SETTING THE SCENE

- The Penn State men's soccer team will conclude the 2011 regular season on Saturday when it welcomes Wisconsin to Jeffrey Field for a Senior Day showdown set for 2 p.m.
- The conference contest will be broadcast on a tape delay basis by the Big Ten Network, with the air time scheduled for 6 p.m. on Sun., Nov. 6.
- Following the contest with the Badgers, Penn State seniors Mackenzie Arment, Marco Ciarla, Mark Fetrow, Justin Lee, and Matt Smallwood will be honored for their contributions to the Nittany Lion program in a special Senior Day ceremony.

LAST TIME OUT

- On Tuesday evening, Penn State traveled to Hofstra and came away with a 1-1 draw.
- The Nittany Lions outshot the Pride, 17-7, and had a 9-2 advantage in shots on goal but gave up a late score off a redirect on a free kick.
- Mackenzie Arment accounted for Penn State's score, netting his second goal of the season, with junior midfielder Marvin Ledgister earning an assist on the play.

DEFENSIVELY DRIVEN

- Solid team defense continues to be the hallmark of the 2011 Nittany Lions.
- Penn State has allowed the fewest goals of any Big Ten team (11) and leads the conference in goals against average (0.58) and shutouts (10).
- The veteran back line, partially made up of seniors Mark Fetrow, Justin Lee, and Matt Smallwood, who have combined to start 197 career games, has played strong defense in front of freshman goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton.

WISCONSIN SCOUTING REPORT

- After a fast start to the 2011 season, which saw it perched alone atop the Big Ten standings with 3-0 record, Wisconsin has lost three of its last four games, including two straight conference matches.
- The Badgers have posted a 3-2 record in road games in 2011, including a 1-1 mark versus Big

Ten foes.

- Junior midfielder Tomislav Zadro, who leads the Badgers in points with 17 and ranks first in the Big Ten in assists with seven, keys a Wisconsin offense that averages 1.29 goals per game.
- Chris Prince (4 goals, 1 assist), Josh Thiermann (3 goals, 3 assists), and Joey Tennyson (3 goals, 3 assists) have also been factors on the attack in 2011.
- Sophomore Max Jentsch has started 12 games in goal for Wisconsin, compiling a 0.96 goals against average with three shutouts.
- The Badgers defense, which has recorded a total of five shutouts this season, allows an average of 1.24 goals per game.

PENN STATE-WISCONSIN SERIES

- Penn State owns a 12-10-2 record in its all-time series with Wisconsin, including a 6-3-2 mark in University Park.
- A year ago, the Nittany Lions fell to the Badgers, 1-0, in Madison, the only shutout dealt to PSU during the 2010 regular season.

NEXT UP FOR THE NITTANY LIONS

- Next week, Penn State will begin pursuit of a fourth conference crown when it competes at the Big Ten Tournament.
- The battle for the 2011 title is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, Nov. 9 with three first round matches. Semifinal games will take place on Friday, Nov. 11 with the championship contest set for Sunday, Nov. 13.
- Hosted by the University of Michigan, all games will be played at the U-M Soccer Stadium in Ann Arbor.
- The semifinals and finals will air live on the BTN.
- Penn State, which possesses a 26-14-4 record in Big Ten Tournament play, is one of just two conference teams to have a winning mark in the postseason event.

KEY STATS

- In 1,705:58 total minutes of play this season, Penn State has trailed for 201:44, just 11.8% of game time.
- Penn State is one of two Big Ten teams to have every loss come by one goal.
- Penn State, which is 5-2-1 at home this season, has outscored opponents 10-3 at Jeffrey Field.

WOLVERTON ANCHORS DEFENSE

- Through the first 18 games of his collegiate career, freshman goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton has registered 10 shutouts.
- Tied the Penn State record for shutouts in a season last week on Oct. 26 versus Bucknell , earning his 10th.
- The program mark is also held by Angelo Nickas (1980), Whit Gibson (1998), and Conrad Taylor (2005).
- Ranks first in the Big Ten in goals against average (0.58), shutouts (8), and shutouts per game (0.56).
- Ranks No. 6 in the NCAA in goals against average.
- Started all 18 games and logged every minute in goal this season.

CARDONA EARNS CALL UP

- Julian Cardona was recently called into duty by the Puerto Rico National Team to play in two World Cup qualifying games.
- Cardona left Happy Valley following the Nittany Lions' 2-0 win over Penn on October 4 to head to Puerto Rico and returned on October 11.
- Cardona started and earned 50-plus minutes of playing time in Puerto Rico's Group D World Cup qualifier with Caribbean rival Saint Kitts and Nevis on October 7 in Bayamon, P.R., which ended in a 1-1 draw.
- On October 11, Cardona and the Blue Hurricane met the Canadian National Team at BMO Field in Toronto.
- Canada had dominated Group D, scoring 14 goals while allowing just one but Puerto Rico played the home team to a 0-0 tie.
- However, based on its overall Group D record, Puerto Rico was eliminated from World Cup contention.
- Cardona has started 11 of 12 games in which he has appeared in his first season as a Nittany Lion and currently leads the team in goals with three and is tied for the team lead in points with seven.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- Penn State posted a 7-2-4 record this season versus non-conference opponents, including a 5-0-1 mark at home.
- The Nittany Lions surrendered just a total of five goals in 13 games versus non-conference foes, with three coming in one game, an early season loss to Stetson.

PENN STATE IN THE STAT RANKINGS

- Penn State ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten in goals allowed (11), goals against average (0.58), shutouts (10), and corner kicks (126).
- Penn State ranks No. 6 in the NCAA in team goals against average and in shutout percentage (tie).

WARMING REACHES MILESTONE

- With Penn State's 1-0 win over Florida International on September, head coach Bob

Warming secured his 400th career win.

- Became just the 31st coach in NCAA men's soccer history to reach the 400-win milestone.
- Ranks sixth among active Division I head coaches and 15th all-time in career wins.

- 34-year coaching veteran
- Six-time finalist for NCAA Division I National Coach of the Year
- Led two teams to the College Cup (Saint Louis, 1997; Creighton, 2002)
- Led his teams to 29 winning seasons.
- Only Division I coach to have at least one player drafted into the MLS every year since the league's inception.
- Inducted into the Creighton University Athletics Hall of Fame in May 2011.

2011 AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

- Minh Vu was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on August 29 for scoring his first Division I goal in his first game as a Nittany Lion in a 1-0 win over Siena.
- Andrew Wolverton was honored as Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on September 12 following a 3-0 shutout of Saint Peter's.
- Jordan Tyler was named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com National Team of the Week on September 12 for scoring two goals in 3-0 win over Saint Peter's.
- Andrew Wolverton was selected to the TopDrawerSoccer.com National Team of the Week on September 19 for recording shutouts versus Saint Francis (Pa.) and Hartford.
- Andrew Wolverton was named SoccerSavings.com/Philly Soccer News College Player of the Week on October 30 for tying the Penn State record for shutouts in a season with his 10th in a 0-0 draw with Bucknell.

ROSTER MAKEOVER

- Penn State lost 71% of its goals, 57% of its assists, and 66% of its points from last year's squad, including the NCAA scoring champion in Corey Hertzog (20 goals, 6 assists) and the nation's leader in assists in Matheus Braga (17).
- In all, 12 letterwinners and six starters are gone from the 2010 team that went 14-8-1, played for a Big Ten title, and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Championship.
- Replacing those losses on the 2011 roster are 12 newcomers, including five transfers and seven freshmen.
- Jacob Barron (UC Davis), Julian Cardona (Butler), and Hasani Sinclair (South Florida) transferred from Division I programs while Mihn Vu (Pima Community College) and Marvin Ledgister (North Iowa Area Community College) came to Penn State from junior colleges.
- Through 18 games, 2011 transfers have combined for 62 starts and accounted for 26 of Penn State's 47 points.
- Andrew Wolverton (18) and Owen Griffith (8) are the only freshmen to earn starts in 2011.

2011 CAPTAINS

- Senior defender Matt Smallwood was named the team captain prior to the start of the 2011 season.
- Smallwood exclusively served in that role until the week leading up to Penn State's match-up with Michigan State when head coach Bob Warming appointed fellow seniors Mackenzie Arment, Mark Fetrow, and Justin Lee as co-captains.
- The four co-captains have combined to start 253 games at Penn State.

COST JOINS WARMING'S STAFF

- In late September, Penn State head coach Bob Warming added former Nittany Lion Drew Cost (2007-10) to his coaching staff as a volunteer assistant.
- Cost was a team co-captain in 2010 and was a two-time All-Big Ten midfielder.
- Starting 70 career games, he finished with 30 points (10 goals, 10 assists)
- Selected by Real Salt Lake in the 2010 MLS Supplemental Draft with the No. 14 pick (32nd overall) in the second round.
- After spending training camp with the defending Real Salt Lake, he signed with the Rochester Rhinos of USL PRO.
- Appearing in 19 games, Cost scored two goals in his first professional season.

WARMING'S STAFF HAS NEW FACES IN 2011

- 2010 assistants Jason Mims (Nebraska Omaha) and Isang Jacob (IUPUI) landed Division I head coaching jobs in the offseason.
- On May 11, Warming added Bo Oshoniyi, former assistant at Wake Forest and South Florida, to his staff.
- A two-time All-American goalkeeper at Central Connecticut State, Oshoniyi won two Division II national championships.
- Drafted into the MLS by Columbus, he played 12 years as a professional, capturing a title with Kansas City in 2000.
- On June 27, Warming added Chad Duernberger, former head coach at Division II University of Charleston, to his bench.
- One of the youngest head coaches in the nation when he was hired by his alma mater in 2008, the 24-year-old Duernberger engineered an impressive and rapid turnaround after inheriting a Charleston program that went 0-17-0 the year prior.
- 2009 team went 19-4-0, advancing to the NCAA quarterfinals and earning a final No. 7 ranking.
- Named 2009 NSCAA Division II Coach of the Year.
- Was a four-year starter for Charleston (2002-06), earning First Team All-WVIAC honors three times and all-region recognition in 2002.
