STORYLINES

- Penn State (5-3) returns to Rec Hall the Nittany Lions' home from 1929-96 for two games this week, hosting Canisius (7 p.m., Thursday) and Louisiana-Monroe (2 p.m., Saturday). The contests also are part of the on-campus games of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic. Penn State will play Colorado and either SMU or Kent State Dec. 22 and 23 in Las Vegas. [Rec Hall: Page 5]
- The Nittany Lions will be wearing pink and black jerseys for a Throwback Thursday game vs. Canisius. The color pairing was the original Penn State palette, beginning in 1887 and lasting just 2.5 years, before Blue and White were adopted. [Pink and Black: Page 3]
- The Lions have won three of their last four games, coming off a loss to George Washington (76-66) Tuesday night in D.C., while the Griffs enter Thursday after dropping three of their last four.
- Penn State is halfway through a stretch of four games in seven days before having six days off from comeptition for finals week.
- Three Nittany Lions are averaging in double-figures in scoring: Shep Garner (16.4), Brandon Taylor (15.9 ppg) and Payton Banks (11.1) with Garner also leading in assists (3.3) and steals (1.9), and Taylor controlling the boards (6.4).

CHAMBERS AVAILABILITY

All interview requests for head coach Patrick Chambers should be directed to Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office. Coach Chambers will hold weekly press conferences and teleconferences during the season. A schedule will be emailed out every Monday. Coach Chambers will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be arranged through Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will generally be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Patrick Chambers' weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off. Player phone numbers will not be released. Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the postgame media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Alissa Clendenen. Please submit requests for game credentials at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, near Parking Lot 8. Penn State is a member of the Big Ten Conference and all press box and game day policies will conform to Big Ten guidelines.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

A photo pass must be issued to gain access courtside in the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Alissa Clendenen one week in advance for photo passes. Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and the stands. Photographers must remain seated at all times.

SCOUTING CANISIUS

The Golden Griffins enter Thursday night with a 3-4 record after a 78-76 setback to Quinnipiac Saturday night at home. They have playd two true road games to date, falling to Hofstra, 96-85, and Buffalo, 98-96 in overtime.

Five players are averaging in double figures for Canisius, who produced 87.3 points per game as a team, a scoring offensive which is ranked 11th in NCAA Division I. They also are in the top-15 nationally in 3-pointers per game, averaging 10.4 per game on 34.9 percent shooting.

Malcolm McMillan is scoring 21.3 points per game, No. 20 in DI, while also leading the team in assists with 4.1 per game. Nearly 58 percent of the team's total field goals are assisted with McMillan as one of five players to have 10 or more assists on the season.

SERIES HISTORY

- The teams have met just twice in program history, in the thirdplace game of the 1995 NIT and in the second game of the regular season in 2007.
- The Nittany Lions have captured both, with the 2007 game standing as the eight-largest margin of victory in program history (+53) and the largest since 1953.

LAST TIME VS. CANISIUS

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (Nov. 16, 2007) - Geary Claxton had 20 points and 10 rebounds and Penn State hit 13 3-pointers in a 93-40 win against Canisius on Friday night. Danny Morrissey scored 17 points, including five 3-pointers, for Penn State (2-0) and Mike Walker added 11 points. Freshman forward Elton Frazier, who scored 13 points, was the lone highlight for Canisius (0-2), which shot only 26.3 percent from the field. Penn State shot 37.1 percent (13-for-35) from 3-point range. Claxton, who recorded his 19th career double-double, helped fuel a 22-7 Penn State (2-0) run to open the game. Canisius hit 3-pointers on three consecutive possessions late in the first half to narrow the lead to 15 at 5:01 before the Nittany Lions pulled away.

UP NEXT

Penn State will #ReturntoRec once more on Dec. 12 against Louisiana-Monroe at 2 p.m. on Big Ten Network, as part of the on-campus games of the Las Vegas Classic. The Nittany Lions will then have six days off from competition for finals week, returning to action Dec. 19 at Drexel in the Palestra before traveling on to Vegas for the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic with games against Colorado and either SMU or Kent State.

THROWBACK UNIFORMS

Penn State will be wearing its new throwback uniform for the third time when it takes on Canisius Thursday. The unis are black and pink, honoring the school's original school colors established in 1887. The color pairing lasted just 2.5 years. Problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new choice was made on March 18, 1890. These jerseys were previously worn vs. Bucknell and Virginia Tech last season.

THIS & THAT

UNDER 40 » Four of Penn State's five wins this season have come when holding opponents below 40 percent shooting. Foes are shooting at at a 36.9 percent clip in the five PSU victories with the Nittany Lions hitting over 40 percent of shots in the same games. Penn State holds a 40-15 record under head coach Patrick Chambers when limiting opponents to a sub-40 percent field-goal percentage.

BOSTON THREE PARTY » Shep Garner's performance at Boston College Dec. 2 produced eight 3-pointers, the second-most in a single game for a Nittany Lion in program history, trailing just Pete Lisicky's nine tallied vs. Penn in 1996. The effort tied the Conte Forum record, set previously by two players.

BLUE STEAL » Shep Garner leads the Blue and White, as well as all players in the Big Ten, with 1.9 steals per game through nine games.

CENTURY MARK » Brandon Taylor played in his 100th career game against Bucknell Nov. 28 and has now seen action in 105. He has started 81 games, the most of any current Nittany Lion, and is averaging 8.5 points per game over his four-year career. [Taylor Career Stats: Page 26]

DOUBLE-DOUBLES » Brandon Taylor tallied his second double-double in the last three games against Eastern Michigan Dec. 5 with career highs in points (27) and rebounds (12). He previously hit double-figures in both categories with 19 points and 11 rebounds in the win over Bucknell Nov. 28. His previous double-double was vs. Drexel last season (12/20/14) with 14 points and 11 rebounds. Taylor has led the team in scoring in four games this season with the Lions holding a 3-1 record in those contests.

BC REBOUNDS » The Nittany Lions out-rebounded Boston College 40-27 in the B1G/ACC Challenge Dec. 2, their largest rebound margin (+13) since Feb. 7, 2015, vs. Nebraska (+13) and the first time hitting 40 boards on the season. Penn State is 3-1 this season when outrebounding its opponent. The loss at George Washington was the first when the Lions outnumbered their opponents' board total (37-34).

TURNOVERS » Penn State is ranked No. 25 in Division I in turnovers per game, averaging 10.5 in each outing, and producing fewer turnovers than its opponents in five of eight games this season. PSU foes are turning the ball over an average of 12.0 times per game, leading to an average of 10.6 points for the Nittany Lion offense.

LINEUPS » Penn State has used two different starting lineup combinations this season and over 60 different in-game combinations. The lineup of Shep Garner, Josh Reaves, Payton Banks, Brandon Taylor and Julian Moore has started each of the last five games, going 3-s. [Game-by-Game starters: Page 10]

CLOSE CALLS » Penn State's four-point win over Bucknell Nov. 28 was the seventh-game consecutive win in non-conference games decided by five points or fewer, dating back to last season. The Nittany Lions had six non-conference games separated by 1-5 points in 2014-15, winning each of them,

IN THE CHALLENGE with the win over Boston College Dec. 2, Penn State moves to 6-3 in its last nine Big Ten/ACC Challenge games and has won four of its last five Big Ten/ACC Challenge road games. The Lions hold a 7-8 record in 15 Challenge appearances. The Big Ten has retained the Challenge cup for each of the last seven seasons after winning eight of 14 games this year. Penn State's last two Big Ten/ACC Challenge outings have both been decided by fewer than 10 points, with PSU edging VT 61-58 at home last year.

REC HALL INFO

RECREATION HALL (Penn State's home in 1929-1996)

Recreation Hall, the home of Penn State basketball beginning in 1929, completed its final season in 1996.
On January 7, Penn State closed the doors of Rec Hall, routing Wisconsin 79-50 and sealing an 11-0 start to the 1996 season for the Nittany Lions.

The Nittany Lions left the grand old building for the new confines of the Bryce Jordan Center in 1996. Built at a cost of \$55 million, the Jordan Center is a state-of-the-art, multi-purpose building, seating 15,000, and the largest building of its kind between Philadelphia and Pittsburgh.

Upon its completion, Rec Hall was considered to be one of the premier field houses in the nation. One of the principal figures in its construction was then newly appointed athletic director Hugo Bezdek. In 1918, at Bezdek's urging, Penn State began a subscription campaign to raise the needed funds; but the drive bogged down until Rec Hall was included in the Emergency Building Fund Campaign of 1922. Sorely lacking dormitory, classroom and office space, Penn State embarked on a massive effort to improve its physical plant.

Originally budgeted at \$450,000, Rec Hall was built at a cost of \$572,260, between 1927 and 1928. The architect, Charles Z. Klauder, also designed the University of Pennsylvania's Palestra, which was constructed in 1927. The Colonial Georgian design was thought to "harmonize" with other new structures on campus. The excavating work required the removal of 12,500 cubic yards of earth and 400 cubic yards of rock, most of which had to be dynamited. The structural work consisted of raising 800 tons of steel in the form of assembled trusses. The project employed 250 people.

Rec Hall opened its doors Jan. 15, 1929, as Burke Hermann's cage Lions defeated Gettysburg, 37-34, in overtime. The building was dedicated on March 23, 1929. Penn State won 514 games, while losing just 183 in 68 and a half seasons in Rec Hall for a 73.7 winning percentage.

The Armory, constructed in 1888-89 and razed in 1964, served as the primary home floor for the Lions until Rec Hall was built. It was replaced by a modern wing to Willard Building.

More than 8,000 fans jammed into Rec Hall six times in the building's history. Eight-thousand and six hundred people saw the Nittany Lions defeat Virginia on Dec 5, 1973, the biggest crowd in Rec Hall history.

The Lions' longest Rec Hall winning streak is 45 games, established during the 1951-55 seasons.

In addition to office space for most of the staff of Intercollegiate Athletics, Rec Hall served as the home for most of the winter sports teams. The basketball, gymnastics, volleyball and wrestling teams have compiled great records in the venerable hall. Recent adjustments in seating have reduced the capacity to 6,846.

Though the basketball team has moved on, Penn State's gymnastics, volleyball and wrestling teams continue to compete at Rec Hall.

PENN STATE 80, SYRACUSE 79

Feb. 28, 1966

Jeff Persson hit a turn-around shot at the buzzer to defeat No. 16-ranked Syracuse before an estimated crowd of 8,100 in Rec Hall.

PENN STATE 86, VIRGINIA 74 Feb. 16, 1972

An estimated 8,000 fans crammed into Rec Hall to see the Nittany Lions defeat the sixth-ranked Cavaliers. Ron Brown finished with 23 points and eight assists to lead the Lions.

PENN STATE 66, PITTSBURGH 64 Feb. 23, 1974

Ron Brown's 32 points, including the game-winner at the buzzer, lifted Penn State past seventh-ranked Pittsburgh and ended the Panthers' 22-game winning streak.

PENN STATE 81, GEORGE WASHINGTON 75 A-10 Tournament -- March 9, 1991

The Nittany Lions raced out to a 20-6 margin and never looked back in winning the Atlantic 10 title and clinching an NCAA Tournament berth for the first time in 26 years.

PENN STATE 71, PURDUE 68

Jan. 27, 1994

The Nittany Lions scored the final eight points of the game to upset No. 7 Purdue and Player-of-the-Year Glenn Robinson.

PENN STATE 62, MIAMI (FLA.) 56 NIT -- March 15, 1995

Trailing 48-28 with 14:07 left, Penn State outscored the Hurricanes 34-8 the rest of the way in the first round of the National Invitation Tournament.

SEASON NOTES

CHAMBERS TAKES ON YEAR FIVE

The 2015-16 season marks the fifth year at the helm of the Nittany Lions for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native is coming off his best season in University Park after posting a win total (18) that had been topped just twice in the last decade and four times since 2000. Chambers has seen his overall win total climb each of the last three years and has continued to make waves in Big Ten play.

SUITS AND SNEAKERS

Head coach Patrick Chambers will don suits and sneakers for every game during the 2015-16, in honor of the 20th season of Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State. The school's chapter of CVC is consistently ranks among the Top 10 CVC organizations in the nation. It was started in 1995 under then head coach Bruce Parkhill and raises funds to support the American Cancer Society as well as the Bob Perks Fund (BPF), a local initiative that provides direct support for community members and families fighting cancer. Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State has raised nearly \$2.5 million to date through a series of year-round events. To get involved please visit CVCPENNSTATE.ORG or call 814-234-1023.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The Penn State basketball program recently moved into new training table and video room facilities in the Bryce Jordan Center. The \$1.2 million project was propelled by a generous gift from Peter and Ann Tombros and allows the Nittany Lions to utilize state of the art technologies. The concourse of the BJC also got a makeover in the offseason, and features Nittany and Lady Lion basketball graphics surrounding the circumference, as well at the main entrances.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

A pair of four-year players — Brandon Taylor and Donovon Jack—were selected team captains for the season by a player vote. Combined with Jordan Dickerson, who has played a year and a half in Happy Valley, and Devin Foster, who joined the Lions last year, the group makes up the 2015-16 senior class. Taylor and Jack have been a part of 44 wins in their first three years, the most since the 2011-12 class entered its final year with 57 victories.

ROOKIE RECOGNITION

The freshman class of Josh Reaves, Mike Watkins and Deividas Zemgulis make up the most heralded group to sign at Penn State to date. The trio was rated as the No. 28 class in the nation by 247 Sports, marking the first Top 30 group to join the Nittany Lions. Both four-star players, Reaves and Watkins were each ranked among the Top 100 players in the country by ESPN with Reaves holding the No. 81 spot and Watkins coming in at No. 89 at the time of their signing. Zemgulis was a three-star recruit and a Top 12 prospect from Maryland.

LIONS GAIN UCONN TRANSFER

Terrence Samuel joined the Nittany Lions in July after playing two years at the University of Connecticut. He will have two seasons of eligibility remaining after sitting out the 2015-16 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. A member of the Huskies' 2014 NCAA Championship team, Samuel saw action in 65 career games with eight starts as a sophomore. He averaged 3.6 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in his second season in Storrs with career averages of 3.0 ppg and 1.7 rpg.

BLOCK PARTY

The Nittany Lions have a total of three players in the Penn State Top 10 in the blocks category. Donovon Jack and Jordan Dickerson entered the season tied at No. 8 with 82 career blocks, while Brandon Taylor was 10th with 74. Jack and Dickerson also share the No. 8 position in single-season blocks with 53 after putting up the total in 2013-14 and 2014-15, respectively. It was the first time Penn State had a player produce more than 50 blocks in back-to-back seasons since 1998 and 1999 when Calvin Booth did so.

RETURN TO REC ... TIMES TWO

Penn State's non-conference schedule is highlighted by two games to be played in historic Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions will take on Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 10 and 12, respectively, as part of the second Return to Rec. Penn State last played in Rec Hall during the 2013-14 season in a Return to Rec event that marked the first men's basketball game played there since the Nittany Lions defeated Wisconsin, 79-50, in the building on Jan. 7, 1996. From 1926-96, the Lions compiled a stellar 514-183 (73.7%) record in Rec Hall, including a 45-game win streak from 1951-55.

PSU TAKES NYC

The Nittany Lion basketball and men's hockey programs will take over Madison Square Garden Jan. 30 in the first Big Ten Super Saturday - Hoops and Hockey doubleheader. The teams will both take on Michigan with tip slated for noon and puck drop scheduled for 7 p.m., both on Big Ten Network. in the first of four annual events at "The World's Most Famous Arena," which also will host the 2018 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament Feb. 28-March 4 of that year. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games at Madison Square Garden in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

LAS VEGAS CLASSIC

Penn State will take part in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic Dec. 22-23 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas. THe Nittany Lions will open action by taking on Colorado at 10:30 p.m. ET Tuesday, Dec. 22. The winner of the Penn State-Colorado game will play the winner of the SMU vs. Kent State matchup at 10:30 p.m. ET Dec. 23 on FoxSports1. The losers in each game will play each other at 8 p.m. ET, also on FoxSports1. Each team will play four games in the Classic — the first two at on-campus sites and the final two rounds at the Orleans Arena. Penn State's two games are vs. Canisus and Louisiana-Monroe in the Return to Rec series.

STAFF CHANGES

Head coach Patrick Chambers announced a series of staff changes in the offseason, beginning with the move by Ross Condon from director of operations to assistant coach in wake of the departure of Brian Daly. David Caporaletti, who previously spent four seasons as the director of on-campus recruiting, filled Condon's former post. Nicholas Colella then moved into the recruiting role and graduate managers Evann Baker and Kevin Hacke were added to the mix.

The 2015-16 campaign will be the 20th season in the Bryce Jordan Center. Since opening its doors to basketball Jan. 7, 1996, with a 79-50 win over Wisconsin, the BJC has hosted 316 Nittany Lion games with the team holding a winning percentage of 61.1 in those contests. Penn State has won at least 10 home games in four of the last five seasons.


120TH SEASON PENN STATE BASKETBALL

The Nittany Lions embark on the 120th season of basketball at Penn State and their 25th as a member of the Big Ten in 2015-16. 

Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State — a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia — before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Helped out by double figure scoring from four Nittany Lions, Penn State men's basketball (2-0) took down DePaul (1-1) 68-62 Tuesday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. After picking up two fouls early, Brandon Taylor scored 19 of his 22 points in the second half and Penn State led DePaul whistle to whistle in the Gavitt Tipoff Series.

Shep Garner added 7 of his 16 points in the final two minutes to keep the Blue Demons at bay. Penn State jumped out to an early lead when Josh Reaves and Garner turned back-to-back steals into easy layups. The Nittany Lion guards combined to score the next eight points, giving Penn State it's largest lead of the half 11-2.

- Penn State never trailed on the way to a 68-62 victory against DePaul Tuesday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. It was the first time since Nov. 28, 2014, that the Nittany Lions did not relinguish a lead.
- Four Nittany Lions fueled the offense with double-digit scoring, led by a 22-point performance from senior Brandon Taylor.
 Sophomore Shep Garner finished with 16 points, while junior Payton Banks and freshman Josh Reaves totaled 10 points each.
- With the win against DePaul, Penn State has won each of its last 12 regular-season non-conference games. The win also stretches the Penn State Bryce Jordan Center home winning streak to 13 in a row against non-league foes.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Despite double figure scoring from five Nittany Lions, Penn State (2-2) fell short in an 86-54 decision to Radford (4-2) Tuesday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. There were four ties and 17 lead changes in the game. Jones and Anderson scored eight points apiece during a 22-9 run the Highlanders used to take control with 8:03 to play. Penn State chipped away and made it a two-possession game with 3:36 left but Davis hit his second 3-pointer with 3:17 remaining to put it out of reach. Julian Moore led a group of five Nittany Lion double digit scorers with a career-high 16 points. Brandon Taylor finished with 15 points, including a 2-for-3 mark from three point range. Shep Garner tallied 11 points to go along with a career-high eight assists.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Five Nittany Lions turned in double figure scoring performances, marking the first time Penn State has had five reach double figures in a non-conference outing since Dec. 22, 2013 against Mount St. Mary's. Penn State had at least five in double figures most recently in a Big Ten conference game at Indiana January 13, 2015 (6).
- The group of double digit scorers marks the ninth-consecutive game (dating back to last season) that at least two Nittany Lions have scored 10 or more points.
- Junior Julian Moore led the team with a career-high 16 points, while senior Brandon Taylor finished with 15 points, including a 2-for-3 mark from three-point range. Sophomore Shep Garner tallied 11 points, while senior Devin Foster and junior Payton Banks posted 10 points each.
- Sophomore Shep Garner dished out a career-high eight assists, marking the most for a Nittany Lion since Tim Frazier passed out eight against Minnesota at home January 8, 2014.
- Junior Payton Banks recorded a team-high eight rebounds, marking the third game he's led the Nittany Lions in the category. Senior Brandon Taylor finished second on the team with a season-high seven boards.
- Penn State scored a season-high 42 points in the paint, the most since producing 46 against Indiana last season on Jauary 13, 2015.
- The Nittany Lions committed a season-low five turnovers, marking the first time the Nittany Lions have had five or fewer turnovers in a regular season game since playing Nebraska at home January 23, 2014.
- Penn State logged a season-high 47 percent shooting from the field, finishing 28-for-60 on the night.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Brandon Taylor scored 19 points, Payton Banks added nine and Penn State overcame an 8-point deficit over the final 5:30 to beat Bucknell 62-58 on Saturday. Banks was quiet in the second half but drilled a 3-pointer with 23 seconds to play. It broke a 58-58 tie and secured the win for Penn

seconds to play. It broke a 58-58 tie and secured the win for Penn State (3-2). Chris Haas led Bucknell (3-3) with 18 points. Nine of them came over a 1:24 span that gave Bucknell its 8-point lead, the largest for either team, with 5:37 to play. But Haas missed what would've been the tying 3-pointer with 2.9 seconds left. Taylor came down with the rebound, drew a foul and made a free

throw to seal it.

- Penn State closed the game on a 13-1 run to overcome an eightpoint deficit at 5:30 and defeat Bucknell 62-58.
- Payton Banks knocked a 3-pointer with 23 seconds to play to break a 58-58 tie. Brandon Taylor hit 1-of-2 free throws with :03 on clock to make it a two-possession game and secure the win.
- Penn State finished with nine turnovers, the third time this season it has made single-digit miscues.
- Bucknell shot 29.8 percent for the game, a season-low by a PSU opponent this season. The last opponent held below 30 percent shooting was lowa in the Big Ten tournament last season (26.3%, 3/12/15).
- The Bison came in to the game averaging 86.2 points per game and shooting 49.8 percent from field/37.9 percent from behind the arc. They were limited to 58 points, 29.8 percent shooting and 30.0 percent from 3-point range. The last time Bucknell was held under 60 points was Feb. 11, 2015 in a 52-51 win over Navy.
- This was the 103rd meeting between Penn State and Bucknell, dating back to 1897. Bucknell is one of four opponents Penn State has faced over 100 times, trailing only Pittsburgh (147), West Virginia (119) and Syracuse (105).
- The Nittany Lions hold a 78-25 advantage in the all-time series with the Bison, including wins in 14 of the last 15 meetings.
- Brandon Taylor finished with 19 points and 11 rebounds for his second career double-double and a tie for his career high in boards. His previous double-double was vs. Drexel last season (12/20/14) with 14 points and 11 rebounds.
- Jordan Dickerson had a career-high eight points vs. Bucknell, topping his previous high of 6 set four times.

With three blocks, Dickerson now has 90 for his career and holds on to a tie for No. 6 all-time at Penn State with Ed Fogell for the No. 6 spot (90, 1986-90).

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. (AP) - Shep Garner hit 8-of-12 on 3-point shots and finished with a career-high 30 points, carrying Penn State to 67-58 victory over Penn State Wednesday in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Garner fell one 3-point basket away from the school record, set by Pete Lisicky in 1996. Jordan Dickerson, Payton Banks and Donovan Jack each scored nine points for the Nittany Lions (4-2). Dennis Clifford led the Eagles (3-4) with 17 points. A.J. Turner scored 15. BC now has lost four straight. The Nittany Lions trailed 38-31 before Garner hit three straight from beyond the arc in a 64-second span during a 15-2 run that pushed Penn State ahead by six. The Eagles closed it to 48-47 on Jerome Robinson's driving basket, but Penn State took charge by scoring the next seven points.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Behind a career-high shooting performance from sophomore Shep Garner,
 Penn State pushed past Boston College, 67-58, on the road at Conte Forum in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.
- -Garner powered the offense with a career-high 30 points, finishing 10-for-16 from the field and 8-for-12 from 3-point range. He's the first Nittany Lion to record a 30-point outing since D.J. Newbill totaled 31 points in the regular-season finale at Minnesota last season.
- -With eight triples, Garner produced the second-most 3-pointers in Penn State history, trailing only Pete Lisicky's record-setting nine 3-pointers against Penn in 1996. Garner's effort also tied a Conte Forum record, which was originally set by Jose Powell (New Hampshire) in 1991 and matched again by Tyrese Rice (BC) March 1, 2008.
- -Penn State shot 32 percent from the field in the first half, before improving to 57 percent in second half to finish with a 43 percent clip (22-51).
- The Nittany Lions tied a season-high mark with 10 3-pointers, finishing 46 percent from behind the arc (10-22). Penn State opened the game shooting 50 percent from the 3-point line in the first half, helped out by five triples from Garner in the first 10 minutes of the game.
- •The Nittany Lion bench outscored the Boston College bench with a season-high 20 points. Penn State's bench has contributed double digit scoring in each of the last three games, averaging 13.3 points per game on the year.
- -The Penn State defense limited BC's leading scorer, Eli Carter (18.0) to just seven points, including a 3-for-9 mark from the field and 1-for-4 showing from 3-point range.

- Penn State moves to 6-3 in its last nine Big Ten/ACC Challenge games and has won four of its last five Big Ten/ACC Challenge road games.
- -Penn State's last two Big Ten/ACC Challenge outings have both been decided by fewer than 10 points, with PSU edging VT 61-58 at home last year.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Brandon Taylor scored 14 of his 27 points in the second half and Penn State beat Eastern Michigan 81-70 on Saturday. Taylor found his shot midway through the first half when he made his first of four 3-pointers to tie it 19-19. He drilled his second moments later to spark a 15-5 run the Nittany Lions (5-2) used to take a 34-24 halftime lead. Penn State led the entire second half and built a 23-point lead with 11:47 to play. Payton Banks added 17 points and Shep Garner finished with 16 for the Nittany Lions who won their third straight. James Thompson led Eastern Michigan with 18 points. Willie Mangum added 15 for the Eagles (5-3) who had a three-game winning streak snapped.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Led by three double figure scorers, Penn State downed Eastern Michigan,81-70, in front of a season-high crowd of 10,303 fans at the Bryce Jordan Center. Penn State improves to 5-2 on the year, having won each of its last three games.
- Brandon Taylor led the way with his third career and second double-double in the last three games. He finished with a career-high 27 points for his second 20-point performance of the season, while also leading the team with a career-high 12 rebounds.
- Payton Banks tallied a career-high 17 points, while Shep Garner added 16 to mark the fifth time the Nittany Lions have had at least three post double figures in scoring this season.
- Penn State shot 43 percent from 3-point range, helped out by triples from four Nittany Lions. Penn State has totaled at least nine triples in each of the last two games.
- Penn State grabbed a season-high 49 rebounds, out-rebounding Eastern Michigan 49-32, including a 19-6 advantage on the offensive glass. The board total is the most since grabbing 50 on Dec. 29, 2012, vs. Duquesne.
- Ten of 11 Nittany Lions to see the court tallied at least two rebounds, with Julian Moore finishing second on the team with eight.
- The Nittany Lions out-scored the Eagles in the paint, putting up a 34-24 advantage.
- The Penn State bench totaled double digit points for the fourth consecutive outing, out-scoring the EMU bench, 16-12. On the year, the Nittany Lion bench is averaging 13.7 points per game.
- The Nittany Lions shot a season-high 74 percent (28-38) from the free throw line, helped out by perfect performance at the charity stripe from both Taylor (5-5) and Garner (8-8).
- Penn State's season-high attendance of 10,303 marks the largest Nittany Lion crowd for a non-conference matchup since PSU drew 11,237 to the Bryce Jordan Center against Virginia Tech Dec. 12, 2009.

WASHINGTON (AP) - Shep Garner led Penn State (5-3) with 22 points as the Nittany Lions fell to George Washington 76-66 Tuesday night. Penn State could get no closer than 71-62 in the second half on 3-pointer by Brandon Taylor with 4:09 remaining. The Colonials (8-1) led by 18 after two Joe McDonald free throws made it 56-38 early in the second half. After trading lead changes over the first six minutes, George Washington took the lead for good at 13-12 on Alex Mitola's 3-pointer with 13:24 left. George Washington hit on 7 of 14 first-half 3-pointers in taking a 40-33 advantage into halftime.

POSTGAME NOTES

- After trailing by as many as 18, Penn State trimmed the deficit to single digits but could not complete the comeback, falling to George Washington 76-66 on the road at the Smith Center.
- Three Nittany Lions finished with double figure scoring, marking the sixth time this season Penn State has had at least three in double digits
- Shep Garner led the group of double digit performers with his second 20-point game of the season, recording a game-high 22 points.
 Brandon Taylor tallied 15 points, while Payton Banks added 10.
- Five Nittany Lions knocked down at least one 3-pointer against George Washington, led by three from Garner. Penn State sunk five triples in the first half alone, marking the fifth straight game Penn State has put up at least four treys in the first half.
- The Nittany Lions held GW leading scorer Patricio Garino to just two points, including a 1-for-5 showing from the field and an 0-for-2 mark from 3-point range.
- All 10 Nittany Lions to see the court grabbed at least one rebound as Penn State out-rebounded George Washington 37-34. Taylor and Garner led the way with six boards each, while Banks chipped in five.
- George Washington is 31-3 on its home court over the last three seasons and 5-0 this season, including a win over then-No. 6 Virginia
- Penn State moves to 20-12 in the all-time series against George Washington, having lost to the Colonels for the first time since 1991.
- The Nittany Lions also move to 115-79 all-time against teams in the current Atlantic 10 Conference.
- Shep Garner logged his second 20-point performance of the season, finishing with 22 points, including a 3-for-6 mark from 3-point range and a 5-for-7 showing from the free throw line.
- Davis Zemgulis had a career-high outing, totaling five points in 16 minutes on the court. He highlighted night with first career triple.
