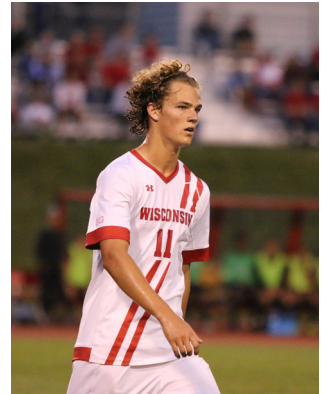

STARTING XI

1. In last weeks competition against Northwestern, Chicago native and Badger junior Mike Catalano notched an overtime golden goal to beat the Wildcats on their home turf, 2-1.
2. The Badgers are now 2-0-0 in conference play and 3-1-1 overall, marking their best start since 2011.
3. Junior Mark Segbers was awarded with both assists in a thrilling overtime bout last week against Northwestern. It was Segbers' second multi-point game of the season and seventh in his career.
4. Chris Mueller leads the Badgers with 20 shots on the season, ranking second in the Big Ten and 12th in the country with 4.0 shots per game.
5. The Badgers are behind 4-8-2 when playing at University Park.
6. Wisconsin is third in the Big Ten standings with a 1.000 conference winning percentage and .700 overall winning percentage, coming up behind Maryland and Michigan State.
7. Junior Tom Barlow leads the Big Ten in game-winning goals.
8. Junior Philipp Schilling ranks third in the Big Ten in save percentage at just under 77 percent.
9. Segbers' two assists against Northwestern is the second-highest assist total in a single match by any player in the Big Ten.
10. Chris Mueller provided the leveling goal against Northwestern with a near-perfect volley to the low corner of the net. It was Mueller's first goal of the season.
11. This is the 30th time the Badgers and the Nittany Lions have matched up. UW trails the overall series record 16-11-3.

HOME SWEET HOME: CHICAGO NATIVES LEAD UW IN 2-1 OVERTIME VICTORY

- The Wisconsin men's soccer team found themselves in another overtime battle against Big Ten foe Northwestern on Wednesday night at the Martin Stadium. In the 92nd minute of play, Chicago native and UW junior midfielder Mike Catalano slashed the net and finished off a great pass from Mark Segbers, giving the Badgers a thrilling 2-1 victory.
- Despite berating the Wildcats with 9-1 first-half shots and dominating ball possession, it was Northwestern that struck first. In the 13th minute of play, Wildcat forward Elo Ozumba received a ball Camden Buescher and notched his first goal of the season with a near-perfect header.
- It wasn't until the 63rd minute of play that Mark Segbers made an incredible individual effort to assist Christopher Mueller with his first goal of the season.
- The Badgers had no shortages of chances against the Wildcats launching 22-5 shots with 9-2 shots on goal. Corner kicks were 7-1 in favor of the Badgers.
- Wisconsin moves to 2-0 in conference play, marking its best start in the Big Ten since starting 2-0 in the 2011 season.
- Philipp Schilling got the start in net for UW where he allowed one goal on one save.

MADE FOR THE BIG SCREEN

- The Badgers had arguably their best performance of the season the last time they were featured on the Big Ten Network as they took down Northwestern, 2-1, in an overtime thriller.
- UW is 1-0 on TV games this season after going 0-1 in games featured on Big Ten Network last season.
- Friday night's game will have Dan Kelly and Chris Doran of the Big Ten Network on the call from the Big Ten studio in Chicago.

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

- The Wisconsin men's soccer team No. 1 goal for the season was to protect the team's home turf, and they have.
- The Badgers have started with a 2-0 record at home and clinched the program's 110th win at McClimom with the thrilling 2-1 overtime victory over Michigan on Sept. 9.

MORE MUELLER

- Junior Chris Mueller ranks fourth in the Big Ten for shots (20) and second for shots per game (4.0). He leads the team in shots, shots per game, and assists.
- He also ranks 34th in the country and second in the conference for firing off an average of 1.8 shots on goal per game.
- Mueller ranks 12th in the country for shots per game (4.0).
- Mueller played in 19 games, starting in 11 in 2015. He led the Badgers in goals with five and points with 13 and tallied 37 shots, 19 of them on goal. Mueller notched an assist vs. Maryland (Sept. 27) and scored his second career and game-winning goal against St. John's (Sept. 19). He was named to the College Soccer News National Team of the Week (9/14) and scored his first career and game-winning goal at Rutgers (Sept. 11).

OH, WHAT A NIGHT

- Wisconsin and Michigan battled it out for the second- and third-highest shooting amounts by any Big Ten teams in a single game. Michigan had a game-high 21 shots while Wisconsin fired off 20 shots.
- Philipp Schilling's six saves in the match was the second-highest amount of saves for any Big Ten player or total for any conference team.
- Junior Christopher Mueller's seven shots against the Wolverines were an individual season high amongst all conference players.

DISH IT OUT

- Wisconsin ranks third in the Big Ten conference and 70th in the country for assists per game (1.4).
- Juniors Christopher Mueller and Mark Segbers rank third in the conference and 105th in the country for their 0.40 assists per game. Additionally, they rank 106th in the country and fourth in the Big Ten for each compiling two assists.

SPRING TO DEFENSE

- Against Northwestern, three defenders logged a season-high shots in the game.
- Elan Koenig and Enda O'Neill tied their season-bests in a game with one shot each, while Sam Brotherton fired off a personal-best in a game this season with three shots.

HOT STARTS

- The Badgers are outshooting opponents 30-13 in the first period.
- Since only notching four shots against FIU in their road game opener, the Badgers have tallied double-digit shots in every game and 20-plus shots in both Big Ten games they have played.

GO WITH WHAT YOU KNOW

- The Badgers have kept a consistent starting lineup, as nine players have started consistently in all five games.
- Tom Barlow, Sam Brotherton, Mike Catalano, Brian Hail, Elan Koenig, Noah Leibold, Enda O'Neill, Alex Masbruch and Philipp Schilling have started in all five contests.
- Brotherton has started in all 22 matches he has played in for the Badgers.
- Barlow started in all 19 matches last season, giving him a 24-match start streak through the last two seasons. He also started in 16 of 18 matches as a freshman in the 2014 season.

TOMMY BOY

- Junior Tom Barlow is second in the Big Ten and ranks 18th in the country for game-winning goals (2).
- He has nine shots this season, with five shots on goal.

SCHILLING WITH THE SAVE

- Junior Philipp Schilling has started strong in net for the Badgers and ranks seventh in the Big Ten with 13 saves on the season.
- His .765 save percentage ranks third in the conference and 73rd in the country.
- Schilling's 0.73 goals against average is the third-lowest in the Big Ten, ranking 33rd in the nation.

SHUT DOWN

- Wisconsin is 108th among Division I teams for its 0.20 shutout percentage.
- Junior Philipp Schilling ranks third in shutouts in the Big Ten and third for shutouts per game (0.20).

TOP TIER

- Wisconsin is second in the Big Ten standings as just one of three teams that are 2-0 in conference play.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

- Wisconsin only allowed five shots from FIU, which is the third-lowest amount of shots allowed from any team in the Big Ten this season.
- UW is ranked 64th in the country and second in the Big Ten for its .765 save percentage.
- Additionally, UW ranks 29th in the nation and second in the Big Ten for its 0.73 team goals against average thanks to sophomore captain Sam Brotherton and the rest of the stellar back line that consists of Elan Koenig, Enda O'Neill and Alex Masbruch.
- The Badgers held three of five teams under 10 shots and have not allowed more than seven shots on goal from any opponent.

TOM THE TANK ENGINE

- Junior Tom Barlow has been a dominant force on the Badger offense and ranks third in the Big Ten conference for goals (2) and third for goals per game (0.40).

TERRIFIC TOMMY: BARLOW LIFTS BADGERS TO DOUBLE OVERTIME WIN

- In a thrilling Big Ten conference opener at the McClimmon Soccer Complex, the Wisconsin men's soccer team took down the Michigan Wolverines 2-1 in a double overtime finish.
- Junior Mike Catalano crossed a well-placed ball, finding a breaking Tom Barlow in the 108th minute of play that ended the heated affair between the two Big Ten rivals. Barlow collected his 10th career goal and second of the season. Freshman Mitch Guitar was also credited with an assist on the goal.
- The Badgers came out of the gates hot, keeping possession well and notching the first goal of the competition in the 28th minute of play. The goal was scored by junior Mark Segbers, as he danced around the Michigan goalkeeper and netted his first goal of the season on a ball from fellow junior Christopher Mueller.
- The Badgers dominated the rest of the first half with immense pressure and ball control. It wasn't until early in the second that All-Big Ten star Francis Atuahene slipped behind the Badger back line and notched the game at 1-1.
- The Badgers won the shot battle 17-15 in regular time while Michigan won the battle in OT 6-3. Corner kicks were 9-7 in favor of Michigan.
- Philipp Schilling got the start in net for the Badgers where he acrobatically denied a would-be golden goal that came in the 98th minute of the first overtime period. Schilling earned six saves on the day.

BATTLE IN BOCA RATON: BADGERS AND OWLS TIE 1-1

- The Wisconsin men's soccer team battled Florida Atlantic University to a 1-1 draw on Sunday afternoon.
- The first goal of the Badger-Owl matchup came just three minutes after the starting whistle when Guitar, a true freshman, knifed through the FAU backline and slotted a well-placed ball into the left corner of the net.
- It wasn't until the 88th minute of play that Owls forward Elijah McDonald received a lead ball and rocketed a shot into the corner that knotted the game at 1-1 and sent the game into overtime

SEASON PREVIEW

A NEW SEASON BEGINS

- In 2016, Wisconsin will have the perfect blend of experience and new additions to depend on during the season.
- Barlow, Brotherton, Catalano and Segbers will be four of the key returners for Wisconsin. UW lost three starters in Drew Connor, Adam Lauko and Carl Schneider, but the Badgers bring back seven players who started and several players who logged meaningful minutes for the Badgers.
- Seniors Brian Hail, Matej Rodanic and Casey Beyers have extensive experience along with juniors Nick Jones, Alex Masbruch, Enda O'Neill, Rahim Omar and Christopher Mueller, who was the team's leader in goals (5), points (13), shots (37) and game-winners (2). Sophomore Elan Koenig, who was rated as a four-star prospect by TopDrawerSoccer.com, will also be returning as a key factor this season.
- Brotherton, a defender recently named a team captain as just a sophomore, returns after starting all 17 games he played in 2015.
- The Badgers also have two goalkeepers returning in Beyers and Adrian Remeniuk, who have logged crucial minutes for the Badgers. Trask's newest addition, Phillip Schilling, hailing from Schwegenheim, Germany, will attend graduate school at UW and add a level of maturity to the goalkeeper group after already competing in college in Germany.
- The goal for Trask and Co. will be to get a core of experience to match up perfectly with an eager and talented collection of newcomers.

MIDFIELDERS

- Junior Mike Catalano started 11 games last season, notching three goals and one assist for the Red and White. Catalano also started 17 games in 2014, recording the third-most minutes and earning a spot on the 2014 Big Ten All-Freshman team. The Roselle, Illinois, native, was awarded the 2015 Academic All-Big Ten honor.
- Junior Christopher Mueller played in 19 games and started 11 in the 2015 season. Mueller led the Badgers in goals and points with five and 13, respectively. The Schaumburg, Illinois, native appeared in 16 games in the 2014 season.
- Junior Rahim Omar did not see game action last season.
- Junior Alex Masbruch started all 19 games last season for the Badgers. Masbruch notched his first assists and point ever as a Badger against UC Davis.
- Junior Nikola Atlija played in three games last season and recorded one shot.
- Sophomore Abdul Kooistra, a Madison, Wisconsin, native, did not see game action for the Badgers last season.
- Freshman Mitch Guitar attended Troy High in Michigan. Guitar was chosen as a "Best 11" individual at the U.S. Soccer National Championship. The Royal Oak, Michigan, native, also participated in the 2012 Manchester United Premier Cup World Finals in China.

■ Freshman Noah Leibold, a Wiesbaden, Germany, native, played for the renowned Mainz Academy. Leibold attended Elly-Heuss School.

■ Freshman Alejandro Estrelles Hernanz, a Barcelona native, currently plays for the FC Stars in Massachusetts. As team captain, Hernanz led his squad in goals and assists, earning team MVP title. Off the pitch, Hernanz is a high honor student at Cushing Academy.

■ Freshman Jack Shaw, a Milwaukee, Wisconsin, native, attended Marquette high school. In addition to playing on his school team, Shaw played for the Chicago Fire Academy and the Bavarian Soccer Club in Milwaukee.

■ Freshman Dominick Mesdjian, was a four year starter for James Madison Memorial High school. Mesdjian was named first team All-Conference, first team All-Area, and first team All-State as a senior.

FORWARDS

- Redshirt junior Nick Jones played in 12 games and made two starts for the Badgers in 2015. He finished the season with one goal on three shots on net. Jones is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten recipient and was a member of the 2013 Big Ten All-Freshman team.
- Senior Brian Hail started 12 games last season and tallied five shots, two of which were goals. Hail was named to the 2013 Big Ten All-Freshman team.
- Junior Tom Barlow started in all 19 games for the Badgers in 2015. He tallied three goals and three assists on the season as well as a game winning goal against Saint Louis. Barlow is ranked the 98th best player in the country (TopDrawerSoccer) as well as being the 10th best player in the Big Ten Conference. Barlow also enjoyed a stellar season for the Badgers in 2014 as he was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman team. Barlow was the Missouri Gatorade Player of the Year as a junior at Chaminade College Prep.
- Junior Mark Segbers started 18 games for the Badgers last season. He led the team with four assists and recorded three goals on 27 shots. The Saint Louis, Missouri, native, also recorded 15 points on five goals in 2014, playing a major factor in his 2014 Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection. Segbers was a highly touted high school prospect, as he was ranked No. 67 in the nation.
- Redshirt sophomore Issac Schlenker appeared in 14 games last season. The Milwaukee, Wisconsin, native, was the recipient of the 2015 Academic All-Big Ten award.
- Freshman Blake Carr attended Arrowhead High school. He tallied 54 goals in his senior year and led his team to a Classic 8 Conference Championship and a runner-up State Championship. He was named Classic 8 Player of the Year and co-State Player of the Year.
- Freshman Nate Bladecki, a Troy, Michigan, native, attended Troy High. Bladecki started every game his junior and senior season while also leading his team in goals and assists, respectively.

DEFENDERS

- Senior Matej Radonic recorded 15 starts for the Badgers in the 2015 season. He recorded six shots and one goal. Radonic was awarded 2015 Academic All-Big Ten.
- Junior Enda O'Neil started seven games for the Badgers last season. The Louisville, Colorado, native, was awarded the 2015 Academic All-Big Ten honor.
- A member of the 2015 Big Ten All-Freshman team and captain of the 2016 Badger squad, sophomore Sam Brotherton is the backbone of the Badger defense. Starting all 17 games in the 2015 season, the Auckland, New Zealand, native, anchored the Badger back line to three shut outs.
- Sophomore Elan Koenig did not see action for the Badgers in the 2015 season.
- Freshman Connor Maki joins the Badgers after transferring from Xavier University last season.

GOALKEEPER

- Redshirt Senior Casey Beyers started 22 career games for the Red and White. Beyers posted an impressive 8-3-1 record for the Badgers in 2013, maintaining a stifling 1.37 goals against average. Off the field, Beyers was the recipient of the 2014 Academic All-Big Ten award.
- Redshirt Junior Philipp Schilling, a Schwegenheim, Germany, native, has not seen the field much for the Badgers. Although, Schilling notched a season-opening win against Santa Clara to start the Badgers off on the right foot with a 1-0 shut-out victory.
- Junior Adrian Remeniuk played in 16 games and started 15 for the Badgers in the 2015 season. Remeniuk recorded 59 saves and posted a 5-6-3 record. He posted three shut-outs and maintained 1.38 goals against average. The junior also played in 11 games while starting 10 in the 2014 season. He posted 2-7-1 record with a 1.6 goals against average. Remeniuk was awarded with a 2015 Academic All-Big Ten honor.
- Redshirt Freshman David Fiflis joined the Badgers in 2016. The Indiana Head Park, Illinois, native, spent a redshirt year at Xavier before transferring to UW for his second year.
- Freshman Nicolas Dutil joined the Badgers in 2016. The Canadian native thrived at Cushing Academy high school as a multi-sport athlete and team captain of the soccer team.

- The Badgers (4-9-3, 1-2-3 Big Ten) were led by sophomores Christopher Mueller and Mike Catalano, as the duo each found the back of the net in the second half to bring UW to an overtime battle.
- After a scoreless first half, Mueller started the offensive spurt for the Badgers, as he beat the PSU defense to slot the ball into the goal in the lower left corner past Nittany Lion goalkeeper Evan Finney. The goal five minutes into the second half marked Mueller's fifth of the season.
- Both Drew Conner and Luc Kazmierczak were credited with assists for the goal.
- Penn State (6-6-3, 2-3-2) followed up quickly just over four minutes later with a goal of their own, as Sam Bollinger capitalized on a ball played by Riley Grant to level the game.
- Despite the strong defensive effort from the Badgers, Penn State was able to tally another goal in the 79th minute to take the lead. Drew Klingenberg fired a shot past Wisconsin goalkeeper Adrian Remeniuk off of a shot from 25 yards out.
- Not ready to give up, Wisconsin catalyst Mike Catalano scored his second goal in as many games to keep the Badgers alive. After a shot from Tom Barlow was deflected, Catalano gained control of the ball and put it in the net to even the score at two.
- The Badgers and the Nittany Lions battled through two overtime periods, but neither team could break the stalemate. The Badgers, playing a man down due to a card infraction, dug down in the defense to hold off the Nittany Lions to the tie.

- PSU was dangerous from the corners, as they earned 13 corner kick opportunities, compared to only seven for the Badgers.
- Remeniuk finished the match with eight saves while PSU keeper Finney had seven.

THATS MALONEY!

- Senior captain Connor Maloney is on a tear for the Nittany Lions in the 2016 season as he leads the Big Ten in assists (3), assists per game (3), and points per game (3), while also ranking second in points (5).
- The senior had a career day for the Penn State against Ohio State in their conference opener, when he joined in each of the four goals scored for the Nittany Lions in their 4-2 victory over the Buckeyes. The senior had three assists and a goal.

INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

HEAD COACH JOHN TRASK

Through six seasons as head coach of the Wisconsin men's soccer program, John Trask has revived with the enthusiasm and excitement that once made the program a perennial Big Ten and NCAA title contender.

A fixture at the highest levels of national and international soccer for nearly two decades, Trask came to Wisconsin in 2010 with the goal of returning the program to the elite ranks of college soccer. He delivered on that promise in just his fourth year, guiding Wisconsin in 2013 to its first NCAA tournament berth in 18 years and its first postseason win since its national title team in 1995.

In the process, Trask also helped the Badgers extend what at that time was the longest home unbeaten streak in the country (14), including UW defeating Milwaukee in the first NCAA tournament men's soccer game played at the McClimmon Complex in nearly two decades.

A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Trask led UW to 14 victories in 2013, which marked the most in Madison since the team won 20 in 1995.

With a reputation for developing talented young men into elite soccer players, Trask also helped a pair of upperclassmen make history in 2013. Tomislav Zadro (Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year) and AJ Cochran (Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year) became the first duo from the same team to sweep the coveted conference awards.

After earning NSCAA All-American honors and becoming the first MACC Hermann Trophy semifinalist in UW history, Cochran went on to become the first Wisconsin player selected in the 2014 MLS SuperDraft since 2005, and the first player selected in the first round since Mike Gentile (1995).

Trask has established a solid foundation in Madison with the development of young talent. At least one Badger has been named to the Big Ten All-Freshman team in six straight seasons under Trask. Sam Brotherton continued that streak of All-Big Ten Freshman Badgers in 2015, earning selection following a strong debut campaign in Madison. Brotherton went on to earn his first international cap with New Zealand and even started for the All Whites at the 2016 OFC Nations Cup.

In 2014, Trask took a young squad of Badgers and developed the team into a group that fought throughout the season and contended with some of the top competition in the country. Perhaps no one benefitted more from the coaching than newcomers Tom Barlow, Mike Catalano and Mark Segbers, who were each named to the 2014 Big Ten All-Freshman Team.

Trask led Wisconsin to a 10-win season and a semifinal finish at the Big Ten tournament in 2011. The 10-win season marks the most wins for the Badgers since 2003 when they finished 11-10-1. In Trask's second season, UW also captured its first true victory at the conference tournament with a 2-0 shutout of Michigan in the first round. One of the highlights of the 2011 campaign came on Oct. 2 when Wisconsin handed then-No.6 Indiana its first loss of the season, marking the first Wisconsin victory over the Hoosiers in 16 years.

The Badgers wrapped up their first season under Trask with a semifinal finish at the 2010 Big Ten Tournament. After advancing past defending Big Ten champion Ohio State on penalty kicks in the opening round, Wisconsin fell to eventual Big Ten champion and NCAA College Cup semifinalist Michigan, 1-0, in the semifinal round. UW posted a 4-13-3 overall record for 2010 but went 3-2-1 over its last six games in Trask's first season.

Widely regarded as one of the top coaches in the game, Trask spent five seasons as head coach at the University of Illinois at Chicago before joining the Badgers. He brought 14 years of collegiate coaching experience - along with five seasons spent in Major League Soccer ranks - to Madison. Trask developed the UIC program into a powerhouse that claimed three Horizon League championships and qualified for NCAA tournament play each season from 2006 to 2008.

Over that span, Trask's teams posted a record of 38-13-17 (.648) -- including an amazing 8-2-1 mark in road games against ranked opponents. Also in those three seasons, Trask mentored four All-Americans and six players that earned All-Great Lakes Region honors from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

He earned Horizon League Coach of the Year honors after leading the Flames to a regular-season conference title and berth in the second round of the NCAA tournament in 2006, a season in which UIC went 13-3-5 and finished with a stellar 0.36 goals-against average that ranks as the fourth-best single-season mark in NCAA history.

Trask followed that with another NCAA berth in 2007, as the Flames won the Horizon League tournament title and advanced to the school's first-ever Elite Eight by winning three consecutive road games on the way to a No. 10 national ranking at season's end.

The Flames won another regular-season Horizon League title and returned to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, a season in which UIC put together a 12-match unbeaten streak and ascended to a No. 4 national ranking.

Prior to his return to the college game, Trask spent five seasons as an assistant coach with three Major League Soccer clubs. He spent two seasons with the now-defunct Miami Fusion, which advanced to the final of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup in his first season before playing its way into the semifinals of the MLS Playoffs in 2001.

Trask then spent two seasons with D.C. United before coaching with FC Dallas in 2004.

No stranger to the Big Ten Conference, Trask's time in professional soccer came after nine years on the coaching staff at his alma mater, Indiana University. In that time, the Hoosiers won eight Big Ten titles, advanced to the NCAA College Cup five times and won back-to-back national titles in 1998 and 1999.

A four-year letterwinner for the Hoosiers from 1984-1987, Trask earned a bachelor's degree in management and a master's degree in kinesiology from Indiana.

A native of Milwaukee, Trask was married to his wife, Jela, in February 2008. The couple has a son, Jack.

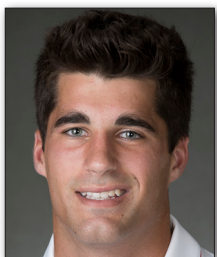
