STORYLINES

- No. 24 Maryland will conclude a six-game home stand on Saturday, December 1 when the Terps face Penn State in both teams' Big Ten Conference opener. Tipoff at XFINITY Center is slated for 5:00 pm and the game will be broadcast on the Big Ten Network.
- The Terrapins own a 13-9 edge in the all-time series between the two schools, and have captured wins in five of the past seven meetings. Maryland split the season series last year with the Nittany Lions, winning 68-63 at the XFINITY Center on January 2.
- Maryland debuted in the Associated Press Top-25 on November 26, checking in at No. 24 after starting the season 6-0. The Terps received votes in the previous three polls this season, and are back in the AP Top-25 for the first time since being voted the No. 25 team in the country on March 6, 2017.
- Sophomore Bruno Fernando posted 14 points and 11 rebounds as the 24th-ranked Terps fell to No. 4 Virginia, 76-71, their last time out on November 28 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.
- Maryland averaged 1.16 points per possession against the Cavaliers – the second most by a team over the past two years. Additionally, Maryland is just the sixth team to shoot at least 54% and score at least 71 points against Virginia in Tony Bennett's 10-year tenure in Charlottesville.
- Anthony Cowan Jr. scored 26 points, Bruno Fernando had 18 points and 16 rebounds, and Maryland cruised past previously unbeaten Marshall 104-67 in their most complete performance of the year on November 23. The 16 boards tied Fernando's career-high, while he posted a career-high four blocks in back-to-back games vs. Mount St. Mary's and the Herd.
- Against Marshall, Cowan became the first Terp to finish with at least 26 points, seven rebounds and six assists since Greivis Vasquez finished with 41/7/6 in a 104-100 double overtime victory at Virginia Tech on February 27, 2010.
- Bruno Fernando has established himself as one of the country's most efficient scorers this year, shooting 77.0% from the floor (47-of-61) through the opening month of the season. Fernando's 77.0% shooting clip is the top mark in the Big Ten and ranks inside the top-five nationally, while his 15.9 points per game rank inside the top-15 in the conference. Fernando shot 59.2% from the field last season – good for sixth in the B1G.

GLASS MASTERS

- Maryland currently boasts one of the top rebounding teams in the country, ranking first in the Big Ten and fourth in the nation in rebounding margin (+14.7).
- Maryland has out-rebounded every team it has played so far this season, led by the inside presence of sophomore Bruno Fernando (9.6/g) and freshman Jalen Smith (7.1) – who both rank inside the top-10 in the B1G in rebounds per game. Smith has been particularly effective on the offensive glass, ranking second in the Big Ten in offensive rebounds per game (3.3).

FERNANDO FANTASTIC FROM THE FIELD

- Sophomore Bruno Fernando has established himself as one of the country's most efficient scorers this year, shooting 77.0% from the floor (47-of-61) through the opening month of the season.
- Fernando's 77.0% shooting clip is the top mark in the Big Ten and ranks inside the top-5 nationally, while his 15.9 points per game inside the top-15 in the conference. Fernando shot 59.2% from the field last season – good for sixth in the B1G.
- Fernando finished 8-for-8 from the floor in Maryland's win over Hofstra on November 16, marking just the 12th time in school history a player was perfect from the floor with at least eight attempts and the first since Sean Mosley was 8-of-8 against Longwood in 2010.
- Fernando posted back-to-back double-doubles vs. Marshall & Virginia -- becoming the first Terp with consecutive double-doubles since Justin Jackson finished with 28&10 vs. Minnesota (1/28/17) and 22&12 vs. Ohio State (1/31/17). Fernando's three double-doubles in November already eclipsed his total from last season.
- Additionally, Fernando remains in the top-10 in the Big Ten in blocked shots per game (2.4 – 2nd) and rebounding (9.3/g – 4th).

SMITH IN RARE AIR AFTER DOUBLE-DOUBLE DEBUT

- Jalen Smith's double-double performance in his Maryland debut against Delaware on November 6 placed the Baltimore, Md. native in elite company for a Maryland freshman. Smith became the first Terrapin freshman to record a double-double in his debut since Buck Williams posted 10 points and 13 rebounds against Bucknell on November 24, 1978 in UMD's season opener.
- Additionally, Smith's 19 points were the most by a freshman in his Maryland debut since Joe Smith scored 26 in the Terps' season opener against Georgetown on November 26, 1993.
- Smith was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week on November 12 for his efforts that week averaging 15.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in 25.0 minutes of action in the wins against Delaware and Navy. Smith is the first Maryland player to claim conference freshman of the week honors in the opening week of the season since Exree Hipp in 1992.

TERPS CELEBRATE 100TH SEASON IN 2018-19

- The University of Maryland basketball program will celebrate its 100th varsity season in 2018-19, and will honor the program's rich tradition and history with several initiatives throughout the year.
- Maryland played its first full varsity season in 1910-11, sporadically fielding teams over the next 11 years before returning to stay in 1923-24. During its storied history, the program has won 1,548 games, advanced to 27 NCAA tournaments and captured the 2002 National Championship.
- A commemorative 100 Seasons logo has been unveiled in honor of the program's centennial season, which will be featured on the team's jerseys this year.

OPERATION: COWAN TO 1000

- Junior Anthony Cowan Jr. is on pace to become the 55th 1000-point scorer in program history this season as the Bowie, Md. native eclipsed 900 career points in Maryland's win over Hofstra on November 16.
- The 2018 Third Team All-Big Ten honoree averaged a team-best 15.8 points per game last season while leading the Big Ten in minutes per game (37.0).
- Cowan became the 46th Terrapin to finish with 500 points in a season last year, totaling 504 during his sophomore campaign. Cowan is one of three players under head coach Mark Turgeon to score 500 points in a season, joining Melo Trimble (568 – '14-'15 & 534 – '15-'16) and Terrell Stoglin (690 – '11-'12).
- The preseason All-Big Ten selection also finished as one of the league's most efficient free throw shooters, hitting 84.8% on his attempts (162-of-191) which ranked third in the B1G. Cowan got to the line better than almost anyone in college basketball last season, as he ranked fourth nationally among major-conference point guards in free-throw rate (56.8)

FERNANDO FIRED UP FOR SOPHOMORE SLATE

- Bruno Fernando elected to return for his sophomore season at Maryland after participating in the 2018 NBA Scouting Combine last spring.
- A rising sophomore, Fernando was named to the All-Big Ten Freshmen Team after a breakout first-year campaign on the court for the Terrapins. The Luanda, Angola native averaged 10.3 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game for the Terps, and was twice named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week during his rookie campaign. Fernando's 6.5 rebounds per game and 57.8% shooting percentage led all Big Ten freshmen, while his 1.2 blocks per game ranked third among all first year players in the conference.
- Fernando's electrifying dunks turned heads nationally throughout the year, with three of them earning a spot in the SportsCenter Top-10 from December to February. Fernando became the third Terp to be selected to the All-Freshmen team since Maryland joined the Big Ten in 2014-15.

FEROCIOUS FRESHMEN

- Mark Turgeon's highly lauded top-10 recruiting class has been as good as advertised through the first month of the season, as Maryland's freshmen have accounted for 45% of the team's points, 46% of the team's rebounds and over 50% of the team's assists. Both Smith and Wiggins are averaging double figures for the Terps, while Ayala is second on the team in assists.
- Jalen "Stix" Smith, Aaron Wiggins and Eric Ayala have all earned starts through the season's opening weeks, with Smith starting every game. All three were consensus top-100 recruits, headlined by Stix – a 2018 McDonald's All-American.
- Additionally, Serrel Smith Jr. and Ricky Lindo Jr. have seen significant minutes for the Terps. Smith Jr. posted a career-high 13 points and four rebounds vs. Mount St. Mary's in his best outing this season. Lindo Jr. put together his most effective game of the season against NCA&T on November 12, finishing with seven rebounds, four assists and three steals. Only three other Terps since 2011 have recorded at least 7 rebounds, 4 assists and 3 steals in a game: Dez Wells, Anthony Cowan Jr. and Justin Jackson.

WIGGINS, SMITH NAMED TO PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

- Two of Maryland's heralded freshmen recruits were named to their position's preseason watch lists in late October.
- Aaron Wiggins was one of 20 players named to the 2019 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award watch list, which recognizes the top small forwards in Division I men's college basketball.
- Wiggins was tabbed as the No. 3 prospect out of the state of North Carolina and the No. 9 small forward in the country via ESPN, and was named to the All-Under Armour Association Team in 2017. He averaged 15.1 points per game at Wesleyan Christian as a senior playing under former Terrapin Keith Gatlin.
- Jalen Smith was one of 20 players named to the 2019 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award watch list, which recognizes the top centers in men's college basketball.
- Nicknamed "Stix", the Baltimore, Md. native capped off an illustrious high school career at Mount Saint Joseph as the two-time Maryland Gatorade Player of the Year, two-time Baltimore Sun All-Metro Player of the Year and two-time Baltimore Catholic League Player of the Year.

NEW SET OF SHOOTERS

- Maryland will be a new look team from beyond the arc this season, as the departed Kevin Huerter, Jared Nickens, Dion Wiley and Justin Jackson accounted for 70% of the team's made threes in 2017-18.
- Anthony Cowan Jr. returns as Maryland's top outside shooter after finishing 54-of-147 (36.7%) from deep last year.
- Freshmen Eric Ayala and Aaron Wiggins have both stepped into outside shooting roles for the Terps, with both hitting at least 40% of their attempts through six games.

DRIESELL INDUCTED INTO NAISMITH HALL OF FAME

- The University of Maryland's legendary head coach Charles "Lefty" Driesell rose to his rightful place among the game's greats as he was formally enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on September 7.
- Heralded for his infectious coaching and recruiting ability, the legendary Driesell transcended the basketball community during his 41 seasons as a head coach, including 17 seasons at the University of Maryland from 1969 to 1986.
- Driesell amassed 786 wins, which ranked fifth among Division I head coaches when he retired in 2003. In 2007 Driesell was named to the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. He is the only coach in Division I history to win at least 100 games at four different schools.

THE "MIDNIGHT MILE" RETURNS

- The Maryland basketball team celebrated the start of its 100th season with a nod to the program's past on Monday, October 15, when the team hosted the "Midnight Mile" at Kehoe Track & Field Complex on campus (Ludwig Field).
- Head coach Mark Turgeon spoke to the hundreds of students who flocked to Kehoe Track prior to the midnight run, thanking them for their support while recounting the origin of "Midnight Madness" under newly inducted Naismith Hall of Fame coach Lefty Driesell
- Maryland's players then ran a mile on the track alongside their classmates to a soundtrack of "Chariots of Fire" and "Eye of the Tiger". The event featured photos with the team, pizza, giveaways and a raffle for a road trip for one lucky student this season.

MARK TURGEON

413-241 (21ST SEASON) / 163-82 (8TH SEASON AT MARYLAND)

Mark Turgeon is entering his eighth season at the helm of the University of Maryland men's basketball team after leading the Terrapins to seven straight winning seasons and three NCAA Tournaments during his tenure. Turgeon, who has won 24 or more games in four different seasons with the Terrapins, won his 400th career game as a head coach and 150th game at the helm for Maryland on December 29, 2017 as the Terps secured a 66-45 victory over UMBC.

He has led three different programs to 12 postseason appearances, which includes the Terps advancing to their first Sweet 16 in 13 years in the 2015-2016 season. Turgeon signed a four-year contract extension through the 2022-23 season on Oct. 27, 2016.

In his first seven seasons at Maryland, Turgeon has compiled a 157-81 (.660) record. He recorded the most wins for a head coach in his first five years in program history (114). Turgeon won 79 games during a three-season span from 2014 to 2017, the second-most wins during a three-year period in school history. He is the first coach in Maryland history to lead the Terps to three 24-plus regular season-win seasons. Turgeon also had the Terrapins ranked in the Associated Press top-25 for 36 consecutive weeks, including 20 weeks in the top-10. Maryland had previously not been ranked in the top-10 since Feb. 3, 2003, a span of 12 seasons.

Under Turgeon, Maryland has also thrived in its first four seasons as members of the Big Ten Conference, earning three top-3 finishes and compiling a 46-26 (.639) conference record. Turgeon's teams boast a 28-8 home record in conference play, including a perfect 9-0 mark in its inaugural season. He was named the 2015 Big Ten Coach of the Year.

Since taking over the program in 2011-12, Turgeon's Terrapins have amassed a 107-22 (.790) home record overall, while recording the most consecutive wins at home in program history (27) from Dec. 6, 2015 - Feb. 13, 2016. Maryland has amassed a 62-10 (.861) mark in home games since joining the Big Ten in 2014-15, tied for the second highest home win percentage in the conference during that stretch.

Turgeon led the Terrapins to a 30-11 record through their first 41 Big Ten games, becoming the fastest Big Ten coach to reach 30 conference wins since former Illinois mentor Bruce Weber guided the Illini to 30 victories in his first 35 conference games at the helm during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns and the first three conference games of the 2005-06 season.

Turgeon has led his teams to a winning season in 17 of his 20 seasons, including a current streak of 16 consecutive winning seasons. The Terps won 27 or more games in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history during the 2014-15 and 2015-16 campaigns.

In 2016-17 Turgeon led Maryland to a 24-9 record, with an impressive 11-2 mark away from XFINITY Center and its aforementioned third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. With a 20-2 record through 22 games in 2016-17, Turgeon topped the 1998-99 squad for the best regular season start in program history. Additionally, Turgeon was instrumental in the development of three-time All-Big Ten guard Melo Trimble, who became one of just four players to post 1,600 points, 400 assists and 150 steals at Maryland. Trimble was also just one of two players (Joe Smith) in school history to record 500 or more points in each of his first two seasons at Maryland.

Under Turgeon's direction the 2015-16 team finished with 27 victories and opened the regular season with a 15-1 record – the best start in program history. Maryland featured five All-Big Ten performers, including guard Melo Trimble (Second Team All-Big Ten) who was also named to the Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America Team. Center Diamond Stone was a Third Team All-Big Ten selection and was named Associated Press Big Ten Newcomer of the Year. Forwards Jake Layman and Robert Carter, Jr., as well as guard Rasheed

Sulaimon each earned Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honors.

Maryland posted victories over five teams that advanced to the 2016 NCAA Tournament. In addition, the Terrapins also defeated rival Georgetown in a monumental game played on the College Park campus for the first time in four decades.

Maryland, ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press and No. 12 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll, finished 27-9, marking the first time in program history the Terps have put together back-to-back 27-plus win seasons. Maryland's 4-0 start in conference play marked the best start since 1996-97.

The Terrapins also led the Big Ten and ranked fifth nationally in attendance in 2015-16, averaging 17,863 fans per game.

Maryland posted a school-record 26 wins during the regular season in 2014-15 and notched 28 total, an eight-game improvement from its 17 victories during the 2013-14 season. The 11-game win total was the second-highest improvement among all Power Five schools. Maryland also advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Terps finished their inaugural season in the Big Ten with an aforementioned 9-0 home record, which included victories against then-No. 5 Wisconsin, Michigan State and Indiana. Overall, Maryland concluded with an 18-1 home mark at XFINITY Center.

Maryland's 14-1 record in 2014-15 marked its best start in 18 years (1996-97). Turgeon posted 25 or more wins in a season for the fourth time in his career.

Since arriving in College Park, Turgeon has signed six consecutive nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including a top-10 class in 2016.

Under Turgeon, the men's basketball team posted its highest single year APR score of a perfect 1,000 in 2012-13 and has also graduated all 13 of his student-athletes who have exhausted their eligibility at Maryland.

In 2013, he captured his 300th career victory with an 85-74 defeat of Tulsa on Dec. 29, before leading the Terps to a thrilling overtime win against No. 5 Virginia in Maryland's final ACC regular season game.

Turgeon's winning percentage of .600 (42-28) was the best mark by a Maryland coach in his first two seasons, ahead of Bud Millikan (.592) and Gary Williams (.574). After bringing in a top-15 recruiting class in 2012, he led the Terrapins to a 25-13 record (most wins in six seasons) and appearances in the ACC Tournament semifinals and the NIT semifinals in 2012-13.

Turgeon directed Maryland to three wins over a ranked team in 2012-13 after Maryland had gone two seasons without one. The Terps were the only team in the nation to beat Duke twice, while also knocking off then-14th ranked NC State at home in January. Maryland's win over Duke at home on Feb. 16 was its first over a No. 1 ranked opponent in five years.

Turgeon, who came to College Park after directing Texas A&M to four consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, led Maryland to a 17-15 record in 2011-12. At A&M, he posted a 97-40 record in four seasons and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2011. He is the only coach in Big 12 history with at least 24 victories in each of his four seasons.

In seven years at Wichita State, he built the Shockers into a power in the Missouri Valley Conference, earning the league title and an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2006. In that NCAA Tournament, Wichita State beat Seton Hall and Tennessee before losing to eventual Final Four participant George Mason.

Turgeon has developed eight former players into the NBA: Gal Mekel (formerly of the Dallas Mavericks and New Orleans Pelicans), Donald Sloan (formally of the Brooklyn Nets), Khris Middleton (Milwaukee Bucks), DeAndre Jordan (Los Angeles Clippers), Alex Len (Phoenix Suns), Jake Layman (Portland Trailblazers), Diamond Stone (formally of the Los Angeles Clippers). Len was selected in the first round (fifth overall) by the Suns in the 2013 NBA Draft while Stone and Layman were both picked up in the second round of the 2016 NBA Draft. In addition, Dez Wells (Oklahoma City Blue) and Rasheed Sulaimon (Greensboro Swarm) played in the NBA D-League in 2016-17, while Melo Trimble started his professional career (with the Iowa Wolves) in newly named NBA "G"-League in 2017-18.

Turgeon amassed a 128-89 record at Wichita State (2000-07), posting the third-most wins in school history. The Shockers advanced to three straight NITs from 2003 to 2005 in addition to the 2006 NAAs, the first time WSU had four straight postseason appearances in 40 years.

He began his head-coaching career at Jacksonville State, going 17-11 in his final season there (1999-2000) after going 8-18 in his first year.

Turgeon was an assistant at Kansas for five seasons, first under Larry Brown (1987-88) and then under Roy Williams (1988-92). The Jayhawks made the NCAA Tournament in four of those seasons, winning the national championship in 1988 and finishing second in 1991. KU also won Big Eight titles in 1991 and 1992 with Turgeon on staff.

He was the top assistant under Jerry Green at Oregon from 1992-97 and was an assistant coach under Brown with the Philadelphia 76ers in 1997-98 before taking the head coaching position at Jacksonville State.

A point guard at Kansas from 1984-87, Turgeon was the first player in Jayhawks history to play in four straight NCAA Tournaments. KU went 108-33 under Brown in that stretch. Turgeon served as team captain in his junior and senior seasons, leading the Jayhawks to the 1986 NCAA Final Four.

As a student-athlete, he was selected to the Big Eight All-Academic Team in 1986 and was a Big Eight All-Freshman pick in 1984. He earned a bachelor of science degree in personnel administration from Kansas in 1987.

A native of Topeka, Kan., Turgeon led Hayden High School to back-to-back Class 4A state titles in 1982 and 1983, earning all-tournament honors each year. A first team all-state pick as a senior, Hayden went 47-3 in his high-school career.

In the summer of 2008, Turgeon was inducted into the Topeka Sports Hall of Fame. He was also honored as the 2015 Kansan of the Year in June, 2015.

Additionally, Turgeon was selected as a court coach for the USA Basketball Pan-American Team in preparation for the Pan-Am Games in the summer of 2015. The following year, Turgeon served as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's Under-18 Team, working with head coach Shaka Smart and assistant coach Kevin Ollie, in helping guide the squad to a gold medal. On June 13, 2016, he was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Ad Hoc committee on NCAA men's basketball tournament selection, seeding and bracketing.

Turgeon is active in the College Park community and has hosted the Coaches vs. Cancer Season Tip-Off Breakfast in conjunction with the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches for five years. Over the past four seasons, Turgeon worked with the Infinity Coaches Charity Challenge to raise money and awareness for the Alzheimer's Association. In addition, Turgeon and his team worked with the Special Olympics of Maryland and hosted a basketball clinic for athletes in the organization along with inviting them to home games the past three seasons. Turgeon also participated in the Special Olympics Relay Across America carrying the Flame for Hope through the College Park campus in 2016.

Turgeon ("TURGE-in") is married to the former Ann Fowler of Chicago, Ill, and they have two sons - William (Will) and Leo - and a daughter, Ella. Will plays basketball at nearby Catholic University in Washington, D.C.

MATT BRADY
ASSISTANT COACH

Head coach Mark Turgeon announced the addition of Matt Brady as the director of player personnel for the Maryland men's basketball program on July 10, 2017. Brady was elevated to the role of assistant coach in June of 2018 prior to his second season on staff for the Terrapins.

Brady, who has nearly 30 years of experience as a coach at the Division I level, including 12 as a head coach, comes to Maryland after serving as an assistant coach at La Salle the past season. Brady will be reunited with Maryland assistant coach Bino Ranson, who was an assistant under Brady while at Marist.

"Matt is a very accomplished head coach and assistant who under his leadership and direction led various basketball programs to unprecedented heights during his tenure," Turgeon said. "His proven track record in player development and his experience as a head coach at the Division I level will greatly benefit our staff and student-athletes. Matt will make a seamless transition to our staff and we are very excited to welcome him to our basketball program."

Prior to La Salle, Brady was the head coach at James Madison for eight seasons, racking up 139 wins, including four seasons with 20 or more victories. In 2013, he led the Dukes to a CAA Championship and an NCAA Tournament bid. He also guided the Dukes to three additional postseason appearances and the 2015 CAA regular season title.

Brady was recognized as State Coach of the Year by the Virginia Sports Information Directors in 2013 following his NCAA Tournament campaign and was also tabbed District 10 Co-Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches

Brady inherited a JMU program that finished last in the conference in scoring, field goal and three-point percentage in 2007. The following season, Brady had the Dukes atop the conference in all three statistical categories. While at JMU, Brady coached 10 all-CAA players and four all-district honorees. Brady mentored three of the top 10 scorers in program history as well as three of the top 10 three-point shooters.

Prior to leading the program at James Madison, Brady was the head coach at Marist for four seasons from 2004-08 where compiled a 73-50 record with the Red Foxes and improved their win total during each of his first three seasons with the team. Marist set a program record for wins during its 25-9 season in 2006-07 when Brady was the MAAC and New York City-area coach of the year. Marist had dramatic statistical improvements under his direction, ranking in the top three in the 10-team MAAC in overall field goal percentage, three-point percentage and three-pointers per game during each of his four seasons. While at Marist, Brady mentored MAAC Player of the Year Jared Jordan, who was a two-time NCAA Division I assists champion and the 45th overall choice in the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Clippers.

A 1987 Siena graduate and a native of Haddon Heights, N.J., Brady was a Division I assistant coach for 17 seasons at Rhode Island (1987-89), Wagner (1989-93) and Saint Joseph's (1993-04).

While Brady was at Saint Joseph's, the Hawks appeared in the NCAA Tournament four times, the NIT three times and won four Big 5 championships and three Atlantic 10 titles.

Saint Joseph's was 27-0 during the regular season in 2003-04, earned a No. 1 national ranking and a No. 1 seed for the NCAA Tournament, ultimately reaching the Elite Eight. Brady was involved in recruiting several of the top players in Saint Joseph's history, including 2004 National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West, an honorable mention Associated Press All-America selection. Nelson, who was selected in the first round of the 2004 NBA Draft and has gone on to play 12 seasons in the NBA, continues to be mentored and trained by Brady during his offseason.

As a player at Siena, Brady appeared in 114 career games, including 92 as a starter. He completed his career as the program's all-time assists leader (593), and he was inducted into the school's hall of fame in 1993. For his career he accumulated 1,106 points (9.7 points per game) and was a 45.9 percent shooter from the field.

Brady was a standout at Paul VI High School in Haddon (N.J.) Township and was named to the 1980s South Jersey All-Decade Team. He was enshrined in the Camden County Sports Hall of Fame in 2012. Brady and his wife Mary have three sons, Logan - who is a freshman at Maryland - and twins Cole and Griffin.

Maryland men's basketball head coach Mark Turgeon announced the hiring of Kevin Broadus as an assistant coach with the program on April 21, 2017. He enters his second season with the Terps in 2018-19.

Broadus has made an immediate impact for Maryland on the recruiting trail, bringing in Serrel Smith Jr. and Ricky Lindo in 2018 to bolster a top-10 recruiting class for head coach Mark Turgeon.

Broadus most recently spent nine years at Georgetown and brings more than 20 years of coaching and recruiting experience to Maryland. Georgetown won three Big East championships and advanced to seven postseason tournaments in his nine years with the Hoyas, including a trip to the Final Four in 2007.

"We are thrilled to welcome Kevin to the Maryland Basketball family," Turgeon said. "Kevin has a strong reputation as a tireless recruiter and is passionate about developing players on and off the court. He has extensive knowledge and experience as a coach and I am confident his ties to this region will be extremely valuable to our program."

Broadus has coached and recruited five high school All-Americans and 12 NBA players during his coaching career, including Kevin Huerter, Jeff Green, Roy Hibbert, Vernon Macklin, DeJuan Summers, Patrick Ewing, Jr., Otto Porter, Chris Wright, Henry Sims, J.R. Pinnock, Pops Mensah-Bonsu, and Mike Hall. Known as a strong recruiter with outstanding local ties, Broadus has coached at five universities in the metro area.

Broadus played college basketball at Bowie State University, where he graduated from in 1990. Upon graduation, Broadus remained at Bowie State as an assistant coach until 1993, before serving as an assistant at the University of the District of Columbia for four seasons. While coaching at UDC, he earned a master's degree in counseling in 1995. Broadus also had coaching stints at American University (1998-2001) and George Washington University (2001) before landing at Georgetown in 2004.

A native of the Washington D.C. region, Broadus played high school basketball at Dunbar in the District and Montgomery Blair in Silver Spring, Md. He began his collegiate career redshirting his freshman year at Grambling State before returning home to attend Bowie State, where he lettered three years and earned a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1990.

In addition to his extensive coaching experience, Broadus spent two seasons as the head coach at Binghamton University from 2007-2009, leading the Bearcats to the NCAA Tournament in 2009, and worked as a summer camp coach and counselor for both the Philadelphia 76ers and the New York Knicks. Broadus and his wife, Belinda, have four children, Nicol, Milan, Paris and Kevin Jr.

Orlando "Bino" Ranson was hired as an assistant coach at Maryland in the summer of 2010 and is now entering his ninth season in College Park, including the eighth on the staff of head coach Mark Turgeon. During his time with Turgeon, Ranson and the Terps have collected 157 wins.

Ranson played a major part in helping lead the Terps to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including a berth in the Sweet Sixteen during the 2015-16 season. It marked the Terps' longest run in the NCAA Tournament since 2003. In the 2015-16 season, Maryland started 15-1 – the best start in program history and finished the campaign with a 27-9 overall record No. 12 ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

"Bino has done an outstanding job in identifying and developing talented basketball players," said Turgeon. "He has strong connections throughout the country and helped expand our recruiting area during our transition to the Big Ten. Bino has worked hard and has developed into a very good coach."

The Terps won 79 games between the 2014-15 through 2016-17 seasons, adding up to the second-most wins in school history over a three-year span. Ranson has helped lead the Terps to three 24-plus regular season-win seasons, while the Terrapins were also ranked in the Associated Press top-25 for 36 consecutive weeks, including 20 weeks in the top-10.

In their inaugural season in the Big Ten (2014-15), Ranson and the Terrapins posted a school record 26 regular season wins en route to advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

Ranson played a major role in helping Maryland sign five consecutive top-25 recruiting classes in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. Ranson was critical in helping Maryland secure a top-10 recruiting class in 2018, leading the recruiting efforts to sign five-star McDonald's All-American Jalen Smith out of Mount Saint Joseph's High School in Baltimore. In addition, Ranson directed the recruiting efforts for Darryl Morsell from the class of 2017, a four-star recruit out of Mount Saint Joseph's.

In 2016, Ranson led the recruiting efforts for consensus four-star forward Justin Jackson, who was selected in the second round of the 2018 NBA Draft before signing with the Orlando Magic. Jackson played high school basketball at national power Findlay Prep as a junior before finishing his high school career at Hill Academy in Ontario, where he was named a First Team All-Star in the Ontario Scholastics Basketball Association. He was also a member of the Canadian U-19 national team that participated at the 2015 FIBA World Championships in Greece.

Ranson has strong ties to the Baltimore-Washington area, having coached for two seasons at St. Frances Academy in Baltimore.

He came to Maryland after one season as an assistant at Xavier, during which the Musketeers went 26-9 and reached the NCAA Sweet Sixteen. In his lone season on the staff of Maryland head coach Gary Williams in 2010-11, the Terrapins went 19-14. Ranson has had a winning season in each of his 11 seasons as an assistant coach.

He spent two years as an administrative assistant at Loyola University on the staff of long-time Maryland assistant and current Siena head coach Jimmy Patsos.

Prior to Xavier, Ranson was an assistant coach at James Madison for one season, helping the Dukes to a 21-15 mark, the most wins by JMU in a season since 1992-93. The Dukes advanced in the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament for the first time since 2003 and their berth in the College Insiders.com Tournament marked their first postseason appearance since 1994.

Ranson also worked for Matt Brady at Marist University for three seasons. The Red Foxes were 62-33 in those three seasons and won the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference regular season in 2007. That season, Marist won at Oklahoma State in the Postseason NIT. Ranson coached under current Maryland assistant Matt Brady during his stops at Marist and JMU.

Considered an outstanding recruiter, he helped bring in excellent classes at James Madison, Marist and Xavier. Ranson helped land Jay Gavin at Marist, who went on to become the MAAC Rookie of the Year.

Ranson coached at St. Frances Academy for two seasons before joining the Loyola staff. He handled St. Frances' junior-varsity program, directing the 2003-04 team to a 24-5 record, titles in the MIAA and the Baltimore Catholic League. He also founded Team Baltimore, one of the top AAU programs in the Northeast.

Among the players Ranson worked with at the AAU level are Sean Mosley and Juan Dixon of Maryland, Ricky Harris of Massachusetts, Jermaine Dixon of Pittsburgh and Donte Greene of Syracuse.

A 1999 graduate of Southern New Hampshire with a B.S. in sports management, Ranson completed his collegiate career as one of the top players in the history of the school. He ranked seventh in career scoring (1,899 points), fifth in assists (598) and fourth in 3-point field goals (226) after lettering for four seasons. He was inducted into the school's hall of fame in January 2007.

Ranson and his wife, Shannon, have two sons; BJ and Bradshaw.

Mark Bialkoski was elevated to the role of director of basketball operations in June of 2018 after serving three seasons as the program's video coordinator.

"Mark is very deserving of this promotion, as he's been a great addition to our staff and program over the past three years," said

head coach Mark Turgeon. "He's a tireless worker who is very committed to our team, and will continue to play a major role in our day-to-day activities. Mark has a promising future ahead of him in this business, and we're excited to reward him for his dedication and commitment to Maryland basketball."

In 2016-17, Maryland finished with a 24-9 record, an impressive 11-2 mark away from XFINITY Center and its third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. In his first season at Maryland, the Terps won 27 games, finished No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time since 2003. Bialkoski spent three seasons as the Charlotte 49ers director of basketball operations. Prior to serving as the director of operations, he spent three years (2009-12) as a program assistant and a graduate manager with the 49ers men's basketball program.

In his three seasons on the staff, the 49ers captured the Great Alaska Shootout and Puerto Rico Tip-Off titles and reached the Charleston Classic championship game. The 49ers defeated No. 10 Butler on the road as well in 2013. The 49ers won 52 games, including a 21 wins season in 2013 which marked the program's first 20 wins season since 2007-08. With another winning season in 2014, the 49ers posted back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2007. Charlotte made its first postseason tournament appearance since 2008 with an NIT appearance in 2013.

During the 2012-13 season, Bialkoski played a major role in helping set up the first annual Military Appreciation game (the Georgia Southern game) where the 49ers were able to raise over \$600 for military personnel.

As Director of Operations, Bialkoski helped with team travel, budgeting, scheduling and academic support as well as helping run the Alan Major Basketball Camps. In the fall of 2013, the Niners men's basketball team achieved its highest semester grade point average in program history.

While as a program assistant and graduate manager at Charlotte, Bialkoski did advance opponents scouting, assisted in scheduling, and managed all video related tasks for the coaching staff in addition to designing and developing the first Charlotte 49ers Men's Basketball Newsletter. Bialkoski facilitated all pre- and post-game practice set-up, created recruiting mail-outs and was a key resource to all basketball operational functions.

The Jacksonville, Florida native earned a Bachelor's of Science with a major in Exercise Science from Georgia Southern in 2008. While at Georgia Southern, Bialkoski served as head manager for the men's basketball program under Head Coach Jeff Price. During his time at Georgia Southern, the Eagles captured the 2006 Southern Conference Championship. He also served as assistant director of the Jeff Price Basketball Camp.

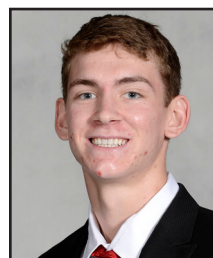
