The Penn State men's soccer team concludes its Big Ten Conference home schedule Friday, Oct. 21 when the Scarlet Knights of Rutgers travel to Jeffrey Field for a 7 p.m. contest. Fans are encouraged to wear white to whiteout Jeffrey Field against the Scarlet Knights.

### JEFFREY FIELD DOMINANCE

Penn State has enjoyed success at Jeffrey Field with over 300 victories at the famed field. Impressively, the Nittany Lions have never posted a losing season at Jeffrey Field in 43 years, going 326-85-36 all-time for a winning percentage of .771. This season, PSU is 6-2-1 at the Jeff and over the past four seasons the Nittany Lions are 33-10-5 en route to a pair of Big Ten titles in 2012 and 2013. In the 43-year history of the stadium, Jeffrey Field has welcomed over 540,000 fans through its gates.

## SERIES HISTORY WITH RUTGERS

Penn State holds the narrow 10-8-0 lead over Rutgers in the all-time series and are 2-0 since the Scarlet Knights joined the Big Ten Conference in the 2014 campaign. The Blue and White defeated RU 2-0 last season with senior **Riley Grant** tallying one goal on the night. Senior **Connor Maloney** put two shots on goal and tallied an assist for Penn State in the 2015 meeting between the two squads.

## SCOUTING THE SCARLET KNIGHTS

Rutgers brings an 0-11-2 overall record and a 0-5-2 Big Ten Conference record into the match, however, the Scarlet Knights have played some of the top teams in the nation to tough matches. RU forced No. 1 Maryland into double overtime before eventually falling 2-1 and tied No. 6 Indiana 0-0 in a double overtime match.

Jason Wright leads the Rutgers offense with four goals and one assist on the season for nine points and both Niel Guzman and Dante Perez have tallied two goals on the season. Guzman along with Ryan Peterson have set up the Scarlet Knight offense as both have two assists on the 2016 campaign.

Senior David Greczek has played every minute in net for Rutgers, giving up 35 goals and making 78 saves. Opponents are averaging 17.2 shots against the Scarlet Knight backline and have put 118 of its 224 shots on goal.

## MALONEY NETS TWO AGAINST NO. 22 AKRON

Senior **Connor Maloney** became the third Penn State men's soccer player to tally a multi-goal match when he found the back of the net on two occasions against No. 22 Akron. Maloney knotted the score at 1-1 in the 66th-minute before giving Penn State the go-ahead goal in the 74th-minute. However, Akron came back to tie the score late in the match as Penn State would play to a 2-2 double overtime draw with the Zips.

Maloney joins the company of senior **Mason Klerks**, who scored two goals against Ohio State, and sophomore **Dayonn Harris**, who netted two against then-No. 4 Maryland.

## PENN STATE TALLIES FIFTH MULTI-SCORING MATCH

In a game that typically ends with a 1-0 result, Penn State men's soccer has had five multi-goal matches in the 2016 campaign after Tuesday night's 2-2 tie with No. 22 Akron. The Nittany Lions had three-straight multi-goal games with a 4-2 win over Ohio State, a 3-2 overtime loss to then-No. 4 Maryland and a 2-1 double overtime win over Wisconsin. Following the three big scoring matches, the Blue and White suffered a scoring drought before finding two-straight one-goal wins and a 2-2 tie with Akron.

Entering his seventh season as Penn State's 11th coach in its storied history, Bob Warming has made his impact known in his first five years. Twice named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 by leading the Nittany Lions to back-to-back Big Ten titles, Warming has added a pair of trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2010, 2013), and led the Lions to three straight postseason appearances.

Warming led the Nittany Lions to a 7-8-3 overall record and a 2-4-2 Big Ten Conference record in the 2015 campaign. The Blue and White earned an overtime victory over Michigan State in the Big Ten Tournament play in match before falling to eventual Big Ten Champion Ohio State in the quarterfinals in overtime. Junior Connor Maloney paced Penn State, starting 17 matches with a team leading 17 points that included seven goals and two assists en route to his second First Team All-Big Ten honor. Freshman Austin Maloney also made his mark on the program, earning All-Freshman team honors after starting 14 games with two assists and a .800 shots on goal percentage. Of its seven wins in 2016, six of them came by way of the shutout with senior goalkeeper Matt Bersano tallying five and junior Evan Finney earning one.

2014 was a banner year for Warming and his Nittany Lions as they won 13 matches for the second straight year, going 13-6-1 overall and 5-3 in the Big Ten. They also recorded their 800th win in program history over Penn (Sept. 24), with a 6-2 win at Jeffrey Field. The team got out to a sizzling 10-0-1 start, it's best ever and won seven straight matches for the first time since 2005.

## 2016 NOTES AND HEADLINES

### FINNEY RANKED AMONGST NATIONS BEST

Redshirt-junior **Evan Finney** finds himself amongst the elite in the nation as he ranks fifth with a .842 save percentage and a 0.65 goals against average. Furthermore, Finney leads the Big Ten Conference in both categories, ranks third in shutouts per game (0.38), fourth in saves per game (3.30) and ties for sixth with three shutouts on the season. This past week Finney shutout both Pittsburgh and No. 19 Michigan State, facing just three shots on the week as the Nittany Lion defense kept opponent offenses away from the net. Despite letting in two goals against No. 22 Akron, Finney still paces the Big Ten Conference in save percentage and goals against average.

### SAGEL HEADER LIFTS PENN STATE TO VICTORY

With less than two minutes left before the double overtime match with the No. 19 Spartans ended in a draw, senior **Robby Sagel** headed in the golden goal off a free kick from **Riley Grant**. The senior defender, who was in on the free kick, found an opening in the box and buried the ball into the lower right corner of the net to secure Penn State's first victory over a ranked opponent this year and third Big Ten Conference win of the season.

### SAGEL KEY IN BEATING NATIONALLY-RANKED OPPONENTS

The win over No. 19 Michigan State marked the first time the Nittany Lions have defeated a top 20 opponent since Sept. 13, 2015 when they beat then-No. 10 Indiana. Senior **Robby Sagel** netted the lone goal of the night in the double overtime win over the Spartans. Furthermore, Sagel found the game-winner against Indiana off a corner kick. The two goals are Sagel's only goals donning the Blue and White, having both come against nationally-ranked contenders.

### NITTANY LION DEFENSE KEEPS PITT TO ONE SHOT

The Penn State defense gave up just one shot to the Panthers in its 1-0 victory Tuesday, Oct. 11. The one shot marked the least amount of shots a **Bob Warming** led team has given up in his six and a half seasons at the helm of the Nittany Lion program. Prior to Tuesday's match with Pittsburgh, Penn State's match low under Warming was two shots which it gave up against Stetson, Sept. 25, 2012 and Buffalo, Sept. 3, 2010.

### PENN STATE PUTS OFFENSIVE PRESSURE ON PITTSBURGH

The Nittany Lions put continuous pressure on Pitt in its non-conference mid-week match, taking 22 shots and putting 13 on net. The 22 shots was the most since Oct. 13, 2015 when it took 20 shots at West Virginia. Furthermore, the Blue and White had 14 shots in the first half which surpassed its match total against No. 6 Indiana where it took just 12 in 90 minutes of action.

## HARRIS NETS GOAL ON CANADA NIGHT AT JEFFREY FIELD

Canadian **Dayonn Harris** netted his third goal of the season and first game-winner at Jeffery Field Tuesday, Oct. 11 when Penn State celebrated Canada Night and the Nittany Lion's international trip. Harris found himself alone against the keeper after a perfect through pass from freshman **Frankie de la Camara**. The sophomore forward chipped the ball past Pitt's keeper and blasted it a mere three-yards out into the back of the net for what would turn into the game-winner in the opening half of the match.

## DE LA CAMARA EARNS FIRST COLLEGIATE POINTS

Seeing his first match with multiple minutes donning the Blue and White, freshman **Frankie de la Camara** made a perfect pass up the middle of the field to **Dayonn Harris** to tally his first career assist. De La Camara played a total of 45 minutes in the match and took one shot.

## MALONEY ON THE EDGE OF ETCHING HIS NAME IN THE RECORDS

Senior **Connor Maloney** has scored 23 goals in his career thus far donning the Blue and White. If Maloney scores at least six more goals this season, the senior will rank 15th all-time in Penn State career goals with 29. Furthermore, Maloney needs just two more assists to tie for 18th all-time in Penn State laurels.

## No. 6 INDIANA BLANKS PENN STATE

After not allowing Indiana to score in regulation for 486 minutes, the Nittany Lions gave up what would be the game-winning goal in the first half of the match, allowing No. 6 Indiana to take a 1-0 victory. The match marked the first time that the Hoosiers have defeated the Blue and White in the regular season since the 2010 campaign.

## NITTANY LIONS FALL AT MICHIGAN

The Penn State men's soccer team was unable to come away with its first road victory of the 2016 campaign, falling to the University of Michigan 2-0 in a Big Ten Conference match Sunday, Oct. 2 at the U-M Soccer Stadium. The Nittany Lions totaled 12 shots in the match, three of which tested keeper Evan Louro, while the Wolverines had 18 shots with nine shots on goal. The Canadian duo of **Aymar Sigue** and **Dayonn Harris** had all three shots on goal for the Blue and White with Sigue putting two on net and Harris having one. Seniors **Connor Maloney** and **Riley Grant** each took one shot for the Nittany Lions. Penn State split time in net with redshirt-junior **Evan Finney** making five saves in the first half before **Arie Ammann** started the second half, making two saves and giving up two goals in the loss.

### FINNEY MAKES HIS RETURN TO THE NET

After suffering an injury in the second match of the season, redshirt-junior **Evan Finney** made his first appearance in goal Sept. 23 when he notched the start against Wisconsin. The San Francisco, Calif. native made one save on the night of his return and earned his first win of the 2016 season. Finney started his fourth match of the season against Temple suffering the loss, making five saves on the night and giving up one goal.

### PENN STATE SHUT OUT AGAINST TEMPLE

The Penn State men's soccer team was unable to come away victorious against the Temple University Owls in a mid-week non-conference match at Jeffrey Field. The Nittany Lions fell 1-0 when a goal from the Owls happened in the final six minutes of play.

Senior **Connor Maloney** led the Blue and White offensively with four shots, two of which landed on goal, while **Dayonn Harris**, **Riley Grant** and **Aymar Sigue** all had two shots on net for the Nittany Lions. Redshirt-junior **Evan Finney** suffered the loss in goal, making five saves on the night and giving up one goal.

### BOUNCING BACK AFTER LOSS

Despite a heartbreaking overtime loss to Maryland in its second Big Ten Conference match of the season, Penn State bounced back to earn a 2-1 double overtime victory over Wisconsin, who was undefeated in conference play coming into the match. The Blue and White used an own goal from the Badgers before **Austin Maloney** scored the game-winning goal on a penalty kick.

### PENN STATE NOTCHES FOURTH MULTI-GOAL GAME OF 2016

The Nittany Lions have tallied four multi-goal matches in the 2016 season with its most recent 2-1 double overtime victory over Wisconsin. Of its four multi-goal games, three have ended in victory for the Blue and White and it suffered one overtime loss to then-No. 4 Maryland after scoring two goals. If Penn State can manage two more multi-goal games in 2016 it will tie the six it had in the 2015 campaign.

### HARRIS NETS TWO AGAINST THE TERPS

The No. 4 Maryland Terrapins did not have an answer for sophomore **Dayonn Harris** who found himself alone on three breakaways in the match. Harris was unsuccessful in his first attempt but scored easily on the next two to give Penn State the lead twice in the match. Harris showed success from both sides of the field scoring his first goal down the right side of the pitch into the bottom left corner. In his second goal of the match, Harris picked up the ball on the left side of the field and drove it into the net for the Nittany Lions.

## 2016 NOTES AND HEADLINES

### REVIEWING THE MARYLAND MATCH

Penn State took the lead twice in the match against the No. 4 Terrapins on two **Dayonn Harris** goals, but Maryland was able to come away with the win using two penalty kicks and an overtime goal to secure the win.

### BIG WIN OVER OHIO STATE ON MACK BRADY NIGHT

Behind a season-high four goals, the Penn State men's soccer team remained undefeated in Mack Brady Matches picking up a 4-2 victory over Ohio State in its first Big Ten Conference match of the 2016 season Tuesday, Sept. 13 at Jeffrey Field.

The Nittany Lions notched their first win over Ohio State since the 2014 season when they took a 1-0 victory at Jeffrey Field in the second Mack Brady Match. The four goals in the match marked the first time Penn State has scored four goals since the 2012 season when it tied Northwestern 4-4 in double overtime on the road.

### KLERKS SCORES TWO AGAINST OSU

Senior **Mason Klerks** paced the team against Ohio State with two goals on the night, scoring both in the first 26 minutes of action. The two goals were the first time a Penn State player has netted two in one game since **Connor Maloney** had two against Maryland in the 2015 campaign.

### AMMANN MAKES IDENTICAL PK SAVE IN MACK BRADY MATCH

Exactly one year to the day of the 3rd Mack Brady Match and Penn State's 1-0 win over then-No. 10 Indiana, freshman goalkeeper **Arie Ammann** found himself in the same situation that **Matt Bersano** was in one year earlier. At the 2015 Mack Brady Match, Bersano came up with a huge penalty kick save when he dove to his left and knocked the ball to the sideline in an effort to keep the match scoreless. In the 2016 Mack Brady Match, Ammann made the same exact save in the same exact goal to keep the Nittany Lion three goal lead intact on a night that is meant to honor goalkeepers.

### MALONEY TALLIES FIVE POINTS AGAINST THE BUCKEYES

Senior **Connor Maloney** was the leader on the field for the Blue and White against the Buckeyes tacking on at least one point in each of Penn State's four goals. The senior captain assisted both of the goals from **Mason Klerks** before netting his fourth goal of the season on a penalty kick and adding an assist on junior **Aymar Sigue**'s goal.

### NITTANY LIONS LOOKING TO BOUNCE BACK AFTER SFU LOSS

After falling in a 3-1 match against Saint Francis, Penn State is looking to bounce back in its Big Ten opener against Ohio State. The Blue and White were down 3-0 against the Red Flash before freshman **Christian Sload** found his first collegiate goal off a pass from **Noah Pilato**.

### SLOAD SCORES FIRST COLLEGIATE GOAL

In his first collegiate appearance late in the match against Saint Francis, freshman **Christian Sload** found the back of the net on his first shot. The freshman traveled up the right side of the field as **Noah Pilato** gathered the ball in the middle of the field. Pilato brought the ball up about six-yards before passing it up to Sload who shot the ball past the keeper to net his first collegiate goal donning the Blue and White.

### WARMING EARNS 450<sup>TH</sup> CAREER VICTORY

Head coach **Bob Warming** notched his 450th career victory as a head coach when the Nittany Lions picked up a 2-1 overtime win over Oakland Sept. 5. Warming ranks second among active Division I coaches in victories just behind South Carolina's Mark Berson who has 486 career wins as a head coach. Furthermore, Warming was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 after leading PSU to a pair of league titles. Moreover, Warming leads all Division I active coaches with a 28 combined regular season and conference tournament championships.

### PSU REMAINS PERFECT UNDER WARMING IN HOME OPENERS

Under the tutelage of head coach **Bob Warming**, the Nittany Lions are a perfect 7-0 in home openers since he arrived at Penn State in 2010. Furthermore, his squads have outscored opponents 10-1 on opening day and have not given up a goal since Warming's inaugural season in 2010 when they defeated Bucknell 2-1.

## 2016 NOTES AND HEADLINES

### SIGUE RETURNS FROM COSTA RICA TO SCORE GAME-WINNER

Junior transfer **Aymar Sigue** made a week-long trip to Costa Rica to play for the Canadian National Team, missing two regular season games for the Nittany Lions. The junior transfer missed Penn State's contest against Cal and its match against JMU before returning in time for its Labor Day match against Oakland. Playing just seven minutes in the second half after 10 hours of travel, Sigue found the ball six yards out from the net in the first minute of overtime. Sigue blasted the ball right at the keeper who was able to make the save. However, the shot was too hard as it squeaked out of his hands, allowing Sigue to rip a shot into the lower half of the net for the game-winner.

### AMMANN NAMED BIG TEN DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For the second consecutive week, Penn State men's soccer has been awarded with the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week as freshman **Arie Ammann** earned his first career honor getting the win in both matches this past weekend.

Ammann earned the nod for both starts after an injury to senior goalkeeper **Evan Finney** and proved to be a good choice for the Nittany Lions as he played 181:42 minutes on the pitch and conceded just one goal in two matches.

The Round Hill, Va. native made his first start donning the Blue and White in Friday's home-opener against the JMU Dukes in which he made a career-high five saves in the match and tallied his first career shutout. Moving into Monday's contest, Ammann gave up one goal late in the match but held on in the remaining minutes as the Nittany Lions went on to a 2-1 overtime victory over Oakland. Ammann made two saves in the match and picked up his second victory in as many games.

On the week, Ammann tallied seven saves and gave up just one goal. The freshman keeper has made a total of nine saves in 191:01 minutes on the pitch and carries a .818 save percentage.

### FINNEY NAMED BIG TEN DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior goalkeeper **Evan Finney** was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week for the period ended Aug 28. The award marks the first of its career and the second consecutive season that the Nittany Lions has earned B1G Defensive Player of the Week honors in opening weekend.

Finney had an outstanding weekend in net for the Nittany Lions, playing 191:32 minutes in goal. The San Francisco, Calif. native returned to his home state to keep the defending National Champion Cardinal scoreless through 110:00 minutes of play. Finney stopped six shots in the match and helped the Nittany Lions to a 0-0 double overtime tie over the No. 1 ranked Stanford Cardinal.

The senior keeper continued to look strong in net for the Blue and White in Sunday's match against UC Berkeley, stopping two shots and allowing just one goal before coming out due to an injury in the second half of play.

### OPENING WEEKEND ON THE WEST COAST

The Nittany Lions fended off defending national champion Stanford in its season-opener on the west coast. The Blue and White played the Cardinal to a 0-0 draw in double overtime, firing off eight shots and getting one on goal. Senior **Evan Finney** made six saves in the opener for the Nittany Lions.

Penn State concluded its west coast trip with a game against UC Berkeley. The Nittany Lions and the Golden Bears each played their second overtime match in as many games, this time with Cal coming out on the winning end with an early overtime goal. Senior **Connor Maloney** netted his 20th career goal and first of the 2016 for the Blue and White in the sixth minute of the match to give Penn State the early lead, but Cal was able to come away with the late win over the Nittany Lions.

### NEW YEAR, NEW LOOK

The 2016 Penn State men's soccer team brought in 10 new student-athletes for the upcoming season, which includes three transfers and eight freshmen. The 2016 freshman class includes two goalkeepers, two defenders, two midfielders and two forwards. **Arie Ammann** and **Josh Levine** will look to make a difference in goal for the Nittany Lions, while **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Mitchel Bringolf** will help the defense. Finally, **Frankie de la Camara**, **Pierre Reedy** and **Christian Sload** will all help on the offensive attack.

### SENIOR CLASS LOOKING TO GET BACK ON TOP

Three of the members of the 2016 senior class have been a part of a championship squad as the Nittany Lions nabbed a Big Ten Championship in the 2013 campaign. Then-freshman **Connor Maloney** paced Penn State with seven assists, while scoring two goals for the Blue and White. Also seeing time on the pitch in his freshman season for the Nittany Lions was **Mason Klerks**, who dished out three assists.

### COACHING CLOUT

Among the elite coaches in the sport for the last three decades, head coach **Bob Warming** is back for his seventh season at Penn State. Warming has an incredible coaching pedigree, including 454 career Division I victories -- second all-time among active Division I coaches and ninth all-time at DI. He was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 after leading PSU to a pair of league titles. Furthermore, Warming leads all Division I active coaches with a 28 combined regular season and conference tournament championships.

### TOUGH SCHEDULE AHEAD FOR PENN STATE

Head coach **Bob Warming** scheduled one of the toughest slates for the Nittany Lions in 2016 as they will take on six teams that were ranked in the top-25 of the NSCAA Preseason Coaches Poll. Penn State kicks off the season with No. 1 Stanford, Aug. 26, before taking on No. 18 Ohio State for its Big Ten Conference opener, Sept. 13. The top-25 tour continues Sept. 18 when Penn State travels to No. 4 Maryland before meeting up with No. 15 Indiana, Oct. 8. Finally the Nittany Lions will go up against No. 2 Akron and No. 25 Rutgers in back-to-back matches, Oct. 18 and Oct. 21.

Last season, Penn State took one from then-No. 10 Indiana in the Third Annual Mack Brady Match off a goal from defender **Robby Sagel** and earned a 2-0 victory over Rutgers with goals from **Brian James** and **Riley Grant**. The Nittany Lions fought to a 1-1 double overtime tie against the eventual Big Ten Champions Ohio State but were unable to overcome Akron and Maryland in the 2015 campaign.

### THREE NITTANY LIONS LAND PRESEASON HONORS

Seniors **Evan Finney**, **Connor Maloney** and **Robby Sagel** each earned Big Ten Preseason Honors as announced by the conference office. Finney closed out the 2015 season as the starting keeper for the Blue and White tallying a 2-2-1 overall record. The San Francisco, Calif. native earned one shut out and made 22 saves in his junior campaign, playing 476:10 minutes in the net. Maloney heads into the 2016 after earning First Team All-Big Ten for the second time in his career. The starting midfielder scored a team-high seven goals in 2015 and tallied two assists for a team-best 16 points. Finally, Sagel will take the pitch for his second season with the Nittany Lions after transferring to Penn State following his sophomore season. Sagel manned the backline for the Blue and White in 2015 and scored the game-winning goal against then-No. 10 Indiana at the Third Annual Mack Brady Game.

## 2016 NOTES AND HEADLINES

### PRESEASON RECAP

Penn State came out strong in its 2016 preseason. The Nittany Lions welcomes University of Nebraska-Omaha to Jeffrey Field for an exhibition match in week two of the preseason. UNO got out to the early 1-0 lead over Penn State but the Nittany Lions responded with two goals of their own to take the 2-1 victory in its first preseason match.

Penn State closed out its preseason slate when it traveled to Pittsburgh for a match against the Riverhounds. After a scoreless first half, the Riverhounds found the back of the net on one occasion to take the 1-0 win over the Blue and White.

### BIG TEN NETWORK SCHEDULE

The Nittany Lion men's soccer team will be featured on BTN three times in 2016 starting with the Badgers of Wisconsin Friday, Sept. 23 at 5:30 p.m. at Jeffrey Field. Penn State holds a 16-11-3 advantage over Wisconsin after tying 2-2 in double overtime in the 2015 campaign. The Blue and White will open the month of October in Ann Arbor, Mich. when it takes on the Wolverines in a noon match up Sunday, Oct. 2.

Finally, Penn State will return to the friendly confines of Jeffrey Field for a midweek match against Akron. The Nittany Lions and the Zips will square off at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 18 to close out its BTN slate.

Along with its three BTN matches, the men's soccer team will be featured on BTN Plus on nine occasions in the 2016 campaign starting with its Labor Day match against Oakland at 7 p.m. before closing out the week at Jeffrey Field Friday, Sept. 9 against Saint Francis. The Nittany Lion's BTN Plus slate continues Tuesday, Sept. 13 when they open the Big Ten Conference season against Ohio State at 7 p.m. at Jeffrey Field before hitting the road for a Sunday, Sept. 18 contest at Maryland. Penn State will return home to take on Temple Tuesday, Sept. 27 in a non-conference contest and head to Indiana Saturday, Sept. 8. The Blue and White will play two-straight home matches against Pittsburgh, Oct. 11, and Michigan State, Oct. 15 and close out its BTN Plus schedule in its final regular season match against Northwestern in Evanston, Ill. Sunday, Oct. 30.

### DUERNBERGER AND GRIFFITH PROMOTED

Head men's soccer coach **Bob Warming** announced the promotion of **Chad Duernberger** to Associate Head Coach Friday, June 17. Duernberger enters his sixth season at Penn State and his first season as associate head coach for the Nittany Lions. He maintains a role in team training and is also involved in a variety of administrative duties. Duernberger helped the Nittany Lions capture back-to-back Big Ten regular season trophies in 2012 and 2013 and has been on the sidelines during two consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

Warming announced the hiring of **Owen Griffith** as an assistant coach for the 2016 season Thursday, July 14. Griffith will work with all positions with an emphasis on defenders and midfielders, while helping with team operations, daily player management and communication. Griffith is entering his second season on the sidelines with Warming in the 2016 campaign. He joined the Penn State men's soccer coaching staff after completing a four-year playing career under Warming and served as a volunteer assistant in the 2015 season.

### NEXT TIME OUT

Penn State concludes its 2016 regular season home slate Tuesday, Oct. 25 when it takes on Wright State in a non-conference match. The match will honor the Nittany Lion's six seniors and start at 7 p.m. at Jeffrey Field.
