OPENING TIP: Rutgers returns to the road to face Penn State Saturday following a 76-69 win Monday evening over rv/rv Nebraska. Freshman Montez Mathis scored a career-high 20 points and fellow rookie Myles Johnson registered a double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds in the victory. The Scarlet Knights committed just two turnovers after halftime to overcome an early 13-point deficit. Co-captain Eugene Omoruyi, who was sidelined for the previous three games with a left leg injury, returned to action. Rutgers' 76 points was the most in a Big Ten Conference game this season. The Cornhuskers represented RU's fourth of seven Big Ten opponents either ranked or receiving votes over a nine-game span. The Scarlet Knights have defeated two of the initial four, downing No. 16 Ohio State and the Huskers.

Versus Nebraska, Mathis set a new career scoring best for the third time in the past five games. Over that span, the guard is leading the team with 15.8 points-per-game, while shooting 50 percent (28-of-56).

THE SERIES: Saturday marks the 73rd meeting between the two teams in a series that dates back to 1922, and the third straight played at the Bryce Jordan Center. Rutgers won 70-68 at the 15,261-seat venue on Feb. 4, 2017, the Scarlet Knights' first Big Ten road victory. RU is 9-26 all-time at PSU but has won four of the last six meetings in State College. Rutgers and Penn State were both members of the Atlantic 10 from 1976-79 and from 1982-1991.

THE OPPONENT: Penn State is 7-12 and 0-8 in conference play, with five league defeats by single digits. The Nittany Lions have the nation's No. 2 strength of schedule according to KenPom, and are coming off a 65-64 loss at Minnesota on Saturday. PSU led by 11 in the second half, but the Gophers made 10 more free throws to secure the win. Offensively, the team is led by Lamar Stevens, who averages 18.5 points-per-game, while fellow junior forward Mike Watkins paces Penn State on the glass (8.4). Senior guard Josh Reaves averages 2.68, first in the Big Ten and ninth nationally.

CONNECTION: Freshmen shooting guards Montez Mathis (RU) and Myles Dread (PSU) were both 2017 DMVelite All-DMV selections.



Scarlet Knight Notables

- Per KenPom.com analysis, Rutgers' strength of schedule ranks 22nd nationally. RU has played three of the top four teams in the league standings.
- Rutgers ranks 23rd nationally in offensive rebounds (13.18) and 44th in total rebounds (39.06). RU and leads the Big Ten in offensive boards.
- Per KenPom.com analysis, Rutgers is among the nation's youngest teams with 1.15 years of experience to rank 320th nationally out of 353 Division I programs. RU is also one of the nation's tallest teams with an average height of 79.0" to rank sixth in D-I.
- Sixteen of Rutgers' 30 regular season games (53%) are against opponents currently ranked or receiving votes in the polls. Five Big Ten programs that have won NCAA titles will compete in Piscataway.
- Rutgers is averaging 5,736 fans through its initial 12 home games with two sell-outs, a 67% increase over its average attendance through 12 games (4,217) last season.
- Eugene Omoruyi's 17 rebounds vs. BU marked the most for a Rutgers player since Adrian Hill grabbed 18 versus Notre Dame on March 3, 2007, a span of 12 seasons.
- Against Eastern Michigan, Rutgers allowed four points in the opening half to tie the NCAA D-I record for fewest points allowed in a half during the shot clock era (since 1985-86). The 36 points allowed also tied the school record, matching the defensive effort against Columbia (60-36) on Nov. 18, 2002.
- In the shot clock era, Rutgers has held an opponent under 40 points eight times. Steve Pikiell has been the head coach in four of those contests.

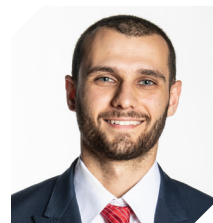

PAUL MULCAHY SIGNS WITH SCARLET KNIGHTS

Paul Mulcahy, an ESPN four-star prospect who averaged 17.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and 6.7 assists under head coach Mergin Sina as a junior at Gill St Bernard's HS in Gladstone, N.J., signed to compete at Rutgers.

"I'm very excited about Paul," said Steve Pikiell. "He's a 6-6 pass first point guard. I think he is one of the best passers in the country. He's a winner, from a winning program. He is a great student that comes from a great family. He's a terrific basketball talent. He plays the game the right way. People are going to love his tenacity and his toughness. We are so excited to have him join our Rutgers family and watch him make all kinds of highlights at The RAC."

The son of Paul and Lisa Mulcahy, the Rivals 150 selection has five siblings and signed with the Scarlet Knights over reported offers from Northwestern, UConn and Xavier.

RWJBARNABAS HEALTH ATHLETIC PERFORMANCE CENTER

The RWJBarnabas Health Athletic Performance Center at Rutgers University continues to rise next to the RAC. Slated for completion in summer of 2019, the 307,000-square-foot, sports facility and parking deck will provide state-of-the-art practice facilities, training areas, locker room, film room, NBA scout observation deck and office space for men's basketball, in addition to shared support (nutrition cafe, VIP/closing room, roof terrace, hydrotherapy, etc.) and public elements (spirit store, lobby/hall of fame).

THE EXCITEMENT IS RISING

For the third straight year, men's basketball has increased paid season tickets. For 2018-19, there was an 8% increase in tickets and 17% increase in revenue from 2017-18. Overall there is an 18% increase in tickets and 75% increase in revenue from 2016-17. RAC Pass, a mobile-only ticket solution made available in a limited quantity, sold out for the second consecutive season. Rutgers created new loge seating on the baseline to improve the fan experience and offer seating options more consistent with Big Ten and metropolitan peers. Sponsored by EisnerAmper, the new loge seating has 48 seats with a delineated tabletop. In 2017-18, Rutgers enjoyed multiple home sell-outs at the RAC in the same season for the first time since 2011. The 8,325 spectators vs. Purdue (Feb. 3, 2018) was the largest in 15 years. This year, the game on Nov. 30 vs. Michigan State marked the first Novem-

ber sell-out at the RAC since Nov. 22, 1997 vs. Princeton. Rutgers' game against Maryland on Jan. 5 was also sold-out. The sell-outs versus the Spartans and Terrapins signaled the first time in 20 years that Rutgers has experienced multiple home sell-outs this early in its calendar schedule. During the 1998-99 campaign, the Scarlet Knights enjoyed capacity crowds at the RAC versus Temple on Dec. 19 and against No. 12 St. John's on Jan. 2.

PERFORMING IN THE CLASSROOM

Men's basketball concluded the 2017-18 school year with a 2.9 team grade point average and four Dean's List honorees. In the spring 2018 semester, 10 players posted GPAs of 3.0 or higher. In the NCAA Graduate Success Rate (GSR) report issued on Nov. 14, 2018, men's basketball achieved a score of 82. In addition, the team's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score was 984, which ranked fifth among conference programs.

GIVING BACK

A commitment to the community has been emblematic of Rutgers basketball under Steve Pikiell, with all student-athletes participating in Leadership Development and Strategic Partnerships community service initiatives. On Sept. 30, men's basketball (with the RU baseball team) participated in the annual Tunnel to Towers 5K Run & Walk for the second consecutive year. Last season, the program sponsored a charity exhibition that raised \$15,000 for American Red Cross Disaster Relief and hosted a clinic with the Special Olympics New Jersey unified basketball team that represented the Garden State at the 2018 Special Olympics USA games. The team has also volunteered at Elijah's Promise Soup Kitchen in New Brunswick, participated in the SAAC Holiday Toy Giveaway and visited children at RWJBarnabas Health facilities around the state.

UTILIZING THE LATEST TRAINING TECHNOLOGIES

Rutgers strives to implement the latest technologies to benefit its student-athletes. In that effort, men's basketball utilizes Sparta Science, Catapult, Polar Team Pro and GymAware. With the recently-dedicated Druskin Strength and Conditioning Center as a backdrop, David VanDyke and Richard Campbell have made a significant impact on the program's student-athletes. In their initial two seasons, players were sidelined a total of 14 combined games due to injury. The Scarlet Knights had 11 total games missed among players in 2017-18 after players combined to miss a total of just three games in 2016-17.

Sparta Science provides an objective measure of how players react to gravity with validated scientific assessments and provides evidence based training prescriptions. Catapult replaces laboratory-based performance testing with microtechnology to obtain actionable data in real time regarding performance. Polar Team Pro provides real-time heart rate data to make objective decisions. GymAware is the gold standard Linear Positional Transducer (LPT with angle measurement) for measuring performance, implementing Velocity Based Training and monitoring power.

Before and after every season, men's basketball welcomes BAM (Basic Athletic Measurement) to the RAC to conduct player testing. A team of strength and conditioning coaches and technology professionals who utilize the most reliable methods and precise measuring tools, BAM has conducted the NBA Draft combine since 2009. Results are registered to a BAMScore™, a proprietary index for reliably measuring athletic performance, and placed in a requisite category. As a result, players receive the information necessary to gauge personal and professional aspirations.

READY TO MAKE A #GARDENSTATEMENT

The Scarlet Knights must replace two regular season starters, six scholarship letterwinners, 55% of its scoring and 48% of its rebounding from last season. Rutgers returns seven scholarship lettermen, including 2017-18 redshirts Peter Kiss and Myles Johnson, from a team that advanced to the 2018 Big Ten quarterfinals at MSG via victories over Minnesota and Indiana. It marked the first time RU won two conference tournament games since 1998. Four players who started in the B1G Championship return in co-captains Shaquille Doorson and Eugene Omoruyi, Issa Thiam and MET Rookie of the Year Geo Baker. Rutgers welcomed a signing class that

COACHING STAFF AT A GLANCE

Head Coach Steve Pikiell | @COACHPIKIELL

- Entered his third season as head coach of the Scarlet Knights in 2018-19.
- With 27 years of coaching experience, the Bristol (Conn.) native is under contract to remain courtside at the RAC through 2023-24 after signing a three-year extension.
- Is the 19th head coach in the history of Rutgers men's basketball.
- Has directed the Scarlet Knights to a 3-2 record in Big Ten Tournament games.
- Throughout career as both a player and coach has arrived at struggling programs and been instrumental in turnarounds that have resulted in conference championships and NCAA berths.
- Has retained an elite coaching staff that includes Karl Hobbs, Brandin Knight and Jay Young. As players and coaches at multiple levels, the four-member staff has made 57 post-season appearances, including 37 National Championship Tournament berths, and won 20 conference tournament titles.

- Began tenure with a 9-1 start, the best head-coaching debut in Rutgers men's basketball history.

Media Credentials: Credentials for home games are issued to working media only and should be requested as early as possible due to space limitations and demand. To apply for credentials, please email the Office of Athletic Communications (OAC) at credentials@scarletknights.com. Parking: Complimentary parking is available to accredited media in the YELLOW LOT North of the RAC. Please show the attendant your media credential to gain access. Those media members arriving to games without a credential will be required to pay the requisite parking fee.

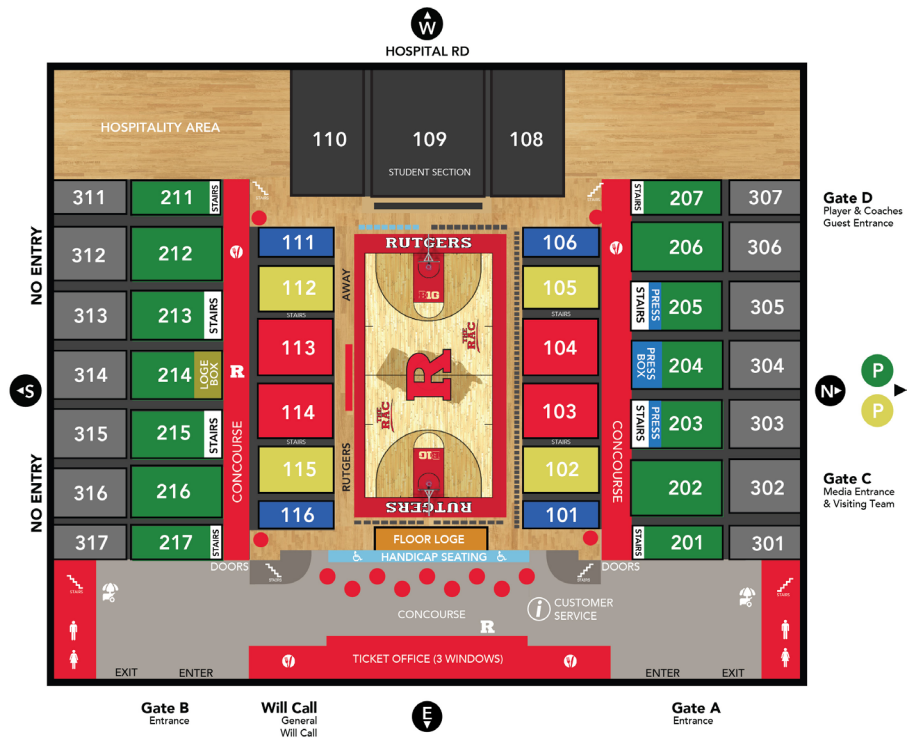
Media Entrance/Will Call: Working media are to enter the Rutgers Athletic Center (RAC) via the designated entrance at the Northwest corner of the arena. All media are to check-in via the media table, where pre-approved credentials may also be picked up. Please note that there is no will call for parking.

Press Row/Press Box: Working media space, as well as television and radio broadcast locations, are located in the North side press boxes of the RAC. Rutgers radio is located in press box three (PB3), television in PB4A, writers in PB4B and PB4C and visiting radio in PB5. Wireless internet access is available, as well as live game stats via Statbroadcast.com. Please see an OAC representative for password information.

In-Season Interview Policy: Requests for coaches, players and staff members should be made at least 24 hours in advance. All interviews must be coordinated through the OAC.

Practice: Practices are closed to the public. Practices are open to accredited media members with prior arrangements through the OAC. The shooting of video footage at practice must be approved by an OAC representative and be conducted during the first 20 minutes of practice. Rutgers players are unavailable on game days until post-game interviews commence.

Post-Game Press Conferences: Post-game press conferences begin approximately 10 minutes after the game's conclusion. A member of the Rutgers OAC staff will escort head coach Steve Pikiell and selected players to the interview area, located in the media center.
