RETURNING FOR 2012-13: Penn State returns 70 percent of its scoring, 60 percent of its rebounding and 78 percent of its assists for head coach Patrick Chambers' second season at the helm. Leading the way will be first-team All-Big Ten guard Tim Frazier, a preseason All-Big Ten selection and the conference's only returning first-team selection from last year. The senior leads four returners that started at least 16 games last year. Frazier had a spectacular campaign in 2011-12 leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4). He led the nation accounting for 58 percent of the Lions offense (scoring and assists) and was still able to set Penn State's season assist record logging 198. Junior guard Jermaine Marshall also had the best year of his career finishing second on the team in scoring (10.8) and leading the team with 43 threes (1.4 per game) while posting four 20-point games. Sophomore forward Jon Graham (3.9 ppg, 3.7 rpg) started 17 games last year and surged in late February, averaging 9.7 ppg and 6.3 rpg over a three-game Big Ten stretch. Sophomore forward Ross Travis (4.4, 4.2) started 16 games last year and saw a similar late season surge posting 7.2 points and 5.2 rebounds per game over the final five contests. Travis finished second to Frazier (4.7 rpg) on the team in rebounding. Also seeing significant playing time last year were junior forward Sasa Borovnjak and senior guard Nick Colella. Borovnjak (4.3, 3.1) played in 32 games while starting seven and led the team shooting 56.6 percent from the floor. Colella (2.7, 1.3), a former walk-on, played in 26 games and started six while seeing significant action in Big Ten play, making 16 threes in those games, and earning a scholarship. Also returning are 6-11 sophomore forward Pat Ackerman, who saw limited action in 12 games last year, and walk-ons Kevin Montminy, a sophomore, and Alan Wisniewski, a junior.

NEW ADDITIONS: Heading up the new additions to the Lions' roster will be Southern Mississippi transfer D.J. Newbill who sat out last season after posting 9.2 ppg and 6.2 rpg as a freshman for the Golden Eagles in 2010-11. The 6-4 guard started 32 games at Southern Miss and posted six double-doubles to earn Conference USA All-Freshman Team honors and is expected to team with Tim Frazier to form one of the strongest backcourts in the Big Ten. Three scholarship freshmen will join the Penn State roster. Strengthening the backcourt will be 6-3 guard Akosa Maduegbunam who posted 18 ppg and 6 rpg at The Winchendon School in Boston last year. Prior to that he posted 22.3 ppg and 8.0 rpg at Charlestown High School leading team to a Boston City League championship. The frontcourt will benefit from two additions. Brandon Taylor (6-8) was a 1,000-point scorer at Trenton Catholic in New Jersey and was named the Times of Trenton Player of the Year after averaging 15.9 ppg and 9.5 rpg in leading the Iron Mikes to the NJSIAA South Jersey Non-Public B championship game for the second straight year. Donovon Jack (6-9) was a three-time first-team Pennsylvania Class AAA selection from Berks Catholic in Reading, Pa. The two-time Berks Player of the Year finished his career with 1,725 points and averaged 17.0 ppg, 10.1 rpg and 2.5 bpg as he led Berks to the PIAA District III Class AAA title.

OUTLET PASSES

- TIM FRAZIER was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team by conference media voters. He was joined on the team by Ohio State's Aaron Craft and Deshaun Thomas, Michigan's Trey Burke and Indiana's Cody Zeller who was selected the preseason Big Ten Player of the Year. Frazier was named a first-team All-Big Ten selection last year, the sixth Lion to earn first-team selection, after leading the Big Ten in assists (6.2) and finishing second in scoring (18.8) and steals (2.4).
- TIM FRAZIER stands 7th on the Penn State career assist charts (444) after posting a Penn State record 198 last year and will enter the season157 assists shy of breaking the all-time career record of 600 set by Freddie Barnes in 1992.
- TIM FRAZIER scored 208 field goals and had 198 assists to lead the nation being involved in 58.4% of Penn State's field goals last year. Only two other players in Division I were involved in 50% or more of their teams scoring on the sea-
- TIM FRAZIER was the ONLY player in NCAA Division I to post at least 17 points and 6 rebounds a game last year.
- TIM FRAZIER brings a string of 22-straight double-figure scoring games into the 2012-13 season.
- TIM FRAZIER raised his scoring average by 12.5 ppg from 2010-11 to 2011-12 (6.3 -18.8), the most in the Big Ten on the season and second-most in the Big Ten since 1996-97
- TIM FRAZIER went 77-83 (92.7%) at the foul line in his final 16 games of 2011-12. Frazier ranked 3rd (87.4%) in the conference at the line in Big Ten games.
- TIM FRAZIER led Penn State in scoring in 25 games last year, including 15 of 19 games vs. Big Ten opponents, and had 17 20-point games (5th among Big Six Conference players). He scored 20 or more points in 7 of the last 10 games.
- JERMAINE MARSHALL scored a career-high 27 points on a career-best four threes vs. Michigan in the Lions' last regular season game last year. He posted 20 double-digit scoring games on the year and led the the team with 43 threes (28 in Big Ten) and had 13 double-digit scoring games in Big Ten play to average 11.8 ppg in the Big Ten.
- JERMAINE MARSHALL greatly improved his defense last year and finished second on the team with 32 steals and 16 blocks. Marshall's 27.1 minutes per game and 10.8 ppg were second only to Tim Frazier last year.
- D.J. NEWBILL trimmed his weight from 225 to 205 in the off-season following his red-shirt campaign after transferring from Southern Mississippi. Newbill missed nearly two months of practice early last season after injuring his left shoulder in practice. He returned to full practice in January and excelled, becoming a team-leader despite not playing.
- ROSS TRAVIS scored a career-high 15 points vs. Michigan in the Lions' final regular season game of 2011-12 and had a career-best 9 rebounds to go with 10 points vs. Northwestern on Feb. 25. He posted 7.2 ppg, 5.2 rpg while shooting 63% in the final five games of 2011-12. He led the Lions in rebounding eight times last year, five in Big Ten play.
- ROSS TRAVIS shot just 4-of-24 (.167) from three last year, but worked hard on his shot during the off-season improving his arch and touch and has shown an effective perimeter jumper in the preseason.
- JON GRAHAM posted three-straight games with a career-high totals in points (10 vs. lowa & Northwestern) or rebounds (10 at Wisconsin) at the end of last February and averaged 9.7 ppg and 6.3 rpg over those outlings.
- JON GRAHAM trimmed his weight from 240 to 225 pounds for his sophomore season and added four inches to his vertical. He still maintains a team-best 24 reps on the 185-pound bench press, four better than the 2012 NBA combine best. Graham missed five games in November and December last year with illness before coming on late in the year.
- SASA BOROVNJAK has shown much greater mobility and explosiveness in his second season after returning from a season-ending ACL tear prior to the 2010-11 campaign. He cut his weight from 242 pounds to 230 for the 2012-13 campaign.
- SASA BOROVNJAK led Penn State shooting 56.5 percent from the floor in 32 games last year. He is one of four Penn State players that can bench press more than 300 pounds.

- Former walk-on **NICK COLELLA** was granted a scholarship for his senior campaign. He was placed on scholarship for the second semester of last season and started six-straight games in the Big Ten and played more than 24 minutes in five of those. He posted his second double-digit scoring game in Big Ten play at lowa (11 pts) and averaged 20.8 mpg in Big Ten play, including a career-best 37 at MSU (2/8), while making 16 threes.
- NICK COLELLA added six inches to his vertical leap in the off-season and tied the Penn State best with a pro-lane agility time of 10.0. He is one of four Lions that can bench press more than 300 pounds.
- Freshman AKOSA MADUEGBUNAM recorded a teambest 35 inch vertical and has impressed the coaching staff with his strength and athleticism.
- Freshman **BRANDON TAYLOR** arrived on campus weighing more than 260 pounds, but sculpted his body in the summer and trimmed his weight by 30 pounds entering the pre-season.
- Freshman **DONOVON JACK** was a three-time Pennsylvania All-State selection, twice earning first-team honors, as well as a standout volleyball player. The left-hander brings tremendous athleticism and a highly developed basketball skill set to the Nittany Lions. His high school teams never won less than 23 games and three times topped 27 wins.

OUTLET PASSES

TEAM

- Penn State returns 70 percent of its scoring and 60 percent of its rebounding from last season as well as four starters that logged 16 or more starts last year and six players that averaged 16 minutes or more of action in Big Ten play.
- Penn State went 4-7 in 11 games decided by seven points or less last year. The Lions had just one home loss come by more than six points while dropping four Big Ten home contests by six points or less, including games with No. 12 Indiana (88-82) and No. 13 Michigan (71-65).
- Penn State defeated No. 22 Illinois (54-52) last year for coach Patrick Chambers' first coaching victory over a Top 25 team (in his eighth ever meeting). Chambers became the third PSU coach to defeat a Top 25 team in his first season.
- Penn State knocked off Purdue by 20 points (65-45), the Lions' most lopsided Big Ten win in six seasons, in coach Patrick Chambers' first-ever Big Ten home game.
- Penn State won the rebounding battle in 19 games last year and ranked first in offensive rebounds in the Big Ten with 12.4 per game.
- Penn State fielded on of the nation's most inexperienced squads last year with eight of 10 primary contributors last season in their first or second season of Division I play. The Lions had 84 starts between three freshmen and three sophomores. The Lions entered the 2011-12 campaign looking to replace 80 percent of their scoring.
- Penn State had four major contributors miss significant action last season. All ranked in the top seven in scoring and three in the top seven of rebounding.
- Penn State started 14 different line-ups last season, nine in Big Ten play.
- Penn State won the scoring in the paint in 11 Big Ten games last year. Penn State won four of those games and lost by six points or less in four others.
- Penn State was out-scored at the arc by 132 points (7.3 ppg) in the Big Ten season and by 168 (5.2 ppg) on the year in 2011-12. The Lions shot 31 percent from three.
- Penn State scored 67.3 ppg and shot 42% at home (10-7) last year, while posting 55 ppg and shooting 35% in 15 games away from home (2-13). Penn State scored more than 60 points just twice (62 at B.C. and 64 at lowa) away from the BJC last season.
- Penn State ranked 325th in NCAA Division I in field goal percentage (39.3 percent) last year and shot a combined 37% from the floor and 27% from three in its 20 losses last year, while shooting 43% from the floor and 37% from three in 12 wins.

FRAZIER'S BIG SUMMER: Tim Frazier had a big summer playing against the nation's top collegiate players as he was invited to attend the Deron Williams Skills Academy in June in Chicago and the LeBron James Skills Academy in Las Vegas in July. Both events were conducted by Nike. One of just two Big Ten guards and 16 top collegiate guards overall invited to attend the Williams camp, Frazier was a standout while competing amongst guards such as Missouri's Phil Pressey, Arkansas' BJ Young, Murray State's Isaiah Canaan and Michigan's Trey Burke. He excelled at the camp to earn an invitation the James Academy which featured 25 top collegiate players (guards, wings and posts) that advance from the earlier Williams, Kevin Durant and Amare Stoudemire Skills Acadmies as well as 80 high school players.

D.J. EYES RETURN TO COMPETITION: Sophomore guard D.J. Newbill (6-4) has his eyes set on Nov. 9 as his first return to official collegiate competition in 20 months. Newbill sat out the 2011-12 season after transfering from Southern Mississippi In late August of 2011. He started all 32 games as freshman at Southern Miss, posting 9.2 ppg and 6.2 rpg to be named to the 2011 Conference USA All-Freshman Team. The 2010 Pennsylvania Class AA Player of the Year (24.2 ppg, 9.0 rpg, 5.0 apg) out of Philadelphia's Strawberry Mansion HS, he recorded six double-doubles and 15 double-digit scoring games at Southern Miss and led team in rebounding 11 times.

BIGGER, STRONGER, FASTER: Some highlights of Penn State's physical improvement under strength coach Brad Pantall:

TIM FRAZIER: Added 18 reps to his 185-pound bench press since arriving at Penn State and can now do 19, one shy of the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his max bench press by more than 115 pounds to over 300 pounds entering his final season...posted a pro-lane agility time (10.0) and 3/4 court sprint time (3.09) better than the NBA combine bests...has added 30 pounds of muscle since arriving at Penn State.

JON GRAHAM: Added four inches to his vertical leap... added 11 reps to his 185-pound bench press to now be able to perform a team high 24, far above the 2012 NBA Combine best of 20..increased his max bench press from 215 to 325.

ROSS TRAVIS: Added 20 pounds of muscle while also increasing his vertical leap by two inches and improving his 185-pound bench press by eight reps to 15.

NICK COLELLA: Added more than six inches to his vertical leap and improved his pro-lane agility time to 10.0, tying the Penn State team record and beating the 2012 NBA Combine best...improved his bench press by 75 pounds to over 300 pounds.

SASA BOROVNJAK: Cut his weight from 242 to 230 pounds and reduced his body fat by five percent...Improved his bench over 300 pounds while cutting one second off his pro-lane agility time.

Introduced as the 12th head coach in Nittany Lion basketball history on June 6, 2011, Patrick Chambers quickly energized the Penn State fan base with his passion and enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

Described as passionate, energetic, upbeat and dynamic by media in attendance, Chambers' first appearance as the leader of Penn State basketball was described as "less an introduction than a passionate call to arms."

Chambers wasted little time in spreading that message to his Nittany Lion team and the Penn State fan base far and wide. He traveled 10,500 miles in his first eight days on the job to personally visit with each returning and incoming player and their families (except sophomore Sasa Borovnjak in Serbia). He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur of the moment trips around the Penn State campus distributing t-shirts and his infectious energy. He has visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and thrown out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout prior to the Lion football team's 2011 clash with Alabama. He was seemingly everywhere in his first year on the job, most importantly the recruiting trail, and showed no signs of slowing down despite reconstructive knee surgery in the spring of 2012 that placed him on crutches for two months.

On the court, he seized the attention of his team with fast-paced, high-intensity practices and his positive, relentless and direct in-game coaching. He guided junior Tim Frazier to one of the best seasons in Lion history as the 6-1 guard earned first-team All-Big Ten honors after leading the conference in assists and finishing second in scoring and steals. Frazier developed into the team's unquestioned floor leader and set a Penn State season record in assists.

The youngest of 12 kids (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, the legendary Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It was also shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching was meteoric. He went from part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), to Director of Operations at Villanova, to assistant coach at Villanova, to Associate Head Coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team, to head coach at Boston University to taking over the helm of a Big Ten program at a dizzying pace reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

Chambers came to Penn State from Boston University where in 2010-11 he led the Terriers to the America East Conference Championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament berth since 2002. He posted a 42-28 record in two years in his first head coaching stint at BU. He was the only BU coach in history to earn 20 wins in each of his first two seasons and the fastest to earn a conference championship in program history.

The Terriers earned a 21-14 mark for the second straight year under Chambers in 2010-11. Led by 2011 America East Player of the Year and two-time scoring champion John Holland, BU fell after challenging No. 1 seed Kansas in the Terriers' first NCAA Tournament game since 2002. Chambers led BU to the semifinals of the College Basketball Invitational in 2009-10.

A native of Newtown Square, Pa., Chambers previously played for and coached with two of the nation's most successful college coaches. From 2004-09, he was a member of Wright's staff at Villanova University, serving as associate head coach in 2008-09. He helped the Wildcats earn four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and advance to the 2009 NCAA Final Four during his tenure. Chambers played for Magee at Philadelphia University (formerly Philadelphia Textile), helping Magee become college basketball's all-time victories leader (922) and a 2011 Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame inductee.

Chambers was a standout guard under Magee, known as The Shot Doctor, at Philadelphia U graduating from the University in 1994 with a degree in marketing and a minor in finance. He joined the NCAA Division II University's basketball team as a walk-on in 1990 and went on to have an outstanding career, becoming the team's starting point guard, earning first-team All-ECAC honors and leaving as the school record holder in assists with 709.

Three of Chambers' 11 siblings are Penn State graduates -- brothers Chris and Joe and a sister, Megan, who resides in State College. A nephew, Patrick Flanagan, is a sophomore on the Nittany Lion football team. Chambers and his wife, Courtney, have two daughters, Grace and Caitlin, and a son, Ryan.
