### THE OPENING TIP...

Overall Record: 88-76 (5th Year)

- Northwestern and Penn State are meeting in the Big Ten tournament for the fourth time. The Wildcats have won two of the previous three matchups, though the teams are squaring off in the tourney for the first time since 2006.
- The winner of Thursday's contest advances to the quarterfinal round where it will square off against second-seeded Ohio State.
- Northwestern reached the semifinal round of the Big Ten tournament for the first time a year ago, defeating Rutgers, 83-61, in the second round before upsetting Maryland, 72-64, in the quarterfinals.
- The Wildcats had a pair of players earn All-Big Ten recognition as senior guard Bryant McIntosh and junior center **Dererk Pardon** were named honorable mention picks of the league's media members.





### **GAME NOTES**

### **SCOUTING PENN STATE**

The Nittany Lions (19-12, 9-9 B1G) tied Indiana for sixth place during the regular season but have dropped their last three contests, most recently falling 76-64 at Nebraska on Sunday. Tony Carr led Penn State with 27 points. A first-team All-Big Ten selection, Carr leads the Big Ten with an average of 19.9 points per game while ranking third with a .458 3-point field goal percentage and fifth with an average of 4.8 assists per game. Josh Reaves ranks first in the Big Ten with an average of 2.4 steals per contest and Shep Garner is tops with 2.8 3-point field goals per game.

### NORTHWESTERN AND PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The Wildcats and Nittany Lions have met three previous times in the Big Ten tournament, but not since 2006. Northwestern has won two of the three meetings. The better seed has won all three matchups. NU set a Big Ten tournament record with 22 steals, including an individual record 8 by Jitim Young, in a 57-52 win March 11, 2004.

### MCINTOSH, PARDON EARN ALL-BIG TEN RECOGNITION

Senior guard **Bryant McIntosh** and junior center **Dererk Pardon** both earned postseason recognition Feb. 26 when they were named honorable mention All-Big Ten as selected by the league's media members. McIntosh was an honorable mention pick as a sophomore before earning second-team accolades a year ago as a junior. This is the first All-Big Ten honor for Pardon.

### **LINDSEY LIGHTS IT UP**

Senior guard **Scottie Lindsey** enters the Big Ten tournament on a hot streak. In Northwestern's last two games, Lindsey tallied 26 points vs. Wisconsin last Thursday before scoring a career-best 32 points at Iowa on Sunday. He went 9-of-11 from 3-point range vs. the Hawkeyes with the nine triples tying Craig Moore and John Shurna for the Northwestern single-game record. The nine makes rank as a tie for the third most ever in a Big Ten game trailing only the 11 made by Michigan State's Bryn Forbes vs. Rutgers and 10 by Ohio State's Jon Diebler vs. Penn State. The total also tied a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record.

### **BACK IN THE NEW YORK GROOVE**

NU is playing at Madison Square Garden for the first time since the 2010-11 season when it participated in the MSG Holiday Festival. The Wildcats defeated St. Francis (N.Y.), 92-61, before falling to St. John's, 85-69. Northwestern did play in New York a year ago, participating in the Legends Classic at Barclays Center in Brooklyn. The 'Cats defeated 22nd-ranked Texas, 77-58, before falling to Notre Dame, 70-66, in the championship game.

### **NOT FAR OFF**

Though Northwestern's record may not be where it would like it to be this season, the Wildcats haven't been far off from having a much more successful campaign. Seven of NU's Big Ten losses were by either seven points or less or in overtime, including each of the last five. Northwestern played each of the top three teams in the conference (Michigan State, Ohio State, Purdue) once with all three of the losses decided by six points or less.

### **WINNING WAYS**

Northwestern has posted at least six Big Ten wins in each of Chris Collins' five seasons as head coach. The only other time NU has won at least six league games over at least five straight years was a seven-year span from 1928-34 that included a pair of Big Ten championships. The Wildcats posted school records of 24 overall wins and 21 regular-season wins in 2016-17 after posting what was then a record 20 regular-season wins the prior season. The previous regular-season best was 19 wins during the 2009-10 season.

### **BEG YOUR PARDON**

Junior center **Dererk Pardon** ranks third in the Big Ten with a .623 field goal percentage this season and is NU's all-time leader with a .623 career field goal percentage. The career mark ranks 12th in the nation among all active Division I players. Pardon made all eight of his field goal attempts in the team's win at Wisconsin Feb. 1, Northwestern's first perfect effort from the field with at least seven attempts since Vince Scott went 7-for-7 against Loyola (Md.) Dec. 27, 2006. Pardon posted a season-high 15 boards against Nebraska Jan. 2. His 11 offensive rebounds against the Cornhuskers are tied for the second most by a Division I player in a game this season, trailing only the 12 by Hofstra's Rokas Gustys against Siena Nov. 25.

### **RETURN OF THE MAC**

Now in his senior season, guard **Bryant McIntosh** already has left his mark on Northwestern. His 694 career assists are a school record and rank third among all active players in the nation. He holds the top two single-season assist totals in school history. After posting a school-record 213 assists as a sophomore, McIntosh had 188 assists in 2016-17. McIntosh currently ranks sixth in school history with 1,676 career points. He is the only Big Ten player over the last 25 years to post 1,340 points and 550 assists through his first three collegiate seasons.

### LINDSEY JOINS THE COMMA CLUB

Senior guard **Scottie Lindsey** became the 35th player in NU history to eclipse 1,000 points in his career when he reached the milestone in a 95-73 victory over Brown Dec. 30. Lindsey currently has 1,258 career points (19th in school history) and leads the team with an average of 15.3 points per contest this season.

### A DISH TO PASS

**Bryant McIntosh** put together a memorable performance in the team's Jan. 10 home win over Minnesota. McIntosh handed out a school-record 16 assists in the game without committing a turnover, making him the first Division I player since 2005 to not commit a turnover while handing out at least 16 assists. The assist total bested the previous school single-game mark of 14 by Patrick Baldwin against Youngstown State Dec. 5, 1992. McIntosh has handed out 10 or more assists in a game six times in his career, something no other Wildcat has done more than twice.

### ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

NU's 96-31 victory over Chicago State Dec. 11 was notable on many levels:
•The 65-point margin of victory is the largest ever by NU. The previous best was 57 in a 77-20 win over University of Chicago Jan. 14, 1944.

- Chicago State's 31 points are just one more than the low by a Northwestern opponent since 1944. Oakland scored 30 points in a 68-30 loss to NU Nov. 21, 1998. The 31 points are the fewest by a Division I team this season.
- •The 'Cats led 55-8 at halftime. The eight points are the fewest by an NU foe in a half during the shot clock era.
- Chicago State's 8 field goals rank as a tie for the fewest by a Division I team in a game over the last four years.

### **GAME NOTES**

### **SUCCESS ACROSS THE BOARD**

With Northwestern earning a preseason national ranking as well as being ranked in the first weekly Associated Press poll and the Wildcats' football program appearing in the College Football Playoff Rankings, this season marked the first time that both programs have been nationally ranked at the same time. The football program concluded its season with eight straight wins and capped a 10-3 campaign with a win in the Music City Bowl.

### **SCINTILLATING FROM THE STRIPE**

Northwestern ranks second in the Big Ten with a .750 team free throw percentage. The Wildcats were nearly perfect from the free throw line against Saint Peter's on Nov. 13. NU hit on 23 of its 24 attempts from the charity stripe. The .958 percentage is the seventh-best effort in school history (minimum 15 attempts) and the top performance with only one miss.

### **SCINTILLATING FROM THE STRIPE, PART 2**

**Bryant McIntosh** has been nearly automatic from the free throw line during his career. He converted on each of his first 20 attempts this season before finally missing once against Illinois Dec. 1. McIntosh's career free throw percentage of .852 ranks second in program history behind only Jeff Grose (.862). In Big Ten play, **Scottie Lindsey** connected on 37 of his 42 attempts (.881).

### **CRASHING THE GLASS**

Northwestern was dominant on the glass in a Jan. 10 home win over Minnesota. The Wildcats finished with a 45-26 rebounding advantage. The +19 margin was the team's largest since out-rebounding Rutgers, 45-25, Feb. 27, 2016. Northwestern surrendered only 16 rebounds to Saint Peter's Nov. 13, the fewest by a Northwestern opponent in over 25 years.

### **BLOCK PARTY**

NU was swatting shots left and right in the team's season-opening win over Loyola (Md.) Nov. 10. The 'Cats posted 12 blocked shots in the game which rank as a tie for the second-best single-game effort in program history. **Dererk Pardon** and **Vic Law** led the way with three blocks apiece. The school record for blocked shots by the team is 15 achieved at Rutgers Jan. 12, 2017. Pardon's 56 blocked shots in 2017-18 are three shy of Alex Olah's top single-season mark (59; 2014-15) in school history since blocked shots became an official statistic in 1986.

### **WILDCATS EARN PRESEASON NATIONAL RANKINGS**

Northwestern opened the season ranked in the preseason Associated Press and USA TODAY Coaches polls. The Wildcats were ranked No. 19 by the AP and No. 20 by the coaches. It is the first time that NU is ranked in the AP preseason poll. The team was ranked No. 25 Jan. 30 of last season, their first top-25 AP ranking in seven years. This is the first time that Northwestern has ever been ranked at any time in the Coaches Poll.

### **QUARTET SERVING AS TEAM CAPTAINS**

Four individuals are serving as team captains for the 2017-18 season. Senior guards **Scottie Lindsey** and **Bryant McIntosh**, redshirt junior forward **Vic Law** and junior center **Dererk Pardon** are serving in the leadership role for the Wildcats. All four are returning starters. This is the first time that Northwestern has had four individuals be team captains.

### MCINTOSH, LINDSEY TABBED PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

Northwestern senior guards **Scottie Lindsey** and **Bryant McIntosh** each were named to the 10-member Preseason All-Big Ten Team. NU is one of three schools to have two individuals named to the squad, joining Michigan State and Minnesota. Both Lindsey and McIntosh were All-Big Ten selections in 2016-17. McIntosh was one of three unanimous selections to the team, joining Michigan State's Miles Bridges and Wisconsin's Ethan Happ.

### **RETURNING ALL-BIG TEN HONOREES**

Three Northwestern players earned All-Big Ten recognition a year ago. Guard **Bryant McIntosh** was a consensus second-team all-league pick, while **Scottie Lindsey** was named by the league's head coaches to the third team

and honorable mention by the media. In addition, **Vic Law** was selected by the coaches to the five-member All-Defensive Team. It's the first time NU has had two All-Big Ten picks in the same years since John Shurna and Drew Crawford in 2012. Law was the first Wildcat to be named to the All-Defensive Team since Jeremy Nash in 2010. McIntosh was a Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection in 2015 and was a consensus honorable mention All-Big Ten pick as a sophomore.

### MCINTOSH NAMED TO PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Senior guard **Bryant McIntosh** was named to a trio of prestigious preseason watch lists. He is one of 50 individuals named to the Naismith Award and Wooden Award watch lists which honor the nation's top player. He also is one of 20 individuals named to the watch list for the 2018 Bob Cousy Award presented to the nation's top point guard. A year ago, McIntosh averaged 5.4 assists per game in Big Ten play making him the first Northwestern player to lead the league in the category.

### **HOME AWAY FROM HOME**

Northwestern is playing all of its home games at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois, this season due to Welsh-Ryan Arena undergoing a complete \$110 million renovation. More information on the project can be found on page 7 of this notes packet.

### MCINTOSH NAMED CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Senior guard **Bryant McIntosh** is one of 30 national candidates for the Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. McIntosh is the lone Big Ten player named a candidate for the honor.

### **IVANAUSKAS, ASH TO MISS REMAINDER OF 2017-18 SEASON**

Northwestern redshirt first-year forward **Rapolas Ivanauskas** underwent shoulder surgery Dec. 8 and will miss the remainder of the 2017-18 season. He was limited to three appearances and 11 minutes of action this season. Ivanauskas also sat out the 2016-17 season due to shoulder surgery. Meanwhile, junior guard Jordan Ash has been shut down for the season due to a knee injury. He had appeared in each of the team's first 24 games, including making five starts, prior to having his season come to an end.

### **DONLON JOINS STAFF AS ASSISTANT COACH**

**Billy Donlon** is in his first season as an assistant coach on Northwestern's staff after spending the 2016-17 season as an assistant at Michigan. Donlon previous served as the head coach at Wright State. Like head coach **Chris Collins**, Donlon is a graduate of nearby Glenbrook North High School in Northbrook, Illinois, where both individuals were coached by current NU assistant **Brian James**. Donlon's father, Bill, was an assistant coach at Northwestern under head coach Bill Foster from 1986-93.

### **GUYTON NAMED DIRECTOR OF PLAYER DEVELOPMENT**

**A.J. Guyton** has joined NU as the program's director of player development. Guyton joins the Wildcats after spending last season as an assistant coach of the Windy City Bulls of the NBA G League. A 2000 graduate of Indiana University, Guyton earned Big Ten Player of the Year and consensus first-team All-America honors his senior year. A three-time team MVP, he earned second-team All-Big Ten recognition and was the Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1997 before earning first-team all-conference accolades in 1998 and 2000.

### NORTHWESTERN INKS STELLAR RECRUITING CLASS

Four individuals have signed National Letters of Intent to join the Northwestern men's basketball program for the 2018-19 season Sullivan-Ubben head men's basketball coach Chris Collins announced Wednesday, Nov. 8. Jordan Lathon (Grandview, Mo./Grandview), Miller Kopp (Houston, Texas/Houston Christian), Pete Nance (Akron, Ohio/Revere) and Ryan Young (Stewartsville, N.J./Bethlehem (Pa.) Catholic) comprise the highly regarded quartet that will matriculate to Evanston next year. The group is rated as the No. 21 recruiting class in the nation by 247Sports and No. 25 by Rivals.com.

### **SULLIVAN-UBBEN HEAD COACH CHRIS COLLINS**

### 88-76 CAREER RECORD (FIFTH SEASON)



Chris Collins is in his fifth season at Northwestern. He was named the University's 24th head men's basketball coach on March 27, 2013.

In Collins' first four years at the helm, he has led Northwestern to an increased win total each season.

Collins guided the Wildcats to heights never before reached during the 2016-17 season. The unforgettable campaign saw Northwestern accumulate a school-record 24 wins while earning the program's first NCAA tournament berth and victory in school history.

NU captured the nation's attention with its outstanding start to the season. An 18-4 start, including a six-game winning streak in Big Ten Conference play — the program's first since 1933 — saw the team crack the top 25 of the AP poll on Jan. 30, the team's first national ranking in

seven years. NU went on to record 10 wins in league play, its most since the 1932-33 campaign. Five of the victories came on the road, including a 66-59 triumph at No. 7/5 Wisconsin on Feb. 12.

The 'Cats picked up a pair of wins in the Big Ten tournament in Washington D.C., including defeating 25th-ranked Maryland in its own backyard, to give NU its first appearance in the conference tournament semifinal round in school history.

NU was rewarded with an NCAA tournament berth on Selection Sunday and the Wildcats earned a 68-66 victory over Vanderbilt in an opening-round contest in Salt Lake City. Northwestern pushed second-ranked and eventual national runner-up Gonzaga to the limits in the second round before eventually suffering a narrow loss.

The 'Cats placed two individuals on the All-Big Ten teams for the first time since 2012 as Bryant McIntosh was a unanimous second-team selection while Scottie Lindsey was recognized as a third-team pick of the league's coaches. In addition, Vic Law was named to the conference's five-member All-Defensive Team.

Collins' contributions to the program were rewarded by being named one of four national finalists for the Naismith Men's Coach of the Year award. Following the season, Collins agreed to a contract extension that runs through the 2024-25 campaign.

Collins came to Evanston after serving on the coaching staff at Duke since July 22, 2000. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach in the summer of 2008. During Collins' 13 seasons on the Blue Devils' staff, Duke posted an overall record of 385-77 while recording eight ACC tournament championships, four ACC regular season titles, eight in-season tournament titles and national championships in 2001 and 2010.

Collins worked primarily with backcourt players during his time at Duke and tutored All-Americans Jason Williams, Mike Dunleavy, Chris Duhon, J.J. Redick, Gerald Henderson, De-Marcus Nelson, Jon Scheyer, Nolan Smith and Austin Rivers, in addition to NBA draft picks Daniel Ewing, Kyrie Irving and Kyle Singler.

Before returning to his alma mater, Collins served as an assistant coach at Seton Hall for two years with Tommy Amaker. Prior to Seton Hall, Collins spent the 1997-98 season as an assistant with the WNBA's Detroit Shock.

As a player, Collins played professional basketball in Finland during the 1996-97 season, leading the league in scoring.

While attending Duke, Collins was a team captain as a senior and four-year letterman from 1993-96. He ranks 11th among Duke's all-time leaders in three-point field goals (209) and 10th in three-point field goal attempts (539). Collins averaged 9.1 points, 2.0 rebounds and 2.4 assists as a collegian. He earned second-team All-ACC honors as a senior.

Collins is the son of former NBA All-Star, Doug Collins, who is currently a senior advisor for the Chicago Bulls. A native of nearby Northbrook, Illinois, Collins is a 1996 graduate of Duke with a bachelor's degree in sociology.

Collins and his wife, Kim, have two children: Ryan and Kate.



### **WELSH-RYAN ARENA RENOVATION**

Immediately following the completion of the 2016-17 season, Welsh-Ryan Arena began to undergo a complete renovation that will close off the facility until the fall of 2018.

The project is estimated at a cost of \$110 million. A leadership gift from Patrick G. and Shirley W. Ryan, along with a \$10 million gift from Stephen R. and Susan K. Wilson, donations from other loyal Northwestern benefactors and the existing athletics maintenance and equipment budget, will fund the project.

The project, part of the 2010 master athletics facilities plan recommendation, will entail a complete renovation of Welsh-Ryan Arena and McGaw Memorial Hall, including:

- New seating throughout the arena, with chair-back seats replacing existing wood bleachers
- Wider, more accessible concourses with improved lighting
- Improved accessibility for the mobility-impaired, with five new elevators replacing the existing one
- New and expanded restrooms, as well as the addition of accessible family restrooms
- New concession areas with twice as many point-of-sale stations for increased efficiency, along with new food and drink offerings
- State-of-the-art lighting, audio and video capabilities in the arena
- Premium seating areas and expansion of the N-Club, which provides space for pre- and post-game events, by more than 400 percent
- Expansion of the building lobby by nearly 50 percent
- · A new ticket office
- New locker rooms for men's basketball, women's basketball and volleyball

Northwestern's men's basketball program has announced plans to play its home games at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois, during the 2017-18 campaign.

The renovation of Welsh-Ryan Arena also will include a state-of-

the-art practice facility for basketball, volleyball and other Wildcats programs, the University announced Feb. 7. The enhancement is possible thanks in large part to a gift of up to \$20 million from University trustee and alumnus Howard J. Trienens. In recognition of his continuing generosity, the facility will be named the Trienens Performance Center.

The Trienens Performance Center will feature a fieldhouse with three courts constructed inside the existing Trienens Hall, adjacent to Welsh-Ryan Arena. The facility will allow for construction of larger team locker rooms inside the Arena for men's basketball, women's basketball and volleyball. It also will include:

- Best-in-class athletic training and rehabilitation amenities
- Ultramodern strength and conditioning facilities
- Team meeting rooms with advanced teaching technologies
- Expanded performance nutrition hub
- Offices for men's and women's basketball
- Staff locker rooms

### Game 1 #19/20 NU 79, Loyola (Md.) 75 Nov. 10, 2017 • Rosemont, Ill.

Northwestern started its season off on a positive note with a 79-75 win over Loyola (Md.) in the season-opener for both teams at Allstate Arena. Scottie Lindsey finished with a game-high 26 points, while adding a career-high nine rebounds. Bryant McIntosh contributed 16 points, seven assists, four rebounds and a team-high three steals, including one with 16 seconds left to help seal the victory for the 'Cats. The Wildcats played lockdown defense in the first half, holding the Greyhounds to 24 points and just 8-of-30 shooting. Pardon and sophomore Barret Benson each added two blocks and four defensive rebounds in the period, while the 'Cats finished the half with seven total blocks as a team. Northwestern held Loyola without a field goal for almost eight minutes midway through the half, during which the #B1GCats went on a 16-0 run to take the lead. Pardon had six points during the run while Lindsey added 10 points, including back-to-back 3-pointers to give Northwestern a 20-8 lead. The Wildcats finished the half on an 11-3 run, capped off with an emphatic dunk by Lindsey to send Northwestern into the break with a 37-24 lead. Lindsey led all players with 14 points on 50.0-percent shooting in the half. McIntosh kickstarted the Northwestern offense to start the second half, hitting back-to-back jumpers to give him 10 points on the night. However, Loyola rallied back in the second half thanks to a much improved 55.0-percent field goal percentage, including shooting 7-of-8 from behind the arc. In the game's last five minutes, Lindsey finished with seven points, while McIntosh added four points along with a steal. McIntosh hit a pair of free throws in the game's final seconds to secure the victory.

## Game 2 #20/20 NU 75, Saint Peter's 66

Nov. 13, 2017 • Rosemont, Ill.

Five Northwestern players scored in double figures and the Wildcats finished with a 34-16 rebounding advantage en route to a 75-66 victory over Saint Peter's at Allstate Arena. Bryant McIntosh led the way with 17 points and matched his career high with seven rebounds. The Wildcats' starting frontcourt of Dererk Pardon and Gavin Skelly added 15 and 14 points, respectively. The Wildcats started out fast thanks to an early 8-0 run. Skelly energized the run with two highlight-reel dunks, including a thunderous alley-oop from Law followed by a put-back slam. Moments later, Lindsey drained a 3-pointer to extend the lead to 11-3 and force Saint Peter's to call a timeout. Skelly led all players at the half with eight points and four rebounds. McIntosh and Pardon each finished the period with seven points. The Wildcats went into halftime with a 32-25 lead thanks to an efficient offensive performance and disciplined defense in the first half. The #B1GCats started the second half red hot from behind the arc. Skelly, Lindsey and Law each hit a triple on NUs first three possessions of the period. A layup by Pardon followed by a McIntosh jumper helped improve the 'Cats' shooting numbers to 5-of-6 to start the half. The jumper opened the lead up to 15 and forced another Peacocks' timeout. Anthony Gaines turned in a strong stretch of play midway through the second half, scoring five consecutive points including his first-career 3-pointer to extend NU's lead to 18 points. Saint Peter's wouldn't go away as an 11-3 run brought them back within 10 points midway throught the second half, but Northwestern shut the door on any further comeback efforts. The Wildcats finished the night shooting 48.9 percent from the field and 23-of-24 from the free throw line.

### Game 3 Creighton 92, #20/20 NU 88 Nov. 15, 2017 • Rosemont, Ill.

Vic Law scored a career-high 30 points but No. 20 Northwestern was unable to complete a furious second-half comeback as the Wildcats fell to the Creighton, 92-88, at Allstate Arena as part of the Gavitt Tipoff Games. Bryant McIntosh added 24 points along with a team-high nine assists. Five consecutive baskets for Creighton helped the Bluejays pull ahead with a 22-13 lead, however Northwestern continued to fight offensively to keep the score close. Despite six consecutive field goals by the 'Cats midway through the half, a 10-0 run by Creighton opened up their lead to 15 late in the first half, but the #B1GCats would not go away. The Wildcats went on a 7-2 run to close the first half, holding Creighton without a field goal for the final 2:52 of the half to head into the locker room trailing, 51-43. A 7-0 run to begin to half cut the NU deficit to just one. Northwestern kept its foot on the gas pedal as Law converted on four-point play to give the 'Cats a 56-55 lead with 17:02 remaining. Following a Creighton basket on the ensuing possession, Law stayed hot as he drained a fadeaway three to put Northwestern back on top, 59-57. The Bluejays kept answering every NU charge, though. With the 'Cats trailing by seven with under four minutes left, Law scored four straight points to close the deficit to three. A basket by Martin Krampelj and a free throw by Ronnie Harrell Jr. made it a six-point game, but a triple by Scottie Lindsey cut the margin in half. A putback basket by Krampelj extended the guests' lead to five. After Gavin Skelly hit a 3-pointer to cut the Bluejays' lead to 90-88 with 18 seconds remaining, Khyri Thomas converted on two free throws to make the score 92-88 and seal the game for Creighton.

### Game 4 #20/20 NU 82, La Salle 74 Nov. 18, 2017 • Uncasville, Conn.

Bryant McIntosh and Scottie Lindsey combined for 41 points to lead Northwestern over La Salle, 82-74, in the 2017 Hall of Fame Tip-Off Tournament at Mohegan Sun Arena. McIntosh scored a team-high 21 points with a 5-of-6 mark behind arc, while Lindsey dropped 20 points to go along with six rebounds. Aaron Falzon made his season debut after missing the majority of the 2016-17 campaign due to injury, scoring 11 points on a trio of 3-pointers and pair of free throws. The contest was knotted at 13 just over eight minutes into the contest when NU took control. An 8-1 run put the 'Cats up by seven, 21-14, with 9:38 remaining before halftime. The advantage was 23-18 with eight minutes remaining, but the Wildcats closed the opening stanza on a 23-6 run to take a convincing 46-24 advantage into halftime. The Wildcats connected on six of their 10 3-point attempts over the opening half with McIntosh (11 first-half points) leading the way by knocking down each of his three triple tries. Northwestern shot a blistering 62.1 percent (18-29) from the field while holding the Explorers to 31.3 percent shooting (10-32) in the opening half. The lead grew to 26 before a 12-point La Salle run got the Explorers within 14 with 16 minutes remaining. Falzon ended the opposing surge by knocking down his second 3-pointer of the game. The Explorers, who connected on 10 of their first 12 field goal attempts to open the second stanza, crept to within eight, 59-51, but Lindsey's third trey pushed the lead back to double digits. B.J. Johnson, who hit each of his first six field goal attempts of the half, led La Salle's charge back as it got within seven, but a 3-pointer by McIntosh and a dunk by Pardon extended the lead back to 12. NU eventually pushed the advantage to 20 with 3:15 remaining before La Salle used a 12-point run to close the game.

### Game 5 Texas Tech 85, #20/20 NU 49 Nov. 19, 2017 • Uncasville, Conn.

Northwestern was unable to overcome a rough opening half as the Wildcats dropped the championship game of the Hall of Fame Tip-Off Tournament to Texas Tech, 85-49, at Mohegan Sun Arena. Scottie Lindsey led Northwestern with 20 points and was named to the all-tournament team. Turnovers were the story of the first half as miscues dug the Wildcats into an early deficit. The Red Raiders scored the first nine points of the contest before Lindsey got NU on the board with a 3-pointer. Texas Tech answered with a 14-2 run to push its advantage to 18, 23-5, just beyond the midway point of the opening stanza thanks in large part to nine turnovers by the Wildcats. The deficit was still 18 when Northwestern finally got things going offensively. Behind seven points by Aaron Falzon off the bench and five by Lindsey, Northwestern brought the crowd to life with a 12-4 surge that cut the deficit to 10, 29-19, with five minutes left in the half. Texas Tech responded with 10 straight points, however, to take its largest lead of the half. The lead was 19 following a last-second bucket by Keenan Evans, but Lindsey's heave from three-quarters court went in at the buzzer making it 41-25 at the intermission. Lindsey single-handedly kept NU in contention by scoring 17 of the team's 25 first-half points. Vic Law's 3-pointer right out of the gates to open the second half brought the Wildcats with 13 as Northwestern began to get better looks from the field. However, NU never was able to get hot from the field as it was unable to mount a serious charge to put pressure on the Red Raiders. Bryant McIntosh went 3-for-3 from the free throw line in the contest giving him 17 straight makes from the charity stripe to open the season.

### Game 6 NU 81, Sacred Heart 50 Nov. 24, 2017 • Rosemont, III.

Scottie Lindsey scored a game-high 19 points and Northwestern put forth a dominant defensive performance in earning an 81-50 win over Sacred Heart at Allstate Arena. Vic Law (15), Dererk Pardon (11) and Gavin Skelly (10) also scored in double figures for Northwestern. The Wildcats started the game on the right foot, tallying the first eight points of the contest in surging out to an early advantage. NU forced five turnovers in just over four minutes to begin the matchup as the lead grew to 13-3, forcing the Pioneers to burn an early timeout. Sacred Heart got things going on the offensive end, trimming Northwestern's lead to four by the second media timeout before a 3-pointer made it a one-point game. The Pioneers were within two, 21-19, when the 'Cats picked it up again on the offensive end. Aaron Falzon and Skelly each hit 3-pointers as part of a 10-2 run that pushed the lead back up to 10, 31-21, with five minutes left in the half. The Wildcats would eventually take a 43-31 lead into halftime. The 'Cats started the second half similar to how they started the first as the hosts scored 16 of the first 22 points in opening up a 59-37 lead. Sacred Heart scored four straight points to make it 59-41, but NU's defense held the visitors scoreless over the next eight minutes and 17 seconds in pulling away. In fact, Northwestern allowed only 10 points over the first 16 minutes of the second stanza while not allowing a field goal for nearly 10 minutes. The Wildcats held Sacred Heart to 33.3 percent shooting in the second half (6-18). Northwestern forced 23 turnovers in the contest, their most in a game in eight seasons.

### Game 7 Georgia Tech 52, NU 51 Nov. 28, 2017 • Atlanta, Ga.

Despite a furious second-half comeback, Northwestern was unable to overcome a rough shooting performance as the Wildcats fell to Georgia Tech, 52-51, on a buzzer-beater at McCamish Pavilion. Bryant McIntosh turned in an impressive performance, finishing with a game-high 18 points while adding six rebounds and five assists. Dererk Pardon registered his first double-double of the season as he finished with 10 points and 12 rebounds. Both teams had trouble getting the lid off the basket early, but eight straight points by the Wildcats midway through the first half, highlighted by two field goals from McIntosh and a three-point play by Skelly, helped wipe away a seven-point deficit and give the Wildcats a 10-9 lead early. The pace began to pick up as both teams traded buckets in the last 10 minutes of the half. A floater by McIntosh knotted the score at 22 with 2:34 remaining in the half, however a pair of 3-pointers from the Yellow Jackets' Curtis Haywood II sent Georgia Tech into halftime with a 28-22 lead. Law's jumper to open the second half brought the Wildcats within four, but Georgia Tech kept its foot on the gas pedal and extended the lead to as much as 10 with just under 14 minutes to play in the game. Georgia Tech's lead was 47-37 with eight minutes remaining, but the Wildcats came roaring back, going on an 12-0 run to take the lead with 2:22 remaining in the game. A putback by Pardon gave the Wildcats a 51-50 lead with seven seconds to play, however a Tadric Jackson layup at the buzzer gave the Yellow Jackets a 52-51 victory. Northwestern forced 15 Georgia Tech turnovers, one game after forcing 23 against Sacred Heart.

### Game 8 NU 72, Illinois 68 (OT) Dec. 1, 2017 • Rosemont, Ill.

Northwestern came up with a thrilling, 72-68, overtime victory over in-state rival Illinois in the Big Ten opener for both teams at Allstate Arena. Scottie Lindsey led the scoring efforts for the Wildcats, finishing with a game-high 22 points, while Vic Law chipped in 16 points and seven rebounds. NU trailed, 26-18, with 6:12 remaining in the first half but promptly cut the Illini lead to just one thanks to a 9-2 run. Moments later, after a pair of Illinois free throws, a triple by McIntosh tied the score at 30. However, Illinois entered halftime with a 36-32 lead. The #B1GCats came out blazing hot to start the second half with a 7-0 run to give them a three-point lead, their first lead in over 15 minutes of action. Pardon jumpstarted the run with a layup on the first possession of the half, then moments later Lindsey converted on his first three of the night to give Northwestern a 37-36 lead. Northwestern regained the lead with 3:34 remaining in the game when Lindsey skied over an Illinois defender for a two-handed slam to put the Wildcats on top, 60-59. After Illinois converted on a pair of free throws, Law drained a three on the ensuing possession to give NU a two-point lead. Tied 63-63 in the final minutes, both defenses ramped up their efforts, with no team scoring in the final 2:49 of regulation to send the game into overtime. With the score tied at 68 and just under a minute remaining in overtime, Lindsey converted on a pair of free throws to put the Wildcats on top. Holding a two-point lead, the #B1GCats came up with two defensive stops, highlighted by a block by Pardon with three seconds remaining before Isiah Brown hit two free throws, to seal the game.

Game 9 Purdue 74, NU 69

### Dec. 3, 2017 • West Lafayette, Ind.

A strong second-half effort from Dererk Pardon nearly gave Northwestern a win in its first Big Ten road trip of the season, but the Wildcats fell to Purdue, 74-69, at Mackey Arena in a back-and-forth game that featured 13 lead changes. Pardon led Northwestern with a team-high 20 points, 14 of which came in the second half, along with eight rebounds and four assists. Vic Law added 12 points and 10 rebounds to give him his first double-double this season. Northwestern got off to a quick start offensively, converting on three of its first five shots of the game to jump out to a 6-2 lead. Hot shooting by Purdue gave the Boilermakers a double-digit lead midway through the first half. However, the Wildcats clawed their way back into the game as they went on a 14-1 run to take a 27-25 lead. Following the run, Purdue responded with a triple and a pair of free throws to take back the lead, but back-to-back baskets by Gavin Skelly helped tie the score, 33-33, heading into halftime. Purdue got off to a hot start to open the second half, but Northwestern was able to keep the lead close thanks to some stellar play from Pardon, who scored the first eight points of the half for the Wildcats. Pardon continued his second-half takeover as he scored six consecutive points to bring his total to 20 on the night and give the Wildcats a 62-61 lead with 3:32 remaining. Law converted on his third triple of the half and Lindsey hit back-to-back jumpers in the final minutes with the second giving NU a 69-67 advantage with 1:34 remaining. However, despite getting some good looks on the final two possessions of the game, Northwestern could not keep up with Purdue down the stretch as the Boilermakers scored the final seven points of the contest.

### Game 10 NU 96, Chicago State 31 Dec. 11, 2017 • Rosemont, III.

Northwestern cruised to its largest margin of victory in program history with a 96-31 win over Chicago State at Allstate Arena. The Wildcats were firing on all cylinders both offensively and defensively as they finished with a team-high in points on the season, while holding the Cougars the fewest points scored in a game by an NU opponent since Nov. 22, 2012 (TCU, 31). The 65-point winning margin for the #B1GCats broke a 73-year record. Five Wildcats finished the game scoring in double figures, led by 18 points from Vic Law. The Wildcats jumped out to an early start, scoring the first 15 points of the game, holding Chicago State scoreless for the first 4:40 of the contest. Later on in the half, they held the Cougars scoreless for 6:40 as the 'Cats mounted a 22-0 run to extend their lead to 44-5. Northwestern held Chicago State without a field goal for the final 12:08 of the half and went into the locker room with 55-8 lead. All-in-all, the Wildcats' first half was one of the best performances turned in by any team in the country this season. The eight points scored by Chicago State is tied for fewest points scored by any Division I team in a half this season and is a low by a Northwestern foe in the shot clock era. The 55 points scored by NU marked the most points the Wildcats have scored in a half since they scored the same amount against Sacred Heart in 2015. Northwestern shot a blistering 55.2 percent (16-29) from the field in the first half while holding Chicago State to 10.5 percent shooting (2-19) in the opening half. The Wildcats held the Cougars without a 3-pointer in the half, while converting on 9-of-16 of their own looks from behind the arc. Northwestern did not let up as it outscored the Cougars, 41-23, in the second half. NU forced 25 turnovers, the most by an NU opponent in a game in 10 years.

### Game 11 NU 84, Valparaiso 50 Dec. 14, 2017 • Rosemont, Ill.

Vic Law posted 18 points with five 3-pointers as a big first-half run propelled Northwestern to a convincing 84-50 win over Valparaiso at Allstate Arena. Gavin Skelly posted the second double-double of his career as he finished with 12 points along with a game-high 10 rebounds. Coming off a dominant offensive performance earlier in the week, Northwestern carried over that strong play as the team shot a scorching 54.5-percent from three point territory on 12-of-22 shooting. On the defensive end, the Wildcats stifled the Valparaiso all night as the Crusaders turned the ball over 21 times and shot just 38.5-percent (15-of-39) from the field. The Wildcats hit their first six 3-pointers of the game and Law hit his first four threes while scoring 15 of the Wildcats' first 24 points to help the 'Cats jump out to an early lead. Law's four-point play came in the middle of a 14-0 scoring run that Northwestern mounted midway through the first half. The run helped the 'Cats extend their lead to 27-10, during which Northwestern's defense held the Crusaders scoreless for over four minutes and without a field goal for over eight minutes during the stretch. NU eventually took a 43-26 lead to the break. The Wildcats opened up their lead even further to start the second half. The #B1GCats' defense continued to lock down the Crusaders, holding them without a field goal for the first 6:53 of the half. An 11-0 run by the Wildcats during that stretch gave NU a 34-point lead with just over 13 minutes to play. Northwestern did not let up as it outscored the Crusaders, 41-24, in the second half. Lindsey led the Wildcats with eight points in the second half, while first-year Anthony Gaines added six points. NU finished the contest with a 30-4 advantage in points off turnovers.

### Game 12 NU 62, DePaul 60 Dec. 16, 2017 • Chicago, III.

Scottie Lindsey connected on a career-high seven three pointers and scored a team-high 25 points to lead Northwestern to a 62-60 victory over DePaul at Wintrust Arena. Both teams got off to quick starts offensively, with each side knocking down five of its first eight shots from the field. Lindsey paced the Northwestern offense early on, scoring eight of the first 16 points for the 'Cats. An 8-0 run by DePaul helped the Blue Demons pull ahead, opening their lead up to as many as nine points midway through the first half. However, despite some hot shooting by DePaul, the Wildcats battled back to cut into the lead late in the half. Back-to-back triples from Law narrowed the NU deficit to just three, but DePaul entered halftime with a 33-28 lead. DePaul took a 43-37 lead with 14 minutes remaining in the game, but the #B1GCats battled back with an 8-0 run to regain the lead, Jordan Ash hit a triple to start the run, and Isiah Brown converted on a three in transition to put the Wildcats on top, 44-43. Northwestern also ramped up its defensive efforts as points came at a premium for De-Paul midway through the half. The Wildcats held the Blue Demons scoreless for 5:40, which allowed NU to take a 51-47 lead with 7:41 remaining. DePaul cut back into Northwestern's lead, cutting the game to one possession on multiple occasions. However, Lindsey shut the door with two clutch baskets in the game's final minutes, including a deep three pointer--his seventh of the game--to give the Wildcats a 62-57 lead with 55 seconds remaining. Holding a 62-60 lead with five seconds left in the game, the #B1GCats' defense came up with a stop to seal the game and hold on for the win.

### Game 13 NU 85, Lewis 48 Dec. 19, 2017 • Rosemont, III.

Bryant McIntosh finished with a career-high six 3-pointers in scoring 24 points to go with a gamehigh seven assists as Northwestern cruised to an 85-48 win over Lewis at Allstate Arena. Gavin Skelly contributed 15 points while shooting a perfect five-of-five from the field. On defense, the Wildcats stifled the Flyers all night as they held Lewis to 31.3 percent shooting (15-of-48). After a slow start in the game's opening minutes, the Wildcats mounted a 9-0 run to take the lead—which they did not relinquish for the rest of the game. Northwestern continued to ramp up its defensive efforts as it held the Flyers without a field goal for over six minutes late in the first half as it continued to build upon its lead. With 1:13 remaining, McIntosh knocked down a triple, his fourth of the half, to put the Wildcats up by 32, their largest lead of the first 20 minutes. The Wildcats eventually took a 49-22 lead into halftime. McIntosh led all players with 16 points and five assists. Scottie Lindsey chipped in with nine points and three rebounds, while Dererk Pardon and Skelly each added eight points. The 'Cats also forced 11 turnovers in the first half and made the most out of those opportunities as they finished the half with 26 points off turnovers. On the other end, the Wildcats moved the ball around as they assisted on 12 of their 16 field goals in the half. Northwestern kept its foot on the gas pedal as it outscored Lewis, 36-26, in the second half. McIntosh finished with eight points in the half, while Skelly chipped in with seven of his own. The Wildcats came into the game forcing an average of 17.9 turnovers per game over the previous seven contests and forced 17 by Lewis. NU finished the game with a 34-5 advantage in points off turnovers. Northwestern assisted on 21 of its 27 field goals with Isiah Brown dishing out a career-high six helpers to go along with the seven by McIntosh.

### Game 14 #17/17 Oklahoma 104, NU 78 Dec. 22, 2017 • Norman, Okla.

Dererk Pardon scored a team-high 17 points with nine rebounds but Northwestern was unable to withstand a first-half scoring barrage by No. 17/17 Oklahoma, falling 104-78 at Lloyd Noble Center.The contest got off to a less-than-ideal start for the Wildcats as seven straight points by the hosts over the opening 72 seconds of play caused NU to burn an early timeout. However, a pair of 3-pointers by Jordan Ash and a dunk by Pardon allowed Northwestern to close to within 10-8. The Sooners could not be slowed down from behind the arch, though, as the hosts made each of their first six triples and started 9-of-10 from the field overall. OU's Trae Young, the nation's leading scorer, sparked the host by tallying 12 quick points, including hitting three consecutive 3-pointers, during the outburst. Pardon kept NU within striking distance with 8 points. Oklahoma simply could not be slowed down as the nation's leading scoring team connected on an incredible 14 3-pointers in the opening 20 minutes of play in opening up an insurmountable lead. Pardon paced the Wildcats with 10 first-half points. Northwestern was able to slow down the Sooners' attack in the second half as it out-scored the hosts, 40-36, but the large halftime deficit was to large to make a run. Five Wildcats finished in double figures, including Ash, who scored a career-high 11 points. Pardon's nine rebounds were a game high as he finished one board shy of a double-double. Aaron Falzon chipped in with 12 points for Northwestern, including knocking down four 3-pointers. Young paced Oklahoma with 31 points and 12 assists, adding to his nation's-leading totals in both categories, while Christian James added 19 points.

### **Game 15** NU 95, Brown 73 Dec. 30, 2017 • Rosemont, Ill.

Dererk Pardon led five Northwestern players in double figures with 18 points as the Wildcats used a strong second-half performance to pull away from Brown for a 95-73 win at Allstate Arena. Trailing by seven early in the second half, NU outscored the Bears 47-18 over the final 15:30 of the game to earn the victory. A three-point play by Anthony Gaines at the 12:46 mark gave NU a 15-10 advantage, the first lead of more than three points for either team through the first seven minutes of the contest. The advantage was four before Aaron Falzon drilled a triple from the top of the key and Gaines followed with a steal and a slam, giving Northwestern its largest lead of the half, 37-28, with just over four minutes remaining before halftime. Brown eventually would close back to within 42-37 at the intermission despite the Wildcats shooting 51.6 percent from the field (16-31). An early second-half surge allowed the Bears to get the lead back as they went up 49-46 just under three minutes into the period. The guests' advantage grew to seven but a dunk by Scottie Lindsey, a corner trey by Jordan Ash and a triple by Gavin Skelly sparked a quick eight-point run that gave NU the lead back, 56-55, with 13:49 left. Overall, a 20-3 run over a span of six and a half minutes pushed Northwestern's lead to 68-58 with nine minutes remaining. A three-point play by Lindsey with 7:54 left gave him 1,000 points for his career, making him the 35th player in school history to reach the milestone. Dererk Pardon registered a double-double, highlighted by a season-high 15 rebounds, but Northwestern was unable to overcome a tough shooting day, falling to Nebraska, 70-55, at Allstate Arena. Pardon turned in a solid all-around performance, finishing the game with 17 points, 11 offensive rebounds, three assists and three blocks. Aaron Falzon came off the bench to help provide a spark for the Wildcats' offense early in the game, jumpstarting a 11-0 run with a three-pointer followed by a layup. A jumper by Jordan Ash at the 9:33 mark extended Northwestern's lead to 16-10, its largest lead of the half. The #B1GCats' defense made life difficult for Nebraska throughout the first half, holding them to 29.6 percent shooting and forcing seven turnovers. The Wildcats also held the Cornhuskers scoreless for nearly five minutes during the Northwestern run midway through the first half. A 10-2 run by Northwestern to close the half, which included back-to-back threes by Falzon and Lindsey on NU's final two possessions, sent the Wildcats into intermission with a 30-25 lead. Pardon's layup to open the second half gave the Wildcats a seven-point lead, but Northwestern had a difficult time getting shots to fall to start the second half and, as a result, Nebraska was able to take back the lead. The Cornhuskers ramped up their shooting efforts, finishing the half shooting 59.3 percent (16-of-27) from the field, helping to extend their lead to double figures. Northwestern was unable to recover, ultimately falling 70-55. The Wildcats were held to 29.2 percent shooting in the contest despite posting a season-high 22 offensive rebounds.

# Game 17 Penn State 78, NU 63 Jan. 5, 2018 • University Park, Pa.

Bryant McIntosh scored a team-high 18 points, but Northwestern was unable to overcome a strong shooting performance by Penn State, falling, 78-63, at the Bryce Jordan Center. Lamar Stevens led the Nittany Lions with 30 points. As a team, Penn State shot 54.5-percent (30-of-55) on the night. The Nittany Lions got off to a hot start offensively, knocking down nine of their first 11 shots to start the game and jump out to a 22-11 lead. Penn State extended its lead to 31-15 with 7:44 remaining in the first half, however the Wildcats went on a 7-0 scoring run to cut their deficit to single digits. NU ramped up its offensive efforts in the final 10 minutes of the half, converting on 9-of-16 shots to close out the opening stanza. The #B1GCats continued to cut away at the lead as they went on a 6-0 in the final two minutes of the half, finishing with McIntosh banking in a triple at the buzzer to send the Wildcats into the break trailing, 41-34. Trailing 45-36 early in the second half, Northwestern went on a 8-2 run to cut its deficit to just three with over 15 minutes remaining in the game. Dererk Pardon jump started the run with a two-handed dunk, and then back-to-back three pointers by McIntosh and Jordan Ash helped cut into the lead even further. Penn State countered the Wildcats' run with a 9-0 streak of their own to extend the lead back to 56-44. However, the Wildcats answered it with back-to-back 3-pointers from Ash and Law to trim the deficit to six. But that would be as close as the Wildcats could get for the rest of the game as Penn State continued its hot shooting en route to a 78-63 victory.

With the game tied at 5-5 early, Gavin Skelly came off the bench and provided a spark for the Wildcats as he knocked down a triple and then a jumper soon after to give NU a 10-9 lead. A 16-2 run by the 'Cats extended the lead to 29-14 midway through the first half. Jordan Ash began the run with a 3-pointer before two dunks by Pardon and a layup from McIntosh helped swing the momentum in the #B1GCats' favor. Three-pointers by Lindsey and Vic Law helped Northwestern open up its lead even further. Later in the run, the Wildcats scored 12-unanswered points to build their lead to as many as 24 with 1:16 remaining in the half. Northwestern also ramped up its defensive efforts, holding Minnesota without a field goal for 4:41 midway through the half and then scoreless for a 5:21 stretch later on in the period. Northwestern entered the break holding a 43-21 lead. Lindsey led all scorers with 10 points, while Pardon chipped in with eight points and eight rebounds. Following a Minnesota three to start the second half, the Wildcats showed no signs of slowing down to open up the game as they went on a 9-0 run to extend their lead to 52-24 with 17:10 left in the contest. ### **Game 19** Indiana 66, NU 46 Jan. 14, 2018 • Bloomington, Ind.

Northwestern was unable to overcome a slow start offensively as Indiana defeated the Wildcats, 66-46, at Assembly Hall. Vic Law finished tied for a team-high nine points to go along with seven rebounds and three assists for the Wildcats. Aaron Falzon contributed with eight points and five rebounds, while Dererk Pardon also finished with eight points and a game-high eight rebounds. Northwestern's defense set the tone early, holding the Hoosiers scoreless for almost four minutes to start the game. A run by Indiana gave the Hoosiers a double-digit lead midway through the first half, however an 8-0 counter by the 'Cats helped cut their deficit to two, 13-11, with 7:18 to go in the half. Bryant McIntosh began the run with a triple, his first of the day, and then Law followed it up with a layup and a three-pointer on back-to-back possessions. The pace began to pick up as both teams traded buckets in the final 10 minutes of the half. A three-pointer by Robert Johnson gave Indiana a 24-15 lead, but a dunk by Pardon and a pair of free throws from Falzon sent Northwestern into halftime trailing, 24-19. Pardon led the Wildcats at the half with six points and four rebounds, while Falzon and Law each had five points. Northwestern hung in the game to start the second half, with a three-pointer by Falzon and a dunk by Lindsey each cutting the lead to four on separate occasions early on. However, the Wildcats didn't have an answer for the Hoosiers' hot shooting as IU opened up its lead back up to double digits. Indiana shot an impressive 14-of-23 from the field as a team over the final 20 minutes of play. Isiah Brown provided NU with a spark off the bench, finishing tied for a team-high nine points, all of which came in the second half. Northwestern converted on all nine of its free throw attempts in the contest.

### Game 20 #22/22 Ohio State 71, NU 65 Jan. 17, 2018 • Rosemont, III.

Northwestern was unable to overcome a strong offensive performance by Ohio State, falling, 71-65, at Allstate Arena. With 7:23 remaining in the game, the Wildcats trailed 62-49 before mounting a 16-6 run in the game's final minutes to give the conference leaders all they could handle. Five Wildcat players finished in double figures, with Vic Law leading the way with 14 points. Micah Potter paced the Buckeyes with 13 points. As a team, Ohio State shot 47.3-percent (26-of-55) on the night. Back-to-back buckets by Gavin Skelly helped the Wildcats take a 12-6 lead with 14:14 remaining in the first half, but Ohio State pushed its way out front to close out the half and entered the locker room with a 33-25 lead. As a team, Northwestern converted on 10-of-27 field goals in the first half, while the Buckeyes shot 12-of-29 from the field. After a slow first half offensively for Dererk Pardon, the junior center picked it up in the second half with two electrifying dunks in the first opening five minutes of the half. However, the Buckeyes caught fire midway through the second half, converting on five straight field goals to open their lead up to 51-36 with 13:00 left in the game. A jumper by Skelly, followed by a McIntosh three-pointer on the ensuing possession, cut the Wildcats' deficit to single digits with 6:37 remaining in the game. Northwestern continued to put pressure on Ohio State, cutting the Buckeyes' lead to as little as three points in the final minute of the game thanks to back-to-back triples from Law and Lindsey, but Ohio State was able to clinch the victory at the free throw line.

### Game 21 NU 70, Penn State 61 Jan. 20, 2018 • Rosemont, Ill.

A 15-2 run by Northwestern to close the game helped fuel a thrilling 70-61 victory over Penn State at Allstate Arena. The #B1GCats held the Nittany Lions without a field goal during the final 10:37 of the game. The 'Cats defense also forced 14 turnovers during the contest, which they turned into 14 points off turnovers on the other end. Vic Law led NU with 18 points. The Nittany Lions jumped out to an early lead, converting on six of their first eight shots from the field to give them a 15-6 advantage. Northwestern's defense ramped up its efforts midway through the half and held the Nittany Lions scoreless for over four minutes in the first half. A three-pointer by Law with 5:10 left in the first half put the Wildcats on top, 24-23, their first lead of the game. Both teams then proceeded to catch fire from the field as the lead changed eight times during the final five minutes of the half. A jumper by Shep Garner sent Penn State into halftime with a 35-33 lead. Garner led all players with 17 points at the half. With the Wildcats trailing by six with 13 minutes to go in the game, Jordan Ash provided some valuable minutes off the bench, sinking a three-pointer and then converting on a put-back layup minutes later to cut the deficit to 53-51. Three consecutive baskets by Pardon, including backto-back two-handed dunks underneath the hoop, gave the Wildcats a 61-59 lead with 4:56 to go in the game. The Wildcats weren't finished yet as a three-pointer by Law, followed by a McIntosh jumper on the ensuing possession, extended their lead to seven points with 3:26 remaining in the game. The stretch capped off an 11-0 run for the #B1GCats, during which they held Penn State scoreless for 5:11. Down the stretch, the Wildcats went 4-for-4 from the free throw line to put the game on ice.

Backed by a solid second-half effort and Vic Law's double-double, Northwestern picked up a 77-69 win at Minnesota to complete a season sweep over the Golden Gophers. Law totaled 18 points on the night and a career-high 13 rebounds, while matching his career best in assists with five dimes. Joining Law with a team-high 18 points was Bryant McIntosh. An 11-2 run early in the opening stanza helped the Wildcats jump out to a 13-7 lead. But Minnesota got off to a hot start offensively, knocking down 53.0-percent of their shots in the first half, including 6-of-10, three-pointers to jump ahead of the Wildcats. The #B1GCats continued to cut away at the lead as they held the Golden Gophers without a field goal for the final 2:45 of the first half. A dunk by Law and a jumper by McIntosh sent Northwestern into the break trailing, 40-34. The 'Cats clawed their way back in the second half, converting on 7-of-12 shots in the half's first 10 minutes. With 10:57 remaining, Law converted on a triple to give NU a 56-54 lead, its first lead of the half. Three consecutive baskets by Pardon, including back-to-back two-handed dunks underneath the hoop, gave the Wildcats a 61-59 lead. Following a three from Law, the lead proceeded to go back-and-forth midway through the second half as Pardon converted on a jumper to put NU up, 58-56. Then, with 7:37 remaining, McIntosh knocked down a jumper to give the Wildcats a 60-58 lead. Following the jumper from McIntosh, Northwestern never relinquished the lead. The Wildcats' defense held Minnesota to just five field goals in the final 10 minutes of the half, while NU converted on 7-of-8 field goals during the final 1:15 to ice the game.

Playing in its second of three straight games on the road, Northwestern fell to No. 24/25 Michigan, 58-47, at Crisler Center. A fast start gave the Wildcats an early lead, however despite a strong defensive performance throughout the game, the 'Cats were unable to overcome a slew of turnovers and a poor shooting performance from the field. Scottie Lindsey led all players with 15 points. Northwestern wasted no time getting going as it jumped out to a 14-5 lead in the game's first seven minutes. Northwestern earned a statement win over No. 20 Michigan, 61-52, at Allstate Arena behind a backcourt explosion from Bryant McIntosh and Scottie Lindsey. The two senior guards combined for 43 of the team's 61 points, with McIntosh dropping a season-high 24. Lindsey added 19 points and seven rebounds and sank four 3-pointers. The defense spurred the Wildcats forward in the second half, and held the Wolverines without a field goal from 12:15 to 2:46. The 52-point output on the game was tied for the lowest of the season for Michigan. Michigan came out of the gate strong and jumped out to a 10-1 lead. Northwestern's momentum came to a halt against Maryland in a 73-57 defeat at the Xfinity Center. Scottie Lindsey followed up his 19-point outburst against No. 20 Michigan by answering the call again to the tune of a team-high 20 points. Lindsey sank four threes in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. Dererk Pardon added 12 points and eight rebounds. Kevin Huerter led a balanced effort for the Terps with 22 points. Maryland came out of the gate strong at the Xfinity Center, but Northwestern kept pace thanks to threes from Vic Law and Gavin Skelly. Huerter started the game hot, sinking his first four attempts from the field as the Terrapins opened up a 19-8 lead. The Terps had it going from beyond the arc early, knocking down seven of their first ten triples to push the lead to 32-16. The 'Cats pushed back with a 6-0 run from Lindsey to force Mark Turgeon into a timeout. As they did against the Wolverines on Tuesday, the Wildcats kept battling to claw back into the game, this time with a 13-2 run to cut the deficit to 36-29 at the break. Lindsey erupted for 15 points in the first half, including a monster putback slam and a tough fadeaway three late in the shot clock to keep the 'Cats within striking distance. Maryland responded with a 7-0 run of its own to start the second half to make it 43-29. Aaron Falzon threw a counterpunch for Northwestern with two makes from downtown to bring it to 47-39. The 'Cats continued to lurk at an arm's length. Bryant McIntosh threw an alley-oop from 30 feet away for Law to slam home, and the hosts' lead shrunk to eight. The Terrapins finally pulled away down the stretch with 11-1 run that proved to seal the win.

### Game 27 Rutgers 67, NU 58 (OT) Feb. 13, 2018 • Piscataway, N.J.

Northwestern led for nearly the entire game at Rutgers, but the Scarlet Knights hit a late game-tying three-pointer to send the contest into overtime where the Wildcats fell, 67-58. Senior Scottie Lindsey dropped a team-high 19 points for his third straight game with 19-or-more. Junior Dererk Pardon recorded his fourth double-double of the season with 12 points on 6-of-7 shooting and 13 rebounds. Pardon had six of the game's first 10 points and almost ended the first half with a double-double, tallying 10 points and eight rebounds. Aaron Falzon had one of his best halves on the season, posting eight points without a missed field goal. His eight points all came in a 14-4 run in the first half that pushed the Wildcats to a 28-16 lead with just over six minutes in the period. Vic Law nailed a triple with under two minutes to go before Pardon dream-shaked his defender out of the way and hit a lay-up to give the 'Cats an 11-point lead at 33-22. Rutgers started the second frame with a 6-0 run, but Lindsey took over the ballgame after another Pardon bucket, scoring the next nine Northwestern points, all from behind the arc, with the third triple make extending the lead to 44-33. Despite two more layups from Lindsey, Corey Sanders willed his team back within one at 51-50. First-year Anthony Gaines sank a crucial three to extend the lead to 56-50 with under a minute to play but Rutgers sprung back to life once more with six more points from Sanders in the last minute including a game-tying three with six seconds to go. Skelly scored the first two points in overtime, but that would be all the Wildcats mustered. Rutgers closed out the game with the last 11 points and walked away with the win.

### Game 28 #2/1 Michigan State 65, NU 60 Feb. 17, 2018 • Rosemont, III.

Northwestern rocketed out from the opening whistle against No. 2 Michigan State at Allstate Arena, building a massive first-half lead before the Spartans roared back themselves in the second half to just edge the Wildcats, 65-60. Vic Law finished with a game-high 21 points for NU. The 'Cats got off to a quick start as a jumper from Law made it 17-6 at the 11:50 mark, increasing his total to 10 points in the first eight minutes of action. A 3-pointer in transition made it 20-6 shortly after, and the Spartans were forced to call a timeout. The pause had little effect on the flow of the game, as a 10-2 run by the hosts increased the lead to 22 points. Anthony Gaines hit back-to-back layups before Law and Gavin Skelly each added a triple in the stretch. NU led 49-27 at the intermission on the back of 8-of-13 shooting from behind the arc. The Wildcats shot 60 percent from the floor in the first 20 minutes and recorded assists on 12 of their 18 made field goals. Michigan State came out firing on all cylinders in the second half, ripping off a 19-4 run to cut the lead to seven points with ten minutes remaining. After a Northwestern timeout, the Spartans scored another seven straight to tie the contest at 53 apiece. A layup-and-1 from Jaren Jackson Jr. put MSU ahead for the first time with 5:26 remaining. A dunk from Pardon a minute later gave the 'Cats just their second field goal of the half, as the game was a two-point affair with three minutes to play. After multiple misses on either end, Miles Bridges went to the line with 42 seconds on the clock. The Spartan knocked down both to stretch his team's lead to four points. MSU's lead was six before Law hit a triple with 11.7 seconds to go, but Bridges hit a pair from the charity stripe to seal it for the Spartans.

### Game 29 Maryland 71, NU 64 Feb. 19, 2018 • Rosemont, III.

Maryland used a second-half rally to defeat Northwestern 71-64 at Allstate Arena. Scottie Lindsey led the Wildcats in scoring with 15 points. Northwestern started the game on fire from deep, with 3-pointers from Vic Law, Lindsey and Aaron Falzon to open up a 9-2 lead. The Terrapins climbed back and took a lead behind a few inside looks from Michal Cekovsky. Northwestern hung within four thanks to Lindsey's second three of the night and a bucket out of the post from Gaines. Law splashed in his second make from downtown to bring the 'Cats within one at 21-20. Gavin Skelly followed that up with a corner three off of a crosscourt find from Brown to tie the ballgame at 23-23. Brown hit a jumper of his own and then dished the rock once more to Gaines, who nailed his first three to give the 'Cats the lead back. Northwestern closed the half on a 10-2 run as it took a 37-30 lead into halftime. The Wildcats and the Terrapins traded buckets to start the second period as the visitors remained an arm's length away. Dererk Pardon scored six points in the first five minutes and Law canned his third deep ball to make it 47-38. Maryland cut it to within three at 52-49, despite Pardon reaching double figures on the night for the 18th time the season and Lindsey knocking down his third shot from behind the arc. The Terps surged ahead with a 15-2 run and grabbed a late 65-56 lead. Pardon started chipping away with a bruising and-one with under four minutes to play. Brown scored on a floater to make it 65-60 with under two minutes to go, but the Terrapins were able to seal the game from the charity stripe.

### Game 30 Wisconsin 70, NU 64 Feb. 22, 2018 • Rosemont, III.

Northwestern celebrated seniors Scottie Lindsey, Bryant McIntosh and Gavin Skelly at Allstate Arena, but fell in a close battle against Wisconsin, 70-64. Lindsey and McIntosh each shined on Senior Night, finishing as Northwestern's top scorers on the night. Lindsey tied his season high with 26 points and McIntosh added 18. Lindsey made four of his first five shots and scored 15 of the team's 32 points in the first half. Together, the senior backcourt combined for 44 of the team's 64 points in the contest. Wisconsin used red-hot shooting from beyond the arch early on in jumping out to an 18-7 advantage. Trailing 30-21 with seven minutes remaining in the half, NU went on a 9-1 run to close to within one. Northwestern eventually trailed 38-32 at the half, but opened the second half strong in taking a 43-42 lead. Wisconsin went back out in front by seven before the two teams battled back-and-forth throughout the final minutes with NU repeatedly pulling to within a single possession. With less than 30 second left, however, Brevin Pritzl beat the shot clock buzzer by hitting a three-pointer that increased the visitors' lead to four. Wisconsin connected on two free throws to seal the road win. The Badgers shot 53.3 percent from the field, including connecting on nine of 20 attempts from beyond the arch. Northwestern shot a respectable 48.9 percent but committed 13 turnover which Wisconsin converted into 19 points. Ethan Happ paced UW with 19 points and 7  $\,$ rebounds while Khalil Iverson added 16 points and Andy Van Vliet chipped in with 14.

Scottie Lindsey dropped a career-high 32 points to lead Northwestern's comeback effort that came up just short as the Wildcats fell, 77-70, to lowa in the regular-season finale. Lindsey hit nine 3-pointers, matching a Northwestern record and the most ever by a Wildcat player in a Big Ten game. Sophomore Barret Benson finished with eight points, a tie for his career-high, on a perfect 4-of-4 line from the field, while grabbing 10 rebounds. Despite starting brightly with a Pardon dunk and a jumper from Bryant McIntosh, who started the game but only played seven minutes, Northwestern could not keep pace with the Hawkeyes' potent offense. Lindsey cut the early lead to 12-9 with his first three, but his next two triples would be the only source of offense as the hosts put a 30-15 stronghold on the game. Benson was active in the paint in the rest of the first half with a tip-in and two lay-ups, but lowa headed to the break up, 45-28. Lindsey picked up in the second frame where he left off and drained two triples early to cut the lead to 50-34. lowa kept its foot on the gas pedal until Northwestern came back to life late in the ballgame. Isiah Brown drained a 3-pointer to kickoff a 7-0 run that brought the 'Cats within 12. Northwestern hit the Hawkeyes with a barrage of deep balls, including Lindsey's sixth and seventh 3-pointers to force a timeout from lowa head coach Fran McCaffery at 73-65. Iowa avoided a collapse in the closing moments and held on for the win. Lindsey ended his night with an exclamation point, knocking down his ninth three with five seconds to go to make it 77-70. His outburst helped Northwestern connect on a season-high 13 triples in the contest.


