THREE-POINTERS

- 1 - This is the second meeting all-time between Penn State and Radford. The schools faced each other in the second game of the 2011-12 season, the first at the helm of their respective programs for both teams' head coaches.
- 2 - In the game immediately preceding Thanksgiving, Penn State has won 10 of its last 11 contests dating back to 2003. The lone loss came in the 2012 at the Puerto Rico Tip-off against Akron.
- 3 - Penn State has won each of its last 13 non-conference home games played in the Bryce Jordan Center. The Lions' loss at Duquesne ended a 12-game winning streak in non-league play.

THE MATCHUP

SCOUTING RADFORD

Radford is off a 3-2 start to its season, which began with an 82-80 double-overtime victory against Georgetown in Washington, D.C. The Highlanders have split their games since, most recently defeated Prairie View A&M, 64-56, Saturday in the consolation game of the 2K Classic subregional at Bryant University.

The Highlanders are averaging 70.0 point per game off 42 percent shooting. Two players are scoring in double-figures through five games, led by Rashun Davis' 14.6 ppg and 6.0 apg. Cameron Jones has put up 10.6 ppg, while Ed Polite Jr. is the leading rebounder with the 6.2 boards per appearance.

In the 82-80 win over the Hoyas, Davis hit 3-pointer with 1.5 seconds left in double overtime for the Radford victory, finishing with 28 points. The Highlanders shot 54 percent from the field in OT and 44 percent for the game.

SERIES HISTORY

Penn State and Radford have met just once previously, in the second game of the 2011-12 season as part of the 2011 Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-off Tournament. The Nittany Lions were victorious in the matchup at the Bryce Jordan Center, paced by a double-double from Tim Frazier. It was the first season at the helm of their respective programs for Patrick Chambers and Radford head coach Mike Jones.

LAST TIME VS. THE HIGHLANDERS

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (Nov. 14, 2011) - Penn State (2-0) cruised past Radford (2-1) at the Bryce Jordan Center, 62-46, behind strong defense and Tim Frazier's (Houston, Texas) second career double-double. The Texas native posted 20 points and a career-high equaling 10 assists to go with six rebounds, three steals and a block in a dominating effort as Penn State won its first game in the 2011 Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-off Tournament.

RADFORD CONNECTION

Penn State assistant coach Ross Condon spent two seasons at Radford as the director of operations before joining Patrick Chambers at Boston University as an assistant coach. Condon spent the 2007-08 and 2008-09 campaigns with the Highlanders.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS

The Nittany Lions have won their last 13 non-conference games in the Bryce Jordan Center, dating back to Nov. 13, 2013, and a 90-80 setback vs. Bucknell. The loss to Duquesne Friday ended a 12-game, non-conference winning streak after closing the pre-Big Ten slate with a 10-consecutive victories last season and beginning the year 2-0.

UP NEXT

Penn State welcomes Bucknell to the BJC at 1 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 28 for the second of three games vs. in-state foes. The Lions and Bison have met 102 times, the fourth-longest series among PSU opponents, including matchups in each of the last three seasons. Penn State has won 13 of the last 14 outings in the series, including an 88-80 win last season (Nov. 25, 2014) in the first trip to Lewisburg since 1974.

LAST TIME OUT

Penn State (2-1) fell short to hot-shooting Duquesne (3-0) on the road at the CONSOL Energy Center Friday evening. Senior Brandon Taylor led Penn State with 14 points. Sophomores Payton Banks and Shep Garner added 12 points apiece. The trio of double figure scorers marks the third straight game the Nittany Lions have ahead at least three with 10 or more points. Penn State led by one with 3:14 remaining in the first half by hitting back-to-back 3-pointers. The Dukes answered with a 12-0 run to close the half and did not relinquish the lead. [Notes/Box Score: Page 21]

CHAMBERS AVAILABILITY

All interview requests for head coach Patrick Chambers should be directed to Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office. Coach Chambers will hold weekly press conferences and teleconferences during the season. A schedule will be emailed out every Monday. Coach Chambers will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be arranged through Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will generally be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Patrick Chambers' weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off. Player phone numbers will not be released. Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the postgame media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

CREDENTIALS

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Alissa Clendenen. Please submit requests for game credentials at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, near Parking Lot 8. Penn State is a member of the Big Ten Conference and all press box and game day policies will conform to Big Ten guidelines.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

A photo pass must be issued to gain access courtside in the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Alissa Clendenen one week in advance for photo passes. Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and the stands. Photographers must remain seated at all times.

RADIO NETWORKS

The Penn State Sports Network originates from the first row of Booth C23 in the press area. Visiting radio stations are located on the first row of Booth C22 in the press area. Visiting radio is provided one phone line and one ISDN line.

CHAMBERS TAKES ON YEAR FIVE

The 2015-16 season marks the fifth year at the helm of the Nittany Lions for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native is coming off his best season in University Park after posting a win total (18) that had been topped just twice in the last decade and four times since 2000. Chambers has seen his overall win total climb each of the last three years and has continued to make waves in Big Ten play.

SUITS AND SNEAKERS

Head coach Patrick Chambers will don suits and sneakers for every game during the 2015-16, in honor of the 20th season of Coaches vs. Cancer - Penn State. The school's chapter of CVC is consistently ranks among the Top 10 CVC organizations in the nation. It was started in 1995 under then head coach Bruce Parkhill and raises funds to support the American Cancer Society as well as the Bob Perks Fund (BPF), a local initiative that provides direct support for community members and families fighting cancer. FACILITY UPGRADES

The Penn State basketball program recently moved into new training table and video room facilities in the Bryce Jordan Center. The \$1.2 million project was propelled by a generous gift from Peter and Ann Tombros and allows the Nittany Lions to utilize state of the art technologies. The concourse of the BJC also got a makeover in the offseason, and features Nittany and Lady Lion basketball graphics surrounding the circumference, as well as the main entrances.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

A pair of four-year players – Brandon Taylor and Donovan Jack - were selected team captains for the season by a player vote. Combined with Jordan Dickerson, who has played a year and a half in Happy Valley, and Devin Foster, who joined the Lions last year, the group makes up the 2015-16 senior class. Taylor and Jack have been a part of 44 wins in their first three years, the most since the 2011-12 class entered its final year with 57 victories.

ROOKIE RECOGNITION

The freshman class of Josh Reaves, Mike Watkins and Deividas Zemgulis make up the most heralded group to sign at Penn State to date. The trio was rated as the No. 28 class in the nation by 247 Sports, marking the first Top 30 group to join the Nittany Lions. Both four-star players, Reaves and Watkins were each ranked among the Top 100 players in the country by ESPN with Reaves holding the No. 81 spot and Watkins coming in at No. 89 at the time of their signing. Zemgulis was a three-star recruit and a Top 12 prospect from Maryland.

LIONS GAIN UCONN TRANSFER

Terrence Samuel joined the Nittany Lions in July after playing two years at the University of Connecticut. He will have two seasons of eligibility remaining after sitting out the 2015-16 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. A member of the Huskies' 2014 NCAA Championship team, Samuel saw action in 65 career games with eight starts as a sophomore. He averaged 3.6 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in his second season in Storrs with career averages of 3.0 ppg and 1.7 rpg.

BLOCK PARTY

The Nittany Lions have a total of three players in the Penn State Top 10 in the blocks category. Donovan Jack and Jordan Dickerson are tied at No. 8 with 82 career blocks, while Brandon Taylor is 10th with 74. Jack and Dickerson also share the No. 8 position in single-season blocks with 53 after putting up the total in 2013-14 and 2014-15, respectively. It was the first time Penn State had a player produce more than 50 blocks in back-to-back seasons since 1998 and 1999 when Calvin Booth did so.

RETURN TO REC ... TIMES TWO

Penn State's non-conference schedule is highlighted by two games to be played in historic Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions will take on Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 10 and 12, respectively, as part of the second Return to Rec. Penn State last played in Rec Hall during the 2013-14 season in a Return to Rec event that marked the first men's basketball game played there since the Nittany Lions defeated Wisconsin, 79-50, in the building on Jan. 7, 1996. From 1926-96, the Lions compiled a stellar 514-183 (73.7%) record in Rec Hall, including a 45-game win streak from 1951-55.

PSU TAKES NYC

The Nittany Lion basketball and men's hockey programs will take over Madison Square Garden Jan. 30 in the first Big Ten Super Saturday - Hoops and Hockey doubleheader. The teams will both take on Michigan with tip slated for noon and puck drop scheduled for 7 p.m., both on Big Ten Network. In the first of four annual events at "The World's Most Famous Arena," which also will host the 2018 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament Feb. 28-March 4 of that year. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games at Madison Square Garden in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

LAS VEGAS CLASSIC

Penn State will take part in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic Dec. 22-23 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas. The Nittany Lions will open action by taking on Colorado at 10:30 p.m. ET Tuesday, Dec. 22. The winner of the Penn State-Colorado game will play the winner of the SMU vs. Kent State matchup at 10:30 p.m. ET Dec. 23 on FoxSports1. The losers in each game will play each other at 8

p.m. ET, also on FoxSports1. Each team will play four games in the Classic – the first two at on-campus sites and the final two rounds at the Orleans Arena. Penn State's two games are vs. Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe in the Return to Rec series.

STAFF CHANGES

Head coach Patrick Chambers announced a series of staff changes in the offseason, beginning with the move by Ross Condon from director of operations to assistant coach in wake of the departure of Brian Daly. David Caporaletti, who previously spent four seasons as the director of on-campus recruiting, filled Condon's former post. Nicholas Colella then moved into the recruiting role and graduate managers Evann Baker and Kevin Hacke were added to the mix.

TWENTY SEASONS IN THE BJC

The 2015-16 campaign will be the 20th season in the Bryce Jordan Center. Since opening its doors to basketball Jan. 7, 1996, with a 79-50 win over Wisconsin, the BJC has hosted 316 Nittany Lion games with the team holding a winning percentage of 61.1 in those contests. Penn State has won at least 10 home games in four of the last five seasons.

120TH SEASON PENN STATE BASKETBALL

The Nittany Lions embark on the 120th season of basketball at Penn State and their 25th as a member of the Big Ten in 2015-16. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, who they will face for the fourth-consecutive season and the 102nd time overall. Penn State has made 13 postseason appearances in the last 27 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

SIGNING DAY



Penn State men's basketball coach Patrick Chambers inked the highest-rated recruiting class in program history, signing four standout players to NCAA Letters of Intent to play for the Nittany Lions on Nov. 11.

Nazeer Bostick, Tony Carr and Lamar Stevens, all products of Philadelphia's Roman Catholic and AAU Team Final, along with Oak Hill/DC Premier export Joe Hampton will join the Penn State squad for the 2016-17 season. The group is touted as the sixth-ranked class in the country according to ESPN at the start of the day, which also ranked three of the individuals among their Top 100 players.

"Today marks the culmination of three years of hard work and dedication by this coaching staff to building relationships with these players and their families," Chambers said. "We are excited to watch these four guys come together and are impressed with their dedication to directing the course of Penn State basketball.

"All four believe in the vision we have for this program – in building it piece by piece and achieving success while earning degrees, developing men and serving our community. I want to welcome Nazeer, Tony, Joe and Lamar to the Penn State family."

The signing of the class was celebrated with an event the night of Nov. 11 with season ticket holders and invited guests. All four members of the 2016-17 class participated via Skype.

Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

- Has three of his former student-athletes on staff: Dwayne Anderson (asst. coach), Ross Condon (asst. coach) and Nicholas Colella (dir. of on-campus recruiting).
- Has been on coaching staffs that have made six NCAA Tournament appearances (17 games) in his 10 seasons in collegiate coaching.
- Is the youngest of 12 children
- Has 3 of 11 siblings who graduated from Penn State.
- Spent 10 years as a highly-successful salesman and part owner of his family's printing business in Philadelphia.
- Was in collegiate coaching just five years before earning his first head coaching position at Boston University.
- Played in college for 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, also known as "The Shot Doctor."
- Helped lead Villanova to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2009 Final Four.
- Was instrumental in recruiting the No. 3 ranked recruiting class in the nation according to ESPN.com to Villanova in 2009.
- Has an older brother, Tim, who was the 1984 Ivy League Player of the Year in football and led Penn to three-straight Ivy League titles. He is now a writer, producer and director and released the film "Mighty Macs" about the Immaculata women's 1972 NCAA championship team.
- Has an older brother, Paul, who was a three-year starter at point guard for the Penn Quakers.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Helped out by double figure scoring from four Nittany Lions, Penn State men's basketball (2-0) took down DePaul (1-1) 68-62 Tuesday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. After picking up two fouls early, Brandon Taylor scored 19 of his 22 points in the second half and Penn State led DePaul whistle to whistle in the Gavitt Tipoff Series.

Shep Garner added 7 of his 16 points in the final two minutes to keep the Blue Demons at bay. Penn State jumped out to an early lead when Josh Reaves and Garner turned back-to-back steals into easy layups. The Nittany Lion guards combined to score the next eight points, giving Penn State its largest lead of the half 11-2.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State never trailed on the way to a 68-62 victory against DePaul Tuesday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. It was the first time since Nov. 28, 2014, that the Nittany Lions did not relinquish a lead.
- Four Nittany Lions fueled the offense with double-digit scoring, led by a 22-point performance from senior Brandon Taylor. Sophomore Shep Garner finished with 16 points, while junior Payton Banks and freshman Josh Reaves totaled 10 points each.
- With the win against DePaul, Penn State has won each of its last 12 regular-season non-conference games. The win also stretches the Penn State Bryce Jordan Center home winning streak to 13 in a row against non-league foes.
- Penn State shot a season-high 48 percent (10-21) from 3-point range in the win against DePaul, helped out by multiple treys from three different Nittany Lions. Taylor knocked down a team-high four triples, while Garner added three and Banks had two.
- Penn State limited the Blue Demons to a season-low 38 percent shooting from the field (20-53), after holding DePaul to 27 percent (7-26) in the first half. PSU also limited the Blue Demons to just 18 percent shooting from three-point range (2-11).
- Head coach Patrick Chambers earned his 100th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory against DePaul. Chambers has led the Nittany Lions to a 2-0 start for the third time in his PSU career and each of the last two seasons.
- The Nittany Lions earned their first program victory against DePaul, to move to 1-6 in the all-time series against the Blue Demons ...PSU also moves to 36-41 all-time against current teams in the Big East conference, having played its first Big East conference opponent since 2013.

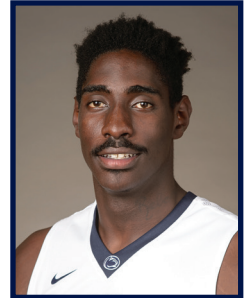
