#### Coch Washington's Availability

All interview requests for head coach Coquese Washington should be directed to Greg Campbell in the Strategic Communications office.

Coach Washington will hold weekly press conferences during the season. A schedule is available by calling the Strategic Communications office.

Coach Washington will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

#### Player Interviews

All player interviews must be arranged through Greg Campbell in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Coquese Washington's weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off.

Players will return phone calls only upon clearance with the Strategic Communications office. They may also be scheduled for one-on-one interviews in person. Player phone numbers will not be released.

Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the post-game media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

#### Credentials

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Greg Campbell. Please submit requests for game credentials at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, near Parking Lot 8.

#### Photographers

A photo pass must be issued to gain courtside access at the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Greg Campbell, one week in advance for photo passes.

Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and stands. Photographers must remain seated at all times.

#### Radio Networks

The Penn State Sports Network originates from the first row of Booth C23 in the press area. Visiting stations are provided one phone line and one ISDN line, and are located on the first row of Booth C22 in the press area.

#### Press Row Seating

To access the press seating area, turn left out of the media room, walk down the hallway and take the elevator to the Concourse level. Please allow several minutes when taking the elevator to press row or the media room.

When leaving the elevator, turn right. The press area is at Portal 23. Final statistics and a running play-by-play will be available in the media room following the game.

Game notes will be provided at least one day in advance of each game. Penn State, Big Ten and opposing team game notes will be available in the media room two hours prior to each game. ## SCOUTING THE OPPOSITION

- » Boston College snapped a three-game skid on Saturday, Nov. 26 with a 73-58 decision over St. Francis Brooklyn in Boulder, Colo. The Eagles split a pair of games at the Colorado Thanksgiving Tournament, falling to SMU, 72-64, in the opening game of the event.
- » This will be just the third home game of the season for BC, splitting the first two contests. The Eagles toppled Boston U., 67-49, on Nov. 14 and fell to Saint Mary's College, 62-54, on Nov. 20.
- » Boston College is 37-of-116 from 3-point range on the season, with 25 of those makes coming from **Kelly Hughes**.
- » Though the record is 2-4, Boston College owns the scoring edge on the season versus its opponents. The Eagles are plus-0.5 in points per game, with a 63.3-62.8 average score in games played.
- » Senior **Kelly Hughes** leads the team with a 16.5 points per game average, boosted by her team-high 25 3-pointers. She also has a team-best nine steals and only 11 turnovers.
- » Sophomore **Mariella Fasoula** paces the team with 7.3 rebounds per game and six blocked shots, while sitting third on the team with 2.8 assists per game.

## THE LAST FIVE GAMES

- » Penn State is 4-1 over its last five games.
- » **Teniya Page** and **Lindsey Spann** are each averaging better than 14 points per game, with Page sitting at 19.2 and Spann boasting a 14.4 scoring average.
- » Three players are averaging better than 5.0 rebounds per game over the last five contests; **Kaliyah Mitchell** (7.2), **Peyton Whitted** (6.8) and **Sierra Moore** (5.2).
- » Penn State is plus-3.0 in turnover margin in the last five games, averaging just 13.2 missteps per game. The Lady Lions are forcing 16.3 opponent turnovers in the last five games.
- » Penn State has assisted on an average of 16.0 of its 28.8 made field goals over the last five games.
- » Freshman **Jaida Travascio-Green** scored a career-high 18 points and corralled a personal-best six rebounds vs. Georgia State on Nov. 24, 2016.

Next to 900

- » In its 53rd season playing women's basketball, Penn State became just the 16th program in Division I women's basketball to earn 900 victories in program history with a convincing win over Saint Peter's, 106-50, on Sunday, Nov. 13.
- » The program owns 903-439 overall record.
- » Penn State joins Big Ten brethren Ohio State and Maryland in the exclusive 900-win club.

Scoreboard Workout

- » Penn State wanted to make sure they played at the pace that head coach **Coquese Washington** wanted and to be sure all of the scoreboard's lights were working with a 106-point effort vs. Saint Peter's.
- » The 106-50 win marked the 49th time in program history the Lady Lions hit the century mark and their 106 points are tied for 19th on the all-time single game scoring list.
- » Furthermore, Penn State scored 64 points in the first half, marking the first time the Lady Lions scored over 60 points in a half since November 8, 2013 vs. Saint Francis (Pa.).
- » The 106-point game against Saint Peter's was the first time the Lady Lions scored over 100 points since beating Saint Francis (Pa.), 117-77 in 2013.
- » The Lady Lions won by 56 points, the largest margin of victory since a 101-44 victory over Fairleigh Dickinson on Dec. 2, 2012.

Opening on the Road

- » Penn State opened a season on the road for the first time since the 2010-11 season (at Dayton) with an 83-60 loss at Drexel on Friday, Nov. 11.
- » Since 2006-07, Penn State has now opened on the road four times; at Dayton (2010-11) and at Drexel (2016-17, 2009-10 and 2006-07).
- » Starting its 53rd season on the road, Penn State has opened with a true road game on 18 occasions. The Lady Lions are 11-7 in those contests, with the season-opening loss to the Dragons snapping a three-game winning streak.

Toppling Rocky Top

- » Penn State came close last season in Knoxville, but Tennessee was able to hold on for a victory on Nov. 18 in Thompson-Boling Arena, but on Nov. 20, 2016, the Lady Lions came through with a 70-56 defeat of the Lady Vols.
- » The Blue and White picked up its first double-digit win over a top-25 team since it defeated No. 23/22 Iowa 87-71 Jan. 5, 2014.
- » The Lady Lions improved to 2-9 all-time against Tennessee, with both wins coming at home. The victory Saturday was preceded by a 79-74 victory in Rec Hall on Jan. 27, 1985.
- » Head coach **Coquese Washington** now has 22 wins over ranked opponents in her 10 seasons at the helm of the Lady Lion program.

Starting Strong at Home

- » Penn State has won each of its first three home games, marking the 27th time in program history it has started with at least three victories to start the home slate.
- » Head coach **Coquese Washington** has won the first three games of a home slate in seven of 10 seasons.
- » The Lady Lions have 10 unblemished seasons at home, including the 2012-13 squad that went 14-0 and the 2002-03 which won a school-record 16 games.
- » Of those 27 seasons, Penn State has won at least four-straight games to open a season on 24 different occasions.

Books & Basketball

- » Senior guard **Sierra Moore** walked across the stage at the Bryce Jordan Center last April as a member of The Pennsylvania State University's graduating class of 2016.
- » The Hanover, Pa., native accepted her diploma, a B.A. in broadcast & journalism, and is now working on a master's degree in human resources & employment relations.
- » Moore missed the 2015-16 season due to injury (knee), after averaging 12.1 points, 5.1 rebounds and 3.8 assists in 2014-15.
- » The trio of **Kaliyah Mitchell**, **Lindsey Spann** and **Peyton Whitted** all excelled on the court and in the classroom during the 2015-16 campaign, earning Academic All-Big Ten honors.
- » Along with her academic honor, Spann was an honorable mention All-Big Ten performer, as well.
- » Mitchell and Whitted were also members of the Dean's List following the 2016 spring semester.

- » In 37 career games in the blue and white, sophomore **Teniya Page** has produced 21 games playing at least 38 minutes.
- » Of those 21 games, nine of them have featured at least 40 minutes. Page produced eight games of at least 40 minutes last season and played every minute vs. Akron on Nov. 16.
- » Page has not fouled out of a game in her career, reaching four fouls in only eight games.
- » As a rookie, she finished ranked No. 14 in the NCAA and No. 3 in the B1G with 37.6 minutes per game.
- » **Perspective:** Page's 16 games of at least 38 minutes last season were more than the rest of the team combined from 2015-16. Only four other players (12 times) played at least 38 minutes in a game.

### JUST THE FACTS

Teniya Page is the only NCAA Division I freshman to average at least 15 points and 4.0 assists per game. She was the first rookie in the NCAA to reach 400 points and 100 assists for the season.



### Crunch Time

- » As a freshman, Teniya Page averaged 5.8 points per game (35 points) in the fourth quarter of Penn State's six Big Ten victories, playing 57 of the 60 minutes.
- » As a rookie, Page was 12-of-19 from the floor (.632), including 3-of-4 from three-point range. She also hit 8-of-11 free throws (.727).
- » At Michigan State, Page scored eight points in the final 2:50 of the fourth quarter - including the go-ahead jumper with 1:01 remaining - to help PSU rally from a 14-point third quarter deficit for the road win over the nationally-ranked Spartans.
- » At Illinois, Page scored 13 fourth quarter points to help PSU complete a come-from-behind win.
- » Overall in the fourth quarter of Big Ten games, Page was 29-of-76 (.382) from the field and 10-of-20 (.500) from 3-point range. She had 16 assists and seven steals in 18 games.

### Taking the Lead

- » Against Georgetown on Friday, Nov. 25, Teniya Page led the team in scoring and assists, ticking off 16 points and four assists.
- » It marked the eighth time in her career she led the team in both categories in the same game.
- » Overall, Page has led the team in scoring on 15 occasions and paced the team in assists in 23 contests.

- » In 37 career games, **Teniya Page** has reached double-figures in the scoring column on 30 occasions, including the first four games of 2016-17.
- » Page scored 10-plus points in six straight games dating back to the 2015-16 season before getting only nine points vs. Georgia State on Nov. 24.
- » For the Chicago native, just reaching 10 points is not enough. Of her 30 double-figure scoring games, 23 of them have seen her score more than 15 points.
- » The 30 games of 10-or-more points includes one 30-point effort and seven other 20-point games.

### B1G POTW

- » After averaging 26.0 points per game and leading the Lady Lions to a pair of wins, including a victory over then No. 13 Tennessee, **Teniya Page** was named Big Ten Player of the Week.
- » Page also averaged 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game on the week.
- » It is the first Player of the Week honor for Page and her second career B1G honor, earning Freshman of the Week once during the 2015-16 season.

- » Only 10 Lady Lions have ever posted multiple games with 30 points in a career, and junior **Lindsey Spann** is one of them after a career-high 31-point effort vs. Saint Peter's on Sunday, Nov. 13, 2016.
- » Spann connected on 13-of-18 shots - including 4-of-8 from 3-point range - and made her only free throw attempt on her way to 31 tallies.
- » Her 31 points are tied for No. 10 on the single game charts in 2016-17 and she is one of just 17 players to top the 30-point mark this season.
- » Spann notched 30 points on Jan. 3, 2016 at Minnesota, making 10-of-18 shots, including seven 3-pointers. She made three free throws vs. the Gophers.
- » In 2015-16, Spann and Teniya Page became just the second set of teammates to reach the 30-point mark during the same season. In 1999-2000, Maren Walseth netted 35 points vs. Michigan (1/27/2000) and Lisa Shepard had 31 points vs. St. Joseph's (11/27/1999).

**Long Range Lindsey**

- » In just 66 career games, **Lindsey Spann** has ascended into the upper echelon of the single season and career charts for 3-point shooting at Penn State.
- » Her 110 makes from 3-point range make her just the 14th player in Penn State history to hit the century mark from distance.
- » She is currently four shy of passing Lynn Dougherty (113, 1989-92) for 13th on the career list.
- » Her 65 makes from long range in 2015-16 sit tied with Kelly Mazzante (2000-01) for No. 11 on the single season charts.
- » Spann's seven three-pointers at Minnesota were the most in a single game in 2015-16 for Penn State and sit tied for No. 4 on the Lady Lion single game charts.
- » She connected on at least two three-pointers in six straight games from Jan. 10 - Jan. 27, before going 0-for-3 against Purdue (1/30).

**Spann Solid From The Stripe**

- » Junior **Lindsey Spann** has moved her named into the discussion as one of the top free throw shooters in school history.
- » Spann has made 122-of-154 shots from charity stripe in her career to rank No. 13 on the career free throw percentage list at .792.
- » Her .877 free throw percentage (57-of-65) in 2015-16 ranks tied for No. 8 on the single season charts with Jess Strom's 71-of-81 effort in 2002-03.

## PLAYER PARABLES

### Moore Is Better

- » **Sierra Moore** missed the entire 2015-16 season due to injury, meaning her last on-court appearance came on March 3, 2015 in the Big Ten Tournament.
- » Her absence spanned 617 days and she returned on Friday, Nov. 11 at Drexel.
- » Moore tied for the team lead with 15 points, connecting on 7-of-8 shots from the floor and 1-of-2 attempts from the free throw line. She added four rebounds and two assists in 32 minutes on the floor.
- » Moore reached double figures in three of her first four games in 2016-17.

### Doubling Up

- » The first double-double of the 2016-17 season came via a 17-point, 12-rebound effort from **Kaliyah Mitchell** on Wednesday, Nov. 16 evening vs. Akron.
- » For Mitchell, it marked the eighth double-double of her career. She posted four as a sophomore in 2014-15 and three as a junior in 2015-16.
- » Mitchell followed that with a 12-point, 11-rebound effort vs. No. 13/13 Tennessee. It is the second time in her career she has posted back-to-back double-doubles, the first time coming on Jan. 22 and Jan. 25 vs. Indiana and Northwestern, respectively.
- » **Peyton Whitted** added to this list with her 15-point, 11-rebound effort off the bench vs. Georgia State on Friday, Nov. 25 at the San Juan Shootout.
- » Along with Mitchell (9) and Whitted (8), **Sierra Moore (3)** is the only other Lady Lion with career double-doubles.

### 500 Club

- » More exclusive than Penn State's 1,000-point club, the 500-rebound group currently has just 33 members. However, two of those are seniors **Kaliyah Mitchell** and **Peyton Whitted**.
- » Mitchell secured her 500th rebound in the opening game of the 2016 Big Ten Tournament vs. Illinois and enters today with 549 career boards.
- » With just 15 rebounds, Mitchell can move into the No. 25 slot, currently held by Kelly Mazzante (2001-04), who nabbed 563 career rebounds.
- » For Whitted, notched rebounds No. 500 vs. Georgetown on Nov. 25 in Dayton Beach, Fla. to become the 33rd member of the club, thanks largely to her 256-rebound season in 2015-16.

### Rookies Get First Taste

- » True freshmen Siyeh Frazier and Jaida Travascio-Green each recorded the first official playing time of their respective careers in the season opener at Drexel.
- » Travascio-Green connected on her first career attempt from the field, a 3-point basket with 1:33 left in the first quarter to push Penn State's lead to six points at the time.
- » Overall, Travascio-Green would end the night with six points and two rebounds in 13 minutes of court time.
- » Frazier played three minutes and had one assist in her first collegiate action.

### ACC/B1G Challenge

- » The 2016-17 season marks the 10th season of the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and Penn State owns a 2-7 overall mark in the first nine events.
- » In the inaugural event, Penn State toppled No. 10 Duke, 86-84, at the Bryce Jordan Center. The only other win came four years later vs. No. 14 North Carolina in the BJC, 103-84.
- » Boston College becomes the first two-time opponent in the event for the Lady Lions. The two teams also met on Dec. 2, 2010, with BC claiming a 113-104 decision, the second-highest scoring game in program history.

- » Wright ended her 12th season in the league with 6.7 points and 3.6 assists per game.
- » Her assists-per-game average ranked 16th in the WNBA and she moved into No. 13 in league history with 1,231 helpers in 393 career regular season games.
- » Alex Bentley finished her third season in Connecticut and ranked among the top-30 in the WNBA in scoring average (22nd, 12.9), minutes played per game (25, 28.8), 3-pointers made (8th, 48) and assists (29th, 85).
- » Bentley was an All-Star in 2015, scoring a team-best 23 points off the bench for the East to go along with five assists.
- » Maggie Lucas missed the 2016 season due to injury (knee), after seeing action in 30 games during the 2015 season.

- » Whitted's leadership role continued to expand following her breakout junior campaign. A nominee for COSIDA Academic All-District, Whitted is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten performer that spent the summer interning with WPSU Penn State as a member of their video production unit and leading workouts with younger players.
- » Every team needs someone that continually places team before self, and McMurtry embodies what it is to be a great teammate. After joining the team as a walk-on in October 2015, she quickly stood out as one of the hardest working and most respected players in the program. She is also one of the top performers in the classroom.

- » On Wednesday, Nov. 9, the Penn State women's basketball program added a pair of student-athletes for the 2017-18 campaign; guard Kamaria McDaniel and post Alisia Smith.
- » McDaniel and Smith both inked their National Letters of Intent on Wednesday to attend Penn State.
- » McDaniel is an attacking-style guard that put up 20 points, five rebounds and four assists per game as a junior to earn All-State Class B Honorable Mention honors in 2015-16.
- » A 6-foot-3 post, Smith has averaged double figures in scoring in each of her last two seasons, including 13.4 points as a sophomore and 17.0 as a junior.

Upon arriving on the University Park campus as the fifth head coach in Penn State women's history - and first female African-American head coach in Penn State history - Coquese Washington quickly returned the program to national prominence with her up-tempo, aggressive style of play. Entering her 10th season on the sideline in Happy Valley, her passion for creating a winning culture, predicated on innovative coaching techniques, tireless recruiting, cultivating meaningful relationships with student-athletes and an unmatched enthusiasm for teaching the game she loves, Washington is in the conversation as one of the nation's top head coaches.

Washington has seen success at every level of basketball and in every role she has filled on the sidelines. She became the first player at Flint Central High School to earn a starting position all four seasons and helped her squad to the program's first Saginaw Valley League and district championships, while earning all-state honors on two occasions.

She went on to earn four varsity letters at the University of Notre Dame, leading the team in steals four times and assists on three occasions, before moving on to professional basketball where she was a member of the 2000 WNBA Champion Houston Comets squad.

On the sidelines, she has appeared in the postseason 13 times, with 12 of those being NCAA Tournament appearances. She helped the Lady Lions to four straight berths in the NCAA Tournament - including a pair of Sweet Sixteen appearances - and was an assistant coach on Notre Dame's 2001 NCAA National Championship team. Her three straight Big Ten Championships make her one of just four coaches in Big Ten history with three-or-more consecutive Big Ten regular season championships (Jim Foster, Ohio State; C. Vivian Stringer, Iowa & Tara VanDerveer, Ohio State), taking home outright crowns in 2012 and 2013, while sharing the 2014 title.

**Growing the Game**

The professionals that are most successful often share one trait; they are thinkers, and Washington is no different. As a student-athlete at Notre Dame, Washington earned her degree in just three years. After her collegiate career was complete, Washington went on to earn her Juris Doctorate from her alma mater, while simultaneously playing in the professional ranks for the American Basketball League's (ABL) Portland Power. Her passion for learning is matched only by her love of family and basketball.

Washington has served on the WBCA Board of Directors since becoming Penn State's head coach, currently holding the role of President with the organization that is tasked with solving issues, preserving the history and growing the game of women's basketball. She was also the Vice President/President-Elect from 2013-15.

Her service to the game also includes time with USA Basketball, the Kay Yow Cancer Fund and the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee. She won a gold medal with Team USA in Kazan, Russia at the 2013 World University Games and served on the USA Basketball Women's Junior National Committee from 2009-12. Her work with the Kay Yow Cancer Fund Board of Directors ran from 2012-15 and she served five years on the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee.

Of her many accomplishments, Washington was the founding President of the WNBA Players Association in 1999 and was a primary force in negotiating the association's first two collective bargaining agreements.

**Recruiting Premier Talent**

The recruiting trail has always been a place of success for Washington, with the Lady Lions signing four top-25 recruiting classes - including three top-15 classes - since her arrival in Happy Valley. Her top-25 recruiting classes have included a pair of 14th-ranked classes (2009, 2013), one that sat at No. 15 (2015) and one that came in 22nd nationally (2010).

Prior to Washington's arrival, Penn State had only signed one McDonald's All-American in program history, but the seasoned recruiter has brought six to campus in her nine years as head coach. Candice Agee (2012), Brianna Banks (2011), De'Janae Boykin (2015), Maggie Lucas (2010), Sierra Moore (2012) and Dara Taylor (2009) have all donned the McDonald's All-American uniform before matriculating to the University Park campus.

Led by the All-American duo of Indiana native Alex Bentley and Lone Star State product Nikki Greene, Washington's 2009 class also included all-state performers Gizelle Studevent (California) and Marissa Wolfe (Pennsylvania), along with transfer Mia Nickson (Virginia), who was a top-100 recruit coming out of high school in 2008. In 2010, Washington landed a pair of Pennsylvania's top players in shooting guard Maggie Lucas and forward Talia East, while the three-person class was boosted by New York wing and WBCA High School All-American Arielle Edwards.

In 2013, Washington and her staff inked a seven-person class that included four ESPN HoopGurlz Top-100 players, including the Georgia duo of Kaliyah Mitchell and Peyton Whitted, and Maryland guard Lindsey Spann. The 2013 class was also bolstered by the addition of Duke transfer Sierra Moore, who was a top-50 national recruit in the class of 2012.

A pair of five-star guards in Chicago native Teniya Page and Maryland product Amari Carter led the way for the class of 2015. Adding to a strong recruiting haul was the highly recruited post pair of Kentucky's Ashanti Thomas and Boston-area product Jaylen Williams.

Washington came to Happy Valley after eight seasons as an associate head coach and assistant coach under Muffet McGraw at Notre Dame, her alma mater. One of the top recruiters in the country, Washington was instrumental in helping the Irish secure eight consecutive top-25 recruiting classes, a feat only accomplished by two other programs in the country (Connecticut and Tennessee).

### WNBA: Pioneer and Pupils

A pioneer in advancing the WNBA both on and off the court, Washington continues to supply the league with top notch talent, including six Penn Staters play in the world's most competitive professional league.

Alex Bentley and Maggie Lucas are two of Washington's pupils succeeding on the grand stage, with Bentley playing in the WNBA Finals as a rookie and earning WNBA All-Star status in 2015. Lucas also competed in the WNBA Finals, helping the Indiana Fever to the WNBA Championship series against the Minnesota Lynx during the 2015 season.

In 2014, Lucas was selected with the 21st overall pick (second round) by the Phoenix Mercury, then was traded to the Indiana Fever during training camp. In her third year as a professional, Lucas saw her court time increase each season, before suffering a season-ending injury in the fourth game of the 2016 campaign. Also in 2014, Ariel Edwards inked a free agent contract with the Tulsa Shock.

In 2013, for the third time in program history, the Lady Lion program saw a pair of student-athletes selected in the WNBA Draft. Alex Bentley went 13th overall to the Atlanta Dream and Nikki Greene was selected 26th overall by the Phoenix Mercury. Bentley has found a home with the Connecticut Sun after competing one season for the Atlanta Dream, and playing in the WNBA Finals that year. A WNBA All-Rookie selection in 2013, she was among the MVP candidates in 2015 before missing the final nine games of the season with an injury.

Greene played two years in the league, suiting up for the Los Angeles Sparks in 2014 before teaming up with Bentley in Connecticut during the 2015 season.

Tyra Grant capped off her career by being selected by the Phoenix Mercury in the second round of the 2010 WNBA Draft, and Washington was also instrumental in helping Kam Gissendanner sign a free agent contract with the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks following in the 2008 campaign. Ariel Edwards and Zhaque Gray have also signed free agent contracts with WNBA teams, inking deals with the Tulsa Shock and Chicago Sky, respectively, in 2014.

During her time at Notre Dame, Washington saw seven players earn roster spots on WNBA teams.

### Dancing Shoes

In 17 years as a collegiate coach, Washington has laced up her dancing shoes and headed to the postseason on 13 occasions, including 12 trips of the NCAA Tournament. While coaching the Blue and White, Washington has guided the program to four NCAA Tournament berths and one appearance in the WNIT.

From 2011-14, the Lady Lions advanced to the NCAA Tournament each season, reaching at least the second round on all four occasions. The 2012 and 2014 squads moved on to the Sweet Sixteen with a pair of postseason wins, before falling to top-five ranked opponents.

In their fourth straight NCAA Tournament appearance, the 2014 squad hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament inside the Bryce Jordan Center for the 14th time in school history. Wins over Wichita State in the opening round and a 22-point rout of Florida in the second round sent the program to its 13th Sweet Sixteen. A date with No. 5/6 Stanford awaited in Palo Alto, as the No. 3 seed Lady Lions fell to the No. 2 seed Cardinal at Maples Pavilion to close out a 24-8 campaign, which included a Big Ten regular season title.

In 2013, Penn State again advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a win over Cal Poly in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The 26-6 campaign ended with a loss to LSU in their home court. Lady Lions advanced to the 2012 Sweet Sixteen with wins over UTEP and LSU in Baton Rouge before falling to No. 3/3 Connecticut en route to a 26-7 overall record.

The Lady Lions worked their way back to the "Big Dance" for the first time since 2004-05 and advanced to the second round for the first time in seven years with a win over Dayton in the first round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament in front of a raucous Bryce Jordan Center crowd. Washington's first appearances in the tournament as a head coach started with a 75-66 win over Dayton.

Washington's first taste of postseason play as a head coach came against Hofstra in the 2010 WNIT. The Lady Lions hosted the contest on the University Park campus, but the Pride got the best of a young Lady Lions squad in the opening round.

During Washington's eight years on the bench, Notre Dame reached the NCAA Tournament each season, including four Sweet Sixteen runs and the 2001 National Championship.

### Trophies & All-Americans

Washington's competitive side shines brightest on the biggest stages and that is a trait that her teams have taken on as well during her tenure on the University Park campus. Washington's teams have advanced out of the first round of the NCAA Tournament in all four of their trips, while earning berths in the Sweet Sixteen twice.

From 2012-14, the Lady Lions claimed three straight Big Ten regular season titles, making them one of just four teams in conference history to win three-or-more regular season titles in a row. Washington's squads took the title outright in 2012 and 2013, while sharing the crown in 2014.

Washington is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2012, 2013 & 2014), a two-time WBCA Region Six Coach of the Year (2012 & 2013) and two-time finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year (2012 & 2013). She was also selected as the 2011 and 2014 Black Coaches Association (BCA) Female Coach of the Year.

On the national awards front, Washington's players have earned a host of national honors from All-America laurels to honors for community service and selflessness. Maggie Lucas finished her Penn State career as one of the most decorated student-athletes to pass through the Lady Lion program. Lucas was a two-time finalist for the Wade Trophy and Wooden Award, while earning nine All-American honors, including first team honors from the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) in 2013 and 2014. She was a three-time AP All-American, garnering second team (2013), third team (2014) and honorable mention (2012) accolades during her career.

Alex Bentley was a two-time All-American, earning AP honorable mention laurels in 2013, and WBCA naming her honorable mention All-America in 2012 and 2013. One of the toughest defenders in the nation and a scoring threat from anywhere on the court, Bentley was the 2013 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winner as the nation's top player under 5-foot-8.

Bentley and Lucas were both named to Freshman All-America teams during their rookie seasons of 2010 and 2011, respectively, while Tyra Grant was Washington's first All-American, garnering honorable mention honors in 2010 from the Associated Press.

On-court accolades are not the only ones celebrated by the Lady Lion program, with Gizelle Studevent and Maggie Lucas each earning national attention for their off-court undertakings, as well. Studevent was a member of the 2013 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team, honoring student-athletes that have made outstanding contributions in the areas of volunteerism and civic involvement. Studevent was the lifeblood of the anti-bullying program Penn State Athletes Take Action (PSATA). Earning a selection to the 2014 Senior CLASS Award All-American Team, Lucas was one of 10 women's basketball student-athletes to be celebrated for the award that is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School.

During her tenure at Notre Dame, Washington coached five All-Americans in her role as the guards coach, and was directly responsible for developing three All-Americans and two Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winners: Niele Ivey and Megan Duffy. Washington also worked with Alicia Ratay, who is the NCAA's career 3-point field goal percentage leader.



**B1G Things Happening**

In nine seasons on the sideline, Washington has seen 15 players earn All-Big Ten laurels on 26 occasions, along with three earning Big Ten All-Freshman Team and Big Ten All-Defensive Team honors. Among the All-Big Ten honorees, four of Washington's pupils account for nine first team selections and Penn State has seen multiple players earn all-conference in eight of her nine seasons on the sideline.

Earning Big Ten Player of the Year on two occasions (2013 & 2014), Maggie Lucas was also the 2011 Big Ten Freshman and Sixth Player of the Year. Lucas joins Alex Bentley as three-time All-Big Ten first team selections under Washington, while Tyra Grant (2009 & 2010) and Ariel Edwards (2014) round out the group of first teamers.

Dara Taylor became the first Lady Lion under Washington to win the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, claiming the award in 2014, while also getting the nod to the All-Defensive Team in 2013. Alex Bentley was also a two-time Big Ten All-Defensive Team choice (2012 & 2013), while Nikki Greene earned her selection to the squad for her shot blocking prowess in 2011.

In 2016, Penn State placed three players on the All-Big Ten team, highlighted by freshman Teniya Page's selection to the All-Big Ten second team. Her second team selection makes her just the third Penn State rookie to earn either first or second team honors at season's end, joining Lucas (2nd Team, 2011) and Kelly Mazzante (1st Team, 2001). Adding to the haul of all-conference honors were Brianna Banks and Lindsey Spann, each earning honorable mention selections.

During Washington's first Big Ten Championship run in 2012, her squad put five players on the All-Big Ten squad. Bentley and Lucas each earned first team honors that season, and Greene, Zhaque Gray and Mia Nickson all noted honorable mention accolades. Both the 2011 and 2014 teams placed four players on the All-B1G squads, with the 2016 team joining the 2008 and 2013 teams that each had three representatives.

Washington is a stout believer is getting her best players on the floor regardless of position or class, with three student-athletes earning a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman squad. Bentley (2010) and Page (2016) were both unanimous all-rookie picks, and Lucas secured a spot on the 2011 list.

The success of her student-athletes isn't confined to the hardwood, as the Lady Lion program has 42 Academic All-Big Ten honorees over her nine seasons. The 2015 squad set a school record with seven honorees on the list, while her 2009 and 2013 teams each saw six honorees for academic success.

**Play to Your Strengths**

Washington's style of play lends itself to being up-tempo and high scoring, which has enabled the program to rise to new heights and return to the national spotlight. As a member of the Big Ten Conference, her teams are playing one of the toughest conference slates in the country, but that doesn't stop Washington from scheduling key non-conference games against the nation's best teams – home and on the road.

In each of Washington's first six years, Penn State improved its Big Ten win total and the Lady Lions posted three consecutive 25-win seasons, joining the 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 squads as the only teams in program history to accomplish the feat.

During Washington's first nine seasons, Penn State has topped ranking opponents in seven of those seasons; winning multiple games against ranked foes during each of those campaigns. Her first season in Happy Valley included wins over No. 20 Pittsburgh and No. 10 Duke. The 2011-12 squad traveled to No. 16/13 Texas A&M for a top-20 showdown with the Aggies and walked away with 63-58 victory to snap a 58-game non-conference home court winning streak for TAMU.

The 2016 squad also had its share of success against ranked opponents, pushing No. 4 Tennessee to the brink in an early season road test, before opening the Big Ten schedule with a 79-72 victory over then-No. 14 Northwestern at the Bryce Jordan Center. Avenging an earlier loss to Michigan State, Penn State traveled to East Lansing and handed the then-No. 15 Spartans a 65-61 defeat in front of a national television audience on the Big Ten Network.

The Penn State record books have also been invaded by Washington's teams and student-athletes.

Teniya Page was a catalyst on the court in 2015-16, as she was the only freshman in the NCAA to average at least 15 points and four assists per game. She became just the third rookie in Penn State history to reach the 400-point and 100-assist mark – and first since Suzie McConnell (1984-85).

After reaching the 10-point mark in each of her first eight career games in 2014-15 – a feat not accomplished by Penn State's top two career scoring leaders – Kelly Mazzante and Maggie Lucas – Lindsey Spann moved her name into elite company on Penn State's 3-point list. Spann enters the season ranked No. 14 on the career charts with 102 shots made from distance.

Maggie Lucas finished her career second in school history and fourth in Big Ten history in scoring (2,510) and broke the Penn State and Big Ten records for career 3-pointers made (365) and career free throw percentage (.907). Lucas left Penn State ranked among the top-five on 25 different single season or career charts.

Nikki Greene became the first player in school history to accumulate 1,000 points, 900 rebounds and 200 blocks, while Alex Bentley is one of only two players (Suzie McConnell) in program history with 1,500 points, 500 assists and 250 steals. Brianne O'Rourke closed out her career as an All-Big Ten performer and left Penn State as one of just six players in school history with 1,000 points and 500 assists.

On the team side of things, the 2013-14 graduating class of Maggie Lucas, Ariel Edwards, Dara Taylor and Talia East produced 101 wins, which are the second-most wins by a senior class in Lady Lion history.

The 2010-11 team was a dominating force from the perimeter as the Lady Lions tied the school record with 228 3-pointers and led the NCAA from deep with a .415 3-point field goal percentage.

**Serving the Community**

Be it on the hardwood, on the golf course, or out on a speaking engagement, Washington is among the most active Penn State coaches in the community. Her annual efforts include Coquese's Drive for the Centre County Women's Resource Center, championing the fight against breast cancer for Penn State Play4Kay game and supporting her team during their many hours of giving back to the Centre region.

One of the first relationships that Washington established in State College was with the Executive Director of the Centre County Women's Resource Center, Ann Ard. The relationship grew quickly, with the focus shifting to helping the local non-profit find a way to raise funds and provide resources in the fight against domestic violence. In its nine years, Coquese's Drive has raised more than \$170,000 to benefit the CCWRC.

While the event that has spread nationally, Penn State women's basketball were trendsetters in spreading awareness for breast cancer by being the first team in the country to wear pink uniforms. Washington has embraced Pink Zone at Penn State and helped it grow into an annual "can't miss" event for survivors and supporters alike. During her tenure, Washington has seen their Play4Kay game grow in both attendance numbers and funds raised. The 698 survivors at the 2014 game are the most in program history, while the \$310,000 raised that year are a benchmark for years to come.

Along with her community involvement, Washington has appointed Miriam Powell as the Director of Community Outreach for the Lady Lion program. Powell has been charged with creating powerful and impactful relationships for the women's basketball program within the Penn State and surrounding communities, through service and volunteerism. This role was created by Washington to make sure the Lady Lions are serving those who spend much of their own time supporting Lady Lion Basketball on the floor and in the classroom.

**The Personal Side**

Washington and her husband, Raynell Brown, have a son, Quenton (11), and a daughter, Rhaiyna (7). Raynell is an Adjunct Professor of Law at Penn State Law School and is a former partner at Hicks & Brown Sports Agency, where he represented athletes in the NFL, FIBA, NBA, and WNBA. They reside in Port Matilda.
