24 – DEREK DAY, RB, Harrisburg, Pa.

Derek Day was co-recipient of the team's John Bruno, Jr. Memorial Award, presented to top senior special teams player. Played in 10 games, gaining 109 yards on 33 carries, with a long rush of 14 yards. Had two catches for 20 yards. Made nine tackles (five solo) on special teams, the highest total among all offensive players. Day made 26 special teams tackles over the last three seasons. Earned his first career start at Virginia and ran a career-high 18 times for 47 yards. Suffered a shoulder injury vs. the Cavaliers and missed the next two games. Carried the ball four times for 14 yards and made two stops in the 35-7 win at Illinois. Had three carries for 12 yards in the 38-14 win at Iowa. Made a career-high four special teams tackles in 34-9 win at Purdue. Made at least one tackle in five games. Graduated in December, 2012.

27 – JAKE FAGNANO, Saf, Williamsport, Pa.

Jake Fagnano played in every game on defense and special teams in 2012, with two starts. Was 10th on the team with 38 tackles (21 solo), the second-highest total among non-starters. Had one interception, one fumble recovery and five pass break-ups. Made a career-high nine tackles in the season opener vs. Ohio. Totaled six stops against Navy (three solo) and made two tackles in the 35-7 win at Illinois. Made three solo hits in 38-14 win at Iowa and two stops vs. Ohio State. Made one solo tackle and had a pass break-up in 34-9 win at Purdue. Made four tackles and recovered first career fumble in the end zone against No. 18 Nebraska for a touchback. Earned first career start in the win over Indiana, recording three tackles and two pass break-ups. Started in the Senior Day win over Wisconsin and made five hits, two pass break-ups and grabbed his first career interception, deep in Penn State territory in the fourth quarter of eventual 24-21 overtime win.

78 – MIKE FARRELL, OT, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Mike Farrell was selected 2012 honorable-mention All-Big Ten by the coaches and media. Co-recipient of the team's Richard Maginnis Award, presented to top senior offensive lineman. Three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. Started every game during 2012 season. Started first two contests at right tackle and started at left tackle in the wins over Navy, Temple and at Illinois. Returned to right tackle for the win over No. 24 Northwestern and the rest of the season. Was instrumental in helping the Nittany Lions lead the Big Ten in total offense (437.0 ypg) in conference games and ranking second in scoring offense (32.6 ppg) and second in pass offense (283.1 ypg) against Big Ten foes. Farrell helped Penn State gain more than 500 yards of total offense three times in conference play, topped by 546 yards against Indiana, its highest total against a Big Ten foe since gaining 557 yards against Michigan State in 2008.

Farrell helped quarterback Matt McGloin break nine Penn State season and career passing records, Allen Robinson break the school season receptions mark (77) and Zach Zwinak to rush for 1,000 yards during the 2012 season, as he gained 100 yards or more in six Big Ten games. Farrell brought a 3.40 grade-point average into the 2012 fall semester and graduated in December, 2012. The former Shady Side Academy standout was president of Penn State's chapter of Uplifting Athletes in 2011 and 2012, helping the football team raise more than \$200,000 for the Kidney Cancer Association at the Penn State Lift For Life. Farrell played in the 2013 Casino Del Sol All-Star Game.

47 – JORDAN HILL, DT, Steelton, Pa.

Jordan Hill was selected a 2012 second-team All-American by Athlon Sports. Hill earned first-team All-Big Ten honors by the coaches, media panel, BTN.com and ESPN.com. In the 2013 Senior Bowl, Hill made three tackles, including 1.5 TFL for minus-six yards and 0.5 sack. His TFL total was third-highest in the Senior Bowl. A starter in 24 games the past two seasons, Hill was invited to the 2013 NFL Scouting Combine. Was a pre-season candidate for the 2012 Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award.

A team co-captain, Hill played an instrumental role for a defense that ranked second in the Big Ten and No. 16 nationally in scoring defense at 19.1 ppg, holding six teams to 17 or fewer points. He was fourth on the team with 64 tackles, second with 4.5 sacks (minus-32) and tied for third with 8.5 tackles for loss this season. The former Steelton-Highspire High School standout also had one interception, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. A two-time Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honoree during the 2012 season (only DL to do so), his tackle total was No. 3 among Big Ten defensive linemen.

In his final game, Hill made a career-high 12 tackles, with two sacks (-11) and 3.0 TFL (-14) in the Nittany Lions' 24-21 overtime win over Wisconsin to earn the conference's weekly defensive honor and the Capital One Impact Performance of the Week. Hill recorded eight tackles, a sack and two tackles for loss (1 solo and two assisted) in the fourth quarter and OT alone. Hill was selected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week for the 38-14 win over Iowa. He made a then season-high nine tackles (seven solo), with 2.0 TFL, one sack for minus-yards and one QB hurry in the win over the Hawkeyes. Hill made eight tackles in the win over No. 24 Northwestern and seven stops vs. Ohio State and Temple.

6 – GERALD HODGES, LB, Paulsboro, N.J.

A starter in all 25 games the past two years, Gerald Hodges was No. 4 in the Big Ten with 109 tackles in 2012. He is just the sixth Nittany Lion with multiple 100-tackle seasons. A semifinalist for the 2012 Butkus Award, he was invited to the East-West Shrine Game and 2013 NFL Scouting Combine. Hodges earned 2012 Second-team All-Big Ten and 2011 First-team All-Big Ten honors.

Hodges was selected the New Jersey Division I College Player of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Southern New Jersey, for the second consecutive year, and the 2012 Brooks-Irvine Memorial Football Club of South Jersey. Hodges was co-recipient of the Coaches Award at team banquet. He was a pre-season candidate for the Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award.

Hodges played an instrumental role for a defense that ranked second in the Big Ten and No. 16 nationally in scoring defense at 19.1 ppg, holding six teams to 17 or fewer points. He led the Nittany Lions with seven pass breakups and was tied for second on the squad with two interceptions. The former Paulsboro High School standout also ranked third with 8.5 tackles for loss, while adding one sack and one forced fumble.

Hodges made a season-high 14 tackles vs. Ohio State, with a 10-yard sack. He tied his season-high with 14 hits at Nebraska, including 2.0 TFL and a pass break-up. He made a game-high 12 tackles, with an interception in Indiana territory, 1.0 TFL and team-high seventh pass break-up in 45-22 win on Nov. 17. Hodges was selected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week for third time in his career after helping Penn State to 39-28 win over No. 24 Northwestern. He recorded 11 tackles, made 1.5 TFL, two pass break-ups and forced a fumble late in game to end any NU comeback hopes.

59 – PETE MASSARO, DE, Newtown Square, Pa.

Pete Massaro was selected a 2012 first-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, to go with his 2010 honor. He is the 10th Nittany Lion to twice earn first-team Academic All-America honors and was a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. Co-recipient of the team's Ridge Riley Award. Played in the 2013 NFLPA Collegiate Bowl. Massaro played an important role for a defense that ranked second in the Big Ten and No. 16 nationally in scoring defense at 19.1 ppg, holding six teams to 17 or fewer points.

Massaro made eight tackles, with 1.0 TFL, 0.5 sack and one pass break-up during 2012 season. Made one tackle against Ohio and Virginia, starting vs. the Cavaliers. Suffered a shoulder injury at Virginia and missed the next three games with an injury. Returned in the win over No. 24 Northwestern, recording a pass break-up. Made one tackle in 38-14 win at Iowa and put pressure on quarterback several times in game. Made two stops with 0.5 sack vs. Ohio State and one solo hit in 34-9 win at Purdue. Made one stop in the win over Indiana.

Massaro also was a 2010 first-team Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-American and nominated for 2012 National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Fellowship. He graduated with a 3.85 grade-point average and earned CoSIDA Academic All-District honors for the second time. Earned degree in Finance in Dec. 2011 and earned second degree, in Economics, in Dec. 2012.

42 – MICHAEL MAUTI, LB, Mandeville, La.

Michael Mauti was selected a first-team All-American by ESPN and Phil Steele's College Football, giving Penn State 11 first-team All-Americans since 2005. The Nittany Lions' 97th first-team All-American, Mauti was a semifinalist for the 2012 Butkus Award, was the Big Ten Butkus-Fitzgerald Linebacker of the Year and a pre-season candidate for the Bednarik Award. He earned first-team All-Big Ten honors by the coaches, media, BTN.com and ESPN.com and was selected the Nittany Lions' 2012 Outstanding Senior Player. A two-time Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week in 2012 (three career), he was invited to the NFL Scouting Combine.

A team co-captain, Mauti was the only Big Ten player ranked in the top 10 in the conference in tackles (6th, 95), interceptions (7th, 3) and forced fumbles (3rd, 3). He also led the Big Ten in interception return yards (125). Mauti recorded 4.0 TFL, 2.5 sacks (minus-25), a team-high three interceptions, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and two pass break-ups.

Mauti played an instrumental role for a defense that ranked second in the Big Ten and No. 16 nationally in scoring defense at 19.1 ppg, holding six teams to 17 or fewer points. The former Mandeville High School All-American started the initial 11 games this season, suffering a knee injury in the first quarter vs. Indiana on Nov. 17 that ended his season.

Mauti was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after making 12 tackles in the 34-7 win over Navy.

He made six tackles and grabbed two interceptions in the 35-7 win at Illinois, including a school record 99-yard return. He was named the Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week and Big Ten Defensive Player of the week following his efforts against the Illini. Mauti made 10 tackles at No. 18 Nebraska and forced a Taylor Martinez fumble near the goal line in the fourth quarter that PSU recovered in the end zone. He tied his career-high with 13 tackles against Ohio State and made nine tackles (six solo), all in the second half, to help the Nittany Lions defeat No. 24 Northwestern, 39-28. He made eight hits, including a sack, and grabbed his third interception of season in 38-14 win at Iowa.

11 – MATT MCGLOIN, QB, Scranton, Pa.

During his senior season, Matt McGloin emerged as one of Penn State's most prolific quarterbacks in its 126-year history. McGloin was named the starting signal-caller in June, 2012 and flourished in Coach Bill O'Brien's offense, starting all 12 games this past season.

A co-captain, McGloin's tremendous efforts and improvement were recognized as he was selected the recipient of the 2012 Burlsworth Trophy, presented to the nation's top player who began

his career as a walk-on.

The former West Scranton High School standout broke 10 school records and tied another during his superlative senior campaign. Under McGloin's direction, Penn State led the Big Ten in total offense (437.0 ypg) in conference games and was second in scoring offense (32.6 ppg) and pass offense (283.1 ypg) against Big Ten foes. McGloin led the Nittany Lions to more than 500 yards of total offense three times in conference play, topped by 546 yards vs. Indiana, its highest total against a Big Ten foe since gaining 557 yards against Michigan State in 2008.

During the 2012 season, McGloin was 270 of 446 (60.5) for 3,266 yards, with 24 touchdown passes and only five interceptions. He also was second on the team with five touchdown runs. An honorable mention All-Big Ten choice, McGloin was selected Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Nov. 19 after throwing for 395 yards, just four yards off the school record, and a career-high tying four touchdowns in Penn State's 45-22 win over Indiana. He completed a school record 35 passes in leading a 22-point fourth quarter for a 39-28 comeback win over No. 24 Northwestern.

McGloin led the Big Ten in passing yards (272.2 ypg) by 25 yards per game. He also led the conference in completions (270) and touchdown passes (24) and had the fewest interceptions among the Big Ten starting signal-callers. McGloin threw at least one touchdown pass in his last 13 regular season games, with multiple TD passes in eight games in 2012. He threw for at least 200 yards in each of the final 10 games of the season.

McGloin earned his degree in journalism in May 2012 and is working on a second degree, in telecommunications. He was co-recipient of the team's Ridge Riley Award and played in the 2013 Texas vs. The Nation All-Star Game.

12 – STEPHON MORRIS, CB, Washington, D.C.

Stephon Morris was selected honorable-mention All-Big Ten by the coaches and media. Co-recipient of the Coaches Award at team banquet. Morris played an instrumental role for a defense that ranked second in the Big Ten and No. 16 nationally in scoring defense at 19.1 ppg, holding six teams to 17 or fewer points.

Morris started every game during the 2012 season and his 24 career starts were No. 4 on the team. He was fifth on the team with 60 tackles and his 41 solo hits were third-highest. He had 5.0 TFL (minus-22), 1.5 sacks and five pass break-ups, tied for second-highest on team. Made four stops and had a pass break-up in 39-28 win over Northwestern. Made one solo tackle in helping hold Iowa to 209 yards in 38-14 win. Made two solo stops and one pass break-up vs. Ohio State. Made season-high six solo hits, with a TFL for minus-5 yards, and a pass break-up in 34-9 win at Purdue. Tied his career-high with nine tackles at No. 18 Nebraska, including 2.0 TFL and a sack. Tied his career-high for the second consecutive game with nine stops (eight solo) in the 45-22 win over Indiana. Made five hits (four solo) and a pass break-up in 24-21 Senior Day overtime win over eventual Big Ten champion Wisconsin.

54 – MATT STANKIEWITCH, C, Orwigsburg, Pa.

A first-team All-Big Ten selection by the coaches, BTN.com and ESPN.com, Stankiewitch started all 25 games the past two seasons. One of six finalists for the 2012 Rimington Trophy, Stankiewitch was co-recipient of the team's Richard Maginnis Award, presented to the top senior offensive lineman. Was named a team captain for the East in the East-West Shrine Game and was invited to the 2013 NFL Scouting Combine.

He was instrumental in helping the Nittany Lions lead the Big Ten in total offense (437.0 ypg) in conference games and rank second in scoring offense (32.6 ppg) and second in pass offense (283.1 ypg) against Big Ten foes. Stankiewitch helped Penn State gain more than 500 yards of total offense three times in conference play, topped by 546 yards against Indiana, its highest total against a Big Ten foe in four years.

Stankiewitch helped Matt McGloin break nine Penn State season and career passing records, Allen Robinson break the school season receptions mark (77) and Zach Zwinak to rush for 1,000 yards this season, gaining 100 yards or more in six Big Ten games. He graduated in December, 2012.

90 - SEAN STANLEY, DE, Rockville, Md.

Selected honorable-mention All-Big Ten. Stanley was co-recipient of the team's Reid-Robinson Award, presented to the squad's top defensive lineman. Played in the NFL Collegiate Bowl.

Stanley played an important role for a defense that ranked second in the Big Ten and No. 16 nationally in scoring defense at 19.1 ppg, holding six teams to 17 or fewer points. Stanley started 10 of 11 games in 2012, missing the Temple contest with a minor back injury. He had 35 tackles, was second on team with 9.5 TFL (minus-43), was tied for third with 4.0 sacks (minus-29), two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. Made a career-high seven tackles (four solo) vs. Ohio State, with 1.5 TFL and 0.5 sack. Made two hits in 34-9 win at Purdue with a sack for minus-13 yards and forced a fumble. Made four tackles at No. 18 Nebraska, including 2.0 TFL. Made four stops (three solo), including a sack in the 45-22 win over Indiana. Recorded 1.5 TFL, with a sack and a forced fumble in 24-21 Senior Day overtime win over Wisconsin.

Played in every game on defense and special teams and made 15 tackles (10 solo). Made four solo tackles in 34-7 win over Navy. Recorded a career-high seven hits in the 35-7 win at Illinois in the Big Ten opener. Pounced on an Ohio State punt that was blocked by Mike Hull for his first career touchdown and a 7-0 lead vs. the Buckeyes. Had one stop in four other games. 9 - MICHAEL ZORDICH, RB, Youngstown, Ohio

Elected a team offensive co-captain. Was the recipient of the team's Robert B. Mitinger, Jr. Award. Played in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl. Played in every game in 2012 with five starts. Was second on the team with 308 yards on 80 carries, and four rushing touchdowns. His long carry was 25 yards. He also made 15 catches for 152 yards, with a long catch of 27 yards.

Zordich led team with then career bests of 50 yards on 11 carries in 34-7 win over Navy. Posted the longest run (16 yds) and longest catch (27 yds) of his career to that point in the win over Temple. Re-wrote his career-bests with 15 carries for 75 yards and caught four balls for 39 yards versus the Owls. In the comeback win over No. 24 Northwestern, Zordich caught four passes for 31 yards and ran seven times for 32 yards, with a touchdown. His 25-yard burst late in the game was the Nittany Lions' second-longest rush during season and set-up his own three-yard scoring run for a 39-28 lead with 1:30 to play. Ran for 24 yards in helping Penn State thump Iowa, 38-14. Posted his first career multiple TD game with six and five-yard TD runs in 34-9 win at Purdue. Gained 33 yards on 11 carries, with a long of 10 yards, and had one catch for 20 yards vs. the Boilers. Had 12 rushing yards and one catch for three yards at No. 18 Nebraska. Ran for 49 yards on just nine carries, including a 23-yard burst, and had a 27-yard reception in the win over Indiana.
