Penn State baseball, winners of six of its last seven games, crawls back into Big Ten action this weekend as it hosts the Michigan Wolverines in a big three-game series at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park. This weekend features Saturday's Wounded Warrior Game and THON sluggers on Sunday.

Media: Friday's 5:05 p.m. game will be televised on the Big Ten Network with Steve Jones and Loren Crispell calling the action. Friday's contest can be heard on ESPN Radio State College 1450 with Brian Tripp and Dan Smith doing the broadcast. Crispell will re-join Tripp on 1450 this Saturday. Live stats will be available via a Gametracker link on GoPSUsports.com. In addition, fans can follow @psubaseball on Twitter for up-to-the-minute updates.

Most Recently: Penn State is coming off a 5-3 loss to Pittsburgh on Wednesday night, where it struggled to get things going offensively. With the game tied at two in the fifth, the Panthers scored two and maintained the lead throughout the remainder of the contest. In his return to his hometown of Pittsburgh, senior Jordan Steranka racked up two doubles and an RBI in the loss. Junior Luis Montesinos also recorded two hits as he started in the No. 2 hole for the Nittany Lions.

Scouting Michigan: Michigan enters this weekend with 15-19 overall record and a 2-4 mark in conference action. The Wolverines leading hitter in Michael O'Neill will be sitting out of this weekend's series with a hand injury. Will Drake has been a big contributor to the Michigan offense, as he's hitting at a .316 clip in 34 games this season. Drake has driven in 21 runs this year. Brandon Sinnery and Trent Szkutnik are Michigan's slated starters for Friday and Saturday. Sinnery is 2-3 with a 4.30 ERA this season while Szkutnik will be making his third start of the season with a 2-1 record and 4.32 ERA. Michigan's Sunday starter is TBD.

All-Time vs. the Wolverines: Penn State holds a 45-37 all-time record against the Wolverines, including an 18-18 record in home contests. Penn State has a tight 6-4 edge over Michigan in the last 10 contests as it took two of three most recently in Ann Arbor last May.

The Weekend Trio: Penn State will send out junior John Walter, sophomore Joe Kurrasch and junior Steven Hill to the mound this weekend. This weekend trio has pitched strong together as of late. Last Friday, Walter picked up his first victory of the season on the mound with a six inning, three-run performance against Canisius. He also fanned seven batters in the victory. The following day, Kurrash punched out 10 batters in 6.2 innings while giving up just four hits and no earned runs against the Golden Griffins. He dropped his ERA to 2.49 this season and had four multi-strikeout innings. Hill went the distance for the Nittany Lions last Sunday, allowing three runs while striking out eight hitters. Hill, who hurled his fifth-straight quality start, threw 122 pitches in the victory. The trio through their last six starts have combined for a 3-2 record and a 2.55 ERA in 42.1 innings, while giving up just 33 hits and striking out 36.

Big Weekend at the Med: This weekend's Big Ten clash with the Wolverines will include a highlight-reel of promotions. Friday will be Dollar Dog Night at the ballpark and all students will get free admission into the game as part of the Free Day Friday promotion. In addition, student season ticket holders will get free food for showing their voucher. In addition, Friday will be "Winning Weeknight Scratchoffs." The first 200

fans that show up to any weeknight game this season will receive a scratchoff ticket. Each ticket is a guaranteed winner of a Penn State Baseball prize. Saturday will be the third annual Wounded Warrior Game. The game was developed to help create awareness for wounded warriors and their sacrifices while providing useful services to meet the needs of injured service members and their families. of each ticket sold for the game will be donated to the cause. The Wounded Warrior Project is a non-profit organization dedicated to "honoring and empowering wounded warriors" of the U.S. Armed Forces. Its mission is to raise awareness while providing benefits such as quality healthcare, support groups, and compensation programs to the service members and their families. Sunday will be THON Sluggers Day at the ballpark. For every student ticket purchased, all proceeds will be donated to THON 2013. THON is the largest student-run philanthropy in the world. The Penn State IFC/Panhellenic Dance Marathon, affectionately referred to as THON,



is a yearlong effort to raise funds and awareness for the fight against pediatric cancer. Since 1977, THON has raised more than \$88 million for The Four Diamonds Fund at Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital.

Bats Coming Around as of Late: Despite the loss at Pittsburgh on Wednesday, Penn State's offense has really picked it up as of late. Through its first 21 game this season, the Nittany Lions were averaging just 3.5 runs per game. In its last 11 games, Penn State is averaging 7.3 runs per contest. The Lions 8-3 in those 11 games.

Wine Approaching 200 Wins: Penn State head coach Robbie Wine is nearing his 200th win, and can potentially reach it this weekend against Michigan. Wine sits at 198 wins for his career as the Penn State skipper. Wine would become the fifth head coach in school history to eclipse the 200-win plateau, joining Joe Hindelang (389), Joe Bedenk (380), Chuck Medlar (308) and Shorty Stone (216).

Steranka Moves into Second in School Hits List: Last Saturday against Canisius, Jordan Steranka moved into second place all-time on the Penn State hits list. He currently has 258 hits and trails Michael Campo by 37 hits for first. With 22 regular season games left, Steranka will need to average 1.68 hits per game for the remainder of the season to pass Campo. Steranka is also third place all-time on the Penn State RBI list with 165. Steranka trails Chris Wright by 11 RBI for second place in the school record books. Steranka is approaching a handful of records including at bats (ranks third, 20 behind first), runs (fifth), doubles

(third, seven behind first) and triples (fourth). With his homer against Canisius, Steranka moved into a tie for seventh in the school annals.

Opening the Gates in West Lafayette: After dropping the first two of the series and facing a potential sweep, Penn State closed

out the weekend with a season-high 16 runs and 19 hits in a 16-6 victory over the No. 19 Purdue Boilermakers two weekends ago. The Nittany Lions belted four homeruns and had a seven-run third inning. The first four batters in the Nittany Lion lineup collected a total of 11 hits and drove in 10 runs. Senior Sean Deegan started it all with leadoff homerun to begin the game. Senior Jordan Steranka had four hits and drove in three runs. Senior Joey DeBernardis drove in four and belted a two-run homer in the seventh inning. Sophomore Steve Snyder drove in two runs and had three hits as he made his second start of the season in the No. 2 spot. The bottom of the order put together a great performance as well. Sophomore Alex Farkes had a three-hit performance and two RBI, which included a massive home run in the eighth inning. Freshman Aaron Novak belted his second homerun of the season as well. Junior Elliot Searer collected two hits and had a great game defensively in the field. Sophomore Steven Hill picked up his first win of the season as he went 6.2 innings, giving up four runs, three of which were earned. He walked just one batter and struck out three.

More Notes on Game 3 Win at Purdue:

The outburst resulted in a number of milestones for some players. Most notably, Alex Farkes homered in his second consecutive game and set or tied career highs five offensive categories. Farkes set career highs in at bats (5) and hits (3) and also tied his career best in runs (2) and RBI (2). Aaron Novak's three RBI that came on his homerun in the third inning are a single-game best for

him. In addition, Joey DeBernardis scored a personal best four runs in Sunday's victory. The 16 runs were the most the Nittany Lions have scored since May 1, 2010 when Penn State defeated Michigan State by a score of 22-5.

Solid Pitching Against Nation's No. 1 Offense: Purdue's offense came into the weekend first in the

country in hitting, but strong starts from all three Nittany Lion starters dropped Purdue from first to ninth nationally. The Boilermakers scored 18 runs (6.0 per game), which were 2.1 below their season average. Most notably, 10 of those 18 Boilermaker runs were unearned.

The Sheep is on the Loose!: Junior Elliot Searer, who got off to a rough start in non-conference play, has significantly come back to his own self as of late. Searer has really stepped up since Big Ten action began, as he's reached base at a .467 clip. Searer leads the team in hitting for conference play by a large margin, as he sports a .389 average. Searer hit an extra inning, walk-off RBI single in the 10th inning to give Penn State its first conference win back on March 24 in a 4-3 victory over Indiana.

Firsts for Skerp: In Penn State's 7-1 game two victory over Coppin State, freshman Taylor Skerpon went 1-for-2 and earned his first career hit and RBIs. With two outs in the second inning and the score tied at zero in game two, Skerpon hit a single the other way to right centerfield to give the Nittany Lions a 2-0 edge on the Eagles. Skerpon has started at shortstop in two games this season.

Patton the Stats: Also in the 7-1 victory over Coppin State last Wednesday, freshman Patton Taylor picked up his first career victory on the mound. Taylor pitched 2.2 innings in his first career start and struck out three batters to earn the win. Also noteworthy in that game was Alex Farkes, who hit his first career homerun. Mike Franklin additionally struck out a career-high eight batters in game one, as he picked up his second win of the season.

Penn State to Have at Least Four Games Televised this Season:

The Nittany Lion baseball team will play in four games televised by the BTN starting with the Friday, Apr. 13 matchup against Michigan at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park. PSU's visit to Target Field to play Minnesota will air Saturday, May 5 at 3:00 p.m. as well Illinois' trip to Happy Valley on Sunday, May 13. Penn State's regular season BTN finale at Michigan State is scheduled for Saturday, May 19

Hill Earns Preseason Honors from College Sports Madness: Penn State junior pitcher Steven Hill has been named to the College Sports Madness Big Ten Preseason All-Conference Second Team. Hill is coming off a stellar 2011 season, as he was named Second Team All-Big Ten and Academic All-Big Ten. During 2011, Hill fired four complete games, which equals the total posted by every other Penn State pitcher since the beginning of the 2009 season. His year was highlighted by a pair of shutouts after he blanked Northwestern, 12-0, on April 9 before firing another gem against Minnesota during a 7-0 victory on May 13. In his 15 starts last year, he posted a 6-5 record, including three wins during conference action. Hill held his opposition to three or fewer runs during 10 starts. Incredibly accurate, he averaged just 1.01 walks-per-nine innings, which stood as the 15th best rate in the nation. Overall, he issued just 12 free passes during the year.
