TODAY'S GAME

· The Nittany Lions will begin a two-game road trip when they visit No. 2/4 Notre Dame at 1 p.m.

· Penn State last visited the Fighting Irish on Feb. 28, 2010, a 12-8 victory for Notre Dame.

ALL-TIME VS. NOTRE DAME

· The Nittany Lions are 4-14 all-time against Notre Dame.

· The teams have played every season since 1997. Penn State is 2-13 during that span.

· The Nittany Lions last win over Notre Dame was on Feb. 24, 2002 (10-9, OT).

SCOUTING THE FIGHTING IRISH

· Notre Dame, which is ranked No. 2 in the USILA Coaches' Poll, enters the contest at 1-0 after defeating then-No. 2 Duke, 7-3, in its season opener. The win was their 10th straight season-opening victory.

- Senior midfielder Max Pfeifer tallied four points (2g, 2a) in the win, while junior goalie John Kemp matched a career high with 14 saves.
- The Fighting Irish are currently riding a 15-game February win streak.
- In 2011, Notre Dame ranked second nationally by allowing just 6.57 goals per game.

TEWAARATON WATCH LIST GOALIES

- Both Notre Dame (John Kemp) and Penn State (Austin Kaut) have goalkeepers who appear on the Tewaaron Award Watch List.
- In 2011, both goalies were named USILA Honorable Mention All-Americans. Kaut ranked first in the NCAA in save percentage (.635) while Kemp was second in goals-against average (6.60).
- The Tewaaron Award is presented to the top men's lacrosse player in the nation.

MANLEY TABBED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

· Freshman attack Pat Manley was tabbed CAA Rookie of the Week after totaling two points (1g, 1a), a ground ball and caused turnover in Penn State's 16-9 win against Michigan.

MACKRIDES AMONG NATION'S BEST

· Senior attackman Matthew Mackrides ranks tied for 13th in the nation among active players in career goals (75). He has scored twice in each games this season.

FINDING FORSTER

· Senior attackman Jack Forster leads the team in goals (5) and points (11), and is only four points away from matching his 2011 total.

· Forster missed the 2008 and 2010 seasons due to injury ranked second on the team with 34 points (22g, 12a) as a redshirt freshman in 2009.

LAST TIME OUT

· Penn Stat defeated Michigan, 16-9, in the first-ever game at the new Penn State Lacrosse Field.

· After leading 4-2 at halftime, Penn State erupted with nine third-quarter goals en route to the victory.

· Senior attackman Jack Forster tallied game highs in both goals (5) and points (8).

CREATOR'S TROPHY

· Penn State, Ohio State and Michigan jointly announced the establishment of the Creator's Trophy, which will be an annual series between the three Big Ten school that sponsor men's lacrosse.

· A team needs a 2-0 record to win the Trophy, otherwise it will reside with the last team to finish the season with an unblemished record against

HOME SWEET HOME

- The Nittany Lions played their first-ever game at the new Penn State Lacrosse Field on Feb. 18

- Senior attackman Matthew Mackrides was the first Nittany Lion to score on the new field with 5:13 left in the first quarter.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS CANDIDATE

- Senior attackman Matthew Mackrides was named one of 20 men's lacrosse candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

- The award is presented to an outstanding senior who excels in the 4 "C's" - classroom, competition, community, character.

- The 20 candidates will be reduced to 10 finalists midway through the regular season. The ballot will then be distributed to coaches, media and fans, who will select the winner.

DUO LAND ON TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Senior Matthew Mackrides and sophomore Austin Kaut were named to the first installment of Tewaaraton Watch List.

- The Tewaaraton Award is presented to the nation's best male and female lacrosse players.

- The selection committee will add student-athletes to the watch list as the season progresses before the 25 nominees are announced in late April. The five finalists will be announced in mid-May before the winner is unveiled May 31.

NORTH CAROLINA RECAP

- Penn State fell to No. 6 North Carolina, 14-10, in front of nearly 7,000 fans in its season-opening game.

- The Nittany Lions trailed 2-1 after the first

- quarter and brought the game to within three early in the fourth, but the Tar Heels held on for the 14-10 win.

- Seven different Nittany Lions scored, including Pat Manley in his collegiate debut.

NIITTANY LIONS TABBED FOURTH

- Penn State was tabbed to finish fourth in the conference by the league's coaches. The Nittany Lions earned 23 points and one first-place vote.

- Defending league champion Delaware was tabbed first with 31 points and three first-place votes.

SENIOR SELECTED IN MLL DRAFT

- Senior attackman Matthew Mackrides was selected 26th overall by the Chesapeake Bayhawks in the 2011 MLL Collegiate Draft.

- After graduation, Mackrides will have the opportunity to become the 27th Nittany Lion to play professionally.

PSU RANKED IN PRESEASON POLLS

- The Nittany Lions were ranked in both major preseason polls.

- Penn State was ranked No. 17 in the USILA poll and No. 18 in the Nike/*Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.

TRIO EARNS CAA PRESEASON HONORS

- Sophomore goalkeeper Austin Kaut was named CAA Preseason Co-Player of the Year and was joined by senior attackman Matthew Mackrides and defender Ryan McGarvey on the All-CAA Preseason Team.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Prior to the season, *Inside Lacrosse* named Matthew Mackrides, Austin Kaut and sophomore attackman Shane Sturgis Honorable Mention All-Americans.

- Sturgis led Penn State with 34 points (18g, 16a) in 2011.

· Sophomore Austin Kaut returns in the net following a sensational freshman season.

· Kaut earned USILA Honorable Mention All-America, CAA Rookie of the Year, All-CAA First Team and CAA All-Rookie Team honors in 2011.

· He led the NCAA in save percentage (.635) and ranked 10th in goals-against average (7.90).

PRESEASON RANKED OPPONENTS

· The Nittany Lions will face nine opponents ranked in the USILA preseason top 20, including non-conference home matchups against No. 5 Denver (March 10), No. 10 Villanova (March 31), No. 12 Bucknell (March 27).

· In addition to UNC, Penn State will visit No. 9 Notre Dame Feb. 26.

PSU WELCOMES 15 NEWCOMERS

· Penn State welcomed 15 newcomers to the 2012 roster, including 12 freshmen and three transfers.

· Five newcomers -- Travis Crane (2008), Reed Kennedy (2011), Riley Lasda (2011), Erik Myers (2010), Kyle Zittel (2011) – who were honored as US Lacrosse High School All-Americans.

· Midfielders Michael Richards and Taylor Stothoff garnered ESPN RISE honorable mention recognition.

· The Nittany Lions' three transfers include Crane (UMBC), John Cugini (Denver), David Spadacene (Presbyterian).

SENIOR CAPTAINS

· Seniors Ryan Link, Matthew Mackrides and Ryan McGarvey were tabbed captains for the 2012 season.

· Mackrides is the first two-time captain since Dave Daniecki, Greg Jackson and Tolleison Morriss each served in 1996-97.

TAMBRONI IN YEAR TWO

· Head coach Jeff Tambroni will enter his second year with the Nittany Lions in 2012. At Cornell,

· Tambroni went from 7-6 in his first year to 11-4 and an NCAA tournament berth in his second season.

· Tambroni holds a 116-47 career record as a head coach. His .712 winning percentage is good for sixth among active head coaches with a minimum of 100 games.

PLAY FOR PARKINSON'S SERIES

· During the fall season, Penn State participated in the Play for Parkinson's Series against Army and Johns Hopkins.

· The series benefitted the ProjectSpark foundation, which raises money toward finding a cure for the disease.

TEAM RUNS IN THON 5K

· Penn State was part of the more than 6,425 people who helped kick off the THON season when it participated in the 11th annual THON 5K on Oct. 24, 2011.

· The 3.1 mile race supports THON's goal of raising funds and awareness for the fight against pediatric cancer.

· The Four Diamonds Fund has raised more than \$78 million since its inception in 1973.

· THON 2012 is being held Feb. 17-19.
