PENN STATE vs. UCLA

Penn State last faced UCLA last season on Jan. 6 in Columbus, Ohio at the Pac-12/Big Ten Challenge, falling to the Bruins 3-0 in St. John Arena. Penn State trails the all-time series 6-30-1 dating back to 1982.

The No. 2 Bruins, undefeated at 5-0, are led by Christian Hessenauer who leads UCLA with 42 kills through five matches. Dylan Missry (39) and Jake Arnitz (38) are close behind in second and third, respectively. Micah Ma'a leads the team with 176 assists while JT Hatch is the team leader in digs with 31.

The Bruins have downed NJIT, King, McKendree and UC-San Diego all by way of the sweep, with the lone exception being a five setter against No. 5 UC-Irvine.

PENN STATE vs. USC

The Nittany Lions last faced the Trojans during opening weekend last season at the Pac-12/Big Ten Challenge in Columbus, Ohio. Penn State downed USC for its first win of the season in a five set thriller at St. John Arena. No. 13 USC is led by Jack Wyett who has recorded 61 kills through five matches. Gert Lisha has posted 128 assists while Matt Douglas has the team lead in digs with 33.

USC has posted wins over Princeton, Juniata and Stevens, while falling to No. 5 Hawai'l and UC-Irvine in straight sets.

BRASWELL NAMED EIVA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt Sophomore Luke Braswell was named the EIVA Offensive Player of the Week as announced by the conference Monday night.

Braswell averaged 9.86 assists per set in a 2-0 week for No. 9 Penn State. Braswell recorded 39 assists in a 3-1 victory at Rec Hall against Mount Olive, and then followed with a 30-assist performance in a sweep of Alderson Broaddus. He helped the Nittany Lions hit .522 overall as a team during last week while also recording four kills. This is the first EIVA Offensive Player of the Week selection for Braswell in 2018.

LAST TIME VS. UCLA

COLUMBUS, OH - No. 13 Penn State (0-1) fell to No. 2 UCLA (2-0) in straight sets (18-25, 22-25, 17-25) Friday evening at St. John Arena on the campus of the defending national champions Ohio State.

In the first ever NCAA men's volleyball game streamed on Facebook LIVE (courtesy of OffTheBlock and Vinnie Lopes), the Nittany Lions struggled to find an offensive rhythm hitting .128 as a team and recording 31 kills on the night.

"I thought that there were stretches of pretty good volleyball, I just don't think we're ready to put it together yet for 25 points," said head coach Mark Pavlik.

"These guys have been in the gym and know the level of play that is expected and sooner or later we're going to get to that point '

Chris Nugent led the Penn State offensive attack collecting 10 kills - tied for a match high - while chipping in three digs

Redshirt-Freshman Luke Braswell made his Penn State debut posting a match high 27 assist for the Blue & White earning a kill of his own against the Bruins.

Penn State started slow in set one being down by as much as 5-1 to UCLA before roaring back to tie the game at 10-all off a Luke Braswell kill.

The Nittany Lions would again knot things up at 13-13 on a UCLA service error, but this would prove to be the last time the Nittany Lions could match the Bruins point for point in the set as UCLA capped the set on a 12-5 run to take the opening set 25-18.

Set two would see the Lions come out firing as Penn State scored the opening point of the set and controlled the scoreboard until UCLA tied things up at 13 apiece, this time on a Penn State service error.

Both teams would stand at a tie four more times (14-14. 16-16, 18-18, 20-20) before UCLA went on a small 5-2 run to extend the lead to two sets to none.

Set three saw Penn State trail by as much as six (10-4) before roaring back to within three midway through the set. UCLA closed out the set on an 11-7 run hitting .357 for the set while Penn State recorded a hitting percentage of .069 committing

COLUMBUS, OH – In a re-match of the 2017 Rose Bowl (even featuring a high scoring opening set) No. 13 Penn State men's volleyball (1-1) outlasted Southern California (0-2) in a five-set thriller (30-32, 25-14, 21-25, 25-23, 15-11) Saturday afternoon at St. John Arena on the campus of Ohio State University.

"It was a grittiness that I think we've been looking for over the past 16-months or so," said head coach Mark Pavlik.

"We had an easy win in set two and everything was going our way, game three, you know the Trojans are going to come back and they socked us in the nose. Game four was where I really wanted to see how we would react, and I thought 'freshman setter, freshman opposite lets see what happens'. I think Luke (Braswell) is finding the shape of the set that Cal (Mende) wants," Pavlik continued.

"(Mende's) future is so bright, and I think if we can keep him in good situations where his confidence keeps soaring then when we need him in bad ball situations then he's going to feel good about himself."

"Honestly we just took it point by point," said Calvin Mende. "We definitely passed well, we had a lot of options on our swings, by this point in the game (fifth-set) we'd keyed in on their hitters pretty well, they still put us in some tough situations but over all I think we handled it pretty well."

"We did really well," said Luke Braswell. "one of our seniors Matt Callaway said 'we have to find our identity' and I think we did that. We played well and battled back during game four and finished them off in game five."

Penn State used a balanced offensive attack to take down the Trojans as three different Nittany Lions had at least ten kills, with two topping 20 as Redshirt-Freshman Calvin Mende led the Lions with a career high 25 kills in only his second game in the Blue & White. Mende also chipped in five blocks and four digs while hitting .525 on the night.

2016 AVCA Honorable Mention All-American Chris Nugent finished second on the team with 22t kills on .395 hitting, while also tallying three assist, two digs and two blocks.

Redshirt-Freshman Luke Braswell dished out a career high 62 assists while finishing with nine digs, three blocks and three kills against USC.

Aidan Albrecht added 13 kills, five blocks and three digs.

Defensively, libero Royce Clemens finished first on the team with 14 digs while the Nittany Lions posted a season-high 14 blocks.

Tied 2-2 entering the fifth-set, Penn State took no time speeding out to a 6-2 lead over the Trojans to force the first timeout of the set by USC. Following the Trojan timeout, USC embarked on their own run of 4-3 to force a Penn State timeout with the Lions holding a 9-6 lead. USC carried that momentum out of the break closing the gap to one as Penn State head coach Mark Pavilk called timeout with the Nittany Lions needing only five points to win holding a 10-9 lead. A Nugent kill, Mende kill and a USC attack error made it 13-10 forcing a final timout by USC before Penn State closed out the game on a 2-1 run capped by a kill from the 2016 EIVA Co-Player of the year Chris Nugent.
