MEN'S GYMNASTICS READY FOR NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Penn State men's gymnastics team is in search of its nation-leading 13th National Championship Friday, April 21-Saturday, April 22 at Army West Point. The Nittany Lions will compete in session I with the first event slated for 1 p.m. The top three teams of session I and session II will qualify for the team event finals on Saturday, April 22 starting at 7 p.m. at the Holleder Center.

SESSION I COMPETITION

Penn State will be in the first session Friday, April 21 and will compete to earn a top-three spot for the team finals on Saturday, April 22. The Nittany Lions will go up against No. 2 Stanford, No. 3 Ohio State, No. 7 Nebraska, No. 9 Michigan and No. 11 Air Force to compete for a spot in the team finals.

ROTATION ORDER

The Blue and White will start on the parallel bars before moving to the high bar and finishing the third rotation on the floor exercise. Penn State will compete on the pommel horse in rotation four, the still rings in the fifth rotation and close out the meet on the vault.

POSTSEASON IN WEST POINT

The Nittany Lions have competed for a championship on the campus of Army West Point six times, dating back to the 1940 Intercollegiates. Penn State finished eighth in its most recent trip to West Point, New York for the 2010 NCAA Championships and garnered back-to-back fourth-place finishes in 2005 and 2006 at Army West Point. Prior to the 2005 campaign, the Blue and White competed in two regional finals at Army with third-place finishes in the 1994 and 1997 regional. Finally, Penn State finished eight in the 1980 NCAA Championships and 10th in the 1950 championships.

FAMILIAR TERRITORY

Penn State has competed at West Point on multiple occasions throughout the years with its seniors competing at the Holledar Center all four years of their collegiate t Place careers. The Nittany Lions have won the annual West Point Open 18 times, including the past four years while sweeping the individual event titles in the 2016 campaign. Overall, Penn State has seen 83 individual event champions inside Holledar Center and will be looking for its first National Championship inside the historic facility.

ROBERSON NOMINATED FOR ELITE 90 AWARD

Redshirt-sophomore **Noah Roberson** is one of the 2017 men's gymnastics Elite 90 nominees after exhibiting hard work on the mat and in the classroom. The ELITE 90, an award founded by the NCAA, recognizes the true essence of the student-athlete by honoring the individual who has reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level in his or her sport, while also achieving the highest academic standard among his or her peers. The Elite 90 is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average participating at the finals site for each of the NCAA's 90 championships.

Roberson has a 4.0 cumulative grade point average as a double major in biomedical and mechanical engineering. The Williamsville, N.Y. native has competed six times for Penn State in his redshirt-sophomore campaign on both the floor exercise and the still rings.

ZAKUTNEY EARNS B1G FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR HONORS

After earning Big Ten Conference Freshman of the Week honors four time in the regular season, freshman **Sam Zakutney** garnered Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors as announced at the Big Ten Individual Event Finals. Zakutney is the first Nittany Lion to earn the honor since **Trevor Howard** captured it in the 2013 campaign. Furthermore, the Ottawa, Ontario native is one of just four Nittany Lions to earn the award as Felix Aronovich earned it in 2010 and Mike Dutka captured the honor in 1997. In his first year donning the Blue and White, Zakutney captured nine titles and saw 21 podium finishes. Zakutney earned titles in four separate events, including: floor exercise, parallel bars, high bar and the all-around. For his efforts in his freshman season, he earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors on four occasions Zakutney competed in the all-around eight times in his first season as a Nittany Lions, while earning the victory twice.

TYNDALL NOTCHES SECOND TEAM ALL-BIG TEN HONORS

Sophomore **Wyatt Tyndall** was named Second Team All-Big Ten as well as garnering the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award after competing in two individual event finals at the Big Ten Championships. Tyndall notched a podium finish in his first Big Ten Championship Individual Event Finals on the floor exercise Saturday, April 8 at Illinois. Overall, Penn State had six gymnasts compete in the individual event finals with Tyndall competing in a team-best two events. Tyndall earned a podium finish on the floor exercise, placing third overall with a 14.425 in the event. The Saskatoon, Saskatchewan native rounded out the championships with an appearance on the parallel bars.

NITTANY LIONS FINISH FOURTH AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Penn State men's gymnastics team placed fourth at the 2017 Big Ten Championships, scoring a 411.200 Friday, April 7 at the State Farm Center. Ohio State captured its second-straight Big Ten title scoring a 418.600 behind a first-place allaround finish from Sean Melton, while Illinois placed second overall with a 416.400. The Golden Gophers of Minnesota rounded out the top three with a 413.300 and Penn State came in fourth overall with its 411.200. Nebraska, Iowa and Michigan closed out the Big Ten Championships with 410.000, 402.150 and 401.250, respectively.

12 NITTANY LIONS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN

Penn State student-athletes continue to add onto their academic achievements with the announcement of the 2016-17 Winter Academic All-Big Ten honorees. The Nittany Lions tallied 76 honorees, the second-highest winter total in school history, just shy of last winter's record total of 79. The Nittany Lions ranked third among all Big Ten institutions in 2016-17 winter Academic All-Big Ten honorees. The men's gymnastics team had 12 Academic All-Big Ten recipients, including junior Noah Roberson, who owns a 4.0 GPA in biomedical engineering. Led by Coach Randy Jepson, the Nittany Lions were second in the Conference in honorees. Also earning Academic All-Big Ten honors for the Blue and White were Joseph Boyle, Michael Burns, Franz Card, Colin Coates, Benjamin Cooperman, Dominic DiFulvio, Christian McSwain, Jeremy Munn, Chris Sands, Alex Thomason and Wyatt Tyndall.

PENN STATE CLOSES OUT REGULAR SEASON WITH WIN OVER IOWA

The Penn State men's gymnastics team became one-of-seven teams in the 2017 season to notch a 420.000-or-better as it took home a 420.400-414.000 victory over lowa in a Big Ten Conference meet. The Nittany Lion's 420.400 ranks fifth in the nation in the 2017 season and is a season-high for the Blue and White in its senior day competition. Head coach Randy Jepson and the rest of the Penn State squad honored its six seniors, Joseph Boyle, Franz Card, Leroy Clarke, Jr., Dominic DiFulvio, Christian McSwain and Jeremy Munn following its win over lowa. The Blue and White saw two season-best with a 72.350 on the pommel horse and a 70.950 on the parallel bars, while the team saw six individual personal-bests and four individual season-bests. Penn State brought home four event titles with DiFulvio earning the still rings and vault victories in his final event at the Rec Hall, while freshman Stephen Nedoroscik grabbed the third pommel horse title of his career and Clarke tied with Nedoroscik for the title. Finally, Wyatt Tyndall garnered the parallel bars title for the Blue and White.

CLARKE HAS PREMEIRE WEEK IN ALL FOUR EVENTS

Penn State gymnastics senior **Leroy Clarke, Jr.** has been named the College Gymnastics Association (CGA) Gymnast of the Week. The honor marks the first of Clarke's career and the first time a Penn State gymnast has earned the award since Trevor Howard captured the honor January 14, 2016. This past weekend, Clarke picked up two individual event titles with a win on the pommel horse and a win on the high bar against Michigan. The senior competed in four events on the day, earning a podium finish in each. Clarke placed second on the still rings and nabbed a third-place finish on the parallel bars in the Nittany Lions victory. For his efforts, Clarke was also named Big Ten Gymnast of the Week for the first time in his career donning the Blue and White. Heading into the final week of the regular season, Clarke ranks seventh on the pommel horse (14.000) and ties for ninth on the parallel bars (13.727). In his final season donning the Blue and White, Clarke has earned seven individual event titles and has stood on the podium a total of 20 times in the 2017 campaign.

ZAKUTNEY BRINGS HOME FOURTH FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

Freshman **Sam Zakutney** earned his fourth freshman of the week honor of the 2017 season after bringing home three titles against Michigan. Zakutney notched three first-place finishes for Penn State against Michigan with his first floor title, his fifth parallel bars title and his third all-around title. Zakutney also secured a podium finish on the high bar, placing third overall for the Blue and White.

NITTANY LIONS TAKE ONE FROM MICHIGAN

Penn State men's gymnastics saw one season-best as it closed out the meet with a 68.250 on the parallel bars and had five individual event wins with senior **Leroy** Clarke, Jr. and freshman Sam Zakutney each earned two event titles and senior **Dominic DiFulvio** earned the still rings title. Zakutney also picked up the all-around win as the lone competitor.

STEPPING IT UP ON FLOOR AND VAULT

The Blue and White saw two season-high scores in its tri-meet at Nebraska with Iowa, notching a 70.650 on the floor exercise and a 71.900 on the vault, while two Nittany Lions took home individual event titles. Senior **Dominic DiFulvio** tallied his fifth still rings title of the season and redshirt-senior Leroy Clarke, Jr. earned his first parallel bars victory of the year.

PENN STATE BESTED IN TRI-MEET WITH NEBRASKA AND IOWA

The Penn State men's gymnastics team fell to both Iowa and Nebraska in a Big Ten Conference tri-meet hosted by the Cornhuskers Saturday, March 4. Nebraska picked up the victory with a 418.350, while Iowa came in second with a 413.500 and the Nittany Lions scored a 409.600.

The Blue and White saw two season-high scores, notching a 70.650 on the floor exercise and a 71.900 on the vault, while two Nittany Lions took home individual event titles. Senior **Dominic DiFulvio** tallied his fifth still rings title of the season and redshirt-senior Leroy Clarke, Jr. earned his first parallel bars victory of the vear.

Senior Christian McSwain and freshman Sam Zakutney earned matching 14.600s on the floor exercise to take over as the top individual performers in the event this season, while DiFulvio's 14.900 bests his previous team-high score of 14.750 on the still rings. Furthermore, the Blue and White saw four career-bests and five season-best performances in the tri-meet.

FRESHMAN DOMINATION

The Nittany Lion freshmen have dominated competition in their first season of collegiate competition, earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors eight times. Favian Valdez and Sam Zakutney lead the pack with four B1G honors each. Stephen **Nedoroscik** has also found his place on the pommel horse, winning the event twice and holding a team-high 14.800 this season. Finally, Isaac Hammett has earned two second-place finishes on the still rings and Brayden Borromeo has earned one second-place finish on the vault.

ZAKUTNEY NOTCHES THIRD BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

For the seventh-straight week a Penn State men's gymnastics freshman notched Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors as **Sam Zakutney** garnered the award for the third time in the 2017 season as announced by the conference office Monday, Feb. 27. Zakutney earned his second parallel bars and high bar title of his young career for the Blue and White at Navy. The freshman scored a 14.200 on the parallel bars and a 13.950 on the high bar. Furthermore, Zakutney earned a podium finish on the floor with a 14.050 in the event.

NITTANY LIONS VICTORIOUS AT NAVY

After a week away from team competition and the first week of a five up, five count format, the Penn State men's gymnastics team came away victorious at Navy winning the dual 409.400-399.250 Saturday, Feb. 25. The Nittany Lions earned five event titles on the afternoon with freshman Sam Zakutney earning the win on both the high bar and parallel bars and Dominic DiFulvio sharing the win with sophomore Christopher Sands on the still rings and taking the vault title outright. Finally, redshirt-senior Leroy Clarke, Jr. garnered his second pommel horse title of the season, scoring a 14.200.

WINTER CUP HIGHLIGHTS

The Nittany Lions had a strong showing at the Winter Cup, getting all four of their competitors into the event finals along with former gymnast and current volunteer assistant coach **Trevor Howard**.

Sophomore **Michael Burns** had two top 20 finishes in the finals, tying for 14th on both the parallel bars and the high bar, scoring a 13.000 and a 12.950, respectively. In his second career appearance at the Winter Cup, redshirt-senior **Leroy Clarke, Jr.** placed seventh on the pommel horse, scoring a 14.450 representing the Nittany Lions. Senior **Dominic DiFulvio** had the best showing on the floor for the Blue and White, placing 22nd overall, while also earning a top 20 finish on the still rings with a 13.650. Freshman **Favian Valdez** placed 19th overall in the all-around in his first collegiate appearance at the Winter Cup. The freshman all-arounder notched a 19th place finish on the pommel horse, scoring a 13.300, while tying for 17th overall on the parallel bars with a 13.200.

VALDEZ GARNERS FOURTH BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

For the sixth-straight week a Penn State men's gymnastics freshman notched Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors as Favian Valdez (Kearny, N.J.) garnered the award for the fourth time in the 2017 season as announced by the conference office Monday, Feb. 20.

Valdez placed 19th overall in the all-around in his first collegiate appearance at the Winter Cup. The freshman all-arounder notched a 19th place finish on the pommel horse, scoring a 13.300, while tying for 17th overall on the parallel bars with a 13.200. In the prelims, Valdez earned a top 30 finish on the pommel horse and the parallel bars, scoring a 12.750 and a 12.950 respectively.

MGYM WINS BEST DANCE AT 2017 THON PEP RALLY

In an event that raises money for pediatric cancer, the Penn State men's gymnastics team took home the top spot in the student-athlete pep rally. The Nittany Lions dance on Saturday night was part of a student-run philanthropy committed to enhancing the lives of children and families impacted by childhood cancer. ZAKUTNEY TAKES SECOND B1G HONOR

The Penn State men's gymnastics team continues to prove that it has recruited the top freshman in the country as **Sam Zakutney** earned his second Big Ten Freshman of the Week honor as announced by the conference office Monday, Feb. 13. The award marks the fifth-straight week that a Nittany Lion has earned the nod as fellow freshman **Favian Valdez** has earned the honor three times and Zakutney has garnered it twice.

Zakutney was the lone event winner for the Blue and White against Ohio State, earning the victory in both the parallel bars and the all-around. The Ottawa, Ontario native notched a career-high 13.800 on the floor exercise for a sixth-place finish before coming in eighth on the vault with a 13.900. The freshman all-arounder capped off the day with three podium finishes which included a 14.750 score and a victory on the parallel bars, while finishing second on the high bar with a 14.300. Finally, Zakutney earned a career-high 83.150 on the all-around to win his second title of the 2017 season.

PENN STATE HAS STRONG SHOWING AGAINST OHIO STATE

Penn State men's gymnastics team suffered its second-straight Big Ten Conference loss as it fell to the Buckeyes of Ohio State University, 419.150-417.750, Saturday, Feb. 11 at Rec Hall. Despite the loss, the Blue and White posted a season-best 417.750 and notched two season-high scores. The Nittany Lions first posted a season-high 71.300 on the pommel horse and capped off the day with a season-best 68.000 on the high bar. Freshman **Sam Zakutney** notched two titles for Penn State with his second parallel bars win of the season and his second allaround victory.

VALDEZ CAPTURES THIRD FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

For the fourth-straight week a Penn State men's gymnastics freshman notched Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors as **Favian Valdez** garnered the award for the third time in the 2017 season as announced by the conference office Monday, Feb. 6. Valdez picked up his first collegiate all-around title against Illinois, earning an 80.950. The title marks the third title of Valdez's career in four collegiate meets. The Kearny, N.J. native also had two other podium finishes placing third on the pommel horse with a 13.850 and third on the parallel bars with a 14.100.

PENN STATE FALLS AT ILLINOIS

The Penn State men's gymnastics suffered its first loss of the 2017 campaign in its first Big Ten Conference meet against the Fighting Illini of Illinois Friday, Feb. 3 at Huff Hall. The Nittany Lions saw bright spots in freshman Stephen Nedoroscik, who won his second-straight pommel horse title with a 14.300, while freshman **Favian Valdez** notched the all-around title for the first time in his career with an 80.950. Nedoroscik's win marks the fourth-straight match in which Penn State has come away with the pommel horse title as it has yet to be defeated in the event in the 2017 campaign.

ZAKUTNEY NABS BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HON-ORS

Freshman Sam Zakutney earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors, marking the first of his career and the thirdstraight week a Nittany Lion has garnered the award as Favian Valdez won it the first two weeks of the season. Zakutney found his groove at Springfield recording three victories for the Blue and White. Zakutney earned his first titles of his collegiate career, grabbing three wins at Springfield College. The freshman all-arounder started with a fourth-place finish on the pommel horse with a career-high 13.800 and notched his second career-high of the day with a 13.500 on the floor exercise and a fourth-place finish. The Ottawa, Ontario native secured his first podium finish with a third-place spot on the vault with a career-best 14.250 before sweeping the final two rotations of the day with a first-place finish on the parallel bars and a win on the high bar. Finally, Zakutney secured his first all-around title donning the Blue and White with an 82.650. Overall, Zakutney set five career-highs and earned three titles for the Nittany Lions at Springfield.

NITTANY LIONS SWEEP TITLES AT SPRINGFIELD

Penn State swept all six events for the first time in the 2017 campaign with senior **Dominic DiFulvio** and freshman **Sam** Zakutney earning three titles each for the Blue and White. DiFulvio picked up his first floor exercise win of the season, his third still rings title and his second vault title of his senior campaign, while Zakutney notched his first collegiate titles with wins on the parallel bars, high bar and all-around. Returning to his home state for the first time in his young collegiate career, freshman **Stephen Nedoroscik** collected his first victory for Penn State, securing the win on the pommel horse.

VALDEZ EARNS SECOND-STRAIGHT BIG TEN HONOR

Freshman Favian Valdez notched his second-straight Big Ten Freshman of the Week honor as announced by the conference office for the week ending Jan. 22.

The freshman earns the honor for the second time in his career after garnering it following his first collegiate appearance at the West Point Open. The Kearny, N.J. native picked up three top-five finishes in his second collegiate outing for the Blue and White against Army, Jan. 21.

Valdez earned his second title of the 2017 season with a 14.050 on the pommel horse for a victory against Army West Point in Penn State's first home meet. Valdez also placed fourth overall on the vault with a 14.050 and placed third in the all-around.

PENN STATE EARNS VICTORY OVER ARMY

The Penn State men's gymnastics team picked up a 414.200-396.050 victory over Army West Point in its home-opener against Army West Point. All-arounder and senior captain Dominic DiFulvio notched his first allaround title of the 2017 campaign with an 82.600, while Favian Valdez placed third overall in the all-around with a 79.800. Penn State saw three season-best team scores. and one tie as it put up a season-high 69.650 on the floor exercise, a 68.950 on the still rings and a 70.150 on the vault, while tying a season-best 67.300 on the high bar.

The Blue and White won five out of six events with Wyatt Tyndall taking the floor exercise, Valdez earning the pommel horse title, DiFulvio notching the still rings win and tying on the vault and Franz Card taking home the parallel bars title.

BLUE AND WHITE CLINCHES FOURTH-STRAIGHT WEST POINT OPEN TITLE

The Penn State men's gymnastics team captured its fourthstraight title at the 26th Annual West Point Open Friday, Jan. 13. The Nittany Lions scored a 412.350 in their first meet of the season to win the open for the 19th time in program history.

Big Ten Conference foe Nebraska placed second overall with a 410.600 and Army rounded out the top three with a 393.500. The Blue and White used a strong parallel bars routine in its sixth rotation of the day to propel itself to the victory in West Point.

Freshman **Favian Valdez** picked up his first victory donning the Blue and White, notching a 14.500 on the floor exercise, while **Christian McSwain** placed second with a 14.400.

The Nittany Lions saw their second individual event title of the evening when **Colin Coates** nabbed the pommel horse win for the second-straight year with a 14.700. Last season, Coates helped Penn State to the individual event title sweep, winning the pommel horse with a 15.050 in the event. Redshirt-senior **Leroy Clarke, Jr.** placed second on the pommel horse after finishing first in the team event Friday night, while Valdez placed fourth overall.

Penn State grabbed its third-straight individual event when senior **Dominic DiFulvio** came up big on the still rings with a 14.750 and **Benjamin Cooperman** placed second overall with a 14.250.

Sophomore **Michael Burns** capped off the four individual event titles for the Blue and White as he picked up his second-straight high bar title with a 14.650 at the West Point Open, winning the event in the 2016 season as well.

VALDEZ EARNS BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS

After capturing the floor exercise title at the West Point Open, freshman **Favian Valdez** notched Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors as announced by the conference office for the week ending Jan. 15.

The honor marks the first of Valdez's career as he made his first collegiate appearance at the West Point Open.

Valdez notched three second-place finishes in the team portion of the West Point Open, grabbing a 14.300 on the floor exercise, a 14.250 on the pommel horse and an 82.400 in the all-around. The Kearny, N.J. native capped off the individual event finals with a floor exercise title nabbing a 14.500 and a fourth-place finish on the pommel horse.

BURNS HAS CAREER WEEKEND AT WEST POINT

Sophomore **Michael Burns** posted four career-bests while also earning the high bar title in the individual event finals and the high bar and all-around title in the team event at the West Point Open, Jan. 13-14. Burns first earned the high bar title in the team portion with a 14.200 before posting a season-high 14.650 in the individual event finals to earn the title for the second-straight season. Burns also tallied a career-high 14.150 in the floor exercise, a 13.800 on the pommel horse, a 14.300 on the still rings and an 82.700 in the all-around.

NITTANY LIONS PICKED FOURTH IN BIG TEN PRESEASON POLL

Penn State was picked fourth in the 2017 Big Ten Men's Gymnastics Preseason Coaches' Poll, as announced by the conference office Thursday, Dec. 15. Along with the preseason coaches' poll, seniors **Leroy Clarke, Jr.** and **Dominic DiFulvio** were named to the Gymnast to Watch List for the upcoming season.

For the third-straight season Ohio State grabbed the top spot in the Big Ten Poll, while Minnesota was picked to finish second and Illinois rounded out the top three places. With the Nittany Lions coming in at fourth, Nebraska, Iowa and Michigan complete the Big Ten Preseason Coaches' Poll for the 2017 campaign.

PENN STATE COMES IN SIXTH IN THE CGA PRESEASON COACHES' POLL

The Penn State men's gymnastics team enters the 2017 campaign ranked sixth in the College Gymnastics Association (CGA) Preseason Coaches' Poll as announced Tuesday, Nov. 22.

Oklahoma was picked to finish first in the nation for the third-straight season with 17 first-place votes, while Stanford was picked to finish second with one first-place vote and Ohio State was projected to round out the top three with one first-place vote. Minnesota and Illinois ranked fourth and fifth, respectively with Penn State coming in as the No. 6 team to start the 2017 season.

NITTANY LIONS SET TO APPEAR ON BTN THREE TIMES

The Penn State men's gymnastics team will have two home meets featured on the Big Ten Network, while the network will also air the 2017 Big Ten Championships. The Nittany Lions and the Wolverines of Michigan will square off at 4:30 p.m. Saturday, Mar. 18 on BTN before the Blue and White closes out its season against Iowa Saturday, Mar. 25 at 3 p.m. on the Big Ten Network.

The 2017 Men's Big Ten Championships will be hosted by Illinois in Champaign, Ill. Friday, Apr. 7 and Saturday, Apr. 8. The team championship will be handed out on Friday, while individual event winners will be crowned Apr. 8. Both sessions will be aired live on BTN starting at 7 p.m.

JEPSON KICKS OFF 26TH SEASON AT THE HELM OF MEN'S **GYMNASTICS**

The 2017 campaign marks the 26th season for Head Coach **Randy Jepson** as the program leader of the Nittany Lions. Jepson came to Penn State in 1982 as a senior gymnast, earning All-America honors on the rings and being a Nissen-Emery Award nominee. From there, he went on to be the graduate assistant for two seasons before becoming an assistant coach from 1985-1991. In 1992, Jepson served as the acting head coach and was promoted to head coach in 1993 and since has led the Nittany Lions to three national championships and three Big Ten titles.

Jepson has been the National Coach of the Year on three occasions (2000, 2004 and 2007) and garnered the prestigious CGA Honor Coach Award in 2011, which is given to the coaches who have 25 years of service or more to the sport of gymnastics. Additionally, Jepson is a two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year honoree and has coached 43 All-Americans on 100 occasions, 30 First Team All-Big Ten selection and 11 NCAA Individual Event Champions.

CLARKE RETURNS FOR FINAL SEASON AFTER ALL-AMERI-CAN FINISH IN 2016

The 2017 men's gymnastics team sees the return of senior Leroy Clarke, Jr., who is the lone All-American returner for the Blue and White. Clarke capped off the 2016 season with an All-American finish on the still rings, placing eighth overall. The redshirt-senior from Maplewood, N.J. will be in search of his third All-American title in the his final season with Penn State as he earned the honor on the parallel bars in the 2015 season.

JEPSON WELCOMES FIVE FOR 2017

Head Coach Randy Jepson will welcome five freshman in the 2017 campaign. The five newcomers include: Brayden Borromeo, Isaac Hammett, Stephen Nedoroscik, Favian Valdez and Sam Zakutney. Nedoroscik, Valdez and Zakutney have been tabbed as three of the top pommel horses performers in the country in their respective classes, while Borromeo and Hammett will hope to make an impact on a variety of events in their freshman campaigns.

SEVEN NITTANY LIONS COLLECT CGA ALL-AMERICA **SCHOLAR-ATHLETE HONORS**

Seven Penn State men's gymnasts earned College Gymnastics Association (CGA) Academic All-America Scholar-Athlete honors, while the 2016 team ranked in the top 10 with a 3.123 team grade point average in the 2015-16 academic year. Five Nittany Lions earned first team All-America Scholar-Athlete honors with sophomore Noah Roberson leading the way with a 4.0 grade point average. Also earning first team honors for the Blue and White were Michael Burns, Wyatt Tyndall and Chris Sands.

Along with the four first team honorees, three Nittany Lions notched second team honors with Franz Card, Benjamin Cooperman and Dominic DiFulvio all earning grade point averages between 3.399-3.30.

As a team, Penn State ranked 10th nationally with a 3.123 grade point average, while William and Mary paced the nation with a 3.512 team GPA and Stanford came in second with a 3.427 team grade point average.

Since the inception of the award in 1991, the Nittany Lions have received 65 first team All-America Scholar-Athlete honors and 43 second team All-American Scholar-Athlete honors. Penn State's 65 first team honors ranks 13th all-time, while its 43 second team honors are tied for third all-time.
