**LIONS LOOK TO REMAIN UNBEATEN AT HOME**

**THE GAME:** Penn State will return to the BJC for the first time in 11 days for a two-game home stand starting Sunday vs. SEC foe Mississippi. This will be the second game of a home-and-home series. Ole Miss posted an 84-71 victory in Oxford last year in the first-ever meeting between the programs. PSU returns just two players from that game while Ole Miss returns six. Penn State is 8-16 all-time vs. SEC teams. This will be the first appearance by an SEC team in the BJC since a 42-41 overtime victory over Tennessee in 1996. The Lions are 4-0 at home on the year. Penn State will be looking for its seventh non-conference win, which would equal its total from last year's NCAA Tournament team that went 7-4 in the pre-Big Ten campaign.

**LIONS WIN 4TH BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE GAME IN LAST FIVE:** Penn State improved to 5-6 overall in Big Ten/ACC Challenge games and posted its fourth win in its last five Challenge contests with a 62-54 victory at Boston College, Nov. 30, which gave the Eagles their first-ever Challenge loss in six games. It marked Penn State's third-straight win in a Challenge road game, having also won at Georgia Tech (2008) and at Virginia (2009). Penn State, which was the first Big Ten team to claim a Challenge victory in three-straight seasons, now ranks sixth among Big Ten teams with five Challenge wins. The **Big Ten won the Challenge for the third-straight year** posting an 8-4 edge, the Big Ten's largest-ever winning margin and equaling the most number of wins in a season in the series. The ACC also won eight in 2006 and 2007 and won the initial 10 Challenges.

**NON-CON ROAD WIN:** Penn State's victory at B.C. snapped a string of four-straight non-conference road losses (going 0-2 last year at Mississippi and Virginia Tech) and was its first non-con road win since winning at Virginia (69-66) as part of the 2009 Challenge.

**FRAZIER IN THE BIG TEN RANKINGS:** Entering the week, junior guard Tim Frazier ranked SECOND in the Big Ten in scoring (19.5), FIRST in assists (6.9), SECOND in steals (2.4) and NINTH in rebounding (5.8). He ranks in the top 10 of seven statistical categories in the Big Ten and has posted FIVE 20-point outings and two career-high point totals so far on the season. Frazier also has three games of 10+ assists to his name on the year and has posted a career high in either scoring, assists or rebounding (or both) in four games on the year. Frazier now leads Penn State in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Frazier has 55 assists (the next closest Lion 10) and 20 steals (next closest Lion 9) on the year.

MARSHALL PROVIDES SPARK/CAREER HIGH: Jermaine Marshall came off the bench to score 15 first half points, including the Lions' last 10 of the half, on his way to a career-high 22 points and eight rebounds in Penn State's win at Boston College (11/30). Marshall hit 8-of-16 from the floor and a career-best 3-of-6 from three in the game. It marked the second time away from home against a Big Six conference opponent that Marshall excelled to help the Lions to victory. He posted eight first half points on his way to 14 in Penn State's victory over South Florida (11/20). Against USF, Marshall had a pair of driving three-point plays in the first half to give Penn State its first lead and hit a pair of second-half threes to finish 5-of-8 from the floor and 2-of-5 from three. The sophomore returned to practice on Nov. 10 after being suspended prior to the start of pre-season practice due to a violation of team rules.

#### **PENN STATE'S LAST GAME SUMMARY**

#### Penn State 62, Boston College 54 Nov. 30 • Chestnut Hill, Mass.

Penn State got 44 points on a combined 15-28 shooting from Tim Frazier and Jermaine Marshall to overcome a 39 percent shooting night and win at Boston College, 62-54. Frazier scored 20 of his 22 points in the second half, his fifth 20-point game of the season, and Marshall logged career highs with 22 points, 15 in the first half, and eight rebounds. The Lions used a 1-2-2 press to force 18 B.C. turnovers and held the Eagles to 36 percent shooting, 27 percent in the second half. The Lions trailed 29-26 at the half after starting 1-of-9 from the floor and trailing 12-4 early. A 10-0 run put PSU in front briefly. Trailing 45-42 with 9:43 to play, PSU held B.C. without a field goal for nine minutes down the stretch and built a nine-point lead in the closing seconds



# **OUTLET PASSES**

- Penn State is playing at home for the first time in 11 days.
- Penn State is looking to start 7-2 for the secondstraight year and match its best start to a season in the last 10 years. The Lions started 7-2 last year (reaching the NCAA) and in 2008-09 (winning the NIT).
- Penn State will face its first SEC team at home since downing Tennessee 42-41 in overtime in 1996.
- Redshirt freshman forward Jon Graham (6-8) was diagnosed with mononucleosis on Nov. 28 and is expected to miss as much as three weeks.
- $\blacksquare$  Jermaine Marshall provided a big spark in the Lions' wins at B.C. and over USF. He had a careerhigh 22 points, on 8-of-16 shooting, and 8 rebounds at B.C. and posted 14 pts and three steals on 5-of-9 shooting vs. USF.
- Tim Frazier is 2nd in the Big Ten in scoring (19.5), first in assists (6.9), 2nd in steals (2.4) and 9th in rebounding (5.8). Frazier led Penn State last season with 35 steals and 173 assists.
- Frazier has surpassed 500 career points (524) and moved into 12th all-time (301) on the PSU career assist charts.
- Forward Billy Oliver leads the team with 14 threepointers, including a career-best four at St. Joe's. He totalled 11 in 32 games last year.
- Tim Frazier has FIVE 20-point games on the year. ■ Freshman Ross Travis equaled his career-high scoring with 10 points, including three dunks, at St. Joe's.
- Frazier posted back-to-back double-doubles with a career-best 26 points and 10 assists in Penn State's win over LIU. He is the first PSU player to post back-to-back double-doubles since Geary Claxton posted three straight in January of 2008. Frazier now has four career double-doubles, all coming with 10 or more assists.
- Freshman Trey Lewis led the Lions with 17 points on 3-of-6 from three in his collegiate debut. He has two double-digit outings on the year and ranks second on the team scoring 7.4 ppg.
- Senior Cam Woodyard posted career highs in points (14), rebounds (7), threes (4) and steals (4) in the season opener
- Penn State has a 162-75 record in games vs. teams from outside of the Big Ten Conference since joining the Big Ten in the 1992-93 season.
- Patrick Chambers, 40, is the youngest coach in the Big Ten edging out Purdue's Matt Painter by about three months. Both were born in 1970 -Painter on Aug. 27 and Chambers on Dec. 13.

SCOUTING OLE MISS.: The Rebels (6-1) are coming off a win vs. DePaul (70-68) on a closing seconds lay-up from Murphy Holloway Thursday in Chicago in the SEC-Big East Challenge. The 6-7 Holloway had 16 points and 12 boards in the game for a Rebel team that shot 56 percent but just 11of-28 from the foul line and 1-of-3 from three and led by 17 with 13:57 to play. The Rebels had 20 turnovers against the DePaul press. Holloway, a transfer from South Carolina and the reigning SEC player of the week, leads the team posting 11.6 ppg and 10.4 rpg. Four Rebels average double-digits. Indiana transfer Nick Williams posts 10.3 ppg. Ole Miss is shooting 41 percent on the year and just 25-121 (20.7%) from three and 55.4 perecent from the line. They are posting 41 boards a game while averaging 17 turnovers. Their lone loss came to Marquette (96-66) at the Virgin Islands Paradise Jam. They also have victories over Miami, TCU and Drake on the year.

LAST YEAR IN OXFORD: The Rebels posted an 84-71 victory last November in Mississippi, led by 24 points from Trevor Gaskins and 20 from Chris Warren. Penn State got 26 from Talor Battle as well as double-digits from David Jackson (17) and Jeff Brooks (15), but were out-rebounded 32-26, had eight shots blocked and saw Mississippi hit 13 threes, six from Gaskins. Penn State returns just two players who saw action in that game. Tim Frazier had two points and six assists in 23 minutes while picking up four fouls and Billy Oliver scored four points and had four turnovers in 14 minutes. Ole Miss returns six players that played in last year's contest led by Nick Williams who posted 15 points and Terrance Henry who logged 13. Reginald Buckner (6-9) posted five blocks.

**20 & 10 AGAIN!:** Three times in the first six games of the season, junior Tim Frazier posted at least 20 points and 10 assists in a game. In Penn State's win over Youngstown State (11/23), Frazier shot 8-of-11 from the floor for a team-high 26 points and added a career-best 11 assists, tying the eighth best game total in Penn State history. It marked Frazier's fourth career double-double (third of the season) and his fifth career 20-point game (4th of the season).

**D'ING UP:** Penn State has held five opponents to less then 40 percent shooting on the year and four to 55 points or less. The Lions are allowing opponents to shoot just 39.9 percent on the year and score 61.6 ppg. Take out the game against current No. 1 Kentucky and those averages drop to 37.8 percent and 58.3 ppg. The Lions have won the rebounding battle in six games, winning every one.

**HALTING FIRST HALVES:** Penn State is shooting 15 percent better (45.9-30.2) and scoring 10 more points per game (36.4-26.1) in the second halves of games as compared to the first. The Lions have shot better than 40 percent in the second half of every game on the year, four times eclipsing 50 percent shooting. Penn State has shot less than 30 percent in the first half in FIVE games and has shot better than 40 percent in just one, a 60 percent outing (including 7-of-10 from three) in a victory over Youngstown State. The Lions suffered through a 10-point first half in which they shot 4-of-38 from the floor (10.5%) and missed their first 16 shots in their loss at St. Joe's (11/26). Penn State similarly struggled scoring 15 points and shooting 16.2 percent in the first half in a loss to Kentucky (11/19).

**HOT VS YSU:** Penn State hit 60 percent from the floor and 7-of-10 from three in the first half of its win over Youngstown State (11/23). Penn State's 56.5 percent shooting for the game vs. YSU is a season high and equaled the Lions' season-best posted last year. The Lions finished 11-of-22 from three in the game, also a season high.

**BOARDIN':** Penn State leads the Big Ten posting 14.5 offensive rebounds per game. Penn State had a season-high 18 offensive rebounds vs. Kentucky.

#### FRAZIER NAMED TO TIP-OFF TOURNAMENT

ALL-TOURNEY TEAM: Tim Frazier averaged 21.0 ppg, 6.7 apg and 5.8 rpg while posting three 20-point games, two career-high points totals, back-to-back doubles and two career-best assist totals (10) in four games while leading the Lions in scoring in every game to earn All-Tournament Team honors in the Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-off Tournament the week of Nov. 14-20. Frazier logged a then career-high 26 points to go with 10 assists in a win over Long Island, his second-straight 20 & 10 double-double, before bettering his scoring mark with 27 points, 19 in the second half, in a come-from behind win over South Florida. Penn State went 3-1 in the tournament, playing in its first pre-season tournament since the 2009 Charleston Classic. The Lions opened play with victories over Radford and Long Island at home before advancing to the Mohegan Sun Arena in Connecticut where they fell to No. 2 Kentucky but bounced back to down South Florida. Penn State holds a 67-83 all-time record in in-season tournaments, claiming 10 titles and 11 second-place finishes.

#### TRAVIS & GLOVER SHINE IN SECOND HALF

**VS UK:** Penn State struggled in the game, but saw two newcomers shine in the second half of the Lions' loss to Kentucky on Saturday. Freshman Ross Travis and sophomore transfer Matt Glover scored all of their career high point totals in the second half vs. Kentucky. Glover hit his first three three-point attempts of the second half before finishing 3-of-4 from three for nine points in 21 minutes. Ross Travis hit a pair of threes in the second half on his way to a career-best 10 points and eight rebounds to lead the Lions on the boards.

#### FRAZIER POSTS BACK-TO-BACK DOUBLE-

**DOUBLES:** Junior guard Tim Frazier posted back-to-back double-doubles, 20-point games and career-best assist totals in two outings vs. Radford and LIU. He was the first PSU player to post back-to-back double-doubles since Geary Claxton posted three straight in January of 2008. Frazier was spectacular in the Lions' win over Long Island posting a then career-high 26 points on 9-of-18 shooting and logging a career-best 10 assists for the second-straight game. Frazier went for 20 points, 10 assists, six rebounds and three steals in the Lions previous victory vs. Radford.

#### **FRAZIER LOOKING TO SCORE/**

2ND IN BIG TEN: Tim Frazier finished fifth in the Big Ten last year averaging 5.1 asssists per game while taking just 4.8 shot attempts per contest to average 6.3 ppg. Frazier averaged just 4.6 shots per game while playing in every one of Penn State's 65 games over his first two seasons. That changed in his junior campaign as the previously pass-first point-guard has been looked toward as the Lions' most potent scoring option. Frazier currently stands SECOND the Big Ten scoring 19.5 ppg and has posted FIVE 20-point games (6 career) while leading the Lions in scoring in SIX games. Frazier is averaging 14 shots and 7 field goals made per game while shooting 45 percent thus far on the season. He showed glimpses of his scoring ability in the LIons' run to the 2011 NCAA Tournament, including posting a career-high 22 points on a career most nine field goals and 13 field goal attempts vs. Michigan State in a Big Ten Tournament semifinal victory. Frazier followed that up with 15 points vs. Temple in the Lions' NCAA Tournament loss to the Owls

**STEALING:** Penn State posted 15 steals in its season opening win vs. Hartford, the most for a Lion team since logging 18 in a 2001 NCAA Tournament victory over North Carolina. Penn State forced Hartford into 26 turnovers, the second most-ever in the Bryce Jordan Center and the most since Nicholls State had 27 in 2005. Tim Frazier (5) and Cammeron Woodyard (4) both posted career highs in steals to lead six Lions who logged a steal.

FRAZIER GOES FOR 20 & 10: Junior guard Tim Frazier posted his second career double-double in the Lions' victory over Radford (11/14) as he logged his second career 20-point game and equaled a career high assist total leading the team with 20 points and 10 assists and adding six rebounds and three steals. Frazier equaled his career-best 10 assists posted at Northwestern last year, also his first double-double. The 6-1, guard hit 9-of-14 from the floor. Frazier scored 11 of the Lions' final 19 points in the first half and assisted for two others as Penn State went from trailing 10-11 to a 29-20 halftime lead.

**LEWIS LEADS TEAM IN DEBUT:** Freshman Trey Lewis, the runner-up for Ohio's "Mr. Basketball" award in 2011, was outstanding in his first collegiate game leading Penn State to a season-opening victory with a team-high 17 points on 3-of-6 from three. Lewis also added four assists, two boards and two steals in the game in 31 minutes of action after starting the contest. Lewis scored 14 of his 17 points in the second half as Penn State pushed a 10-point halftime lead to as much as 26 and junior guard Tim Frazier spent much of the half on the bench with four fouls. Lewis scored 10-straight points hitting a pair of threes and two lay-ups beginning midway through the half to push Penn State's lead to 18. Lewis finished 7-of-13 from the floor.

**SENIOR SUCCESS:** Penn State's lone senior, Cammeron Woodyard, spent his first three seasons playing an average of just 8.7 minutes per game (including a high of 10. 4 mpg last year) and never averaged more than the 2.2 ppg he posted in 24 contests as a freshman. He showed that will all change this year when he posted career highs in points (14), rebounds (7), threes (4) and steals (4) in 27 minutes of action off the bench in Penn State's season opening victory over Hartford. This despite missing the first two weeks of practice after having minor surgery on his left knee. Woodyard hit 4-of-7 from three in the contest and tied for the team lead in rebounding. He has led Penn State in rebounding in three games this season, posting a career-best equaling seven boards on four occasions.

**OLIVER TWIST/POSTS CAREER HIGH 12 POINTS & 4 THREES:** After missing his first two seasons as a Nittany Lion due to concussions and chronic exercise induced headaches and taking a total of 76 shots last year, his first full healthy season, junior Billy Oliver steps into a much more integral offensive role in his fourth season in the program. That was clearly evident in the Lions' loss at St. Joe's (11/26) as Oliver made a career-best four threes and posted a career-high 12 points while taking 13 shots from the floor and 10 from three. He hit two clutch threes late in the second half to finish with nine points and a career-high 10 rebounds in PSU's win over LIU (11/16) and made a big three to give the Lions a 50-44 lead with 3:00 to play vs. USF (11/20). **Oliver currently leads the Lions with 14 threes on the year.** He entered the season as a career 23.9 percent shooter from three having hit 11-of-46 career



three-point attempts. However, his confidence soared during off-season and pre-season practices spent getting numerous shot opportunities and constant encouragement to shoot from the coaching staff. Oliver posted a career-best 10 points on six shots in the Lions' season-opening win vs. Lehigh last year, but only reached that career-high shot total twice more the rest of the year.

**CHAMBERS WINS PENN STATE DEBUT:** Patrick Chambers won the first season opener of his career in his Penn State debut as the Lions downed Hartford 70-55 on Nov. 12. The 12th head coach in Penn State history, Chambers became just the second of the last six Nittany Lion coaches to win his Penn State debut joining Jerry Dunn (1996) and Bruce Parkhill (1983). Coaches Ed DeChellis (2003), Dick Harter (1978) and John Bach (1968) all fell in their debuts. Eight of Penn State's 12 head coaches have won their debut, including the Lions' first coach Burke Hermann in 1916. Chambers had been 0-2 in season opening games – having lost a pair of road season opening contests in his two seasons as head coach at Boston University.

**20th BIG TEN SEASON:** Penn State will open its 20th season of Big Ten Conference play with a pair of road games at Michigan (Dec. 29) and at Northwestern (Jan. 1). It marks the second straight season Penn State will open the Big Ten with a pair of road games (winning at Indiana and falling at Michigan last year) and the third straight season opening the Big Ten with a road game (falling at Minnesota in 2009-10). Penn State posted a 9-9 mark during the Big Ten regular season last year to finish in a tie for fourth place. The nine wins marked the fifth time Penn State posted a .500 or better record in Big Ten play and tied for Penn State's third best Big Ten record ever. It marked the second time in the last three seasons Penn State finished fourth in the Big Ten regular season. Penn State's best Big Ten finish came in 1996 as the Lions went 12-6 to finish second in the conference.

**CHAMBERS ERA BEGINS:** Patrick Chambers was introduced as the 12th head coach in Nittany Lion basketball history on Monday, June 6, shortly after the departure of Penn State alumnus and eight-year head coach Ed DeChellis for the Navy head job in late May. Chambers introduction took place in front of more than 300 fans and supporters described a "less an introduction than a passionate call to arms," by local media. Chambers wasted little time connecting with the Penn State fan base far and wide. He ordered a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the Penn State campus distributing t-shirts and his infectious energy. He visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, classes, threw out the first pitch for the State College Spikes and even donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Paternoville"



student campout just prior to the clash of Joe Paterno's football team with Alabama. He was seemingly everywhere in his first four months on the job, most importantly the recruiting trail, and showed no signs of slowing down.

**CLIMBING CAREER CHARTS:** Tim Frazier's three games with 10 or more assists, including a career-high 11 vs. YSU, have moved him into 12th all-time in career assists Penn State history. He passed Brandon Watkins (287; 2000-03) and Pete Lisicky (291; 1994-98) last week. He is on pace to rank among the top 10 all-time in assists at Penn State by the end of his junior season.

**STILL DISHIN':** Despite a new emphasis on scoring, Tim Frazier has posted careerbest assist totals in three games this year, posting at least 10 on each occasion. He leads the Big Ten posting 7.3 apg, two more per game than second place Jordan Taylor of Wisconsin. He has led Penn State in assists in each of the first six games, including 10 vs. Radford and LIU and a career-best 11 vs YSU. Entering the season, he ranked third among Big Ten returners in assists after posting an average of 5.1 per game last year. Frazier's 173 assists last year rank as the fifth best season mark in Penn State history.

**FRAZIER & OLIVER LEAD LIONS' EXHIBITION WIN:** Juniors Tim Frazier and Billy Oliver paced the Nittany Lions with 19 and 16 points, respectively, in Penn State's 64-47 exhibition game victory over Slippery Rock last Saturday. However, what first-year head coach Patrick Chambers was more concerned with was the Lions' hustle and energy and he was pleased to see his Nittany Lions record 18 charted dives in the game. The Lions recorded 13 of those 18 dives in the second half as Penn State picked up the defensive intensity. Penn State recorded 13 steals in the game and caused 25 Slippery Rock turnovers helping the Lions pull-away to as much as a 21-point second half lead despite shooting just 40 percent from the floor and 7-of-26 from three. The Lions scored 24 points off turnovers, out-scored SRU 16-0 on second chance points, and got 18 more field goal attempts (57-39) in the game. Frazier added a team-high seven assists and six rebounds to his point total. Oliver hit 4-of-8 from three. Freshman guard Trey Lewis added 10 points, while fellow freshman Ross Travis led the team with eight rebounds and numerous hustle plays.

**FRAZIER STEPS INTO LEADERSHIP ROLE:** Junior guard Tim Frazier took his game to a higher level in Penn State's 2011 run to the NCAA Tournament as he averaged 10.0 ppg, 5.9 apg and 4.6 rgp over the final 11 games, including a career-best 22-point, eight-rebound, six-assist effort in the Lions' Big Ten Tournament semifinal win over Michigan State. With the graduation of four senior starters, Frazier entered the season the most experienced Nittany Lion having played in every game over the previous two seasons and started 43.

**CAPTAINS:** Penn State named senior Cammeron Woodyard and juniors Tim Frazier and Billy Oliver captains at the beginning of pre-season practice.

**CHAMBERS' FIRST TEAM:** Penn State coach Patrick Chambers will look to mesh seven Nittany Lion newcomers who could see action this year (including five true freshmen, a transfer and a redshirt freshman) with seven returners, five of which have previously seen action in a Penn State uniform. Just four returning players (Tim Frazier, Billy Oliver, Cammeron Woodyard and Jermaine Marshall) saw action last year. Redshirt sophomore Sasa Borovnjak will return after missing last year with a torn ACL. Penn State will look to replace nearly 80 percent of its scoring and 70 percent of its rebounding lost when five seniors graduated from a team that went 19-15 last year and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2001. Frazier leads the returners having started 43 career games and played in every game the last two years. Frazier averaged 6.3 points and 3.9 rebounds per game last year and ranked fourth in the Big Ten with 5.1 assists per game. Frazier was big in Penn State's run to the 2011 Big Ten Tournament championship game and NCAA Tournament as he averaged 10 points, 5.9 assists and 4.6 rebounds per game over the final 11 games of 2010-11.

**"HOOPS MADNESS" ROCKS REC HALL:** It was a a fabulous night in Rec Hall Nov. 2 when the Nittany Lion and Lady Lion basketball teams hosted "Hoops Madness" with a special performance by top selling rap artist *Fabolous*. The Brooklyn-born *Fabolous* has twice been nominated for a Grammy and has sold more than three million albums with numerous chart topping hits. - Posted fourth Big Ten/ACC Challenge win in last five Challenges and third-straight in a Challenge road game.

once again shook with hoops hysteria as a large crowd turned out to see New Nittany Lion coach Patrick Chambers and the 2011-12 Nittany Lions and fifth-year Lady Lion coach Coquese Washington and a 2011-12 Lady Lion teams introduced. Fans were treated to numerous contests, highlight videos, a slam-dunk contest and one fan in attendance was given a chance to make a half court shot to win \$10,000. Nittany Lion guard Tim Frazier and Lady Lion Maggie Lucas helped instruct the contestant and made back-to-back half court shots on their first attempts to electrify the crowd.

#### **CHAMBERS HITS THE GROUND RUNNING:**

Coach Chambers wasted no time in getting to know his first Penn State team as he logged 10,500 miles in his first eight days on the job traveling from coast-to-coast to visit current Penn State players and incoming freshmen and their families. Chambers traveled from Massachusetts to California, Minnesota to Texas as he met with every player except Sasa Borovnjak who was at home in Serbia

**GET ON THE FLOOR:** Patrick Chambers places an emphasis on "dives" during a basketball game and has his staff chart them with a goal of achieving at least 14 "dives" per game. The Nittany Lions achieved that goal in their exhibition game recording 18 "dives," 13 of which came in the second half. Chambers has established an "Attitude Club" in which players attempt to record enough hustle points during practices to become a member. Penn State charts "Attitude Points" during every practice and announces winners at the end of every practice. Modeled after similar programs used by longtime NBA coach Pat Riley and Chambers' mentor, Villanova's Jay Wright, the club charts hustle plays, extra passes, charges drawn, dives on the floor.

BJC GETS NEW SCOREBOARD: Penn State partnered with ANC Sports Enterprises to place a new state-of-the-art center hung scoreboard in the Bryce Jordan Center. The board, weighing approximately 22,000 pounds, features high-definition quality visuals across approximately half a million pixels. The new scoreboard, which was installed in October, features four Mitsubishi Electric 10mm Diamond Vision video screens each measuring approximately 12' high x 16' wide and two 16mm Diamond Vision ribbon displays, one on top of the video screens and one at the bottom of the structure. The new center-hung system will include over 1100 square feet of dynamic video capabilities which will provide real-time statistics, team logos, crowd prompts, animated team introductions, student athlete videos and live footage of events at the arena.

**STAFF TIES:** Patrick Chambers began forming his first Penn State coaching staff by naming his former Episcopal Academy high school teammate Eugene Burroughs as associate head coach, the first of three assistants with strong ties to Philadelphia. Chambers and Burroughs both played for legendary coach Dan Dougherty in Philadelphia in the late 80's early 90's.

## SEASON OUTLOOK NOTES

- Juniors Tim Frazier and Billy Oliver are expected to step to the forefront as scoring options for Penn State after averaging 6.3 and 2.3 ppg, respectively, last season
- Penn State graduated players that accounted for 80% of the scoring and nearly 70% of the rebounding from last year's NCAA Tournament team.
- Five senior graduates from the 2010-11 team accounted for 432 career starts and 581 career games played. Among them was all-time leading scorer Talor Battle who posted 2,213 points and led the Lions in scoring each of the past four seasons.
- Tim Frazier leads all returners having started 43 career games (33 of 34 games last year) and played in every game in the last three seasons.
- Penn State returned five players with experience in a Penn State uniform (Frazier, Sasa Borovnjak, Jermaine Marshall, Billy Oliver and Cammeron Woodyard)

Burroughs previously had worked as associate head coach at Navy. Former Villanova assistant Keith Urgo also joined the staff as an assistant. The pair worked together on Villanova's 2009 NCAA Final Four staff and Urgo worked under Jay Wright for four seasons. Brian Daly followed Chambers from Boston University where he was associate head coach under Chambers. Daly is a former Philadelphia high school standout and player at Saint Joseph's and was a highly successful high school coach at his alma mater, Monsignor Bonner HS in Philadelphia.

FAMILIAR FOES IN 2011-12: Penn State will face four teams on the 2011-12 season that head coach Patrick Chambers faced last year while leading Boston University. The Nittany Lions will begin the Chambers' Era by facing a very familiar foe in Hartford at the Bryce Jordan Center. Chambers and BU posted a 2-1 mark in three meetings vs. Hartford last year posting victories of 61-50 and 55-49 later in the year after falling, 59-55, in the initial meeting. Chambers went 5-1 in six meetings with Hartford while at BU. The Lions will also face 2011 NCAA Final Four participant Kentucky in the Hall of Fame Tip-off Classic. Chambers and BU fell to Kentucky, 91-57, last year in Lexington. BU also downed Cornell (66-61) and Saint Joseph's (85-79), which appear on the Lions' 2011-12 schedule.

#### CHAMBERS LEADS PENN STATE-CVC; CVC "BAND TOGETHER" DAY SET FOR FEB.

11 VS. NEBRASKA: Patrick Chambers immediately embraced the mantle of leadership of Coaches vs. Cancer-Penn State when he took over the Nittany Lion program in June. Penn State-CVC has raised nearly \$2 million in the last 15 years to fight cancer and help support those affected by the disease. The Organization raised over \$200,000 last year and has raised more than \$175,000 each of the last five years ranking it among the top six CVC organizations in the nation. Penn State-CVC has grown from an annual golf tournament started in the summer of 1996 to a year-round schedule of seven events, which includes the the Coaches Vs. Cancer Celebrity Golf Tournament, CVC Reverse Car Drawing, CVC "Band Together" Day, Spikes Fest, CVC 5k Fun Run/Walk, Microbrewer's Expo and Bestwick Foundation Bike For Life. A portion of the money raised goes directly to assist those affected by the disease in the Centre Region through the Bob Perks Cancer Assistance Fund (BCAF). Funds are also donated directly to the American Cancer Society.

## **2011 EARLY SIGNEE**

Penn State signed one player in the 2011 NCAA Early Signing Peried that began Nov. 9

BRANDON TAYLOR 6-8, 235, F, Tabernacle, N.J., Trenton Catholic Academy (N.J.)

"Brandon is a great kid who comes from a great family and is serious about his academics and getting his degree. Basketball wise, he is a terrific player who can post-up, shoot threes, has a very high basketball IQ and has a Big Ten ready body. He will make an immediate impact in our - Patrick Chambers program."

Taylor helped lead his AAU squad, Team Philly, to several tournament titles over the summer and saw his stock rise as he diversified his game and excelled in several head-to-head battles with other high Division I recruits. His size and strength on the block as well as his ability to stretch defenses on the perimeter and score off the dribble or from the three-point line were on display. He is described as a "prototypical mismatch problem" with "the physical tools and basketball skills to score both inside and out" by ESPN.com. Dave Telep of ESPN.com added, "Penn State has itself a legitimate scoring option on its way to Happy Valley."

Taylor helped Trenton Catholic Academy (N.J.) to a 2010 New Jersey Non-Public B State Championship with a victory over perennial powerhouse St. Anthony and an eventual championship crown in the NJSIAA (all classes) Tournament of Champions as a sophomore. He averaged 11.7 points per game last year as a junior at Trenton Catholic as he helped lead the team to a 19-6 record. The Iron Mikes fell in the semifinals of the NJSIAA Non-Public South B Tournament in a two-point game in which Taylor recorded 14 points and had 15 rebounds. He posted a season high 25 points earlier in the year in a victory over West Windsor South.

LIONS PLAYING PROFESSIONALLY: All four senior starters from Penn State's 2011 NCAA Tournament team are currently playing professionally in Europe or South America. Penn State currently has 11 former players active in pro leagues around the world, six of which have graduated in the last three years.

GREAT GRAD RATE: Penn State basketball's NCAA four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 995 through 2009-10 tied for the best among men's basketball teams in the Big Ten and was well above the national average of 945. Penn State and Michigan State tied for the Big Ten's highest APR figure, marking the fourth consecutive year the Nittany Lions have ranked among the top three in the Big Ten. Penn State student-athletes also earned a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 88 percent compared to the 80 percent average for all Division I institutions for students entering from 2001-02 through 2004-05. The 88 percent figure was third to Northwestern (96) and Illinois (89) among Big Ten Conference institutions. Coach Patrick Chambers' Nittany Lions ranked second in the Big Ten with their 90 percent GSR score. The four-year federal graduation rate average for University Park student-athletes was 79 percent, second to Northwestern (88) among Big Ten schools, and significantly above the 64 percent Division I average.



Frazier's career-best five steals led a 15 steal effort for the Lions, the most by a PSU team since 2001, and helped cause 26 Hartford turnovers, the most for a PSU opponent since 2005. Penn State shot just 36 percent but turned 17 offensive rebounds into a 20-2 edge in second chance points and got 20 more shots (64-44) than Hartford, which was led by 12 points from Wes Cole.

Freshman Ross Travis had career highs of 10 points, all in the second half, and eight rebounds. The 38-point loss marked the Lions' largest since falling by 43 at Illinois in 2004.

Penn State got 44 points on a combined 15-28 shooting from Tim Frazier and Jermaine Marshall to overcome a 39 percent shooting night and win at Boston College, 62-54. Frazier scored 20 of his 22 points in the second half, his fifth 20-point game of the season, and Marshall logged career highs with 22 points, 15 in the first half, and eight rebounds. The Lions used a 1-2-2 press to force 18 B.C. turnovers and held the Eagles to 36 percent shooting, 27 percent in the second half. The Lions trailed 29-26 at the half after starting 1-of-9 from the floor and trailing 12-4 early. A 10-0 run put PSU in front briefly. Trailing 45-42 with 9:43 to play, PSU held B.C. without a field goal for nine minutes down the stretch and built a nine-point lead in the closing seconds.
