#### **ON THE PITCH**

The No. 3 seeded Penn State women's soccer team opens up postseason play on Wednesday, facing sixth-seeded Wisconsin in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament.

#### PENN STATE NO. 20 IN NSCAA POLL

After 11 weeks of action, the Penn State women's soccer team ranks 20th overall according to the NSCAA rankings. Michigan (7) and Nebraska (18) also represent the Big Ten in the poll while Wisconsin and Indiana are just outside of the Top 25, receiving votes.

#### LEADING THE LEAGUE

The Blue and White currently lead the conference in every offensive category. They are No. 1 in goals (55), goals per game (2.89), assists (49), assists per game (2.58), points (159) and shots (351). Penn State is also in the top five in the nation in points (3rd), scoring offense (4th) and assists (T5th).

PENN STATE VS. WISCONSIN

#### **SCOUTING WISCONSIN**

Wisconsin enters Wednesday's match at 10-6-2 overall. The Badgers finished the Big Ten regular season tied for fifth place with Iowa and Illinois after posting a 5-5-1 record against league opponents.

Leading the way for the UW offensive attack is sophomore Kinley McNicoll, who has recorded a team-high 25 points on six goals and a conference-best 13 assists. Junior Cara Walls and freshman Rose Lavelle are also key players for the Badgers. Walls leads the team in goals (9) and has tallied four assists while Lavelle has notched six goals and seven assists.

Genevieve Richard leads Wisconsin between the pipes, having started all 18 matches this season. The redshirt junior allows just over one goal per game (1.07), has posted five shutouts and collected 77 saves.

#### SERIES HISTORY vs. THE BADGERS

The Blue and White are 17-3-4 against UW all-time and 2-1-1 against the Badgers in the conference tournament. The two teams last met in the conference tournament in 2003. The match resulted in a 0-0 tie and UW advanced on penalty kicks, 4-3.

PSU defeated the then-No. 18 Badgers by a count of 2-1 earlier this season. Wednesday's meeting will be just the third neutral site match-up between the two teams and the first since the 1999 Big Ten Tournament, when PSU overpowered Wisconsin 3-0.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

Senior Maya Hayes and sophomore Raquel Rodriguez led the No. 22 Penn State women's soccer team to a 3-0 shutout over Michigan State last Friday afternoon in the regular season finale. Hayes found the back of the net twice for the fourth time this year and Rodriguez tallied her sixth goal of the season.

Penn State came out of the gate with two early attempts on net as Mallory Weber and Emily Hurd each fired off shots before the 10 minute mark but were stopped by Clem, who notched her first two saves of the match.

PSU's aggressive play paid off just a few minutes later as the Lions were awarded a penalty kick at the 10:13 mark after senior defender Bri Hovington went down in the box. Rodriguez took the kick, burying it in the back of the net to give Penn State an early 1-0 advantage.

Hayes improved the Blue and White's lead in the 54th minute of play, notching her 18th goal of the season and 70th career goal. The forward received the ball on a cross from Rodriguez and blasted it in from 16 yards out to give the Lions a 2-0 advantage.

Tani Costa looked to get on the board in the 68th minute and was nearly successful. The senior got past Clem but fell just short as MSU defender Jessica Kjellstrom stepped in to make the save.

Costa made another attempt just a minute later and was blocked by another Spartan defender but the Lions were able to make the best of it as Hayes found the rebound inside the six yard box and tapped it in, putting the score at 3-0. Michigan State took its final shot in the 84th minute as redshirt freshman Erica Goodenough attempted to put the Spartans on the board but was stopped by Kaminski, who collected the save to preserve the

#### **SIX LIONS EARN ALL-BIG TEN HONORS**

The No. 20 Penn State women's soccer team claimed six All-Big Ten laurels on Tuesday. Senior Maya Hayes and sophomore Mallory Weber headlined the group, earning first team All-Big Ten

Hayes has been named a first team selection for the third consecutive season. A two-time NSCAA first team All-American, Hayes has registered 19 goals this season to go along with five assists for a Big Ten-best 43 points. The West Orange, N.J. native reached a milestone in career goals last the weekend, surpassing the 70-goal mark. She leads all-active players in Division I women's soccer in career goals (71) and is second in the nation in career points (162).

Weber, an All-Big Ten freshman team selection in 2012, is earning first team honors for the first time. The midfielder has posted six goals and seven assists for the Nittany Lions this season and is fourth on the team with 19 points.

Senior Taylor Schram and junior Whitney Church earned second team All-Big Ten laurels for their efforts on the pitch this season. Schram is claiming second team accolades for the second time as she was also named to the second team in 2011. The midfielder is fifth on the team in points (14) after tallying four goals and six assists.

Church earns all-conference honors for the secondstraight year after logging over 1,500 minutes for the Nittany Lion backline this season. The defender has found the back of the net on three occasions and has posted two game-winning goals and one assist for PSU.

Freshman Brittany Basinger was honored on the All-Big Ten freshman team for her defensive efforts. The defender has started every match for the Nittany Lions this season, registering two assists, and has recorded over 1,400 minutes on the playing field.

Senior Tani Costa is Penn State's representative on the Sportsmanship Award Honoree list. The forward is second on the team in points, goals and assists with 22, eight and six, respectively. The Sportsmanship Award is granted to a student-athlete who has distinguished themselves through sportsmanship and ethical behavior while also maintaining good academic standing and demonstrating good citizenship outside of the sport.

#### **HAYES COLLECTS B1G WEEKLY LAURELS**

Penn State senior Maya Hayes has been named the Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week, along with Iowa's Cloe Lacasse, for her efforts against Michigan State last Friday. This is the ninth Big Ten weekly honor in three seasons for Hayes.

The reigning Big Ten Forward of the year found the back of the net twice to lead the Blue and White to a 3-0 victory over the Spartans in each team's regular season finale. Hayes scored her first goal of the match in the 54th minute, blasting the ball from 16 yards out. Her second goal came at the 68:25 mark as she rebounded the ball inside the box and tapped it in.

This week's award marks the fifth time this season that Penn State has had an athlete named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week. Hayes has claimed the award three times while Raquel Rodriguez and Whitney Church have also been selected.

#### HAYES FINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Penn State senior Maya Hayes has been selected as one-of-10 finalists for the 2013 Senior CLASS Award in collegiate soccer. Hayes is the first PSU women's soccer student-athlete in the seven-year history of the award to be named a finalist.

The Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award is presented yearly to a Division I senior student-athlete who has notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

Penn State fans can vote for Hayes at the Senior Class Award website. Fans can vote DAILY for their top three choices and are encouraged to vote often as fan voting is a key factor in determining the winner of the award.

Hayes leads the Nittany Lions and the Big Ten and tied for third in the nation in points this season with 37 through 16 matches. The forward is also second in the league and tied for fourth in the country in goals (16) and has notched five assists.

A two-time NSCAA first team All-America selection, Hayes was second on the team in goals (16) and points (38) in 2012 despite missing the first seven games while participating in the U20 World Cup with the U.S. U20 Women's National Team. She led the nation in scoring in her sophomore season, registering 31 goals and eight assists for a Big Tenrecord 70 points.

A kinesiology major, Hayes has received several academic awards during her time as a Nittany Lion. She was a 2011 CoSIDA/Captial One third-team Academic All-America selection and CoSIDA/Capital One first team All-District selection. Hayes was included on the Dean's List for the spring 2013 semester and was inducted into Penn State's Athletic Honor Society, Spiritus Leoninus. She is also a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.

Fans are encouraged to vote on the Senior CLASS Award website through November 25. Fan votes will be combined with media and Division I head coaches' votes to determine the winner. The Senior CLASS Award winners will be announced during the 2013 NCAA Men's and Women's College Cup championships in December.

#### **TOP TIER**

Senior Maya Hayes leads the B1G and is tied for third in the nation in points with 43. The forward is also is second in the B1G and fifth in the country in goals with 19.

Hayes has found the back of the net in 15-of-19 matches this season.

#### **IN THE BOOKS**

Forward Maya Hayes solidified her place in the Penn State record books after notching the second most goals (31) and most points (70) in a single season during her sophomore campaign but she is not stopping there. The senior is now No. 3 on the career goals ledger after netting 19 so far this season, bringing her total to 71 in 83 games.

All-American Tiffany Weimer (2002-05) and MAC Hermann Trophy winner Christie Welsh (1999-02) are atop the standings with an impressive 91 and 82 goals, respectively.

Hayes is also third on the career points record list with 162. Welsh leads the category with a remarkable 216 points and Weimer follows closely with 214.

#### HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

The Lions are a force to be reckoned with when playing at Jeffrey Field, having amassed a home record of 190-22-11 (.877). At 96-4-4 (.942), the Nittany Lions have the best Big Ten home record in the conference.

PSU also leads the league in attendance, averaging 1,742 fans per game this season. The program with the next highest attendance average is Michigan at 853 fans per match.

#### TWO NAMED TO HERMANN WATCH LIST

Penn State women's soccer senior forward Maya Hayes and junior defender Whitney Church have been named to the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy Watch List for the 2013 season.

The MAC Hermann Trophy is collegiate soccer's most prestigious award presented annually to one male and one female athlete. The winners will be announced Friday, Jan. 10, 2014 at the trophy presentation banquet at the Missouri Athletic Club in St. Louis. Christie Welsh is the only Penn State athlete to win the award (2001).

This is Hayes' second consecutive year on the watch list and Church's first appearance. Hayes was a finalist for the award in 2011 and a semifinalist in 2012. Hayes and Church are joined by Illinois' Vanessa DiBernardo as Big Ten honorees for the award.

Hayes is a two-time NSCAA first team All-America selection and has earned back-to-back Big Ten Forward of the Year honors. She finished second on the team in goals (16) and points (38) in 2012, despite missing the first seven games of the season while participating in the U20 World Cup with the U.S. U20 National Team.

Church received NSCAA first team All-Great Lakes recognition and Big Ten Defender of the Year honors in 2012. She led the Nittany Lion defensive attack, starting all 27 contests and logging over 2,000 minutes.

## 2012 NSCAA NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR TWO-TIME BIG TEN COACH OF THE YEAR (2009, 2012)

Head coach Erica Walsh enters her seventh season at the helm of the Penn State women's soccer program in 2013. Walsh's 2012 Nitanny Lions were the most successful team in program history after advancing to their first-ever national title game. The Nittany Lions won 21 of 27 games and were unbeaten in Big Ten action with a 10-0-1 record. The Lions registered their 15th consecutive Big Ten title and 18th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. The 15-title mark stands as the most consecutive Big Ten Championships by a women's program, along with the present Northwestern tennis team.

2008-present 2008 Olympic Gold Medalists 2011 World Cup Silver Medalists U.S Women's Under-19 2004 Senior Christine Nairn became just the seventh Nittany Lion to finish as a finalist for the prestigous Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy in 2012 under Walsh's tutelage while junior Maya Hayes was named a semifinalist for the award.

Walsh's success was recognized at the conference and national level as she earned Big Ten Coach of the Year and NSCAA Coach of the Year honors.

Her 2011 team was a dominant force, winning 21 of 26 matches, while out-scoring opponents 70-24. The Nittany Lions were 10-1-0 in Big Ten action and posted the seventh undefeated season at Jeffrey Field (9-0). Walsh helped guide the Lions to their 14th-straight Big Ten title and a spot to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for

the first time since 2007.

With Walsh's guidance, sophomore Maya Hayes became the nation's most prolific scorer in soccer in 2011. Hayes was a finalist for the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy. Hayes led the nation with 31 goals and 70 points. The sophomore phenom broke single-season record at Penn State for goals and points.

2004-07

During the 2011 summer, Walsh had an extraordinary experience of being one of the top assistants to Pia Sundhage and the 2011 United State women's national team at the FIFA World Cup in

Germany. The U.S. made a sparkling run through knockout play to the final, falling to eventual champions Japan.

During the 2010 season, Walsh's young club made a remarkable turnaround mid-season, overcoming a two-game deficit in the league standings over the final weeks to capture a share of a record-breaking 13th straight Big Ten title.

After a tough 2-4 start to the 2009 season, Walsh led the Nittany Lions to a remarkable turnaround, going 10-1-2 in the last 13 games of the regular season, earning her the 2009 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award for her efforts. In March of 2010, Walsh's alma mater, William & Mary, honored her by inducting her into the W&M Athletics Hall of Fame.

With the impressive end to the season, Walsh and her charges captured the program's 12th-straight Big Ten Championship, tying a record for most consecutive women's Big Ten titles won held by the Michigan swimming & diving program. By winning the Big Ten, the Nittany Lions continued their string of NCAA Tournament berths, making their 15th-straight appearance in the 64-team field in 2009. For the second time in three years, Penn State hosted the first and second rounds of tournament play.

Walsh also orchestrated one of the finest awards seasons in Penn State history when Katie Schoepfer, Alyssa Naeher and Christine Nairn swept the year-end Big Ten Player of the Year awards. Schoepfer was named the Offensive Player of the Year, Naeher the Defensive Player of the Year and Nairn the Freshman of the Year. Danielle Toney was named to the All-Big Ten First Team, while Lexi Marton garnered Second Team mention. Walsh has now coached two players of the year to three awards as Naeher was also the 2007 recipient of the Defensive Player of the Year honors in Walsh's first year in Happy Valley.

Walsh continued her success from the 2007 campaign into a 16-8-0 record that saw Penn State capture its 11th-straight Big Ten Championship and the 2008 Big Ten Tournament crown.

Her transition to Penn State was quite smooth as the 2007 team finished 18-4-2, including a 9-1-0 mark in conference play, and was ranked 12th in the final NSCAA poll of the season.

When she came to Penn State, Walsh brought with her a wealth of experience at both the international and collegiate levels. She already has coached at six different universities, including three stints as head coach as well as serving as an assistant for the U.S. U-19 team in 2004. Walsh served as head coach of the U-17 team from December 2004 until her hire at Penn State in February of 2007.

As of January 2009, Walsh was appointed as a member of the Panel of Instructors and Lecturers for FIFA Courses. In addition, she was appointed as the Chairman of the Women's Technical Committee for the period of January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2011.

In January of 2008, Walsh was named as the assistant coach by Pia Sundhage for the U.S. National Team. With Walsh's help and guidance the U.S. team completed its historic run with a gold medal at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China. Even sweeter was that Walsh's main responsibility was the U.S. Team's defense, which held fellow world power Brazil scoreless in the gold medal game.

The head coach at Harvard University as well as the U.S. Under-17 team prior to her hiring at Penn State, Walsh has consistently been active among the coaching ranks both at the Division I level and the U.S. Youth National Team program for nearly a decade. Prior to her time with the Crimson, she was part of a Florida State staff that led the Seminoles to one of its most successful year to date. FSU joined Penn State in the 2005 Women's Soccer College Cup, with both programs reaching the national semifinals.

Walsh's coaching path began in 1997 as a graduate assistant with Bucknell University. In 1998, she accepted a position at Dartmouth, where she was an assistant coach for two seasons. After helping the team to a final NSCAA ranking of No. 8 at the conclusion of the team's 1998 NCAA quarterfinal run as well as an Ivy League championship in 1999, Walsh assumed head coaching duties before the 2000 season.

As head coach, Walsh led the Big Green to back-to-back Ivy League co-championships in 2000 and 2001. Her squad was ranked in the NSCAA's top 25 each year, rising as high as No. 13 in 2001. In her three seasons as head coach, Dartmouth was invited to the NCAA Tournament each season and reached the round of 16 twice. All three of her teams earned the NSCAA's Academic Team Award.

Walsh left Dartmouth to earn her Master's in business administration at Lehigh University where she served as a graduate assistant from 2003-04.

Beginning in the spring of 2004, Walsh joined the United States Under-19 team as an assistant coach where she helped with preparations for the Under-19 World Cup. The U.S. finished with the bronze medal in Thailand after defeating Brazil in the third place match. After the World Cup, Walsh was appointed the U.S. National Team's U-17 head coach, a position which she held for three years.

As a player, Walsh was an NSCAA All-Region selection at William & Mary. A two-time first team All-CAA pick, she propelled her team to four NCAA Tournament appearances as well as two CAA regular season and two CAA league championships.

A high school All-American at Lower Moreland, she was also a member of the U.S. Under-17 National Team.

Walsh earned her Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in biology from William & Mary in 1997 and resides in State College,
