Last Time Out

The Seahawks started the second half with a 22-2 run on their way to a dominant 78-49 victory over Stony Brook on Saturday.

Wagner held a 43-27 advantage on the glass, 20-10 edge in assists, and outscored Stony Brook 42-18 in the paint.

On the defensive end, head coach Bashir Mason's squad held the America East preseason favorite to 30.9% (17-55) shooting throughout the contest.



Morales Shines Once Again

In his return to the lineup, graduate student Alex Morales shined once again. The reigning Northeast Conference (NEC) Player of the Year led all scorers with 19 points, nine rebounds, and six assists against Stony Brook.

Morales has recorded at least 15 points and five rebounds in each game he has played in and is shooting 65.6% (21-32) from the field this season.

Fast Start

Wagner is 3-1 for the third time under Bashir Mason and first time since the 2017-18 season, when the Seahawks beat NJIT, American, and CSI on their way to an NEC regular season title and a spot in the NIT. Two of Wagner's victories also came against two teams that qualified for the NCAA tournament last year, marking the first time since 2011-12 that the Seahawks have earned two non-conference victories over NCAA Tournament teams in the same season.

Program DNA

Through four games, the Seahawks are playing true to their program DNA. Wagner ranks first in the NEC in field goal percentage defense at 40.7% and rebounding margin (6.8). The Seahawks are also first in the conference in scoring defense at 59.2 points per game, which ranks 31st in the country.



Big Victories

The Seahawks lead the NEC with a scoring margin of 9.8. The Green and White's three victories of the season have been by an average of 20.8 points.

The Series

Saturday's contest marks the fifth alltime meeting between the two teams, as Penn State holds a 4-0 advantage in the series. In the last meeting during the 2019-20 season, Wagner trailed just 37-30 at the halfway mark, but the short-handed Seahawks came up short in a 91-64 loss.

Sharing The Basketball

The Seahawks average 15.2 assists per game, which is first in the NEC and 67th nationally. Against Stony Brook, freshman Javier Ezquerra led Wagner with seven assists in his second career start. With Ezquerra, Morales, graduate student Will Martinez, and freshman DeLonnie Hunt, four Seahawks average three or more assists per game.

Scouting The Nittany Lions

Penn State enters Wednesday's matchup with a 4-4 record, most recently dropping games against Ohio State and Miami. On November 18, the Nittany Lions earned a 74-59 victory over fellow NEC opponent St. Francis Brooklyn.

It's Miller Time

Junior Ashton Miller scored his first points in a Seahawk uniform against Stony Brook. The transfer from Duquesne saw his first action at Wagner in the Green and White's loss against Seton Hall before contributing eight points in 16 minutes of action against the Seawolves on Saturday.

Bashir Mason Named To The Athletic's 40 Under 40 List

Head men's basketball coach Bashir Mason was named to the Athletic's "40 Under 40 – Rising Stars In Men's College Basketball" list.

According to the article, which features Mason at #15, Mason "has established himself as one of the top mid-major coaches in America."

Last season, Mason entered elite territory, becoming just the second coach in the conference's 40-year history to win three Jim Phelan Coach of the Year honors, joining NEC Hall of Fame coach Howie Dickenman, who earned the distinction four times in his storied career at CCSU.

Following the 2020-21 season, Mason was also a finalist for the 2020-21 Hugh Durham Award, which is presented annually to the top Division I mid-major coach in college basketball.

Wagner's head coach was also a finalist for the Ben Jobe award, which is presented annually to the top Division I minority coach. Mason was the youngest head coach at the Division I level when he was named the 18th head men's basketball coach in school history on March 26, 2012 and is the fastest coach to win 100 games in Seahawk history.

Wagner's win over Stony Brook was the 147th of Mason's head coaching career, as he continues to inch closer to 150 career wins.

The Schedule

The Seahawks will host Immaculata on December 16 and Delaware State on December 20, before closing out the non-conference schedule at Fairfield on December 23.

The Seahawks will open conference play on December 29 at Saint Francis U.



Preseason Favorites

Wagner was predicted to finish first in the league's annual preseason poll, the NEC announced at its virtual media day.

Additionally, graduate students Alex Morales and Elijah Ford were named to the six-person Preseason All-NEC team.

The Seahawks received seven firstplace votes to claim the top spot in the league's preseason poll for the third time ever and first time since the 2013-14 season.

The Returners

Overall, the Seahawks will return 82.6% of total minutes played and 89.4% of points scored from last year's team, highlighted by the return of graduate students Alex Morales, Elijah Ford, Will Martinez, and Nigel Jackson.

Last season, Morales, Ford, Martinez, and Jackson accounted for 57% of all minutes played and 981 points, 68.9% of the team's total points.

After helping the Seahawks to an NEC regular season title, Morales became the first Wagner player since Jermaine Hall and third Wagner player ever to be named NEC Player of the Year. The Paterson, NJ was also a First Team All-Met and NABC District 15 First Team selection.

One of the most versatile guards in the nation, Morales was the only player in the NEC to earn four Player of the Week awards throughout the 2020-21 regular season. The senior finished the regular season ranking in the Top-10 in the conference in scoring (17.1, fourth), rebounding (7.4, eighth), assists (4.26, fourth), and steals (1.8, seventh).

The dynamic Ford earned a spot on the All-NEC First Team after a dominant season on both ends of the floor. The senior finished the regular season second in the league in scoring at 17.8 points per game, ninth in the circuit with 7.4 rebounds per contest and third in the NEC in steals (1.94).

One of the most efficient scorers in the country, Ford was among the top-20 players in the nation in field goal percentage, converting 59.5% of his shots throughout the regular season.

In his second season on Grymes Hill, Martinez developed into one of the most improved players in the NEC, raising his average from 5.8 points per game during the 2019-20 campaign to 12.4 points per contest.

Serving as the Seahawks' sixth man for a majority of the season, the versatile Martinez scored in double digits in nine of Wagner's final 11 games while recording three 20-point games throughout the season.

Jackson, the longest tenured Seahawk on the team, will enter his fifth season at Wagner in 2021-22 and has appeared in 86 games throughout his career.

The Baltimore, MD native has accounted

for 571 points in four years on Grymes Hill, scoring in double figures four times as a valuable piece in Bashir Mason's system in 2020-21.

Other returners include reigning NEC Rookie of the Year DeLonnie Hunt, the first Seahawk since Jermaine Hall in 1999-2000 and fourth Wagner player ever to win the top award for newcomers in the NEC. Hunt became the first NEC player since LIU's E.J. Reed during the 2012-13 season to earn three straight NEC Rookie of the Week honors.

The Newcomers

Wagner welcomed five newcomers throughout the offseason in Raekwon Rogers, Jahbril Price Noel, Rob Taylor II, Zaire Williams, and Javier Esquerra Trelles. The class consists of three guards and two forwards comprised of two transfers and three first-year student-athletes. Additionally, this year's recruiting class includes two local products, with Taylor and Williams both coming to Grymes Hill from Brooklyn.

BASHIR MASON



In nine years as Wagner's head men's basketball coach, Bashir Mason has led Wagner to three NEC regular season titles and two NIT appearances, while earning three NEC Coach of the Year honors during this stretch.

Mason has entered elite territory, becoming just the second coach in the conference's 40-year history to win three Jim Phelan Coach of the Year honors, joining NEC Hall of Fame coach Howie Dickenman, who earned the distinction four times in his storied career at CCSU.

The fastest coach to win 100 games in Seahawk history, Mason has developed 16 All-NEC selections during his tenure, in addition to having seven players garner All-NEC Tournament accolades as well as four were named to the prestigious National Association of Basketball Coaches' (NABC) First and Second Team.

Mason was the youngest head coach at the Division I level when he was named the 18th head men's basketball coach in school history on March 26, 2012.

Prior to accepting the head coaching spot, Mason served two seasons as an assistant coach under Dan Hurley, who accepted the head coaching position at the University of Rhode Island in 2012 and just completed his third season as head coach of the UConn Huskies.

In his tenure as head coach, Mason has led the Seahawks to six top-four finishes in the NEC standings.

During one of the toughest season's college basketball has ever seen, Mason led the 2020-21 Seahawks to a regular season championship after being picked eighth in the preseason poll. Mason helped the Seahawks re-write the record books, as the Green and White won 10 straight games, marking the longest winning streak by an NEC team since LIU reeled off 13 straight victories during the 2010-11 campaign and longest by a Wagner team since a 16-game streak under PJ Carlesimo in 1978-79.

In the process, senior Alex Morales was named the NEC Player of the Year, while freshman DeLonnie Hunt earned Rookie of the Year honors. Additionally, senior Elijah Ford was named to the All-NEC First Team. The 2020-21 season marked the first time Wagner has ever won NEC Coach of the Year, Player of the Year, and Rookie of the Year in the same season and first time since 2007-2008 that two Seahawks earned First Team All-NEC honors.

In addition to earning NEC Coach of the Year honors, Mason was also named a finalist for the Ben Jobe and Hugh Durham awards.

The 2017-18 Seahawks combined its vintage brand of hard-nosed defense with more offensive firepower than in recent memory, and it all added up to a 23-10 overall record, highlighted by an NEC-best 14-4 mark.

In guiding the Green & White to the league's automatic bid to the postseason NIT in 2018, after falling in the NEC title game to LIU Brooklyn, Mason became the first Wagner head coach to win multiple NEC Coach of the Year honors as well as the 10th in NEC history to accomplish this feat.

The Seahawks won 16 of 17 home games down the stretch that season, setting a program record for home victories and consecutive wins when the team rattled off 16 straight prior to the championship game, which tied for the second-longest streak in the NCAA. Mason once again built the NEC's top-ranked scoring defense (68.3) and field goal percentage defense (.407).

The 2017-18 Seahawks produced the highest scoring average in the Mason era, netting 74.2 points per game. Among all 351 Division I programs, Wagner ranked among the top-ten programs in the nation in offensive rebounds per game, as the team averaged 13.52 offensives caroms a contest.

Mason tutored three Seahawks to All-NEC honors in 2017-18, as senior guard JoJo Cooper earned First -Team accolades, while sophomore guard Blake Francis was named to the Second Team and redshirt junior guard Romone Saunders was selected as one of five players to the Third Team.

The three all-conference selections marked the first time since the 1994-95 that Wagner had three or more players named to the All-Conference team.

BASHIR MASON



In the lid-lifter of the 2016-17 season, Mason's Seahawks traveled to Storrs, CT to tangle with fourtime NCAA men's basketball national champion and then No. 18-ranked, UConn, at Gampel Pavilion, coached by former Huskie and 15-year NBA veteran, Kevin Ollie.

The Green & White's signature tenacious defense, along with a pair of 15-point performances from forward Mike Aaman and rising redshirt junior Romone Saunders, held the Huskies to just 36.0 percent shooting as Wagner earned a near wire-to-wire 67-58 victory in a game televised on SNY.

The only lead for the Huskies was 2-0 at the 19:23 mark of the first half. Wagner's victory marked the first time UConn had ever lost in a home opener at Gampel Pavilion as the Huskies came into the contest with a 27-0 record at Gampel.

The 2015-16 was a banner year for the Wagner men's basketball program. Mason led the Seahawks to one of the most successful seasons in program history, a 23-11 record, the seventh 20-win season in program history and first since 2012, when he was an assistant on the Wagner sidelines under Hurley (25-6).

The 2015-16 Jim Phelan Northeast Conference (NEC) Coach of the Year steered the Seahawks to their second-ever NEC regular season title and became the program's first head coach to lead Wagner to a postseason victory, an impressive 79-75 road win over No. 1 seed, St. Bonaventure, in the first round of the 2016 NIT.

For his efforts, Mason, for the second time in his career, was a finalist for the prestigious Ben Jobe Award, given annually to the nation's top minority coach in Division I.

Mason's 2015-16 squad built the NEC's top-ranked scoring defense (63.6) and field goal percentage defense (.406) while limiting the opposition to under 60 points 11 times, nine of which came during league play.

In 2014-15, Mason brought in seven newcomers, which was Wagner's largest incoming class since the 2004-2005 season, and blended them with a core of veterans headlined by senior guard Marcus Burton ('15). After primarily coming off the bench in 2013-14, the 6'0" guard flourished as a starter in his final season, as he finished second in the NEC in scoring at 17.5 points per game while becoming the 42nd member of the Seahawks' 1,000 point-scoring club.

In 2013-14, his second season as head coach, the Seahawks posted their second straight 19-12 finish, including 12-4 mark in league play. The Seahawks also ripped off nine consecutive wins, highlighted by a hard-fought 59-48 win over NEC Regular Season Champion, Robert Morris. Also, Mason's bunch delivered a 73-61 victory at home over the Bryant University Bulldogs in the Seahawks first-ever appearance on CBS Sports Network, played in front of 2,027 fans at the Spiro Sports Center.

Under the defensive-minded Mason's watch, Wagner ranked fourth nationally in blocks per game (6.5), 12th in field goal percentage defense (.391) and 14th in three-point field goal percentage defense (.300,) while ranking first among all NEC teams in seven different categories and second in three others.

Mason helped Ortiz develop into the first-ever three-time NEC Defensive Player of the Year winner while center Naofall Folahan ('14) set all-time blocked shot records for a single-game (10), single-season (89) career (230). Mason also over-saw the progression of guard Latif Rivers ('14), who became just the program's 13th 1,500-point scorer.

In his first season at the helm in 2012-13, at 29 years old, Mason proved that age is just a number as he guided Wagner to a 19-12 record, which included 12 conference victories. Among the 19 wins, which set a school record for a first-year coach, was a 63-53 win over an SMU squad coached by Hall of Famer, Larry Brown. The swarming Seahawk defense paced the league in field goal percentage defense and blocked shots that year while ranking among the top four in the NEC in all ten defensive categories.

Spearheading the defensive attack in Mason's first year was guard Kenneth Ortiz ('14), who garnered his second straight Defensive Player of the Year Award, while also earning NEC Third-Team honors. Under Mason's tutelage, Williams averaged a team-best 15.6 points and 6.4 rebounds game while blossoming into an NEC Second Team selection. For his efforts, Mason was a finalist for the CollegeInsider.com Joe B. Hall First-Year and Ben Jobe Minority Coach of the Year awards.

In his first season as an assistant, in 2010-11, the Green & White saw an eight-win improvement from the previous campaign. Murray earned First-Team All-NEC accolades after averaging 16.9 points per game. In year two as a Seahawk assistant in 2011-2012, Mason helped the Seahawks to a school-record 25 victories.

BASHIR MASON



Mason arrived on Grymes Hill from Marist College, where he spent two seasons as an assistant coach, with responsibilities including recruiting and guard development. Under his guidance, R.J. Hall was tabbed to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) All-Rookie Team in 2008-2009.

He began his coaching career at his high school alma mater, St. Benedict's Prep of Newark, under Hurley, during the 2007-2008 season. As coach of the school's prep team, the Gray Bees won the

New Jersey State Prep A Title.

During his tenure at St. Benedict's Prep, Mason coached a plethora of players that would go on to earn Division I scholarships: Myles Davis (Xavier), Chris Gaston (Fordham), Dwan McMillan (Hofstra), Mark Robertson (UMES), Zack Rosen (Pennsylvania) and Tavon Sledge (Iona).

Following a standout playing career at St. Benedict's under Hurley, Mason played collegiately for Drexel under James "Bruiser" Flint from 2003-2007, where he scored 1,126 career points while averaging 9.4 points and 3.9 assists per contest.

At Drexel, Mason was a four-year starter for the Dragons, anchoring the team from his point guard position. In addition to scoring more than 1,000 points while dishing out nearly 500 assists, Mason's calling card was defense. The first four-time member of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) All-Defensive Team, he also became the first player in league history to be named Defensive Player of the Year as a freshman following the 2003-2004 season.


As a senior, Mason led the Dragons to wins over Saint Joseph's, Villanova, Syracuse and Temple en route to a 23-9 record and a berth in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). He also provided a flair for the dramatic, hitting a running 35-footer at the buzzer to defeat Virginia Commonwealth (VCU) as a sophomore, garnering top billing on ESPN Sportscenter's Top-10 plays for the night.


Mason led Drexel in assists and steals in all four of his season and graduated second on the Dragons' all-time steals list (226) and fourth on its all-time assists list (471).

In 2007, Mason graduated from Drexel with a Bachelor's Degree in Sports Management. After earning a Master's Degree of Science in Education from Wagner in December of 2013, he was lauded by his alma mater with inclusion in the Drexel Magazine's '40 Under 40' list.

Mason, who grew up in Jersey City, NJ, now makes his residence in Bayonne, NJ.



WINSTON SMITH



Winston Smith completed his fourth season on the Seahawk bench in 2020-21.

He helped lead the Seahawks to a 13-7 overall record and 13-5 mark in Northeast Conference (NEC) play in 2020-21, as Wagner earned a third regular season championship and No. 1 seed in the conference tournament.

In his first season with the program in 2017-18, Smith helped lead the Seahawks to a 23-10 overall record, highlighted by an NEC regular season title, which came by virtue of a 14-4 league mark. With Smith's assistance, Wagner reached the 2018 NEC Title game and made an appearance in the postseason NIT.

Smith, who boasts more than 15 years of coaching experience, came to Wagner after spending the previous two seasons in his second tour of duty at fellow Northeast Conference (NEC) member, Fairleigh Dickinson. In 2015-16, he helped guide the Knights to a ten-win improvement, an NEC championship (claiming the 2016 crown over Wagner at the Spiro Sports Center), which resulted in the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2005.

Prior to his second stint in Hackensack, Smith spent eight seasons on staff at Drexel, where he served as the Dragons' coordinator of basketball operations. Under then head coach Bruiser Flint, he was responsible for all aspects of Drexel's basketball operations.

On the sidelines, he helped lead Drexel to a 29-7 record during the 2011-12 season, highlighted by a 19-game winning streak, as the Dragons reached the third round of the National Invitational Tournament (NIT). The 29 wins are the highest total in the history of the program.

No stranger to the NEC, Smith spent two seasons in Loretto, PA as a member of Saint Francis U staff from 2006-to-2008 before spending a season in Hempstead, NY as a member of the Hofstra University women's basketball staff, serving as their assistant coach for the 2005-06 campaign.

During that season, Smith helped guide Hofstra to a 19-12 record, which qualified the Pride for the 2006 WNIT, where they defeated Stony Brook, 92-65 in the opening round before falling to Villanova in the Second Round.

Before arriving on Long Island, Smith spent two seasons at Youngstown State, where he was an assistant men's coach. In 2004-05, he worked alongside current Wagner associate head coach, Mike Babul, who was also an assistant coach for the Penguins.

Smith began his coaching career at Fairleigh Dickinson, working under NEC Hall of Famer Tom Green, serving as the Knights' assistant director of basketball operations (2001-02), before being promoted to an assistant coach for the 2002-03 campaign. Smith also served as the director of the FDU Basketball Camps.

A native of Summit, NJ, Smith played his collegiate ball for Coach Flint at UMass from 1996-2001, where he was also teammates with Coach Babul. In 2000-01, Smith served as team captain for the Minutemen. During his UMass playing career, Smith also earned the team's Top Defender and Mr. Hustle Awards in 1997 (freshman year), and 2001 (senior season), respectively.

He was also a two-time selection to the Student-Athlete Academic Council. While in Amherst, the Minutemen made three post-season appearances with Smith on the squad, which included a pair of trips to the NCAA Tournament.

A former scholastic standout at The Patrick School in Elizabeth, NJ, where he was an All-State player for the Celtics' renowned basketball team, Smith earned a Bachelor of Science degree from UMass as a sociology major in 2001.

Smith and his wife, Allison Levy Smith, married on August 15, 2015 and welcomed their son, Brandon, in March of 2020. The Smith's reside in Summit, New Jersey.



BOBBY JORDAN

Bobby Jordan completed his second season as an assistant coach with the Seahawks men's basketball program in 2020-21 after joining the team in June of 2019.

He helped lead the Seahawks to a 13-7 overall record and 13-5 mark in Northeast Conference (NEC) play in 2020-21, as Wagner earned a third regular season championship and No. 1 seed in the conference tournament.

Following his playing career at Drexel, Jordan become part of the Dragons coaching staff, first as an operations assistant for two years and then as assistant coach for three seasons.

Jordan assisted head coach James "Bruiser" Flint in leading the Dragons to a 29-6 record as they won the 2010 CAA Regular Season Championship and an automatic bid to the NIT Quarterfinals. Working extensively with the Drexel guards, Jordan developed both a first-Team All -CAA selection and a CAA Rookie of The Year.

Jordan also earned a reputation as a top recruiter for the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) program. Ranked as a top-five assistant coach in the CAA by NextupRecruits, Jordan played a major role in Drexel landing the CAA's top recruiting class in 2013 according to Hoopscoop.

Jordan came to Grymes Hill following one season at the prestigious IMG Academy as head basketball coach. He led the Ascenders to a 26-4 record and saw four players sign with Division 1 schools, along with five others signing on to play college basketball.

Prior to IMG; Jordan served as head coach at Philadelphia area prep school Girard College. He guided the Cavaliers to a 23-6 record and an appearance in the 2017 Penn-Jersey League Finals, as three of his players went onto sign with Division 1 schools.

Jordan graduated from Drexel University in 2009 with a degree in Sport Management. He resides in Philadelphia with his wife Kate and daughters Mackenzie and Madison.







Pete Gash joined the Wagner basketball staff in 2021 as an assistant coach.

PETE GASH ASSISTANT COACH

Gash spent the last 14 years on a Division I bench and arrives on Grymes Hill after spending the previous two seasons at LaSalle University under head coach Ashley Howard. In his role, Gash was responsible for the development of Atlantic 10 Sixth Man of the Year Sherif Kenny.

"Pete brings a lot of coaching experience at the Division I level to our team and has made a positive impact on every team he's coached," Mason said. "He knows what it takes to win at this level and will make everyone around him better."

Prior to his time at LaSalle, Gash served as an assistant coach at the University of Massachusetts. Gash was the lead assistant on staff and in charge of player development. During his time at UMass, he was instrumental in the Development of Luwane Pipkins, who earned Atlantic 10 Most Improved Player honors during the 2018 Season after increasing his scoring average from 10.2 PPG to 21.1 PPG.

Gash also coached at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, helping the Mocs earn 49 wins in two seasons, a SoCon Championship, and an NCAA Tournament berth in 2016. Gash's first opportunity as an Assistant Coach came at Florida Atlantic. During his time at FAU, the Owls earned the 2011 Sun Belt regular season title, set the program's single season win record (21), and earned a 2011 NIT Appearance. SCOTT RODGERS



Scott Rodgers joined the Wagner men's basketball staff in 2021 as the Director of Player Development.

Rodgers joins the Seahawks after a successful professional career and becomes the third former Drexel player on Wagner's staff.

During the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 seasons, Rodgers, head coach Bashir Mason, and assistant coach Bobby Jordan all played for head coach James "Bruiser" Flint for the Dragons, earning an NIT berth.

"I'm excited to add another former teammate to the staff," Mason added. "Scott embodies our program DNA and his decorated playing career will help him with the development of our student-athletes."

During Mason's senior year, the trio earned wins over Saint Joseph's, Villanova, Syracuse, and Temple en route to a 23-9 record and a berth in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT).

Rodgers' professional playing career included stints in over eight countries, mostly in Central and South America, and lasted more than a decade.

In 2014, Rogers led the Rochester RazorSharks to a PBA championship. Most recently, Rodgers helped Correcaminos de Colon to the LPB finals and earned Latinbasket. com All Panamanian LPB Honorable mention honors for the 2020 season.

Apart from his coaching duties, Rodgers will pursue a Master's Degree at Wagner.
