SETTING THE SCENE

» Fourth seeded Penn State is set to make its second consecutive appearance in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals, taking on top-seeded Maryland Thursday, May 5 at 5:30 p.m. The matchup will broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Joe Beninati and Mark Dixon on the call.

» The Nittany Lions closed out the 2016 regular season with a 14-9 win against Michigan last weekend to earn a berth to the Big Ten Tournament and capture the Creator's Trophy. A total of six Nittany Lions found the scoring column in the win, led by multi-goal outings from four of the six. TJ Sanders, Nick Aponte and Grant Ament powered the offense, combining for eight goals and nine assists.

» Penn State and Maryland are meeting for the first time as Big Ten Tournament opponents with the Terrapins having claimed a close 11-10 win in OT in the regular season meeting at home at the Penn State Lacrosse Field.

» Four Nittany Lions earned Big Ten post season awards. Nick Aponte highlights the group as a unanimous First-Team All-Big Ten selection, while freshman Grant Ament and sophomore Mike Aronow earned All-Big Ten Honorable Mention honors. Senior James Chakey rounded out the group Penn State's Sportsmanship Award selection.

» Nick Aponte and Grant Ament garnered Big Ten Weekly Awards this week, following the win against Michigan. Aponte earns his first career Big Ten weekly award, named Co-Offensive Player of the Week after a five-point (4g/1a) performance, while Ament garnered his second consecutive Big Ten Freshman of the Week nod after leading the team with a seven-point outing (1g/6a).

ALL- BIG TEN NITTANY LIONS

Four Nittany Lions earned Big Ten post season awards. Nick Aponte highlights the group as a unanimous First-Team All-Big Ten selection, while freshman Grant Ament and sophomore Mike Aronow earned All-Big Ten Honorable Mention honors. Senior James Chakey rounded out the group as Penn State's Sportsmanship Award selection. Aponte is Penn State's first First-Team All-Big Ten selection in program history.

APONTE NAMED TEWAARATON NOMINEE

Junior Nick Aponte has been selected as a nominee for the 2016 Tewaaraton Award, as announced by the organization. Aponte is one of 25 members on the men's list, which features student-athletes from 16 different programs from around the country. Aponte is the first Nittany Lion to be named a Tewaaraton Award nominee since goalie Austin Kaut, who was named to the list in 2012 and 2013.

AMENT, APONTE EARN B1G WEEKLY HONORS

Both Nick Aponte and Grant Ament garnered Big Ten Weekly Awards this week, following Penn State's 14-9 win against Michigan. Aponte earns his first career Big Ten weekly award, named Co-Offensive Player of the Week after a five-point (4g/1a) performance against Michigan last week. Ament garnered his second consecutive Big Ten Freshman of the Week nod after leading the team with a sevenpoint outing against Michigan, posting a career-high six assists to go along with one goal and a personalbest four ground balls.

NOT FINISHED JUST YET

Penn State men's lacrosse paid tribute to its 2016 senior class, featuring James Burke, James Chakey, Ryan Guittare, Tommy O'Neill, TJ Sanders, John Von Nessen and Connor Darcey (posthumously) prior to its senior day win against Michigan in the regular season finale. Across four years, the 2016 senior class has earned 32 wins and has been a part of some of the most historic moments in Penn State lacrosse history ahead of this weekend's 2016 Big Ten Tournament.

In the 100th season of Penn State Lacrosse, they made their first appearance in the NCAA

Tournament since 2005 and set a program record with a 12-win season. 2015 brought another history moment as these seniors ushered in the inaugural season of Big Ten men's lacrosse, while also earning berth to the first Big Ten Tournament. Most recently, the 2016 seniors helped make more history, defeating No. 1 Denver to mark the first program victory over a top-ranked opponent.

CREATOR'S TROPHY CLAIMED

Penn State, Michigan and Ohio State compete for The Creator's Trophy, an annual award presented when a team is 2-0 against one of the other programs. In its fifth year, the trophy was created to honor the rivalries among the first three Big Ten lacrosse schools at the time Michigan added the sport in 2012. After defeating Ohio State and Michigan, PSU captured its third Creator's Trophy. PSU won the 2012 and 2014 titles, while OSU earned the trophy in 2013 and 2015.

AMENT EARNS ANOTHER B1G HONOR

Following a five-point outing on the road at No. 19 Rutgers, freshman Grant Ament earned his third career Big Ten Freshman of the Week honor. Ament scored two goals on just three shots, while also dishing out a team-high three assists. Registering five points, Ament also notched his eighth consecutive multi-point outing.

ALL ABOUT BALANCE

Penn State has a total of eight Nittany Lions with at least 10 goals on the year, with five of the 10 having posted at least 15 this season. Led by senior Nick Aponte's 26 goals, PSU has been helped out by at least six different goal scorers in all but one game this season.

HELPING OUT

Having notched at least five assists in all but three games this season, Penn State is averaging 7.29 assists per game, which ranks 10th nationally and second in the Big Ten conference.

Penn State's starting attack unit with Nick Aponte, TJ Sanders and Grant Ament features a trio with double figure assists and goals. With one assist in all but three games this season, Aponte has totaled 19 helpers. Leading the team with 34

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE TERRAPINS

SCOUTING MARYLAND

Big Ten regular season champion Maryland enters the matchup at 12-2 on the year, having posted a 5-0 mark in conference play. The Terps recently posted a program record with seven members of the team earning Big Ten postseason awards. Maryland led the conference with three First Team All-Big Ten honors.

SERIES HISTORY vs. MARYLAND

The Terrapins hold a 27-2 advantage in the alltime series against the Nittany Lions, including a 2-0 mark in Big Ten play. Penn State dropped a close 11-10 OT decision to the Terps earlier this season. The Nittany Lions and Maryland will meet in the Big Ten Tournament for the first time. The OT loss was the first of two for the Nittany Lions, who lost to then-No. 17 Johns Hopkins 12-11 in extra time the following week.

Sophomore goalie Will Schreiner recorded eight saves, while also totaling a team-high three ground balls. Junior Peter Triolo had two ground balls, while also causing one turnover. Sophomore Mike Aronow also finished with one caused turnover.

assists, Ament's averaging 2.43 per game, which ranks fourth nationally and second in the conference.

SUCCESS WITH SCORING

Penn State is outscoring its opponents 169-148 on the year, with a scoring offense that's ranked 14th nationally, averaging 12.07 goals per game. Penn State's .347 shot percentage is also slotted seventh nationally and first in the conference.

Penn State has scored at least 10 goals in nine of 14 games this season, at 6-3 in outings with 10 or more goals. The Nittany Lions are also outscoring their opponents in the first, second and third quarter, out-scoring foes 45-34 in the first.

Penn State scored 37 goals in just the first two games of the season, marking the most amount of goals in the first two games of the season in program history. The 37 goals were the most since Penn State scored 36 in the first two games of the 1987 season and the first 30-plus scoring through two games since the Nittany Lions had 33 goals in 2013.

FRESH CONTRIBUTIONS

Through 14 games, the Nittany Lion newcomers have continued to make their mark, contributing 45 goals and 43 assists for nearly 33 percent of the team's total point scoring this year. At least one freshman has scored in all 14 games this season for the Nittany Lions, with six rookies posting at least two goals on the year.

Grant Ament highlights the talented newcomer group with at least two goals in eight of the last 11 games, netting two in the win against No. 1 Denver and against No. 5 Maryland. Against Hobart, Ament recorded his first collegiate hat trick, while also tallying a pair of assists for a teamhigh five points. On the defensive end, Chris Sabia has started all 13 games and is tied for second on the team with nine caused turnovers.

All 16 Nittany Lion rookies saw action in Penn State's 2016 season-opening victory against Robert Morris. Making the most of their debuts, a total of six newcomers combined for seven goals and six assists. Trevor Scollins also saw action in goal, notching two saves in 10:50 seconds between the pipes.

SANDERS NEARING ANOTHER MILESTONE

With a team-high four goals in Penn State's win against Robert Morris, senior TJ Sanders notched his 100th career goal to join an elite group as just the seventh Nittany Lion all-time to amass 100 career goals. As the first Nittany Lion to hit the mark since Jack Forster in 2013, he needs four more goals to tie for first all-time. Sanders has scored at least two goals in all but five games this season and is one of two Nittany Lions in program history to notch 120 goals.

SCHREINER EARNS 3RD B1G WEEKLY AWARD

After a career-high performance in Penn State's Big Ten opener at Ohio State, sophomore Will Schreiner has earned Big Ten Specialist of the Week honors. Schreiner led the team with a career-high 15 saves in the Nittany Lions' 6-5 win. He made six saves in the fourth quarter alone, marking a season-high tally in a single frame. He allowed just five goals in the victory, which is also a season-low mark for Penn State this year.

KEENAN PICKS UP BIG TEN AWARD

Following a career-high outing against top-ranked Denver, sophomore Ryan Keenan earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors. The award is the first of Keenan's career, as he shares it with Maryland's Connor Kelly. Keenan was one of two Nittany Lions to register a hat trick in Penn State's win against the top-ranked Pioneers.

FINDING MOMENTUM AT ATTACK

Penn State's starting attack unit consisting of veterans TJ Sanders and Nick Aponte and freshman Grant Ament has combined for 72 goals and 66 assists, for just about 50 percent of the team's total point-scoring this year.

With each member of the trio having posted at least 40 points or more on the year, Ament leads the way with 53 points, while Aponte is second with 45. Ament and Aponte have registered at least 19 goals and assists apiece, serving as a duo that can successfully distribute and finish.

In Big Ten games, they produced 27 goals and 21 assists for 48 of the team's 86 points.. Aponte recently matched a career-mark three times with four goals in the last three games, while Sanders had a hat trick against Michigan.

NITTANY LIONS UPSET NO. 1 DENVER

Penn State put an end to a 20-game Denver winning streak, upsetting the top-ranked Pioneers, 15-10, to capture the 2016 Patriot Cup at SMU's Ford Stadium. The Nittany Lion victory marks the first win over a No. 1 ranked opponent in Penn State program history.

Junior Dan Craig and sophomore Ryan Keenan powered a group of five Nittany Lions with multigoal outings, scoring a pair of hat tricks. Penn State out-shot the Pioneers 33-26, putting 23 shots on goal to Denver's 16. Penn State also won the ground ball battle, 31-27 as Billy Lombardi finished 13-for-28 from the faceoff "x."

After trailing in the first quarter, Penn State used a six-goal surge to enter halftime leading, 8-6. The Nittany Lions out-scored the Pioneers 4-1 in the third quarter to build the lead to as many as five, 15-7. Denver looked to get back on track with three goals in the final four minutes, but Penn State held off the pressure to secure the win.

DUO EARNS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONOR

After helping Penn State to a pair of wins at Furman and against No. 8 Harvard, sophomore Will Schreiner and freshman Grant Ament earned Big Ten Weekly awards. Schreiner earns his second career Big Ten Co-Specialist of the Week nod, while Ament also picks up his second career Big Ten Freshman of the Week laurel.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Penn State Lacrosse's expansive alumni base is bound to produce a few connections among current Nittany Lions, and this year's team is no exception. Matt Florence's father Tom was a goalie at Penn State from 1982-85. J.J. Pearl, who ranks fifth in career saves (557 from 1989-92), is also sophomore Hunter Pearl's father.

Schreiner averaged 9.5 saves per game for the Nittany Lions in a 2-0 week. After recording nine saves in the win against the Paladins, he led the team with a career-high 10 saves in a thrilling overtime win over the Crimson.

Ament finished second on the team with eight points during the undefeated week, as one of two Nittany Lions to total five assists across both outings. He dished out two assists at Furman, adding one goal. Against Harvard, he logged three assists and scored two goals, marking his fifth straight game with at least one goal.

APONTE LEADS PSU PAST NO. 8 HARVARD IN OT

Behind junior Nick Aponte's game winning goal, Penn State knocked off No. 8/7 Harvard 13-12, for a thrilling overtime victory last week. A total of eight Nittany Lions found the scoring column, led by hat tricks from Aponte and senior TJ Sanders.

Sophomore Josh Wellman highlighted the game with a career-high outing from the faceoff "x," winning 18-of-29 attempts, while also collecting 10 ground balls. Penn State shot out to a 6-3 lead in the first quarter before allowing a 5-2 Harvard run. The Nittany Lions held the Crimson without a goal in the third quarter as Mike Sutton and Dan Craig scored back-to-back goals, but Harvard battled back with four straight to tie the score, 12-12, forcing overtime.

Penn State held off early pressure from the Crimson in the opening part of the overtime period, but Ament found Aponte for the game winner with 2:59 remaining to secure the win.

A FAST START

Following Penn State's 8-7 win on the road at No. 18 Cornell, the Nittany Lions improved to 3-0 on the year, marking the best start for the program since 2002. The 3-0 start to the 2016 season marked a first for head coach Jeff Tambroni, who has directed the Nittany Lions to back-to-back wins in the first two weeks of the season twice in the last four years.

SCHREINER EARNS BIG TEN LAUREL

Penn State's Will Schreiner earned Big Ten Specialist of the Week honors after helping direct the Nittany Lions to their third straight victory on the road at No. 18/15 Cornell. He becomes the first Nittany Lion in program history to earn Big Ten Specialist of the Week honors. Schreiner logged seven saves in Penn State's thrilling 8-7 victory against the Big Red, marking the team's first win over a nationally ranked opponent this season. He registered three saves in the fourth quarter alone, including one huge save in the final minute of the game to keep the Nittany Lions on top for the win. He also led the team with three ground balls.

DUO NAMED TO TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

Penn State's Nick Aponte and TJ Sanders have been named to the 2016 Tewaaraton Award watch list. The Nittany Lion duo is among the top players across all three divisions of NCAA Lacrosse to be recognized as early contenders for the prestigious award, presented by Under Armour. The Tewaaraton Award, annually honors the top male and female college lacrosse player in the United States. On April 28, the field will be narrowed to 25 men's and 25 women's nominees.

PENN STATE HOLDS OFF CORNELL, 8-7

No. 20 Penn State held off No. 18 Cornell for a thrilling 8-7 victory on the road at Schoellkopf Field. The Big Red jumped out to a fast start, scoring two quick goals, including one just five seconds in to take over an early lead.

Mike Sutton and Matt Florence responded for the Nittany Lions to tie the score, 2-2 with 1:30 remaining in the first. Penn State and Cornell kept it close in the second quarter until the Big Red broke open the tied score with a goal to pull ahead 3-2 as time expired in the first half.

The Nittany Lions came out of the intermission firing, using a 5-0 scoring streak to take control. James Chakey opened the stretch, followed by back-to-back goals from TJ Sanders. Kevin Fox and Ryan Keenan followed with a pair of goals to widen the advantage to four, 7-3 with 2:41 left in the third quarter. The Big Red came storming back with four consecutive goals, scoring the last two 38 seconds apart to knot the score, 7-7 with 5:13 left in the game. Florence came through in the clutch with his second goal of the afternoon to send the Nittany Lions ahead for good, 8-7.

PENN STATE RALLIES PAST HOBART

Helped out by an offensive surge in the fourth quarter, Penn State rallied past Hobart to earn its second straight win. Penn State's offense fired on all cylinders in the fourth quarter as the Nittany Lions came from behind to close out the game with nine goals in 11 minutes to secure the win.

Grant Ament, TJ Sanders and Ryan Keenan led the team with three goals apiece. Both Keenan and Ament's multi-goal scoring outings marked career high efforts for the pair. Ament also added two assists to lead the team with five points.

Matt Florence and Dan Craig posted multi-goal outings, registering two goals each. Brian Prestreau, Kevin Fox and Billy Lombardi and Mike Sutton all logged one goal apiece to round out the balanced group of goal scorers.

AMENT EARNS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

Penn State's Grant Ament earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors after helping guide the Nittany Lions to a 20-7 victory against Robert Morris. Ament is the first Nittany Lion in program history to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors and the fourth conference weekly award-winner all-time.

Ament recorded two goals and led the team with five assists for a seven-point outing in his collegiate debut in the Blue and White against the Colonials. He put away his first collegiate goal in the first quarter, just one minute after registering his first collegiate assist. After tallying four consecutive assists in the second quarter, he closed out the afternoon with Penn State's 17th goal of the game for a multi-goal outing against Robert Morris.

PENN STATE IN SEASON OPENERS

The Nittany Lions improved to 21-17 all-time after downing Robert Morris 20-7 in this year's 2016 season-opener. With the victory, Penn State has won each of its last four season opening games. Penn State is also 5-1 in yearly openers under head coach Jeff Tambroni.

HOME SWEET HOME

The 2016 Penn State men's lacrosse schedule features double the home dates this season as the Nittany Lions are set to welcome eight opponents to University Park this year. PSU hosts back-to-back games at home in the first two weeks of the season for the first time since 2014, hosting Robert Morris and Hobart. Other non-conference dates include Villanova (2/27), Harvard (3/12) and UMASS (3/19). The Big Ten slate is also set to take place mostly at home with Penn State hosting Maryland (4/10), Johns Hopkins (4/17) and Michigan (4/30).

PSU PICKED FOURTH IN B1G COACHES POLL

Penn State has been voted fourth in the 2016 Big Ten Preseason Coaches' Poll with Nittany Lions redshirt juniors Matt Florence, Drake Kreinz and senior TJ Sanders named Penn State's Players to Watch. Johns Hopkins claimed the top spot in the 2016 poll with a unanimous selection from the league's head coaches. Maryland and Ohio State rounded out the top three at spots two and three, respectively. Michigan and Rutgers were selected fifth and sixth.

BIG TEN PRESEASON PLAYERS TO WATCH

Redshirt seniors Matt Florence and Drake Kreinz and senior TJ Sanders earned Penn State Big Ten Preseason Player to Watch honors. The preseason nod is the second straight for Kreinz and Sanders, who both earned 2015 Player to Watch honors prior to the first year of Big Ten lacrosse.

Florence earns his first career Big Ten preseason honor, having capped off the season with Big Ten All-Tournament team honors. A 2015 Academic All-Big Ten selection, Kreinz served once again as Penn State's top faceoff specialist in 2015, playing in 13 of 14 games. A USILA All-America honorable mention, Sanders returns as one of the Nittany Lions' top offensive contributors in 2016, having earned both All-Big Ten honorable mention distinction and Academic All-Big Ten awards last year.

TRIO TO LEAD AS 2016 CAPTAINS

A trio of midfielders will lead the team during its 2016 campaign. Seniors Tommy O'Neill and James Burke and redshirt junior Drake Kreinz have been voted as captains. The process for choosing captains has remained unchanged for years and Jeff Tambroni is confident in the system he has in place.

"There are a number of different factors going into the captains process," Tambroni said. "One is a consensus vote from last years team, we want to get exiting seniors, graduating seniors opinions on who they believe will lead this team most effectively."

After the team vote, Tambroni and fellow assistant coaches evaluate upperclassmen during the fall semester before making a final decision. Penn State men's lacrosse has experimented with the number of captains the team has every year. In 2014 three seniors led the team but in 2015 the task fell solely on senior Kyle Zittel.

TAMBRONI SIGNS 11 TO NLI

Jeff Tambroni has announced the signing of 11 newcomers to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period. From U.S. Lacrosse All-Americans and MVPs to state champions and honor roll athletes, this year's class features a talented group poised to join the team in 2016.

Gerard Arceri (Saint James, N.Y.), Nick Cardile (West Grove, Pa.), TJ Connellan (Cazenovia, N.Y.), Colby Kneese (Dallas, Texas), Nick McEvoy (Bethesda, Md.), Mac O'Keefe (Syosset, N.Y.), Kane Randolph (Annapolis, Md.), Jack Rusboldt (Richmond, Va.), Mitch Schaefer (Canandaigua, N.Y.), Conor Smith (West Islip, N.Y.) and Barrett Sutley (Stevenson, Md.) are all set to arrive in Happy Valley. Three of the signees are ranked within Inside Lacrosse's list of top 25 recruits with Arceri ranked No. 11, O'Keefe tabbed No. 23 and McEvoy slotted No. 25.

WHO'S BACK?

Penn State returns nearly all of its offensive production from last year, including Nittany Lion top scorer and USILA All-America honorable mention, TJ Sanders, who led the team with 29 goals and 13 assists in 2015 for a team-high 42 points. Mike Sutton also joins Sanders as one of two 20-plus goal scorers from last year. Sutton closed out the year second on the team with 24 goals, including eight multi-goal outings. Both Sanders and Sutton both earned 2015 All-Big Ten honorable mention distinction.

Another top returner at attack is Nick Aponte, who transitioned from midfield to attack late in 2015 season. Prior to the move, Penn State averaged 8.9 goals per game, but since transitioning in the first meeting against Johns Hopkins (4/17), the team improved to 10.33 goals per game, with Aponte highlighting the remainder of the season with three goals and one assist for four points in a close 10-9 victory against Michigan.

In the midfield, Penn State returns Big Ten All-Tournament Team honoree Matt Florence, who finished third on the team with 16 goals in 2015. Also moving positions last year and returning is Dan Craig, who transitioned from attack to the midfield mid-year. He scored 11 goals and finished second on the team with nine assists. Craig also enters the 2016 season with at least one goal in the last four consecutive games. Other returners at midfield include Brian Prestreau and Chris Young. Prestreau saw action in 13 of 14 games, notching five goals including one in each of the last two games of the season.

At defensive midfield, the Nittany Lions have a veteran crew of seniors: James Burke, Tommy O'Neill and James Chakey, with Burke at the longstick. Burke registered a team-high12 caused turnovers to go along with 34 ground balls. Defensively speaking, Penn State has Peter Triolo returning at close defense, who played in 13 games, starting the final 10.

Penn State is also solid at the faceoff "X" with returner Drake Kreinz who finished 129-237 on the year with a .544 winning clip.

WHO'S GONE?

Penn State is tasked with replacing standout goalie Connor Darcey, who passed away suddenly last summer. Darcey played all 14 games, recorded 176 saves with a .553 save percentage on the year. The Nittany Lions also saw departures from defenseman JP Burnside and Pat Manley at attack. Manley played in 13 of 14 games, tallying 12 goals and six assists for 18 points.

WHO'S NEW?

Ranked No.12 nationally by Inside Lacrosse, Penn State welcomes 16 newcomers in its freshmen class this year. The class includes five All-Americans, eight all-conference honorees, three all-league picks and a Canadian national champion. Defenseman Tommy Wright was slotted No. 12 in Inside Lacrosse's Power 100 Freshman Rankings while attackman Grant Ament came in at No. 31. Midfielder Drew Petkevich was slated No. 67, while Kevin Hill (midfield) and Robby Black (midfield) rounded out the group at No. 81 and No. 93, respectively.

UP NEXT

Should the Nittany Lions defeat top-seeded Maryland, they will advance to the Big Ten championship game for the first time in program history. Penn State would meet the winner of the No. 2 Rutgers/No. 3 Johns Hopkins semifinal Saturday, May 7.

MEN'S LACROSSE TOURNAMENT

2016 marks the second year of the Big Ten Men's Lacrosse Tournament. Featuring four of the six Big Ten conference teams, the two-day event features back-to-back semifinal games Thursday, May 5 with the winners of each matchup advancing to the championship Saturday, May 7.

Last year, top-seeded Johns Hopkins captured the title in the inaugural Big Ten Tournament, defeating No. 3 seed Ohio State, 13-6. The fourth-seeded Nittany Lions dropped a 14-9 decision to the Blue Jays in the semifinals.

The Big Ten Network will broadcast both semifinal games, while the champion-ship game will broadcast live on ESPN2.

SELECTED PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

ROOKIE TO THE RESCUE - On the Penn State alltime single season record list, Grant Ament's 34 assists are the most by a Nittany Lion since John Hollerbach notched 38 in 1989. With the second-most assists among freshman in the NCAA, his 2.43 assists per game ranks second in the conference and fourth nationally.

HE'S STREAKING – Nick Aponte has matched a career-high mark with a squad-best four goals in each of the last three consecutive games. He's also in the midst of a 31-game point-scoring streak that dates back to April 5, 2014. His streak is the 16th longest active streak in NCAA DI, including 71 total points.

SOPHOMORE SURGE – In his first year as a starter, Mike Aronow has established himself as a key component to the Nittany Lion close defense. With a team-high 13 caused turnovers, he has forced multiple miscues in four games this season. He's also tallied at least one ground ball in all but four outings this season, totaling four in Penn State's 6-5 win on the road at Ohio State in its 2016 Big Ten opener.

NO. 16, JAMES BURKE – Team captain James Burke changed his jersey number from 23 to 16 in honor of the late Connor Darcey. In his senior season he was a prominent faceoff wing and defensive midfielder – picking up 19 ground balls and causing five turnovers in nine games.

CRAIG'S CRAZY GOALS – Craig scored his second career hat trick against No. 1 Denver en route to the program's first win over a top-ranked team. Craig's behind-the-back goal against the Pioneers was featured on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays.

FLORENCE IN THE CLUTCH – Matt Florence has proved to be a clutch offensive option for the Nittany Lions at all the right times this season. Florence netted his second game-winner of the season in Penn State's win at Ohio State, scoring with 1:41 remaining in the fourth quarter to break open a tied score and secure a 6-5 win.

Earlier this season, he scored with 3:49 in the fourth quarter to secure an 8-7 win at Cornell. Most recently, he netted an equalizer against then-No. 17 Johns Hopkins at 11-all to send the game into a decisive overtime period.

HILL MANS UP – Kevin Hill is Penn State's goto man-up goal scorer, leading the team with five goals on the man-advantage. He is the only Nittany Lion to score two man-up goals in a single game this season (April 30 vs. Michigan). Hill's 13 goals on the year are the second-most among freshmen on the team.

KEEPING IT KEENAN – Ryan Keenan played the best game of his career in the Nittany Lions' win against No. 1 Denver, scoring three goals and dishing out two assists. Keenan is one of eight Penn State players with at least 10 goals on the season.

LOMBARDI STEPPING UP – Billy Lombardi won 103 of 213 faceoffs in 13 appearances, finishing with a .484 clip at the faceoff "x." He leads the Nittany Lions with 36 ground balls and has registered seven ground balls in three games this year. He went 15-for-26 with seven ground balls against then-No. 17 Johns Hopkins

AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT - Christopher Sabia picked up 24 ground balls and caused 10 turnovers in his first season at Penn State. Sabia and Grant Ament are the only freshmen to start all 14 games for the Nittany Lions this season.

VETERAN SANDERS – TJ Sanders' 123 career goals are second-most in Penn State history and just four shy of Will Driscoll's 127. Sanders' 13 assists on the season also matches a careerhigh mark, set in 2015. Sanders has registered at least 40 points in three of his four seasons at Penn State.

SAVES BY SCHREINER – Schreiner made 123 on 262 shots faced during his first season between the pipes, finishing the regular season with a .469 save percentage. Schreiner made a career-high 15 saves in Penn State's 6-5 win at Ohio State on April 3 in its Big Ten opener.

SCORING FROM SUTTON – Mike Sutton is one of five Nittany Lions with at least 20 points on the year (18 goals, two assists). He highlighted the season with two hat tricks, most recently netting three in Penn State's tough 11-10 OT. loss to then-No. 5 Maryland at home. Sutton earned his way into the starting lineup, having not started the first four games of the season.

TRIOLO ON DEFENSE – Triolo started every game on defense for Penn State. He caused nine turnovers and scooped up four ground balls during the regular season. He recorded his first career point dishing out an assist on a James Chakey goal in the season-opening win vs. Robert Morris (2/6).

2009 USILA DI COACH OF THE YEAR 2011 CAA CO-COACH OF THE YEAR 2013 CAA COACH OF THE YEAR

After guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni returns for his sixth season as Penn State's head coach in 2016.

Tambroni guided the Nittany Lions through a historic season in 2015 that brought Penn State's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament following the first ever season of Big Ten lacrosse. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked No. 14 in the USILA DI Preseason Coaches' Poll and knocked off No. 16/11 Penn during the 2015 season. Tambroni also led Penn State to its first two Big Ten conference victories as well as a berth to the conference tournament. He also mentored rising senior TJ Sanders to USILA All-America honorable mention honors.

In 2014, Tambroni led Penn State to its fourth consecutive above-.500 season. His student-athletes earned the eighth USILA All-American and third Scholar All-America honors of Tambroni's Penn State career. He also coached goalkeeper Austin Kaut to his school record third All-America honor and conference-best All-CAA First Team award.

Penn State's 2013 campaign saw Tambroni lead Penn State to one of the greatest seasons in program history while celebrating its 100th season. The Nittany Lions set new records for wins (12) and earned the program's first outright regular season conference title by sweeping the CAA with a 6-0 record. PSU rattled off 10 straight wins from March through May to earn the school's third NCAA bid and first chance to host an NCAA game.

Tambroni was named CAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2011), while Kaut (under Tambroni's tutelage) was named Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalie. Also, Kaut was CAA Player and Defensive Player of the Year. TJ Sanders was named Rookie of the Year and the Nittany Lions placed six on the All-CAA First Team.

During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a secondplace CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees. Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.

During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Penn State kicked off the 2016 season with a dominant 20-7 victory against Robert Morris Saturday afternoon at Holuba Hall.

"We're thrilled," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "I thought our guys came out of the locker room and from the start of the game at the first whistle they played a very inspired game of lacrosse and gained a ton of momentum in the second and third guarter."

Penn State jumped out to an early lead in the first quarter as Matt Florence found the back of the net off an assist from Nick Aponte less than two minutes into the game to spark a 5-0 scoring streak. Aponte, Grant Ament, James Chakey and Brain Prestreau all added goals during the stretch.

Looking to spark some momentum, Robert Morris' Eric Rankel popped in a goal to cut the Nittany Lion advantage to four with less than two minutes remaining. Florence answered with his second goal of the quarter to send Penn State ahead 6-1 at the end of the frame.

The Colonials opened the second quarter with a goal from JonPatrick Kealey to trim the gap back to four, 6-2. Penn State came storming back with 11 consecutive goals spanning the remainder of the second quarter and into the third to surge ahead by as many as 15, 17-2.

TJ Sanders kicked off the scoring streak with back-to-back goals, scoring his first on an extra-man opportunity after the Colonials were whistled for cross-checking. Sanders powered the charge with a total of four goals in the offensive push, while Mike Sutton, Aponte, Florence, Robby Black, Prestreau, Kevin Fox and Ament all chipped in a goal apiece to bolster the lead.

Penn State (4-2) and Furman went back and forth in the first quarter until Hill broke open the scoring for the Nittany Lions with an extra-man goal with 7:32 remaining in the stanza. After Furman (0-5) netted an equalizer, junior Craig burned his defender with a split dodge and ran to the crease and scored his first of the afternoon to give Penn State a 2-1 lead with 4:06 left in the first quarter.

The Nittany Lions continued the momentum as Sanders dished a pass across the middle to Aponte, who scored to send Penn State into the second quarter with a two-goal lead, 3-1. Hill stretched the Nittany Lion scoring streak to three straight, as he converted on a pass from Aponte for his second goal of the game to bring PSU ahead 4-1 with 13:05 remaining in the half. Furman looked to get back on track with a goal to make it 4-2, but Sanders responded with his first goal of the afternoon to lift the Nittany Lions back up by three, 5-2, with 1:16 to play in the half.

After killing a minor penalty to start the second half, Aponte drew a doubleteam as he tried to drive through the defense, leaving Sutton wide open. Sutton launched a rocket to the top corner and gave Penn State a four-goal lead, 6-2, just 1:45 into the second half.

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PHILADELPHIA - No. 20 Penn State's fourth quarter rally fell short as the Nittany Lions dropped an 11-7 decision to Penn Saturday at Franklin Field.

Trailing by as many as seven, 9-2, heading into the final period of play, the Nittany Lions rebounded with five goals in the fourth quarter but could not complete the comeback as the Quakers held off Penn State.

"I thought every time we tried to fix sometime Penn came right back," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "Momentum and possession time seemed to have not favored us all that well, but that's on us, not a particular unit."

Penn opened the game scoring 25 seconds in for an early lead, before adding two more goals to send the Nittany Lions into the second quarter trailing 2-0.

Billy Lombardi matched a career-high mark, finishing 14-for-19 from the faceoff X, while also leading the team with a career-best seven ground balls.

"It was good to see us win more face offs, that was good. It's a sign of moving in a positive direction," Tambroni said.

Mike Aronow also matched a career-high mark finishing second on the team with four ground balls. Tommy O'Neill and James Chakey added three ground balls, as Penn State won the ground ball battle, 35-28, against the Quakers.

The Quakers scored once more in the second frame before Nick Aponte halted the streak with a goal to put Penn State on the board, 4-1 with 6:10 remaining in the quarter. Penn answered back with a 3-0 stretch, scoring the first goal of the strike on the man advantage to stretch the Quaker lead to as many as six, 7-1 at halftime.

Nearly two minutes into the third quarter, Matt Florence scored to cut the deficit to five, 7-2. Penn responded with back-to-back goals to send the Nittany Lions into the fourth quarter trailing 9-2.

TJ Sanders sparked the Nittany Lions' fourth-quarter with his first goal of the game to shave the deficit to six, 9-3. COLUMBUS, Ohio - No. 18 Penn State opened the 2016 Big Ten conference slate with a 6-5 win on the road at Ohio State Sunday afternoon at Ohio Stadium.

"We're extremely excited to get the win, a road win let alone a Big Ten win, against a team as competitive as Ohio State," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "I think both of those elements are extremely important as the season goes on and it speaks to not only the character of the leadership that we have, but also the preparation coming off of an emotional win in Texas against Denver. I think in so many different ways it was a great win for us."

Craig put the Nittany Lions on the board early, scoring unassisted to make it 1-0 with 13:53 left in the first quarter. The Buckeyes answered back with a goal to even the score, 1-1, but Spillane followed with his second of the season less than two minutes later to put Penn State back on top, 2-1, with 3:30 remaining in the first quarter.

Aponte found the net just 49 seconds into the second quarter, scoring on a pass from Sanders to send the Nittany Lions ahead by two, 3-1. The Nittany Lions continued to hold off pressure from the Buckeyes as Schreiner posted four saves to protect the Penn State advantage. With 2:34 remaining in the opening half, Sanders found Sutton cutting in front of the net for his first goal of the afternoon to push PSU ahead, 4-1, heading into halftime.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 14 Penn State came up short in a close 11-10 overtime loss against No. 5 Maryland at the Penn State Lacrosse Field.

"I don't think there was a lot of negative from tonight and that's a tough thing," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "We still lost and other than the fact that it's a loss, I thought our guys played their hearts out on this field and that's what we ask them to do. They did it, but we just couldn't make one more play at the end."

Maryland opened the scoring with a goal with 12:39 remaining in the first quarter to pull ahead early. The Nittany Lions answered with back-to-back goals from Sutton and Aponte to move ahead, 2-1 with less than 10 minutes to play in the quarter. The Terps came battling back with two more goals to go back on top, 3-2 with 6:27 left in the opening frame. PSU responded with a 3-0 streak, as Ament, Hill and Aponte all scored to give the Nittany Lions a two-goal lead, 5-3, heading into the second quarter.

The Terrapins cut the deficit to one, 5-4, with 14:02 left in the half, but the Nittany Lions regrouped with another 3-0 scoring streak, as two goals from Sutton and one from Sanders sent Penn State ahead by as many as four, 8-4 with 9:39 remaining in the second quarter. PSU continued to hold off the Maryland offense until the Terps opened a 3-0 run with 9:39 left in the frame to enter halftime just one goal behind the Nittany Lions at 8-7.

Maryland continued the scoring into the third quarter, scoring with 13:56 remaining to even the score, 8-8, for the first time since the opening frame. After receiving a pass from junior Dan Craig, Ament faked high before scoring low to give the Nittany Lions the edge, 9-8. Maryland responded with a goal to tie the score once again, 9-9, knotting the frame as time expired in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions opened the scoring with a goal Aponte to move ahead 1-0 with 10:05 left in the opening frame. The Wolverines answered back with a pair of goals, scoring one on the EMO to pull ahead, 2-1, with 7:46 remaining in the first quarter.

Penn State came storming back with six unanswered goals as the Nittany Lions held Michigan scoreless for more than 10 minutes on the way to a five-goal lead, 7-2 with 7:45 remaining in the second guarter. Both Sutton and Hill led the way with two goals apiece during the scoring stretch. Michigan answered back with a short-handed goal 12 seconds later to open a 3-1 strike that brought the Wolverines within three, 8-5.

Aponte looked to break up the stretch with an unassisted goal with just over a minute remaining in the second quarter, but Michigan scored with 13 seconds left to send Penn State into halftime leading by three, 9-6.

The Wolverines came out of the intermission firing, scoring back-to-back goals to arrive within one, 9-8 with 12:26 left to play in the third guarter. Penn State regrouped with another offensive surge, using a 5-0 run helped out by goals from Aponte, Sanders, Hill, Florence and Ament to take its largest lead of the game, 14-8, with 8:04 remaining in the fourth quarter.
