

STORYLINES

- Penn State is making its 24th NCAA Tournament appearance and third-straight.
- Penn State is one of only 11 teams to earn 24 or more NCAA Tournament berths.
- The Lady Lions are 29-23 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- Penn State is the 2013 Big Ten regular-season champions. The Lady Lions claimed back-toback crowns for the first time since the 2002-03 and 2003-04 teams accomplished the feat.
- The Lady Lions' 14-2 record in conference play is the best mark since the 2003-04 team went 15-1.
- Senior Alex Bentley was selected as the 2013 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winner for the nation's top player under 5-8.

- Maggie Lucas was selected as the 2013 Big Ten Player of the Year, becoming the third player in school history to earn the honor (Helen Darling, Kelly Mazzante - twice).
- Lucas and Bentley were named to the All-Big Ten first team for the second-straight year.
- Bentley garners first team accolades for the third time in her career, making her the fifth player in PSU history to earn the honor three or more times.
- Coquese Washington was named Big Ten Coach of the Year by the media for the secondstraight season. She is just the fifth coach in Big Ten history to earn back-to-back honors.
- Senior Nikki Greene took home third team All-Big Ten accolades from the coaches and earned an honorable mention nod by the media.

- Maggie Lucas knocked down five three-pointers and was 11-for-11 from the free throw line en route to 30 points, 19 of which came in the first half.

- Senior guard Alex Bentley and junior guard Maggie Lucas have been named to the WBCA All-Region 6 team. The pair is now eligible for the 10-member WBCA All-America team, which will be announced at the Final Four in New Orleans.
- The All-Region honor is the second for Bentley, who was a WBCA honorable mention All-American last year.
- Additionally, Lucas is one of 15 finalists for the John R. Wooden Award, it was announced by the Los Angeles Athletic Club.
- · Lucas is the lone representative of the Big Ten on the Wooden list.
- Selected by the Wooden Award National Advisory Board, the final ballot is made up of 15 student-athletes
 who have proven to their universities that they are making progress toward graduation and maintaining at

COQUESE WINS COACH OF THE YEAR, AGAIN

- Penn State mentor Coquese Washington won her second consecutive Big Ten Coach of the Year award from the media.
- She is the first PSU coach to win back-to-back COY honors since Rene Portland won the award in 2003 and 2004.
- This is the fifth time in Big Ten history that a coach has won back-to-back Coach of the Year accolades.

MORE BIG TEN ACCOLADES

- Senior center Nikki Greene was selected third team All-Big Ten by the coaches and honorable mention All-Big Ten by the media.
- It is the third all-conference selection for Greene, who was a media third team choice and coaches honorable mention choice last year and an honorable mention recipient in 2011 by the media.
- Guards Alex Bentley and Dara Taylor were named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team.
- It is Bentley's second consecutive berth on the defensive squad. PSU has had a representative on the team each of the last three seasons.
- Senior guard Gizelle Studevent was Penn State's Sportsmanship Award recipient.

BIG TEN CHAMPIONS

- The Lady Lions clinched the Big Ten regular-season title outright for the second-straight year with an 82-67 win at Nebraska on Mar. 3.
- The back-to-back titles are the first for the program since the 2002-03 and 2003-04 squads accomplished the feat.
- This is the fifth outright regular-season title for the Lady Lions (2000, 2003, 2004, 2012).
- PSU is the ninth team to claim consecutive championships in Big Ten history.
- Penn State has won seven overall regular season crowns (1994, 1995, 2000, 2003, 2004, 2012).
- The Lady Lions earned the No. 1 overall seed in the Big Ten Tournament for the sixth time in program history (1995, 2000, 2003, 2004, 2012).
- Penn State's 14-2 Big Ten record is the best since the 2003-04 squad went 15-1.

THREE CONSECUTIVE 25-WIN SEASONS

- With a 76-66 win over Ohio State in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals, the Lady Lions notched their 25th win of the season.
- · This is the third consecutive season that Penn State has reached the 25-win mark.
- It is the 13th 25-win campaign in program history .
- This is only the second time in program history that the Lady Lions have posted three consecutive 25-win seasons, joining the 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 campaigns

COQUESE NAMED USA BASKETBALL ASSISTANT COACH

- Head coach Coquese Washington has been selected to be an assistant coach for the USA Basketball Women's World University Games Team this summer.
- She will serve with the team's head coach Sherri Coale of Oklahoma and assistant coach Brian Giorgis
 of Marist.
- The World University Games will be played July 8-15 in Kazan, Russia.
- This is her first coaching position with USA Basketball, but she served on the USA Basketball Women's Junior National Team Committee from 2009-12.
- She is the fourth person with Lady Lion ties to coach a USA Basketball squad, joining Rene Portland, Suzie McConnell-Serio and Terri Williams-Flournoy. Portland was the head coach for the Olympic Festival team (1985), the U.S. Junior World team (1986, 1996, 1997) and World University Games squad (1999). She was also an assistant for the U.S. Junior World Team in 1993. McConnell-Serio and Williams-Flournoy were assistant coaches on the most recent World University Games team in 2011.

STARTING RECORD TURNS GREENE

- By earning the starting nod in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals against Michigan State on March 9, Nikki Greene tied Kelly Mazzante for the school record for consecutive games started with her 129th start.
- Greene is tied with Nebraska's Linsdsay Moore (129) for the second-longest active streak in the nation. They trail Texas Tech's Monique Smalls (132) for the top spot among active players.
- Additionally, with a start in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, Greene will tie Mazzante's school record for career games started (130).

SHOCKING SHOOTING NUMBERS

- The Lady Lions have been a part of several interesting shooting performances this season. They have seen their best and worst shooting performances since the 90s and saw the school record for opponent field goal percentage go down.
- The Lady Lions shot 61.1% from field in the 95-62 win over Illinois on Feb. 20. It
 is the first time Penn State shot better than 60% in a game since Feb. 23, 1996
 versus Michigan State (.608).
- The 61.1% effort from the field is the highest shooting percentage for the Lady Lions in a Big Ten game since joining the conference in 1992-93 and is also Penn State's highest shooting percentage since knocking down 63.3% of its shots against Morgan State on Dec. 29, 1993.
- On the flip side, in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals, Penn State struggled to find its rhythm, connecting on just 22.4% of its shots from the field. It was the first time Penn State shot under 25% in a game since Dec. 19, 1996 when the Lady Lions shot 23% at Alabama.
- From an opponents' standpoint, Minnesota shot a sizzling 66.7% of its shots on Feb. 28, breaking the school record an opponent's best field goal percentage in a game. The previous mark was 64.3% by Tennessee on Jan. 30, 1983.

STELLAR SCORING TANDEM

- Junior guard Maggie Lucas and senior guard Alex Bentley are the only two
 players in school history to play together and each score 1,700 career points.
- The only other duo in school history to each finish their career with 1,700 or more points is Kelly Mazzante and Tanisha Wright. However, Wright did not reach the 1,700-point mark until her senior year and Mazzante graduated.
- Lucas is seventh all-time in scoring with 1,810 points, while Bentley is eighth with 1,754 tallies.

BIG TEN STATS TITLES

- Maggie Lucas tied for the Big Ten lead in three-point field goal percentage in conference play with a .430 mark.
- She is the first Lady Lion to win the Big Ten long range percentage crown since Jess Brungo shot .487 from deep in 2000-01.
- Lucas is the fourth Penn State player to win the three-point field goal percentage title (Brungo, Lisa Shepherd - twice, Tina Nicholson) and it is the fifth time that a Lady Lion claimed the title.
- The Lady Lions led the Big Ten in scoring offense in conference play with a 74.4 mark, nearly six points better than the second-ranked team.
- Penn State wins back-to-back scoring titles for the first time since accomplishing the feat in 1994 and 1995. It is the seventh overall scoring crown for the Lady Lions.
- The Lady Lions shot .435 from the field in league play to finish atop the Big Ten in field goal percentage for the first time in school history. It is the first time in nine years that Ohio State hasn't won the field goal percentage title.
- PSU also led the league in three-point field goal percentage (.393) for the fourth time in school history and first time since 2011.
- Penn State is the first team to ever lead the conference in scoring offense, field goal percentage and three-point field goal percentage in a Big Ten season.

- · The Lady Lions recorded 10 blocks against Illinois on Feb. 20, the most since recording 11 vs. Purdue on Jan. 28, 2010.
- · With a pair of rejections at Ohio State on Jan. 27, junior forward/center Talia East moved into the Top 20 in Penn State history in blocks, passing former teammate Julia Trogele (48; 2008-11) for 19th place.
- With 54 career rejections, she needs seven blocks to tie Tanisha Wright (61; 2002-05) for 18th place.
- · Sophomore center Tori Waldner has moved into the Top 20 on Penn State's career blocks list with 50 rejections. She passed Julia Trogele for the 20th spot with one rejection at Nebraska on March 3.
- · Waldner is chasing East for 19th position, needing four rejections to tie her. She also needs 11 blocks to pass Tanisha Wright (61; 2002-05) for 18th spot.

- Junior guard Ariel Edwards surpassed the 500-point plateau with a seven-point performance against 🖺 Michigan on Feb. 24.
- · Also in the game against the Badgers, Tori Waldner scored her 100th career point on a layup off of a pass from Gizelle Studevent.
- Redshirt junior guard Dara Taylor recorded her 300th career assist with six helpers in the win over Wisconsin Jan. 17.
- · Taylor posted a career-high 18 points in the road win at Michigan State on Jan. 6, surpassing her previous mark of 17 vs. Clemson of Feb. 14, 2010 while she was with Maryland.
- In the Big Ten opener against Northwestern Jan. 3, the Lady Lions shot just 29.9% (20-67) for the game, but girl managed to pull out the 73-69 win. It was the first time that Penn State has shot below 30% and won since shooting 22.4% (15-67) at Minnesota on Jan. 3, 1999.
- Taylor and Talia East made their first career starts in a Penn State uniform against Fairleigh Dickinson on

 Freshman **Candice Agee** and Waldner each had career days in the win over Fairleigh Dickinson Dec. 2. Agee tallied personal bests of eight points, nine rebounds and 20 minutes played, while Waldner notched a career-high seven points with five rebounds and two blocks. Waldner's previous career high was six points, established three times, including twice this season.
- Edwards had a career day against Detroit on Nov. 23. The junior guard/forward tallied 24 points on 11-of-16 shooting in just 25 minutes of action. In fact, Edwards had 19 tallies in the first half, which eclipsed her previous career high of 17 points against lowa on Jan. 22, 2012.
- In the Nov. 18 win over Lafayette, senior forward Mia Nickson tallied 12 points to surpass the 600-point mark for her Penn State career.
- · Nickson also snagged six rebounds versus the Leopards to surpass the 500-carom mark for her collegiate career.

Coquese Washington announced her 2013 recruiting class, which is ranked No. 6 by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report, No. 7 Blue Star Basketball and No. 9 by All-Star Girls Report. Guards Lindsey Spann (Laurel, Md./Good Counsel) and KeKe Sevillian (Goodrich, Mich./Goodrich), swing players Jenny DeGraaf (Springboro, Ohio/Springboro), Kaliyah Mitchell (Stone Mountain, Ga./Stephenson), Peyton Whitted (Suwanee, Ga./North Gwinnett) and post players Alex Harris (Lorain, Ohio/Lorain Southview) and Infiniti Alston (Baltimore, Md./Digital Harbor) signed National Letters of Intent and will start their Lady Lion careers in 2013-14. The seven-player class is the largest in school history and includes six players that are in the Collegiate Girls Basketball Report Top 100.

Spann, who is the 22nd-ranked player by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report and 88th-rated player by Blue Star Basketball, led Good Counsel, to the 2012 Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC) Championship and became the first team in league history to finish with an undefeated record (18-0). The 5-6 guard averaged 15.0 points, 5.4 assists, 2.0 steals and 3.0 rebounds as a junior en route to first team All-WCAC honors. She was also a first team All-Gazette, All-Sentinel and All-DCSportsfan selection and was a second team All-Met honoree. Spann participated in USA Basketball's U16 Trials in May 2011. She played her AAU ball for the Maryland Lady Terps.

Sevillian is a two-time All-State point guard, who led Goodrich High School in Michigan to their first-ever Class B State Championship in 2011-12 with a perfect 28-0 record. Sevillian, a 5-6 guard, is a three-time first team all-conference choice for the Martians, who averaged 13.5 points and 3.6 assists per game during her junior season. She also snatched 107 steals in 28 contests a year ago. For her career, Sevillian has 916 points, 237 assists, 283 steals and 130 blocks. Sevillian is also an outstanding track athlete, earning four varsity letters at Goodrich. She holds the school record in the 300-meter hurdles and 200-meter dash and finished second in the state championships in the 300-meters hurdles her freshman and sophomore seasons. She was unable to compete last season due to an injury. She played AAU ball for the Michigan Crossover.

DeGraaf, 87th-rated recruit by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report, averaged 15.0 points, 6.1 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per game as she led Springboro to a 22-2 record. The 6-1 forward led the Greater Western Ohio Conference (GWOC) with a .548 field goal percentage and accounted for a .747 effort from the free throw line. DeGraaf was a first team All-GWOC, Dayton Daily News D-I All-Area team and first team Associated Press D-I All-Southwestern District honoree as a junior. Additionally, she garnered special mention All-Ohio accolades in 2011-12. As a sophomore, she averaged 9.3 points and 7.1 rebounds per game en route to All-GWOC South Division first team honors. DeGraaf is also a standout volleyball player for Springboro. She played her AAU ball for Sports City U.

Mitchell, who is the 54th-ranked recruit by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report and 40th-ranked recruit by All-Star Girls Report, accounted for 12.9 points, 8.3 rebounds, 3.2 steals, 4.0 assists and 2.0 blocks per game as a junior for Stephenson High School. The 6-2 forward shot 46% from the field and 68% from the free throw line last season on her way to All-DeKalb County accolades. Mitchell is a two-time All-Metro third team honoree, an Atlanta Journal Constitution DeKalb County second team choice and honorable mention All-State selection. She played her AAU ball for the Georgia Hoopstars Black.

Whitted is the 71st-ranked recruit by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report and 60th-ranked player by All-Star Girls Report after averaging 11.6 points and 6.3 rebounds per game for North Gwinett her junior season. The 6-2 forward guided the Bulldogs to their first state semifinal appearance since 1963 as she averaged a double-double in state playoff games (14.8 pts., 10.0 rebs.). She was a second team All-County selection by the Daily Post. In two seasons at North Gwinett, Whitted has 551 points, 279 rebounds and 89 steals. She also has experience on the national level, participating in USA Basketball's U16 Trials in May 2011.

Harris, who is the 49th-ranked recruit by Collegiate Girls Basketball Report and All-Star Girls Report, averaged a double-double for Lorain Southview in Ohio. The 6-3 forward tallied 12.1 points and 11.7 rebounds in 2011-12 as the Titans went 17-5. She also accounted for 5.0 blocks per game a year ago on her way to honorable mention All-State and first team All-County and All-District honors. She also earned honorable mention All-State accolades and first team All-Lorain County honors as a sophomore. - She needs 30 rebounds for 1,000 career caroms.
- The members of the 1,000-1,000 club are Susan Robinson (2,253-1,070), Kahadeejah Herbert (2,025-1,103) and Andrea Garner (1,619-1,016).

LUCAS LIGHTS UP SCOREBOARD

- Junior Maggie Lucas ranks seventh in school history in points with 1,810.
- With her 23-point night at Minnesota on Feb. 28, Lucas passed Angie Potthoff (1993-97) for seventh place in school history.
- She needs 87 points to tie Suzie McConnell (1,897; 1985-88) for sixth most in school history.
- With 23 tallies against Michigan State in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals on March 9, Lucas became just the second player in school history to record multiple 600-point seasons, joining Kelly Mazzante, who accomplished the feat three times. It is the seventh time in school history that a Lady Lion has surpassed the 600-point plateau in a season.
- Lucas currently has 616 tallies this season and sits in seventh place in program history on the single-season scoring chart.

PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- The Feb. 10 win over Michigan State marked the 20th of the season for the Lady Lions. It is the third-straight 20-win season and 25th overall for Penn State. It is the first time that the Lions have had three consecutive 20-win seasons since the 2001-02, 2002-03 and 2003-04 campaigns.
- The win over Michigan State on Feb. 10 gave the Lady Lions 10 wins in conference play, marking the 14th time that Penn State has posted double figure wins in 21 seasons as a member of the Big Ten.
- The Lady Lions' 76-54 win at Indiana on Feb. 7 marked the 850th win in program history. Penn State is one of 12 teams in NCAA Division I to reach the 850-win plateau. The Lady Lions join the likes of Tennessee, Louisiana Tech, Old Dominion, James Madison, Stephen F. Austin, Texas, Ohio State, Stanford, Tennessee Tech, Georgia and Connecticut as the only programs to reach the milestone.
- With a win over NJIT to close out the non-conference season Dec. 23, the Lady Lions secured double digit non-conference wins for the third-straight season.
- The Lady Lions led the second-ranked Connecticut Huskies on two occasions for a total of 31 seconds in their Dec. 6 game. To that point, the Huskies had only trailed for a total of 17 seconds in their season opener against College of Charleston. Penn State also forced UConn into a season-high 20 turnovers.
- With a 101-44 win over Fairleigh Dickinson Dec. 2, Penn State surpassed the 100-point plateau for the first time since scoring 103 tallies against Wagner last season (12/18/11). It was the 47th time in program history that the Lions have scored 100 or more points. Additionally, the 57-point win was the biggest margin of victory since the 103-42 win over Wagner.
- The Lady Lions picked up a 63-58 victory over #16/13 Texas A&M Nov. 14 to snap the Aggies' first 58-game non-conference home court winning streak. Texas A&M last lost a home non-conference game to Houston on Dec. 30, 2003.
- Penn State has won its last seven season openers after a 72-61 decision over Howard on Nov. 11.
- The Lady Lions are a perfect 6-0 in the first game of the season under head coach Coquese Washington.
- · Overall, Penn State is now 37-12 all-time in season openers.

COQUESE'S C-NOTE

- Washington won her 100th career game as a head coach as Penn State topped Virginia Tech, 60-41, in Blacksburg on Dec. 12.
- She is just the second head coach in school history to top 100 wins, joining Rene Portland (606).
- Washington started the 2012-13 season 5-0 for the second time in her coaching career, last doing in during the 2010-11 campaign.
- Washington will serve on the 18-person search committee for the next Penn Stae president, as current president Dr. Rodney Erickson will retire by June 30, 2014.

- Nickson became the 28th member of the Lady Lions' 500-rebound club with six caroms at Michigan State.
- Posted her third double-double of the season and 13th of her career with season-bests of 14 points and 13 rebounds in the win over Northwestern on

- Greene became the 35th player in school history with 1,000 career points after tallying nine markers against Minnesota on Jan. 24.
- She is one of three current Lady Lions in the 1,000-point club, joining Alex Bentley and Maggie Lucas.
- · Her 23 points against Wisconsin on Jan. 17 are a season-high and mark her second 20-point game of the season and fifth of her career.

PROTECTING THE BJC

- The Lady Lions posted a perfect 14-0 record in home games this season.
- The perfect home record is the first unbeaten home slate for Penn State since 2004-05.
- · Penn State has posted 10 unbeaten home seasons in school history, including four in the BJC.
- The 14 home wins for the Lady Lions are tied for the second-most in program history, the 2002-03 squad won 16 games in the BJC.
- The 68-57 win over Michigan on Feb. 24 marked the 200th win for the Lady Lions at the BJC.
- The Lady Lions packed the Bryce Jordan Center on Feb. 24 for the Seventh Annual Pink Zone at Penn State with 14,173 fans, including a record 621 survivors, for the fourth-largest home crowd in Lady Lion history.
- The Lady Lions are riding a 20-game home court winning streak, which is the third-longest active streak in NCAA Division I and the fifth-longest streak in school history. The Lady Lions last lost at home Jan. 7, 2012 to Michigan State.
- PSU's eight home conference wins are the most for the Lady Lions since 2004-05 (8).
- The Lady Lions have won their last 13 non-conference home games, dating back to the 2010-11 season. The streak is the third-longest non-conference home court-winning streak in school history. Penn State last lost a home nonconference game against Drexel on Dec. 21, 2010.

CENTURY MARK FOR STARTS

- For the second time this season, the Lady Lions have had a player reach the century mark for starts. This time it was Alex Bentley, who earned the nod against Lafayette on Nov. 18, joining Nikki Greene among those Lady Lions with 100 or more starts.
- Bentley is the 12th player in school history to accomplish the feat. She has started all but two of the games that she has played in the Blue & White.
- Greene made her 100th career start against Howard on Nov. 11, to become the 11th player in school history with 100 career starts.

STIFLING DEFENSE

- The Lady Lions have recorded at least 17 steals in five contests this year. By comparison, the season-high for steals in a game all of last season was 17. The five games with 17 or more steals are the most since the 1993-94 squad had six games with 17 or more thefts.
- The Lady Lions held back-to-back opponents, Wisconsin (40) on Jan. 17 and Michigan (49) on Jan. 21 to less than 50 points en route to wins. It is the first time since the 2004-05 slate that PSU has held back-to-back foes to less than 50 points. That year, the Lions held Illinois to 41 tallies on Jan. 13 and Indiana to 44 points on Jan. 16 for a pair of wins.
- The Lady Lions recorded a season-best 19 steals in the Big Ten opener against Northwestern. The 19 thefts are the most by the Lady Lions since registering 21 thefts against Bucknell Dec. 28, 2010. Junior guard Dara Taylor had seven of those steals to establish a personal best mark, surpassing her previous career mark of six thefts against N.C. Central (11/14/09) as a member of the Maryland Terrapins. Taylor also surpassed the 100-steal mark for her career against the Wildcats.

GOING STREAKING

- The Lady Lions had their 11-game winning streak come to an end with a 63-61 loss at Wisconsin Jan. 31. The streak was the sixth longest streak in school history and was the third-longest active streak in NCAA Division I when it ended.
- Penn State collected a school record 14 consecutive Big Ten regular-season games, dating back to last season, before the streak was snapped at Wisconsin on Jan. 31. The streak broke the previous school mark for consecutive Big Ten wins of 13 over the 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons.
- · Prior to the Wisconsin loss, the Lady Lions last lost in Big Ten play on Jan. 29, 2012 at Michigan State. The overall school record for consecutive conference victories is 16 as the 1990-91 squad won 14 straight Atlantic 10 games and the 1992-93 team won its first two games as a member of the Big Ten (PSU did not play in a conference in 1991-92) to account for the record.

SIZZLING SHOOTING NIGHT

- The Lady Lions shot 61.1% from field in the 95-62 win over Illinois on Feb. 20. It is the first time Penn State that shot better than 60% in a game since Feb. 23, 1996 versus Michigan State (.608).
- The 61.1% effort from the field is the highest shooting percentage for the Lady Lions in a Big Ten game since joining the conference in 1992-93 and is also Penn State's highest shooting percentage since knocking down 63.3% of its shots against Morgan State on Dec. 29, 1993.

 It was also the first time since Jan. 26, 2006 (vs. lowa) that Penn State shot better than 55% in each half
- better than 55% in each half.
- Additionally, the 95 points scored by the Lady Lions are the most in a conference game since the 95-62 victory at Ohio State on Feb. 3, 2002.

MARGIN OF VICTORY

- The Lady Lions claimed an 84-40 win over Wisconsin Jan. 17 to move to 4-0 in conference play.
- · Penn State's 44-point win is the biggest margin of victory over a Big Ten opponent since topping Michigan State by 48 points (97-49) on Jan. 28, 2001.
- Additionally, the 44-point win also marked the first time that Penn State defeated a Big Ten opponent by 40 or more points since a 43-point win over Northwestern (91-48: 1/22/06).
- The margin of victory for the Lions also marked the worst loss for the Badgers since falling to Purdue (93-45) on March 6, 1994.
- With a 76-55 win over Michigan State Jan. 6, an 80-58 victory over Nebraska Jan. 13 and an 84-40 win over Wisconsin Jan. 17, the Lady Lions earned three consecutive Big Ten wins of 20 or more points for the first time since the 2004-05 season. In that season, the Lady Lions topped 76-41 win over Illinois (76-41; 1/13/05), Indiana (65-44; 1/16/05) and Purdue (77-54; 1/20/05).

COQUESE WASHINGTON

Head Coach 6th Season

PENN STATE LADY LION BASKETBALL

Coquese Washington, who helped lead Notre Dame to the 2001 NCAA Championship, was introduced as the fifth head coach of the Penn State women's basketball program on April 23, 2007. Washington is the first female African-American head coach in Penn State history.

Washington returned the Lady Lions to Big Ten prominence in her fifth season as she guided Penn State to the Big Ten regular-season title with a 13-3 record in conference play. Additionally, the Lady Lions advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen with wins over UTEP and LSU en route to a 26-7 overall record. The Lady Lions posted back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 2002-03 and 2003-04. It was also the first Big Ten crown and Sweet Sixteen berth for the Lady Lions since 2003-04. The Lady Lions were ranked throughout the season and finished ninth in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and 11th in the Associated Press Top 25.

For her efforts in rebuilding the Penn State program, Washington was honored as the Big Ten Coach of the Year and the WBCA Region 6 Coach of the Year, making her a finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year. The accolades were not just limited to Washington; all five Lady Lion starters earned All-Big Ten recognition, including first team bids for Alex Bentley and Maggie Lucas. Both Bentley and Lucas also garnered honorable mention All-America honors from the WBCA and Associated Press, respectively. Bentley became the 33rd player in school history to reach the 1,000-point plateau and just the 15th junior to reach the milestone. Lucas also joined the 1,000-point club in 2011-12, becoming just the third sophomore in program history to accomplish the feat.

On the recruiting trail, the Lady Lions' 2012 class earned a Top 20 class from Dan Olson's Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. The class includes transfer Dara Taylor, who sat out the 2011-12 season due to NCAA transfer rules, and McDonald's High School All-American Candice Agee from California. The addition of Taylor, who was a 2009 McDonald's All-American, and Agee gives the Lady Lions three McDonald's All-Americans on the roster heading into the 2012-13 campaign, joining 2010 honoree Lucas. Additionally, Agee earned a gold medal with the USA Basketball U18 National Team Trials at the 2012 FIBA Americas Championship in August.

The Lady Lions returned to the national stage in Washington's fourth year with a second-place finish in the Big Ten regular season standings, a runner-up finish in the Big Ten Tournament and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Penn State tallied its 23rd 20-win season with a 25-10 overall record and an 11-5 mark in conference play. The Lady Lions worked their way back to the "Big Dance" for the first time since 2004-05 and advanced to the second round for the first time in seven years with a win over Dayton in the first round in front of a raucous BJC crowd.

Penn State was a dominating force from the perimeter as the Lady Lions tied the school record with 228 threepointers and led NCAA Division I from deep with a .415 three-point field goal percentage. Pacing the Lady Lions from downtown was Lucas, who broke the Big Ten threepointers record with 112 triples to go along with a .426 shooting percentage. For her efforts, Lucas was selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year and Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year while breaking the Penn State freshman season scoring record (552 pts.). Additionally with Washington's guidance, Bentley became the 11th different player in school history to take home first team All-Big Ten accolades after finishing second in the conference in assists. After outstanding seasons, both Lucas and Bentley were invited to the USA Basketball World University Games Trials.

Washington's third season saw the Lady Lions return to the postseason for the first time since 2004-05 with a WNIT berth. The Lions earned their most overall wins (17) and conference wins (8) since the 2004-05 campaign en route to a sixth-place finish in the Big Ten. Penn State picked up a pair of wins over ranked opponents in #15/15 Pittsburgh and #20/23 Michigan State.

In Washington's second season, the Lady Lions moved up three positions in the Big Ten standings, finishing in a tie for seventh place. Under Washington's guidance in

2008-09, Grant became the 10th different player in school history to earn first team All-Big Ten honors. Grant was also a semifinalist for the Naismith Player of the Year award.

In her first season at the helm. Washington and the Ladv Lions picked up two nationally-televised wins, downed two nationally-ranked foes and took home the 25th regularseason tournament crown in program history.

Washington came to Happy Valley after eight seasons as an associate head coach and assistant coach under Muffet McGraw at Notre Dame, her alma mater. During Washington's eight years on the bench, Notre Dame amassed a 188-69 record with eight NCAA Tournament appearances, including four Sweet Sixteen runs and a National Championship in 2001.

One of the top recruiters in the country, Washington was instrumental in helping the Irish to secure eight consecutive Top 25 recruiting classes, according to "Blue Star Index," a feat only accomplished by two other programs in the country (Connecticut and Tennessee).

Washington was a four-year starting point guard for Notre Dame under McGraw and was the team captain on Notre Dame's first-ever NCAA Tournament team. She was a two-time All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference (MCC) selection and led Notre Dame to three MCC Tournament titles.

The epitome of a student-athlete, Washington graduated from Notre Dame in 1992, a full year ahead of schedule, with a bachelor's degree in history. She went on to attain "Double Domer" status in 1997 after earning her Juris Doctorate from the Notre Dame Law School.

Washington is currently serving on the 29-member WBCA Board of Directors, where she is the Treasurer of the Executive Committee. Washington is also a member of the Kay Yow Cancer Fund Board of Directors and the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee.

A native of Flint, Mich., Washington and her husband, Raynell Brown, have a son, Quenton (7), and a daughter, Rhaiyna (3). They reside in Port Matilda, Pa.
