## WHAT'S AHEAD

For the second time this season, Akron will step away from Mid-American Conference action to square off against a squad from the Big Ten Conference as the Zips travel to University Park, Pa., to battle Penn State on Tuesday, Oct. 18. Game time is set for 7:04 p.m. with Chris Doran and Dan Kelly calling the action for the Big Ten Network.

## **SCOUTING PENN STATE**

Penn State (6-6-1) enters action this Tuesday, Oct. 18, having won two straight following the Nittany Lions' 1-0 double-overtime victory past Michigan State on Saturday, Oct. 15. Senior Connor Maloney has directed Penn State this season owning team-high marks in goals (4), assists (3), points (11), shots (40), shots on goal (17) and game-winners (2). Sophomore Dayonn Harris, senior Mason Kierks and junior Aymar Sique have also contributed three, two and two goals, respectively, for the Nittany Lions. The goalkeeping tandem of redshirt junior Evan Finney and freshman Arle Ammann have nearly split the minutes in net for Penn State this season as the duo has registered 26 and 23 saves, respectively, en route to combining for a 1.17 goals against average.

As a team, the Nittany Lions are ranked 73rd in the NCAA in save percentage (.761) and 74th in saves per contest (4.08).

## **IN OUR LAST MEETING**

No. 7 Akron def. Penn State, 1-0 (Sept. 30, 2015)

AKRON, Ohio - A successful 77th minute (76:18) penalty kick from Adam Najem (Clifton, N.J.) coupled with a clean sheet from goalkeeper Jake Fenlason lifted No. 7 Akron to a 1-0 men's soccer triumph past Penn State at First Energy Stadium - Cub Cadet Field.

The Zips dominated the pace of play in the affair as Akron registered a 24-6 advantage in shots, including 5-3 on goal.

The outcome of the game turned when the Nittany Lions were whistled for a pivotal handball call in the box at the 76:18 mark. The Zips rewarded their captain with the opportunity to take the penalty kick and Najem delivered finding the back of the net.

Richie Laryea recorded a game-high six shots for the Zips, while Sam Gainford (Liverpool, England) added five shots. Coming off the bench to start the second half and post three shots was **Stuart Holthusen** (Auckland, New Zealand).

Additionally, Najem, Victor Souto and **Goncalo Soares** (Lisbon, Portugal) each netted a pair of shots. Robby Sagel and Dani Marks directed Penn State's offensive efforts with two shots apiece.

Fenlason pulled in three saves for Akron, while his counterpart for Penn State, Matt Bersano matched Fenlason with three saves of his own.

## **AKRON VERSUS THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE**

- The Zips are meeting a team from the Big Ten Conference for the second time this season and 180th time overall.
- Akron owns a 98-65-16 (.592) all-time record versus the current 14 members of the Big Ten Conference.
- A year ago, the Zips went 4-0-1 against the conference and have gone 16-2-3 against the league since 2012.
- This season, Akron dropped a 2-1decision at Michigan State, Oct. 11.
- In all, Akron is 33-7-6 (.783) versus teams from the Big Ten since 2007. During that time, the Zips have out-scored the competition, 89-36.

## **THE COACHES**

**Penn State:** Bob Warming is in his seventh season as head coach of the Penn State program, owning a 66-42-14 (.598) record. He is 449-222-78 (.652) in 37 years overall as a head coach.

**Akron:** In his fourth year on the Akron sidelines as head coach, and 10th season overall, is **Jared Embick**, who has a 55-17-7 mark (.741), including 102-38-17 (.704) overall, in his seventh year as a head coach.

## **AKRON HEAD COACH JARED EMBICK**

**Jared Embick**, who had previously served as the Zips' associate head coach and recruiting coordinator, officially became the seventh head coach in the history of The University of Akron men's soccer program in December of 2012.

The 2016 campaign marks his fourth year leading the Zips having registered a 55-17-7 (.741)

ledger after posting an 18-3-3 record a season ago.

During Embick's time at Akron, the Zips have posted the highest winning percentage in the nation with an overall record of 165-30-23 (.810), including a 50-2-2 (.944) mark in Mid-American Conference play, while securing eight conference tournament titles, nine trips to the NCAA Tournament and two appearances in an NCAA final.

Recording their 15th consecutive double-digit victory campaign, the Zips finished the 2015 season ranked No. 3 nationally with an 18-3-3 ledger, including 4-0-1 mark in the Mid-American Conference. Akron's efforts were rewarded as the Zips earned the MAC's regular season and tournament crowns en route to collecting a No. 4 national seed and a berth in the NCAA Tournament for the 30th time in program history.

The Zips became one of just five Division I programs to qualify for the NCAA Tournament in each of the past nine seasons with their 30th overall selection.

Akron was led by the play of Adam Najem and Richie Laryea, who garnered second- and third-team National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-America accolades, respectively, en route to directing the Zips to rank second in the NCAA in points (159), goals (56), and scoring offense (2.33), third in points per game (6.63) and shots per contest (17.54), fourth in assists (47), seventh in winning percentage (.813) and 10th in shots on goal per game (7.13).

The Zip's also found success in the classroom as Akron boasted a team 3.1955 grade-point average, while Najem was tabbed a first-team NSCAA Academic All-American.

Led by Sam Gainford, Stuart Holthusen, Laryea, Najem, Brad Ruhaak and Andrew Souders, who were selected as first-team All-MAC men's soccer selections, eight Akron student-athletes garnered All-MAC accolades a year ago. Additionally, Jake Fenlason and Sean Sepe were recognized as second-team selections.

The Zips came into the campaign maintaining a No. 25 preseason ranking by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) as well as being tabbed preseason No. 24 by College Soccer News.

After opening the season splitting a pair of matches at VCU and Old Dominion, Akron rolled off three consecutive victories over ranked opponents registering a 1-0 triumph at No. 4 Georgetown before notching a 3-2 road win at No. 6 Maryland and then opening its home campaign downing No. 14 Saint Louis, 3-2.

In a rematch of its 2014 NCAA Tournament showdown, the Zips battled Ohio State to a 3-3 double-overtime draw before No. 8 Wake Forest bettered Akron, 2-1.

The Zips then began a run of seven straight wins with a 2-0 triumph at No. 25 UC Santa Barbara. Akron followed with victories past Penn State (1-0), UAB (2-1 in OT), Santa Clara (2-0), Buffalo (2-1), Northern Illinois (4-0) and Michigan State (4-1) before earning a 1-1 double-overtime draw at Western Michigan.

Akron closed out the month of October recording a 2-0 win at West Virginia before dropping a 4-2 decision against No. 25 UCLA to open the month of November.

The Zips registered a 4-0 victory over Bowling Green to earn the right to host the MAC Championship at FirstEnergy Stadium – Cub Cadet Field after claiming the schools 18th regular season league title.

Akron captured the MAC Tournament crown with a 1-0 victory past Buffalo before opening NCAA Tournament play downing No. 25 Rutgers, 6-1, in the tournament's second round.

The Zips continued tournament besting No. 11 SMU, 2-1, before earning a 3-2 overtime victory over No. 3 Creighton in the Elite Eight to advance to the College Cup where Akron battled eventual national champion Stanford to a 1-1 double-overtime draw, before the Cardinal advanced on penalty kicks, 8-7 in 10 rounds.

In January, 2016, Laryea became the 11th Zip to have his name called during the first round of the MLS SuperDraft with his selection seventh overall in the MLS SuperDraft by Orlando City.

A 2000 graduate of Indiana Wesleyan, Embick was named an All-American by the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) in 1998 and 1999 as a player. He was also an NAIA honorable mention All-America honoree in 1999 and was twice named to the All-Mid-Central Conference squad.

#### **GAINFORD SPARKS ZIPS TO 7-0 VICTORY AT NORTHERN ILLINOIS**

Propelled by four first-half goals, Akron cruised to a 7-0 Mid-American Conference victory past Northern Illinois on Saturday, Oct. 15.

The Zips bettered the Huskies in the affair in shots, 18-7, including 9-3 on goal. Sam Gainford directed Akron's offensive attack with a game-high four shots, while redshirt junior Robby Dambrot (Akron, Ohio), junior Niko De Vera (Camas, Wash.), freshman Jonathan Lewis (Plantation, Fla.) and Adam Najem added two shots apiece. Adam Lightner and Christian Molina collected two shots each for Northern Illinois.

Sophomore goalkeeper **Ben Lundt** (Berlin, Germany) and redshirt freshman keeper **Nick Costa** (North Royalton, Ohio), in his collegiate debut, combined to earn Akron's seventh shutout of the season. Lundt played the first 79 minutes in the tilt and made one save before yielding to Costa, who closed out the affair with one stop over the final 11 minutes. Drew Donnally pulled in two saves for the Huskies.

Gainford scored what proved to be the game-winning tally in the fourth minute (3:16) beating Donnally for his first goal of the season. Delivering the assist off a cross was redshirt freshman **Skye Harter** (Copley, Ohio).

Gainford again found the back of the net at the 27:12 mark, courtesy of an assist from **Stuart Holthusen**, to extend the Zips' lead to 2-0. The tally enabled Gainford to record his third career multi-goal performance of his career and first since scoring twice in a 3-2 win past Saint Louis on Sept. 11, 2015.

Redshirt junior **Manuel Cordeiro** (Porto, Portugal) notched his initial collegiate score for the Zips in the 31st minute (30:26) to push Akron's advantage to 3-0. Cordeiro headed the ball in off assists from Dambrot and Gainford.

After many close scoring opportunities up this point in his career, Dambrot was rewarded for his tenacity capitalizing on his first career goal at the 42:42 mark to send the Zips into the intermission leading 4-0. Senior **Brad Ruhaak** (Akron, Ohio) netted his third goal of the season in the 49th minute (48:43) off an assist from redshirt junior **Pau Belana** (Barcelona, Catalonia) to extend the Zips' margin to 5-0.

De Vera's tally was unassisted, while junior **Nate Shultz** (Mayfield, Ohio) and Harter earned assists on Laryea's goal.

## **MICHIGAN STATE EDGES AKRON, 2-1**

A pair of goals in each half propelled 14th-rated Michigan State to a 2-1 men's soccer victory over No. 17 Akron on Oct. 11.

The Zips bettered the Spartans in the affair in shots, 8-5, while each side recorded five shots on goal. **Stuart Holthusen** led Akron with a team-high two shots, while six other Zips posted one shot apiece. Michigan State garnered the decision in the top-25 showdown despite not having a single player record more than one.

**Ben Lundt** registered three saves for the Zips, while Jimmy Hague corralled four stops for the Spartans. The Spartans broke onto the scoreboard first after the Zips where whistled for a foul in the box in the 22nd minute (21:24) resulting in a penalty kick. Ryan Sierakowski delivered on the scoring opportunity recording his seventh tally of the season to give Michigan State a 1-0 lead.

The shot proved to be the only one of the initial stanza for the Spartans, who were outshot by Akron in the first half, 2-1.

The Spartans extended their lead to 2-0 at the 52:28 mark off the second goal of the year from Hunter Barone. The tally came off a successful corner kick delivered from Ryan Scott into Jimmy Fiscus, who found Barone for the goal.

**Skye Harter** cut Akron's deficit to 2-1 in the 71st minute (70:32) connecting on his third goal of the year off an assist from **Adam Najem**.

## **NAJEM AMONG THE NCAA'S ELITE**

One of the most dynamic players in men's collegiate soccer, **Adam Najem** enters play this Tuesday, Oct. 18, versus Penn State as the only active men's soccer player in Division 1 to have scored more than 25 career goals and registered 25 or more career assists. He has amassed 33 goals and 27 assists in 79 career games. Najem is currently ranked second, third, third, fifth, sixth and ninth, respectively, among active career leaders in assists (27), games played (79), points (93), goals (33), assists per contest (0.34) and points per game (1.16). Across all divisions of men's soccer, Najem is rated 13th in assists and 15th in games played.

## **GAINFORD GARNERS MAC ATHLETE OF THE WEEK HONORS**

**Sam Gainford** was selected by the Mid-American Conference as the MAC Men's Soccer Athlete of the Week, the league announced on Monday, Oct. 17.

The conference award is the first in Gainford's career and marks the third weekly conference accolade for a Zip in 2016.

Gainford registered team-high marks in goals (2), points (5), shots (5), shots on goal (2) and gamewinners (1) en route to leading Akron to a 1-1 mark this past week.

Gainford sparked the Zips to a 7-0 road victory at Northern Illinois on Saturday, Oct. 15, collecting a pair of goals, while adding an assist.

Gainford scored what proved to be the game-winning tally in the fourth minute (3:16) beating goalkeeper Drew Donnally for his first goal of the season. He then again found the back of the net at the 27:12 mark to extend the Zips' lead to 2-0.

The tally enabled Gainford to record his third career multi-goal performance of his career and first since scoring twice in a 3-2 win past Saint Louis on Sept. 11, 2015.

Earlier in the week, he posted one of eight shots for the Zips in a 2-1 setback at No. 14 Michigan State on Tuesday, Oct. 11.

On the season, Gainford owns a pair of goals, while adding an assist on 23 shots, including seven on goal.

## **OWNING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER**

The recent successes of the Akron men's soccer program over the past 10 seasons (2007-present) can be attributed to its play in the month of October. Since the start of the 2007 campaign, the Zips own a 61-8-5 (.858) ledger in the month, including a 32-3-3 (.882) mark in matches at FirstEnergy Stadium - Cub Cadet Field.

### **LEWIS MAKING HIS MARK**

**Jonathan Lewis** has provided a dynamic presence for the Zips on the offensive end this season as he enters play versus Penn State on Tuesday, Oct. 18, second nationally among NCAA Division I freshmen having recorded a team-leading six assists on the campaign. Only Nick King (Bucknell) has recorded more assists as a freshman this season nationally.

#### TOPDRAWERSOCCER.COM RECOGNIZES TRIO OF AKRON FRESHMEN

A trio of freshmen for the Zips this season in **Nick Hinds** (Plantation, Fla.), **Jonathan Lewis** and **Marcel Zajac** (Mississauga, Ontario) have been named by Top Drawer Soccer.com to its Midseason Men's Freshman Top-100 list. Hinds checks in at No. 5 nationally and is followed by Lewis at No. 10, while Zajac was tabbed at No. 44. Akron was one of two teams nationally to have a pair of freshman standouts chosen among the top 10 selections, joining North Carolina.



Hinds has appeared in 11 contests for the Zips as a rookie, including nine starts, helping anchor an Akron defensive unit that has posted seven shutouts. Offensively, he has added an assist on five shots.

Lewis has played in all 12 matches for the Zips this fall, including 10 starts, and has been a key offensive playmaker for Akron owning a team-high six assists. He has also contributed 16 shots, including eight on frame.

Having played in nine tilts, including five starts, Zajac has recorded a goal on 14 shots, including five on goal.

#### **ZIPS TIDBITS**

• The Zips' offensive eruption in a 7-0 win over Northern Illinois, Oct. 15, marked the most goals in a game for Akron since registering a 7-1 decision past Michigan on Oct. 29, 2010. The seven-goal winning margin also represented the largest scoring difference for the Zips in a triumph since downing Wright State, 8-0, on Oct. 15, 2008.

• Over the Zips' last five contests, **Adam Najem** has paced the Akron attack registering three goals, while **Sam Gainford** and **Brad Ruhaak** have recorded two goals apiece. As a team, the Zips are averaging 3.00

goals per game en route to a 2-2-1 ledger.

• Since 2007, Akron owns a league record of 50-2-2 (.944) mark in the Mid-American Conference. Furthermore, the Zips have won 10 consecutive MAC regular season championships and seven of the last eight MAC Tournament titles.

•The Zips will be looking to continue their domination of the MAC over the last decade as Akron owns a 14-0-1 mark in conference road games during the regular season since the start of the 2001 campaign. Additionally, the Zips continued their league road success at Northern Illinois, Oct. 15, as Akron has registered a 5-0 record in league road tilts following a setback since 2007.

• In the process of earning a 4-0 win over Buffalo on Oct. 7, Akron extended its run of not allowing a home goal in 2016 to 560 minutes. Dating back to the 2015 campaign, the Zips have not surrendered a home tally in nearly 580 minutes (577:38).

• Following its 4-0 win over Buffalo, Akron owns a 22-1-1 mark all-time in MAC openers.

- In all, Akron leads all league members with 18 regular-season and 12 tournament championships since joining the MAC in 1993, and has won both titles in the same season 11 times after doing so in 2015.
- In 23 seasons in the MAC, the Zips have produced 169 All-MAC honorees, including a conference-record nine first-team selections in 2010.
- The Zips have posted a winning record in the month of September in each of the last 14 seasons, including a 3-3-1 mark this season.
- The Zips registered the sixth clean sheet of the season on their home pitch with a 4-0 win past Buffalo on Oct. 7, to extend Akron's unbeaten streak at FirstEnergy Stadium Cub Cadet Field to 12 straight dating back to the 2015 campaign.
- The Zips have proven a daunting task for visiting opponents over recent history as Akron has won nine or more home contests in every season since 2005, including earning 13 triumphs during the 2009 campaign. Through six games this season, the Zips own five home victories on the campaign.

• Akron's 2-0 triumph over No. 5 UC Santa Barbara, Sept. 12, marked the third win of the season for Akron over a ranked opponent through nine games this season.

• Akron's 2-1 victory over Tulsa on Sept. 16 represented the 100th career coaching win for Zips' head coach **Jared Embick**.

• The Zips have made the most of the initial and final 15 minutes of their games this season as Akron has recorded 10 of its 24 goals in this span. Three of the Zips' seven tallies in the final 15 minutes have been game-winners

 Akron has seen eight newcomers, including five true freshmen, earn playing time through 12 games this season. Of that group, Jonathan Lewis and Nick Hinds have started nine and eight contests, respectively,

and have combined to record seven of the Zips' 24 assists on the campaign.

• Adam Najem owns 190 career shots, the fifth-highest total in program history. He is 14 shots behind Michael Apple for fourth place.

• Freshman **Jonathan Lewis** and **Nick Hinds** registered the first points in their Zips' careers as the duo netted two and one assist, respectively, versus Oregon State on Sept. 9.

• Akron has garnered scoring contributions from 18 players this year, while 19 players have recorded a

shot. Of those players, all but one have placed a shot on goal.

• In just his second career contest and first start, **Skye Harter** posted a pair of tallies in a 2-0 victory over Oregon State on Sept. 9. It marked the first multi-goal game for a Zip since **Stuart Holthusen** recorded a pair of goals in a 6-1 win over Rutgers in the 2015 NCAATournament on Nov. 22, 2015.

• Akron has found success at home this season as the Zips own a 5-0-1 mark and have posted shutouts in each of those contests. Akron is averaging 18.2 shots per tilt at home, while limiting the opposition to 11.2 shots a game.

• The Zips are 3-3 this season versus ranked opponents following wins over No. 7 Georgetown (Aug. 26, No. 9 Seattle (Aug. 28) and No. 5 UC Santa Barbara (Sept. 12).

Akron owns a 31-3-3 record in its last 37 home matches.

• Since the start of the 2015 campaign, the Zips own a 10-6-1 mark against ranked opponents. In 2015, Akron registered seven victories over ranked opponents defeating No. 3 Creighton (3-2 on Dec. 5), No. 4 Georgetown (1-0 on Sept. 4), No. 6 Maryland (3-2 on Sept. 7), No. 11 SMU (2-1 on Nov. 29), No. 14 Saint Louis (3-2 on Sept. 11), No. 23 Rutgers (3-1 on Nov. 22) and No. 25 UC Santa Barbara (2-0 on Sept. 25).

- The Zips are ranked 13th nationally in attendance in 2016 averaging 2,566 in six home games. A year ago, Akron rated seventh nationally in attendance in 2015 averaging 2,187 fans per contest.
- On the season, **Ben Lundt** owns six shutouts on the strength of 36 saves. His efforts helped the Zips extend their shutout streak dating back to last season to nearly 369 minutes (368.32) before the run was halted by a San Diego State penalty kick on Sept. 2 at the 60:55 mark.
- Akron's 1-0 victory over No. 9 Seattle represented the 50th career win for Zips' head coach Jared Embick at Akron.
- **Tyler Sanda** connected on his first-ever game-winning goal with his tally in the 88th minute (87:49) against No. 9 Seattle on Aug. 28.
- Najem is Akron's active career leader in goals (33), assists (27), points (92), shots (190) and shots on goal (90).
- Ben Lundt, Adam Najem, Danilo Radjen (Broadview Heights, Ohio) and Victor Souto were named all-tournament selections after leading the Zips to the title at the Akron Classic.
- By virtue of its back-to-back shutouts to open the 2016 campaign, Akron has now opened a season with consecutive shutouts for the sixth time in the last nine years.
- Brad Ruhaak's game-winning goal in a 1-0 win past Georgetown on Aug. 26, was the second of his career. He also netted game-winner in a 2-0 victory at West Virginia last season.
- Ben Lundt made the most of his Akron debut as he registered the shutout on the strength of two saves in a 2-0 win against No. 7 Georgetown on Aug. 26.
- Adam Najem has started in each of the last 70 games in which he has played in.
- The Zips have scored two or more goals in 25 of the squad's last 42 matches, including on six occasions this season.
- Akron advanced to the College Cup for the fourth time (1986, 2009, 2010 and 2015) in program history in 2015.
- Since Oct. 1, 2015, Akron owns a 19-5-3 record.

## **A LEGACY OF SUCCESS**

Since 2007, Akron men's soccer program has posted the highest winning percentage in the nation (.810) through games of Oct. 16, with an overall record of 165-30-23. The Zips are followed by Maryland, 154-39-30 (.758), Creighton, 139-38-26 (.749), North Carolina, 140-43-31 (.727) and Connecticut, 133-40-38 (.720). Akron has made nine straight appearances in the NCAA Tournament (2007-15), earning a first-round bye in seven seasons. The Zips have advanced to the NCAA's Round of 16 in seven of the last nine years. Since 1961, the Zips have advanced to the NCAA postseason 30 times, including each of the past nine seasons and 14 of the past 15.

## **PROTECTING OUR HOUSE**

Since 2007, the Zips have recorded an 99-7-13 (.887) ledger in home matches at FirstEnergy Stadium - Cub Cadet Field. Akron owns four unbeaten campaigns during that span, including posting home marks of 12-0-1, 13-0-0, 12-0-1 and 10-0-2 during the 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2012 seasons, respectively.

## **RUHAAK NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD**

**Brad Ruhaak** has been named a semifinalist for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award® in men's collegiate soccer. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. A mechanical engineering major, Ruhaak maintains a 3.651 cumulative grade point average.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

Outside of academics and athletics, all candidates also have been consistently involved in community service on their campus or in their communities.

The men's candidate class will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplifies excellence in the four C's of community, classroom, character and competition.

The Senior CLASS Award winners will be announced during the 2016 NCAA Men's and Women's College Cup® championships in December.



## **RUHAAK GARNERS NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK HONORS**

**Brad Ruhaak** was named by *College Soccer News* to its National Men's Soccer Team of the Week on Monday, Oct. 10, as well as by *TopDrawerSoccer.com*'s National Men's Team of the Week on Oct. 11.

Ruhaak played a key role at both ends of the field to help spark the Zips to a 4-0 victory past Buffalo in the Mid-American Conference openers for both schools on Oct. 7, at FirstEnergy Stadium-Cub Cadet Field. Ruhaak scored what proved to be the game-winning goal in the fifth minute (4:19) delivering a header within the six-yard box past Bulls' goalkeeper Joseph Kuta off a corner kick from **Pau Belana**.

Ruhaak led á defensive charge that allowed Akron to post its sixth shutout of the season and extend its run of not allowing a home goal in 2016 to 560 minutes.

## **KAHSAY EARNS NATIONAL AND LEAGUE ACCOLADES**

**Ezana Kahsay** (Asmeras, Eritrea) was selected by the Mid-American Conference as the MAC Men's Soccer Athlete of the Week, the league announced on Sept. 19.

The conference award was the first in Kahsay's career and marks the second weekly conference accolade for a Zip in 2016. He was also named by *College Soccer News* to its National Team of the Week on Sept. 19. Kahsay turned in a strong week helping the Zips extend their then winning streak to three straight on the strength of team-high marks in goals (2) and point (4), while registering four shots, all on frame. In Akron's 2-0 triumph past No. 5 UC Santa Barbara on Sept. 12, Kahsay recorded his first goal of the season in the 83rd minute (82:42) to secure the Zips' victory. He finished the affair posting two shots.

Kahsay followed notching his first career game-winning goal at the 87:18 mark to provide the difference in a 2-1 triumph at Tulsa on Sept. 16. He finished the tilt with two shots, both on frame.

## **NAJEM NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST**

**Adam Najem** added another accolade to his growing resume with his selection to the 2016 Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy Watch List.

Najem is one of 28 men tabbed for consideration for the MAC Hermann Trophy, which is the most prestigious individual award in college soccer presented annually to one male and one female athlete. The winners will be announced Jan. 6, 2017, at the trophy presentation banquet at the Missouri Athletic Club in St. Louis.

Akron head coach **Jared Embick** received high praise for his efforts leading the Zips as *TopDrawerSoccer.* com named him as one of the Top-10 coaches in the country.

TopDrawerSoccer.com described Akron as a machine with talented young players, and much of that goes down to Embick's aesthetic. Akron seeks to dominate possession, build from the back and create scoring opportunities that way. That, in turn, creates well-rounded pros.

## **ZIPS PAIR WITH TEAM IMPACT TO ADD MAVERICK WESTOVER TO 2016 ROSTER**

The University of Akron men's soccer team and head coach **Jared Embick** announced the signing of Maverick Westover on Aug. 19. The 11-year-old Akron native, signed a national letter of intent to join the Zips' men's soccer squad this season.

Team IMPACT, an organization that connects children facing chronic or life threatening illnesses to college athletic teams in an effort to improve their quality of life, orchestrated Maverick's recruitment with the Akron men's soccer program.

Maverick deals with Common Variable Immune Deficiency (CVID), which makes him highly susceptible to infection, especially in his lungs, sinuses, and ears.

## **ZIPS PRIMED FOR BIG THINGS IN 2016**

The Zips enter the 2016 campaign looking to build upon an 18-3-3 mark last season, including a 4-0-1 ledger in the Mid-American Conference, an return to the College Cup in search of winning the program's second national championship.

University of Akron men's soccer standouts **Adam Najem** and Richie Laryea garnered All-America accolades when the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) unveiled its 2015 All-American teams on Dec. 11, 2015. Both Zips earned All-America status for the first time in their respective Akron careers as Najem and Laryea were tabbed as second- and third-team honorees. The NSCAA All-America citations were the 54th and 55th in the Zips' storied men's soccer history.

#### NAJEM SELECTED AS FIRST-TEAM ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

Adam Najem was selected as a First-Team Scholar All-America award winner when the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) unveiled its 2015 Scholar All-American team last season.

Najem became the sixth Zip to garner First-Team NSCAA Scholar All-America accolades and the first since Reinaldo Brenes in 2013. The NSCAA Scholar All-America citation was the ninth in the Zips' storied men's soccer history, while also marking the 22nd overall academic All-America honor in program history.

## **SANDA NAMED 2015 ELITE 90 WINNER**

Tyler Sanda was named the recipient of the NCAA Elite 90 award for the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Championship.

In its seventh year, the award recognizes the true essence of the student-athlete by honoring the individual who has reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level in his or her sport, while also achieving the highest academic standard among his or her peers. The Elite 90 is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average participating at the finals site for each of the NCAA's 90 championships.

Sanda appeared in 14 games for Akron this past fall and registered a pair of goals, while adding two assists. He maintains a 3.954 GPA majoring in biology.

## **KITCHEN AND YEDLIN ADDED TO USMNT ROSTER FOR PAIR OF FRIENDLIES**

**Perry Kitchen** and **DeAndre Yedlin** were added to the USMNT roster for a pair of recent friendlies as the Americans defeated Cuba, 2-0, Oct. 7, before they battled New Zealand to a 1-1 draw on Tuesday, Oct. 11, at RFK Stadium in Washington, D.C.

Beginning in November, the USMNT embarks on the last leg of the journey to qualify for its eighth-consecutive World Cup. The six-team, 10-game Final Round – also known as the Hex – will span 11 months and see three teams from CONCACAF automatically qualify for Russia 2018.

Trapp, who was a two-time first-team All-MAC selection in 2011 and 2012 and a third-team NSCAA All-American in 2012, was previously tabbed as the fourth- and ninth-best prospect on the 24 under 24 list a in 2015 and 2014, respectively.

## **WHAT IS A ZIP?**

- One of the unique nicknames in collegiate athletics belongs to The University of Akron.
   Originally Zippers, athletic director Kenneth "Red" Cochrane officially shortened the nickname to the Zips in 1950. Twenty-five years earlier a campus-wide contest had been conducted to choose a nickname for the University's athletics teams.
   Suggestions submitted by students, faculty, and alumni included Golden Blue Devils, Tip Toppers, Rubbernecks, Hillbillies, Kangaroos, and Cheveliers.
- The winner, freshman Margaret Hamlin, received a prize of \$10 for Zippers, a \$6 pair of rubber overshoes and a brand name of the BF Goodrich Company.

The evolution of Zippy, UA's mascot, began 40 years ago when the student council decided the University needed a mascot.
"Zippy" the kangaroo was officially declared the school's mascot on May 1, 1953. The first known printed reference to the mascot as "Zippy" was a 1965 Zip football press brochure. The Buchtelite's first use of the name "Zippy" came Sept. 24, 1965, in an identification of a photo of the cheerleaders listing "Mascot - 'Zippy' - Charles Huettner."

• In 2007, Zippy was named the Capital One National Mascot of the Year.

• Redshirt junior MF/D **Robby Dambrot** is the son of Zips' men's basketball coach Keith Dambrot.

• Eleven Zips have had their names called during the first round of the MLS SuperDraft, including a league record five selections in the first eight picks in 2011 following the Zips' national championship season.
