PENN STATE INVITATIONAL IN REVIEW

The Penn State women's volleyball team kicked off the 2013 campaign in winning fashion, picking up three straight-set victories to capture the Penn State Invitational title. The Nittany Lions opened the weekend with a 3-0 win against Dabrowa, a top professional team from Poland. PSU returned the next day to claim back-to-back victories against Syracuse and No. 19 Louisville in straight sets. Junior Micha Hancock notched a match-high eight aces against the Orange, while senior Ariel Scott and redshirt freshman Paulina Prieto Cerame both recorded double-digit kills against the Cardinals.

NIKE BIG FOUR: A TOP COLLEGIATE VOLLEYBALL EVENT

This year marks the fourth and final year of the round-robin tournament, known as the Nike Big Four between Stanford, Florida, Texas and Pen State. Regarded as one of the most highly anticipated and competitive tournament of the seasons, this year's Nike Big Four is the highest ranked in the history of the event with PSU ranked No. 1, Stanford No. 2, Texas No. 6 and Florida at No. 8.

PENN STATE VS. NO. 6 TEXAS

Penn State is 11-7 all-time against Texas, having split the last two meetings between the two clubs. In 2012, Penn State swept the Longhorns 25-22, 25-21, 25-22 in the Nike Big Four event at Rec Hall. In 2011, Texas squeezed a 23-25, 20-25, 25-19, 25-14, 10-15, five-set victory in the second year of the Nike Big Four. Prior to the loss in 2011, PSU had won the last 10 matches between the two, dating back to 11/24/1990.

SCOUTING THE LONGHORNS

The defending National Champion Longhorns return in 2013 with very much the same lineup as last year's team, having lost only one senior. So far, Texas is out to a 2-1 start this season. Despite being upset, 3-1, by No. 11 Hawaii in the season-opener, the Longhorns swept UTEP and rallied past San Diego, 3-2, to close out the weekend on a high note. Senior Bailey Webster is at the helm of the offense this year, leading the team with 39 kills, having registered a match-high 19 against Hawaii. A trio of others have posted 20+ kills this season, including Khat Bell, Haley Eckerman and Pilar Victoria. Bell is leading the team in blocking as well, having posted 17 blocks in 2013, including eight vs. San Diego.

PENN STATE VS. NO. 8 FLORIDA

The Nittany Lions own the all-time series 7-3 against the Gators. The last time the two teams matched up was in the inaugural year of the Nike Big Four event - Penn State took the match, 3-1. Florida and PSU also met in 2009, with the Lions sweeping the Gators.

SCOUTING THE GATORS

Florida enters the weekend with a 3-0 record in 2013, having also captured the Campus USA Credit Union Invitational title during its opening weekend. In a 3-0 sweep against New Orleans, the Gators hit .500, on their way to another set of victories against LIU Brooklyn and Duke. Chloe Mann is leading the Florida offense with 35 kills. Across all three games, Mann hit .630, with one error. Behind Mann is sophomore Ziva Recek, who tallied 29 kills last weekend, highlighted by a 15-kill performance against LIU Brooklyn. Mann is also leading the squad in blocking with 12 blocks. On the defensive side of things, 2011 SEC All-Freshman team honoree Taylor Unroe is leading the squad with 37 digs.

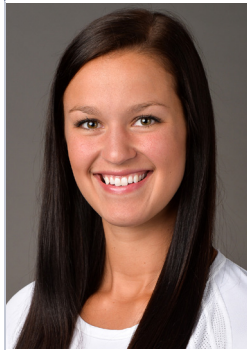

ALL ALONE AT THE TOP

Following an undefeated opening weekend, the Nittany Lions earned the No. 1 ranking in the AVCA weekly Top 25 Coaches' Poll, while also picking up top rankings in the RichKern.com and Volleyball Magazine polls. In the AVCA poll, Penn State received 50-of-60 possible first-place votes, marking the first time the Lions have claimed the top spot since the 2012 season. Last year, Penn State spent six weeks atop the standings, including five consecutive weeks from Sept. 24 to Oct. 22, before earning the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, Nov. 9.

The Nittany Lions are very familiar with the No. 1 ranking though, as this week marks the 76th time in history that Penn State has reached the top of the polls, having earned its first-ever No. 1 ranking Sept. 2, 1997.

HANCOCK EARNS PENN STATE INVITATIONAL MVP HONORS

Junior Micha Hancock earned Penn State Invitational MVP honors for a pair of outstanding performances in both matches last weekend. Hancock tied for third on the squad in kills with five against Syracuse, posting a .556 hitting clip. She also dished out 30 assists, while pacing the team to a .313 hitting percentage. Against Louisville, Hancock registered eight service aces, which is just two shy of her career-high mark of 10 that she set against Binghamton in the NCAA Tournament last season. She also tallied two kills and seven digs against the Cardinals to round out the weekend.

PREITO CERAME AND SLAY EARN PSU INVITE ALL-TOURNAMENT

Redshirt freshman Paulina Prieto Cerame and senior Katie Slay also earned Penn State Invitational All-Tournament team honors in the Penn State Invitational. In her first season in the blue and white, Preito Cerame recorded a team-high nine kills against Syracuse and hit double-digits with 10 against No. 19 Louisville. Slay led the squad with a team-best five blocks against Syracuse, including two solo blocks. She also tied for third on the team with five kills. Against the Cardinals, she posted three blocks, including one solo block, adding three kills.

NITTANY LIONS IMPROVE TO 29-6 IN SEASON-OPENERS

With a victory against Syracuse, Penn State improved to 29-6 all-time in season-openers. The win marks the second-straight season opening triumph for the Lions after knocking off Morehead State 3-0 in the first match of the 2012 season. Penn State has not lost a season-opener since Aug. 26, 2011, when PSU lost to Oregon, marking the first season-opening loss since 2005.

The Penn State Invitational also marked the first time the Nittany Lions opened the season at home in six years. The last time PSU opened at Rec Hall was in 2007, when Penn State defeated Texas, 3-1, on Aug. 24 and 25 to kick off the start of an eventual national championship campaign.

PSU EARNS NO. 2 RANKING IN AVCA PRESEASON COACHES' POLL

The defending Big Ten Champion Nittany Lions enter the 2013 season with the No. 2 ranking, according to the 2013 AVCA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Lions are among Big Ten teams to break into the top 10, with Minnesota and Michigan coming in at No. 6 and No. 7 and Nebraska at No. 10.

Defending NCAA Champion Texas nabbed the top spot, earning 55 of 60 possible first-place votes. The Nittany Lions received three first place votes, while third-ranked Stanford earned two. Rounding out the top five is USC and Washington, who are ranked fourth and fifth, respectively.

PENN STATE PICKED TO FINISH FIRST IN BIG TEN PRESEASON POLL

PSU was picked as the Big Ten preseason favorite in the 2013 Preseason Coaches' Poll, marking the Lions' eighth first-place nod within the last nine years. Following Penn State in the No. 2 slot is Minnesota, followed by Michigan, Nebraska and Michigan State. Illinois rounds out the group, slated at sixth.

FIVE EARN BIG TEN PRESEASON HONORS

Penn State dominated the Preseason All-Big Ten honors this year with five Nittany Lions earning honors. Ariel Scott led the group with a unanimous selection, marking her second straight appearance on the list. Deja McClendon earned her third consecutive nod, while Katie Slay also notched her second straight. Micha Hancock and Megan Courtney also earned spots on the list.

SISTER, SISTER!

In Penn State's final match up of the Penn State Invitational, three-time AVCA All-American Deja McClendon lined up against her sister, Maya McClendon, who is currently an outside hitter for the No. 19-ranked Louisville Cardinals. Deja led with a team-high 17 digs, while Maya led the Cards offense with eight kills.

NITTANY LIONS BY MONTH

Penn State is 37-5 (.881) all-time during the month of August, including the pair of victories this weekend against Syracuse and No. 19 Louisville. Its first two losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 when Nebraska swept the Lions, and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State, 3-2, in the opening round. Most recently, the Nittany Lions suffered a season opening loss to Oregon in 2011 before rebounding with a hard fought 3-2 win against nationally-ranked USC.

Penn State is 350-54-4 (.863) all-time during the month of September. The Lions are 174-15 (.921) during September dating back to the 1995 season and 47-7 (.870) across the last five years.

The Lions are 379-67 (.850) all-time during the month of October. Penn State has posted a 79-11 (.878) mark in October across the last 10 seasons, a record of 43-3 (.935) in the last five years and did not lose a match during the month from 2007 to 2010.

Penn State is 275-57 (.828) all-time during the month of November, including a 77-8 (.906) mark over the last 10 seasons. The Lions had a six-year streak from 1995-2000 where they did not lose a match in the month, and in the last five seasons, Penn State has a 38-3 (.927) mark in November.

QUICK SETS

From Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten in 1991, Penn State has played in 733 total matches, winning 648. Additionally, 515 of those 648 wins, or 79%, have been three-game sweeps. Across the last seven years, Penn State has won 190 of its 234 victories in three games (81%), including 37-of-38 (98%) in 2008 and 32-of-38 in 2009 (84%).n

In the last 15 years, the Lions have lost only 56 matches. And of those 22 teams that defeated the Lions – BYU, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Long Beach State, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Oregon State, Purdue, USC, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin – only eight of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota and Florida) have been able to beat Penn State a third time. The Lions have compiled a 273-54 mark in the last 15 years versus these teams.

Penn State women's volleyball senior Ariel Scott has been selected as a candidate for the 2013 Senior CLASS Award, as announced today. Scott is one of 30 to earn a spot on the ballot, along with four others from the Big Ten conference.

Scott, a unanimous Preseason All-Big Ten selection, helped guide PSU to a spot in the NCAA National Semifinals, picking up numerous honors along the way. The 2012 First Team AVCA All-American and 2012 Big Ten Player of the Year returns to the court in 2013 for her final season after starting all 36 games last year. She led the squad with a team-best, 469 kills, averaging 3.75 per set with a .308 hitting clip. The NCAA West Lafayette Regional Championship MVP recorded double-digit kills in 24-of-26 matches.

Team captains for the 2013-14 year include junior Dominique Gonzalez and senior Maggie Harding. Gonzalez is no stranger to the leadership role, having served as a team captain during the 2012-13 season.
