QUICK HITS

SETTING THE SCENE | The Penn State men's basketball team begins a stretch of four out of five games vs. Top 20-ranked opponents when it heads to No. 17/16 Maryland for an 8:30 p.m. Wednesday tipoff on BTN.

The Nittany Lions have won two of their last three games by outlasting Minnesota, 63-58, Jan. 28 and downing Rutgers by 28 points, 79-51, Jan. 24. They were clipped by Illinois, 60-58, Saturday in Champaign.

SCORING DEFENSE | In six of nine Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent under their season scoring average, including each of last four by average of 12.4 points.

MARYLAND | The Terps are 18-4 overall and 6-3 in Big Ten play, tied for second, after losing to Ohio State last Thursday. [MORE: Page 2]

THE SERIES | Penn State and Maryland have met 17 times, dating back to 1938, with this standing as the first meeting as conference foes. The teams last faced each other in the 2010 Big Ten/ACC Challenge. [MORE: Page 2]

NARROW MARGINS | Six games this season have been separated by one possession with PSU winning the first four before falling short in the last two (Indiana and Illinois). In Big Ten play, six of the team's seven Big Ten losses have been decided by an average of 4.8 points.]

HEY DJ, THAT'S MY DJ | Senior guard D.J. Newbill, the top scorer among Power 5 conference players and fifth in Division I, has paced Penn State throughout season with 21.5 ppg. The No. 5 scorer all-time at PSU, he is 25 points away from 4th-place and 28 points away from being just second player in program history to reach 500 points in three-consecutive seasons. SENIOR CLASS AWARD | D.J. Newbill was named one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to a four-year student-athlete who excels in all four areas of classroom, community, character and competition. [seniorclassaward.com]

THE MATCHUP

SCOUTING MARYLAND

- The Terps are 18-4 on the season with a 6-3 record, tied for second, in their first season of Big Ten action. They are coming off a 80-56 setback at Ohio State last Thursday and had a bye weekend leading up to the Wednesday night matchup in College Park.
- The Terps fell to Illinois, Indiana and Ohio State, all on the road, by a margin of -16.7 points. Their six wins have been separated by +8.0. They have not lost back-to-back games this season.
- Maryland is 13-1 in the Xfinity Center this season with a 4-0 mark in conference games. The lone loss was to Virginia in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.
- The Terps are the only team in the Big Ten with three players averaging 13.5 or more points per game as Melo Trimble (15.7), Jake Layman (14.1) and Dez Wells (13.5) lead Maryland offensively. Maryland has utilized a total of nine different starting lineups this season with Trimble and Layman being the lone two players to start every game.
- Trimble's 15.7 ppg are eighth in the Big Ten and third among league rookies. He was limited to 3 points, 1 assist and 0-8 shooting from the field in the loss to the Buckeyes.

SERIES HISTORY

- This is the first meeting between Penn State and Maryland as conference foes.
- The Terps lead the all-time series with a 9-8 record and captured the last meeting between the squads, in the 2010 ACC/Big Ten Challenge.
- The teams first met in 1939 and then once a season from 1960-68 with sporadic meetings thereafter.

LAST TIME VS. THE TERPS

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (Dec. 1, 2010) - Penn State jumped out to an early 7-0 lead on Maryland and then put a lid on the basket hitting just 20 percent (14-68) from the floor and 3-of-27 from three (11%) as Maryland (6-2) pulled away in the second half for a 62-39 victory and its fifth-straight ACC/Big Ten Challenge win.

The Nittany Lions fell to 5-2 on the year as Talor Battle logged his Big Ten leading 34th 20-point game (21) and no other Lion logged more than six on the night. Battle was a below average 7-of-21 from the floor as he tried to create for a struggling Lion offense while the rest of the team went 7-of-47. Penn State pulled down 20 offensive boards and got 68 shots to Maryland's 47, but was only able to record eight second chance points, got just three from its bench and went just 5-of-28 in the second half, four of those from Battle.

THREE MORE NOTABLE GAMES

March 19, 1990 (PSU, 80-78): Ed Fogell tallied 20 points to lead Penn State over Maryland in the second round of the NIT in University Park, en route to a third-place tourney finish. This was the lone meeting vs. Maryland under Gary Williams.

Nov. 30, 1968 (UMD, 66-56): The last meeting in College Park was a loss for the Nittany Lions in the 1968-69 season opener.

Dec. 7, 1963 (PSU, 91-62): The largest scoring margin in the series was a 29-point decision in Penn State's favor in 1963. Former Maryland head coach Gary Williams was a freshman on that Terrapin squad. Penn State was 2-2 during Williams' time as a player.

CONNECTIONS

- Three members of the Penn State coaching staff are from the DMV: Associate head coach Keith Urgo (Washington), assistant coach Dwayne Anderson (Silver Spring, Md.) and director of operations Ross Condon (Springfield, Va.).
- Longtime radio analyst Dick Jerardi, a member of the USBWA Hall of Fame, and Alissa Clendenen, the team's sports information director, are both graduates of the University of Maryland.

SCORING DEFENSE | In six of nine Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent under their season scoring average, including each of last four by average of 12.4 points.

14 WINS | It took Penn State 21 games to reach 14 wins on the season, the fewest games since 2008-09 since the Nittany Lions got to 14 wins in the span of 19 games. It took 28 games a year ago.

SHARE THE LOVE | In Penn State's win over Minnesota Jan. 28, nine players saw action and all tallied at least three points. Four players produced or tied career highs in scoring, while the defense posted a season high in steals and helped limit the Gophers to 19.5 points below their season average. [MORE: Page 36]

40 MINUTES | Patrick Chambers said after the Rutgers game Jan. 24 was the first time the Nittany Lions had played 40 full minutes of Penn State basketball. It resulted in 51 percent shooting, a season-high 18 assists, 10 3-pointers and the six-largest win over a Big Ten team in program history. [MORE: Page 36]

ONE-POSSESSION GAMES | Six games this season have been separated by one possession with Penn State winning the first four before falling to Indiana, 76-73, Jan. 13 and Illinois, 60-58, Saturday. A year ago, the Lions had eight games decided by three points or fewer in the regular season. They lost each of the first five and won the last three, giving them a seven-game win streak in regular-season, one-possession games.

FIVE-POINT GAMES | Through 22 games, Penn State has had 10 decided by five points or fewer, winning each of the first six and the last vs. Minnesota (63-58) to stand at 7-3. The three losses have been separated by four (Rutgers), three (Indiana) and two (Illinois) points. Last season, the Lions were 4-8 in regular-season games decided by the same margin. Six of the team's seven Big Ten losses were decided by an average of fewer than five points (4.8)

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT | The Lions currently are producing 69.5 ppg overall and 65.8 in conference play, battling last year's totals for the highest-scoring offensive marks since the 2000-01 team put up 76.8 and 73.8 points per contest. Penn State ended 2013-14 with averages of 70.9 ppg overall and 65.3 ppg in league games.

Despite falling to Wisconsin, 89-72, New Year's Eve in Madison, the team shot 53.7 percent from the field (29-54), the highest clip vs. a Big Ten opponent since 2011 and the seventh-best against a conference foe in 15 years. D.J. Newbill powered PSU with 29 points to make Penn State just the second team to score 70 or more points vs. Wisconsin this season, joining Duke.

FIELD-GOAL DEFENSE | Penn State's opponents are scoring on 40.4 percent of their total shots and 33.3 percent of 3-point attempts, defensive marks which stand as third and sixth all-time since 1965 (among full-season figures). [Page 137 of Media Guide]

BENCH MOB | The PSU bench - which has dubbed itself the Bench Mob - is averaging 20.7 ppg this season, up from 14.7 ppg last season, and has outscored the opponent's bench in 12 games. Reserve players have combined to score more than 30 points in four games this season: Duquesne (35), Michigan (33), Marshall (32) and Dartmouth (31). [MORE: Page 28]

WIN STREAK | Wisconsin snapped Penn State's 10-game winning streak, which was the longest for a PSU team since the 1995-96 squad opened the year going 13-0. The longest single-season win streak in program history was 15 games (1952).

CHAIRMEN OF THE BOARDS | Penn State is seventh among league teams in rebounds with 35.8 per game, up from 35.2 last season. The Lions have outrebounded its opponent in 12 games, going 10-2 in those contests with losses at Indiana and Illinois.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS | The 12 non-conference wins were the most for the Nittany Lions in program history, breaking the previous high of 11 set during the 2008-09 season. In the Big Ten era, Penn State was undefeated in conference play in 1995-96 (9-0) and had one-loss seasons in 2000-01 (9-1) and 1994-95 (8-1).

COMEBACKS | The Lions have battled back from second-half deficits of 14 (Akron), 13 (Cornell), 8 (Virginia Tech) and 6 (Southern California) in wins this season. They trailed Rutgers by 14 Jan. 3 and came to within one late in the second half, and were down 12 to Indiana before closing it to three, but were not able to complete either comeback.

CHARLESTON CLASSIC | The two wins at the Charleston Classic stand as the first multi-win performance at a neutral-site, regular-season tournament for Penn State since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHTS

D.J. NEWBILL | was named one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to the one four-year student-athlete with exceptional accomplishments in all four areas of classroom, community, character and competition. Newbill is one of just two players from the Big Ten among the candidate pool, joining Wisconsin's Frank Kaminsky. [MORE: <http://bit.ly/NewbillSrCLASSAward>]

Newbill is averaging 21.5 ppg, tops in Division I among Power 5 conferences and fifth overall, and 21.6 ppg in Big Ten games only. After posting 20 points to move into No. 5 overall at Penn State, he is averaging nearly 25 ppg in the last five games with 13 outings of at least 20 points and two topping 30, most recently with a record-setting 37-point vs. Purdue Jan. 17. That effort stands as:

- PSU single-game record vs. Big Ten
- 8th-most points in a game all-time
- Most since 1965 (Dick Weiss vs. Duke, 38)

With 1,580 career points at Penn State, Newbill holds the record among players to spend just three years in the Blue and White and is No. 5 all-time overall. He is averaging 18.2 ppg over his three seasons with Penn State, a career scoring average which is second among 1,000-point scorers, behind only Jesse Arnette (1952-55; 21.0 ppg; 2,138 points). He needs just 25 points to take over the No. 4 spot and 28 points to reach 500 for the third-consecutive season. [More: Page 17-18]

BRANDON TAYLOR | has missed the last two games with a mild knee sprain. He is second on the team in scoring with 9.9 points per game. Over the last four games he has played, Taylor is averaging 9.2 ppg in the first half alone and is shooting 53 percent from behind the arc in last three games. He produced the team's first double-double of the season and the first of his career with 14 points and 11 rebounds in win vs. Drexel Dec. 20. [MORE: Page 18]

SHEP GARNER | is third on the team in both scoring (9.5 ppg) and assists (2.3 apg) as a freshman. He has scored 10+ in all but nine games this season, and has seen increased assist and rebound numbers when limited in scoring. He has tied his career-high 14 points four times, most recently at Illinois [More: Page 12]

GENO THORPE | has started each of the last four games and five this season. In the last four games, he has led the team with 12 assists (3.0 apg) and seven steals (1.8 spg), while averaging 6.0 ppg. Thorpe was the top scorer off the bench with 8.4 points per game as a reserve.

Thorpe has produced and then topped career highs twice this season. He leads the team and is third in the Big Ten with 87 percent free-throw shooting. He is 71-82 from the line overall and 22-24 (92 percent) in league action. [MORE: Page 20]

DEVIN FOSTER | finished the Minnesota game last Wednesday with eight points and was perfect from the field (3-3) and free throw line (2-2). Foster saw action in just two non-conference games while getting up to speed after transferring from a junior college this semester. Over the last five games, Foster is fifth on the team in scoring with 4.6 ppg and 2.6 rebounds in 18.2 minutes. [MORE: Page 11]

DONOVAN JACK | is 12-13 from the free-throw line in the last seven games combined and is averaging 5.0 ppg during the stretch. UP NEXT

The Nittany Lions return to the Bryce Jordan Center to face Nebraska at 4 p.m. Saturday on ESPN. The Huskers are 12-9 on the season and 4-5 in the Big Ten with a home game vs. Northwestern scheduled for Tuesday night in Lincoln. Nebraska is 0-4 on the road in league play, falling at Indiana, Iowa, Wisconsin, Michigan and Minnesota.

Terran Petteway is the team's leading scorer at 18.6 ppg and is third in the league behind D.J. Newbill and Ohio State's D'Angelo Russell. Shavon Shields is behind Petteway with 16.3 ppg and a team-leading 6.4 rpg.

SEASON NOTES

PENN STATE AND THE BIG TEN TAKE NYC

The Big Ten Conference announced a four-year men's basketball and men's hockey doubleheader series in Madison Square Garden, set to begin in 2016 with Penn State vs. Michigan Jan. 30. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

Additionally, the 2018 Big Ten Tournament will take place in MSG, scheduled for Feb. 28-March 4 with all 14 conference programs competing for the Big Ten's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. The 2018 event will be held one week earlier than previous tournaments, ending seven days before NCAA Tournament Selection Sunday.

THROWBACK UNIS

Penn State wore new throwback uniforms at Bucknell Nov. 28 and vs. Virginia Tech Dec. 3, going 2-0. The unis are black and pink, honoring the school's original school colors established in 1887. The color pairing lasted just 2.5 years. Problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new choice was made on March 18, 1890.

PLAYER LEADERSHIP

The team elected four captains prior to the start of the season -- D.J. Newbill, who is in his third season as a captain, along with two-time captain Ross Travis, Brandon Taylor and Kevin Montminy. Those four, along with Alan Wisniewski, make up Patrick Chambers' Leadership Council, which the staff relies on for decision making, providing guidance and helping everyone be the best possible teammate.

CHAMBERS BEGINS YEAR FOUR

The 2014-15 season marks the fourth in University Park for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native has seen his win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season as he racked up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State, a road win at Indiana and his first PSU postseason appearance last season.

ROOKIES LOOK TO MAKE IMPACT

Three new faces join the veteran core of Nittany Lions. Devin Foster, a junior college transfer, along with freshmen Shep Garner and Isaiah Washington as Penn State rookies. Garner (Chester, Pa.) and Washington (Williamsport, Pa.) bring the number of Pennsylvania natives on the roster to eight, including four from the Philadelphia area.

MONTMINY EARNS SCHOLARSHIP

Kevin Montminy was awarded a scholarship for the 2014-15 season, Patrick Chambers announced in early August. A three-year walk-on, Montminy has seen action in 40 career games over the last three seasons with 24 total points and 10 rebounds. With a 4.0 grade-point average in each of the last five semesters, Montminy is a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, Academic All-Big Ten honoree and the team's Academic Award recipient.

CHARLESTON CLASSIC

The Nittany Lions are slated to take part in the 2014 Charleston Classic, Nov. 20-23 in Charleston, S.C. They will open play in the tourney by taking on Charlotte at 5 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 20 on ESPNU and then will face either South Carolina or Cornell on the second day of the three-day event. The remaining teams in the field include Akron, Drexel, Miami (Fla.), and Southern California.

OFFSEASON TRAINING

The Nittany Lions made headlines with their extensive offseason-training regimen. Strength coach Brandon Spayd designed a three-part workout challenge for team members called the Yoke Zone Challenge. Players pushed cars, crawled through sandpits and completed a number of demanding stations in an obstacle course setting. Kevin Montminy and Jordan Dickerson were the top pair among players completed the entire course each week.

Patrick Chambers and his staff also brought in The Program, a leadership development and team building program created and executed by former military personnel. Players completed two days of extensive mental and physical tasks designed to build better leaders and more cohesive teams.

CHAMBERS ADDS ANOTHER FORMER PLAYER TO STAFF

D.J. Irving, a four-year member of the men's basketball team at Boston University, joined the Penn State staff as a graduate manager for the 2014-15 season. He replaced Andrew Jones, who is an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Thunder's D-League team. Irving is the fourth player coached by Chambers to join his staff. Assistant coach Dwayne Anderson and Ross Condon, director of operations, both played at Villanova with Chambers as an assistant and associate head coach. Irving came into the fold at Boston University and fellow PSU graduate manager Nicholas Colella played two seasons for Chambers as a Lion.

PENN STATE OPENS THE 119TH SEASON

Penn State is competing in its 119th season on the hardwood and its 23rd as a member of the Big Ten conference. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule for the third year in a row. The Lions have made 13 postseason appearances in the last 26 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

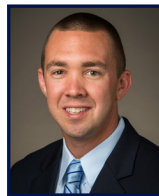

Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It was also shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

SCORING

D.J. Newbill has 1,580 points in his third and final season wearing the Blue and White and ranks No. 5 all-time in career scoring. He also holds the record for scoring among three-year players, passing John Amaechi's 1,310 points with 17 at Marshall Dec. 6.

With 25 more points, Newbill will take over the No. 4 spot at Penn State. With 28 more points, Newbill will reach 500 points and become just the second PSU player to do so in three-consecutive seasons, joining Talor Battle.

REBOUNDS

Ross Travis, who has led the Nittany Lions in rebounding each of the last two seasons and is among the top returning rebounders in the Big Ten, entered the Top 10 in career boards at Penn State. He currently has 745 and is tied for No. 6.

By producing the average of his last two seasons (7.2), Travis will entrench himself in the No. 3 spot all-time.

BLOCKS

Donovon Jack entered Penn State's Top 10 with one block vs. Fordham (11/16). He is now ranked No. 8 and has 75 with all but three coming after his freshman season. His 53 blocks as a sophomore are the eighth-most in a single season and the most since the 1998-99 season. Only Calvin Booth, who owns positions 1-4, and John Amaechi (spots 5-7) rank above Jack.

Brandon Taylor needs two blocks to enter the Top 10 at Penn State. He is second on the team this season with 17 (0.9 per game).

Jordan Dickerson has 31 blocks this season and is averaging 1.4 per game, which ranks ninth in the Big Ten. Last season, Dickerson produced 29 blocks in the 22 games he was eligible to compete last season, an average of 1.3 per game. That average would have placed him among the Top 10 in the Big Ten last season had he reached the minimum number of games to be ranked.

Charleston, S.C. (AP) - D.J. Newbill had 26 points including the driving layup as the buzzer sounded to lift Penn State to a 72-71 victory over Cornell at the Charleston Classic on Friday night.

The Big Red (2-3) were up 71-70 with four seconds left but threw the inbound pass into the backcourt to beat the five-second clock. Geno Thorpe picked it up and passed to Newbill on the left side. Newbill dribbled the baseline and went up for the winning shot before time ran out.

It was the first lead for Penn State (3-1) since going up 4-2 less than three minutes into the game.

John Johnson had 17 points, including a high arcing 3-pointer with 4.5 seconds left that drew the Nittany Lions to 71-70.

Galal Cancer and Robert Hatter had 17 points each for Cornell, which faces Drexel for seventh place game Sunday.

It was a dramatic change of fortune for the Nittany Lions in Charleston. They rallied from 17 points down against Charlotte on Thursday night only to fall 106-97 in double overtime.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State trailed by as many as 13 before erasing an 11-point second-half deficit to earn the win with a buzzer-beating layup from D.J. Newbill.
- The 13-point deficit is the largest comeback for a win since the Nittany Lions overcame a 13-point disadvantage to defeat Indiana on the road, 66-65, Feb. 12, 2014.
- Penn State led for all of :07 in the entire contest. The game-winning bucket was its first advantage since the 17:38 mark in the first half.
- The game featured seven ties and three lead changes. Cornell led for 32:39 of the game.
- Penn State moves to 6-5 all-time against the Big Red, while head coach Patrick Chambers moves to 3-0 against Cornell in his career at both Penn State and Boston University.
- With 26 points, D.J. Newbill recorded his second-consecutive 20-plus point outing this season and 22nd of his career.
- Newbill tallied 15 first-half points going 3-3 from 3-point range and 4-8 from the field. He finished the evening 4-5 from the 3-point line.
- John Johnson set a season-high mark with 17 points, shooting 6-9 from the field and 4-4 from the free-throw line.
- Thirteen of Johnson's 17 points came in the second half, including a 3-pointer with :04 on the clock to make it a one-point game, 71-70
- Shep Garner put up double-figure scoring (10) for the fourth consecutive game of his career.
- With two steals, his final steal of the evening led to Newbill's game-winning buzzer-beater.

Charleston, S.C. (AP) - If Penn State wanted to close the Charleston Classic with a victory, coach Pat Chambers knew D.J. Newbill would have to make the biggest plays.

Newbill came through with 16 of his 22 points in the second half in the Nittany Lions' 63-61 win over Southern Cal in Sunday's fifth place game. He finished the three games with 83 points to set the tournament scoring mark, surpassing the 78 scored by St. Joseph's Carl Jones in 2011.

Penn State opened 4-1 for the third time in Chambers' four seasons.

After the Trojans (2-3) built a 49-43 lead with just under 10 minutes left, Newbill scored 10 of Penn State's next 13 points in their go-ahead run. His second 3-pointer put the Nittany Lions ahead to stay at 56-54.

Southern Cal was still within 62-60 on Jordan McLaughlin's foul shot with 1.3 seconds left. But Shep Garner made a foul shot with 0.7 seconds left to provide the final game.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The two wins at the 2014 Charleston Classic mark the first time Penn State has won at least two games at a neutral site tournament since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic at Madison Square Garden. The Nittany Lions knocked off Princeton, 65-52, Dec. 26 and Hofstra, 74-71, Dec. 27 before going on to the NCAA Sweet 16 that season.
- The Nittany Lions limited the Trojans to 27.3 percent from the field marking the second time this season Penn State has held a team to less than 30 percent from the field.
- PSU matched a season-high mark with seven team 3-pointers, marking the second-consecutive game the Nittany Lions have reached the mark.
- The Nittany Lions did not attempt a free-throw until the 7:57 mark of the second half. USC had a 22-0 advantage in free-throw attempts to that point and finished with a 27-10 margin.
- With 83 points across all three games of the Charleston Classic, D.J. Newbill now holds the scoring record for the most points in tournament history. The previous record was held by Saint Joseph's Carl Jones (2011) with 78 points.
- Newbill averaged 27.7 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.3 steals over the last three games, while shooting 50 percent from 3-point range, 47 percent from the field and 85 percent from the free-throw line.

LEWISBURG, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill had 28 points and Penn State pulled away late for an 88-80 victory over Bucknell on Friday. The Nittany Lions (6-1) never trailed but never led by more than 12.

Bucknell (2-5) tied the game once, at 66-all, with 6:19 to play. Penn State answered with a 12-4 run and held steady from there with Newbill scoring six of the Nittany Lions' last 10 points to secure the win.

Ross Travis added 14 points, and Brandon Taylor and Geno Thorpe had 12 apiece. Penn State was 8 of 15 from 3-point range and 30 of 54 from the field.

The Bison used a 16-6 run to pull even late in the second half, but Chris Hass and John Azzarino turned the ball over on consecutive possessions to halt the momentum.

Haas cut the deficit to 83-78 on a 3-pointer with 1:07 left and the Bison would get no closer. Penn State led 39-33 at halftime, and Newbill scored 21 of his 28 in the second half. Taylor's 3-pointer with 6:18 left in the first half gave Penn State its largest lead at 31-19. The Bison answered with nine straight points.

POSTGAME NOTES

- With the 88-80 win on the road at Bucknell, Penn State improves to 6-1 on the road, marking the second consecutive year PSU has opened the year with a 6-1 mark under head coach Patrick Chambers.
- The Nittany Lions are 3-1 away from the Bryce Jordan Center and 1-0 after their first true road game. The team has won their first true away game in each of the last two seasons.
- The win also extends the current Nittany Lion winning streak to four straight, marking the third consecutive season PSU has put together a four-game winning streak.
- The Nittany Lions went 30-54 from the field for a season-high 56 percent mark in the win. Penn State also made 20 of 26 attempts from the free throw line for a season-high 77 percent from the charity stripe.
- In the first half alone, Penn State shot 86 percent from the 3-point line, nailing six three's, while also shooting 54 percent from the field in the opening half.
- Penn State made eight 3-pointers for a season-high mark during regulation games. Eight treys also marks the fourth-consecutive game the Nittany Lions have netted at least seven 3's. Penn State finished the night 8-15 (53%) from 3-point range marking the first time PSU has shot 50 percent from three since 2/27/13 against Michigan (10-20, 50%).

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Patrick Chambers was eager to point out that Penn State's defense played a huge role in the Nittany Lions' 61-58 ACC-Big Ten Challenge victory over Virginia Tech Wednesday night. D.J. Newbill scored 18 points and Shep Garner added 13 for Penn State (7-1), but the Lions crafted a 47-38 edge in rebounding. They were led by 10 from Ross Travis, eight from Jordan Dickerson and seven each from Brandon Taylor and Donovan Jack.

Penn State limited the Hokies (4-3) to 38.5 percent shooting from the field and 28.6 from 3-point range during the back-and-forth game in which a 16-2 second-half run turned momentum in Penn State's favor. It was the fourth one-possession game Penn State has played this season.

Joey van Zegeren scored 18 points for the Hokies and Justin Bibbs added 16. But Tech hit only 4 of 14 free throws and 4 of 14 3-pointers. The Hokies (4-3) led by as many as eight points early in the second half but Penn State's Newbill scored 13 second-half points after a 1-of-5 first-half shooting performance.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Penn State victory extends the Nittany Lions winning streak to five in a row, putting PSU out to its best start (7-1) under head coach Patrick Chambers and for the program since the 2008-09 campaign.
- Eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points in the win, led by D.J. Newbill and Shep Garner, who each recorded double figure scoring.
- Powered by a 16-2 run in the second half, Penn State came from behind by as many eight, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have come back from down by more than six to win (14 vs. Akron, 6 vs. USC and 13 vs. Cornell).
- Penn State trailed by as many as seven in the first half (17-10, 10-38), before closing out the opening frame with nine unanswered points to enter the intermission with a three-point lead, 30-27.
- Penn State out-rebounded Virginia Tech 47-38, posting a season-high mark on the boards and the most since Dec. 7, 2013 vs. Marshall.
- Penn State wore its throwback uniform for the second time this season, improving to 2-0. The pink and black jerseys honor the original schools colors of the University, which were established in 1887.
- Penn State moves to 6-8 in its 14th Challenge appearance, winning its first since 2011.
- With 1,301 career points, Newbill moves into the No. 15 spot on the Penn State all-time scoring list. He needs nine more points to match John Amaechi (1,310; 1993-95) for No. 14 and for the record among players to spend just three years of action at Penn State.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 17 points, Geno Thorpe added 12 and Penn State defeated Dartmouth 69-49 Monday for its 10th straight win and a school-record 12th non-conference victory.

John Johnson and Brandon Taylor each added 10 points for Penn State (12-1), which held Dartmouth to 19 of 54 from the field and 2 of 20 from 3-point range. The Nittany Lions shot 47 percent from the field and had a 38-30 edge in rebounding. Alex Mitola had 13 points and Gabas Maldunas had nine to lead Dartmouth (5-6).

Dartmouth opened the second half with more energy, outscoring the Lions 15-11 over the initial 7 1/2 minutes. But the Big Green struggled to stay consistent and remained cold from long range as well as at the foul line. Penn State led by 25 with 10:30 remaining but Maldunas was good on four free throws and Malik Gill lobbed a pass over the basket that Wesley Dickinson slammed through to close Dartmouth's deficit to 60-42. Newbill followed with a driving layup, got the ball from Ross Travis on a team and fed Travis for an easy slam and a 64-42 advantage.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The win against Dartmouth marked the 12th non-conference victory of the season, a program-best mark for Penn State.
- The Nittany Lions extended their winning streak to 10 in a row with a victory against the Big Green. The winning streak is the longest since the 1995-96 season when PSU opened the season 13-0. The 12-1 start also is the best mark since the 1995-96 campaign.
- The 10-game win streak is the longest among all 14 Big Ten teams. Penn State is the first conference team to reach 12 wins this season.
- Penn State limited Dartmouth to a season-low 16 first-half points marking the fewest amount of points allowed in the first half since Northwestern scored 15 on March 16, 2014. The 69-49 final score also marks the first time the Nittany Lions have recorded a 20-point margin of victory since defeating the Wildcats 59-32 in 2014.
- The Nittany Lion bench contributed 31 points in the win, led by double figure scoring from John Johnson (10) and Geno Thorpe (12). Having recorded more than 20 points in nine games this season, the Nittany Lion bench is averaging 22.0 ppg this season. Non-starters produced 15.1 ppg a year ago.
- Along with Johnson and Thorpe, D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor posted double figures with 17 and 10, respectively, marking the fifth time this season the Nittany Lions have had four record double digit scoring.
- Penn State improves to 7-0 in the Bryce Jordan Center, marking the most consecutive victories at home for the Nittany Lions since 2007-08, when PSU recorded eight in a row from Nov. 12 - Dec. 31, 2007. They have won each of their last 12 non-conference games in the BJC.
- A season-high tallying 13 players saw action for the Nittany Lions with 10 of them tallying points. Thirteen players also took the court opening weekend vs. Fordham.

MADISON, Wis. (AP) - Frank Kaminsky had 18 points and 14 rebounds, Nigel Hayes scored 21 points and No. 4 Wisconsin shot a blistering 63 percent from the field to beat Penn State 89-72 on Wednesday. The Badgers (13-1) won their sixth straight with Kaminsky leading a balanced attack. The preseason All-American had secured his sixth double-double of the season by midway through the second half with Wisconsin comfortably ahead by double digits.

D.J. Newbill scored 29 points for Penn State (12-2), which had its 10-game winning streak snapped. The Big Ten's leading scorer was 5-of-11 shooting in the second half after going 6 of 7 in the first. Wisconsin's athletic frontcourt asserted control after halftime, with Kaminsky and Hayes getting to the basket at will. Forward Sam Dekker scored 17 after shooting 7 of 10 from the field.

The Nittany Lions withered on both ends of the court to start the second half, when Wisconsin went on an 8-2 run to take a 51-38 lead with 17:03 left on Traevon Jackson's 3-pointer. It was in sharp contrast to the opening 20 minutes, when Penn State stayed step-for-step for much of the time with Wisconsin.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions scored more points against Wisconsin than any other team this season. As one of two teams to score 70 points against the Badgers, only Duke has been able to put up at least 70 points.
- The Penn State bench tallied 28 points, led by 11 points from Geno Thorpe. The PSU bench is averaging 22.0 ppg this season, up from 15.1 ppg in non-conference games last season.
- Penn State shot 53.7 percent from the field (29-54) against the Badgers, marking a season-best for the Nittany Lions. PSU opened the game shooting 64 percent in the first half alone.
- Three Nittany Lions recorded double figures, led by D.J. Newbill, who put up a team-high 29 points.
- Penn State's 10-game winning streak came to an end as the Nittany Lions move to 12-2 on the year with the loss.
- Penn State moves to 2-1 in true road games this season and 7-16 in Big Ten openers.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 20 points and John Johnson added 16, but the Penn State men's basketball team fell to Michigan 73-64, Tuesday night at the Bryce Jordan Center.

The Wolverines' Caris LeVert scored 18 points, while Zak Irvin added 17 and Michigan converted on free throws down the stretch to hold off the Nittany Lions. Michigan also had a 31-26 rebounding edge on Penn State as Irvin pulled down nine.

It was the Big Ten home opener for Penn State, which fell to 0-3 in conference play and 12-4 overall. Michigan (9-6, 2-1 Big Ten), relied on 3-point shooting from Irvin, LeVert and Aubrey Dawkins who each had two as the Wolverines were 9 of 13 from 3-point range and 24 of 45 overall. Each team was stale offensively to open the second half, but Penn State rallied with a 12-2 run that featured slams from Donovan Jack and Jordan Dickerson, and a Newbill 3-pointer and a nifty drive through the lane to tie the game at 53 at the 7:36 mark.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions had an eight-game Bryce Jordan Center winning streak snapped, dating back to the CBI last season. They opened the year 7-0 on their home floor.
- Penn State earned its first lead of the game following a 14-4 run during a seven-minute stretch in the first half to go up 21-17 after trailing 13-7.
- The Lions went on another lengthy run, this time 12-2 during a four minute stretch midway through the second half, tying the contest at 53 after being down 51-41.
- With D.J. Newbill's 20 points and John Johnson's 16, the Lions have now had at least a pair of players in double-digits in each game this season.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP) - Penn State was led by Ross Travis and Shep Garner, who each had 14, but a late charge from Indiana was enough to hold off the Nittany Lions 76-73 on Tuesday.

The Hoosiers (13-4, 3-1 Big Ten) have won two straight but had to survive a replay review on Brandon Taylor's 3-pointer that would have forced overtime. Officials determined the shot came after the buzzer.

It was not quite enough to snap a four-game losing streak, but Penn State (12-5, 0-4) certainly had a chance. The Nittany Lions cut a 12-point deficit to 76-73 on Travis' basket with 53.1 seconds to go. After a defensive stop, they took possession on a jump ball with 14.6 seconds left. But D.J. Newbill's contested 3 from the left wing was off and after Taylor grabbed the rebound, raced to the arc and made the shot, the refs waved it off.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions starting lineup of D.J. Newbill, Donovan Jack, Brandon Taylor, Shep Garner and Ross Travis took the court for the eighth time this season (6-2). All five starters finished in double-figure scoring.
- Geno Thorpe posted 10 points, making him the sixth Nittany Lion with double figure scoring, marking the first time PSU has had six in double figures since 12/19/2009 vs. Gardner Webb.
- Penn State scored 18 of its 39 first-half points in the paint, finishing the game with a season-high 46 points in the paint. The mark is the highest since 3/2/14 vs. Wisconsin when the Nittany Lions tallied 50.
- The Nittany Lions have had five one-possession games this season with this standing as the first loss. They won each of their last three games decided by three points or fewer last season for a seven-game streak.
- Eight games this season have been decided by five or fewer points with Penn State winning the first six in non-conference play and dropping the last two to Big Ten teams.
- PSU picked up eight steals against the Hoosiers, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have recorded at least eight steals.
- D.J. Newbill finished second on the team with 12 points, scoring 10 in the first half alone for his 17th consecutive double-figure scoring outing of the season.
- With 1,461 career points, Newbill moved into ninth on the Penn State career scoring list. He needs 81 more points to match Geary Claxton (2005-08) for eighth all-time.
- Ross Travis finished tied for first on the team with a season-high tying 14 points. It is the first time he has led or shared the lead in the team in scoring since Dec. 7, 2013 when he tallied 20 points vs. Marshall.

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Despite a game-high 27 points from D.J. Newbill, Michigan State slipped past Penn State in a 66-60 decision on the road in East Lansing Wednesday evening.

Newbill, the nation's No. 4 scorer, had 18 of his 27 points in the second half and nearly gave the Nittany Lions (12-7, 0-6) their first win since Dec. 22.

Brandon Dawson had 12 points, 10 rebounds and three blocked shots to help Michigan State outlast Penn State. Gavin Schilling added 11 points and 10 rebounds for the Spartans (13-6, 4-2 Big Ten). Denzel Valentine scored 11 points and Travis Trice and Matt Castello 10 each.

The Nittany Lions battled back from an eight-point first half deficit to tie the game at 37-37 in the opening part of the second half. Despite keeping it tight, a technical foul on frustrated Penn State coach Patrick Chambers helped Michigan State pull away when the game was tied for the final time at 51. A short jumper from Valentine with 4:04 left gave the Spartans the lead for good at 53-51.

POSTGAME NOTES

- D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor paced the offense with double figure scoring, led by a game-high 27 points from Newbill.
- Eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points, with a total of 10 seeing time on the court.
- The Nittany Lions trailed by as many as eight, but tied up the game seven times in the second half alone. They were never able to take the lead.
- The last five games have been decided by an average of fewer than six points (5.8), with two being separated by three and four points (Rutgers, Indiana).
- Penn State committed just three turnovers in the opening frame while converting eight points off of eight MSU miscues in the first half.
- The Nittany Lions shot 42.6 percent from the floor for the game and 57.9 percent in the second half.
- After shooting 23 percent from behind the arc in the first half, the Nittany Lions improved to 67 percent in the second half, going 4-for-6 from 3-point range.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 23 points and Brandon Taylor 16 to lead Penn State to a 79-51 win over Rutgers on Saturday for its first Big Ten Conference victory of the season.

The Nittany Lions (13-7, 1-6 Big Ten), losers of six straight games, never trailed after taking a 16-15 lead with just over 10 minutes to play in the opening half. The 28-point spread was Penn State's largest margin of victory since December 2011 against Mount St. Mary's (29).

Shep Garner added 13 points for Penn State, including three 3-pointers. Penn State shot 10 of 20 from 3-point range and its first 12 points of the game were 3-pointers.

Rutgers (10-11, 2-6) was led by 19 points from Kadeem Mack, the only Scarlet Knight in double figures. Rutgers shot just 10 of 27 in the second half after going 11 of 21 in the first half. The Knights were 3 of 13 from 3-point range.

Penn State forced 16 Rutgers turnovers while committing just nine of its own, and also owned a 32-28 edge in rebounding.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State's 28-point margin of victory is tied for the sixth-largest win against a Big Ten team in program history and is the largest at home since defeating Northwestern by 38, 83-45, on Jan. 22, 1998.
- The win is the first 20-point Big Ten victory since the Nittany Lions defeated Northwestern 59-32 (27) March 6, 2014 on the road in Evanston. The win also marks the most recent 20-point margin of victory at home against a conference team since PSU topped Purdue 65-45 (20) January 5, 2012.
- PSU totaled 41 first-half points, marking a season high total for the Nittany Lions in Big Ten play this year. The first half tally also marks the first time Penn State has reached the number in Big Ten action since January 11, 2014 and the first half vs. Indiana (41-37).
- The Nittany Lions tallied a Big Ten season-high 10 3-pointers, marking the first time PSU has notched double-digit treys since February 27, 2013 against Michigan. In the opening half alone, Penn State shot 75 percent from 3-point range, sinking 6-of-8 attempts.
- Penn State hit 50 percent of its 3-point attempts on the game for the first time in Big Ten play this season. The Lions season-best performance was 53.3 percent (8-15) at Bucknell.
- Penn State shot above 50 percent from the field for the third time this season and the first time in the Bryce Jordan Center. The Lions finished 50.9 percent from the field (29-57) for the highest shooting percentage at home vs. league teams since also hitting 50.9 percent of shots vs. Northwestern Feb. 25, 2012.
- Nine players tallied points for the Nittany Lions, including three in double figures. Penn State is 6-1 on the season with three players top 10 points.
- The Nittany Lions converted a season-high 21 points off of 16 Scarlet Knight turnovers.
- Penn State totaled a season-high 18 assists, while also matching a season-low mark with just nine turnovers.
- Penn State wore its alternate gray uniforms for the third time this season, improving to 3-0 in them.

CHAMPAIGN, ILL. (AP) - D.J. Newbill led Penn State with 20 points, but the Nittany Lions fell to Illinois 60-58 in a game that came down to the very last play.

Illinois forward Malcolm Hill scored 27 points Saturday including two on a layup with four seconds left in the game to put Illinois up by two. Newbill raced down the court and drove to the basket but couldn't convert on the layup as time expired.

Shep Garner added 14 for Penn State. Julian Moore posted a career-high 10 points for the Nittany Lions, having entered the game averaging just 1.1 points a game.

The biggest lead of the afternoon was eight, in the first five minutes for Illinois. Kendrick Nunn added 10 points for Illinois. Leron Black had a game-high seven rebounds.

Penn State outrebounded Illinois 32-26, while making 42% of their shots and holding Illinois to 38% shooting. Illinois -- if you take away its 8-of-15 3-point shooting -- shot just 31.6 percent from the field.

The Nittany Lions will play their second straight on the road, traveling to Maryland on Wednesday.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Three Nittany Lions recorded double figure scoring, featuring a team-high 20 points from D.J. Newbill and a career-high 10 points for Julian Moore.
- Six games this season have been separated by one possession with PSU winning the first four before falling short in the last two (Indiana and Illinois). In Big Ten play, six of the team's seven Big Ten losses have been decided by an average of 4.8 points.
- Through 22 games, Penn State has had a total of 10 games decided by five points or fewer, having won the most recent close call earlier this week against Minnesota (63-58).
- Penn State limited Illinois to 60 total points, which is 13.5 points below the Illini's 73.5 ppg average entering the game.
