Russell Sweeps B1G Weekly Awards Again

For the second time this season, Ohio State freshman guard D'Angelo Russell has swept both the Big Ten Player and Freshman of the Week awards. Russell now has a pair of B1G POW honors and six FOW awards. Russell, the nation's top freshman scorer at 19.5 points per game, averaged 21.5 points, 9.0 rebounds and 8.0 assists last week, helping the Buckeyes to a split in road games at Purdue (L, 60-58) and Rutgers (W, 79-60). Against Rutgers, Russell recorded the fourth triple-double in Ohio State history with 23 points, 11 rebounds and a career-high 11 assists. The feat was the first by an Ohio State freshman, the first by a freshman this year in college basketball, the first for a Buckeye vs. a Big Ten opponent and the first on the road. Russell is the third Ohio State player to record a triple-double. Dennis Hopson was the first with 27 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists vs. Ohio University at St. John Arena Dec. 6, 1986. The Buckeyes won that game 93-75. Evan Turner had two triple-doubles during his junior National Player of the Year campaign in 2009-10. The first was a 14-point, 17-rebound, 10-assist effort vs. Alcorn State Nov. 9, 2009 at Value City Arena. The second was Nov. 28, 2009 at home vs. Lipscomb in an 84-64 win. He tallied 16 points, 10 rebounds and 11 assists in that game.

Buckeyes Lead in B1G Rookie Award

With D'Angelo Russell's sweep of Big Ten weekly honors Feb. 9, Ohio State now has tallied the most Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors and the most Big Ten Player of the Week laurels earned by freshmen. The Buckeyes' 13 freshmen who earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors are one more than Indiana and Ohio State's 20 Big Ten Freshman and Michigan. Jared Sullinger garnered Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors 12 times, while

Buckeyes Have Most Home Wins Since 2010

Ohio State has the most home wins nationally with a 103-9 (.920) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland and Wisconsin are the nextbest Big Ten teams at No. 18t with 86-17 and 86-12 records, respectively. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes also own the national lead in home victories with 118 wins over 130 games (118-12). The Buckeyes also have played the second-most ranked teams in the country during the Thad Matta era (2005-present). Ohio State has played 108 opponents ranked among the Associated Press Top 25 since Matta became head coach. That total trails only Michigan State (112) during that span (see page 7 for more information).

Matta 22-5 vs. Rookie B1G Coaches

Since the Big Ten began expanding with the addition of Penn State in 1990, the league added three more teams to the league in Nebraska (2011), Maryland (2015) and Rutgers (2015). The Scarlet Knights and Buckeyes met for the first time Sunday as league opponents. Ohio State is 9-5 in first-time meetings with league foes. The Buckeyes have won the last six such games, including the 79-60 win at Rutgers and the 80-56 win in Columbus vs. Maryland Jan. 19. Since Thad Matta took over the Ohio State program in 2004-05, he has faced 15 coaches in their first year in league. He is 22-5 vs. first-year Big Ten coaches, which includes a 14-0 record in Columbus. Matta is 8-5 in road games vs. coaches in their first year in the league.

Remaining Game Times Finalized

Game times for Ohio State home games vs. Purdue March 1 and Wisconsin March 8 have been set. The game vs. the Boilermakers will tip at 7:30 p.m. ET Sunday, March 1. The Wisconsin game, the final regular-season game of the year and senior day for Shannon Scott, Sam Thompson, Amir Williams, Trey McDonald and Anthony Lee, will tip at 4:30 p.m. ET Sunday, March 8. Ohio State's game at Michigan Sunday, Feb. 22, was recently confirmed for a 1 p.m. ET tip.

Wayman Tisdale Watch List Includes Russell

The 2015 Integris Wayman Tisdale Award Midseason Watch List includes 14 players under consideration for the national freshman of the year award. Ohio State's D'Angelo Russell is among the contenders. Russell is the leading freshman scorer in the country at 19.5 ppg. He also is among the leaders in several other categories. He has earned two Big Ten player of the week ward and six league freshman of the week accolades, including the last

four. Ohio State's Jared Sullinger earned the 2011 Wayman Tisdale Freshman of the Year Award following his rookie campaign.

Matta Climbing All-Time Big Ten Wins Chart

Thad Matta has 128 career regular-season wins in Big Ten Conference play to rank No. 15 all-time in Big Ten history. Matta passed Dr. Tom Davis of Iowa (125 wins from 1986-99) with an 82-70 win in Columbus vs. Indiana Jan. 26.

Scouting the Nittany Lions

Penn State is 15-9 overall and 3-8 in the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions opened the season with a 12-1 record prior to the conference opener vs. Wisconsin. Penn State dropped its first six games in league play before back-to-back wins vs. Rutgers and Minnesota. Penn State fell to Illinois and Maryland on the road before a home game vs. Nebraska last Saturday, a 56-43 win for PSU. The Nittany Lions are led by the Big Ten's leading scorer D.J. Newbill, a three-year starter for the Lions following a transfer from Southern Mississippi after his freshman season. The Philadelphia native is the team's only double-figure scorer at 20.9 points per game. Senior forward Ross Travis leads the squad in rebounding with 6.2 boards per game. He hails from Chaska, Minnesota.

Ohio State vs. Penn State Series

Ohio State leads the all-time series with the Nittany Lions 29-14. The Buckeyes are 15-4 in Columbus, 11-8 in State College and own a 3-2 advantage in neutral site games. Thad Matta's Buckeyes are 17-2 vs. the Nittany Lions. Penn State has won the last two in the series. The Buckeyes are 7-1 at Penn State, 7-1 at Value City Arena and 3-0 in the Big Ten Tournament vs. the Nittany Lions. As a ranked team, Ohio State is 16-4 in the series and 12-2 under Matta's direction. Ohio State's senior class has played four games vs. the Nittany Lions. Sam Thompson is the leading scorer for the Buckeyes in the series with 7.8 points per game. Amir Williams is the top rebounder with 3.5 a contest. Williams also has made 6 of 9 field goals (.667). Trey McDonald is 6 of 8 (.750) from his post position.

Ohio State vs. The Big Ten

Ohio State is in its 103rd season as a member of the Big Ten Conference in 2014-15. The Buckeyes own an overall record of 778-689 against current league members. Thad Matta, in 15 seasons as a head coach, owns an overall record of 152-67

Buckeyes to Face Memphis in Miami in 2015-16

Ohio State added Memphis to the 2015-16 schedule when the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced the field for the first Hoophall Miami Invitational Jan. 22. Ohio State will take on the Tigers at American Airlines Arena Nov. 27 in Miami. The game is set for the day after Thanksgiving. Three other games to be played in Columbus also make up the event. The Buckeyes already are scheduled to play at Connecticut and against Kentucky in Brooklyn, New York, in the 2015 CBSSports Challenge.

Russell Among Wooden Midseason Top 25

The Los Angeles Athletic Club named Ohio State rookie D'Angelo Russell to the 2015 Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 Jan. 14. Russell is one of five freshmen nationally to make the list. In 24 games, Russell leads the Buckeyes with 19.5 points per game. That scoring average rates No. 1 in the country among freshmen. He has six times been named the Big Ten's Freshman of the Week and is one of only three players in the country to average more than 17 points, five rebounds and four assists.

Offense Clicked in Non-Conference Action

Ohio State scored 85 or more points in eight of 24 games this season and has eclipsed the 70-point plateau in 19 of 24 games. The last time Ohio State scored 85 or more points eight or more times in a season was in 2010-11. That team reached or surpassed 85 points 11 times.

Loving Among Big Ten Leaders at Line, From 3

Sophomore Marc Loving is one of the top shooters in the country, in the Big Ten and certainly on Ohio State's 2014-15 roster. The Toledo, Ohio, native is connecting 53 percent from 3-point range (42-79). He ranks No. 1 nationally in 3-point field goal percentage and No. 1 in the Big Ten.

Scott, Russell One of Top Combinations

Senior Shannon Scott and freshman D'Angelo Russell lead the country in combined assists per game with an average of 11.7 helpers a contest. Scott (6.3 apg.) is No. 7 nationally. Russell (5.4 apg.) rates No. 42. The next-closest is the duo from Providence, Kris Dunn with 7.5 apg. and Kyron Cartwright with 2.8 apg, for a combined 10.3 apg.

Matta Chasing Career, Ohio State History

Thad Matta has made a habit of achieving records and milestones over his coaching career, which spans 15 years. After a season at Butler, three at Xavier and the last 11 in Columbus, Matta coached his 500th career game as a head coach Dec. 13 vs. Morehead State. As an Ohio State head coach, the 13th in the history of the program, Matta is closing in on the all-time wins record currently held by Fred Taylor with 297 career wins over 18 seasons from 1959-1976. Matta needs five wins added to his Ohio State career record of 293-89 to claim the career wins record at Ohio State. Five wins also would give him 400 victories for his career (395-120). Matta teams have never failed to win at least 20 games. His Ohio State teams have averaged 27.5 victories over his 10 full years in Columbus.

Last Time vs. Penn State Game 29

Penn State 65, No. 22 Ohio State 63 Feb. 27, 2014, State College

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. -- D.J. Newbill scored 23 points, Tim Frazier added 16 and Penn State held off a late rally by No. 22 Ohio State for a 65-63 victory. The Buckeyes had a chance to win at the end. Coming out of a timeout with 6.8 seconds left, Lenzelle Smith Jr.'s 3-pointer rimmed out. The Nittany Lions grabbed the rebound and time expired. Ohio State was led by LaQuinton Ross, who scored 19 points. Aaron Craft, plagued by foul trouble most of the game, added 10. Nittany Lions forward Donovan Jack made a turnaround jumper, was fouled and hit the free throw to give Penn State a 60-55 lead with 1:59 to go. Ross and Craft each made a pair of free throws, sandwiched around two by Frazier, to pull the Buckeyes to 62-59 with just more than a minute to go. Frazier pushed Penn State's lead to five with 39.4 seconds left with a pair of free throws. After Ross made two more free throws, Shannon Scott stole the inbounds pass and passed to Trey McDonald for a layup that cut it to 64-63. Penn State missed two free throws on the ensuing possession, but Smith's shot caromed off the rim and over the backboard, giving the Nittany Lions the ball back with less than 10 seconds left. Frazier was fouled and made one of two at the line, setting up Smith's last-second attempt from 3-point range.

Buckeyes in the B1G

Shannon Scott is leading the Big Ten Conference and is No. 10 in the nation in total assists with 150. He is No. 1 in the league and No. 10 nationally with an average of 6.3 apg. He is No. 4 in the conference with an average of 1.9 steals a game (45 total). Marc Loving is the league's top shooter from 3-point range (42-79/.532). D'Angelo Russell leads the conference in 3-point field goals made with 69 (2.9 3pg). He also is No. 2 in scoring average (19.5 ppg.), No. 3 in 3-point field goal percentage (69-155/.445) and No. 3 in assists (130/5.4 apg.) Freshman Jae'Sean Tate is No. 3 in field goal percentage (.583/81-139) and senior Amir Williams is No. 2 in blocked shots (41/1.9). As a team, Ohio State leads in field goal percentage (.503). The Buckeyes are No. 2 in scoring margin (17.6 ppg.), blocked shots (5.2), scoring offense (79.0 ppg.), assist/turnover ratio (+1.5), steals (8.3 spg.), field goal defense (.390), 3-point field goal defense (.309) and turnover margin (+4.6).

Russell Among Nation's Best Freshmen

Among true freshmen nationally, Ohio State rookie D'Angelo Russell is the leading scorer in the country with an average of 19.5 points a game over his first 24 appearances in Columbus. Russell has been credited with 130 assists, the most among the Top 25 rookie offensive leaders nationally. He leads

all rookies in combined points+assists+rebounds (PAR) with an average of 30.8. That total is third among Big Ten players over the last 10 years. Russell also has the only triple double among freshmen nationally. He scored 23 points to go with 11 rebounds and 11 assists in a 79-60 win at Rutgers Feb. 8

Buckeyes In Top 5 nationally in Field Goal Pct.

The Buckeyes are No. 3 nationally in field goal shooting percentage at 50 percent scoring accuracy. Ohio State has made 709-of-1,409 field goal attempts (.503). The Buckeyes are No. 4 the nation in field goals made with 709. Ohio State also is No. 9 nationally in assists with 399, and No. 10 in total points with 1,897. Ohio State's 79.0 points per game ranks No. 15 nationally. In addition, Ohio State sits 11th in 2-point field goal percentage (.558), 18th in turnovers forced per game (15.9) and 10th in assist/turnover ratio (1.48).

Scott Setting Assist Records

In the opening three games of the 2014-15 season, Ohio State senior Shannon Scott handed out 10 or more assists in three-consecutive games. He set career highs in helpers each time out the first three games of the season with 11 assists in the season opener vs. UMass-Lowell, 14 vs. Marquette and

an Ohio State-record 16 assists vs. Sacred Heart Sunday. His 150 assists rate No. 10 in the country in total assists. Scott is No. 10 nationally in assists per game with 6.3. Scott also has set Ohio State records for consecutive games with 10 or more assists (3) and the highest assist total over three consecutive games (41) and in back to back games (30). In his career, Scott has 471 assists. He is in the No. 5 spot all-time at Ohio State. In Big Ten history, Scott's 16 assists vs. Sacred Heart is tied for the No. 4 spot all-time with four others, most recently by Demetri McCamey of Illinois vs. Purdue (1/12/14).

It's Give and Take for Shannon Scott

Not only is Shannon Scott rewriting the single game records in assists at Ohio State, he continues to move up the charts in career steals as well. With 197 thefts for this career, Scott is No. 3 all-time.

Buckeye Thievery on Record Pace

In 24 games this season, Ohio State has recorded 10 or more steals nine times, the third most in a single season during the Matta Era (2005-15). The 2012 team recorded 10+ steals in 11 games with the 2014 team second with 10. In all, Matta teams have pilfered at least 10 times in 64 games over the last 11 seasons.

Noting the Rutgers Game

- Sunday marked the first time Ohio State and Rutgers have met as Big Ten opponents. The two teams met once before Dec. 30, 1978 at Madison Square Garden. The Scarlet Knights defeated the Buckeyes 97-96.
- Ohio State is 9-5 in first-time meetings with league opponents. The Buckeyes have won the last six such games.
- Three players scored in double figures for the Buckeyes: D'Angelo Russell (23), Jae'sean Tate (20) and Keita Bates-Diop (14)
- The Buckeyes own an overall record of 778-689 against current members of the Big Ten Conference.
- Ohio State freshmen had 39 of the team's 44 points at halftime at the half and 61 of 79 overall.
- Of the 10 players to see game action for Ohio State, nine scored and recorded a rebound.
- Ohio State recorded eight team steals vs. the Scarlet Knights, with seven Buckeyes registering steals.
- The Buckeyes outrebounded the Scarlet Knights 48-40.
- Ohio State scored 14 points off 12 Rutgers turnovers.
- The Buckeyes outscored the Scarlet Knights, 15-9, in second chance points.
- Ohio State's bench outscored the Rutgers bench, 26-14.
- The Buckeyes are now 17-0 when leading at halftime this season.
- Thad Matta is 293-89 during his career at Ohio State and 395-120 overall as a head coach.
- Matta is 153-67 overall vs. Big Ten opponents, including a mark of 149-63 while coaching the Buckeyes.
- The Buckeyes are 51-25 during February in

Elite 2015 Recruiting Class Choose Matta, Ohio State

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Once again, Thad Matta and the Ohio State men's basketball coaching staff have signed one of the nation's elite recruiting classes with four high school student-athletes signing National Letters of Intent to play for the Buckeyes starting in 2015-16.

Matta has again assembled a class rated among the Top 10 recruiting classes nationally. In all, over Matta's career, the Buckeyes have put together Top 10 recruiting classes seven times.

Two student-athletes from Texas and one each from Georgia and Ohio make up the 2015 class of Buckeyes.

Austin Grandstaff, a 6-5 shooting guard from Rockwall, Texas, Mickey Mitchell, a 6-8 forward from Plano, Texas, Daniel Giddens, a 6-10 center from Marietta, Georgia, and A.J. Harris, a 5-9 point guard from Dayton (Ohio) Dunbar High school comprise the next class of Buckeyes.

What Ohio State Coaches are Saying:

Grandstaff is a shooter by trade but gets teammates involved with his passing abilities. He can get to the basket through traffic and possesses a high basketball IQ.

Mitchell is a lefty who plays aggressively on both ends of the court. He has tremendous passing skills complemented by his ability to rebound, score off the break and shoot from distance.

Giddens will give Ohio State a defensive presence in the middle. Another in a long line of All-Big Ten caliber big men recruited by Thad Matta, Giddens is expected to compete right away in the conference. Offensively, he has the tools to become one of the Big Ten's better multidimensional performers as his career progresses. **Harris** is extremely quick with the ability to get anywhere he likes on the court with the ball. Another lefty, Harris can create his own shot, score

Scott needs three more steals this season to become the third Buckeye all-time to reach 200 steals in a career and eight more to pass Jay Burson for No. 2 in program history (204).
- Sam Thompson notched one block for the Buckeyes. He has 100 career blocks.
- Thompson scored five points, collected three rebounds and dished one assist vs. Rutgers.

Scarlet Knights. With 176 blocks for his career, he ranks fifth on Ohio State's all-time list for blocked shots acquired in a career. He needs 12 more to surpass Brad Sellers for the No. 4 spot.

- Amir Williams scored four points vs. the Scarlet Knights, and now has 601 for his career.
- Keita Bates-Diop set a career-high in points, blocks, steals, rebounds and 3-pointers. Bates-Diop recorded 14 points, three blocks, two steals, nine rebounds and three made 3FG's.
- Jae'Sean Tate tied his career-high in points with 20 on 8-11 shooting.
- Tate scored in double figures for the third time in the last four games and collected five rebounds, one assist and one block.

Matta Era Buckeyes in 1,000-pt. Club

There have been 51 Buckeyes to reach 1,000 or more career points in the 115-year history of Ohio State men's basketball. Nearly 20 percent (10 of 51) of those players have been coached by Thad Matta over the last 11 years. Two, No. 3(t) William Buford (1,990) and No. 9 Deshaun Thomas (1,630) are ranked among the Top 10 scorers alltime at Ohio State.

Several 2014-15 Foes Tabbed Among Top 25

Ohio State is scheduled to face four teams ranked among the Top 25 in the most recent *Associated Press* Poll. Two of those teams are ranked among

the Top 10. No. 9 Louisville and No. 5 Wisconsin join No. 19 Maryland and No. 12 North Carolina.

Ohio State vs. The Ranked

The Buckeyes have an all-time record of 159-244 (2-2 in 2014-15) vs. ranked opponents in the *Associated Press* Top 25. That includes a mark of 66-121 vs. Top 10 foes. As a ranked team, Ohio State is 491-139 all-time. In games when both teams enter with a Top 25 ranking, Ohio State is 75-70. When ranked among the Top 10 nationally, Ohio State is 336-75.

Shannon Scott has been a dependable distributor of the basketball over his career with 471 career assists as a Buckeye, good for the No. 5 spot all-time in Ohio State history. He currently has 150 assists in 24 games, the highest single-season total of his career. A senior season total of 169 assists would place Scott on a list with just three others with 500 or more career assists. A Buckeye has eclipsed the 170 assist total in four of the last five years. Evan Turner handed out 185 in 2010 followed by

177, 181, and 172 by Aaron Craft from 2011-13. Craft, Ohio State's career leader in assists with 694, dished out 164 assists a season ago. Scott already is third in career steals with 197. He's averaged 67 over the last two years. That total again as a senior would place Scott No. 2 all-time with 219 career steals. Craft is the Ohio State career leader with 337. Amir Williams is currently No. 5 all-time in career blocks with 176.

Maryland/Rutgers Join the Big Ten

Ohio State joined the Big Ten in 1912 and played its first season of men's basketball during the 1912-13 season. This year, the University of Maryland and Rutgers University will be playing as members of the Big Ten in the inaugural season for each school. Ohio State has won its last six games vs. first-year league members dating back to a 37-7 home win vs. Michigan Jan. 21, 1918. The most recent wins vs. a first-year Big Ten foe were at Rutgers Feb. 8, 2015 (W 79-60) and Jan. 29, 2015 at home vs. Maryland, an 80-56 victory. The Buckeyes have played four of the last six inaugural league games at home.

Matta, Buckeyes Face the Best

Since Thad Matta took over the Ohio State program the Buckeyes have competed against 108 opponents ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25, the second-most games against ranked foes in all of NCAA Division I men's basketball. The Buckeyes are 51-57 in those games with a winning percentage of .472. That win total ranks No. 7 nationally for victories vs. ranked opponents since 2004-05. In the last nine seasons (2007-15), Matta has guided the Buckeyes to 246 victories, fifth-most wins during that span among all Division I schools.

Thompson Next Buckeye Shooting for 1,000-Point Club at Ohio State

Ohio State lost a pair of career 1,000-point scorers from last season in seniors Aaron Craft (1,314) and Lenzelle Smith Jr. (1,014). LaQuinton Ross, a junior last season, left the Buckeyes with 858 career points. With a bevy of underclassmen on the squad this season along with a senior class that has primarily played supporting roles over their careers, there are still a couple possible opportunities to join Ohio State's 1,000-point club this year. Senior Sam Thompson seems to be the most likely candidate with 877 career points. He's averaged nearly eight points a game over his sophomore and junior seasons. He will need to average just over 10 points a game as a senior to reach 1,000 career points.

Matta Extends Streak vs. Non-Conference Foes

Thad Matta has directed Ohio State to at least 10 wins during non-conference play in each of his 11 seasons in Columbus. Matta is 144-26 vs. non-conference competition at Ohio State and 149-63 vs. Big Ten foes (regular season and Big Ten tournament games) for an overall record of 293-89. In 15 seasons as a head coach (1 at Butler, 3 at Xavier and 11 at Ohio State) Matta is 153-66 vs. the current roster of Big Ten teams. He has winning records vs. 13-of-13 league opponents: ILL (15-5), IND (12-9), IOWA (12-7), MICH (18-6), MINN (12-6), NW (17-1), PSU (17-2), PUR (17-7), NEB (7-1), WIS (12-11), MSU (11-10), Maryland (2-1) and Rutgers (1-0).

Matta's Big Ten Tenure

Thad Matta took over the head coaching duties at Ohio State in July of 2004. His 11 years in Columbus have been a successful stint, both nationally and in the Big Ten Conference.

Matta vs. the Big Ten: Matta's Buckeyes have played in more games (382) with more victories (293) than any other Big Ten program in the last 11 years. Michigan State is next in victories (274). Matta In the B1G Regular Season: The Buckeyes have won 128 Big Ten regular-season games, with nine-consecutive years winning at least 10 conference games. The Buckeyes have won 82 percent of league games decided by 10 or more points (75-17) in the Matta era. In games decided by less than 10 points, Ohio State is 53-40 (.584).

overall conference titles (9) than any other league school over the last 11 years. Five of those are regular-season titles while four are conference tournament crowns. Michigan State is the next closest with five titles, three in the regular season and two conference tournament titles.

Defending the 3 in Matta Era

The Buckeyes finished the 2013-14 season among the top teams nationally in 3-point percentage defense (.293). Over the 11 years with Thad Matta as the head coach in Columbus, Ohio State is 91-21 (.813) when holding opponents to less than five made 3s. When foes make between 5-9 from distance, Ohio State is 159-53 (.750) and when opponents make 10 or more, the Buckeyes are 43-15 (.741). Ohio State is 231-58 (.799) when making at least five 3-pointers, 62-11 when making 10

or more (.849) and 62-31 (.667) when connecting on four or fewer.

Matta Continues to Build Impressive Ohio State Résumé

Thad Matta has accomplished a remarkable list of accomplishments in 11 years as head coach of the Buckeyes. Matta's teams have never failed to win 20 games, a record streak (10 seasons) in Ohio State history. In fact, Matta has never failed to reach the 20-win plateau in 14 years as a head coach. Ohio State (25-10) reached 20 wins in 2013-14 with a win at Illinois. Ohio State has reached 30 or more wins three times, all with Matta at the helm. Back-to-back seasons with 30 wins in 2010-11 (34) and 2011-12 (31) only trail the 35 wins recorded in 2006-07, the Ohio State record for single-season victories. In addition, Matta has won five Big Ten regular-season titles, including three of the last five (2010-12), four Big Ten postseason tournament crowns in seven title game opportunities, eight NCAA tournament appearances, including four-consecutive (2010-13) runs to the "Sweet 16," a pair of Final Four trips (2007, 2012) and a title game appearance in 2007. Throw in a National Invitation Tournament title in 2008 and Matta has guided the Buckeyes to postseason play in nine-consecutive attempts and in every year in which Ohio State was eligible.

Ohio State celebrates 103 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2014-15. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over the 102 previous seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 26 NCAA tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Eight former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 50 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 23 in the first round.

2014-15 Rookies

Kam Williams, a Maryland native and 2,000 point scorer for Mount St. Joseph High School in Baltimore, officially started his collegiate career along with four true freshmen in 2014-15. Williams elected to redshirt at Ohio State in 2013-14 and will retain four years of eligibility beginning this season. D'Angelo Russell, Keita Bates-Diop, Jae'Sean Tate and David Bell all are in their true freshman year at Ohio State. Bell (Garfield Heights) and Tate (Pickerington) are Ohio natives. Russell hails from Louisville, Kentucky, and Bates-Diop from Normal, Illinois. As a whole, the rookie class is rated among the top classes nationally by several recruiting entities.

Matta Has Faced, Defeated Top Active Coaches

Ohio State's Thad Matta has faced 20 of the Top 24 active coaches by wins entering the 2014-15 season and has wins against 18. Of the Top 10 coaches, Matta has faced and defeated eight. Matta entered the season No. 3 among active coaches in win percentage at .768 (377-114) and with a 5-1 start has improved that winning mean to .769 (382-115). In addition to owning wins vs. the top active coaches, Matta has a victory vs Coach Bob Knight, the No. 5 all-time winningest coach in NCAA history. Ohio State defeated Texas Tech, where Knight finished his coaching career, 77-71 Dec. 16, 2004 in Dallas. That game was Matta's ninth as Ohio State's head coach.

This is Matta's 15th year as a head coach and the 11th at Ohio State. He spent three seasons at Xavier (2002-2004) and one season at Butler

In the 18 most recent wins vs. the Top 24 active coaches by wins, Matta teams have been ranked among the Top 10 in 10 of the wins, were unranked in five, faced Top 25 teams nine times and matched up against unranked opponents on nine occasions. Opponents were ranked among the Top 10 six times.

Since taking over the Ohio State program for the start of the 2004-05 season, Thad Matta has the Big Ten's best overall record with a winning percentage of 77 percent. He also has directed the Buckeyes to the second-most regular-season Big Ten Conference wins with 128 and most overall wins with 293. Ohio State's 185 home wins in Matta era rates No. 2 nationally and his home win percentage of .911 (185-18) also is No. 2 among all Division I programs.

Buckeyes Own Four 1-Loss/Perfect Home Seasons Under Matta

Thad Matta has won at least 15 home games in each of his 11 seasons in Columbus. The 2006-07

squad finished with a perfect 18-0 record while the 2005-06 (16-1) and 2009-10 teams (18-1) squads each finished with a single loss at home. Matta is 185-18 overall in Columbus, the most home wins among Big Ten schools, during his tenure after finishing the 2013-14 season 17-3 at home and starting 2014-15 at 15-1. Ohio State finished 16-2 in 2012-13. Ohio State is 108-3 at home vs. non-conference opponents and 77-15 vs. Big Ten competition. Over the last six seasons Ohio State is 103-9 in Columbus.

Matta Owns Top Win Percentage Among Ohio State Coaches

Thad Matta, now in his 11th season as head coach of the Buckeyes, has an overall win percentage of 76.7 (293-89) at Ohio State. That winning mean is the highest among the 11 head coaches in the history of the Ohio State men's basketball program with three or more seasons on the sidelines. Matta's 128-57 (185 games) record in Big Ten regular-season play (.692) also has produced the highest winning percentage in conference play among any previous Ohio State coach. Fred Taylor (1959-76) is second in both overall win percentage (.653/297-158) and Big Ten win percentage (.608/158-102) in 18 seasons.

- Thad Matta is 162-4 in Columbus vs. uranked opponents. The Buckeyes have lost just once to an unranked non-conference opponent during his 11 years at Ohio State. That loss was at the hands of West Virginia Dec. 27, 2008.
- The Buckeyes are 104-1 vs. unranked nonconference opponents at home under Matta.
- Ohio State is 58-3 in Columbus with Matta at the helm vs. unranked Big Ten opponents.
- Ohio State has won 59-consecutive games vs. unranked non-conference opponents at home...last loss was Dec. 27, 2008 vs. West Virginia.

MATTA WORKING ON 400 GAMES COACHED AT OHIO STATE

When Ohio State played at Illinois Jan. 5, 2013, Thad Matta, who was then 14 games into his ninth season with the Buckeyes, coached in game No. 300 at Ohio State. Only two previous coaches, Harold G. Olsen (1923-46) and Fred Taylor (1959-76), reached 300 or more games at Ohio State. Olsen coached 456 (259-197) and Taylor 455 (297-158). Matta has 382 games to his credit as a Buckeye. His winning percentage after 100 games was second only to Taylor. At 200 games, Matta tied Taylor for best winning percentage to that point in OSU history. Matta's winning mean of .773 at 300 games topped Taylor and Olsen at the 300-game plateau. Matta should reached 400 games coached at Ohio State early in the 2015-16 season, his 12th in Columbus.

Game 1 No. 20 Ohio State 92, UMass-Lowell 55 Nov. 14, 2014, Columbus

Columbus -- Sam Thompson showed the way for Ohio State's promising bunch of newcomers. Thompson scored 14 points - including seven in a 14-0 first-half run - and No. 20 Ohio State's rookies had a big game in leading the Buckeyes to a 92-55 victory against overmatched UMass-Lowell. Freshman D'Angelo Russell had 16 points, four rebounds and six assists, Marc Loving scored 14, graduate transfer Anthony Lee had 13 and redshirt freshman Kam Williams 12 for the Buckeyes, who shot 62 percent from the field. Shannon Scott, had a career-best 11 assists to go with nine points. Russell is an acclaimed recruit out of Louisville, Kentucky, who led Montverde (Fla.) Academy to a 55-2 record and two national championships the last two seasons. He played well alongside Scott, and then slid over and ran the offense to give Scott a breather. The bigger, stronger, quicker Buckeyes pulled away early. After Kerry Weldon, who had 11 points, dunked to put the River Hawks up 5-4, Thompson hit a 3 from in front of the visiting bench and then made a floater in the lane. Scott then made a 3, Loving a perimeter jumper and, in transition, the Buckeyes got back-to-back baskets on a dunk from Thompson and Russell's layup to make it 18-5. The outcome was never in doubt again

Game 2 No. 20 Ohio State 74, Marquette 63 Nov. 18, 2014, Columbus

Columbus -- Kam Williams scored 15 points and Shannon Scott added a career-best 14 assists to lead the Buckeyes past Marquette 74-63. Amir Williams had 12 points, and Marc Loving and Sam Thompson each added 10 for the Buckeyes, who shot 65 percent from the field (32 of 49) - including 8 of 15 on 3-pointers. Steve Taylor Jr. had 20 points for the Golden Eagles, who trailed by as many as 20 late. Kam Williams, who missed last season after contracting mononucleosis, came off the bench to hit six of eight shots from the field, making his first three 3-pointers. The Buckeyes used a 12-2 run early to take the lead for good, then put together a series of spurts to pull away. In a 6-0 surge, Scott drove through the middle of the lane for two layups and Kam Williams added a 10-foot floater for a 56-42 lead with 10 minutes left. Through two games, he's 11 of 15 from the field (73 percent) and 5 of 8 behind the arc (62.5 percent). 

Game 3 No. 20 Ohio State 106, Sacred Heart 48 Nov. 23, 2014, Columbus

Columbus -- After the game, Shannon Scott handed out cookies. During it, he dished out assists. D'Angelo Russell scored 32 points and Scott set a school record with 16 assists to lead 20th-ranked Ohio State to a 106-48 win against Sacred Heart. Russell's total tied the second most for a freshman at Ohio State, trailing only Jared Sullinger's 40 points (along with 13 rebounds) against IUPUI in 2010. Scott had 11 points to go with his assist total, which broke Aaron Craft's team mark, while Jae'Sean Tate and Sam Thompson each had 12 points, Keita Bates-Diop 11 and Marc Loving 10. The Buckeyes shot 57 percent from the field. Trey McDonald chipped in with 14 rebounds. Scott has 41 assists so far. It's early but Russell, an acclaimed first-year player out of Louisville, Kentucky, is averaging 18 a game. The Buckeyes led early and never looked back. Russell had 17 points at the break and then hit three consecutive 3-pointers in the opening minutes of the second half. Filip Nowicki had 10 points and nine rebounds for the Pioneers.



Columbus -- Marc Loving scored a career-high 18 points and four teammates joined him in double figures as the Buckeves beat Campbell 91-64. D'Angelo Russell led the Buckeyes with 22 points, while Shannon Scott and Sam Thompson each had 11 and Amir Williams, back after missing a game with a sore knee, had 10. Williams had a perfect night, making all three of his shots from the field and all four free throws. Ohio State has averaged five in double figures in each game this season. Loving's best had been 14 points a year ago as a freshman. The Buckeyes pulled away after taking a 9-8 lead. They ran off seven points in a row and, after a Campbell bucket, scored the next 10 points to make it 26-10. 


Game 5 No. 16 Ohio State 73, James Madison 56 Nov. 28, 2014, Columbus

Columbus -- D'Angelo Russell scored 14 points and the Buckeyes' bigs stood tall in a 73-56 win over James Madison. Starting center Amir Williams had seven points and nine rebounds, and backups Trey McDonald and Anthony Lee had eight points each. Jae'Sean Tate also provided a jolt when he was inserted midway through the second half. Ohio State's guards have dominated the ball and scoring on offense so far But in the second half, the Buckeyes got 14 consecutive points from their frontcourt. Ohio State came in shooting 61 percent from the field but was held to 41 percent. The Buckeyes led by 17 and had the ball with under 8 minutes left in the first half before playing "lackadaisical" according to Matta. 


Game 6 No. 5 Louisville 64, No. 14 Ohio State 55 Dec. 2, 2014, Louisville

Louisville -- D'Angelo Russell led a second-half comeback that fell just short in Ohio State's 64-55 loss at No. 5 Louisville. The Buckeyes, down 35-18 at the half, battled back to cut the lead to 3 after a couple Russell free throws with 1:12 to play (56-53). Louisville scored eight of the next 10 points to earn the win in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge matchup. Russell finished with 17 points and sophomore Marc Loving added 13 before fouling out. The Buckeyes struggled to score, making 30.4 percent of their field goals (17-56) for the game. Ohio State was 6 of 26 in the first half. The Buckeyes' defense held Louisville to jsut 35 percent shooting (19-54) but the Cardinals made 10 of 29 3-pointers.

- Ohio State is 4-4 all-time vs. Louisville.
- Ohio State is 6-7 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Buckeyes have won five of the last seven meetings in the Challenge games.

Columbus -- To hear Kam Williams tell it, the Ohio State Buckeyes have a lot of role players just waiting to shine when their time arrives. D'Angelo Russell scored 14 of his 19 points in the second half and Marc Loving added 17 points to lead No. 14 Ohio State to a 70-50 victory over Colgate. Not until Williams, who chipped in with 19 points, capped an 11-0 surge with a four-point play with 5:03 left did Ohio State finally put the game away. The Buckeyes led 31-21 after an uneven first half in which their lone threat on offense was Loving, who before missing his final 3-pointer was 3 for 3 from the field, 2 for 2 behind the arc and 4 for 4 at the line for 12 points. Ohio State broke out to a 10-0 lead, then quickly cooled and led just 23-19 before running off the next eight points. The Raiders wouldn't go away in the second half, hanging within 10 points most of the way. Loving scored and Williams' hit a 3-pointer and was fouled, then made the free throw, to push the lead to 66-46.

Columbus -- Kam Williams has always been a scorer. From the crib to college he's never been afraid to shoot and has never had trouble making shots. Now he's ready to make a big impact on a big stage. Williams scored a career-high 23 points, including 13 in a row for Ohio State in the first half, to lead the 12th-ranked Buckeyes to a 97-43 victory over High Point. 

Columbus -- In a milestone game, Ohio State coach Thad Matta hardly saw a monumental effort from his team. Despite a ragged second half, the 12th-ranked Buckeyes did enough to get past pesky Morehead State 87-71. Asked if it felt as if this was his 500th career game as a head coach, Matta cracked, "Yes, it does. Maybe a thousand." Matta is in his 15th season as a head coach, including a year at his alma mater, Butler, and three at Xavier. His record is 385-115, a .770 winning percentage. Kam Williams added 15 points in the second half for the Buckeyes, who hit 69 percent of their shots after the break to finish at 57 percent (35 of 62) from the field. 





MINNEAPOLIS -- Ohio State freshman quard DeAngelo Russell scored 25 of 27 points in the first half to lead the Buckeyes to a 12-point halftime lead before Minnesota rallied to force overtime at Williams Arena. The Buckeyes claimed the 74-72 win when sophomore forward Marc Loving hit a jumper in the lane to give the Ohio State the extra-session victory. Loving added 13 points and seven rebounds. Minnesota's Mo Walker had 18 points and nine rebounds, DeAndre Mathieu scored 17 points and Andre Hollins had all 12 of his points in the second half, but each of them had a turnover in overtime. 



Game 21 Ohio State 82, No. 23 Indiana 70 Jan. 25, 2015, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- Freshman D'Angelo Russell scored 22 points and added 10 assists for his second double-double of the season and the Buckeyes knocked off No. 23 Indiana 82-70. The Hoosiers hit their first eight shots of the game but committed 15 turnovers as their four-game winning streak was snapped despite 26 points from junior guard Kevin "Yogi" Ferrell. The Buckeyes weathered the early storm and pushed their lead as high as 10 points in the first half and it was Russell who quelled the final Hoosier threat. After a Ferrell jumper made it 56-50 with 10:26 remaining in the game, Russell knocked down a pair of 3-pointers while battling leg cramps to double Ohio State's lead with 8:58 remaining. Indiana would get no closer than within seven points for the remainder of the game. Freshman Jae'Sean Tate scored a career-high 20 points, sophomore Marc Loving added 12 and senior Shannon Scott had 10. Ohio State finished with 26 points off of Indiana turnovers.

Game 22 Ohio State 80, No. 16 Maryland 56 Jan. 29, 2015, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- Marc Loving matched his career high with 19 points and D'Angelo Russell added 18 points and 14 rebounds to lead Ohio State to an 80-56 victory over No. 16 Maryland. The Buckeyes, at times a timid bunch on the boards this season, dominated the Terrapins on the glass (51-32) and on defense. Jae'Sean Tate, starting his third game in a row, added 16 points and eight rebounds for the Buckeyes, who have won three in a row - including the last two over ranked opponents at home. Loving has come off the bench of late and responded by hitting all five of his 3-pointers as the Buckeyes went 10 of 17 behind the arc. Russell, the nation's leading freshman scorer, flirted with a triple-double. He also had six assists and two steals, and didn't commit a turnover in 34 minutes. Ahead by eight points at halftime thanks to a 12-0 run, the Buckeyes took control early in the second half. Up 41-32 just 3 minutes in, the Buckeyes went on a rapid-fire 7-0 run. Later, Loving hit consecutive 3s to push the lead to 54-38 with under 14 minutes left, and Maryland never again threatened.

- · Ohio State defeated Maryland by 24 points, marking the largest margin of victory for an unranked Ohio State team vs. a ranked opponent. The previous largest margin of victory for an unranked Ohio State team vs. a ranked opponent was 18 points when Ohio State defeated No. 13 Michigan, 105-87, Feb. 12, 1981.
- The victory vs. Maryland marks back-to-back wins vs. ranked opponents at home for the Buckeyes. The last time Ohio State recorded back-to-back wins at home vs. ranked opponents was Feb 3. 2009 vs. No. 12 Purdue, 82-70 in OT, and Feb. 7, 2009 vs. No. 19 Minnesota, 64-58. Game 23 Purdue 60. Ohio State 58 Feb. 4, 2015, West Lafayette

WEST LAFAYETTE -- D'Angelo Russell scored 20 points for the Buckeyes, but his 40-foot desperation heave at the buzzer came up short, as Ohio State fell to Purdue 60-58, Rapheal Davis scored 20 points and Purdue staved off a late Ohio State rally. After trailing 36-28 early in the second half, they charged back to take two brief leads, at 41-40 and 44-42. Purdue then answered with 10 straight points to make it 52-44. But the Boilermakers' free-throw shooting allowed Ohio State to get as close as 59-58 with 6.4 seconds left. Purdue snapped a six-game losing streak to the Buckeyes, its thirdlongest active skid against a single opponent. The Boilermakers barely held on after seemingly taking control twice in the second half. First, they opened the half on a 9-2 run to extend a 27-26 halftime lead to 36-28. Then, after the Buckeyes took that 44-42 lead, the Boilermakers answered with the 10-0 run. But Purdue went only 5 of 10 from the free throw line the rest of the game, allowing Ohio State to rally one more time. The Buckeyes got within 58-56 on Russell's 3 with 31.2 seconds left and got as close as 59-58 when Russell made two free throws.

- · Purdue leads Ohio State, 84-82, in the all-time series. Ohio State has won the six of the last seven meetings.

Game 24 No. 20 Ohio State 79, Rutgers 60 Feb. 8, 2015, Piscataway

PISCATAWAY, N.J. -- D'Angelo Russell recorded his first tripledouble and the fourth in Ohio State history with 23 points, 11 assists and 11 rebounds in No. 20 Ohio State's 79-60 victory over Rutgers. Russell played 35 minutes, was 8 of 13 from the field, had one steal and two turnovers handling the ball most of the game. Jae'San Tate added 20 points and Keita Bates-Diop had 14. Bishop Daniels had a season-high 17 points for the Scarlet Knights, and Junior Etou added 12 points and 11 rebounds. Ohio State never trailed, built a 21-point lead in the first half and extended it to 25 early in the second with Russell, Tate and Bates-Diop doing most of the damage. Even when Rutgers made a late run and got to 69-57, Russell fed Tate for a layup and hit a jumper to ice the game. He left with 2:47 to go to polite applause from the big crowd, which was bolstered by almost two dozen NBA scouts. Russell hit a jumper and a 3-point field goal in an 8-2 spurt to open the game and, after Rutgers pulled to 11-10, he added seven more points in a 13-2 spurt that pushed the lead to 24-12. Ohio State shot better than 48 percent from the field in the first half, including 6 of 13 from long range with Bates-Diop hitting 3 of 4.

Notes:

- Sunday marked the first time Ohio State and Rutgers have met as Big Ten opponents. The two teams met once before Dec. 30, 1978 at Madison Square Garden. The Scarlet Knights defeated the Buck-
- Ohio State is 9-5 in first-time meetings with league opponents. The Buckeyes have won the last six such games.
- Three players scored in double figures for the Buckeyes: D'Angelo Russell (23), Jae'sean Tate (20) and Keita Bates-Diop (14)
- The Buckeyes own an overall record of 778-689 against current members of the Big Ten Conference.
- Ohio State freshmen had 39 of the team's 44 points at halftime at the half and 61 of 79 overall.
- Of the 10 players to to see game action for Ohio State, nine scored and recorded a rebound.
- Ohio State recorded eight team steals vs. the Scarlet Knights, with seven Buckeyes registering steals.
- The Buckeyes outrebounded the Scarlet Knights 48-40.
- Ohio State scored 14 points off 12 Rutgers turnovers.
- The Buckeyes outscored the Scarlet Knights, 15-9, in second chance points.
- Ohio State's bench outscored the Rutgers bench, 26-14.
- The Buckeyes are now 17-0 when leading at halftime this season
- D'Angelo Russell recorded his first career triple-double, the fourth in program history, first by an Ohio State freshman and first against a Big Ten opponent.
- Russell tallied a team-high 23 points, scoring 20+ points for the 11th time this season. Russell has scored in double figures 23 out of 24 games this season.
- Russell dished a career-high 11 assists, tallying double digits for the second time this season. Russell now has 130 assists this season.
- Russell notched 11 rebounds, the third time this season he has recorded double digit rebounds
- Keita Bates-Diop set a career-high in points, blocks, steals, rebounds and 3-pointers. Bates-Diop recorded 14 points, three blocks, two steals, nine rebounds and three made 3FG's.


