- The Kick Off
 The No. 5-ranked West Virginia University women's soccer team opens its 2016 season right where it closed its 2015 campaign, as the Mountaineers travel to University Park, Pennsylvania, for the Penn State Invitational, Aug. 19-21, at Penn State's Jeffrey Field.
- The Mountaineers will meet No. 2-ranked and defending National Champion Penn State on Friday, Aug. 19, at 7:30 p.m., before taking on Buffalo on Sunday at noon.
- WVU is 9-8-3 in season openers. Friday marks the fourth straight season the Mountaineers have opened the season away from Morgantown, and the team is 1-1-1 in that span.
- Nikki Izzo-Brown enters her 22nd season as a head coach, 21st at WVU, needing one victory to reach career win No. 300. Her career coaching record stands at 299-106-44.
- Eighteen letterwinners return from a 2015 season which saw the Mountaineers advance to the NCAA Elite Eight, win their fourth straight Big 12 Conference regular-season title and set program season records for wins (19), shutouts (15) and goals (61).

A Look at the Nittany Lions

- Friday's season opener pits the Mountaineers against the opponent who knocked them out of the 2015 NCAA Tournament, as the Nittany Lions earned a 2-0 victory on Nov. 28, at Jeffrey Field, en route to their first NCAA Championship
- WVU is 6-7-1 all-time against PSU and went 1-1 in 2015, defeating PSU, 1-0, on Sept. 4, in Morgantown before the season-ending loss.
- The Nittany Lions are the reigning Big Ten champions. PSU closed the season posting eight straight shutouts.
- PSU's roster features 12 upperclassmen, with all but one a junior.

A Look at Buffalo

- WVU is 1-0 all-time against the Bulls, earning a 1-0 overtime victory last season on Sept. 18, in Morgantown. The Mountaineers' took the victory in the 97th minute off an own goal.
- Eighteen letterwinners return for UB, including 13 who played in at least 15 matches in 2015.

Challenging Slate: Year after year, coach Nikki Izzo-Brown challenges the Mountaineers with one of the nation's hardest schedules, and 2016 is no different, as the team will meet seven squads that qualified for the 2015 NCAA Tournament, including matches against reigning National Champion Penn State and runner-up Duke on their home fields.

In total, WVU, coming off an NCAA Elite Eight season in 2015, will face three teams from the Big Ten Conference and two from the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC), including Clemson, the ACC's third-place team last year and a No. 2 seed in the 2015 NCAA Tournament, in its home opener on Aug. 26 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

WVU opens the year at Penn State on Friday, Aug. 19; the Mountaineers dropped a 2-0 decision at PSU in the 2015 NCAA Tournament Elite Eight on Nov. 28. Additional nonconference road-match highlights include a showdown at Duke on Sept. 9 and a match at Richmond on Sept. 23.

WVU competes in Morgantown 10 times in 2016. Following their home opener against the Tigers, the Mountaineers will compete against 2015 NCAA Tournament qualifiers Ohio State on Sept. 4, Princeton on Sept. 16 and Georgetown on Sept. 18.

WVU opens the defense of its four straight Big 12 Conference regular-season titles at home against Baylor on Sept. 30. The Mountaineers also will face Oklahoma, Texas Tech, the defending Big 12 Conference Tournament champions, and Oklahoma State in Morgantown this season. WVU will travel on two conference road swings this season, playing at Kansas State and Iowa State Oct. 7-9, and TCU and Texas Oct. 21-23.

The 2016 Big 12 Soccer Championship begins with quarterfinal play on Nov. 2, with the semifinals and the final following on Nov. 4 and Nov. 6. For the fourth straight year, all matches will be played at Swope Soccer Village in Kansas City, Missouri.

The first round of the 2016 NCAA Tournament will begin on Nov. 11-13, with all matches held on campus sites. The 2016 Women's College Cup will be held Dec. 2-4, at WakeMed Soccer Park, in Cary, North Carolina.

Catch Us When You Can: Four of the Mountaineers' regular-season contests will be broadcast for national audiances: at Penn State on Aug. 19 (Big Ten Network), home against Oklahoma on Oct. 2 and Texas Tech on Oct. 14 (ESPNU), and at Texas on Oct. 23 (FOX Sports Network). The scheduled television games are the most for WVU since the squad was featured in seven televised matches in 2009.

Picked to Win Again: The Mountaineers were unanimously picked No. 1 by the league coaches in 2016 Big 12 Conference Soccer Preseason Poll. It marked the fourth straight season the conference coaches selected WVU to win the Big 12 crown; the team was not chosen in 2012, its first season in the league. WVU is the only current conference team to be tabbed No. 1 four straight seasons and the first squad since Texas A&M (2004-07) to earn a conference-best four straight preseason No. 1 rankings.

The Best of the Big 12: A conference-best four Mountaineers were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Soccer Team: unanimous selections Kadeisha Buchanan, Ashley Lawrence and Michaela Abam, and Carla Portillo.

We Are the Champions! (x4): With a 2-1 overtime victory at Oklahoma State on Oct. 23, the Mountaineers clinched the 2015 Big 12 Conference regular-season title, their fourth straight. The Mountaineers have won the title each season since joining the Big 12 in 2012, and WVU is the only program to win four straight outright championships; Texas A&M won four straight titles from 2004-07, but its first was not an outright win. Also the 2015 Big 12 preseason favorite, WVU's accomplishment marked the ninth time in Big 12 history the preseason favorite in the coaches poll also won the title. The Mountaineers own a 27-1-3 all-time record in Big 12 play are are unbeaten at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

Dating back to its days in the Big East Conference, WVU has won five straight conference regular-season crowns and nine since its first title in 2002. WVU has won nine regular season and championship conference titles in six seasons and 14 since 2002.

Big Benchmark Awaits: Entering her 21st season as the only WVU women's soccer head coach, Nikki Izzo-Brown is just one victory short of career win No. 300. Her 21-year coaching record stands at 299-106-44 (.715). Before founding the WVU women's soccer program in 1995, she spent one season at West Virginia Wesleyan in 1994.

Izzo-Brown has posted a winning record in all 20 seasons with the Mountaineers and has led WVU to 10 wins or more each year but 1999. WVU earned a program-record 19 victories in 2015.

The Next 250: In just 20 seasons, the WVU women's soccer team has earned 286 program wins, an average of 14 victories per season; the team needs 14 wins to earn program victory No. 300. The Mountaineers scored program win No. 250 with their 1-0 victory over Baylor at the 2013 Big 12 Soccer Championship semifinal on Nov. 8, in Kansas City, Missouri. WVU earned its 275th program victory with a 1-0 overtime win against Buffalo on Sept. 18, 2015, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

Hermann Hopefuls Again: For the second straight season, defender Kadeisha Buchanan and midfielder Ashley Lawrence, both seniors, were named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List. College soccer's version of the Heisman Trophy, the award represents the highest level of individual achievement in the sport.

This year's recognition is the third straight for Buchanan and the second straight for Lawrence. It is the fourth time since 2007 WVU has had two student-athletes land on the first list of the season. Nine different Mountaineers have been named to the initial Watch List 14 times since 2003. WVU also had had six semifinalists, including Buchanan and Lawrence. Buchanan was the program's first finalist in 2015 and is the only finalist to return to the list this year.

Mountaineers on the Game's Biggest Stage: For the second straight summer, seniors Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence gained experience with Canada's National Team on the world's biggest stage, as the duo earned the start in each of the nation's games at the 2016 Rio Summer Olympics.

The first WVU women's soccer players named to an Olympic roster, Buchanan and Lawrence are still competing in Rio, as Canada competes against host Brazil for the Bronze medal on Friday, Aug. 19, at noon FT

Also the first WVU women's soccer players named to a World Cup roster, they started all five of Canada's matches at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup. Buchanan was named the Best Young Player, landed on the FIFA Women's World Cup Canada 2015 All-Star Squad and was featured on a Canadian commemorative stamp. Lawrence scored Canada's lone goal in a 1-1 draw against Netherland in Group A play; the score helped advance Canada to the knockout stage for only the second time in six tries.

Defense Back for More: Following a record-breaking 2015 season, the WVU women's soccer defense returns partially intact but fully committed to the same objective – denying opponent goals.

Back to anchor the Mountaineer defense for the fourth straight season is three-time NSCAA All-America and three-time reigning Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, senior center back Kadeisha Buchanan. Under her leadership, the WVU backline has allowed just 50 opponent goals since 2013, including a program-low 11 in 2015, the same season the unit also posted a school-record 15 shutouts.

Also returning this season is sophomore Bianca St. Georges, the reigning Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, as well as senior Carly Black and Easther Mayi Kith. Black started 52 straight career matches prior to suffering a season-ending injury in 2015. Mayi Kith replaced her in the lineup and started the remaining 15 matches.

The Mountaineers will be forced to replace goalkeeper Hannah Steadman and outside back Maggie Bedillion in the lineup. Junior Michelle Newhouse should step in between the posts. The Pinch, West Virginia, native has seen time in eight matches since 2014 and shows two career saves.

No Shots for You: The Mountaineers denied Longwood a shot in a 4-0 win on Sept. 13, 2015, marking the second time in as many seasons and the fifth time in program history that WVU denied an opponent a shot. The team also denied four opponents a shot on-goal last year.

Goals Galore: The Mountaineers return 59 percent of the record-setting 61 goals scored in 2015. At the top of the list is junior forward Michaela Abam. An All-Big 12 First Team honoree last season, she paced the team and ranked No. 2 in the conference with 12 goals, a career-high total. She also ranked No. 2 on the team, No. 3 in the Big 12, with 27 points (12 G, 3 A). Among her many highlights was a WVU record four-goal performance in the team's 8-0 victory over Villanova on Sept. 6. The eight points also were a team single-game record.

Senior midfielder Ashley Lawrence will again factor into the Mountaineers' offensive success. An NSCAA All-America First Team honoree one year ago, she ranked No. 3 on the team in 2015 with 18 points (5 G, 8 A). The eight helpers were a team and career high, and she ranked No. 2 in the Big 12 with a 0.36 per game average. Lawrence's career assist total stands at 19, one short of breaking onto the all-time program list.

Sophomore forward Sh'Nia Gordon should once again factor into the team's scoring production. The All-Big 12 Freshman Team honoree started all 23 matches in 2015 and finished tied for fourth on the team with 13 points (5 G, 3 A). Also returning is junior midfielder Carla Portillo, who started 21 matches and finished with 10 points (3 G, 4 A).

Expected to factor more into the Mountaineers' offensive plans this season are top returning reserves from 2015, junior forwards Amandine Pierre-Louis and Heather Kaleiohi. Pierre-Louis finished 2015 with 12 points (4 G, 4 A), while Kaleiohi contributed six points (2 G, 2 A).

Nice to Meet You: WVU's 2016 regular-season schedule features just one first-time opponent in Clemson. The Mountaineers will face the Tigers in their home season opener at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium on Friday, Aug. 26, at 7 p.m.

The Mountaineers went 6-0 against first-time opponents in 2015. In the program's 20-year history (moving into the 2016 season), WVU has faced 106 different teams.

Power of Pink: Raising awareness for breast cancer research is a cause close to coach Nikki Izzo-Brown, and each year, she and the Mountaineers raise funds for Morgantown's Betty Puskar Breast Care Center. In 2015, WVU donated a check for \$8,647 at halftime of the WVU-TCU contest on Oct. 2.




