**KEY NOTES** 

- Robert Morris looks to retake the lead atop the College Hockey America (CHA) standings as it continues conference play. The Colonials are coming off a sweep at CHA rival RIT, their first series win since sweeping RIT Nov. 10-11.
   RMU is 14-4-4 all-time versus the Nittany Lions, going unbeaten in nine of 12 meetings at Colonials Arena since 2012. Previously they tied 3-3 and 2-2 Oct. 28-29 at Pegula Ice Arena in the first CHA series of the season for both.
   The Colonials split their last home series with PSU, including a 2-0 victory at the Island Sports Center Feb. 18, 2017. Amanda Pantaleo scored a
- RMU equaled its largest victory margin in the Colontino era Jan. 19. Maggie
   LaGue scored her 3rd career GWG Jan. 20, two of which have come at RIT.

game-winning shorthanded goal, the only RMU shorthanded goal last season.

- Saturday marks the second annual Teddy Bear Toss at Colonials Arena. On Jan. 13, 2017, fans threw 425 stuffed animals onto the ice for charity when eventual CHA scoring champion Brittany Howard scored RMU's first goal, and over \$1,600 was raised for cancer patients at UPMC Children's Hospital.
- Howard was named the NCAA's Third Star of the Week for registering a nation-best 7 assists and 4 power play points Jan. 19-20. Previously, she was named No. 1 NCAA Star for putting up six points in RMU's initial sweep of RIT.
- In addition, Howard got CHA Player of the Week for the 13th time in her career and 4th this year. On Jan. 19 she became the 5th player in RMU history with five assists in a game, matching her career single-game high in points.
- With 19 assists on the season, Howard now shares the CHA lead. She leads all active Colonials with 16 career points against the Nittany Lions (5 G, 11 A).
- Kirsten Welsh enjoyed her second career multiple-goal game at RIT Jan. 19.
   She earned CHA Player of the Week honors for her heroics at PSU Oct. 28-29, tying the opener with 1:37 left in regulation and the finale with 8:21 remaining.
- Elijah Milne-Price became the 6th goalie in RMU history to make 400 career saves. She made a career single-game high 32 stops at RIT Jan. 20, and she continues to lead the conference with her .725 winning percentage. Milne-Price was named CHA Goalie of the Week the last time she faced Penn State, making 22 of her 52 saves in the last two regulation periods of the series.
- Emily Curlett was named CHA Rookie of the Week for the second time this season. She finished with five points (2 G, 3 A) and five blocked shots at RIT.
- RMU received votes in the latest USCHO.com D-I Poll and the USA Today/ USA Hockey Magazine Women's Poll. The Colonials have received votes in 34 consecutive USA Today/USAHM polls, the longest streak in program history.

# AN "A" FOR EFFORT

• Jaycee Gebhard was named CHA Player of the Week for her game-winning goal at Brown Oct. 20 and six assists in the series. Gebhard leads the conference with an average of 0.86 apples per game, also ranking 11th in Division I. She figured in on all six RMU goals at Mankato Oct. 8 to match a school single-game record that had been untouched since Maria Olausson had six helpers versus Chatham Oct. 27, 2006. Gebhard, tied for eighth in career assists at RMU (43), is one of only three NCAA players to have recorded four or more assists in two or more games this season.

#### RESUME BUILDER

RMU sits No. 13 in the Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) and No.
 12 in the PairWise Rankings. Both rankings, taking strength of schedule into account, help determine NCAA Tournament seeding.

#### WORTH THE WAIT

- Robert Morris has gone 3-0-3 in overtime this season. Two OT winners belong to Brittany Howard, the first two of her career. The Colonials are unbeaten in their last 11 sudden-death appearances (4-0-7) dating back to 2016-17, and Howard's 16 lifetime GW's are the second-most in program history to Rebecca Vint's 18.
- Caitlyn Sadowy, in her first game since missing 2016-17 with upper-body injuries, opened the scoring in a 4-1 preseason win over Ryerson Sept. 23, and Lexi Templeman had the game-winner. On Nov. 3 Templeman set up Sadowy on an RMU power play for the latter's first official goal since '15-'16 and first-ever GWG.

# CHASING HISTORY

Brittany Howard, with 72 career goals, needs just two more to surpass Rebecca Vint '15 as RMU's all-time leader. They are the only two Colonials to ever top 70. Howard's 97 lifetime assists are the second-most of any active NCAA player entering Friday. She hurdled Vint as the all-time points leader in Colonials history Oct. 8, and her 169 career points are the second-most in the NCAA. She is tied for sixth in D-I with 18 goals, sharing the NCAA lead in shorthanded goals with three. She leads CHA in points (37), points per game (1.61), power play points (11), game-winning goals (4), plus/minus (+22) and shots on goal per game (5.57).
With her career-high 12th goal of the season at RIT Jan. 19, Amber Rennie needs just one more to catch Kelsey Thomas '12 for 7th all-time at RMU (32). On Jan. 20 Jaycee Gebhard became the 9th in team history to score 30 career goals. Kirsten Welsh tied Megan Picinic '08 for 6th with her 13th career PPG last Friday.

# 2 WOXE GIRLS

- Skate for the Cure is the second charity event to take place at the RMU Island Sports Center this season. During fall semester, Jessica Gazzola and Natalie Fraser, for their senior project for the student-athlete group Colonial Leadership Academy, raised \$588 in a gift basket auction for the Children's Institute of Pittsburgh.
- Jaycee Gebhard has 7 points (4 G, 3 A) in her last three games, including two PPGs at RIT Jan. 20 set up by Brittany Howard, one of which forced overtime with 1:52 to play in the third period.
- Howard is the first RMU student-athlete named Dapper Dan Charities Pittsburgh Sportswoman of the Year. In the 2017 calendar year, she put up 43 points (24 G, 19 A) en route to the program's single-season assist record (30), first-ever CHA points crown (50), first-ever CHA Player of the Year award, first-ever regular-season conference title and first NCAA Tournament berth.

# IN OUR DEFENSE...

- The Robert Morris defense has combined for 21 goals and 74 points, ranking third in the NCAA and making it the top-scoring defensive unit in CHA. The 50th point was a secondary assist by Leah Carey, while playing in her 100th career game, on the winning goal vs. Mercyhurst Dec. 2. Kirsten Welsh is seventh in the nation in points by defenders with 19 (9 G, 10 A), and she has the third-most in Division I by an underclassman at her position.
- Katherine Murphy matched her career best by blocking a
  game-high eight shots versus Mercyhurst Dec. 2, the most by any
  RMU player in a single game this season. The previous high was
  the seven blocked by Maggie LaGue at Penn State Oct. 29.
   On Dec. 8 at Calgada, LaGue became the first defender in Co.
- On Dec. 9 at Colgate, LaGue became the first defender in Colonials history to register 50 career assists. In addition, LaGue's
   +19 rating is on track for an RMU single-season defensive record.



# OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

 Amanda Pantaleo became the seventh different captain of the Paul Colontino era at Robert Morris Sept. 18. On Nov. 4 she scored a game-winning shorthanded goal at Lindenwood, her first shorty since Feb. 18, 2017--the only Colonial SHG of the 2016-17 season.

# APPLE FEST

• Kirsten Welsh chipped in four assists at Brown Oct. 20, a personal single-game high. That was her best effort since her three assists in a 3-3 tie with Mercyhurst Jan. 21, 2017. Dating back to last season, Robert Morris is unbeaten in 14 of the past 16 games in which Welsh has registered a point.

# "THE THIRD PERIOD IS OUR PERIOD!"

- For the 2017-18 squad this commonly-used phrase by Colonials Arena P.A. announcer Larry Snyder has rung particularly true. Robert Morris has outscored CHA foes 20-6 in 3rd periods, and its 35 third-period goals overall are the second most in the nation. Brittany Howard has an NCAA-best 19 of her CHA-best 37 points (10 G, 9 A) in the third period. Jaycee Gebhard (4 G, 6 A), Kirsten Welsh (3 G, 7 A) and Amber Rennie (5 G, 5 A) each have ten.
- RMU is unbeaten in 13 tries (11-0-2) when tied or ahead entering the third. Its six 3rd-period goals allowed in conference play are tied for 4th-fewest in the nation. The Colonials lead CHA with their +18 goal margin in third periods, which ranks fifth nationally. Elijah Milne-Price has a 1.34 goals-against average in third periods that ranks second in CHA and sixth among all NCAA goaltenders.

# A NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER

- Robert Morris began the month sweeping Lindenwood Nov. 3-4, concluding the longest and most successful road swing of the Paul Colontino era with a 7-1-2 record. It ended the month with an upset of then-No. 5 Ohio State, its first defeat of a ranked opponent since Jan. 18, 2014 and first on home ice since Nov. 9, 2013. OSU was the highest-ranked foe RMU had beaten since Dec. 8, 2012 (No. 4/5 Mercyhurst).
- Four of the top five scorers in CHA for the month were Colonials: Brittany Howard, Kirsten Welsh, Lexi Templeman and Amber Rennie. Jessica Gazzola shared the conference lead in assists (five) with Welsh, Rennie and Maggie LaGue. RMU led CHA and ranked ninth in Division I with 27 goals in November, and Howard ended the month on a five-game goal-scoring streak.
- Kirsten Welsh became the program's new career points champ among defenders Nov. 3. She led all CHA defenders with seven points in November. Emily Curlett had points in four straight outings Nov. 4-24 and shared second in CHA with a plus-8. Elijah Milne-Price won a CHA-best five of six November starts, including her 24-save performance against No. 5 Ohio State Nov. 25.

# ONGE MORE, WITH FEELING!

• With her overtime goal Nov. 25, Brittany Howard set a new RMU record with her 13th career multiple-goal game. The previous record for career multi-goal games was the 12 registered by Rebecca Vint 2011-15. Howard has five such games this season alone, while common linemates Amber Rennie and Jaycee Gebhard (two apiece) and defenders Emily Curlett and Kirsten Welsh are the only other Colonials with multi-goal games in 2017-18. Behind Howard's 13, Vint's 12 and Brianna Delaney's ten 2008-2012, Gebhard is next in line with seven career multi-goal outings, and Rennie has four, including her first career hat trick Oct. 8.

# DRAMA QUEENS

● Natalie Fraser scored her first goal since Feb. 11, 2017 with :02 left in regulation to complete a come-from-behind 3-2 victory and sweep of Brown Oct. 21. It was the first Colonials goal in the last minute of a period since Kirsten Welsh's power-play equalizer with :12 left in the second period Oct. 7 at Mankato. Jaycee Gebhard delivered their most recent last-minute goal, and first empty-netter of 2017-18, at Lindenwood Nov. 4 with :59 to play.

# PAYING THE PRICE

● Elijah Milne-Price made 20 saves for her second career shutout, a 6-0 decision at Lindenwood, Nov. 3. Her next will tie her with Courtney Vinet '15 and Daneca Butterfield '11 for fourth in RMU history. Her 1.91 GAA ranks fourth among D-I seniors, and her .921 save percentage is fifth. "E.J." won four straight starts after earning CHA Goalie of the Week/Month Oct. 30-31. She also earned Goalie of the Week for making 15 saves at Maine Oct. 13.

# NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- Emily Curlett opened her NCAA account with two goals, including a shorthanded marker, at Brown Oct. 20, and an assist on the game-winning goal. She claimed CHA Rookie of the Week after ending that series a plus-4 and blocking four shots. Curlett blocked a series-high eight vs. Syracuse Jan. 5-6. She leads all CHA defenders with 61 blocks, and her plus-18 rating this season is tops among all first-year players in the conference.
- Lexi Templeman, CHA Rookie of the Month for November, and Rookie of the Week Dec. 11, shares the CHA rookie scoring lead with Curlett, who has an identical 7 goals and 16 points, and Natalie Heising of PSU. Her first career PPG came at PSU Oct. 29.

# YOU CAN GO HOME AGAIN

- Rookie goalie Molly Singewald enjoyed the unique thrill of making her NCAA debut in her home state. The Farmington, Minn. native played the last 7:19 of RMU's 6-2 victory at Mankato Oct. 8 in relief of Lauren Bailey and made her first two collegiate saves.
- Pittsburgh native Anjelica Diffendal scored her first NCAA goal in her second-ever home game Nov. 11 vs. RIT after appearing in seven road contests. On Nov. 4 she had the honor of skating on a line with former Pittsburgh Penguins Elite teammate Morgan Schauer in the latter's RMU debut. Diffendal joins Chelsea Burdzy (2011-12) and current Pens Elite assistant coach Ashley Vesci (2012-16) as the third "Steel City" citizen to play for the program.

#### TAKE MY PUCK, PLEASE

Jaycee Gebhard was 14-for-16 on faceoffs vs. Syracuse Jan.
 6, the best single-game effort by a Colonial since Nov. 3-4, when Jessica Gazzola won 15 of 20, then Natalie Marcuzzi 5 of 5 at Lindenwood. Brittany Howard won an RMU season-high 24 draws vs. Ohio State Nov. 24. She went 13-6 in the dot Oct. 29 at PSU.

Since being hired in June of 2011, Paul Colontino has guided the Robert Morris women's program to new heights.

In 2016-17, Colontino helped the Colonials to their first regular-season conference championship, their second postseason CHA crown, their second 20-win campaign and first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. RMU finished at No. 8 in both major polls, the first end-of-season national rankings in program history. He was rewarded with a four-year contract extension Aug. 24.

The Colonials also gained national recognition in 2013-14, as Colontino guided them a school record 24 wins (24-8-3) and their first appearance in the national polls. Robert Morris reached as high as seventh in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Women's College Hockey poll and eighth in the United States College Hockey Online (USCHO) rankings. The Colonials also held an unbeaten streak of 14 games, from Nov. 9 to Jan. 24. On Jan. 18, Colontino gained the top spot on the program's career win leaderboard with his 53rd thanks to a 5-1 victory at No. 10 Quinnipiac.

In 2012-13. Colontino led the Colonials to a record of 15-15-3. and earned a trip to the CHA semifinals for the fourth straight year. The 15 wins included a two-game sweep of No. 4/5 Mercyhurst in December, and a triple-overtime CHA first round victory over Lindenwood. The latter set a new record for the longest game in program history, as the contest lasted 108 minutes before Corbin Delaney found the back of the net.

In Colontino's first season, he made an immediate impact on the Robert Morris program. He led the Colonials to the largest year-to-year win improvement in Division I women's hockey in 2011-12 before guiding the squad to a storybook ending as RMU captured the program's first-ever conference championship. His turnaround of the RMU program earned him USCHO (U.S. College Hockey Online) National Coach of the Year accolades.

Before coming to Robert Morris, Colontino had served as associate head coach at Mercyhurst since 2006. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach with the women's team at the University of North Dakota for four years. Colontino began his coaching career as an assistant with Mercyhurst in 2000.

As a player at Mercyhurst. Colontino was the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) co-Defensive Player of the Year as a senior and an All-MAAC First Team selection.

Colontino earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Mercyhurst in anthropology/ archaeology in 2000 and proceeded to earn a Master of Science degree from Mercyhurst in organizational leadership in 2002.


- Brittany Howard opened the 2017-18 season on a career-best streak of six games in a row with a goal scored:
