### **OUICK HITS**

SETTING THE SCENE | The Penn State men's basketball team returns to the Bryce Jordan Center to face Purdue at 1 p.m. Saturday. The game will be broadcast on ESPNU with Clay Matvick and Sean Harrington on the call.

The Nittany Lions are seeking their first win in Big Ten play, though the teams still has the most wins (12) through the first 17games of the season since 2008-09 (13-4).

Penn State's last three Big Ten games have been decided by a total of 16 points with two games being separated by three and four points. The loss to Indiana, 76-73, was the Nittany Lions' first one-possession loss of the season and broke a seven-game streak of wins in games decided by three points or fewer, dating back to last season.

PURDUE | The Boilermakers are 10-7 on the season and 2-2 in conference play, defeating Minnesota and Michigan before falling to

Wisconsin and Maryland. They are 0-2 on the road this season (0-1 in the Big Ten). [MORE: Page 2]

THE SERIES | Penn State and Purdue have met 32 times, dating back to 1959. The Boilermakers lead 30-12, though the teams split regular-season meetings a year ago and Penn State has won two of the last three meetings in the BJC. [MORE: Page 2]

LAST TIME OUT | Penn State was led by Ross Travis and Shep Garner, who each had 14, but a late charge from Indiana was enough to hold off the Nittany Lions 76-73 Tuesday. The Nittany Lions cut a 12-point deficit to 76-73 on Travis' basket with 53.1 seconds to go. A 3-point shot at the buzzer was waved off. [RECAP: Page 35]

**LEADER** | Senior guard D.J. Newbill, the Big Ten leading scorer and eighth in the nation, has paced the Nittany Lions throughout the season with 20.8 ppg, with nine outings of 20-plus points. He is 9th all-time in PSU career scoring, despite playing just three seasons. [MORE: 17]

### THE MATCHUP

### **SCOUTING PURDUE**

- The Boilermakers enter the BJC with a 10-7 overall record and are 2-2 in the Big Ten. They have played just two true road games to date, going 0-2 at Vanderbilt in the non-conference and at Wisconsin among league foes.
- Purdue won each of its first two Big Ten games, but dropped its last two againt ranked foes Wisconsin and Maryland.
- Purdue has three players averaging just over 10 points per game, led by Kendall Stephens with 10.9 ppg. Isaac Haas and A.J. Hammons both produce 10.1 ppg with Hammons adding 5.9 rebounds and a Big Ten-leading 2.5 blocks per game.
- As a team, the Boilermakers averaged 72.9 ppg in non-conference play, but have been limited to 62.2 ppg once in league play.

### 14-15 PLAYERS VS. THE BOILERMAKERS

Nine players on the current PSU roster have seen action vs. Purdue with D.J Newbill leading the group in scoring with 15.5 ppg in four meetings. He had 19 points in the 79-68 victory at the BJC last season, which is tied for for he sixth-most points scored by a PSU player all-time against the Boilermakers. Brandon Taylor is the leading rebounder with 5.8 per game.

### **SERIES HISTORY**

- The teams split last season's meetings with each team winning at home. Purdue leads the all-time series 30-12 and is 11-10 when playing in University Park.
- Penn State has won two of the last three meetings in the BJC.
- The Nittany Lions were victories in the BJC last season, knocking off the Boilermakers 79-68 for what stood as the team's third Big Ten victory in a row.

### **LAST TIME VS. PURDUE**

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (Feb. 2, 2014)** - The Penn State trio of D.J. Newbill (Philadelphia, Pa.), Tim Frazier (Houston, Texas) and Brandon Taylor (Tabernacle, N.J.) led the men's basketball team to a 79-68 victory over Purdue Sunday afternoon at the Bryce Jordan Center. Newbill led all scorers with 19 points, Frazier followed close-

ly with 18 points and Taylor added 15 points to give the Nittany Lions three-consecutive Big Ten regular-season wins for the first time since 2009.

Taylor also led the Lions in rebounding, pulling down eight boards while Newbill registered seven. Frazier recorded another complete game, dishing out five assists and grabbing five rebounds. The graduate guard is just two helpers away from taking over the PSU career assists record, currently held by Freddie Barnes (600; 1989-92).

### **THREE MORE NOTABALE GAMES**

**Jan. 5, 2012:** Penn State posted the first Big Ten victory of the Patrick Chambers era with an impressive 65-45 victory in the Bryce Jordan Center. The Nittany Lions were led by redshirt junior Billy Oliver, who posted a career-high 21 points on a personal-best 7-of-11 from three. Oliver's seven threes tied for the second-most for a Nittany Lion in a game Penn State history.

**March 13, 2009:** The Lions' last loss of the 2008-09 season came to Purdue, 79-65, in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten tournament in Indianapolis. Jamelle Cornley had 20 points to lead four Lions in double-figures, but 24th-ranked Boilermakers shot 63 percent in the first half to fuel the win. They went on to win the B1G tourney, while the Lions bounced back to earn the NIT Championship, the program's first and only national title to date.

**Feb. 21, 1998:** The Nittany Lions used Pete Lisicky's 19 points and Jarrett Stephens' 17 to upset No. 5 Purdue, 74-63, in the Bryce Jordan Center. The win was Penn State's first over a team ranked in the Top 5 in nearly 50 years.

**NON-CONFERENCE WINS** | The 12 non-conference wins were the most for the Nittany Lions in program history, breaking the previous high of 11 set during the 2008-09 season. In the Big Ten era, Penn State was undefeated in conference play in 1995-96 (9-0) and had one-loss seasons in 2000-01 (9-1) and 1994-95 (8-1).

**THRU 17** At 12-5, the Nittany Lions have the most wins through the first 17 games of the year since the 2008-09 season when they went 13-4.

**ONE-POSSESSION GAMES** | Five games this season have been separated by one possession with Penn State winning the first four before falling to Indiana, 76-73, Tuesday in Bloomington. A year ago, the Lions had eight games decided by three points or fewer in the regular season. They lost each of the first five and won the last three, giving them a seven-game win streak in regular-season, one-possession games.

**FIVE-POINT GAMES** | Through 17 games, Penn State has had eight decided by five points or fewer, winning each of the first six. The Jan. 3 loss vs. Rutgers was decided by four points, 50-46, and the loss at Indiana was separated by three points, 76-73. Last season, the Lions were 4-8 in regular-season games decided by the same margin.

**OFFENSIVE OUTPUT** Despite falling to Wisconsin, 89-72, New Year's Eve in Madison, the team shot 53.7 percent from the field (29-54), the highest clip vs. a B1G opponent since 2011 and the seventh-best against a conference foe in 15 years. D.J. Newbill powered PSU with 29 points to make Penn State just the second team to score 70 or more points vs. Wisconsin this season, joining Duke.

**FIELD-GOAL DEFENSE** | Penn State's opponents are scoring on 39.9 percent of their total shots and 32.8 percent of 3-point attempts, defensive marks which stand as third and fourth all-time since 1965 (among full-season figures).

**HOME SWEET HOME** | Penn State is 7-1 in the Bryce Jordan Center this season after falling to Michigan last Tuesday and has won each of its last 12 non-conference games in the BJC.

**BENCH POINTS** The PSU bench is averaging 21.6 ppg this season, up from 14.7 ppg last season, and has outscored the opponent's bench in 10 games. Reserve players have combined to score more than 30 points in four games this season: Duquesne (35), Michigan (33), Marshall (32) and Dartmouth (31). [MORE: Page 28]

**WIN STREAK** | Wisconsin snapped Penn State's 10-game winning streak, which was the longest for a PSU team since the 1995-96 squad opened the year going 13-0. The longest single-season win streak in program history is 15 games (1952).

**CHAIRMEN OF THE BOARDS** | Penn State is sixth among league teams in rebounds with 37.1 per game, up from 35.2 last season. The Lions have outrebounded its opponent in 10 of 17 games, going 9-1 in those contests. The loss at Indiana (37-30 rebounds) was the first.

**COMEBACKS** | The Lions have battled back from second-half deficits of 14 (Akron), 13 (Cornell), 8 (Virginia Tech) and 6 (Southern California) in wins this season. They trailed Rutgers by 14 Jan. 3 and came to within one late in the second half, and were down 12 to Indiana before closing it to three, but were not able to complete either comeback.

**CHARLESTON CLASSIC** | The two wins at the Charleston Classic stand as the first multi-win performance at a neutral-site, regular-season tournament for Penn State since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic.

**ATTENDANCE ON RISE** Attendance for non-conference home games this season was up nearly 54 percent from where it was a year ago. The Lions are averaged 7,532 fans per game in pre-Big TEn play in 2014-15, compared to 4,895 a year ago.

## **PLAYER SPOTLIGHTS**

**D.J. NEWBILL** is averaging 20.8 ppg, tops in the Big Ten and No. 8 in the country among DI players. Through Thursday games this week, his 353 total points and 120 made field goals were the sixth and 14th-most of any DI player, respectively. [More: Page 17]

With 1,461 career points at Penn State, **Newbill** holds the record among players to spend just three years in the Blue and White and is No. 9 all-time overall. He is averaging 17.8 ppg over his three seasons with Penn State, a career scoring average which tied for second among 1,000-point scorers. He is tied with Mark DuMars (1959-61; 1,139 points), behind only Jesse Arnelle (1952-55; 21.0 ppg; 2,138 points).

**BRANDON TAYLOR** | produced the team's first double-double of the season and the first of his career with 14 points and 11 rebounds in the win vs. Drexel Dec. 20. He has produced double-figures in six of the last nine games and is third on the team in scoring with 9.6 points per game. [MORE: Page 18]

The Nittany Lions cut a 12-point deficit to 76-73 on Travis' basket with 53.1 seconds to go. After a defensive stop, they took possession on a jump ball with 14.6 seconds left. But D.J. Newbill's contested 3 from the left wing was off and after Taylor grabbed the rebound, raced to the arc and made the shot, the refs waved it off.

## **SEASON NOTES**

### PENN STATE AND THE BIG TEN TAKE NYC

The Big Ten Conference announced a four-year men's basketball and men's hockey doubleheader series in Madison Square Garden, set to begin in 2016 with Penn State vs. Michigan Jan. 30. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

Additionally, the 2018 Big Ten Tournament will take place in MSG, scheduled for Feb. 28-March 4 with all 14 conference programs competing for the Big Ten's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. The 2018 event will be held one week earlier than previous tournaments, ending seven days before NCAA Tournament Selection Sunday.

### **THROWBACK UNIS**

Penn State wore new throwback uniforms at Bucknell Nov. 28 and. vs. Virginia Tech Dec. 3, going 2-0. The unis are black and pink, honoring the school's original school colors established in 1887. The color pairing lasted just 2.5 years. Problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new choice was made on March 18, 1890.

### PLAYER LEADERSHIP

The team elected four captains prior to the start of the season -- D.J. Newbill, who is in his third season as a captain, along with two-time captain Ross Travis, Brandon Taylor and Kevin Montminy. Those four, along with Alan Wisniewski, make up Patrick Chambers' Leadership Council, which the staff relies on for decision making, providing guidance and helping everyone be the best possible teammate.

### **CHAMBERS BEGINS YEAR FOUR**

The 2014-15 season marks the fourth in University Park for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native has seen his win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season as he racked up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State, a road win at Indiana and his first PSU postseason appearance last season.

### **ROOKIES LOOK TO MAKE IMPACT**

Three new faces join the veteran core of Nittany Lions. Devin Foster, a junior college transfer, along with freshmen Shep Garner and Isaiah Washington as Penn State rookies. Garner (Chester, Pa.) and Washington (Williamsport, Pa.) bring the number of Pennsylvania natives on the roster to eight, including four from the Philadelphia area.

### MONTMINY EARNS SCHOLARSHIP

Kevin Montminy was awarded a scholarship for the 2014-15 season, Patrick Chambers announced in early August. A three-year walk-on, Montminy has seen action in 40 career games over the last three seasons with 24 total points and 10 rebounds. With a 4.0 grade-point average in each of the last five semesters, Montminy is a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, Academic All-Big Ten honoree and the team's Academic Award recipient.

### **CHARLESTON CLASSIC**

The Nittany Lions are slated to take part in the 2014 Charleston Classic, Nov. 20-23 in Charleston, S.C. They will open play in the tourney by taking on Charlotte at 5 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 20 on ESPNU and then will face either South Carolina or Cornell on the second day of the three-day event. The remaining teams in the field include Akron, Drexel, Miami (Fla.), and Southern California.

### **OFFSEASON TRAINING**

The Nittany Lions made headlines with their extensive offseason-training regimen. Strength coach Brandon Spayd designed a three-part workout challenge for team members called the Yoke Zone Challenge. Players pushed cars, crawled through sandpits and completed a number of demanding stations in an obstacle course setting. Kevin Montminy and Jordan Dickerson were the top pair among players completed the entire course each week.

Patrick Chambers and his staff also brought in The Program, a leadership development and team building program created and executed by former military personnel. Players completed two days of extensive mental and physical tasks designed to build better leaders and more cohesive teams.

### **CHAMBERS ADDS ANOTHER FORMER PLAYER TO STAFF**

D.J. Irving, a four-year member of the men's basketball team at Boston University, joined the Penn State staff as a graduate manager for the 2014-15 season. He replaced Andrew Jones, who is an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Thunder's D-League team. Irving is the fourth player coached by Chambers to join his staff. Assistant coach Dwayne Anderson and Ross Condon, director of operations, both played at Villanova with Chambers as an assistant and associate head coach. Irving came into the fold at Boston University and fellow PSU graduate manager Nicholas Colella played two seasons for Chambers as a Lion.

### PENN STATE OPENS THE 119TH SEASON

Penn State is competing in its 119th season on the hardwood and its 23rd as a member of the Big Ten conference. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule for the third year in a row. The Lions have made 13 postseason appearances in the last 26 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

# PATRICK CHAMBERS, HEAD COACH

Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State — a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia — before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It was also shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

- Was in collegiate coaching just five years before earning his first head coaching position at Boston University.
- Played in college for 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, also known as "The Shot Doctor."
- Helped lead Villanova to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2009 Final Four.
- Was instrumental in recruiting the No.
   3 ranked recruiting class in the nation according to ESPN.com to Villanova in 2000
- Has an older brother, Tim, who was the 1984 lvy League Player of the Year in football and led Penn to three-straight lvy League titles. He is now a writer, producer and director and released the film "Mighy Macs" about the Immaculata women's 1972 NCAA championship team.
- Has an older brother, Paul, who was a three-year starter at point guard for the Penn Quakers.

### **SCORING**

D.J. Newbill has 1,461 points in his third season wearing the Blue and White and ranks No. 9 all-time in career scoring. He also holds the record for scoring among three-year players, passing John Amaechi's 1,310 points with 17 at Marshall Dec. 6.

With his junior point total (604) replicated, Newbill would enter the Top 4 at Penn State. With at least a 500-point season, Newbill would become just the second PSU player to do so in three-consecutive seasons, joining Talor Battle.

### **REBOUNDS**

Ross Travis, who has led the Nittany Lions in rebounding each of the last two seasons and is among the top returning rebounders in the Big Ten, entered the Top 10 in career boards at Penn State. He curently has 719 and owns the No. 9 spot after an 8-rebound showing at Indiana (1/13).

By producing the average of his last two seasons (7.2), Travis will entrench himself in the No. 3 spot all-time.

### **BLOCKS**

Donovon Jack entered Penn State's Top 10 with one block vs. Fordham (11/16). He now has 70 with all but three coming after his freshman season. His 53 blocks as a sophomore are the eighth-most in a single season and the most since the 1998-99 season. Only Calvin Booth, who owns positions 1-4, and John Amaechi (spots 5-7) rank above Jack.

Brandon Taylor needs three blocks to enter the Top 10 at Penn State. He is second on the team this season with 16 (0.9 per game).

Jordan Dickerson has 23 total blocks and is averaging 1.4 per game, which ranks 12th in the Big Ten. Last season, Dickerson produced 31 blocks in the 24 games he was eligible to compete last season, an average of 1.3 per game. That average would have placed him among the Top 10 in the Big Ten last season had he reached the minimum number of games to be ranked.



### Game 1: Penn State 61, Morgan State 48

Nov. 14, 2014 @ Bryce Jordan Center, University Park, Pa.



**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa.** - Behind a trio of double-digit scorers, Penn State men's basketball (1-0) earned a 61-48 season-opening victory against Morgan State (0-1) Friday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. Senior D.J. Newbill (Philadelphia, Pa.) scored 17 points, while freshman Shep Garner (Chester, Pa.) added 14.

Morgan State was led by Cedric Blossom's 10 points and Blake Bozeman's 9. The Bears shot just 18 of 58 from the field and were only 3 of 18 on their 3-point attempts.

Tied at 4-4 in the opening half, Morgan State used a 12-4 run to go up by as many as eight, 16-8, with 9:41 remaining in the frame. Penn State rallied back with a 12-2 stretch to lift the Nittany Lions on top, 21-18, with six minutes left in the period. The Bears answered with a 5-2 strike to keep the frame knotted, 23-23, but PSU regrouped with an 8-2 run to go up by as many as six, 31-25, heading into the intermission.

Garner came out firing to start the second half with his first 3-pointer for a nine-point Penn State lead. Bolstering the lead to as many as 16 in the second half, the Nittany Lions did not let the advantage dip below 10 as PSU powered to a 61-48 win.

### **POSTGAME NOTES**

- Penn State has now won its last 10 season openers. Having not lost a season-opening contest since 2004, the win also marks the fourth consecutive for head coach Patrick Chambers.
- Penn State moves to 89-30 all-time in season openers and 79-10 in yearly home openers.
- The Nittany Lions improve their advantage to 5-0 in all-time series against Morgan State.
- Penn State moves to 13-1 all-time against current squads in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.
- Shep Garner made his first collegiate start for the Nittany Lions against
  Morgan State. Garner is the first true freshman to start in a season
  opener since Trey Lewis in 2011, who made his rookie debut for the
  Nittany Lions Nov. 12, 2011 vs. Hartford. Both Garner (14) and Lewis
  (17) recorded double figure scoring in their debut outings for PSU.
- D.J. Newbill hit the court for his 66th consecutive start in the Blue and White, as he's started every single contest since arriving on campus as a sophomore transfer.
- With 17 points, Newbill recorded his 10th consecutive double-digit scoring outing, having posted double figures in every game since notching 22 against lowa Feb. 15, 2014.
- With 1,125 career points, Newbill needs just 14 more points to move to No. 20 on the Penn State all-time career scoring list.
- Geno Thorpe set a career-high mark with 11 points against Morgan State breaking his previous high (9) that he set last season against Ohio State (2/27/14).

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa.** - Four Nittany Lions scored in double figures as Penn State men's basketball (2-0) powered to a 73-54 victory against Fordham (1-1) Sunday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. Senior D.J. Newbill scored 18 points, freshman Shep Garner added 12 on four 3-pointers. junior Brandon Taylor and senior John Johnson each scored 11 as the Nittany Lions sank 25 of 53 field-goal attempts and seven of 18 3-pointers. The Lions held the Rams to 17-of-55 shooting, including just 8-of-26 3-pointers.

Nemanja Zarkovic scored 14 points for Fordham and Chris Sengfelder added 10.

The Nittany Lions won the rebounding battle (40-37) and held the Rams' Eric Paschall to just seven points. Paschall, who scored 31 against New York Institute of Technology Friday night, fouled out with 12:56 remaining. Senior Ross Travis had nine rebounds and eight points.

Tied up at 10-10 in the first half after some early back-and-forth action, senior John Johnson sparked a 6-0 run with a three-point play that lifted the Nittany Lions ahead by as many as six, 16-10. The Rams cut off the streak with a free throw, but Penn State surged ahead with eight more unanswered points capped off with a dunk by Newbill to stretch the advantage to double-digits, 24-11.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- PSU limited Fordham to 29.3 percent shooting from the field marking the first time that the Nittany Lions have held a team to less than 30 percent from the field since Dec. 23, 2012 against New Hampshire (22.6%).
- Four Nittany Lions recorded double-figure scoring in the win including, D.J. Newbill (18), Shep Garner (12), John Johnson (11) and Brandon Taylor (11)
- Penn State's four-guard rotation of Newbill, Garner, Thorpe and Johnson combined for 62 percent of the Nittany Lions' offense scoring 45 of 73 total points.
- The Penn State victory extended the Nittany Lion winning streak to six straight when playing on Nov. 16, as PSU moved to 7-1 all-time on the day.
- Penn State improved to 3-2 in the all-time series against the Rams in the first meeting between the two teams since 1973. The Nittany Lions also move to 1-1 at home in the series against Fordham.

**CHARLESTON, S.C. (AP)** - Led by a career-high 35 points from senior D.J. Newbill, Penn State men's basketball (2-1) fell short in a 106-97, double overtime loss to Charlotte (2-0) on the road in the Charleston Classic Thursday evening at TD Arena. The Nittany Lions rallied back from behind by as many as 17 points in the second half to send the game into two overtimes.

Four Nittany Lions posted double digit scoring, led by Newbill's career-high mark. Newbill is the first Nittany Lion to notch 35 points since Pete Lisicky put up the tally against Penn in 1996. Junior Brandon Taylor finished second on the squad with 19 points, including 11 in the first half.

Sophomore Geno Thorpe finished third on the team with a career-high 14 points, while freshman Shep Garner rounded out the group with 12 points. Senior Ross Travis and Taylor led the team with nine rebounds apiece.

This one looked like a runaway with Charlotte up 63-46 with 11:46 left in regulation. But Penn State used a 37-20 run to the buzzer and tied the game on senior John Johnson's 3-pointer with 1.6 seconds left.

Penn State had a chance to win in the first overtime, but Newbill's drive to the basket with the game tied at 90-all was blocked by Cameron Blakley. Ogbueze got the 49ers going in the second extra session. Thorne added two foul shots and a jam and Charlotte was up 97-93.

- Penn State erased a 17-point deficit in the second half to force the game into overtime (83-83) with a clutch three-pointer from John Johnson with two seconds remaining.
- A second overtime was forced (90-90), marking the first double-overtime game for Penn State since March 7, 2009 vs. lowa (lowa, 75-67).
- With a career-high 35 points, senior D.J. Newbill notched his first career 30-point game. The 35 points stand as the most by a Penn State player since Joe Crispin tallied 35 vs. Iowa Jan. 6, 2001.
- Newbill used 33 field-goal attempts in the process, the second-most in program history behind only Gene Harris' 37 vs. Holy Cross in 1962
- Newbill has 1,178 career points, which vaults him into 19th place on the Penn State all-time list. He needs just six more points to match Ron Brown (1972-74) for 18th all-time.
- Sophomore Geno Thorpe finished third on the team with a career-high 14 points, marking the second time this season he's reach double figure scoring.
- Senior John Johnson scored his only three points of the game with a clutch 3-pointer with two seconds remaining in regulation to send the contest into overtime.

John Johnson had 17 points, including a high arcing 3-pointer with 4.5 seconds left that drew the Nittany Lions to 71-70.

Galal Cancer and Robert Hatter had 17 points each for Cornell, which faces Drexel for seventh place game Sunday.

It was a dramatic change of fortune for the Nittany Lions in Charleston. They rallied from 17 points down against Charlotte on Thursday night only to fall 106-97 in double overtime.

Charleston, S.C. (AP) - If Penn State wanted to close the Charleston Classic with a victory, coach Pat Chambers knew D.J. Newbill would have to make the biggest plays.

Newbill came through with 16 of his 22 points in the second half in the Nittany Lions' 63-61 win over Southern Cal in Sunday's fifth place game. He finished the three games with 83 points to set the tournament scoring mark, surpassing the 78 scored by St. Joseph's Carl Jones in 2011.

Penn State opened 4-1 for the third time in Chambers' four sea-

After the Trojans (2-3) built a 49-43 lead with just under 10 minutes left, Newbill scored 10 of Penn State's next 13 points in their go-ahead run. His second 3-pointer put the Nittany Lions ahead to stay at 56-54.

Southern Cal was still within 62-60 on Jordan McLaughlin's foul shot with 1.3 seconds left. But Shep Garner made a foul shot with 0.7 seconds left to provide the final point.

### **POSTGAME NOTES**

- The two wins at the 2014 Charleston Classic mark the first time Penn State has won at least two games at a neutral site tournament since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic at Madison Square Garden. The Nittany Lions knocked off Princeton, 65-52, Dec. 26 and Hofstra, 74-71, Dec. 27 before going on to the NCAA Sweet 16 that season.
- The Nittany Lions limited the Trojans to 27.3 percent from the field marking the second time this season Penn State has held a team to less than 30 percent from the field.
- · PSU matched a season-high mark with seven team 3-pointers, marking the second-consecutive game the Nittany Lions have reached the mark.
- · The Nittany Lions did not attempt a free-throw until the 7:57 mark of the second half. USC had a 22-0 advantage in free-throw attempts to that point and finished with a 27-10 margin.
- With 83 points across all three games of the Charleston Classic, D.J. Newbill now holds the scoring record for the most points in tournament history. The previous record was held by Saint Joseph's Carl Jones (2011) with 78 points.
- Newbill averaged 27.7 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.3 steals over the last three games, while shooting 50 percent from 3-point range, 47 percent from the field and 85 percent from the free-throw
- Shep Garner registered 12 points in the first half, shooting 4-5 from both the field and 3-point range. He concluded the night ranked second on the team in scoring with 13 points.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) -- Patrick Chambers made it clear to his Penn State players that their first 20 minutes of play against Akron Tuesday night were not acceptable.

His players made it clear in the second half that they heard him. D.J. Newbill scored 29 points, Penn State outscored Akron by 19 points in the second half and the Nittany Lions defeated the Zips 78-72.

Brandon Taylor was 4 of 11 from 3-point range and added 14 for the Lions, who trailed 45-32 at the half. Geno Thorpe scored 10 points. Penn State (5-1) opened the second half by holding Akron (3-2) scoreless for 6:19 and built a 47-45 lead off a 15-0 run.

Deji Ibitayo scored 17 points and Noah Robotham 16 for the Zips, but Akron's second-half shooting woes opened the door for the Nittany Lions.

The Zips, who shot 58.6 percent from the field in the first half, went 6 of 29 in the second (21.2 percent). Penn State was 14 of 22 and shot 45.6 percent overall.

The Lions also got four blocked shots from Jordan Dickerson and three more from Taylor as Penn State increased its pressure on Akron around the rim.

- Penn State trailed 45-32 at the half, but came out of the break scoring 16 unanswered points and took a 48-45 lead with 13:55 left in regula-
- The game featured three ties and three lead changes with Penn State taking the lead for good with 8:56 to play (56-54).
- · After allowing Akron to shoot 17-of-29 (58.6 percent) in the first half, the Nittany Lions held the Zips to 7-of-33 (21.2 percent) shooting in the second half.
- The Nittany Lions have battled back from deficits of 14 (Akron), 6 (Southern California) and 13 (Cornell) in its three-game winning streak.
- Penn State had a 46-27 advantage in the second half. The Lions are outscoring opponents 236-191 (+45) in the second frame through six games this season, opposed to being outscored 198-194 (-4) in the first period.
- Penn State improved to 5-2 all-time against Akron and 3-0 in games played at home.
- With a game-high 29 points, D.J. Newbill moved into 17th place on Penn State's career scoring list with 1,255 points.
- · Newbill posted his fourth-consecutive 20-plus scoring outing and 24th of his career.
- Brandon Taylor had 14 pts, third double-figure scoring game of season.
- · Four of Taylor's five field goals were from 3-point range.
- · With nine rebounds, Travis moved into 13th place on Penn State's alltime rebounding list with 650 for his career.

**Lewisburg, Pa. (AP)** - D.J. Newbill had 28 points and Penn State pulled away late for an 88-80 victory over Bucknell on Friday. The Nittany Lions (6-1) never trailed but never led by more than 12.

Bucknell (2-5) tied the game once, at 66-all, with 6:19 to play. Penn State answered with a 12-4 run and held steady from there with Newbill scoring six of the Nittany Lions' last 10 points to secure the win.

Ross Travis added 14 points, and Brandon Taylor and Geno Thorpe had 12 apiece. Penn State was 8 of 15 from 3-point range and 30 of 54 from the field.

The Bison used a 16-6 run to pull even late in the second half, but Chris Hass and John Azzinaro turned the ball over on consecutive possessions to halt the momentum.

Haas cut the deficit to 83-78 on a 3-poiner with 1:07 left and the Bison would get no closer. Penn State led 39-33 at halftime, and Newbill scored 21 of his 28 in the second half. Taylor's 3-pointer with 6:18 left in the first half gave Penn State its largest lead at 31-19. The Bison answered with nine straight points.

### **POSTGAME NOTES**

- With the 88-80 win on the road at Bucknell, Penn State improves to 6-1on the year, marking the second consecutive year PSU has opened the year with a 6-1 mark under head coach Patrick Chambers.
- The Nittany Lions are 3-1 away from the Bryce Jordan Center and 1-0 after their first true road game. The team has won their first true away game in each of the last two seasons.
- The win also extends the current Nittany Lion winning streak to four straight, marking the third consecutive season PSU has put together a four-game winning streak.
- The Nittany Lions went 30-54 from the field for a season-high 56 percent mark in the win. Penn State also made 20 of 26 attempts from the free throw line for a season-high 77 percent from the charity stripe.
- In the first half alone, Penn State shot 86 percent from the 3-point line, nailing six three's, while also shooting 54 percent from the field in the opening half.
- Penn State made eight 3-pointers for a season-high mark during regulation games. Eight treys also marks the fourth-consecutive game the Nittany Lions have netted at least seven 3's. Penn State finished the night 8-15 (53%) from 3-point range marking the first time PSU has shot 50 percent from three since 2/27/13 against Michigan (10-20, 50%).

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP)** - Patrick Chambers was eager to point out that Penn State's defense played a huge role in the Nittany Lions' 61-58 ACC-Big Ten Challenge victory over Virginia Tech Wednesday night. D.J. Newbill scored 18 points and Shep Garner added 13 for Penn State (7-1), but the Lions crafted a 47-38 edge in rebounding. They were led by 10 from Ross Travis, eight from Jordan Dickerson and seven each from Brandon Taylor and Donovon lack.

Penn State limited the Hokies (4-3) to 38.5 percent shooting from the field and 28.6 from 3-point range during the back-and-forth game in which a 16-2 second-half run turned momentum in Penn State's favor. It was the fourth one-possession game Penn State has played this season.

Joey van Zegeren scored 18 points for the Hokies and Justin Bibbs added 16. But Tech hit only 4 of 14 free throws and 4 of 14 3-pointers. The Hokies (4-3) led by as many as eight points early in the second half but Penn State's Newbill scored 13 second-half points after a 1-of-5 first-half shooting performance.

### **POSTGAME NOTES**

- The Penn State victory extends the Nittany Lions winning streak to five in a row, putting PSU out to its best start (7-1) under head coach Patrick Chambers and for the program since the 2008-09 campaign.
- Eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points in the win, led by D.J. Newbill and Shep Garner, who each recorded double figure scoring.
- Powered by a 16-2 run in the second half, Penn State came from behind by as many eight, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have come back from down by more than six to win (14 vs. Akron, 6 vs. USC and 13 vs. Cornell).
- Penn State trailed by as many as seven in the first half (17-10, 10:38), before closing out the opening frame with nine unanswered points to enter the intermission with a three-point lead, 30-27.
- Penn State out-rebounded Virginia Tech 47-38, posting a season-high mark on the boards and the most since Dec. 7, 2013 vs. Marshall.
- Penn State wore its throwback uniform for the second time this season, improving to 2-0. The pink and black jerseys honor the original schools colors of the University, which were established in 1887.
- Penn State moves to 6-8 in its 14th Challenge appearance, winning its first since 2011.
- With 1,301 career points, Newbill moves into the No. 15 spot on the Penn State all-time scoring list. He needs nine more points to match John Amaechi (1,310; 1993-95) for No. 14 and for the record among players to spend just three years of action at Penn State.

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP)** - Penn State has gotten off to its best start in more than a decade because it's been able to finish.

The Nittany Lions took the lead late in the first half and never trailed in the second en route to a 64-62 victory over Duquesne Wednesday night. Their seventh straight victory is the longest streak since 2007-08 and is the longest active streak among Big Ten teams.

Geno Thorpe scored a career-high 19 points, freshman Shep Garner added 13 and Penn State upped its record to 9-1, its best start since the Lions' 2000-01 Sweet 16 season.

The Dukes (3-3), who were led by 18 points from Jordan Stevens and 11 from TySean Powell, took a potential game-winning shot at the final buzzer, but Micah Mason's 3-pointer fell short.

D.J. Newbill and Donovon Jack each added 11 for Penn State, and Jack made good on four free throws in the final two minutes.

Penn State, after a 5-of-10 first-half performance at the free throw line, sank 15 of 18 in the final 20 minutes. Penn State led by 10 early in the second half but Powell and Stevens teamed up for an 8-2 Duquesne run to close to 46-42, and Duquesne got to within 52-51 when Darius Lewis made good on a three-point play.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State matches its best start, 9-1, since the 2000-01 team also started 9-1. That team finished 21-12 and made an appearance in the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen
- Penn State has now won seven straight games, its most since winning seven in a row in 2007-08 and the longest active streak among Big Ten teams.
- The Lions have had five games decided by five or fewer points and four by just one possession. They have won all of them this season and have been victorious in each of their last seven games decided by three or fewer points, dating back to last season.
- The Nittany Lions held Duquesne to just 4-of-19 from beyond the arc (21.1 percent). The Dukes came into the game shooting 45.8 percent collectively from 3-point range.
- The 35 bench points for Penn State are the most since posting 44 vs. Central Connecticut State on Nov. 22, 2010.
- The Nittany Lions, who led by just one (29-28) at the midpoint, started the second half on an 11-2 run to take a 40-30 lead at the 15:59 mark in the second half.
- Penn State improved to 27-19 all-time against Duquesne.
- Geno Thorpe scored 19 points, a career high. His previous best was 14 against Charlotte on Nov. 20, 2014.
- Shep Garner had 13 points in the game and has now scored in double figures seven times in 10 games this season.
- Garner posted four assists, tying his personal best, which he also did at Marshall (Dec. 6, 2014).

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP)** - A solid defensive effort enabled Penn State to inch closer to its coach's season-long goal of playing a complete, 40-minute game on Sunday. DJ. Newbill scored 20 points, Brandon Taylor added 17, and Penn State defeated GW 64-51 for its eighth straight win. The Nittany Lions (10-1), who also got 10 points from Shep Garner, shot 38.7 percent (18 of 53) from the field and were 9 of 9 from the free throw line. But six blocks from Jordan Dickerson - out of 11 total blocks - and 10 rebounds from Ross Travis helped shut down a Colonials team that averaged nearly 74 points per game.

George Washington (6-3), which was led by 15 points each from Kevin Larsen and Patricio Garino, consistently shot from under the basket but made good on only 18 of 53 shots for 34 percent. The Colonials failed to score on eight 3-point shots and were just 15 of 23 from the free throw line.

Penn State's start is its best since the 1995-96 team jumped to a 13-0 record and ultimately advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The Nittany Lions outrebounded GW 40-35. Its 16 offensive rebounds, many of which came late in the second half, enabled Penn State to kick the ball out to the backcourt and kill time while holding leads that ranged from 10 to 15 points down the stretch.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State extends its winning streak to eight in a row with the win against George Washington to move to 10-1 on the year, marking the best start for the Nittany Lions since the 1995-96 season. The streak also is the longest for the Nittany Lions since the 1995-96 season (13).
- Having posted wins in its last eight non-conference games, Penn State's 10 non-conference wins are also the most for PSU since the 2008-09 season (11).
- PSU's eight-game winning stretch is the longest among all 14 Big Ten teams
- The Nittany Lions registered a season-high mark with 11 blocks in the win, marking the most for PSU since posting 13 against Duquesne in 2013
- Penn State grabbed a season-high 16 offensive rebounds, posting a 40-35 advantage against GW on the glass.
- GW did not hit a 3-point field goal in the game, going 0-8 from behind the arc. The last time Penn State held an opponent without a trey was Feb. 5. 2013 vs. Purdue.
- Penn State held the Colonials to 34 percent shooting on the game, its fourth opponent to shoot below 35 percent this season, and to a stifling 29 percent in the second half.
- Improving to 20-11 all-time against the Colonials, Penn State has won
  eight of the last 10 games in the series, having claimed a win in the first
  meeting between the two teams since 1991.
- The Nittany Lions also improve to 6-0 at home, having won its last 11 non-conference games in the Bryce Jordan Center.

ALLENTOWN, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 20 points, Brandon Taylor had 14 and 11 rebounds and Penn State won its ninth-

straight game 73-68 over Drexel on Saturday at the PPL Center.

The Nittany Lions (11-1) made 7 of 8 free throws in the final minute to hold off the Dragons (2-8), who lost their fourth straight. Tavon Allen had 15 points for Drexel with Sammy Mojica adding 14 off the bench, Damion Lee getting 13 and Mohamed Bah 10.

Penn State led 58-38 on a Newbill jumper with 7:23 left before Drexel made a final run. Allen hit the first of two straight 3-pointers at 6:58 and Freddie Wilson followed with a third to fuel a 15-0 run that cut it to 58-53 with 4:13 left.

Newbill hit two free throws, Donovon Jack had a tip-in and the Dragons never got closer until a 3 by Rashann London with 1 second left

The Dragons got within 40-35 early in the second half before a Newbill layup and four free throws pushed Penn State ahead 46-35. That was the start of a 14-1 run that gave Penn State a 55-36 lead with nine minutes left.

Penn State finished 20 of 27 from the foul line to 12 of 19 for the Dragons, who shot 40 percent from the field while the Nittany Lions were at 49 percent. The rebounding battle was even but Drexel had an 11-5 advantage in offensive boards.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 17 points. Geno Thorpe added 12 and Penn State defeated Dartmouth 69-49 Monday for its 10th straight win and a school-record 12th non-conference victory.

John Johnson and Brandon Taylor each added 10 points for Penn State (12-1), which held Dartmouth to 19 of 54 from the field and 2 of 20 from 3-point range. The Nittany Lions shot 47 percent from the field and had a 38-30 edge in rebounding. Alex Mitola had 13 points and Gabas Maldunas had nine to lead Dartmouth (5-6).

Dartmouth opened the second half with more energy, outscoring the Lions 15-11 over the initial 7 1/2 minutes. But the Big Green struggled to stay consistent and remained cold from long range as well as at the foul line. Penn State led by 25 with 10:30 remaining but Maldunas was good on four free throws and Malik Gill lobbed a pass over the basket that Wesley Dickinson slammed through to close Dartmouth's deficit to 60-42. Newbill followed with a driving layup, got the ball from Ross Travis on a team and fed Travis for an easy slam and a 64-42 advantage.

- The win against Dartmouth marked the 12th non-conference victory of the season, a program-best mark for Penn State.
- The Nittany Lions extended their winning streak to 10 in a row with a victory against the Big Green. The winning streak is the longest since the 1995-96 season when PSU opened the season 13-0. The 12-1 start also is the best mark since the 1995-96 campaign.
- The 10-game win streak is the longest among all 14 Big Ten teams. Penn State is the first conference team to reach 12 wins this season.
- · Penn State limited Dartmouth to a season-low 16 first-half points marking the fewest amount of points allowed in the first half since Northwestern scored 15 on March 16, 2014. The 69-49 final score also marks the first time the Nittany Lions have recorded a 20-point margin of victory since defeating the Wildcats 59-32 in 2014.
- The Nittany Lion bench contributed 31 points in the win, led by double figure scoring from John Johnson (10) and Geno Thorpe (12). Having recorded more than 20 points in nine games this season, the Nittany Lion bench is averaging 22.0 ppg this season. Non-starters produced 15.1 ppg a year ago.
- · Along with Johnson and Thorpe, D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor posted double figures with 17 and 10, respectively, marking the fifth time this season the Nittany Lions have had four record double digit scoring.
- Penn State improves to 7-0 in the Bryce Jordan Center, marking the most consecutive victories at home for the Nittany Lions since 2007-08, when PSU recorded eight in a row from Nov. 12 – Dec. 31, 2007. They have won each of their last 12 non-conference games in the BJC.
- · A season-high tying 13 players saw action for the Nittany Lions with 10 of them tallying points. Thirteen players also took the court opening weekend vs. Fordham.

MADISON, Wis. (AP) - Frank Kaminsky had 18 points and 14 rebounds, Nigel Hayes scored 21 points and No. 4 Wisconsin shot a blistering 63 percent from the field to beat Penn State 89-72 on Wednesday. The Badgers (13-1) won their sixth straight with Kaminsky leading a balanced attack. The preseason All-American had secured his sixth double-double of the season by midway through the second half with Wisconsin comfortably ahead by double dig-

D.J. Newbill scored 29 points for Penn State (12-2), which had its 10-game winning streak snapped. The Big Ten's leading scorer was 5-of-11 shooting in the second half after going 6 of 7 in the first. Wisconsin's athletic frontcourt asserted control after halftime, with Kaminsky and Hayes getting to the basket at will.Forward Sam Dekker scored 17 after shooting 7 of 10 from the field.

The Nittany Lions withered on both ends of the court to start the second half, when Wisconsin went on an 8-2 run to take a 51-38 lead with 17:03 left on Traevon Jackson's 3-pointer. It was in sharp contrast to the opening 20 minutes, when Penn State stayed stepfor-step for much of the time with Wisconsin.

### POSTGAME NOTES

- · The Nittany Lions scored more points against Wisconsin than any other team this season. As one of two teams to score 70 points against the Badgers, only Duke has been able to put up at least 70 points.
- · The Penn State bench tallied 28 points, led by 11 points from Geno Thorpe. The PSU bench is averaging 22.0 ppg this season, up from 15.1 ppg in non-conference games last season.
- Penn State shot 53.7 percent from the field (29-54) against the Badgers, marking a season-best for the Nittany Lions. PSU opened the game shooting 64 percent in the first half alone.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (AP) - Despite trailing by as many as 14 in the first half and 11 at halftime, Penn State men's basketball rallied within one in the final minute of play, but could not complete the comeback in a 50-46 setback on the road at Rutgers.

D.J. Newbill scored 14 for the Nittany Lions (12-3, 0-2), who have dropped two straight. It was the second-lowest scoring output this season for Newbill, who entered the game with Big Ten-leading 21.9 average.

Myles Mack had 10 points and seven rebounds for the Scarlet Knights (9-6, 1-1 Big Ten), who gained their first Big Ten victory since joining the conference this season. Rutgers led the entire game and had its biggest advantage at 30-16 near the end of the first half. Penn State got within one twice, at 45-44 and 47-46. Mack hit two foul shots to put Rutgers up 49-46 with 27.0 to play.

Newbill missed a 3-pointer and Jack was fouled on the rebound. He made 1 of 2 free throws with 9.8 seconds remaining to clinch it. The Nittany Lions return home to the Bryce Jordan Center Tuesday, Jan. 6 to host Michigan in its Big Ten home opener.

- D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor led the offense with double digit scoring. Newbill led all scorers with a game-high 14 points.
- · Through 15 games, Penn State has had seven decided by five points or fewer, having won all but tonight's matchup against the Scarlet Knights.
- PSU limited the Scarlet Knights to 16 percent from the field in the second half (4-25), while also holding Rutgers to 17 percent from behind the arc

The Wolverines' Caris LeVert scored 18 points, while Zak Irvin added 17 and Michigan converted on free throws down the stretch to hold off the Nittany Lions. Michigan also had a 31-26 rebounding edge on Penn State as Irvin pulled down nine.

It was the Big Ten home opener for Penn State, which fell to 0-3 in conference play and 12-4 overall. Michigan (9-6, 2-1 Big Ten), relied on 3-point shooting from Irvin, LeVert and Aubrey Dawkins who each had two as the Wolverines were 9 of 13 from 3-point range and 24 of 45 overall.

Each team was stale offensively to open the second half, but Penn State rallied with a 12-2 run that featured slams from Donovon Jack and Jordan Dickerson, and a Newbill 3-pointer and a nifty drive through the lane to tie the game at 53 at the 7:36 mark.

**BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP)** - Penn State was led by Ross Travis and Shep Garner, who each had 14, but a late charge from Indiana was enough to hold off the Nittany Lions 76-73 on Tuesday.

The Hoosiers (13-4, 3-1 Big Ten) have won two straight but had to survive a replay review on Brandon Taylor's 3-pointer that would have forced overtime. Officials determined the shot came after the buzzer.

It was not quite enough to snap a four-game losing streak, but Penn State (12-5, 0-4) certainly had a chance. The Nittany Lions cut a 12-point deficit to 76-73 on Travis' basket with 53.1 seconds to go. After a defensive stop, they took possession on a jump ball with 14.6 seconds left. But D.J. Newbill's contested 3 from the left wing was off and after Taylor grabbed the rebound, raced to the arc and made the shot, the refs waved it off.

- The Nittany Lions starting lineup of D.J. Newbill, Donovon Jack, Brandon Taylor, Shep Garner and Ross Travis took the court for the eighth time this season (6-2). All five starters finished in double-figure scoring.
- Geno Thorpe posted 10 points, making him the sixth Nittany Lion with double figure scoring, marking the first time PSU has had six in double figures since 12/19/2009 vs. Gardner Webb.
- Penn State scored 18 of its 39 first-half points in the paint, finishing the game with a season-high 46 points in the paint. The mark is the highest since 3/2/14 vs. Wisconsin when the Nittany Lions tallied 50.
- The Nittany Lions have had five one-possession games this season with this standing as the first loss. They won each of their last three games decided by three points or fewer last season for a seven-game streak.
- Eight games this season have been decided by five or fewer points with Penn State winning the first six in non-conference play and dropping the last two to Big Ten teams.
- PSU picked up eight steals against the Hoosiers, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have recorded at least eight steals.
- D.J. Newbill finished second on the team with 12 points, scoring 10 in the first half alone for his 17th consecutive double-figure scoring outing of the season.
- With 1,461 career points, Newbill moved into ninth on the Penn State career scoring list. He needs 81 more points to match Geary Claxton (2005-08) for eighth all-time.
- Ross Travis finished tied for first on the team with a season-high tying 14 points. It is the first time he has led or shared the lead in the team in scoring since Dec. 7, 2013 when he tallied 20 points vs. Marshall.
- Travis led the team with eight rebounds, including six on the defensive glass. He has led the team in rebounding in 10 of 17 games this season.
