Quick hits:

- Hofstra women's soccer is coming off an impressive 2015 season that concluded with a trip to the NCAA Tournament, its fourth appearance under Head Coach Simon Riddiough.
- Hofstra finished the season 13-6-2 and earned a share of the Colonial Athletic Association regular season title.
- Senior Jill Mulholland is coming off a First-Team All-CAA nod, poised to make a splash in her final season. She was also named to the Preseason All-CAA Team.
- The Pride is playing in the Penn State Invitational for the second straight season. In 2015, Hofstra opened the tournament with a narrow 2-1 loss to the eventual national champion Nittany Lions before falling 1-0 to NCAA Tournament team Rutgers.
- The Pride enters opening weekend receiving votes in the NSCAA Preseason Poll.
- Hofstra was picked to finish third in the CAA Preseason Coaches' Poll.

Buffalo Bulls:

The Bulls finished last season 11-7-3, including a 7-3-1 mark in the Mid-American Conference. They advanced to the conference tournament, falling to Western Michigan in the semifinals. Buffalo graduated its top scorer from a season ago, but returns Julia Benati, who finished with six goals and three assists, and Celina Carrero, who put up three goals and six assists in 2015.

Series history vs. Buffalo:

The sides have met just once before, in 1993, with the Bulls coming away with a 3-0 win in Hempstead.

Penn State Nittany Lions:

After opening the season with a 2-1 victory over the Pride, the Nittany Lions went on to win it all, capturing the national championship. Penn State is ranked No. 2 in the NSCAA Preseason National Rankings and returns Megan Schafer, leading scorer from the championship season. Schafer finished 2015 with 13 goals and four assists and is on the 2016 Missouri Athletic Club (MAC) Hermann Trophy watch list.

Series history vs. Penn State:

The Nittany Lions have won all four previous meetings with Hofstra, including a narrow 2-1 victory last season at the Penn State Invitational. In 2007, the Nittany Lions were responsible for Hofstra's exit from the NCAA Tournament, defeating the Pride, 2-1, in University Park.

Home Sweet Home:

Hofstra has posted a record of .500 or better on home turf for 17 straight seasons, dating back to 1999. In 2002, the final season that the Pride played on University Field, Hoftsra suffered just one loss at home, finshing 9-1 in Hempstead. Since the Pride has begun play at Hofstra Soccer Stadium, the team is 83-21-8 at home, and since Head Coach Simon Riddiough began his tenure in 2006, the Pride is 63-17-6 in the friendly confines of Hofstra Soccer Stadium.

Conference Call:

Six Hofstra players earned spots on All-CAA teams last season, and three return to the Pride roster in 2016. Redshirt-senior midfielder Jill Mulholland was named to the first team along with graduated forward Leah Galton. Sophomore defender Madeline Anderson made the second team as well as the All-Rookie Team. Graduated midfielder Jeannine Molleda joined her on the second team, while forward Jenn Buoncore also made the All-Rookie Team. Senior defender Emily Agudelo earned a third-team nod.

New Kids On The Block:

The 2016 Pride will get a boost from a talented freshman class. Newcomer Maya Watkins will likely make an impact in her rookie season after breaking the New Brighton High School record with 121 career goals and 75 assists in Pennsylvania. Midfielder Jaimie Layfield had an illustrious high school career in Bel Air, Maryland, helping her school to its first ever state championship. Rachel Carindal will also bolster the midfield, and local product Brenda Quinn of Hicksville could see time as a forward or midfielder.

Riddiough's Record vs. Ranked Teams:

Hofstra has faced off against ranked opponents on 15 occasions since Riddiough took over in 2006, and the Pride has yet to come away with a victory. Hofstra has lost by a one-goal margin on nine of those occasions, including taking No. 6 Penn State to overtime in 2007 and forcing extra time with No. 25 Indiana in 2009. The Pride played three contests against ranked opponents in 2015. Hofstra fell to No. 6 Penn State, 2-1, in the season opener, and the Nittany Lions went on to win the National Championship. The Pride also played No. 24 Rutgers in the Penn State Invitational, losting 1-0, before the Scarlet Knights, then ranked No. 9, were responsible for Hofstra's exit from the NCAA Tournament, beating the Pride, 2-0, in the second round.

Opening Day:

Hofstra is an even 12-12 in opening day matches. Last season, the Pride fell to Penn State in the season opener. Hofstra's last season-opening win came in 2012, a 2-0 win over Ohio State.

Conference Success:

The Pride has had a strong run in CAA play for more than a decade, posting a conference record of .500 or better in 14 straight seasons and earning at least a share of the regular season title on four occasions. Since Head Coach Slmon Riddiough took over in 2006. Hofstra is 67-26-9 in conference.

Mulholland in the Middle:

Senior Jill Mulholland will anchor the midfield this season, after finishing second on the team in 2015 with seven goals. With the graduation of the program's all-time leader in points, Leah Galton, Mulholland will be relied on to create offensive opportunities this season.

Desmond Dishes:

Junior Kristin Desmond led the team and was second in the CAA in assists in 2015 with eight. She returns to the Pride front line this season, and Head Coach Simon Riddiough expects Desmond to continue to improve and increase her point production. Her points total has grown in each season she's been on the roster thus far. Hofstra was 7-1 when Desmond recorded an assist in 2015.
