### RUTGERS QUICK KICKS

- No. 3 seed Rutgers women's soccer meets top-seeded Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament Championship Match Sunday at 2 p.m. in University Park, Pa. The No. 7-ranked Scarlet Knights are the first Rutgers program to advance to a Big Ten title game.
- The match will be televised live nationally on BTN and stream live on BTN Plus. RU is 2-1 in nationally televised contests this season.
- Rutgers rides a 10-match unbeaten streak into the championship match (8-0-2), a single season program record. The unbeaten streak ties a 10-match unbeaten run between the 2005 and 2006 seasons, as RU closed 2005 6-0-1 and started 2006 3-0.
- At 16 wins, the Scarlet Knights tied the 2006 team for the most wins in a season (16-3-4).
- The Scarlet Knights were ranked by the NSCAA (No. 7), Soccer America (No. 9), and TopDrawerSoccer.com (No. 11) after the 10th weekend of the season. The coaches poll ranking ties for the highest in program history.
- In the seventh RPI of the season, Rutgers was tabbed No. 3 in the nation, second among Big Ten schools. No. 2 Penn State led all BIG programs in the RPI.
- RU's defensive numbers remain among the best nationally. Entering the BIG Semis, the Scarlet Knights were

- first in goals-against average (0.31), second in shutout percentage (.737) and third in save percentage (.912).
- Rutgers started the year with eight consecutive clean sheets for the first time in program history, posting a program record scoreless streak of 760:16 minutes.
- Sophomore forward Colby Ciarrocca has scored in five of six matches for Rutgers and leads the team in goals (eight). Her four game-winners also lead the team.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Casey Murphy has 25 shutouts for her career, third on the program's all-time list.
- With 15 shutouts this season, Murphy surpassed Erin Guthrie (2006) for the most in a single season by an RU goalkeeper.
- Senior midfielder Hayley Katkowski has started 84 consecutive matches and is tied for third on Rutgers' all-time list for starts in a career.
- Senior center back Erica Skroski (Galloway, N.J.) has logged the full time in 18 of 20 matches. She scored the game-winner vs. Minnesota in the Big Ten quarterfinals and made an open-net save before the half to preserve the RU lead.
- Junior forward Madison Tiernan, RU's active scoring leader with 13-career goals, notched her first scoring strike of the season in the 57th minute at Iowa.

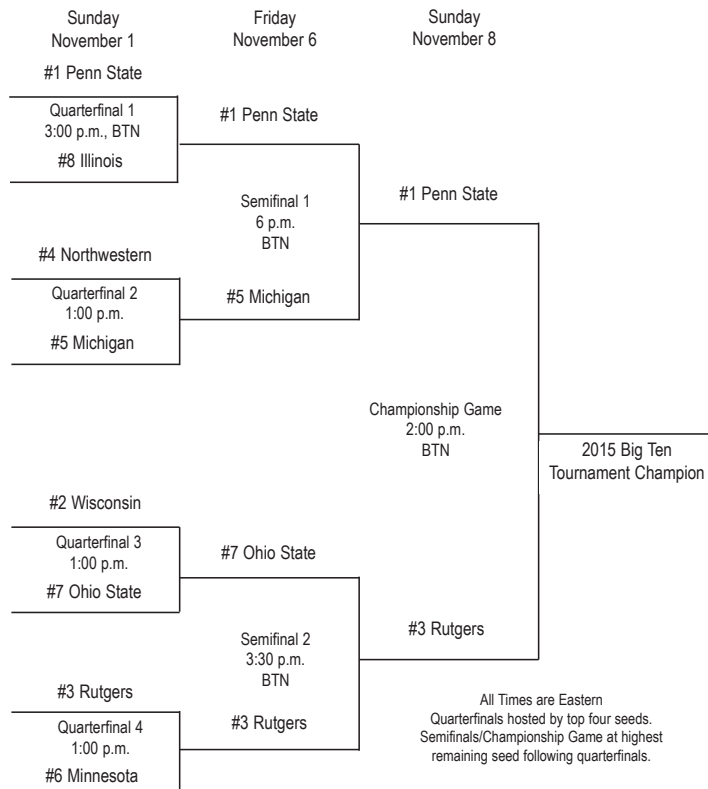

### Scouting Penn State

- Top-seeded and No. 9 ranked Penn State will host the Big Ten Championship Match Sunday at Jeffrey Field. The Nittany Lions enter the matchup 15-3-2 overall and have won four-straight.
- PSU defeated fifth-seeded Michigan, 1-0, in the Big Ten Semifinals, with Frannie Crouse firing the game-winning goal in the 62nd minute.
- Head coach Erica Walsh is in her ninth season as head coach of Penn State. She won her 150th match with the Nittany Lions with their win Friday.
- Penn State had numerous players recognized as All-Big Ten. Forward Mallory Weber and midfielder Raquel Rodriguez were named First Team All-Big Ten, forward Megan Schafer, midfielder Emily Ogle, and defender Kaleigh Riehl were named Second Team All-Big Ten, and four rookies - Alina Ortega-Jurado, Charlotte Williams, Elie Jean, and Kaleigh Riehl - were placed on the All-Freshman squad.
- Schafer leads Penn State with 10 goals this season. Weber assumes the points lead with eight goals and eight assists (24 points).
- As a team, Penn State is averaging 2.10 goals per match.
- Goalkeeper Britt Eckerstrom has started all 20 contests for Penn State and has a 0.61 goals-against average and .818 save percentage.
- Penn State was picked to finish first in the Big Ten Preseason Coaches Poll.

### All-time Series vs. the Nittany Lions

• Rutgers is 5-7-1 all-time against the Nittany Lions, but has emerged victorious in the last four meetings, including twice as conference foes. Rutgers topped PSU, 1-0, in each of the last two contests, once at Yurcak Field (2015) and once at Jeffrey Field (2014).

### Rutgers All-Big Ten Conference Honorees

• A banner 14-2-2 regular season for Rutgers women's soccer culminated with six All-Big Ten Conference honorees, the league office announced Friday. Highlighting the list for the Scarlet Knights are two coveted honors, as sophomore Casey Murphy was named Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year, and senior Erica Skroski was named Big Ten Defender of the year.

Both Scarlet Knights joined senior center back Brianna Reed as First Team All-Big Ten selections, the second in as many season for Reed. Earning Big Ten All-Freshmen laurels were midfielder Katelyn Walters and defender Kenie Wright, each of whom played key roles during Rutgers' historic regular season.

Senior Maggie Morash was honored as the Scarlet Knights' Big Ten Women's Soccer Sportsmanship Award winner. Reed, Skroski, and Murphy collected the second all-conference honors of their careers. Skroski picked up All-Big Ten Second Team plaudits a year ago, while Murphy qualified for the all-freshman team.

### Rutgers To The Conference Championship

• For the second time in the last three seasons, Rutgers will play for a conference title. The Scarlet Knights made a run to the 2013 American Athletic Conference Championship game by winning a 2-1 PK shootout in the semifinal vs. Memphis. RU dropped the final in nine rounds of PKs, 8-7, to No. 17 UCF after a scoreless 110 minutes of play.

The Scarlet Knights also competed for a BIG EAST Championship in 2006, falling in the final, 4-2, to Notre Dame.

Rutgers only conference titles came as a member of the ECAC. The Scarlet Knights won three consecutive ECAC Championships from 1990-92.

### Hot Streak

• Colby Ciarrocca has scored in five of the last six matches for Rutgers, netting the game-winner vs. Ohio State (Nov. 6) in the Big Ten Semifinals and in the win over then-No. 9 Penn State (Oct. 18). Ciarrocca also recorded points in five consecutive contests from Sept. 3-18. She tallied an assist on Sam Valliant's game-winner at Maryland (Sept. 18), scored the game-winner against UMass (Aug. 30), tallied assists against Princeton (Sept. 3) and Drexel (Sept. 6) and scored against vs. then-No. 20 UConn.

Ciarrocca leads the team with 19 points and eight goals this season. Three of her goals have come against ranked opposition.

### Closing Out Matches

• Once the Scarlet Knights take a lead into halftime, they do not relinquish it. Since 2008, Rutgers holds a 48-2-2 mark with a lead at half, including a 9-0-0 record this season, an 8-0-0 record in 2014 and a 7-1-1 mark in 2013. The lone loses came against No. 21 San Diego in 2009 and against No. 21/19 UCF on Oct. 18, 2013, both 2-1 losses.

### Home Cookin'

• Since the start of the 2006 season, RU is 82-16-9 (.808) on Yurcak Field, including a 10-0-1 record this season, a 9-1-0 record last season, an 11-1 record in 2013, a 7-3 mark in 2012 and a 6-2-2 record in 2011.

• RU is 30-2-1 in its last 33 contests at Yurcak Field dating back to the 2013 season. The only losses were against Northwestern, 1-0, on Oct. 19, 2014 and vs. UConn, 2-1, on Oct. 24, 2013.

• The 2015 Scarlet Knights joined the 1987 (8-0) and 1984 (5-0) teams as the only other home unbeaten in history. The Scarlet Knights' 10 home wins are one shy of the program record set in 2013 (11-1).

### Stepping Up

• Through 20 matches, eight different Scarlet Knights have scored game-winning goals, the most for the team since the 2009 season, when nine different RU players scored game-winners. Sophomore forward Colby Ciarrocca leads RU in the category with four. The season tally is below:

• Ten different starting lineups have taken the pitch for Rutgers through 20 matches. Moreover, the Scarlet Knights have used at least seven reserves in all 20 matches, cycling in nine or more players eight times. When using at least eight reserves, Rutgers is unbeaten (14-0-1) this season.

### Rutgers in Conference Openers

• Dating back to the 1993 season and the program's days in the Atlantic 10 Conference, BIG EAST Conference, American Athletic Conference, and now the Big Ten Conference, Rutgers is 11-9-3 in conference openers.

### Making Headlines

• Five Scarlet Knights have won numerous weekly awards this season for standout performances. Casey Murphy was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 29 in the last weekly honors of the season. She earned NSCAA Division I Women's National Player of the Week, TopDrawerSoccer.com Player of the Week, and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 20 after RU upset then-No. 9 Penn State, 1-0.

That same week, Rutgers swept the Big Ten Weekly Awards, with sophomore forward Colby Ciarrocca winning offensive player of the week honors and freshman defender Adora Moneme being named co-freshman of the week. Ciarrocca was also named Honorable Mention TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week.

Murphy earned Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 15 after making five saves in a 2-0 win over then-No. 20 UConn (Sept. 13). Cassie Inacio was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week for her two-goal performance at Princeton (Sept. 6). In addition, senior center back Erica Skroski was named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com

Women's Team of the Week for helping RU to its fifth and sixth shutouts.

### Shutout Soccer

• Rutgers started the year with eight consecutive shutouts for the first time in program history. RU's 770:16-minute scoreless streak this season was the longest in program history.

### Coaching Firsts

• Head coach Mike O'Neill is the first coach in program history to guide the program to starts of at least 4-0 in each of his first two seasons. Should RU advance to the NCAA Tournament this season, he would become the first head coach to advance to the post-season in each of his first two years at the helm.

### Neutral Territory

• RU opened the season with two neutral site wins at the Penn State Invitational from Aug. 21-23. It was the first time in program history that the team opened the season with two neutral victories.

### Preseason Top 25

• The Scarlet Knights were ranked No. 24 in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Preseason Poll, released Aug. 3. It is the program's first preseason appearance in the poll since 2010, when RU came in ranked No. 18 to start the year. Additionally, Rutgers debuted at No. 22 in the TopDrawerSoccer.com Preseason Top 25.

### Reed Named Hermann Trophy Candidate

• Rutgers women's soccer All-American center back Brianne Reed is one of 28 women from the NCAA Division I level to earn placement on the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy Watch List, announced on Aug. 5 by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA).

### Early Season Success

• RU has started the season 2-0 12 times in the last 13 years and 4-0 in each of the last four seasons. The Scarlet Knights began this season with eight-straight shutouts for the first time in program history.

### As Seen On TV

• Rutgers women's soccer has played three live nationally televised matches in 2015. The first came in the form of a 3-0 win at regional rival Princeton on ESPNU on Thursday, Sept. 3. The Scarlet Knights fell, 2-1, at Illinois on Thursday, Sept. 24 on the Big Ten Network. Rutgers defeated Ohio State, 2-0, on BTN in the Big Ten Semifinals (Nov. 6).

### Going Dancing

• The Scarlet Knights qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season and the fifth time in the last seven years in 2014. RU won its first round NCAA Tourney game against La Salle - the program's first since Nov. 10, 2012, when the squad topped Colgate, 1-0, in Charlottesville, Va.

### Defense Wins Championships

• Defense has been a staple of RU's success this season. The strong defensive and possession-driven play builds off the foundation laid by former head coach Glenn Crooks and current head coach Mike O'Neill during their 14 years working the RU sidelines together.

Entering the BIG Semis, RU was first in the nation in goals-against average (0.31), second in shutout percentage (0.737), and third in save percentage (.912). Defense was a key part of RU's success in 2014. Rutgers ended the year 18th in the nation in GAA (0.64), 18th in shutout percentage (.550) and 36th in save percentage (0.835).

Rutgers returned all five defensive starters from that team, namely 2014 NSCAA All-American and 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy Candidate, Brianne Reed, and 2014 Big Ten All-Freshman Team goalkeeper, Casey Murphy.

Murphy, who spent the offseason with the U.S. Women's National U-20 Team, was 21st in the nation in GAA (0.64) a year ago. That mark was second-best among true freshmen nationally.

### Clean Sheets

• Rutgers has 15 shutouts this season, one shy of tying RU's record for most shutouts in a season set in 2006, when current associate head coach Meg Ryan was a defender and captain for the Scarlet Knights.

### Streamlined Success

• With 16 wins this season, RU has recorded double-digit victories 21 times in the last 32 years. In 32 seasons of Rutgers women's soccer, the Scarlet Knights have finished .500 or better 25 times.

### Rutgers vs. The Big Ten

• Rutgers is 25-21-6 all-time against the Big Ten Conference, and has won 20 of its last 29 (20-6-3) matches against league opponents dating back to the 2008 NCAA Tournament. Prior to 2014, RU topped Ohio State, 1-0, in double overtime on Aug. 29, 2012 and defeated Penn State in consecutive meetings: 1-0 at No. 13 PSU on Sept. 6, 2009 and 2-1 vs. No. 20 PSU on Nov. 14, 2008 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

### Postseason Success

• Dating back to the 2000 season, the Scarlet Knights have qualified for 16 consecutive postseason conference tournaments. From 2000-2012, Rutgers advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament 13 times and in 2013, made a run to the American Athletic Conference finals in its only year in the league. Rutgers qualified for the 2015 Big Ten Tournament as a No. 3 seed, and the 2014 tournament as a No. 4 seed.

### Multi-Goal Outbursts

• Cassie Inacio became the first RU player to record a multi-goal performance this season with two goals at Princeton (Sept. 6). Below is a list of all the individual multi-goal performances over the past six seasons:

### The O'Neill Era Begins

• Head coach Mike O'Neill secured his first victory as head coach in 2014 with RU's season opening victory against Stony Brook (Aug. 22). As associate head coach, O'Neill was credited with three RU wins (Seton Hall, Sept. 18, 2009; Stony Brook, Aug. 14, 2010; Colgate, Aug. 27, 2010).

He owns the best start to a head coaching career in program history in terms of consecutive wins with his 7-0 start. Former coach Charlie Duccilli guided the Scarlet Knights

to a 6-0-1 start through his first seven games at the helm in RU's first season in 1984.

### Five-Goal Outbursts

• Against Princeton last season, Rutgers posted its sixth five-goal match since 2006. The Scarlet Knights also posted five goals against Princeton (Sept. 13, 2013), Cincinnati (Oct. 14, 2012), Villanova (Sept. 22, 2008), Farleigh Dickinson (Sept. 23, 2007) and USF (Oct. 1, 2006).

### Best Foot Forward

• The Scarlet Knights are 23-5-4 (.774) all-time in season openers.

### Iron Knight

• Senior Hayley Katkowski started her 84th consecutive game in the midfield for Rutgers vs. Ohio State (Nov. 6) on Sunday. She has started in every game for the Scarlet Knights dating back to the start of the 2012 season.

### Freshman Phenom

• Now a sophomore, goalkeeper Casey Murphy has started the first 40 matches of her career in net for RU. Last season, she started the most consecutive games of any Scarlet Knight freshman to begin her career in program history and finished near the top among freshmen in numerous categories, including second in shutouts (10), goals-against average (0.64), and goals allowed (13), third in save percentage (.829), and tied for fourth in saves (63).

### Tiernan Storms out of the Gates

• Junior Madison Tiernan recorded her first-career two-goal match on opening night 2014 against Stony Brook (Aug. 22). While the multi-goal performance was a first, it marked the second-straight season in which Tiernan scored in the first contest of the season. She posted the game-winner in a 1-0 win over Drexel on Aug. 23, 2013 at Yurcak Field.

### Seasoned Vets

• RU returns 23 letterwinners and eight starters "To the Banks," this season. The Scarlet Knights have 10 seniors on this year's roster.

### Scarlet Shootouts

• RU had its final three matches of the 2013 season decided by penalty kicks, the first time in school history that feat has occurred.

### Big Ten Preseason Coaches Poll

• RU was selected to finish tied for third with Wisconsin in the 2015 Big Ten Women's Soccer Preseason Coaches' Poll. Penn State was selected to win the conference, while Michigan was tabbed second. RU's three players on the Big Ten Players to Watch List were sophomore goalkeeper Casey Murphy, junior forward Madison Tiernan and senior back Brianne Reed. Tiernan finds herself on the watch list for the second consecutive season.

The longtime New Jersey native served as the Scarlet Knights' associate head coach from 2004-13, now lending his local and national player expertise at the helm of the program as it competes in the Big Ten Conference.

Through his involvement on the New Jersey club soccer scene, O'Neill has helped develop a multitude of regional and national-level players, while his club teams have won numerous state and regional titles, in addition to three national championships.

Under O'Neill's guidance, defender Brianne Reed emerged as a national talent in 2014, being named a Third Team National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-American, as well as a First Team All-Big Ten player.

Throughout O'Neill's tenure at Rutgers, the program has produced seven MAC Hermann Trophy candidates, six NSCAA All-American selections, and 21 NSCAA All-Region honorees.

A USSF "A" licensed coach who holds a KNVB Dutch International Badge, O'Neill was a member of Seton Hall's BIG EAST Championship teams in 1987 and 1988, helping the Pirates reach the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight each of those years.

O'Neill graduated from Seton Hall University in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in business management. A native of Kearny, N.J., he currently resides in New Egypt with his wife, Rachel, and their children, Madelyn, Kylie and Michael.

## ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH MEG RYAN



Meghan Ryan begins her eighth year with the Rutgers coaching staff and second as the program's associate head coach. Ryan previously served as an assistant coach for the Scarlet Knights for four seasons after spending two years as a volunteer assistant. Ryan, a three-year RU captain at center back, graduated in 2007.

The Annapolis, Maryland, product will continue to serve as head recruiting coordinator, already hauling in a top-20 class for the 2012 season. Under Ryan's guidance, defender Brianne Reed emerged as a national talent in 2014, being named a Third Team National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-American, as well as a First Team All-Big Ten player.

Throughout Ryan's tenure with the Scarlet Knights, the program has produced five MAC Hermann Trophy candidates, four NSCAA All-American selections, and 10 NSCAA All-Region honorees. A major orchestrator of the RU defense, the Scarlet Knights have not posted a GAA higher than 1.06 in Ryan's coaching career (since 2008), five times recording a GAA under 1.00 and three times posting a GAA under 0.65.

On the club level, Ryan has excelled with Players Development Academy (PDA) as the head coach of PDA the Arsenal and assistant coach of the PDA Slammers. Ryan coached the Arsenal to a 2015 U17 ECNL National Championship, and has won two other ECNL national titles as an assistant with the Slammers (2014, 2013). She is the first female head coach in ECNL history to win a national championship.

In 2006, Ryan anchored a defense that was arguably one of the best in the country. The team finished 16-3-4, allowing a mere six goals and posting 16 shutouts, the most in the program's history. RU finished the season ranked No. 6 in shutout percentage, No. 10 in won-lost-tied percentage and No. 11 in goals-against average.

Ryan was a two-time BIG EAST Academic All-Star, a three-time BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week, an Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) Defensive Player of the Week and a Soccerbuzz Elite Team of the Week honoree once.

## ASSISTANT COACH LUBOS ANCIN



Former Rutgers men's soccer goalkeeper Lubos Ancin returned to Piscataway in 2014 as an assistant coach for the women's soccer program. Entering his second season, Ancin assumes a number of responsibilities, namely supervising the Rutgers goalkeeping corps.

Ancin's presence was immediately felt by the RU defensive unit, namely rookie goalkeeper Casey Murphy. Murphy was named the goalkeeper on the Big Ten All-Freshman team after posting a 0.64 GAA, .829 save percentage, 63 saves, and 10 shutouts while allowing just 13 goals in 20 contests in 2014. She was twice named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week.

Among true freshmen nationally, Murphy posted the second-best GAA, which overall was 21st nationally. In the annals of RU history, Murphy also stood out. She allowed the second-fewest goals, recorded the second-best GAA and posted the third-best save percentage of any freshman keeper in RU history.

Ancin joins RU with substantial playing and coaching experience. From 2004-2014, Ancin served as the assistant head coach at the Paul Blodgett Goalkeeper Training School, preparing and running practices for goalkeepers of all ages. In addition, Ancin was the assistant goalkeeper coach of the New Jersey Wildcats and the Robert Reasso Soccer School.

A goalkeeper for the Scarlet Knights from 2003-05, Ancin played in 33 games and made 99 saves in his career. He finished with eight collegiate shutouts, once earning BIG EAST and ECAC Goalkeeper of the Week honors. Ancin was also placed on the College Soccer News National Team of the Week in October of 2004.

Ancin currently resides in Dunellen, N.J. and is happily married to his wife, Hana. The couple welcomed their daughter, Juliet, to the world in 2015.

## VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH TRICIA DIPALO



Former Scarlet Knight Trish DiPaolo begins her second season on staff as a volunteer assistant coach. DiPaolo, a four-year captain and seven-year player for RU, overcame numerous injuries and served as an integral part of the Scarlet Knights' success in her career.

DiPaolo's experience includes time at the club, high school, college and professional levels. This past year, DiPaolo earned a spot as a back on Sky Blue FC of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL). She has served as a student assistant coach since 2007 at the Rutgers University Soccer Youth Camps, providing training and instruction throughout camp sessions. Further, DiPaolo has six years of experience with East Brunswick Girls Soccer as a trainer under head coach Eddy Lam.

In her role, DiPaolo designs and executes practice sessions. In 2011, DiPaolo worked as an assistant strength and conditioning intern at Lake Highland Preparatory High School in Orlando, Fla. While there, she conducted training sessions incorporating weight lifting, speed and agility-specific soccer drills.

DiPaolo tied for third in Rutgers history with 85 matches played for her career and was the unheralded leader of the squad since the 2010 season. Initially a forward, DiPaolo closed her career as the leader in the backfield for Rutgers and ended her time in Scarlet with four goals and nine assists.

The Sparta, N.J., native earned her bachelor's degree in exercise science and sport management from Rutgers in May of 2011 and went on to finish her master's degree in human resource management "On the Banks" in 2013.
