PENN STATE HOCKEY

THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

Penn State welcomes Alaska-Anchorage to Hockey Valley for the first time after taking the long trek to the Last Frontier the past two seasons to battle the Seawolves.

- The Nittany Lions hold the 1-0-2 all-time advantage over UAA after a 3-3 tie during the 2014 Brice Alaska Goal Rush and a 5-2 victory and 1-1 draw last season in Anchorage.

LAST TIME THEY MET

Penn State won the opening game of a two-game series last November taking the first game 5-2 before earning a 1-1 tie in the finale.

- Sophomore **Andrew Sturtz** scored twice in the victory while **Luke Juha '16** potted the equalizer in the third period during the 1-1 draw.

MILESTONE WATCH

- Senior **David Goodwin** is currently riding a four-game point streak (1-5-6) and is sitting at 99 career points.

- Goodwin, who is already the program's all-time leading scorer, would become the first Nittany Lion to reach the 100-point milestone.

- After scoring his first goal of the season this past weekend against Niagara, the Captain's 99 points currently ties for seventh among active Division-I players.

SMIRNOV NAMED B1G SECOND STAR

- Freshman Denis Smirnov led all Big Ten players last weekend with six points off two goals and four assists and was named the conference Second Star of the Week.

- The rookie currently leads the team in both points (15) and assists (10) while those marks are also good for tops in the conference and rank fifth and second nationally.

- Smirnov has now registered at least one point in all nine games this season which ties Taylor Holstrom for the longest career point streak which was achieved October 10, 2014 - November 15, 2014.

DUCK FOR COVER

- The Lions are currently leading the nation in shots per game as they are firing and eye-popping 45.78 shots per game, eight shots more than their closest competitor.

- Among those 45.78 shots per game, sophomore's **Vince Pedrie** and **Andrew Sturtz** are averaging 6.0 and 4.65, respectively. Those marks are good for first and fifth in the nation.

- Penn State's 4.22 goals per game is also good for fourth most in the nation while their 38 total goals tie for fourth as well.

TAKE ME TO FUNKEY TOWN

- Sophomore goaltender **Chris Funkey** started his first game between the pipes for the Nittany Lions on Thursday evening and collected 24 saves to earn his first career victory only allowing a single goal during the 5-1 win.

- Funkey has now appeared in six games over his first year plus for the Blue and White and each time he hits the ice he continues to keep the puck out of the net. The sophomore has only allowed four games in 185:34 minutes while registering a .944 save percentage and a 1.29 goals against average.

MR. JONES

- Freshman **Peyton Jones** strikes up a conversation when talking about one of the top goalies in the nation.

- The rookie is one of just five goalies to remain unbeaten on the year and one of just two goalies unbeaten with at least seven starts so far this season.

- Peyton's .923 save percentage and 1.95 goals against average place him 16th and 11th, respectively, in the nation.

STREAKING

- Penn State is currently riding a seven-game unbeaten streak which falls just behind Boston College's nine-game streak for the nation's best.

- The streak is also the second longest in program history trailing just a nine-game unbeaten streak which started about this time last year and lasted through December 12th, the Nittany Lions went 7-0-2 over that span.

ANOTHER PROGRAM BEST

- In this week's national polls, Penn State came in ranked the highest they have ever been. The Nittany Lions came in at No. 12 in both the uscho.com poll and the USA Today poll. Never has PSU been ranked higher than No. 14 on any previous poll.

- While it may be too early to take notice Penn State is also ranked No. 2 in the Pairwise.

ANDY IS FINE AND DANDY

- Sophomore Andrew Sturtz leads the team with eight goals after scoring three times this past weekend against Niagara.

- True to form his first goal of the weekend on Thursday night was another one for the highlight reel and it landed him yet another spot on the NCAA Ice Hockey Top Five Plays of the Week, this time at #2.

- The sophomores eight total goals tie him with Nick Schilkey of Ohio State for the Big Ten lead and is tied for fifth in the nation.

- In just 46 games played so far in his career, Sturtz has tallied 26 goals which places him sixth on the all-time list at Penn State as he passed Taylor Holstrom and Curtis Loik last weekend.

SCOUTING ALASKA



This marks the third straight season these two teams have faced off against one another, but the first meetings to take place in Hockey Valley.

- Alaska-Anchorage finished last season 11-20-3 and did not make the post season in the WCHA. The Seawolves are off to a slow start this season coming into the weekend with a 1-7-0 and a 0-4-0 mark in conference games.

- UAA ranks last in the conference in scoring offense averaging just one goal per game while they are allowing 3.38 goals per contest to rank 7th out of the 10 teams in the WCHA.

- The Seawolves power-play is also last in the conference coming into the weekend they have only converted 2-of-41 opportunities (4.9%) on the year. However, their penalty-kill has been one of the bright spots so far this season ranking fourth in the WCHA at 83.7 percent (41-for-49).

- With only eight goals on the season, UAA is being outscored by 19 as they have allowed 27 goals.

- Only two players have registered multiple goals so far through the Seawolves' eight games as Matt Anholt and Brad Duwe have each found the back of the net twice.

- Anholt along with Jonah Renouf and Aleksii Ainali all tie for the team lead in points with three apiece while Ainali paces the squad with three assists.

- Anholt was second on the team last year with 22 points on seven goals and 15 assists. Tad Kozun also returns in 2016-17 after leading the team with 13 goals while adding seven assists for 20 points, but has been kept off the score-sheet so far this season.

- Olivier Mantha returns between the pipes for the Seawolves after appearing in 27 games last season compiling an 8-16-2 record with a .905 save percentage and a 2.83 goals against average. He has appeared in seven games so far this season and has a 1-5-0 record with a .901 save percentage and a 3.01 goals against average.





ANOTHER BRICK IN THE WALL

• Penn State has been exceptional on defense this season coming into the weekend ranked seventh in the nation in scoring defense allowing just 2.00 goals per game.

• A large part of this success is their penalty-kill which has only allowed three goals in 44 chances (93.2 percent) and ranks second in the nation.

RECAPPING NIAGARA

Penn State registered their second consecutive weekend sweep with a pair of 5-1 victories over Niagara.

• Senior **David Goodwin** collected his first goal of the season for his 99th career point.

• Smirnov registered a pair of goals during the opening game and added four assists on the weekend for six total points.

• Sturtz scored once on Thursday and twice on Friday for a three-goal weekend and now leads the team with eight.

• Funkey and Jones were excellent in net each night as they both picked up a victory making 20+ saves and only allowing a single goal.

RECAPPING 2015-16

Penn State put together its best season during it's young existence earning the first 20-win campaign for Guy Gadowsky as the Nittany Lion Bench Boss with a 21-13-4 record while posting their second-straight winning season in Big Ten play (10-9-1-0).

• Penn State set 7 new single-season program standards during 2015-16 including most wins (21), most points (366), most goals (140), most assists (226), most shots (1,579), most shots/game (41.55) and most goals/game (3.68).

• For the third straight season the Nittany Lions won their opening Big Ten game by defeating Michigan State at home, 4-2. They followed that up with a 6-1 victory the following night to earn a sweep in the first conference series for the second straight season after doing the same to Wisconsin in 2014-15.

• Nittany Lions climb to as high as No. 14 in the uscho.com poll on numerous occasions while also earning their first-ever USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine ranking debuting at No. 15 in the December 14, 2015 poll.

• Penn State sweeps Wisconsin January 15-16, 2016.

• Penn State beats Minnesota, 5-3, at Mariucci Arena marking the first Nittany Lion victory in Minneapolis, February 6, 2016.

• **Vince Pedrie** earns All-Big Ten Second Team honors as well as All Freshman Team laurels.

NITTANY LIONS PICKED FOURTH

• Penn State, entering its fifth season of varsity hockey, was picked fourth for the second consecutive year in the Preseason Coaches' Poll behind Minnesota, Ohio State and Michigan, but ahead of Wisconsin and Michigan State in the preseason poll.

• The Nittany Lions were picked sixth in both 2013-14 and 2014-15. Penn State exceeded expectations last season, leading the Big Ten for stretches of the season and finished third in the regular season and advanced to the Big Ten semifinals.

GOODWIN, PEDRIE NAMED B1G PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Forward **David Goodwin** and defenseman **Vince Pedrie** were among the 13 athletes named to the Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch List on Monday, Sept. 26.

• Goodwin, returns as the leading point scorer from last seasons roster with 38 on 11 goals and a career-best 27 assists. His 27 helpers was also a new single-season program record.

• Goodwin is currently the career leader in points (90) and assists (57) while his 33 goals rank him third all-time. His 90 points in currently 8th in all of college hockey for current players.

• The senior's 72 points over the last two seasons are the most in a two-year stretch in program history as he boasts the second and third best scoring seasons behind Casey Bailey's 40-point outburst in 2014-15.

• A double major in economics and Spanish, Goodwin has benn an All-Big Ten Honorable Mention the past two seasons.

• Pedrie, a communications, Arts and Sciences major, missed the final six games last season due to injury, but was still a unanimous pick for the Preseason Watch List by the opposing coaches.

• The strong d-man with a wicked shot returns as the leading goal-scoring defenseman in conference games last season with seven. He finished the year with eight goals and 14 assists for 22 points, good for eighth on the team.

O CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- The final is the newest member of the Lions, Matt Erlichman, and resides about 80 miles south of State College in Bedford, Pa.

CANADIAN INFLUENCE

- Seven Nittany Lion call Canada home, which is the same amount as last season, marking the most in the programs brief history.

- Three hail from Alberta: **James Robinson** (Cochrane), **Dylan Richard** (Sherwood Park) and **Brandon Biro** (Sherwood Park).

- A trio of freshman join the Lions from Ontario: **Liam Folkes** (Scarborough), **Sean Kohler** (Oakville) and **Kris Myllari** (Kanata).

RUSSIAN CONNECTION

- A pair of Nittany Lion freshman hail from Russia by the way of Pennsylvania as both Nikita Pavlychev (Yaroslavl) and Denis Smirnov (Moscow) become the first Lions to wear the Blue and White from the Motherland.

- Both forwards migrated to the U.S. and to Pennsylvania in their early teen years, playing youth hockey in the Keystone State.

PACKING THE PEG

- Penn State has played to a sellout crowd in 54-of-56 home games, including all 18 during the 2015-16 season.

- More than 6,000 fans have filed into the arena on 35 occasions including 15 games last season.

- In 2015-16, Penn State ranked seventh in average attendance (6,093) and led the nation in building capacity percentage (105.4 percent).

- Last season, Penn State had a season-total of 109,681 fans that have been to Pegula Ice Arena, which is the most in the facilities short three-year history.

WELCOME HOME

- Penn State opened the 5,704-seat Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 win against Army Oct. 11, 2013.

- The arena was brought to fruition through an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—in September 2010 from Penn State alumnus Terry Pegula and his wife, Kim. The Pegulas added to that figure to bring their total donation to \$102, supplying \$90 million for the facility.

- The \$90 million facility broke ground in early February 2012 and was turned over to Penn State in September 2013.

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

- Penn State has 27 players on the 2016-17 roster and after dealing with injuries throughout the majority of last season they are excited about this added depth. With 16 forwards and eight defensemen the internal competition and confidence is high.

THIS IS BIG TEN HOCKEY

- The Big Ten is in its fourth season entering 2016-17. In league action, each Big Ten team will play 20 league games, including 10 home contests.

- Big Ten teams are awarded three points for a regulation or overtime victory, two points for a shootout win and one point for a shootout loss.

- Big Ten schools have won a combined 23 national championships, more than any other league.

- The Big Ten Hockey Conference is the only major football conference to sponsor men's hockey.

- The 2017 league tournament will take place at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. with the tournament champion earning the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

- Penn State welcomes Arizona State to Pegula Ice arena for the first-ever match-ups between the two schools.

- This match-up features the 59th and 60th NCAA Division I schools to integrate ice hockey as Penn State did so before the 2012-13 season and the Sun Devils instituted the program last fall and are competing in their first full season as a Division I member.

MEET COACH GADOWSKY

Guy Gadowsky, the 2014-15 Big Ten Coach of the Year, will guide the Nittany Lions in his 17th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program in 2016-17. Gadowsky is currently coaching his fifth Penn State varsity team.

AT PENN STATE

In 2015-16 the Nittany Lions rise continued as Gadowsky led Penn State to their best finish since making the leap to NCAA Division I status. The Lions secured their first 20-win season, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6th the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of his 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

Those 2015-16 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (140), assists (226), points (366), shots (1,579), goals/gm (3.68) and shots/gm (41.55) to go along with those program-best 21 victories.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the preseason, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title up until the final weekend of

the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten First Team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention by the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign had gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play. Additionally, his Lions earned wins over every Big Ten team during the season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten teams (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL arena (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second straight NCAA tournament appearance.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Gadowsky, who inherited a program that had won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first NCAA tournament berth since 1998, and Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, pre-





sented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

While at Princeton, Gadowsky had more than 20 players go on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalembe (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

AT ALASKA

Prior to Princeton, Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, who were ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

In addition, Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance.

BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign as he garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

PLAYING CAREER

The Edmonton, Alberta, native played collegiately at Colorado College from 1985-89, serving as team captain as a senior, while also earning the team's Rodman Award, given for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship. The three-time WCHA All-Academic Team member collected 46 points in 134 career games.

Upon graduation, Gadowsky embarked on a seven-year professional career that included stops with the ECHL's Richmond Renegades, the IHL's San Diego Gulls and the AHL's St. John's Maple Leafs and Prince Edward Island Senators. Gadowsky saved his best season for last as he totaled 52 goals and 29 assists for the Fresno Falcons in 1995-96. He earned league MVP and first-team all-star recognition.

In addition, Gadowsky spent a portion of the 1993-94 season competing with the Canadian National Team and also played professionally in Austria, The Netherlands and Sweden.

PERSONAL LIFE

Gadowsky and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Mac and Magnus, and a daughter, Mia.

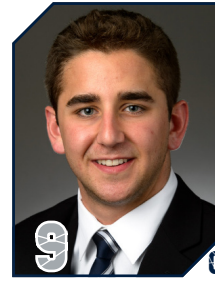
