## No. 1 PENN STATE (13-0, 4-0 Big Ten) at BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

### NITTANY LIONS ENTER POSTSEASON RANKED ATOP NATIONAL POLLS

Penn State was in Minneapolis just two weeks ago and closed out their first perfect regular season since 2003.

Now, after a couple of weeks of training, the Nittany Lions will return to the Twin Cities and attempt to bring home their third Big Ten Championship in program history.

The Nittany Lions claimed the team title during the 2003 and 2008 seasons, while finishing runner-up three times since joining the conference in 1992.

Last season, Penn State finished third at the Big Ten summit with 350.000 points, behind champion Illinois (352.950) and runner-up Michigan (351.850).

### PENN STATE HOSTS NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Penn State University will play host the 2013 NCAA National Championships on April 19-21 inside historic Rec Hall.

It marks the eighth time in program history, and seventh time inside the historic Recreation Building, that Penn State will host the National Championships.

**LIONS POST UNDEFEATED REGULAR SEASON**

It has happened just four times in the last 40 years of Penn State men's gymnastics, but the 2013 team was able to notch an undefeated regular season with a 13-0 record.

Their victory at Minnesota on March 23 sealed the 19th undefeated regular season in school history and the first perfect regular season since 2003.

The Nittany Lions kicked off their march for perfection with a nation's best score of 447.850 in a victory over Army and they were off and running.

Their score at the Navy Open of 440.900 topped the six team field and that victory was followed by a 444.300-432.300 triumph over No. 5 Ohio State inside Rec Hall.

Penn State topped No. 11 Temple and No. 12 William and Mary in a tri-meet with a score of 446.550 on the road before winning their dual meet vs. Springfield College, 446.850-403.330.

A road victory over No. 7 and defending National Champion Illinois, 438.900-436.250, opened March, while wins over No. 2 Michigan, 437.300-430.400, and at No. 7 Minnesota, 433.650-428.000 followed to cap the unblemished record.

**IN-SEASON TOURNAMENT CHAMPS**

Penn State claimed the title at the Navy Open on Jan. 19 when they topped the six-team field with a score of 440.900.

That victory gives the Nittany Lions at least one in-season invitational title during each of the last 11 seasons and moves their in-season tournament winning streak to 15.

Since their last non-first place finish at the Southwest Cup in 2001 the Lions have one Temple Invitational title, grabbed two Southwest Cup titles, two Navy Open crowns and nine West Point Open trophies during that stretch.

**ARONOVICH LIVES OLYMPIC DREAM**

The Olympic rings are tattooed on the right shoulder of Penn State senior Felix Aronovich.

Those rings represent a dream that became reality when the Israel native represented his home country at the XXX Olympiad in London.

Aronovich had to qualify twice to earn his trip to the Olympics, first meeting the Olympic committee requirements at a test event in London in January, 2012 and then meeting the Israeli Olympic committee conditions by placing 11th in the all-around at the European Championships in May, 2012.

At the 2012 Olympic games, Aronovich finished 32nd overall in the all-around competition with a score of 83.199. His best score came on the parallel bars at 14.233, while he also topped the 14.000 score on the still rings (14.100) and the floor exercise (14.033).

**BURBAR AMONG NCAA'S BEST ON HIGH BAR**

When junior Wasef Burbar stepped onto the mat for his high bar routine on Saturday, Feb. 23 vs. Springfield College the meet was firmly in hand for the Nittany Lions.

That didn't matter to Burbar, who proceeded to post just the fourth score of 16.000 or better on the apparatus in NCAA history.

His score of 16.000 set a new school record, topping his own mark of 15.800, which he set just a week prior to his performance vs. the Pride.

It also marked one of just four performances in the NCAA in 2013 that topped the 16.000 mark and the only on the high bar.

Others to top the mark were Stanford's Eddie Penev's 16.050 on the floor exercise, Michigan's Stacey Ervin's 16.150 on the floor exercise and Oklahoma's Michael Squires' 16.000 on the still rings.

# HEADCOACH RANDY JEPSON



Under the direction of Randy Jepson, the 2000, 2004, and 2007 National Coach of the Year, the Penn State men's gymnastics program has carried on the proud tradition of excellence and achievement established by its forebearers. After guiding his teams to three national championships and two Big

Ten titles, Jepson serves as a symbol of Penn State's vaunted gymnastics heritage.

Testament to his impact upon and dedication to the Penn State program and the sport overall, Jepson received the prestigious CGA Honor Coach Award in 2011. Bestowed annually, the Honor Coach Award recognizes CGA member coaches with 25 years or more of service to the sport of gymnastics. Presented with the honor at the NCAA/CGA Awards Banquet in April, Jepson received a special introduction by Bill Ballister, his coach and mentor while at the University of Oregon.

A member of the coaching staff since 1983, Jepson was appointed head coach on July 6, 1992, succeeding long-time head coach Karl Schier. During Jepson's coaching tenure at his alma mater, Penn State student-athletes have earned All-America honors 111 times. He has also mentored 16 individual national champions, including Mark Sohn, the first gymnast to win four-consecutive pommel horse national crowns.

Jepson also championed the renovation efforts of the White Building, the Penn State training gymnasium, transforming the facility into the top collegiate training site in the country.

## Jepson's Background

Before his appointment as acting head coach, Jepson spent six seasons as an assistant to Schier, who retired on October 1, 1991.

Jepson is the sixth head coach in the 72-year history of the Penn State men's gymnastics program and only the third in the last 64 years. Gene Wettstone coached from 1939-76 and was succeeded by Schier, one of his former athletes, who served from 1977-91. Jepson earned the appointment on April of 1991, the year he was named Assistant Coach of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches for his outstanding work.

Seven months prior to that, he coached Mike Masucci to a gold medal in the all-around as head coach of the U.S. team that participated in the Cup of Puerto Rico international meet in San Juan. Masucci also captured gold medals in four events.

A native of Portland, Ore., Jepson lettered for three years at the University of Oregon and was an NCAA finalist on the rings his sophomore year. He transferred to Penn State in 1982, when the Ducks dropped their gymnastics program. In his one season as a Nittany Lion, Jepson was captain and won All-America honors on rings.

A Nissen-Award nominee as a senior, Jepson posted a perfect score of 10.0 on rings in a meet against a team from the Soviet Union in 1983 at Rec Hall.

Jepson joined the Lions' coaching staff as a graduate assistant in 1983 and worked in that capacity for two seasons. His first season as an assistant coach was 1985-86.

Jepson has been instrumental in guiding Penn State gymnastics to berths on the U.S. Senior National and Developmental squads, and in addition was a member of the 1997 and 2005 USA World Championships coaching staff.

A member of the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches, Jepson served as secretary and treasurer of the United States Elite Coaches Association.

In years past, Jepson has served men's program director at Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Woodward, Pa. In addition, Jepson directed the North team that won the gold medal at the 1993 United States Olympic Festival.

Jepson has also been heavily involved in national team training camps, helping to prepare teams for the 1999 World Championships in China and the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Australia. He was also selected as assistant coach for the 1999 Pan American Games team in Winnipeg, Canada. In 2006, Jepson served as an assistant coach for Team USA at the World Championships and in a meet versus France and Switzerland. In February of 2008, Jepson served as head coach of a six-man U.S. team in a dual meet versus Canada, leading the Americans to victory. Later that year, countless hours spent overseeing the training of world class gymnast and Penn State assistant coach Kevin Tan paid off for Jepson, as Tan realized a lifelong dream by earning a spot on the U.S. Olympic Team. Jepson served as Tan's personal coach, accompanying him to Beijing, China for the 2008 Summer Games, where he captured a bronze medal in the team competition.

Jepson received his master's degree from Penn State in exercise sport and science, with an emphasis in biomechanics, in 1990. He and his wife, Sue, a Penn State alum, and their four children - Adam and Anna, who both currently attend Penn State, Emily, and Maggie - reside in Centre Hall.

## SCHOOL RECORDS FALL

Penn State has watched three school records fall during the regular season portion of the 2013 season, including one record reset multiple times.

On the opening weekend of 2013, Felix Aronovich and Matthew Felleman both topped the school standard on the high bar vs. Army, scoring 15.500. The next weekend at the Navy Open, Felleman posted an identical score on the apparatus.

That wasn't the final time that the high bar record would be topped, as junior Wasef Burbar notched a 15.800 and 16.000 scores in consecutive weeks to place the mark at its current heights.

Burbar flew to a 15.800 at Temple on Feb. 16, before posting the fourth highest score in NCAA history with a 16.000 showing vs. Springfield College on Feb. 23.

Sophomore Craig Hernandez already held the school record on the pommel horse, but bested his effort during his rookie year with a 15.750 on the pommel at the Navy Open on Jan. 19.

Junior Néstor Rodríguez set the parallel bar record on Feb. 16 at Temple when he scored 15.800, prior to seeing his season end due to injury.

## RAQUE SELECTED AS TEAM CAPTAIN

Prior to the season starting, senior Parker Raque (Louisville, Ky.) was selected as the Nittany Lion's team captain.

Raque, a two-time All-American, has been a key in figure in Penn State's line up since arriving on campus.

In 2011, Raque emerged as a clutch performer for Penn State at the NCAA Championships, setting three season-highs en route to earning All-America honors in the floor exercise and vault.

Raque has also achieved success in the classroom, earning CGA All-American Scholar-Athlete three times and Academic All-Big Ten twice in his career.

## INJURED LIONS

The Lions have fortunately avoided a multitude of injuries during the 2013 season, but a few gymnasts might not be available during the postseason due to injury.

Those two injuries came to a pair of 2012 All-American performers in Nihir Kothari and Néstor Rodríguez.

Kothari injured his knee prior to the season and Rodríguez injured his elbow during his school record performance on the parallel bars vs. Temple on Feb. 16.

## HOWARD SETS BIG TEN ROOKIE RECORD

Trevor Howard can claim that he is one of the best freshmen to compete in the history of the Big Ten after winning eight of the 12 Big Ten Freshman of the Week awards handed out this season.

Howard collected the Big Ten Freshman of the Week award eight times during his first season on campus to set a new Big Ten record, moving past Illinois' C.J. Maestas who won six awards during the 2012 campaign.

Howard is the fifth Nittany Lion to earn the acknowledgment on multiple occasions and sixth PSU gymnast overall to win conference's top freshman award, both are tops for any Big Ten program.

It marks the 18th Big Ten's Freshman of the Week award for Penn State as a program, the most distinctions by one program since the honor was installed by the conference during the 2010 season.

The rookie has won at least one individual title or the all-around in all eight of his NCAA competitions this season.

He has claimed two all-around crowns, won the floor exercise once, topped the vault and parallel bars three times apiece and won the still rings four times. His 13 titles are the most on the team in 2013.

## BIG TEN BEST TEN LIONS EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

The Nittany Lions are on top of the national poll and when the Big Ten announced their Academic All-Big Ten honors, Penn State sat a top those, as well.

The Blue and White had ten gymnasts earn the academic honor, the most of an Big Ten team.

**MEN'S GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Penn State has had its fair share of success at the Big Ten Championships, winning the 2008 and 2003 team titles, while claiming 20 individual crowns at the Big Ten Championships since joining the conference in 1992.

In 21 seasons in the Big Ten, the Nittany Lions have claimed at least one individual title during 10 of those seasons. Six times Penn State has brought home multiple event winners.

There have been 25 All-Big Ten pickets that have donned the blue and white over the years, with Kevin Tan (2002-03-04) and Derek Helsby (2006-07-08) each earning the honors on three occasions.

In 1998, Mike Dutka won the all-around, floor exercise, vault and pommel horse. He is one of just four gymnasts since 1980 to win four or more events at a single championship, joining Scott Vetere (Michigan, 2000) and Brian Meeker (Minnesota, 1982), who won four events, and Blaine Wilson (Ohio State, 1997), who claimed five event titles.

Of the 20 titles, seven have come on the still rings, four on the parallel bars, two on the high bar, pommel horse and vault and one on the floor exercise. Two of those have come on as the top all-arounder.

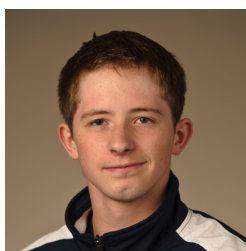

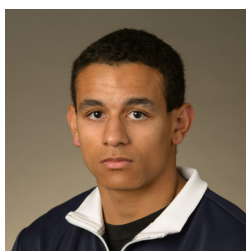

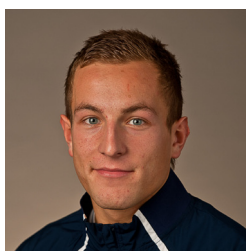
