B1G ROAD TRIP: UW KICKS OFF BIG TEN VS. NATIONALLY-RANKED FOES

Wisconsin kicks off its Big Ten Conference schedule this weekend with two big-time road tests. The Badgers first travel to face No. 4 Penn State in State College, Pennsylvania, seeking their first road win against the Nittany Lions since 2010. UW heads to Columbus, Ohio, for a game against No. 20 Ohio State on Sunday. With a win, the Badgers would secure their third-straight win over the Buckeyes and their first in Columbus since 1996.

STARTING XI

- 1 THE WILKINS WAY: With head coach Paula Wilkins at the helm for her ninth season, Wisconsin looks to make the NCAA tournament for the fifth time in the last seven years. Wilkins is approaching 100 wins at Wisconsin (90-58-23).
- **2** ROSE IN BLOOM: Rose Lavelle returns to UW after earning NSCAA second-team All-America honors last season. A U.S. Soccer youth program standout, Lavelle was named to the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy watch list this preseason.
- **3 McMIDFIELD:** Ranked the 18th best player in the nation by TopDrawerSoccer, Kinley McNicoll is now in her final year as a senior at Wisconsin. UW's leading returning point scorer (27pts: 9G, 9A), she's still seeking her first pts of '15.
- **4 STINGY WITH STELZER:** Anchored by Brianna Stelzer, UW set a Big Ten record in 2014 with 18 shutouts in 24 matches. The Badgers recorded their first shutout of 2015 last weekend on the road at No. 18 Kentucky (0-0, 20T).
- **5 CALLING ON CLEM:** Sophomore Caitlyn Clem has stepped into net this season for graduating All-American Genevieve Richard (RISH-ard). The Michigan native had her first career shutout on the road at No. 18 Kentucky (9/13).
- **6 GOING THE DISTANCE:** Dating back to last season, UW is an undefeated 6-0-4 in its last 10 overtime games. 2-0-2 in OT this year, UW has had three double overtime games, including a scoreless draw at No. 18 Kentucky.
- 7 BATTLE-TESTED BADGERS: Following this weekend, UW will have already faced five nationally-ranked teams. That includes a non-conference road trip during which UW faced No. 10 Pepperdine and No. 12 UCLA back-to-back.
- **8 LIVING UP TO THE HYPE?** Wisconsin was picked to finish third in the Big Ten Conference this year in the preseason coaches poll. The Badgers won the Big Ten tournament title last year, their first tourney crown since 2005.
- **9 YOUTH MOVEMENT:** Wisconsin added 11 freshmen for 2015: Borgmann, Donohue, Fabry, Jacobson, Kalkofen, Knudtson, Mittelsteadt, O'Brien, Pickett, Quirk, Torchio. Roster also has six seniors, five juniors and five sophomores.
- **10 MAGIC NUMBER 10:** Wisconsin looks to extend its school record and reach 10 wins in a season for the seventh straight season. UW also enters 2015 having won at least five Big Ten games six seasons in a row, also a school best.
- 11 REWORKED XI: There have been be as many as five new Badgers in the Starting XI this season. Emily Borgmann, Marisa Kresge, Micaela Powers, Holly Heckendorf & Caitlyn Clem have become new regulars in the starting lineup.

SERIES VS. PENN STATE

Thursday's game at Penn State will mark the 27th alltime meeting between the Nittany Lions and Badgers.

- ▶ Penn State leads the all-time series, 19-3-4.
- ► The Nittany Lions also hold a 7-1-1 advantage for games played at State College.
- ► UW and PSU met once last season, as the No. 7 Nittany Lions scored twice over the final 12 minutes to earn a 2-0 road win against the No. 13 Badgers in Madison.
- ▶ UW seeks its first win at Penn State since 2010.
- ► Before Paula Wilkins took over at Wisconsin in 2007, the Badgers had won just one game against Penn State and held a 1-13-3 all-time record.

 Now with Wilkins at the helm, the Badgers have

won or tied three of the last seven meetings.

▶ Wilkins was the head coach at Penn State from 2001-06. With Wilkins at the helm, the Nittany Lions won six-straight Big Ten regular season titles (each year of Wilkins' tenure) and never saw their season end before the second round of the NCAA tournament. That included two College Cup Semifinal runs.

Prior to becoming head coach, Wilkins served as an assistant coach on PSU's staff from 1994-2000.

▶ Wilkins is a native of Middletown, Pennsylvania.

SCOUTING PENN STATE

- Penn State is coming off a pair of wins last weekend on the West Coast. The Nittany Lions upset No. 2 Stanford in a 2-0 final in Palo Alto, California, Friday. PSU defeated Santa Clara, 1-0, on Sunday.
- PSU senior midfielder Raquel Rodriguez Cedeno joins Wisconsin junior midfielder Rose Lavelle on the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List.
- ► The Nittany Lions return eight starters from last year and 13 letterwinners; welcome nine newcomers.
- ▶ Penn State has scored 13 goals so far this season, led by senior forward Mallory Weber with four. Sophomore forwards Megan Schafer and Frannie Crouse have each scored three goals.
- Britt Eckerstrom has started all seven games this season for PSU. The fifth-year senior has posted three shutouts and allowed only four goals.
- Erica Walsh is in her ninth season as head coach at Penn State. She entered 2015 with a 135-47-8 (.732) all-time record at PSU.

SERIES VS. OHIO STATE

Sunday's contest against Ohio State will mark the 25th all-time meeting between the Buckeyes and Badgers.

- ▶ Wisconsin leads the all-time series, 10-9-5.
- ► However, UW trails 2-5-3 for games in Columbus.
- ▶ The Badgers have not won in Columbus since 1996.
- ► The Badgers and Buckeyes met once last season, as Wisconsin earned a 2-0 shutout in Madison.
- ▶ UW is looking for its third-straight win against OSU.
- ► As head coach at Wisconsin, Paula Wilkins holds a 3-3-2 record against Ohio State.
- ► Wisconsin has two Ohio natives: Rose Lavelle - Cincinnati (Mount Notre Dame) Micaela Powers - Beavercreek (Beavercreek HS)

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

- ► Last weekend, Ohio State was shut out at home by No. 8 West Virginia in a 2-0 final on Friday. OSU rebounded with a 2-0 win over Bucknell on Sunday. This weekend, OSU hosts Minnesota at home Thursday before hosting Wisconsin on Sunday.
- ► The Buckeyes have already faced two top-eight teams this year. OSU upset No. 8 Florida at home, 1-0, but fell to No. 8 West Virginia, 2-0.
- ► OSU returns eight starters and 14 letterwinners from last season.
- Ohio State enters the weekend with 14 goals on the season, led by junior forward Nichelle Prince and her three goals. Sophomores Nikki Walts and Sammy Edwards have each scored two goals.
- ➤ Two different goalkeepers have seen time this year for OSU. Jillian McVicker is 4-1-1 with one solo shutout, while Devon Kerr is 1-0-0 and has split time with McVicker to preserve two team shutouts.
- ▶ Lori Walker is in her 19th season as head coach. She has guided the Buckeyes to nine NCAA tournament appearances, one Big Ten regular season championship and three Big Ten tournament titles. Walker entered this season 202-141-34 at OSU.
- ► Ohio State is 94-27-14 at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium since 2003 and 48-15-6 since 2009.

WISCONSIN 0, #18 KENTUCKY 0 - 9/13/15 - LEXINGTON, KY.

- Wisconsin played to a scoreless, double-overtime draw on the road against No. 18 Kentucky on Sunday. It was the second-straight 2OT game of the weekend for LIW
- Caitlyn Clem earned her first career shutout and helped UW preserve its first clean sheet of the year. The sophomore made four saves in the game.
- ▶ Rose Lavelle had a game-high five shots for UW. The 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy candidate has led the Badgers in shots in all but one game this year.
- ► UW improved to an undefeated 6-0-4 in its last 10 overtime games.
- Wisconsin's all-time series lead over Kentucky is now 4-1-1. UW has never lost in Lexington (2-0-1) and has not lost to UK since 1997.

- ► Wisconsin is receiving votes in the NSCAA rankings.
- ► Wisconsin is ranked No. 30 in the Bennett Rank/ HERO Sports women's soccer rankings.

- Junior midfielder Rose Lavelle was named to the 2015 Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy watch list. The MAC Hermann Trophy is the most prestigious individual award in NCAA soccer.
- Lavelle was named to the TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Week on Aug. 25.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Wisconsin takes its third road trip this weekend.

- ▶ Wisconsin is seeking its first road win of the year.
- ► The Badgers were 10-2-1 last season in games played away from home. That includes neutral site contests and postseason play.

UW was 6-1-1 in true road games last year.

▶ Dating back to the 2013 season, the Badgers have gone 16-7-5 away from home. They hold a 12-5-5 record in true road games over the past two years.

ROSE IN BLOOM

Junior **Rose Lavelle** broke onto the scene as a freshman and has become one of the nation's best.

- ► Lavelle was named to the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy watch list. The MAC Hermann Trophy is the highest individual honor in college soccer.
- ► Lavelle enters 2015 ranked as the No. 2 player in the country in TopDrawerSoccer's national player rankings. She's on TDS' preseason Best XI First Team.
- ► She was named to TDS Team of the Week on 8/25. Honorable mention TDS Team of the Week (9/8).
- ► This season, Lavelle leads UW in goals (4), assists (2), points (10), shots (37) and shots on goal (17). She's T7th in the Big Ten Conference in points, T5th in goals and 4th in shots per game.
- Lavelle has already scored four goals through the first eight games of the season after scoring just three goals all of last year.
- ► Lavelle has had multi-point outings in four of UW's first eight games this season.

- ► Last season, Lavelle and teammate Genevieve Richard became the first Badgers to earn NSCAA All-America honors since Allison Wagner in 2000. Lavelle was a second team All-American.
- ► The Cincinnati, Ohio native was the first player in UW history to be tabbed conference freshman of the year in 2013. During her freshman campaign, Lavelle tied for eighth in the conference in assists (7) and led all Big Ten freshman in the category.
- As a freshman, Lavelle also became the first UW player to earn first-team All-Big Ten accolades since Michele Dalton earned the honor in 2011. She earned first-team Big Ten accolades again in 2014.
- ► Lavelle was named to the NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region first team last year; third team as freshman.
- Known for her creativity and possession in the midfield, Lavelle is always a threat offensively. She led the team last year in assists (10) and ranked fourth for points with 16 on her 10 assists and three goals.
- A noted up-and-comer in the U.S. Soccer youth system, Lavelle was a finalist for 2014 U.S. Soccer Young Female Athlete of the Year.
- ► Lavelle recently helped lead the U.S. U-23s to a title at the 2015 Four Nations Tournament in Norway.
- Lavelle was a standout player for the U.S. during the Under-20 Women's World Cup during the summer of 2014.
- ► Lavelle was awarded the Golden Ball at the 2014 CONCACAF Women's U-20 Championships.

KICKING IT WITH KINLEY

Since being honored on the All-Big Ten Freshman team, senior **Kinley McNicoll** has elevated her game throughout her collegiate career and now prepares for her senior season in Madison.

- McNicoll enters 2015 ranked 18th in the country in the TopDrawerSoccer national player rankings. She's on TDS' preseason Best XI Second Team.
- McNicoll was a second team all-region honoree and a first team All-Big Ten selection last season. She was also on the All-Big Ten second team in 2013.
- McNicoll was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week once last season (9/9), as well as espnW College Soccer Player of the Week (9/10) and TopDrawerSoccer Women's Player of the Week (9/9).
- ► McNicoll had a junior campaign to remember, highlighted by scoring the game-winning goal in double overtime of the Big Ten tournament championship game. She was Big Ten Tournament Offensive MVP.
- ► One of the leaders for UW in points each season, McNicoll ranked second among Badgers last season with 27 points on nine goals and nine assists. She led UW in points during the 2013 season.
- McNicoll enters the 2015 season tied for second in school history for career assists (28), just three shy of the school record.
- McNicoll is well on her way within the Canada Soccer National Team system. She captained Canada at the 2014 FIFA Under-20 Women's World Cup when the country hosted the event.

She most recently competed with Canada at the Pan American Games this summer.

WORLD-CLASS BADGERS

- ► Rose Lavelle and Kinley McNicoll have both become prominent players and up-and-comers with their respective country's youth system.
- ► Lavelle started all four matches for the U.S. at the 2014 U-20 Women's World Cup, scoring her first international goal at the U-20 level and helping the U.S. advance out of group play and to quarterfinals.

Lavelle helped lead the U.S. U-23s to a title at the Four Nations Tournament this past spring, tallying an assist in each of the three games and added one goal to her tournament tally in the finale vs. England.

McNicoll served as team captain for host Canada at the 2014 U-20 Women's World Cup in Toronto. She played in all four matches and the Oakville, Ontario native helped guide Team Canada to the quarterfinals.

McNicoll most recently played for Canada at the 2015 Pan American Games, also hosted by Canada.

➤ Victoria Pickett played with UW teammate McNicoll for Canada at both the 2015 Pan American Games and the 2014 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup.

Pickett was 15 years old when she made her debut in the Canadian youth program.

Emily Borgmann represented Canada at the 2014 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Costa Rica, starting two games and playing in all four games.

Borgmann also played for Canada at the 2013 CONCACAF Women's U-17 Championship in Montego Bay. She helped Canada win a silver medal by starting in all five games and scoring five goals.

STILL AS STINGY IN 2015?

After allowing six goals through the first four games of the season, Wisconsin has begun to settle in defensively and allowed just three goals over the last four games.

That includes one shutout on the road against No. 18 Kentucky.

- ► Last year, UW was led by Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year **Genevieve Richard** (RISH-ard) and anchored by All-Big Ten honoree **Brianna Stelzer**. The stingy UW defense set a Big Ten record for shutouts in a season last year with 18 in 24 games.
- ► The Badgers also set a Big Ten record last season for the fewest goals allowed in a season at 10.
- ► Last year, **Genevieve Richard** set a school record and finished second in Big Ten history with 16 solo shutouts in a season.
- Wisconsin had three seperate streaks of at least four straight shutouts last season, including the longest, which saw the team string together seven straight.
- Wisconsin loses defender Alexandra Heller, but brings back Brianna Stelzer, Kylie Schwarz and Molly Laufenberg on its back line for 2015.
- With Genevieve Richard gone in net, redshirt sophomore Caitlyn Clem has taken over at goalkeeper.

Clem made the first two starts of her career last weekend and allowed two goals in a pair of wins.

LAVELLE NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

Earlier this summer, junior midfielder **Rose Lavelle** was named a candidate for the 2015 Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, the most prestigious individual award in NCAA soccer.

- An All-American last season, Lavelle was one of 28 women marked as a potential contender on the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List.
- ➤ The MAC Hermann Trophy is the highest individual award presented to a player in intercollegiate soccer and is awarded annually to one male and one female athlete.

LAVELLE A FINALIST FOR 2015 MOST VALUABLE PLAYER OF USL W-LEAGUE

For her performance over the summer, junior midfielder **Rose Lavelle** was named a finalist for the 2015 Most Valuable Player of the United Soccer League (USL) W-League.

- ▶ One of just three finalists for the league's highest individual honor, Lavelle played for the Seattle Sounders Women this summer. The Cincinnati, Ohio, native scored seven goals on the season and also tallied four assists in nine games with the Sounders. Lavelle ranked 10th in the W-League for points (18).
- Seattle earned a top postseason spot with a 10-1-1 overall record, but fell to the Colorado Pride in the Western Conference final. Lavelle did not play in the game, however. The Sounders were an undefeated 8-0-1 with Lavelle in the lineup.

LAVELLE AND MCNICOLL GARNER W-LEAGUE CONFERENCE HONORS

The Wisconsin duo of Rose Lavelle and Kinley McNicoll garnered individual team honors from the United Soccer Leagues (USL) W-League this week, as Lavelle earned all-league and all-conference nods, and McNicoll was an all-conference honoree.

- ▶ Both Lavelle and McNicoll played for the Seattle Sounders Women this summer. The duo helped lead Seattle to the conference championship game and the top postseason spot in the Western Conference with a 10-1-1 overall record.
- ► Lavelle and McNicoll were named to the 2015 W-League All-Western Conference Team. For Lavelle, it marked her second-consecutive season garnering all-conference accolades in the W-League.
- ▶ In addition, Lavelle was also named to the 2015 All-League Team. The midfielder ranked 10th in the league for points with 18 in nine games during the season. The Cincinatti, Ohio, native also ranked eighth in assists with four.

BADGERS PICKED THIRD BY COACHES

- ► This marks the sixth-straight season in which Wisconsin has been predicted to finish among the top five in the Big Ten coaches poll.

- ▶ In addition to the coaches poll, the Big Ten also released its list of players to watch. From Wisconsin, that list included 2014 NSCAA second-team All-American Rose Lavelle, along with 2014 All-Big Ten honorees Kinley McNicoll and Brianna Stelzer.

Under Wilkins, Wisconsin put together the winningest season in program history in 2014. The Badgers finished 19-3-2, winning the Big Ten tournament and advancing to the second round of the NCAA tournament. Wilkins coached Rose Lavelle and Genevieve RichardClick here to hear it to become the program's first NSCAA All-Americans since 2000, while Richard also became just the second player in UW history to be named Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year. Cara WallsClick here to hear it, Rose Lavelle and Kinley McNicoll joined Richard in earning First-Team All-Big Ten accolades, while Brianna Stelzer was Second Team All-Big Ten. Lavelle, McNicoll, Richard, Stelzer and Walls each earned All-Great Lakes Region recognition, as

Wilkins has compiled a remarkable 206-74-32 (.712) record through 14 seasons as a head coach. Prior to her start at Wisconsin, Wilkins was the head coach at Penn State for six years. The Nittany Lions earned six NCAA tournament berths, which included two College Cup appearances during her tenure. In addition, Penn State won the last six Big Ten regular season championships, along with a pair of Big Ten tournament titles.

Penn State dominated Big Ten women's soccer for most of the 13 seasons of the school's sponsorship of the sport and Wilkins was part of the coaching staff the entire time. She joined the Nittany Lions as an assistant coach when the program debuted as a varsity sport in 1994 and served in that role until she was named head coach at the end of the 2000 campaign.

Wilkins coached nine All-Americans at Penn State, including four-time All-American Christie Welsh, the 2001 player of the year and winner of the prestigious M.A.C. Hermann Trophy. Wilkins also recruited and guided Tiffany Weimer, a three-time All-American, two-time Big Ten offensive player of the year and the conference's record holder in career goals.

Paula Wilkins

Establishing a winning culture at Wisconsin

Having led teams to a pair of College Cup Semifinal appearances and 10 NCAA tournament berths, Paula Wilkins has earned a reputation as one of the most accomplished women's college soccer head coaches in the country. Through eight seasons in Madison, she has made giant leaps in rebuilding and sustaining the women's soccer program at Wisconsin.

Now in her ninth season at Wisconsin, Paula Wilkins holds a career coaching record of 209-77-34. Having guided the Badgers to NCAA tournament appearances four of the last six years, the five-time Big Ten Coach of the Year looks to lead a talented group back to the postseason this year.



- ▶ Wilkins earned her 200th career win as a head coach last season by leading Wisconsin to a 4-1 win on the road against rival Minnesota on Oct. 18.
- ▶ Wilkins is approaching 100 career wins at Wisconsin with her record sitting at 90-58-23. She currently ranks third in school history for career coaching wins at Wisconsin. Dean Duerst (1994-2006) holds the program record with 151 wins in Madison, while Greg Ryan is second at 108.
- ► Last season, not only did Wilkins lead the Badgers in becoming the winningest team in school history, but the 2014 squad also became the fastest group to reach 10 wins in a season. Last year's team was just the fourth ever at Wisconsin to begin with a 10-1 start.
- ▶ With their magical run during the 2014 season, Wilkins and the Badgers became the first team in school history to reach 13 wins in a single season since 2005.
- ▶ UW has been incredibly consistent under the guidance of Wilkins. The Badgers reached 10 wins for a school-record sixth straight season last year. UW has also won at least five Big Ten games a record six years in a row.
