AROUND THE HORN

» The 2022 season marks the 32nd in NCAA Division I. It marks the first time since 2019 that the Panthers open the year against a team they have never faced before. That season, MKE faced Marshall in the opener on February 15.

» Head Coach Scott Doffek, the winningest coach in Milwaukee history, begins his 16th season at the helm. Doffek surpassed Jerry Augustine with victory No. 348 on March 26, 2019. He is just two victories away from No. 400.

» With 22 wins a season ago, the Panthers crossed 1,000 program wins. The Panthers baseball team joined the men's basketball team and volleyball team as the only in the department to reach the 1,000-victory plateau.

» It is a young group for Doffek with over half of the 39-man roster labeled as underclassmen. The Panthers' upperclassmen include graduate transfer Curtis Sheahan and seniors Mitchell Buban, Mike Edwards, Adam LaRock, Jack Mahoney, and Zach Nogalski.

» After having the 2020 season canceled due to COVID-19, Milwaukee finally got a chance to break in its new home venue, Franklin Field. The Panthers recorded a four-game sweep of Purdue Fort Wayne to open the new digs. Franklin Field opened in the summer of 2019 and seats 4,000 fans. It is also home to the Milwaukee Milkmen of the American Association of Independent Professional Baseball.

Game one of the three-game series is set for 4:00 pm CT on Friday, March 18. The two will then meet at 12:00 pm CT on Saturday before wrapping up on Sunday at 10:00 am CT from Medlar Field at Lubrano Park.

SCOUTING THE NITTANY LIONS

Penn State most recently wrapped up a series win over UMass, taking two of three games including a 1-0 victory on March 13 where it held the Minutemen to just one hit.

The Nittany Lions sit at 5-9 overall and will play at home for the first time this weekend after canceling two home midweek games against Niagara.

Penn State has a tall task this year, replacing a 2021 rotation that featured three MLB draft selections in Conor Larkin, Kyle Virbitsky, and Bailey Dees. The Nittany Lions new rotation features three newcomers while their roster has 16 total newcomers including 12 freshmen.

Matt Wood, a Second Team All-Big Ten award winner in 2021, leads the team this season with a .340 batting average and 12 RBI. The junior was tabbed as the top catcher in the Big Ten and 16th-best in the country.

SERIES HISTORY

This weekend marks the first all-time matchup between Milwaukee and Penn State. The Panthers have history of scheduling Big Ten opponents but have not yet faced the Nittany Lions.

BACK-TO-BACK

For the second consecutive week, a Panthers' pitcher earned Horizon League Pitcher of the Week honors. Riley Frey collected his first weekly award on Tuesday following an solid outing at Dayton.

The sophomore was lights out on Friday, leading the Panthers to a 6-2 win over Dayton. He earned the win, tossing 6.2 scoreless innings while scattering just three hits and striking out eight.

The award comes one week after Nick Gilhaus was named Horizon League Pitcher of the Week behind an impressive win at BYU. Gilhaus threw six scoreless innings and struck out five while allowing just four hits to lead MKE to a 2-0 shutout win against the Cougars.

EARNING THE FRIDAY SLOT

Riley Frey got comfortable as the Panthers' ace a year ago and has earned the right to be in that spot again this season.

Through four starts, Frey has struck out a team-best 24 batters in 21.2 innings.

Outside of one slipup at No. 11 Arizona, Frey owns a 2.97 ERA with 19 strikeouts in 18.2 innings.

Frey currently ranks third in the Horizon League in strikeouts and leads the league with two victories.

PERFECT ON THE PATHS

Milwaukee added four more stolen bases in the win over Dayton last weekend to improve to 28-for-28 this season.

The Panthers stole all over the base paths in the season's opening series, going 17-for-17 in Alabama. In game three of the series, the Panthers were a perfect 11-for-11 in stolen bases. The 11 swipes set a new program record, topping the previous mark of 10 which was set against Butler on April 10, 2010.

Milwaukee currently leads the Horizon League and ranks 39th in the nation with 28 stolen bases. The Panthers' number of 2.6 stolen bases per game ranks 10th among NCAA Division I opponents.

Luke Seidel leads the league with eight stolen bases while Aaron Chapman (6 steals) and Mitchell Buban (5 steals) rank second and fourth, respectively.

CLEAN SHEET

After totaling 10 fielding errors in the four-game series in Arizona, Milwaukee has cleaned up the defense and has not had one error in the last 34 innings of play.

The Panthers improved their fielding percentage to .963 which ranks third in the Horizon League.

GETTING COMFORTABLE

Transfer Aaron Chapman has quickly settled into a starting role with the Panthers and is finding his groove offensively. At BYU, Chapman led the team going 5-for-14 from the plate with three runs and three RBI.

Scott Doffek, the 2013 Wisconsin Baseball Coaches Association College Coach of the Year and two-time Horizon League Coach of the Year, enters his 15th year as the head coach of the Milwaukee Panthers in 2021. A mainstay in the MKE baseball program, Doffek enters his 27th season with the Milwaukee coaching staff after spending the first 12 of those years as the assistant head coach.



The 2020 season was limited to just 15 games due to COVID-19, but did include a victory over No. 17 Wake Forest to mark the third defeat of a ranked opponent in the last five years. The offseason also included a special moment for the program when Daulton Varsho - who played for Doffek from 2015 to 2017 - made his MLB debut with the Arizona Diamondbacks in July, marking the first Panther to play in Major League Baseball in program history.

Doffek became just the second coach in program history to top 300 career wins in 2017, becoming the program leader with victory No. 348 in March of 2019.

The Panthers posted a runner-up finish in the Horizon League regular season and tournament in 2019, finishing in the Top 25 in the NCAA in numerous categories, including batting average, hits, doubles and runs-per-game. Two players - Jake Sommers (Round 10/St. Louis) and Trevor Schwewe (Round 13/Toronto) - were selected in the 2019 Major League Baseball Draft.

The pair made it nine MLB-draftees in the past five years under Doffek and 23 in school history. In fact, Doffek has now coached a list of 47 players that have been either drafted by Major League Baseball or signed by professional teams.

He added 26 wins to his career total in 2018, with his team coming up one victory short of a spot in the Horizon League Tournament title game. Seven players earned postseason league honors and Austin Schulfer was selected in the MLB Draft.

Four players earned All-Horizon League honors and two more players - Daulton Varsho and Adam Reuss - were selected in the MLB Draft in 2017. At pick No. 68, Varsho became the highest-drafted player in program history, as well as the second-highest Horizon League player ever selected when the Arizona Diamondbacks tabbed the All-American junior.

He led the team to 32 victories in 2016, the first back-to-back seasons of 30-plus wins since 2001-02. Picked fourth in the preseason poll, the Panthers finished second behind the efforts of Horizon League Player of the Year Daulton Varsho and Horizon League Pitcher of the Year Brian Keller. Keller went on to be drafted by the New York Yankees. The squad also reset program records for stolen bases and strikeouts by the pitching staff for the second year in a row.

The program enjoyed a record-breaking season in 2015, tying the school record along the way with an impressive total of 39 victories. The team broke records for strikeouts by the pitching staff as well as offensive records that stood the test of time when they reset standards for stolen bases (last established in 2001) and triples (1997). The pitching staff recorded the second-best ERA in program history and the Panthers tied a school mark with 17 wins at home. And it all came in a campaign that ended just one win shy of a trip to the NCAA Tournament, falling in the Horizon League Tournament Championship.

Doffek saw three of his players get selected in the 2015 MLB Draft for the second time in program history when Justin Langley (Miami Marlins/16th round), Sam Koenig (Los Angeles Angels/27th round) and Mitch Ghelfi (Milwaukee Brewers/28th round) were all chosen. The trio gives the Panthers 18 selections all-time in the MLB Draft, including eight since 2011. In addition to the three players drafted, the team also had two more sign professional contracts. In fact, Doffek has now coached a list of 39 players that have been either drafted by Major League Baseball or signed by professional teams.

The Panthers claimed the Horizon League regular-season title in 2013, riding a strong offense that led the league in batting average, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, runs, hits and RBI while also recording the second-best ERA in the conference and the lowest opponent batting average. They went undefeated at home for the first-time in program history and ended the season with the longest active winning streak at home (16 games) at the NCAA Division I level.

The team had the Horizon League Player, Pitcher and Newcomer of the Year on its roster and ended the season with the league's leading hitter as well as five of the top 10 batters in the conference. Doffek ended up as the 2013 Horizon League Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Then, in the MLB Draft in June, Josh Uhen was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the fifth round - making him the highest-ever draft choice in program history as well as the fifth player to be selected by a Major League team in the past three seasons.

Following the 2012 season, Doffek saw three of his players chosen in the 2012 Major League Baseball Draft - the first time in program history that more than one Panther was selected - with Jordan Guth (Philadelphia Phillies; ninth round), Eric Semmelhack (Milwaukee Brewers; 12th round) and Paul Hoenecke (Los Angeles Dodgers; 24th round) all hearing their names called on draft day.

The 2010 season was a memorable one, as the team won the Horizon League Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time, winning 25-plus games for the 13th time in the past 14 years.

The squad had a memorable run to the crown, going 4-1 while riding strong pitching to the championship. The team recorded a 2.66 ERA in the five games, limiting opponents to just a .247 batting average. Eight players earned all-league honors, with Chad Pierce earning the Horizon League Newcomer of the Year award and Cameron Amsrud the Horizon League Relief Pitcher of the Year honor. The team led the league in earned run average and was second in batting, while also setting a school record with 21 wins in a row at home.

Doffek was named the seventh head coach in the history of the Milwaukee baseball program on Sept. 25, 2006.

Before joining the coaching staff, Doffek spent five seasons (1989-93) in the Los Angeles Dodgers minor league system, making it to the Triple-A level with the Albuquerque Dukes. Collegiately, Doffek played baseball at Waukesha County Community College, where he won the NJCAA batting title after hitting .539 as a sophomore. He was honored as an all-region and all-conference selection. Doffek attended Hartland Arrowhead High School, where he was selected to all-state and all-conference teams. Doffek lives in Menomonee Falls with wife, Kara, & two children, daughter Kori and son Ty.

Chapman has a hit 10 of 11 games and is hitting .333 this season. The junior ranks seventh in the Horizon League in batting average and is sixth with 16 hits.

Additionally, Chapman has already played three different positions for the Panthers and has recorded 10 putouts and 18 assists with just one error.

POWER IN THE 'PEN

In the Panthers 2-0 win over BYU on March 3, the bullpen duo of Ryan Hoerter and AJ Blubaugh preserved starter Nick Gilhaus' gem, tossing two scoreless.

Hoerter worked around a single in the seventh and struck out a pair. He added another strikeout in the eighth before the Cougars got to him for a walk and double to bring on Blubaugh.

Blubaugh got out of the jam with a groundout and after a leadoff single in the ninth, the sophomore struck out three straight batters to earn the save and give the Panthers a victory.

Blubaugh already has 16 strikeouts in 13.1 innings of work this season, holding opponents to a .180 batting average.

NOVAK NUKES

Jake Novak made the most of his first start of the season on February 19, finishing 3-for-3 with a pair of home runs.

The sophomore got the scoring going in the fifth inning for MKE with a solo homer and added a sacrifice fly in the sixth inning and another solo shot in the ninth.

The final home run was the eventual game-winner as Milwaukee hung on to top Alabama A&M 8-7.

Novak's two-homer game is the first by a Milwaukee player since Conner Goodman blasted two in a 14-13 win over Oakland last season on April 3.

He has recorded at least one hit in all four games since and leads qualified batters with a .389 average.

HORIZON LEAGUE HONOR

Mitchell Buban was pegged Horizon League Batter of the Week thanks to an impressive start to the year in Alabama. Buban finished the weekend 7-for-14 (.500) at the plate with a home run and five RBI. He reached base a total of 10 times, recording with a slash line of .500/.588/.714. The Kenosha, Wis. native also scored five runs and was a perfect 4-for-4 in stolen bases.

2022 RECAP

Milwaukee closed the regular season 22-33 but made a solid run in the Horizon League Tournament, ultimately finishing runner-up for the second consecutive tourney. After falling to top-seeded Wright State in the opener, MKE earned wins over Youngstown State and UIC to reach the title game. The Raiders won the crown and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

MKE also was Horizon League Tournament runner-up in 2019 and 2020 was canceled due to COVID-19.

The Panthers have finished fourth or better in the Horizon League standings in 12 of the last 13 full seasons.

LOOKING AT THE LEAGUE

The 2022 Horizon League Preseason Baseball Coaches' poll was released on Thursday and with 30 poll points, the Panthers were predicted to finish third. MKE trailed defending regular season and tournament champions Wright State (42) and UIC (34).

Youngstown State was selected fourth in the preseason poll with 24 poll points while Northern Kentucky (15), Oakland (13), and Purdue Fort Wayne (9) rounded out the poll.

D1 BASEBALL TOP PROSPECTS

In D1Baseball.com's Horizon League preview, a trio of Panthers' pitchers were recognized as top prospects.

AJ Blubaugh was listed as a top prospect for 2022 while Riley Frey made the list for 2021 and newcomer Logan Schulfer was named an impact freshman. The nationally recognized publication also predicted Frey as Horizon League Pitcher of the Year.

A GRAND MILESTONE

Last season, the Panthers picked up their 1,000th victory as a program to become just the third team in Milwaukee history to accomplish that feat. The MKE men's basketball team was the first with over 1,400 victories while volleyball has over 1,100 victories under its belt.

PLENTY TO LEARN

The 2022 Panthers are relatively light on experience with just two position players having appeared in over 100 games and two pitchers with at least 100 innings logged.

Mitchell Buban has been a mainstay in Milwaukee's lineup since 2018, having started 169 of 172 possible contests. With consistency this season, Buban could crack the top five in games played. Sam Koenig (2011-15) is fifth with 207 games played while Luke Meeteer (2012-16) and Doug Dokoning (2008-11) own the program record with 222 games played.

Zach Nogalski is the other Milwaukee starter with a load of experience, having played in 122 contests.

Mike Edwards (175.1 innings pitched) and Jack Mahoney (140.1) are the Panthers' most experienced on the hill but beyond this group of four, Doffek's roster has plenty of room to learn. In total, 24 of 39 Panthers on the roster are considered underclassmen.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Panthers are no strangers to beginning the season on the road, opening with 21 consecutive contests away from Milwaukee. It marks the most road games to open a season since 2018 when the Panthers played a program record 34 consecutive road games to being the year.

Milwaukee is scheduled to open the home schedule on Wednesday, March 30 against MSOE.

TAKING ON TOP COMPETITION

The Panthers are no strangers to top competition and this year is no different as Milwaukee took on Arizona, who was pegged No. 15 on the USA TODAY baseball coaches poll. The Wildcats finished 45-18 in 2021 reaching the College World Series before falling to Vanderbilt and Stanford to end their season.

Milwaukee has posted a handful of wins over ranked opponents including topping No. 17/18 Wake Forest in 2020. The Panthers' first and biggest ranked win came in 1999 when MKE knocked off then-No. 1 Rice in the NCAA Regionals. In total, Milwaukee has recorded eight wins against ranked opponents.

NO SMALL FREY

Riley Frey put together one of the more memorable freshman campaigns in recent Panthers' history as he was named to the All-League Second Team and All-Freshman Team.

Frey earned 14 starts in his first season for the black and gold and struck out 67 batters, both of which rank first all-time for a freshman in program history.

Frey led Milwaukee starters and ranked fifth in the Horizon League with a

ANY WAY ON

Last year, Mitchell Buban ranked second on the team with a .380 on base percentage. The senior finished the season with 50 hits and 14 walks while reaching 18 times via hit by pitch.

That number tied for fourth all-time for a single season in program history.

Buban currently ranks second in program history with 43 hit by pitch for his career, trailing Clay Schwartz (1994-97) who recorded 68 which was a NCAA record upon his graduation.

BANKING ON BLUBAUGH

It was a year to remember for freshman AJ Blubaugh, who was named Horizon League Pitcher of the Year and First Team All-League thanks to an impressive season out of the bullpen.

Blubaugh earned two wins in relief and struck out 37 batters in 27.1 innings, locking in a 2.63 ERA in 19 appearances. He held opponents to a batting average of .188 and led the Horizon League with eight saves.

During the season, Blubaugh had an impressive run from March 26 to April 10 where he allowed just one earned run across nine appearances, pitching 13.0 innings total.

At the Horizon League Tournament, Blubaugh picked up the save against Youngstown State when he struck out three straight batters after the Penguins loaded the bases.
