TODAY'S GAME

• Penn State, which is looking for its first 12-win regular season since 2005, will play its final regular-season game when it visits Princeton Saturday for a 1 p.m. matchup.

ALC CHAMPIONS

• The Nittany Lions finished 4-1 in conference play for the first time since 2006 as they clinched a share of their first ALC regular-season championship.
• Penn State, Florida and Northwestern all finished with identical 4-1 marks.

TOURNAMENT SEEDING SET

• Based on lowest goals allowed in conference play, the Nittany Lions secured the No. 3 seed for the upcoming ALC championships. Penn State will play sixth-seeded Vanderbilt in the quarterfinals May 2.

ALL-TIME VS. PRINCETON

• Penn State, which has lost four straight to Princeton, is 12-21 all-time against the Tigers. The Nittany Lions are looking for their first win in the series since 2007.

LAST TIME VS. THE TIGERS

• Penn State erased a 9-4 deficit with

22:38 remaining to tie the game at 11-11, but Princeton outscored the Nittany Lions, 2-1, in the extra frame to secure the 13-12 victory.

• **Maggie McCormick** led Penn State with six points (4g, 2a), while **Mackenzie Cyr** (2g, 1a), **Molly Fernandez** (2g) and **Kelly Lechner** (2g) collected multi-point games.
• Final Stats (PSU-PU): Shots (28-25), Ground Balls (19-16), Turnovers (16-16), Saves (8-6), Draw Controls (12-16), Caused Turnovers (10-8).

FAMILIAR TERRITORY

• Head coach **Missy Doherty** served as an assistant coach at Princeton for three seasons (2001-03) before becoming Towson's head coach. She helped lead the Tigers to two national championships (2002, 2003) and three Ivy League crowns.

MOSKETTI GETS FOURTH ALC HONOR

• Freshman midfielder **Jenna Moschetti** was named ALC Rookie of the Week for the fourth time April 23. The Fallston, Md., native recorded four points (3g, 1a), five draw controls, one ground ball and one caused turnover in victories against Lafayette and Johns Hopkins.

CYR WITH ANOTHER WINNER

• Junior attacker **Mackenzie Cyr** scored her team-leading fourth game-winning goal of the season and her second in the game's final minute to send Penn State to a 15-14 victory vs. Johns Hopkins.
• The Westminster, Md., native, who has registered at least one point in a team-high 22 straight games, has collected 70 career assists to move to seventh on the program's all-time list.

PENN STATE RALLIES VS. HOPKINS

UNDERCLASSMEN THRIVING

- Penn State has started as many as eight underclassmen during the 2013 season.
- Freshmen and sophomores have combined for 156 goals, good for 75 percent of the Nittany Lions' scoring.
- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** leads Penn State in goals (39), assists (30) and points (69), while sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** paces the squad with 42 draw controls.
- Freshman **Emi Smith** has been the goalkeeper of record for each game (11-4).

DEFENSIVE ANCHOR

- Defender **Katie Guy** has flourished during her senior season as she has set career highs in both ground balls (38) and caused turnovers (29).
- The Whitby, Ont., native is also six draw

controls away from matching her personal best (30).

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- In 2013, nine Nittany Lions have recorded at least 10 points, while Penn State boasts one 60-point scorer, one 50-point performer, two 30-point players and two 20-point contributors.
- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** (39g, 30a) and junior **Mackenzie Cyr** (26g, 24a) are the only Lions with double-digit goals and assists.
- Five Lions - **Kelly Lechner** (16gb, 42dc, 15ct), **Tatum Coffey** (21gb, 30dc, 12ct), **Jenna Moschetti** (25gb, 29dc, 18ct), **Madi-son Cyr** (15gb, 21dc, 12ct) and **Katie Guy** (38gb, 24dc, 29ct) - have recorded at least 10 ground balls, draw controls and caused turnovers.

NOT DONE SINCE '91

- The Nittany Lions, who finished 7-0 at home during the regular season, defeated Lafayette, 19-10, April 17 to complete their first undefeated home campaign since 1991.
- Penn State has completed 13 undefeated home campaigns during the regular season (10 when including postseason).

ANOTHER 10-WIN SEASON

- Penn State secured its fourth straight 10-win season with a 19-10 victory against Lafayette.
- The Nittany Lions have won at least 10 games in each of head coach **Missy Doherty's** three seasons.

- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick**, who led Penn State in scoring as a freshman, has enjoyed a breakout sophomore campaign.
- In 2013, she has set career highs in goals (39), points (69), caused turnovers (3), goals in a game (6 vs. James Madison) and assists in a game (5 vs. Duquesne).
- The Eldersburg, Md., native also notched her 100th career point vs. Drexel March 22.

PENN STATE RISING

- The Nittany Lions are ranked sixth in both the IWLCA and deBeer Media polls.
- Penn State is ranked at No. 6 for the first time since the 2007 season.

LIONS ROAR PAST LEOPARDS

- Five Nittany Lions recorded at least three goals as Penn State knocked off Lafayette, 19-10, at the PSU Lacrosse Field April 17.
- Sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick** recorded a game-high seven points, while senior **Molly Fernandez** scored a game-high four goals.
- Sophomore **Kelly Lechner** and freshmen **Madison Cyr** and **Ally Heavens** notched three goals each.

MOSKETTI EARNS THIRD ALC HONOR

- Freshman midfielder **Jenna Mosketti** earned her third ALC Rookie of the Week honor after helping lead Penn State to victories against Lehigh and Ohio State.
- The Fallston, Md., native tied for the team lead with four caused turnovers, while also collecting three goals, four draw controls and four ground balls.
- The midfielder leads all conference freshmen in caused turnovers per game (1.31) and ground balls per game (1.85).

LIONS OUTLAST OHIO STATE

- Led by a six-point (5g, 1a) outing from sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick**, Penn State downed Ohio State, 14-12, at the Penn State Lacrosse Field April 14.
- Sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** netted her third hat trick of the season, while **Molly Fernandez** and **Jenna Mosketti** added two goals each.

McCORMICK ADDED TO TEWAARATON

- Sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick** was added to the Tewaaron Award Watch List April 11.
- McCormick joins classmate **Tatum Coffey** as the Nittany Lions' representatives.

LIONS CRUISE PAST LEHIGH

- Seven Nittany Lions recorded multi-point games as Penn State rolled past Lehigh, 16-3, April 10.
- **Maggie McCormick** tallied a game-high four points (2g, 2a), while **Kristin Brent** and freshman midfielder **Erika Spilker** netted their first career goals.
- Final Stats (PSU-LEHIGH): Shots (31-12), Ground Balls (17-13), Turnovers (10-16), Saves (6-7), Draw Controls (13-8), Caused Turnovers (13-8).

LIONS FALL TO NORTHWESTERN

- Seeking its second straight win against a top-five team, Penn State fell to No. 3/4 Northwestern, 11-3, at Lakeside Field April 5.
- **Molly Fernandez**, **Tatum Coffey** and **Kelly Lechner** scored the PSU goals.
- Final Stats (PSU-NU): Shots (10-21), Ground Balls (13-15), Turnovers (13-11), Saves (2-4), Draw Controls (6-10), Caused Turnovers (8-10).

HIGHEST RANKED WIN SINCE 2007

- The Nittany Lions defeated its highest ranked opponent since 2007 when it knocked off No. 2 Florida, 16-11, at Penn State Lacrosse Field March 30.
- Penn State trailed, 9-6, at halftime but outscored the Gators by a 10-2 margin in the second.
- **Tatum Coffey** recorded a game-high five points (4g, 1a), while six players recorded multi-point games.

TRIO EARNS WEEKLY HONORS

- Sophomore midfielder **Tatum Coffey** earned WomensLax.com Co-Player of the Week honors after five points (4g, 1a), two draw controls, one ground ball and a caused turnover against the Gators.
- Freshman **Jenna Mosketti** earned her second ALC Rookie of the Week award. Mosketti scored twice, including the game-winner, and corralled a game-high four draw controls.
- Senior defender **Colleen Shea** was named ALC Defensive Player of the Week for the first time after helping hold Florida to two second-half goals. She also recorded a game-high two caused turnovers.

CYR SENDS LIONS PAST DREXEL

- Junior **Mackenzie Cyr** scored the game-winning goal with 36 seconds remaining as Penn State edged Drexel, 9-8, March 22.
- Drexel erased a three-goal deficit to tie the game with 54 seconds left before Cyr's heroics.



- Sophomores **Tatum Coffey** and **Kelly Lechner** paced PSU with three goals each, while senior **Katie Guy** also scored.

GUY, MOSKETTI HONORED BY ALC

- Senior **Katie Guy** and freshman **Jenna Mosketti** were named ALC Defensive Player of the Week and Rookie of the Week, respectively, March 19.
- A Whitby, Ont., native, Guy collected six ground balls, four draw controls and five caused turnovers against Cornell and Vanderbilt.
- Mosketti collected seven points (5g, 2a), seven ground balls, five draw controls and four caused turnovers.
- Both Guy and Mosketti were honored for the first time in their careers.

PSU OPENS ALC SEASON WITH WIN

- Penn State opened its ALC campaign with a 20-14 victory against Vanderbilt March 17.
- The Nittany Lions trailed, 3-1, in the first half before taking a 4-3 lead. Penn State kept the lead for the remainder of the game.
- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** recorded six points (5g, 1a), while senior **Molly Fernandez**, junior **Mackenzie Cyr** and freshman **Jenna Mosketti** added three goals each.

PENN STATE FALLS TO MARYLAND

- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** scored a team-high four goals, but Penn State fell to top-ranked Maryland, 20-10, in College Park March 9.
- The Terrapins opened the game on a 5-0 run. Penn State made it a five-goal game with 23:50 left in the second, but Maryland finished the contest on a 7-2 run.

LECHNER EARNS PAIR OF HONORS

- After an eight-point weekend (5g, 3a) against Duquesne and then-No. 6/8 Virginia, sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** was named the WomensLax.com Player of the Week and ALC Offensive Player of the Week.
- Lechner matched her career high with four points in both games. She also tied a personal best with three goals against Duquesne.

LIONS OUTLAST VIRGINIA

- After trailing by an 8-5 halftime margin, the Nittany Lions netted 10 second-half markers as it edged No. 6/8 Virginia, 15-14, at Klöckner Stadium March 3.
- Sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner**

recorded a career-high four points (2g, 2a) for the second straight game, while junior **Mackenzie Cyr**, who added an assist, notched her third three-goal game of the season.

PENN STATE DOMINATES DUQUESNE

- Ten Nittany Lions scored in a 16-9 victory against Duquesne Feb. 27.
- Sophomore attack **Maggie McCormick** paced the team with six points (1g, 5a), while junior **Mackenzie Cyr** and sophomore **Kelly Lechner**, who matched her career high, scored three goals each.
- Junior **Evan Foulsham** recorded a career-high five draw controls.

LIONS FALL TO LOYOLA

- The Nittany Lions fell to No. 6/10 Loyola, 13-11, at Ridley Athletic Complex Feb. 23.

LIONS OPEN 2013 WITH WIN

- The Nittany Lions defeated Bucknell by a 16-goal margin for the second straight season with an 18-2 victory Feb. 20.
- Ten different Nittany Lions recorded at least one point, while goalkeeper **Emi Smith** garnered the victory in her collegiate debut.

STELLAR DEBUTS
