## NOTES

• After defeating Purdue, 1-0, in overtime on senior night on Saturday, Oct. 24, to move into a tie for third place in the Big Ten, Michigan will travel to play No. 10 Penn State in its regular-season finale on Wednesday, Oct. 28, at 7 p.m. at PSU's Jeffrey Field.

• **Big Ten Race:** Just six points currently separate the top six teams in the Big Ten standings, while there is just a three-point difference between the second and sixth teams. Michigan is currently in a tie for third place in the conference standings at 6-2-2 (20 points), along with Rutgers, while Penn State is in second place at 7-2-1 (22 points). Wisconsin has already clinched at least a share of the Big Ten title with an 8-1-1 record (25 points). Minnesota and Northwestern are just one point behind Michigan and Rutgers at 6-3-1 (19 points). Michigan has finished in the top three of the Big Ten in each of the last three seasons -- 2012 (3rd), 2013 (t-2nd), 2014 (3rd). The Wolverines could finish anywhere from second to sixth place depending on the results of the final regular-season games on Wednesday.

• **Wolverines Among the Big Ten:** Michigan is leading the Big Ten in shots per game (17.83) and corner kicks per game (7.5). U-M is also second in points per game (5.5), goals per game (1.89) and assists per game (1.72). Senior captain **Christina Murillo** continues to lead the Big Ten with seven assists, while sophomore **Taylor Timko** is tied for fifth in the conference in goals with seven.

• **U-M Against Ranked Opponents:** Michigan will face a top-25 opponent for the fifth time this season when it takes on No. 10 Penn State. The Wolverines are 1-1-2 this season against ranked opponents after losing 2-0 at No. 13 Notre Dame (Sept. 13), tying No. 25 Rutgers, 1-1 (Oct. 4) and No. 11 Minnesota, 0-0, (Oct. 18), and defeating No. 22 Northwestern, 1-0 (Oct. 8).

## WOLVERINE BITES

- **The 2015 Roster:** Michigan's 28-person roster consists of seven seniors, six juniors, eight sophomores and seven freshmen (based on athletic eligibility). The Wolverines returned 22 of 28 letterwinners from 2014, including all except one starter. Michigan has a much more experienced roster this season, with its seven seniors entering the season with 189 career starts and its six juniors returning with a total of 86 starts.

- **Returning Goal Scorers:** The Wolverines returned 100 percent of their goal scoring (34 goals) from the 2014 season. **Nicky Waldeck** led U-M with 12 goals and five assists, **Ani Sarkisian** recorded four goals and a led the Big Ten with 12 assists as a rookie, and **Corinne Harris** notched three goals and nine assists.

- **Leaders and Best:** The Wolverines are led by a group of seven senior leaders, including captains **Maddie Clarfield**, **Corinne Harris**, **Christina Murillo** and **Christina Ordonez**.

- **The Return of Murillo:** Senior captain **Christina Murillo** rejoined the Wolverines this season after taking the 2014-15 year off to train with the Mexican National Team in preparation for the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup and Pan American Games. She became the first Wolverine to compete in the Women's World Cup and helped lead Mexico to the bronze medal at the Pan Am Games. Michigan's 2015 season opener against Eastern Michigan (Aug. 23, 2015) was her first match in Maize and Blue since the 2013 NCAA Elite Eight match against Virginia (Nov. 29, 2013).

- **Upcoming Conference Tournament:** The Big Ten Tournament will begin with the quarterfinals on Sunday, Nov. 1. A new format for the conference tournament was instituted for the 2015 season. Similar to the 2014 season, eight teams qualify for the tournament. However, the four first-round matches will be hosted by the higher seeds on Nov. 1. The semifinals (Nov. 6) and finals (Nov. 8) will be hosted by the top seed of the remaining four teams. The Wolverines need to win at Penn State to guarantee they would host a quarterfinal match.

- **Stingy Defense:** Michigan has shut out eight opponents this season, including Minnesota and Purdue in the last two outings -- Detroit (3-0), Portland (5-0), Nebraska (2-0), Iowa (1-0), Maryland (1-0), No. 22 Northwestern (1-0), No. 11 Minnesota (0-0) and Purdue (1-0 OT). Sophomore goalkeeper **Megan Hinz** has five of those shutouts-- against Detroit, Maryland, Northwestern, Minnesota and Purdue. She also played 83 minutes of the Portland shutout before being replaced by sophomore/freshman **Sarah Jackson**. Hinz is currently sixth all-time at Michigan with 20 career wins, including nine this season.

- **Multiple Threats:** Fifty percent of Michigan's roster (14/28) has contributed points in 18 matches this season, with 10 Wolverines netting at least one goal. Four players have double-digit points -- sophomore **Taylor Timko** (7G+3A+=17P), junior/sophomore **Ani Sarkisian** (7G+3A=17P), freshman **Abby Kastroll** (4G+4A=12P) and senior **Lulu Haidar** (5G+1A=11P).

- **Producing Chances:** In 18 games, Michigan has scored 34 goals (1.89 per game) while averaging 17.8 shots per game (321 total). U-M's 34 goals this season match its total goal count from the 2014 season. The Maize and Blue has allowed a total of 16 goals (.89 per game) on 126 shots (7.0 per game). Michigan's +18 scoring margin is tied for the sixth-best total in program history. The Wolverines have only been outshot in two matches this season -- at No. 13 Notre Dame (L, 2-0), 9-3, and at No. 25 Rutgers, 11-10 (T, 1-1). U-M also has a 134-48 advantage in corner kicks.

- **Freshmen Contributions:** All five members of Michigan's freshman class who are medically cleared to compete have seen game action this season -- **Ashley Calcagno**, **Abby Kastroll**, **Reilly Martin**, **Jackie White** and **Sura Yekka**. **Kelly Sweeney** will miss the season due to a knee injury suffered over the summer.

Two of Michigan's top point-getters are freshman. Kastroll is third on the team with four goals and four assists (12 points), while Martin is fifth with two goals and five assists (nine points). Kastroll was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors on Oct. 6. Yekka has made a big impact in her first season in Maize and Blue, playing in all 18 games with nine starts at outside back and recording one assist.

- **Last Time Out:** After 90 minutes of scoreless play, junior **Nicky Waldeck** netted the golden goal just 1:45 into overtime to give Michigan a 1-0 win against Purdue on senior night on Saturday, Oct. 24. Freshman **Reilly Martin** assisted on the game-winning goal.

- **Big Ten All-Freshman Team:** Michigan currently has five student-athletes on its roster that were members of the Big Ten All-Freshmen Team -- **Taylor Timko** and **Ani Sarkisian** (2014), **Madisson Lewis** (2013), **Corinne Harris** (2012) and **Christina Murillo** (2011).

- **Record Watch:** With her assist Nebraska (Sept. 18), senior captain **Corinne Harris** took over sole possession of fourth place all-time in career assists at Michigan with 21. She sits behind Kacy Beitel (third), who finished her career with 26 assists (1997-2000).

- **2014 in Review:** Michigan went 12-5-3 (8-2-3 Big Ten) last season and earned its third straight top-three finish in the Big Ten Conference, but came up just short of making its third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. The Wolverines went 9-1-1 at home, giving them a 31-3-3 record at U-M Soccer Stadium over the last three seasons. Four Wolverines earned All-Big Ten honors last season. **Nicky Waldeck** was named to the All-Big Ten first team, while **Corinne Harris** earned second team honors. **Taylor Timko** and **Ani Sarkisian** were selected to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. In addition, Waldeck and Harris also garnered All-Great Lakes Region second team accolades, and Harris became U-M's first Capital One Academic All-District first team selection since 2007 (Katie Bohard).

- **Big Ten Predictions:** Michigan was picked to finish second in the 2015 Big Ten preseason coaches' poll behind defending conference champion Penn State. Additionally, **Corinne Harris**, **Ani Sarkisian** and **Nicky Waldeck** were named to the Players to Watch list. Together, the trio combined for 19 of Michigan's 34 goals (56 percent) and 26 of its 42 assists (62 percent) in 2014.

## WEEKLY HONORS

**Ani Sarkisian (Jr./So.)**

- Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 13)

Sarkisian became the 10th player in program history to record a hat trick against Illinois, helping Michigan defeat the Fighting Illini, 3-1 (Oct. 11). She also had five shots in Michigan's 1-0 upset of No. 22 Northwestern (Oct. 8).

**Abby Kastroll (Fr.)**

- Big Ten Freshman of the Week (Oct. 6)

Kastroll had a hand in both of Michigan's goals in a 1-0 win at Maryland and 1-1 tie at No. 25 Rutgers. At Maryland, Kastroll netted the game-winning goal in the 36th minute, while at Rutgers, she assisted on Michigan's only goal to help U-M secure a 1-1 tie in its first overtime match of the season.

**Christina Murillo (Sr.)**

- Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 22)

As U-M's starting center back, Murillo helped the Wolverines start Big Ten play 2-0 with shutout wins over Nebraska (2-0) and Iowa (1-0). With Murillo leading the back line, Michigan allowed just 11 total shots in the two matches, while holding both opponents scoreless.

The Ojai, California, native had a hand in both goals against Nebraska, assisting on the first goal and playing a long ball on a free kick from penalty box to penalty box that led to the second goal. Against Iowa, she had the assist on the game-winning goal from Lulu Haidar in the 89th minute.

## OPPONENT PREVIEWS

**Scouting Penn State**

Penn State, which is led by ninth-year head coach Erica Walsh, is currently in second place in the Big Ten with a 7-2-1 mark and owns an overall record of 12-3-2. PSU is coming off a 2-1 win at Ohio State last weekend. The Nittany Lions are led by sophomore forward Megan Schafer (9G, 2A) and senior forward Mallory Weber (7G, 6A), who each have 20 points this season. Schafer's nine goals are tied for third in the Big Ten. Penn State leads the conference in goals (35), goals per game (2.06) and points per game (6.06) and is second behind Michigan in shots per game (16.71). Redshirt senior goalkeeper Britt Eckerstrom has played all but 80 minutes in goal for the Nittany Lions and owns all their decisions. She has allowed 10 of PSU's 12 goals and owns a 0.60 goals-against average. Eckerstrom also has five shutouts and a save percentage of .792. Last season, Penn State went 20-4 overall and 12-1 in conference play, en route to claiming the Big Ten regular-season title and advancing to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight.

**Series vs. Penn State:** Michigan trails Penn State in the all-time series, 4-18-7, but is 1-1-2 against the Nittany Lions in the last four meetings. The last two meetings have each been decided by one goal, as the Wolverines defeated then-No. 11 PSU 1-0 in 2013, and Penn State earned a 1-0 win last season.

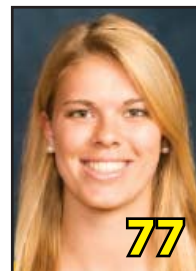

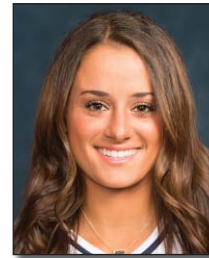

**Greg Ryan** is in his eighth season at the helm of the University of Michigan women's soccer program. During his 23-year collegiate coaching career, Ryan owns a record of 271-132-43 (.656) with nine NCAA Tournament appearances and two Final Four berths. In his eight-year tenure in Ann Arbor, Ryan is 86-51-25 (.610), guiding the Wolverines to four-straight winning seasons, three NCAA Championships bids (Elite Eight in 2013, Sweet 16 in 2012) and two top-three finishes in the Big Ten Conference.

Upon being hired in February 2008, Ryan was tasked with rebuilding the program, placing an emphasis on smart, balanced and organized soccer. After two rebuilding years, Ryan and the Wolverines broke through in 2010, finishing with a 10-5-4 record -- equaling the total number of

wins from the past two seasons combined -- and qualifying for the NCAA Championships, the program's first bid to the postseason since 2006. Adversity struck the team in 2011, as seven players were lost for the season due to illness or injury. Despite that, the Wolverines still finished with a winning record (9-8-2), achieving back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2003-04.

The Wolverines had a record-breaking 2012 season, finishing with a record of 16-5-3, making the NCAA Sweet 16 and finishing third in the Big Ten, but were even better in 2013, reaching the Elite Eight for the second time in program history on the backs of an 18-4-1 record and second-place finish in the Big Ten. During that period, Michigan was +58 in scoring margin (87 GF, 29 GA) and dominant at home, going 22-2-2 at U-M Soccer Stadium, a state-of-the-art facility that opened in Ryan's third year (2010). Several players flourished under Ryan's guidance, but none more than Canadian striker Nkem Ezurike, who graduated in 2013 as the program's leader in career goals (49) and career points (118). She was a four-time All-Big Ten selection and a semi-

finalist for the 2013 MAC Hermann Trophy.

Ryan came to Michigan after spending the previous three years as the head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team. There, he guided Team USA to a 45-1-9 record, including a bronze medal at the 2007 FIFA World Cup and a championship title at the 2005 Algarve Cup. Prior to his appointment as head coach, Ryan served as an assistant with the national team, helping Team USA secure a gold medal at the 2004 Olympics in Athens.

Ryan was a four-year letterwinner as a defender at SMU (1975-78), becoming the first Mustang to earn All-America honors when he was a first team selection in his senior season. He went on to play professionally for six seasons in the North American Soccer League (1979-84).

The Dallas, Texas, native returned to SMU after his pro career and earned his B.S. in biology. He also earned his teacher's certification in biology from SMU in 1986.

Ryan is a USSF "A" licensed coach and has conducted numerous U.S. Soccer Coaching Education and Licensing courses during his career.



**DEAN DUERST**  
Assoc. Head Coach  
Eighth Season

**Dean Duerst** is in his eighth season as the Wolverines' associate head coach. Following the 2013 season, he was named NSCAA Great Lakes Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

Under Duerst's guidance, the U-M defense has grown to be one of the most formidable and organized units in the country. Throughout the 2012 and 2013 seasons, the Michigan back line allowed just 29 goals in 47 matches (includes 25 shutouts). The breakthrough came in 2012, as the U-M defense posted team records for fewest goals allowed (17) and most shutouts (13). The following year, Michigan obliterated the first record, allowing only 12 goals in 23 matches (12 shutouts), leading to a top-10 national ranking in virtually every defensive category.

Duerst has more than two decades of experience in the Big Ten, as he both played and coached (13 years) at Wisconsin. From 1994-2006, he amassed a 151-105-31 (.580) record, surpassing current U-M head coach Greg Ryan as the winningest coach in UW history.

Duerst has also served as the head coach of the U.S. Under-17 Women's National Team (2007) and the U.S. Under-20 Women's National Team (1993).



**TIFFANY HANSEN**  
Assistant Coach  
First Season

**Tiffany Hansen** is in her first season at Michigan, overseeing the U-M goalkeepers.

Prior to coming to Ann Arbor, she spent four successful seasons at Dayton (2011-14), where she helped lead the Flyers to two A10 Tournament championships (2011, '14), the 2013 A10 regular-season title and two appearances in the NCAA Tournament (2011, '14).

Hansen got her start in collegiate coaching as the goalkeeper coach for three seasons at Bowling Green (2008-11), where she also competed during the final two years of her playing career. Hansen began her collegiate playing career at Louisville in 2004, before transferring to Bowling Green for her final two seasons. As a goalkeeper at BGSU, she helped the Falcons set a new record for shutouts in a season with 10 in 2006. Hansen graduated Summa Cum Laude from BGSU with a bachelor's degree in dietetics in 2008.

In addition to her collegiate playing and coaching experience, Hansen also works on the Head Age Group staff for Region II ODP and also works with Michigan ODP across many age groups.



**TOM ANAGNOST**  
Volunteer Assistant  
First Season

**Tom Anagnost**, who boasts five years of Division I head coaching experience, is in his first season at Michigan as a volunteer assistant coach.

Most recently, Anagnost was at the helm of the women's soccer program at Miami from 2011-13. He led the Hurricanes to a combined 19-15-5 record and two straight NCAA Tournaments, including the program's first trip to the NCAA second round.

Prior to taking over at Miami, Anagnost spent three successful seasons as the head coach of Central Michigan's women's program, compiling an overall record of 45-12-7. He was twice named the MAC Coach of the Year (2008 and 2009) and led the Chips to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths. Before making the jump to the Division I coaching ranks, Anagnost spent eight years coaching at the high school level.

As a player, Anagnost was a three-time NCAA Division III All-American at Kalamazoo College (1992-95), where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in political science in 1995. Upon graduation, Anagnost played professionally for the Chicago Power (NPSL) in 1995 and for the Michigan Bucks (USISL) in 1996. In 2011, he was inducted into the Kalamazoo College Sports Hall of Fame.
