**BUCKNELL (16-1-2, 8-1-0 PL) VS. PENN STATE (11-4-4, 7-1-3 BIG TEN)
 NOV. 11, 2016 | UNIVERSITY PARK, PA. | JEFFREY FIELD**

The Bucknell women's soccer team travels to Penn State for an NCAA Tournament first-round game on Friday night. While the Nittany Lions earned an at-large bid into the 64-team field, the Bison captured the Patriot League's automatic bid after a dramatic 2-1 overtime win over three-time defending champion Boston University in the PL final last Sunday. Bucknell will be making its third NCAA appearance in women's soccer and its first since 2005. The previous NCAA berths came in 2001 and 2005. The Bison are 0-2 all-time in NCAA games.

HOW THE BISON GOT HERE

- Bucknell is making its third NCAA Tournament appearance, and were on a mission this year after losing in the Patriot League Championship game in 2015. The Bison won the regular title for the fifth time in program history, posting a league record on 8-1-0 to earn the No. 1 seed.
- In the Patriot League Tournament, Bucknell earned the right to host, while receiving a quarterfinal bye. The Bison advanced to their second straight championship game after defeating sixth-seeded Lafayette in the semifinals. Bucknell scored two goals in the first half, which held up for the 2-0 win. In the final against No. 2 seed and three-time defending champion Boston University, Bucknell took a 1-0 lead in the second half but the Terriers quickly answered, scoring 30 seconds later, but **Cora Climo's** golden goal gave them a 2-1 win.
- This week Bucknell is receiving 11 votes in the NSCAA national coaches' poll, and the Bison are ranked first in the NSCAA Mid-Atlantic Region poll.

MORE FROM THE PATRIOT LEAGUE FINAL

- **Maddie Mulford** scored the game's first goal in the 51st minute, scoring her 10th goal of the season.
- **Alexis Gannon** and **Meghan Holtz** assisted on the game's first goal. It was Gannon's seventh assist of the year and the first point of the season for Holtz.
- **Jackie Ham** assisted on the game-winning score, her fifth helper of the year.
- **Cora Climo** was named Patriot League Tournament MVP. Climo was joined by **Kelsey Witt** and **Jessica Ratner** on the Patriot League All-Tournament Team.

ABOUT PENN STATE

- The Nittany Lions are 11-4-4 and finished 7-1-3 in the Big Ten Conference, earning a share of the Big Ten regular season title. They earned the No. 2 seed for the Big Ten Tournament, but were knocked off by Rutgers 2-0 in the quarterfinals.
- Penn State is ranked 25th by *Top Drawer Soccer* and received votes in the latest NSCAA Coaches' Poll.
- Offensively, the Nittany Lions are led by All-Big Ten First Team selection Frannie Crouse, who leads the team and the conference in goals (12), while her 25 points are a team-best and rank third in the Big Ten.
- Amanda Dennis, an All-Big Ten Freshman Team selection, has started every game in net for the Nittany Lions this season, making 48 saves while recording a .762 save percentage and posting seven solo shutouts.
- Penn State returns to the NCAA Tournament for the 22nd consecutive season and is the reigning national champions.

BISON TOP LEOPARDS IN SEMIFINALS

- **Gabi Rosenfeld** had not scored a goal as a Bison since transferring from Stony Brook. Rosenfeld picked the right time to find the back of the net, giving the Bison insurance in their 2-0 win in the semifinals.
- For the second straight season, **Alexis Gannon** has scored a goal in a Patriot League semifinal contest. She gave the Bison a 1-0 in the 27th minute, posting her fourth goal of the year.
- The Bison outshot the Leopards 23-8 in the win, forcing the Lafayette goalkeepers, Danielle Sedillo and Kelly O'Brien, to combine for nine saves. Ratner finished with two stops for the Bison.

HAM MOVES INTO BUCKNELL TOP-10S

- Forward **Kendall Ham** leads the team and the Patriot League in points (35) and goals (15). Ham has accumulated 66 points and 29 goals in her career, both of which rank in the top 10 in program history at Bucknell.

RATNER'S DOMINANCE IN NET

Bucknell goalkeeper **Jessica Ratner** has been dominant in net since becoming a full-time starter in 2015:

- Ratner has helped the Bison set single-season program records for shutouts (11), consecutive shutouts (6) and consecutive scoreless minutes (655:03).
- This season, Ratner has posted 10 shutouts, and became the program's shutout leader earlier in the year in the team's 2-0 win at Wright State.
- Ratner was named Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year, becoming the first Bucknell player to earn the citation.
- In addition to being the program's all-time shutouts leaders, she has recorded 30 career victories, sitting in a four-way tie for most in program history.

AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

Bucknell's play throughout the year has led to the Bison holding some of the top numbers in the nation:

- Offensively, the Bison rank fourth in scoring offense (2.68), fourth in points per game (7.84), fifth in total goals (51) and seventh in total points (149).
- **Kendall Ham's** 15 goals rank 13th in the nation.
- Bucknell ranks 11th in scoring defense (0.6).

HEAD COACH KELLY COOK

Bison head coach **Kelly Cook** is in her second season at Bucknell. Cook is currently 27-7-5 during her tenure, earning Patriot League Coach of the Year honors in her first two years (2015-2016). Cook is no stranger to the Patriot League, as she was a two-year captain and three-time Second Team All-Patriot League selection at Colgate, where she recorded 27 goals

and 23 assists in her career. She ranked in the top 10 in program history in career points (77) and assists. As a junior in 2004, Cook was named Patriot League Tournament MVP after leading the Raiders to the league title, and then her team knocked off Arizona in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, marking the first NCAA win in school and league history.

COACHING STABILITY

Bucknell has had only four head coaches since the team's arrival in 1990. Toby Lovecchio had the reins from 1990-96, followed by Chrissy Findlay from 1997-2004. Ben Landis is the longest-tenured, coaching from 2005-14.

POSTSEASON HONORS

- Bucknell placed a league-high eight players to All-Patriot League Teams, while claiming three major awards.
- **Kendall Ham** earned her second straight first team all-league citation, and was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year. Ham became the fourth player in program history and the first since Christa Matlack in 2010. Lisa Gibbons earned the award in 1993, followed by back-to-back recipients Jennifer Dervarcis (2007-2008) and Matlack (2009-2010).
- **Jessica Ratner** was named Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year, becoming the first player in school history to do so.
- Joining Ham and Ratner on the First Team All-Patriot League squad are **Maddie Mulford** and **Karli Cirovski**, each earning their first all-league honor. **Alexis Gannon** earned second team all-league accolades, along with **Meghan Holtz** and **Jackie Ham**, who both earned all-league citations a season ago, while Ali Russo earned a spot on the third team.

BOOKS FIRST

- Bucknell continues to excel on and off the field, as **Kendall Ham**, **Jackie Ham** and **Alexis Gannon** were selected to the CoSIDA All-District 2 Team, while earning Academic All-Patriot League Team accolades. The trio is currently on the ballot for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, which will be announced on Nov. 22.
- **Kendall Ham** was named Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year, becoming the fourth Bucknell player to earn the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year citation and the first since Shannon Curd in 2006. Christina Baselga won the honor in 1990, followed by Joanne Crane in 1994.
- **Kendall Ham** carries a 3.84 GPA in Biology and is a two-year Patriot League Academic Honor Roll member.
- **Jackie Ham** carries a 3.93 GPA in accounting and financial management.
- **Gannon** carries a 3.76 GPA in neuroscience. The tri-captain has worked at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia in the Center for Childhood Cancer Research, where she worked with doctors who focus on neuroblastoma, a tumor that primarily affects children. She has also shadowed at Gillette Children's Hospital, Lakeview Clinic and Southlake Pediatrics in Minnesota.

JUNIOR CLASS PRODUCTION

Kelly Cook has received tremendous production from her junior class over the last two-plus seasons:

- **Kendall Ham** has become one of the Patriot League's premier strikers. She has 29 goals and eight assists in her career. Last year, she earned First Team All-Patriot League and a NSCAA All-Region honors after scoring nine goals. She was named Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, living up to the citation and earning PL Offensive Player of the Year accolades at the end of the season, scoring 15 goals. Her 15 goals and 35 points are third most in a single-season in program history.
- **Maddie Mulford** been a great 1-2 combo with Ham in 2016. Her 28 points and 10 goals are second-most behind Ham, while her eight assists lead the Patriot League. Mulford has recorded a point in 14 of 17 games started this season, earning First Team All-Patriot League honors.
- **Karli Cirovski**, a First Team All-Patriot League selection, along with Second Team All-Patriot League honoree **Jackie Ham** have been important to Bucknell's defensive success over the last few seasons. Last season, they helped the Bison back line set program records in shutouts (11), consecutive shutouts (6) and consecutive scoreless minutes (655:03). This season, the Bison have allowed the fewest goals in the Patriot League and have posted double-digit shutouts for the second straight season and for the second time in school history.
- **Meghan Holtz**, a Preseason All-Patriot League and Second Team All-Patriot League selection, has been a fixture in the Bucknell midfield. She has started in 17 games, playing the full distance nine times. The tri-captain leads the Bison midfield in minutes (1,400).

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT

- Bucknell will return five of its top-seven scorers in 2017, two of which are underclassmen.
- Four of Bucknell's starters this season are juniors, including **Kendall Ham**, **Jackie Ham**, **Maddie Mulford** and **Karli Cirovski**.
- **Kendall Ham** paces the team and the Patriot League offensively in points (35) and goals (15), while Mulford ranks second in both categories, respectively, recording 28 points on 10 goals and a league-best eight assists.
- Cirovski has posted two goals and five assists, while **Jackie Ham** has recorded four helpers.
- Freshman **Bailey Hurst** has recorded five goals this season, ranked third on the roster.
- Freshman **Gabby Bair** has scored four goals this year, while classmate **Ali Russo** has started in every game, earning Third Team All-Patriot League honors.

SISTER-SISTER

- Bison juniors **Kendall Ham** and **Jackie Ham** are identical twin sisters:
- This season, both sisters earned All-PL accolades, along with CoSIDA All-District Team and Academic All-Patriot League honors.
 - Both Kendall and Jackie have started in all 19 games this season.
 - The Ham sisters have recorded goals in the same game twice in their careers. The first time came in 2014 in a 2-0 win at Monmouth and the second time came this season in a 2-0 victory over Holy Cross.

RECORDS ARE MEANT TO BE BROKEN

- Bucknell's play throughout the year has led to several program records:
- Bucknell held an unbeaten streak of 14 games during the season, shattering last year's mark of nine.
 - The Bison set a program record for wins in a season (16). The previous mark was 12, which was reached in 1994, 2001 and 2006.
 - Bucknell posted a road record of 9-0-1, becoming the first team in program history to finish the year unbeaten on the road.

BUCKNELL PATRIOT LEAGUE

TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- Bucknell is 8-14-3 in the Patriot League Tournament, which dates back to 1990. Those three "ties" were all decided in penalty kicks, and Bucknell is 1-3 in PKs. It's lone win came in 2005 against Lehigh in the Patriot League Semifinals.
- Bucknell has won Patriot League titles in 2001, 2005 and 2016.
- The Bison have played in the title game five times. In addition to wins in 2001, 2005 and 2016, the Bison appeared in the championship game in 2007 and 2015.

BISON BRIEFS

- Kendall Ham leads the Patriot League in game-winning goals with five.
- Bucknell has been one of the most aggressive teams in the league this season, ranking second in shots (304), shots per game (16) and shots on goal per game (7.68).
- Karli Cirovski leads the team in minutes played with 1,719 (90.5 per game).
- Bucknell opponents are averaging 10.9 shots per game this season. Goalkeeper **Jessica Ratner** has been called to make 66 saves this year, fifth-most in the Patriot League.
- The Bison have taken 99 corners this season, second most in the Patriot League this season.
- You will rarely see Bucknell called offsides. The Bison have been

called offsides 23 times this season, fewest in the Patriot League.

ALL-TIME SERIES AGAINST PENN STATE

EMMITT FIELD AT HOLMES STADIUM

Bucknell plays its home soccer games at Emmitt Field, a natural-grass, soccer-only facility on campus.
