### QUICK HITS

**SETTING THE SCENE** | The Nittany Lions head to Northwestern for a mid-afternoon matchup at 3 p.m. ET Saturday ESPNU. This weekend's matchup vs. the Wildcats marks the lone regular-season meeting between the teams this season.

Penn State (15-12, 3-11 B1G) is coming off a loss to fifth-ranked Wisconsin, ending an eight-day stretch of three games vs. Top 25 teams. The Lions have taken on four nationally-ranked foes at the time of meeting this season.

**SCORING DEFENSE** | In 10 of 14 Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent below their season scoring average, including eight of the last nine by an average of 10.7 points. Penn State limited Wisconsin to 18.4 points below its season average.

**NORTHWESTERN** | The Wildcats are 12-14 overall with a 3-10 mark in conference play. They have won their last two in a row, most recently taking down Minnesota on the road, helped out by a season-high 15 threes. [MORE: Page 2]

**SO CLOSE** | Ten of Penn State's Big Ten games have been decided by single digits, most recently with an eight-point loss to No. 5 Wisconsin. The nine single-digit losses in conference play have been separated by an average of 6.0 points.

**ALL CLASS** | D.J. Newbill was named one of 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award, an accolade presented annually to the senior student-athlete with high accomplishments in all four areas of classroom, community, character and competition. **VOTE:** bit.ly/Vote4Newbill

**HEY DJ, THAT'S MY DJ** | Senior guard D.J. Newbill, the top scorer among Power 5 conference players and fifth in Division I, has paced Penn State throughout season with 21.1 ppg. The No. 4 scorer all-time at PSU, he also is just second player in PSU history to reach 500 points in three-consecutive seasons. [MORE: 17-18]

**UP NEXT** | Penn State returns home for its final two home games of the season vs. Iowa Feb. 28 and Ohio State March 4.

# GAMEDAY INFO

## THE MATCHUP

### SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN

- The Wildcats are 12-14 on the year and 3-10 in Big Ten action, after winning each of their last two games. The pair of wins snapped a 10-game losing streak spanning Jan. 4 to Feb. 10.
- Northwestern most recently knocked off Minnesota on the road, 72-66, Feb. 18 helped out by a season-high 15 3-pointers.
- Freshman Bryant McIntosh leads the Wildcat offense with 12.3 ppg, as well as 4.4 apg, which is tied for sixth in the conference.
- Along with McIntosh, redshirt junior Tre Demps and junior Alex Olah are each averaging double figures with 12.2 and 11.0 ppg, respectively.
- Northwestern's Alex Olah is among the top shot blockers in the conference, as his 1.8 bpg is slotted second.
- In a 66-61 OT win against Iowa, the Wildcats blocked 12 shots to tie a single-game program record. As a team, NU's averaging 4.1 blocks per game, which ranks sixth in the B1G standings.

### SERIES HISTORY

- This is the 43rd meeting between the teams with Penn State owning a 28-15 advantage in the all-time series. The Nittany Lions also lead 12-9 all-time when playing in Evanston.
- PSU has defeated NU on the road in each of the last two outings, having most recently captured a 59-32 win against the Wildcats March 6, 2014.
- In the last win in Evanston, Penn State limited the Wildcats to a season-low 32 points, holding NU to 23.3 percent from the field and 13.6 percent from behind the arc.
- D.J. Newbill helped the Nittany Lions to the most recent win against the Wildcats with 12 points, while Brandon Taylor and former Nittany Lion Tim Frazier chipped in 11 points each.

### LAST TIME VS. THE WILDCATS

**EVANSTON, Ill. (March 6, 2014)** - D.J. Newbill scored 12 points and Penn State's zone defense stifled Northwestern in the Nittany Lions' 59-32 Big Ten win. Balanced scoring helped the Nittany Lions pick apart Northwestern's defense. Tim Frazier and Brandon Taylor, each of whom scored 11 points, were two of eight different players to score for Penn State. The Nittany Lions shot 50 percent from the field.

Penn State's 2-3 zone defense frustrated Northwestern the entire game. The Wildcats' 32 points were a season low and the fewest scored by any team in Big Ten play. Northwestern shot 23.3 percent from the field and went 3 of 22 behind the arc (season-low 13.6 percent).

### 14-15 NITTANY LIONS VS. THE WILDCATS

D.J. Newbill is the leading scorer in the series with Northwestern, producing 16.7 ppg through four meetings. He's posted double figures in every outing, including the third-highest scoring output of 20 points in January 2013. Having faced NU a team-high five times, Ross Travis is averaging a squad-best 7.4 rebounds per game in the series, including 6.0 defensive boards per game.

### THREE NOTABLE GAMES

**Feb. 25, 2012 (NU, 67-66):** The Lions held a one-point lead for much of the final 2:48 until a foul call sent John Shurna to the free throw line with :03 to play. Shurna hit both to seal the win for the Wildcats, who hit 15 free throws in the contest.

**Feb. 28, 2010 (PSU, 79-60):** Tator Battle had 16 points to lead Penn State to what was the Lions' largest margin of victory since 2007. They shot 68 percent in the first half and ended the night at 57 percent.

**Jan. 28, 2004 (PSU, 63-61-OT):** The last of five overtime games between the teams went to Penn State when Marlon Smith posted 23 points and Ndu Egekeze converted on a lay-up with :01 remaining in the extra period.

**WELCOME, ISAAC!**

Following Penn State's win over Dartmouth Dec. 22, head coach Patrick Chambers added a top recruit who signed a letter of intent to join the Nittany Lions for life.

Isaac Bennett, a native of Hollidaysburg, Pa., was presented with a No. 1 jersey and a Certificate of Relentlessness in the postgame ceremony.

Bennett has a non-cancerous, but aggressive brain tumor and signed with Penn State through the Friends of Jaclyn program, which places children battling brain tumors with college and high school sports teams.

**SCORING DEFENSE** | In 10 of 14 Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent below their season scoring average, including eight of the last nine by an average of 10.7 points. Maryland was the first team to produce more than its average (+5.4) since the Purdue game Jan. 17. The Nittany Lions limited Nebraska to 43 points Feb. 7, 20.7 points below their season average of 63.7 points per game on the year. Most recently, PSU limited fifth-ranked Wisconsin to 18.4 points below their scoring average (73.4), holding the Badgers to 55 points.

Penn State limited Nebraska to 13 first-half points, marking the fewest points by an opponent in the opening frame since 12/12/07 when Princeton scored 11. The Nittany Lions held Nebraska without a made field goal for a stretch of 11:16 of game action in the first half. The Huskers' 43 points in the game are the fewest by a PSU opponent this season and the second-lowest scoring output for any team in the Big Ten during league action.

**FIELD-GOAL DEFENSE** | Penn State's opponents are scoring on 40.6 percent of their total shots and 32.2 percent of 3-point attempts, defensive marks which both stand as fourth all-time since 1965 (among full-season figures). [Page 137 of Media Guide]

**BLOCK PARTY** | With two blocks from Jordan Dickerson against Wisconsin, Penn State now has three players in the Penn State Top 11 in the category. Donovan Jack owns the No. 8 spot (77), while Dickerson own the No. 10 position with 69. Brandon Taylor is close behind at No. 11 with 68 career blocks. Dickerson is averaging 1.5 blocks in his Penn State career, putting up 69 through 49 career games. [MORE: Page 25]

**VS. RANKED TEAMS** | Penn State has faced a team ranked in the Top 25 at the time of meeting five times this season, falling to Wisconsin (twice), Maryland (twice) and Ohio State -- with two of five occurring on the road. Six of the Nittany Lions' 2014-15 opponents are currently ranked, or receiving votes, in the AP and/or USA Today polls.

**15 WINS** | It took Penn State 24 games to reach 15 wins on the season, the fewest games since 2008-09 since the Nittany Lions got to 15 wins in the span of 20 games. It took 30 games a year ago.

**SHARE THE LOVE** | In Penn State's win over Minnesota Jan. 28, nine players saw action and all tallied at least three points. Four players produced or tied career highs in scoring, while the defense posted a season high in steals and helped limit the Gophers to 19.5 points below their season average. [MORE: Page 36]

**40 MINUTES** | Patrick Chambers said after the Rutgers game Jan. 24 was the first time the Nittany Lions had played 40 full minutes of Penn State basketball. It resulted in 51 percent shooting, a season-high 18 assists, 10 3-pointers and the six-largest win over a Big Ten team in program history. [MORE: Page 36]

**ONE-POSSESSION GAMES** | Seven games this season have been separated by one possession with Penn State winning the first four before falling in each of the last three. A year ago, the Lions had eight games decided by three points or fewer in the regular season. They lost each of the first five and won the last three, giving them a seven-game win streak in regular-season, one-possession games.

**FIVE-POINT GAMES** | Through 27 games, Penn State has had 11 decided by five points or fewer, winning each of the first six plus the decision vs. Minnesota (63-58) to stand at 7-4. The four losses have been separated by four (Rutgers), three (Indiana and Maryland) and two (Illinois) points. Last season, the Lions were 4-8 in regular-season games decided by the same margin.

**BENCH MOB** | The PSU bench - which has dubbed itself the Bench Mob - is averaging 16.5 ppg this season, up from 14.7 ppg last season, and has outscored the opponent's bench in 14 games. Reserve players have combined to score more than 30 points in four games this season: Duquesne (35), Michigan (33), Marshall (32) and Dartmouth (31). [MORE: Page 28]

**WIN STREAK** | Wisconsin snapped Penn State's 10-game winning streak, which was the longest for a PSU team since the 1995-96 squad opened the year going 13-0. The longest single-season win streak in program history was 15 games (1952).

**NON-CONFERENCE WINS** | The 12 non-conference wins were the most for the Nittany Lions in program history, breaking the previous high of 11 set during the 2008-09 season. In the Big Ten era, Penn State was undefeated in conference play in 1995-96 (9-0) and had one-loss seasons in 2000-01 (9-1) and 1994-95 (8-1).

**COMEBACKS** | The Lions have battled back from second-half deficits of 14 (Akron), 13 (Cornell), 8 (Virginia Tech), 7 (George Washington) and 6 (Southern California) in wins this season. [MORE: Page 29]

**CHARLESTON CLASSIC** | The two wins at the Charleston Classic stand as the first multi-win performance at a neutral-site, regular-season tournament for Penn State since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic.



# PLAYER SPOTLIGHTS

**D.J. NEWBILL** | has likely topped out in the No. 4 spot in career scoring at Penn State (1,679) in just three seasons, needing 307 points to hit the No. 3 spot. He reached 500 points on the season vs. Nebraska (571) -- only one other player - PSU all-time leading scorer Talor Battle -- has reached 500 points three seasons in a row. Newbill now owns two of the Top 10 single-season scoring outputs, with last season's 604 points sitting in seventh and this year currently sitting in 10th. Newbill needs 29 points to reach 600 on the season. There have been six players, Newbill included, to score at least 600 points in a season a total of eight times in PSU history.

Newbill is averaging 21.1 ppg, tops in Division I among Power 5 conferences and fifth overall in Division I. It also is the fifth-highest season scoring average all-time at Penn State, among full-season figures, and is the greatest clip since 1963. He is averaging 18.3 ppg over his three seasons with Penn State, a career scoring average which is second all-time, behind only Jesse Arnelle (1952-55; 21.0 ppg; 2,138 points). [MORE: Page 25]

Off the court, Newbill was named one of 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to the one four-year student-athlete with exceptional accomplishments in all four areas of classroom, community, character and competition. Fans can vote once a day, every day from now until March 25. Newbill is one of just two players from the Big Ten among the candidate pool, joining Wisconsin's Frank Kaminsky. **BRANDON TAYLOR** | missed two games with a mild knee sprain, but returned to the court off the bench at Maryland and has started each of the three games since. He is second on the team in scoring with 9.9 points per game. Over the four games before injury, Taylor averaged 9.2 ppg in the first half alone and was shooting 53 percent from behind the arc. He had nine points, all of 3-pointers, in his return vs. the Terps and added multiple 3-pointers in three of the last four games. Taylor produced the team's first double-double of the season and the first of his career with 14 points and 11 rebounds in win vs. Drexel Dec. 20. [MORE: Page 18]

**ROSS TRAVIS** | recorded a team-high eight rebounds against Wisconsin (2/18) to move into third all-time in career rebounds at Penn State (768) after leading the team in 13 games this season. He needs 144 to match Mike Lang (1980-83) for second place. [More: Page 20]

**SHEP GARNER** | is third on the team in scoring (8.8 ppg) and second in assists (2.3 apg) as a freshman. He has scored 10+ in 14 games this season, and has seen increased assist and rebound numbers when limited in scoring, leading the team in assists in two of the last four games. He has tied his career-high 14 points four times, most recently at Illinois. Though limited to 9 points vs. Nebraska (2/7/15), Garner posted a career-high five assists with just one turnover. **GENO THORPE** | has started each of the last nine games and 10 this season. As a starter in the last nine games, he is third on the team in assists (14) and leads the team with 12 steals, while averaging 7.9 ppg. He led the team in scoring for the second time this season with 14 points vs. Nebraska (2/7/15). Thorpe leads the team and is third in the Big Ten with 87 percent free-throw shooting. He is 79-91 from the line overall and 30-33 (91 percent) in league action. [MORE: Page 20]

**JORDAN DICKERSON** | has blocked multiple shots in 11 of the last 17 games, including a career-high six in the win over George Washington Dec. 14. He leads the team with 40 and is eighth in the Big Ten with 1.5 per game. **UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP)** - Penn State battled from behind by as many as 16 in the second half to arrive within five, 48-43, with 4:08 remaining, but Wisconsin pulled away for a 55-47 win. Sam Decker scored 22 points and Frank Kaminsky added 16 as No. 5 Wisconsin overcame a late Penn State surge to defeat the Nittany Lions.

Dekker and Penn State's D.J. Newbill waged an entertaining scoring battle. Newbill led all scorers with 29 points, but the next-highest scorer for Penn State was Brandon Taylor with seven.

Wisconsin never trailed and pulled out to a 39-26 lead at the outset of the second half that forced a Penn State timeout, then neither team scored for more than three minutes before Newbill's layup for Penn State and another Dekker 3-pointer that put the Badgers up by 14. The teams combined for just 21 points in the first 11 minutes of the half, and the Badgers patiently built a 46-30 lead.

# SEASON NOTES

## PENN STATE AND THE BIG TEN TAKE NYC

The Big Ten Conference announced a four-year men's basketball and men's hockey doubleheader series in Madison Square Garden, set to begin in 2016 with Penn State vs. Michigan Jan. 30. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

Additionally, the 2018 Big Ten Tournament will take place in MSG, scheduled for Feb. 28-March 4 with all 14 conference programs competing for the Big Ten's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. The 2018 event will be held one week earlier than previous tournaments, ending seven days before NCAA Tournament Selection Sunday.

## THROWBACK UNIS

Penn State wore new throwback uniforms at Bucknell Nov. 28 and vs. Virginia Tech Dec. 3, going 2-0. The unis are black and pink, honoring the school's original school colors established in 1887. The color pairing lasted just 2.5 years. Problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new choice was made on March 18, 1890.

## PLAYER LEADERSHIP

The team elected four captains prior to the start of the season -- D.J. Newbill, who is in his third season as a captain, along with two-time captain Ross Travis, Brandon Taylor and Kevin Montminy. Those four, along with Alan Wisniewski, make up Patrick Chambers' Leadership Council, which the staff relies on for decision making, providing guidance and helping everyone be the best possible teammate.

## CHAMBERS BEGINS YEAR FOUR

The 2014-15 season marks the fourth in University Park for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native has seen his win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season as he racked up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State, a road win at Indiana and his first PSU postseason appearance last season.

## ROOKIES LOOK TO MAKE IMPACT

Three new faces join the veteran core of Nittany Lions. Devin Foster, a junior college transfer, along with freshmen Shep Garner and Isaiah Washington as Penn State rookies. Garner (Chester, Pa.) and Washington (Williamsport, Pa.) bring the number of Pennsylvania natives on the roster to eight, including four from the Philadelphia area.

## MONTMINY EARNS SCHOLARSHIP

Kevin Montminy was awarded a scholarship for the 2014-15 season, Patrick Chambers announced in early August. A three-year walk-on, Montminy has seen action in 40 career games over the last three seasons with 24 total points and 10 rebounds. With a 4.0 grade-point average in each of the last five semesters, Montminy is a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, Academic All-Big Ten honoree and the team's Academic Award recipient.

## CHARLESTON CLASSIC

The Nittany Lions are slated to take part in the 2014 Charleston Classic, Nov. 20-23 in Charleston, S.C. They will open play in the tourney by taking on Charlotte at 5 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 20 on ESPNU and then will face either South Carolina or Cornell on the second day of the three-day event. The remaining teams in the field include Akron, Drexel, Miami (Fla.), and Southern California.

## OFFSEASON TRAINING

The Nittany Lions made headlines with their extensive offseason-training regimen. Strength coach Brandon Spayd designed a three-part workout challenge for team members called the Yoke Zone Challenge. Players pushed cars, crawled through sandpits and completed a number of demanding stations in an obstacle course setting. Kevin Montminy and Jordan Dickerson were the top pair among players completed the entire course each week.

Patrick Chambers and his staff also brought in The Program, a leadership development and team building program created and executed by former military personnel. Players completed two days of extensive mental and physical tasks designed to build better leaders and more cohesive teams.

## CHAMBERS ADDS ANOTHER FORMER PLAYER TO STAFF

D.J. Irving, a four-year member of the men's basketball team at Boston University, joined the Penn State staff as a graduate manager for the 2014-15 season. He replaced Andrew Jones, who is an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Thunder's D-League team. Irving is the fourth player coached by Chambers to join his staff. Assistant coach Dwayne Anderson and Ross Condon, director of operations, both played at Villanova with Chambers as an assistant and associate head coach. Irving came into the fold at Boston University and fellow PSU graduate manager Nicholas Colella played two seasons for Chambers as a Lion.

## PENN STATE OPENS THE 119TH SEASON

Penn State is competing in its 119th season on the hardwood and its 23rd as a member of the Big Ten conference. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule for the third year in a row. The Lions have made 13 postseason appearances in the last 26 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

- Was instrumental in recruiting the No. 3 ranked recruiting class in the nation according to ESPN.com to Villanova in 2009.
- Has an older brother, Tim, who was the 1984 Ivy League Player of the Year in football and led Penn to three-straight Ivy League titles. He is now a writer, producer and director and released the film "Mighty Macs" about the Immaculata women's 1972 NCAA championship team.

## SCORING

D.J. Newbill has 1,679 points in his third and final season wearing the Blue and White and ranks No. 4 all-time in career scoring. He also holds the record for scoring among three-year players, passing John Amaechi's 1,310 points with 17 at Marshall Dec. 6.

Newbill passed the 500-point season mark vs. Nebraska (581), becoming just the second person in PSU history to do so in three-consecutive seasons, joining Talor Battle.

## REBOUNDS

Ross Travis, who has led the Nittany Lions in rebounding each of the last two seasons and is among the top returning rebounders in the Big Ten, entered the Top 5 in career boards at Penn State. He currently has 768 and owns the No. 3 spot.

## BLOCKS

Donovon Jack entered Penn State's Top 10 with one block vs. Fordham (11/16). He is now ranked No. 8 and has 77 with all but three coming after his freshman season. His 54 blocks as a sophomore are the eighth-most in a single season and the most since the 1998-99 season. Only Calvin Booth, who owns positions 1-4, and John Amaechi (spots 5-7) rank above Jack.

Jordan Dickerson, who posted two blocks against Wisconsin (2/18) to take over the No. 10 spot. He has 40 blocks this season and is averaging 1.5 per game, which ranks eighth in the Big Ten. Last season, Dickerson produced 29 blocks in the 22 games he was eligible to compete last season, an average of 1.3 per game. That average would have placed him among the Top 10 in the Big Ten last season had he reached the minimum number of games to be ranked.

Brandon Taylor moved to No. 11 at Penn State with 68 career blocks. He is second on the team this season with 18 (0.8 per game).

**Charleston, S.C. (AP) -** D.J. Newbill had 26 points including the driving layup as the buzzer sounded to lift Penn State to a 72-71 victory over Cornell at the Charleston Classic on Friday night.

The Big Red (2-3) were up 71-70 with four seconds left but threw the inbound pass into the backcourt to beat the five-second clock. Geno Thorpe picked it up and passed to Newbill on the left side. Newbill dribbled the baseline and went up for the winning shot before time ran out.

It was the first lead for Penn State (3-1) since going up 4-2 less than three minutes into the game.

John Johnson had 17 points, including a high arcing 3-pointer with 4.5 seconds left that drew the Nittany Lions to 71-70.

Galal Cancer and Robert Hatter had 17 points each for Cornell, which faces Drexel for seventh place game Sunday.

It was a dramatic change of fortune for the Nittany Lions in Charleston. They rallied from 17 points down against Charlotte on Thursday night only to fall 106-97 in double overtime.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State trailed by as many as 13 before erasing an 11-point second-half deficit to earn the win with a buzzer-beating layup from D.J. Newbill.
- The 13-point deficit is the largest comeback for a win since the Nittany Lions overcame a 13-point disadvantage to defeat Indiana on the road, 66-65, Feb. 12, 2014.
- Penn State led for all of :07 in the entire contest. The game-winning bucket was its first advantage since the 17:38 mark in the first half.
- The game featured seven ties and three lead changes. Cornell led for 32:39 of the game.
- Penn State moves to 6-5 all-time against the Big Red, while head coach Patrick Chambers moves to 3-0 against Cornell in his career at both Penn State and Boston University.
- With 26 points, D.J. Newbill recorded his second-consecutive 20-plus point outing this season and 22nd of his career.
- Newbill tallied 15 first-half points going 3-3 from 3-point range and 4-8 from the field. He finished the evening 4-5 from the 3-point line.
- John Johnson set a season-high mark with 17 points, shooting 6-9 from the field and 4-4 from the free-throw line.
- Thirteen of Johnson's 17 points came in the second half, including a 3-pointer with :04 on the clock to make it a one-point game, 71-70
- Shep Garner put up double-figure scoring (10) for the fourth consecutive game of his career.
- With two steals, his final steal of the evening led to Newbill's game-winning buzzer-beater.

**Charleston, S.C. (AP) -** If Penn State wanted to close the Charleston Classic with a victory, coach Pat Chambers knew D.J. Newbill would have to make the biggest plays.

Newbill came through with 16 of his 22 points in the second half in the Nittany Lions' 63-61 win over Southern Cal in Sunday's fifth place game. He finished the three games with 83 points to set the tournament scoring mark, surpassing the 78 scored by St. Joseph's Carl Jones in 2011.

Penn State opened 4-1 for the third time in Chambers' four seasons.

After the Trojans (2-3) built a 49-43 lead with just under 10 minutes left, Newbill scored 10 of Penn State's next 13 points in their go-ahead run. His second 3-pointer put the Nittany Lions ahead to stay at 56-54.

Southern Cal was still within 62-60 on Jordan McLaughlin's foul shot with 1.3 seconds left. But Shep Garner made a foul shot with 0.7 seconds left to provide the final game.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- The two wins at the 2014 Charleston Classic mark the first time Penn State has won at least two games at a neutral site tournament since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic at Madison Square Garden. The Nittany Lions knocked off Princeton, 65-52, Dec. 26 and Hofstra, 74-71, Dec. 27 before going on to the NCAA Sweet 16 that season.
- The Nittany Lions limited the Trojans to 27.3 percent from the field marking the second time this season Penn State has held a team to less than 30 percent from the field.
- PSU matched a season-high mark with seven team 3-pointers, marking the second-consecutive game the Nittany Lions have reached the mark.
- The Nittany Lions did not attempt a free-throw until the 7:57 mark of the second half. USC had a 22-0 advantage in free-throw attempts to that point and finished with a 27-10 margin.
- With 83 points across all three games of the Charleston Classic, D.J. Newbill now holds the scoring record for the most points in tournament history. The previous record was held by Saint Joseph's Carl Jones (2011) with 78 points.
- Newbill averaged 27.7 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.3 steals over the last three games, while shooting 50 percent from 3-point range, 47 percent from the field and 85 percent from the free-throw line.
- Shep Garner registered 12 points in the first half, shooting 4-5 from both the field and 3-point range. He concluded the night ranked second on the team in scoring with 13 points.

LUISWAY, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill had 28 points and Penn State pulled away late for an 88-80 victory over Bucknell on Friday. The Nittany Lions (6-1) never trailed but never led by more than 12. Bucknell (2-5) tied the game once, at 66-all, with 6:19 to play. Penn State answered with a 12-4 run and held steady from there with Newbill scoring six of the Nittany Lions' last 10 points to secure the win.

Ross Travis added 14 points, and Brandon Taylor and Geno Thorpe had 12 apiece. Penn State was 8 of 15 from 3-point range and 30 of 54 from the field.

The Bison used a 16-6 run to pull even late in the second half, but Chris Hass and John Azzarino turned the ball over on consecutive possessions to halt the momentum.

Haas cut the deficit to 83-78 on a 3-pointer with 1:07 left and the Bison would get no closer. Penn State led 39-33 at halftime, and Newbill scored 21 of his 28 in the second half. Taylor's 3-pointer with 6:18 left in the first half gave Penn State its largest lead at 31-19. The Bison answered with nine straight points.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- With the 88-80 win on the road at Bucknell, Penn State improves to 6-1 on the road, marking the second consecutive year PSU has opened the year with a 6-1 mark under head coach Patrick Chambers.
- The Nittany Lions are 3-1 away from the Bryce Jordan Center and 1-0 after their first true road game. The team has won their first true away game in each of the last two seasons.
- The win also extends the current Nittany Lion winning streak to four straight, marking the third consecutive season PSU has put together a four-game winning streak.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Patrick Chambers was eager to point out that Penn State's defense played a huge role in the Nittany Lions' 61-58 ACC-Big Ten Challenge victory over Virginia Tech Wednesday night. D.J. Newbill scored 18 points and Shep Garner added 13 for Penn State (7-1), but the Lions crafted a 47-38 edge in rebounding. They were led by 10 from Ross Travis, eight from Jordan Dickerson and seven each from Brandon Taylor and Donovan Jack.

Penn State limited the Hokies (4-3) to 38.5 percent shooting from the field and 28.6 from 3-point range during the back-and-forth game in which a 16-2 second-half run turned momentum in Penn State's favor. It was the fourth one-possession game Penn State has played this season.

Joey van Zegeren scored 18 points for the Hokies and Justin Bibbs added 16. But Tech hit only 4 of 14 free throws and 4 of 14 3-pointers. The Hokies (4-3) led by as many as eight points early in the second half but Penn State's Newbill scored 13 second-half points after a 1-of-5 first-half shooting performance.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- The Penn State victory extends the Nittany Lions winning streak to five in a row, putting PSU out to its best start (7-1) under head coach Patrick Chambers and for the program since the 2008-09 campaign.
- Eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points in the win, led by D.J. Newbill and Shep Garner, who each recorded double figure scoring.
- Powered by a 16-2 run in the second half, Penn State came from behind by as many eight, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have come back from down by more than six to win (14 vs. Akron, 6 vs. USC and 13 vs. Cornell).

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP)** - Penn State has gotten off to its best start in more than a decade because it's been able to finish.

The Nittany Lions took the lead late in the first half and never trailed in the second en route to a 64-62 victory over Duquesne Wednesday night. Their seventh straight victory is the longest streak since 2007-08 and is the longest active streak among Big Ten teams.

Geno Thorpe scored a career-high 19 points, freshman Shep Garner added 13 and Penn State upped its record to 9-1, its best start since the Lions' 2000-01 Sweet 16 season.

The Dukes (3-3), who were led by 18 points from Jordan Stevens and 11 from TySean Powell, took a potential game-winning shot at the final buzzer, but Micah James's 3-pointer fell short.

D.J. Newbill and Donovan Jack each added 11 for Penn State, and Jack made good on four free throws in the final two minutes.

Penn State, after a 5-of-10 first-half performance at the free throw line, sank 15 of 18 in the final 20 minutes. Penn State led by 10 early in the second half but Powell and Stevens teamed up for an 8-2 Duquesne run to close to 46-42, and Duquesne got to within 52-51 when Darius Lewis made good on a three-point play.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State matches its best start, 9-1, since the 2000-01 team also started 9-1. That team finished 21-12 and made an appearance in the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen.
- Penn State has now won seven straight games, its most since winning seven in a row in 2007-08 and the longest active streak among Big Ten teams.
- The Lions have had five games decided by five or fewer points and four by just one possession. They have won all of them this season and have been victorious in each of their last seven games decided by three or fewer points, dating back to last season.
- The Nittany Lions held Duquesne to just 4-of-19 from beyond the arc (21.1 percent). The Dukes came into the game shooting 45.8 percent collectively from 3-point range.
- The 35 bench points for Penn State are the most since posting 44 vs. Central Connecticut State on Nov. 22, 2010.

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP)** - A solid defensive effort enabled Penn State to inch closer to its coach's season-long goal of playing a complete, 40-minute game on Sunday. DJ Newbill scored 20 points, Brandon Taylor added 17, and Penn State defeated GW 64-51 for its eighth straight win. The Nittany Lions (10-1), who also got 10 points from Shep Garner, shot 38.7 percent (18 of 53) from the field and were 9 of 9 from the free throw line. But six blocks from Jordan Dickerson - out of 11 total blocks - and 10 rebounds from Ross Travis helped shut down a Colonial team that averaged nearly 74 points per game.

George Washington (6-3), who was led by 15 points each from Kevin Larsen and Patricio Garino, consistently shot from under the basket but made good on only 18 of 53 shots for 34 percent. The Colonials failed to score on eight 3-point shots and were just 15 of 23 from the free throw line.

Penn State's start is its best since the 1995-96 team jumped to a 13-0 record and ultimately advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The Nittany Lions outrebounded GW 40-35. Its 16 offensive rebounds, many of which came late in the second half, enabled Penn State to kick the ball out to the backcourt and kill time while holding leads that ranged from 10 to 15 points down the stretch.

**POSTGAME NOTES**

- Penn State extends its winning streak to eight in a row with the win against George Washington to move to 10-1 on the year, marking the best start for the Nittany Lions since the 1995-96 season. The streak also is the longest for the Nittany Lions since the 1995-96 season (13).
- Having posted wins in its last eight non-conference games, Penn State's 10 non-conference wins are also the most for PSU since the 2008-09 season (11).
- PSU's eight-game winning stretch is the longest among all 14 Big Ten teams.
- The Nittany Lions registered a season-high mark with 11 blocks in the win, marking the most for PSU since posting 13 against Duquesne in 2013.
- Penn State grabbed a season-high 16 offensive rebounds, posting a 40-35 advantage against GW on the glass.
- GW did not hit a 3-point field goal in the opening 0-8 from behind the arc. The last time Penn State held an opponent without a trey was Feb. 5, 2013 vs. Purdue.
- Penn State held the Colonials to 34 percent shooting on the game, its fourth opponent to shoot below 35 percent this season, and to a stifling 29 percent in the second half.
- Improving to 20-11 all-time against the Colonials, Penn State has won eight of the last 10 games in the series, having claimed a win in the first meeting between the two teams since 1991.
- The Nittany Lions also improve to 6-0 at home, having won its last 11 non-conference games in the Bryce Jordan Center.

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) -** D.J. Newbill scored 17 points, Geno Thorpe added 12 and Penn State defeated Dartmouth 69-49 Monday for its 10th straight win and a school-record 12th non-conference victory.

John Johnson and Brandon Taylor each added 10 points for Penn State (12-1), which held Dartmouth to 19 of 54 from the field and 2 of 20 from 3-point range. The Nittany Lions shot 47 percent from the field and had a 38-30 edge in rebounding. Alex Mitola had 13 points and Gabas Maldunas had nine to lead Dartmouth (5-6).

Dartmouth opened the second half with more energy, outscoring the Lions 15-11 over the initial 7 1/2 minutes. But the Big Green struggled to stay consistent and remained cold from long range as well as at the foul line. Penn State led by 25 with 10:30 remaining but Maldunas was good on four free throws and Malik Gill lobbed a pass over the basket that Wesley Dickinson slammed through to close Dartmouth's deficit to 60-42. Newbill followed with a driving layup, got the ball from Ross Travis on a team and fed Travis for an easy slam and a 64-42 advantage.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- The win against Dartmouth marked the 12th non-conference victory of the season, a program-best mark for Penn State.
- The Nittany Lions extended their winning streak to 10 in a row with a victory against the Big Green. The winning streak is the longest since the 1995-96 season when PSU opened the season 13-0. The 12-1 start also is the best mark since the 1995-96 campaign.
- The 10-game win streak is the longest among all 14 Big Ten teams. Penn State is the first conference team to reach 12 wins this season.
- Penn State limited Dartmouth to a season-low 16 first-half points marking the fewest amount of points allowed in the first half since Northwestern scored 15 on March 16, 2014. The 69-49 final score also marks the first time the Nittany Lions have recorded a 20-point margin of victory since defeating the Wildcats 59-32 in 2014.
- The Nittany Lion bench contributed 31 points in the win, led by double figure scoring from John Johnson (10) and Geno Thorpe (12). Having recorded more than 20 points in nine games this season, the Nittany Lion bench is averaging 22.0 ppg this season. Non-starters produced 15.1 ppg a year ago.
- Along with Johnson and Thorpe, D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor posted double figures with 17 and 10, respectively, marking the fifth time this season the Nittany Lions have had four record double digit scoring.
- Penn State improves to 7-0 in the Bryce Jordan Center, marking the most consecutive victories at home for the Nittany Lions since 2007-08, when PSU recorded eight in a row from Nov. 12 - Dec. 31, 2007. They have won each of their last 12 non-conference games in the BJC.
- A season-high tallying 13 players saw action for the Nittany Lions with 10 of them tallying points. Thirteen players also took the court opening weekend vs. Fordham.

**MADISON, Wis. (AP) -** Frank Kaminsky had 18 points and 14 rebounds, Nigel Hayes scored 21 points and No. 4 Wisconsin shot a blistering 63 percent from the field to beat Penn State 89-72 on Wednesday. The Badgers (13-1) won their sixth straight with Kaminsky leading a balanced attack. The preseason All-American had secured his sixth double-double of the season by midway through the second half with Wisconsin comfortably ahead by double digits.

D.J. Newbill scored 29 points for Penn State (12-2), which had its 10-game winning streak snapped. The Big Ten's leading scorer was 5-of-11 shooting in the second half after going 6 of 7 in the first. Wisconsin's athletic front court asserted control after halftime, with Kaminsky and Hayes getting to the basket at will. Forward Sam Dekker scored 17 after shooting 7 of 10 from the field.

The Nittany Lions withered on both ends of the court to start the second half, when Wisconsin went on an 8-2 run to take a 51-38 lead with 17:03 left on Traevon Jackson's 3-pointer. It was in sharp contrast to the opening 20 minutes, when Penn State stayed step-for-step for much of the time with Wisconsin.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions scored more points against Wisconsin than any other team this season. As one of two teams to score 70 points against the Badgers, only Duke has been able to put up at least 70 points.
- The Penn State bench tallied 28 points, led by 11 points from Geno Thorpe. The PSU bench is averaging 22.0 ppg this season, up from 15.1 ppg in non-conference games last season.
- Penn State shot 53.7 percent from the field (29-54) against the Badgers, marking a season-best for the Nittany Lions. PSU opened the game shooting 64 percent in the first half alone.
- Three Nittany Lions recorded double figures, led by D.J. Newbill, who put up a team-high 29 points.
- Penn State's 10-game winning streak came to an end as the Nittany Lions move to 12-2 on the year with the loss.
- Penn State moves to 2-1 in true road games this season and 7-16 in Big Ten openers.
- Garner also move to 32-10 in the all-time series against the Nittany Lions.

## BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP) - Penn State was led by Ross Travis and Shep Garner, who each had 14, but a late charge from Indiana was enough to hold off the Nittany Lions 76-73 on Tuesday.

The Hoosiers (13-4, 3-1 Big Ten) have won two straight but had to survive a replay review on Brandon Taylor's 3-pointer that would have forced overtime. Officials determined the shot came after the buzzer.

It was not quite enough to snap a four-game losing streak, but Penn State (12-5, 0-4) certainly had a chance. The Nittany Lions cut a 12-point deficit to 76-73 on Travis' basket with 53.1 seconds to go. After a defensive stop, they took possession on a jump ball with 14.6 seconds left. But D.J. Newbill's contested 3 from the left wing was off and after Taylor grabbed the rebound, raced to the arc and made the shot, the refs waved it off.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions starting lineup of D.J. Newbill, Donovan Jack, Brandon Taylor, Shep Garner and Ross Travis took the court for the eighth time this season (6-2). All five starters finished in double-figure scoring.
- Geno Thorpe posted 10 points, making him the sixth Nittany Lion with double figure scoring, marking the first time PSU has had six in double figures since 12/19/2009 vs. Gardner Webb.
- Penn State scored 18 of its 39 first-half points in the paint, finishing the game with a season-high 46 points in the paint. The mark is the highest since 3/2/14 vs. Wisconsin when the Nittany Lions tallied 50.
- The Nittany Lions have had five one-possession games this season with this standing as the first loss. They won each of their last three games decided by three points or fewer last season for a seven-game streak.
- Eight games this season have been decided by five or fewer points with Penn State winning the first six in non-conference play and dropping the last two to Big Ten teams.
- PSU picked up eight steals against the Hoosiers, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have recorded at least eight steals.
- D.J. Newbill finished second on the team with 12 points, scoring 10 in the first half alone for his 17th consecutive double-figure scoring outing of the season.
- With 1,461 career points, Newbill moved into ninth on the Penn State career scoring list. He needs 81 more points to match Geary Claxton (2005-08) for eighth all-time.
- Ross Travis finished tied for first on the team with a season-high tying 14 points. It is the first time he has led or shared the lead in the team in scoring since Dec. 7, 2013 when he tallied 20 points vs. Marshall.
- Travis led the team with eight rebounds, including six on the defensive glass. He has led the team in rebounding in 10 of 17 games this season.

**EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP)** - Despite a game-high 27 points from D.J. Newbill, Michigan State slipped past Penn State in a 66-60 decision on the road in East Lansing Wednesday evening.

Newbill, the nation's No. 4 scorer, had 18 of his 27 points in the second half and nearly gave the Nittany Lions (12-7, 0-6) their first win since Dec. 22.

Brandon Dawson had 12 points, 10 rebounds and three blocked shots to help Michigan State outlast Penn State. Gavin Schilling added 11 points and 10 rebounds for the Spartans (13-6, 4-2 Big Ten). Denzel Valentine scored 11 points and Travis Trice and Matt Castello 10 each.

The Nittany Lions battled back from an eight-point first half deficit to tie the game at 37-37 in the opening part of the second half. Despite keeping it tight, a technical foul on frustrated Penn State coach Patrick Chambers helped Michigan State pull away when the game was tied for the final time at 51. A short jumper from Valentine with 4:04 left gave the Spartans the lead for good at 53-51.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor paced the offense with double figure scoring, led by a game-high 27 points from Newbill.
- Eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points, with a total of 10 seeing time on the court.
- The Nittany Lions trailed by as many as eight, but tied up the game seven times in the second half alone. They were never able to take the lead.
- The last five games have been decided by an average of fewer than six points (5.8), with two being separated by three and four points (Rutgers, Indiana).
- Penn State committed just three turnovers in the opening frame while converting eight points off of eight MSU miscues in the first half.

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP)** - D.J. Newbill scored 23 points and Brandon Taylor 16 to lead Penn State to a 79-51 win over Rutgers on Saturday for its first Big Ten Conference victory of the season.

The Nittany Lions (13-7, 1-6 Big Ten), losers of six straight games, never trailed after taking a 16-15 lead with just over 10 minutes to play in the opening half. The 28-point spread was Penn State's largest margin of victory since December 2011 against Mount St. Mary's (29).

Shep Garner added 13 points for Penn State, including three 3-pointers. Penn State shot 10 of 20 from 3-point range and its first 12 points of the game were 3-pointers.

Rutgers (10-11, 2-6) was led by 19 points from Kadeem Mack, the only Scarlet Knight in double figures. Rutgers shot just 10 of 27 in the second half after going 11 of 21 in the first half. The Knights were 3 of 13 from 3-point range.

Penn State forced 16 Rutgers turnovers while committing just nine of its own, and also owned a 32-28 edge in rebounding.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State's 28-point margin of victory is tied for the sixth-largest win against a Big Ten team in program history and is the largest at home since defeating Northwestern by 38, 83-45, on Jan. 22, 1998.
- The win is the first 20-point Big Ten victory since the Nittany Lions defeated Northwestern 59-32 (27) March 6, 2014 on the road in Evanston. The win also marks the most recent 20-point margin of victory at home against a conference team since PSU topped Purdue 65-45 (20) January 5, 2012.
- PSU totaled 41 first-half points, marking a season high total for the Nittany Lions in Big Ten play this year. The first half tally also marks the first time Penn State has reached the number in Big Ten action since January 11, 2014 and the first half vs. Indiana (41-37).
- The Nittany Lions tallied a Big Ten season-high 10 3-pointers, marking the first time PSU has notched double-digit treys since February 27, 2013 against Michigan. In the opening half alone, Penn State shot 75 percent from 3-point range, sinking 6-of-8 attempts.
- Penn State hit 50 percent of its 3-point attempts on the game for the first time in Big Ten play this season. The Lions season-best performance was 53.3 percent (8-15) at Bucknell.
- Penn State shot above 50 percent from the field for the third time this season and the first time in the Bryce Jordan Center. The Lions finished 50.9 percent from the field (29-57) for the highest shooting percentage at home vs. league teams since also hitting 50.9 percent of shots vs. Northwestern Feb. 25, 2012.
- Nine players tallied points for the Nittany Lions, including three in double figures. Penn State is 6-1 on the season with three players top 10 points.
- The Nittany Lions converted a season-high 21 points off of 16 Scarlet Knight turnovers.
- Penn State totaled a season-high 18 assists, while also matching a season-low mark with just nine turnovers.
- Penn State wore its alternate gray uniforms for the third time this season, improving to 3-0 in them.

CHAMPION, ILL. (AP) - D.J. Newbill led Penn State with 20 points, but the Nittany Lions fell to Illinois 60-58 in a game that came down to the very last play.

Illinois forward Malcolm Hill scored 27 points Saturday including two on a layup with four seconds left in the game to put Illinois by two. Newbill raced down the court and drove to the basket but couldn't convert on the layup as time expired.

Shep Garner added 14 for Penn State. Julian Moore posted a career-high 10 points for the Nittany Lions, having entered the game averaging just 1.1 points a game.

The biggest lead of the afternoon was eight, in the first five minutes for Illinois. Kendrick Nunn added 10 points for Illinois. Leron Black had a game-high seven rebounds.

Penn State outrebounded Illinois 32-26, while making 42% of their shots and holding Illinois to 38% shooting. Illinois -- if you take away its 8-of-15 3-point shooting -- shot just 31.6 percent from the field.

The Nittany Lions will play their second straight on the road, traveling to Maryland on Wednesday.

**POSTGAME NOTES**

- Three Nittany Lions recorded double figure scoring, featuring a team-high 20 points from D.J. Newbill and a career-high 10 points for Julian Moore.
- Six games this season have been separated by one possession with PSU winning the first four before falling short in the last two (Indiana and Illinois). In Big Ten play, six of the team's seven Big Ten losses have been decided by an average of 4.8 points.
- Through 22 games, Penn State has had a total of 10 games decided by five points or fewer, having won the most recent close call earlier this week against Minnesota (63-58).

**COLLEGE PARK, Md. (AP)** - Despite double figure scoring performances from D.J. Newbill and Geno Thorpe, Penn State men's basketball came up short in a close 64-58 loss on the road at No. 17 Maryland Wednesday evening.

The Nittany Lions (14-9, 2-8) and the Terrapins (19-4, 7-3 Big Ten) were tied with 4:59 left before Maryland pulled away with a late rally to capture the win.

With Maryland leading 57-52, PSU battled to within one before Wells made two foul shots with 39.3 seconds remaining. Then, after a Penn State miss, Wells grabbed the rebound and added another free throw to clinch it.

Maryland improved to 4-0 this season following a defeat. The Terrapins were coming off an 80-56 loss at Ohio State.

**POSTGAME NOTES**

- Nine different Nittany Lions scored at least two points, led by D.J. Newbill and Geno Thorpe, who both tallied double figure scoring. Newbill led the way with 18 points, while Thorpe followed with 10.
- Despite 13 lead changes and seven ties, PSU held the lead for 12:01, before the 17th-ranked Terps edged the Nittany Lions, 64-58.
- Penn State limited Maryland's leading scorer Melo Trimble to just four points, holding him scoreless from both the field (0-5) and from three-point range (0-2). Trimble entered the game averaging 15.7 ppg, which ranked eighth in the Big Ten standings.
- While the Nittany Lions entered the intermission shooting 15 percent (2-13) from behind the arc, PSU improved to 44 percent (4-9) in the second half, led by a pair of treys from both Newbill and Brandon Taylor.
- Including Maryland, Penn State has held its opponent under their season scoring averaging in seven of 10 Big Ten games, including each of the last five. The Terps totaled 64 points, having entering tonight's matchup averaging 68.4 ppg.
- D.J. Newbill led the team in points (18), rebounds (7) and assists (5). He has led the team in all three categories twice this season and for the second time in three games. He also did so vs. Minnesota (12, 11 and 5).
- With 1,598 points, Newbill is in sole possession of fifth place on the PSU career scoring list. He needs just seven more points to match Pete Lisycky (1995-98) for fourth all-time.
- With 490 points on the year, Newbill is 10 points shy of becoming the second player in program history to reach 500 points in three consecutive seasons.
- Geno Thorpe finished second on the team with 10 points in his fifth consecutive start for the Nittany Lions.

**COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)** - D.J. Newbill had 16 points and Brandon Taylor 11 as Penn State men's basketball (15-10, 3-9) fell short in a 75-55 decision on the road at No. 23/21 Ohio State Wednesday evening.

Sam Thompson scored a career-high 22 points, while Russell, the nation's top freshman scorer, added 17 points, six rebounds and seven assists for Ohio State (19-6, 8-4 Big Ten), which has won five of six.

Ohio State never trailed after streaking to a 9-0 lead early in the game. The Nittany Lions scored nine of 11 points during one span to draw as close as 24-16 before Ohio State pulled away for good.

- Ten different Nittany Lions contributed at least one point, led by D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor, who each recorded double digits.

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP)** - Despite double figure scoring from three Nittany Lions, No. 19 Maryland used strong shooting in the second half to scramble past Penn State 76-73 Saturday night. The Terrapins (21-5, 9-4 Big Ten), the nation's No. 2 team in free throws made with 447, sank 21 of 26 and were 9 of 19 from 3-point range. Penn State (15-11, 3-9) was led by 25 points from D.J. Newbill, who reached double figures for the 100th time in his career. Geno Thorpe added 17 points and Brandon Taylor had 11 for the Nittany Lions.

The Terps led 72-70 with a minute remaining when they committed their 11th turnover. Newbill then slipped and lost control of the ball, and Trimble hit a pair of free throws. Newbill recovered with a long 3-pointer to bring the Lions to 74-73 with 13.6 seconds left. Trimble was fouled on the inbounds pass and put the Terps up by three. Newbill took a 25-foot shot that bounced high off the rim and then off the top of the backboard to end the game.

**POSTGAME NOTES**

- All nine Nittany Lions to see action on the court made it on to the scoreboard with at least one point. D.J. Newbill, Geno Thorpe and Brandon Taylor led the group with double figure scoring.
- The Nittany Lions held Maryland without a bucket for 4:05 during a 13-0 second-half Penn State surge, while also holding the Terps without a field goal for 7:22.
- Through 26 games this season, Penn State has had 11 decided by five points or fewer, moving to 7-4 in five-point games since knocking off Minnesota (63-58). There have been seven one-possession decisions.
- The game featured eight ties and five lead changes with the Nittany Lions holding the lead for 20:28 of the contest (15:46 for UMD, 3:45 tied)
- The Nittany Lions move to 17-15 all-time when playing on Valentine's Day with the last four games being decided by a total of 12 points: 2013 vs. Iowa (L, 74-22); 2009 vs. Minnesota (W, 68-63); 2007 vs. Ohio State (L, 64-62) and 2015 vs. Maryland (76-73).
- Penn State tallied a season-low seven turnovers. Maryland produced 11 turnovers, leading to 14 PSU points.
- Penn State also moves to 10-3 when playing at home in the Bryce Jordan Center this year.
- The Nittany Lions wore their alternate gray uniforms, falling to 3-1 on the season when wearing them.
- The game against the Terps marks PSU's second of three-consecutive outings against ranked opponents. The Lions have faced a ranked team at the time of meeting four times this season; six of the Nittany Lions' 2014-15 opponents are currently ranked, or receiving votes, in the AP and/or USA Today polls.
- Newbill led the team with 25 points, marking his 14th 20-plus point scoring performance of the season and 34th of his career. He shot 3-for-5 from 3-point range and 6-for-9 from the free throw line.
- Having reached double figures in every game this season, Newbill has tallied 100-career double digit outings. His team-high 20.8 ppg also leads the Big Ten and ranks ninth nationally.
