

- D.J. NEWBILL passed both 600 (641) points on the season and 2,000 (2,042) for his career vs. Ohio State March 4. He has led the Big Ten in scoring since the season tipped off, averaging 20.7 ppg to lead all NCAA players from Power 5 conferences and own the No. 7 spot in Division I. He is fourth in Penn State career scoring, after three seasons, and owns two spots in singe-season scoring records. [MORE: 17-18]
- The Nittany Lions earned their 16th win of the season at Minnesota Sunday. They ended the 2013-14 season with 16 wins, making this the first time a PSU team has reached at least 16 wins in back-to-back campaigns since the 2000 and 2001 seasons. [MORE: Page 3]
- In the last four games, there are three players averaging in double figures. Newbill is producing 17.5 ppg with 10+ points of support from GENO THORPE (12.5) and SHEP GARNER (11.3).

THE MATCHUP

SCOUTING NEBRASKA

- The Huskers are 13-17 on the season and finished the Big Ten slate with a 5-13 record after dropping each of their last eight games. They concluded the regular season with a 64-61 setback vs. No. 10 Maryland in Lincoln.
- Nebraska's eight-game skid began with Penn State's 56-43 victory Feb. 7 in the BJC. The three-point loss to the Terps was the closest decision of the stretch with the eight games being decided by an average of 13.3 points.
- Terran Petteway is fourth in the league in scoring with 17.8 ppg on the season. Shavon Shields also is scoring in double-figures with 15.3 ppg and a team-leading 5.9 rebounds per game.

SERIES HISTORY

- The all-time series with Nebraska is tied 5-5 after the Nittany Lions' 56-43 victory Feb. 7 in the Bryce Jordan Center.
- All but three of 10 meetings have taken place once the Huskers were in the Big Ten. Penn State was 2-1 prior to being league foes; 3-4 since.
- Both teams are 4-1 when playing on their respective home courts. This will be the first neutral-site meeting between Penn State and Nebraska. The teams have met once in the postseason with the Lions capturing a 1995 NIT Tournament game in Lincoln, 65-59.
- Three of the last five meetings in the series have been decided by six points or fewer.

LAST TIME VS. THE HUSKERS

UNIVERSITY PARK (Feb. 7, 2015) - Geno Thorpe scored 14 points, Brandon Taylor and D.J. Newbill had 11 as Penn State was able to take advantage of Nebraska's cold shooting to beat the Huskers 56-43. The teams combined for just 35 first-half points before picking up the pace in the second half. Nebraska shot 15 of 51 from the field and just 2 of 20 from 3-point range. Nebraska (13-10, 5-6 Big Ten) trailed by as many as 11 points late in the game but closed to within 44-41 before Penn State (15-9, 3-8) pulled away with just over 3 minutes to play. 14-15 NITTANY LIONS VS. NEBRASKA

Thirteen players on the current roster have seen action against the Huskers, including 11 in the lone regular-season meeting Feb. 7 D.J. Newbill is the leading scorer among current players, averaging 14.4 ppg over five appearances. He scored 17 points in each of the last two games played in Lincoln. Ross Travis is the top rebounder with 4.7 per game through seven career games.

THREE NOTABLE GAMES

Jan. 23, 2014 (PSU, 58-54): Led by D.J. Newbill's 16 points, four Penn State players posted double-figure scoring efforts as the Lions snapped a six-game losing streak with a 58-54 win over Nebraska at the Bryce Jordan Center.

Jan. 11, 2012 (NEB, 70-58) : Tim Frazier tallied a career-high 30 points, but Nebraska used 10-0 and 8-0 runs in the first half to build an early lead and take a 70-58 win for the Cornhuskers' first Big Ten victory.

March 21, 1995 (PSU, 65-59): The Nittany Lions used Rahsaan Carlton's 19 points to top Nebraska 65-59 in the NIT Second Round in Lincoln, Neb. The teams were tied at 36 at halftime, but three Lion players put up double-digits for the win. Penn State went on to finish third in the NIT that year, its second of four trips to Madison Square Garden.

LAST TIME IN THE B1G TOURNEY

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. (March 13, 2014) - D.J. Newbill had 16 points and Tim Frazier added 11 for Penn State, who fell to Minnesota 63-56 in the Big Ten tournament opening round March 13.10th-seeded Penn State (15-17) struggled shooting the ball, making only 32.2 percent from the field. Austin Hollins scored 18 points, Deandre Mathieu added 13 and Andre Hollins hit a late 3-pointer to help Minnesota edge the Nittany Lions. Penn State got within three just before halftime and within 58-54 with 2:35 to go, but Andre Hollins made a free throw and hit the 3 in the final minute to close it out. The Nittany Lions finally roared back late, cutting a 51-38 deficit to 58-54 on two free throws from Brandon Taylor made two free throws with 2:35 to go.

TEAM NOTABLES

16 WINS | With 16 wins, Penn State and head coach Patrick Chambers have reached a victory mark topped just three times in this millennium (21, 2000-01; 27, 2008-09; 19, 2010-11). The Nittany Lions ended the 2013-14 season with 16 wins, making this the first time a PSU team has reached at least 16 wins in back-to-back campaigns since the 2000 and 2001 seasons.

.500 | The Nittany Lions have not fallen below .500 the entire season. They evened out at 15-15 before earning the win at Minnesota for their first regular-season finish above .500 since 2011 and for just the fifth time since 2000.

FINALE VICTORY The win over Minnesota Sunday marked the first season-ending win under head coach Patrick Chambers and the first for the program since 2011 when the Nittany Lions also knocked off Minnesota. Penn State has ended the regular season on a high note just four times in the last 16 seasons (2003, 2008, 2011 and 2015).

LAST FOUR GAMES In the last four games, there are three players are averaging in double figures. D.J. Newbill is producing 17.5 ppg with 10+ points of support from Geno Thorpe (12.5) and Shep Garner (11.3). After seeing his average dip to 6.3 rebounds per game, Ross Travis has been grabbing 7.3 over the last four games, to go with 9.5 ppg (up from season average of 5.1).

LINEUPS | Patrick Chambers has placed eight different starting lineups on the court this season, including a different one in each of the last three games. Four lineup combos have earned a win in their first time on the court, most recently with Shep Garner, D.J. Newbill, Geno Thorpe, Ross Travis and Jordan Dickerson on Sunday at Minnesota.

SCORING DEFENSE | In 12 of 18 Big Ten games, Penn State held its opponent below their season scoring average, including 10 of the last 13. The Nittany Lions limited Nebraska to 43 points Feb. 7, a season-best 20.7 points below their season average of 63.7 points per game on the year.

The Huskers had 13 first-half points in that game, marking the fewest points by an opponent in the opening frame since 12/12/07 when Princeton scored 11. The Nittany Lions held Nebraska without a made field goal for a stretch of 11:16 of game action in the first half. The Huskers' 43 points in the game were the fewest by a PSU opponent this season and the second-lowest scoring output for any team in the Big Ten during league action.

FIELD-GOAL DEFENSE Penn State's opponents are scoring on 40.7 percent of their total shots, a defensive mark which stand as fifth all-time since 1965 (among full-season figures) and the lowest since the 1994-95 campaign (40.5). In league games only, the 43.1 field-goal percentage is tied for second since Penn State joined the Big Ten, while the 67.4 ppg is the sixth-lowest average. [Page 137 of Media Guide]

BLOCK PARTY Penn State now has three players in the Penn State Top 11 in the category. Donovon Jack owns the No. 8 spot (79), while Dickerson own the No. 9 position with 78. Brandon Taylor is close behind at No. 11 with 69 career blocks. Dickerson is averaging 1.4 blocks in his Penn State career, putting up 78 through 56 career games. Jack tallied 53 blocks last season. With 49, Dickerson is one block away from giving Penn State its first back-to-back seasons with a player who produced 50-plus blocks since 2000 and 2001. [MORE: Page 25]

VS. RANKED TEAMS | Penn State has faced a team ranked in the Top 25 at the time of meeting six times this season, falling twice to Wisconsin, Maryland and Ohio State. Five of the Nittany Lions' 2014-15 opponents are currently ranked, or receiving votes, in the AP and/or USA Today polls and nine have been ranked at some point this season.

SHARE THE LOVE | In Penn State's win over Minnesota Jan. 28, nine players saw action and all tallied at least three points. Four players produced or tied career highs in scoring, while the defense posted a season high in steals and helped limit the Gophers to 19.5 points below their season average. [MORE: Page 36]

40 MINUTES | Patrick Chambers said after the Rutgers game Jan. 24 was the first time the Nittany Lions had played 40 full minutes of Penn State basketball. It resulted in 51 percent shooting, a season-high 18 assists, 10 3-pointers and the six-largest win over a Big Ten team in program history. [MORE: Page 36]

ONE-POSSESSION GAMES | Eight games this season have been separated by one possession with Penn State winning the first four in non-conference play before falling in the next three, all to Big Ten teams. The win over Minnesota Sunday was the first victory over a league team by three or fewer points.

FIVE-POINT GAMES | Through 31 games, Penn State has had 13 decided by five points or fewer, winning each of the first six plus both decisions over Minnesota to stand at 8-5. The five losses have been separated by four (Rutgers, Iowa), three (Indiana and Maryland) and two (Illinois) points. Last season, the Lions were 4-8 in regular-season games decided by the same margin.

SINGLE-DIGIT SEPARATION Twelve of Penn State's 18 Big Ten games were decided by single digits, tied for the second-most of any league team behind Purdue (13). On the season, 21 overall games have been decided by nine or fewer points (10-11).

BENCH MOB | The PSU bench - which has dubbed itself the Bench Mob - is averaging 18.9 ppg this season, up from 14.7 ppg last season, and has outscored the opponent's bench in 15 games. Reserve players have combined to score more than 30 points in four games this season: Duquesne (35), Michigan (33), Marshall (32) and Dartmouth (31). [MORE: Page 28]

WIN STREAK | Wisconsin snapped Penn State's 10-game winning streak in the league opener Dec. 31, which was the longest for a PSU team since the 1995-96 squad opened the year going 13-0.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS | The 12 non-conference wins were the most for the Nittany Lions in program history, breaking the previous high of 11 set during the 2008-09 season. In the Big Ten era, Penn State was undefeated in conference play in 1995-96 (9-0) and had one-loss seasons in 2000-01 (9-1) and 1994-95 (8-1).

CHARLESTON CLASSIC | The two wins at the Charleston Classic stand as the first multi-win performance at a neutral-site, regular-season tournament for Penn State since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic.



PLAYER SPOTLIGHTS

D.J. NEWBILL

- Has likely topped out in the No. 4 spot in career scoring at Penn State (1,749) in just three seasons, needing 237 points to hit the No. 3 spot (1,986; Joe Crispin, 1998-2001).
- Reached 500 points on the season vs. Nebraska (641) -- only one other player PSU all-time leading scorer Talor Battle -- has reached 500 points three seasons in a row.
- Passed 600-point mark vs. Ohio State (641), becoming the third PSU to tally at least 600 points twice in a career, joining Battle and Joe Crispin. There have been six players, Newbill included, to score at least 600 points in a season a total of eight times in PSU history.
- Owns two of the Top 10 single-season scoring outputs, with this season's 641 jumping up to No. 6 all-time. The 604 points from his junior season now sitting in eighth.
- Passed 2,000 career points (including freshman season at Southern Miss) and now has 2,042. There are only 11 active NCAA Division I players with 2,000 or more points; Newbill has the 10th-most points of any active DI player and the most of any current Big Ten player.

Newbill is averaging 20.7 ppg, tops in Division I among Power 5 conferences and seventh overall in Division I. It also is the fifth-highest season scoring average all-time at Penn State, among full-season figures, and is the greatest clip since 1963. He is averaging 18.2 ppg over his three seasons with Penn State, a career scoring average which is second all-time, behind only Jesse Arnelle (1952-55; 21.0 ppg; 2,138 points). [MORE: Pages 21, 29]

Off the court, Newbill was named one of 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to the one four-year student-athlete with exceptional accomplishments in all four areas of classroom, community, character and competition. Fans can vote once a day, every day from now until March 25. Newbill is one of just two players from the Big Ten among the candidate pool, joining Wisconsin's Frank Kaminsky. ROSS TRAVIS | moved into No. 3 in all-time career rebounds at Penn State after pulling down a team-high eight against Wisconsin (2/18). He now has 797 after leading the team in 17 games this season. He would need 115 to match Mike Lang (1980-83) for second place. Travis is the first player since John Amaechi (1993-95) to lead the team in rebounding in three-consecutive seasons. He is in the Top 35 of active Division I players in total boards and is third among Big Ten players, trailing only Aaron White (lowa) and Branden Dawson (Michigan State). [More: Page 25, 29]

GENO THORPE | is second on the team in scoring over the course of the last four games, averaging 12.5 ppg in that stretch. He also is tied for third in both rebounding and assists, beginning at Northwestern. Thorpe is shooting 39 percent from the field and hitting 78 percent of free throws.

He is the only player other than D.J. Newbill to lead the team in scoring multiple times this season, doing so three times. [MORE: Page 31] Thorpe leads the team and is second in the Big Ten with 86 percent free-throw shooting. He is 86-100 from the line overall and 37-42 (88 percent) in league action. [MORE: Page 24]

SHEP GARNER | is third on the team in scoring (9.1 ppg) after averaging 11.3 ppg over the last four games. He also is second in assists (2.4 apg) as a freshman. In the last seven games, Garner has dished out 15 assists with just four turnovers, a ratio of 3.8 (compared to 1.6 on the season).[More: Page 16]

JORDAN DICKERSON | has blocked multiple shots in eight of the last 11 games and 16 times this season. 

SEASON NOTES

PENN STATE AND THE BIG TEN TAKE NYC

The Big Ten Conference announced a four-year men's basketball and men's hockey doubleheader series in Madison Square Garden, set to begin in 2016 with Penn State vs. Michigan Jan. 30. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

Additionally, the 2018 Big Ten Tournament will take place in MSG, scheduled for Feb. 28-March 4 with all 14 conference programs competing for the Big Ten's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. The 2018 event will be held one week earlier than previous tournaments, ending seven days before NCAA Tournament Selection Sunday.

THROWBACK UNIS

Penn State wore new throwback uniforms at Bucknell Nov. 28 and. vs. Virginia Tech Dec. 3, going 2-0. The unis are black and pink, honoring the school's original school colors established in 1887. The color pairing lasted just 2.5 years. Problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new choice was made on March 18, 1890.

PLAYER LEADERSHIP

The team elected four captains prior to the start of the season -- D.J. Newbill, who is in his third season as a captain, along with two-time captain Ross Travis, Brandon Taylor and Kevin Montminy. Those four, along with Alan Wisniewski, make up Patrick Chambers' Leadership Council, which the staff relies on for decision making, providing guidance and helping everyone be the best possible teammate.

ROOKIES TO MAKE IMPACT

Three new faces join the veteran core of Nittany Lions. Devin Foster, a junior college transfer, along with freshmen Shep Garner and Isaiah Washington as Penn State rookies. Garner (Chester, Pa.) and Washington (Williamsport, Pa.) bring the number of Pennsylvania natives on the roster to eight, including four from the Philadelphia area.

MONTMINY EARNS SCHOLARSHIP

Kevin Montminy was awarded a scholarship for the 2014-15 season, Patrick Chambers announced in early August. A three-year walk-on, Montminy has seen action in 40 career games over the last three seasons with 24 total points and 10 rebounds. With a 4.0 grade-point average in each of the last five semesters, Montminy is a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, Academic All-Big Ten honoree and the team's Academic Award recipient.

CHARLESTON CLASSIC

The Nittany Lions are slated to take part in the 2014 Charleston Classic, Nov. 20-23 in Charleston, S.C. They will open play in the tourney by taking on Charlotte at 5 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 20 on ESPNU and then will face either South Carolina or Cornell on the second day of the three-day event. The remaining teams in the field include Akron, Drexel, Miami (Fla.), and Southern California.

OFFSEASON TRAINING


The Nittany Lions made headlines with their extensive offseason-training regimen. Strength coach Brandon Spayd designed a three-part workout challenge for team members called the Yoke Zone Challenge. Players pushed cars, crawled through sandpits and completed a number of demanding stations in an obstacle course setting. Kevin Montminy and Jordan Dickerson were the top pair among players completed the entire course each week. Patrick Chambers and his staff also brought in The Program, a leadership development and team building program created and executed by former military personnel. Players completed two days of extensive mental and physical tasks designed to build better leaders and more cohesive teams.

CHAMBERS ADDS ANOTHER FORMER PLAYER TO STAFF

D.J. Irving, a four-year member of the men's basketball team at Boston University, joined the Penn State staff as a graduate manager for the 2014-15 season. He replaced Andrew Jones, who is an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Thunder's D-League team. Irving is the fourth player coached by Chambers to join his staff. Assistant coach Dwayne Anderson and Ross Condon, director of operations, both played at Villanova with Chambers as an assistant and associate head coach. Irving came into the fold at Boston University and fellow PSU graduate manager Nicholas Colella played two seasons for Chambers as a Lion.

PENN STATE IN 119TH SEASON

Penn State is competing in its 119th season on the hardwood and its 23rd as a member of the Big Ten conference. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule for the third year in a row. The Lions have made 13 postseason appearances in the last 26 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.



Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

SCORING

D.J. Newbill has 1,718 points in his third and final season wearing the Blue and White and ranks No. 4 all-time in career scoring. He also holds the record for scoring among three-year players, passing John Amaechi's 1,310 points with 17 at Marshall Dec. 6.

Newbill passed the 500-point season mark vs. Nebraska (574), becoming just the second person in PSU history to do so in three-consecutive seasons, joining Talor Battle.

He then passed the 600-point plateau vs. Ohio State (610) and became the third PSU player to reach 600 points twice in his career, joining Talor Battle and Joe Crispin.

REBOUNDS

Ross Travis, who has led the Nittany Lions in rebounding each of the last three seasons and is among the top returning rebounders in the Big Ten, has 791 on his career and owns the No. 3 spot. Travis is the first player since John Amaechi (1993-95) to lead the team in rebounding in three-consecutive seasons.

BLOCKS

Donovon Jack entered Penn State's Top 10 with one block vs. Fordham (11/16). He is now ranked No. 8 and has 78 with all but three coming after his freshman season. His 54 blocks as a sophomore are the eighth-most in a single season and the most since the 1998-99 season. Only Calvin Booth, who owns positions 1-4, and John Amaechi (spots 5-7) rank above Jack.

Jordan Dickerson owns the No. 9 spot after producing multiple blocks in 16 games this season, including eight of the last 10 games. He has 48 blocks this season, good for 10th on the single-season charts, and is averaging 1.6 per game, which ranks seventh in the Big Ten. Last season, Dickerson produced 29 blocks in the 22 games he was eligible to compete last season, an average of 1.3 per game. That average would have placed him among the Top 10 in the Big Ten last season had he reached the minimum number of games to be ranked.

Brandon Taylor moved to No. 11 at Penn State with 69 career blocks. He is third on the team this season with 20 (0.7 per game).

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Behind a trio of double-digit scorers, Penn State men's basketball (1-0) earned a 61-48 season-opening victory against Morgan State (0-1) Friday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. Senior D.J. Newbill (Philadelphia, Pa.) scored 17 points, while freshman Shep Garner (Chester, Pa.) added 14.

Morgan State was led by Cedric Blossom's 10 points and Blake Bozeman's 9. The Bears shot just 18 of 58 from the field and were only 3 of 18 on their 3-point attempts.

Tied at 4-4 in the opening half, Morgan State used a 12-4 run to go up by as many as eight, 16-8, with 9:41 remaining in the frame. Penn State rallied back with a 12-2 stretch to lift the Nittany Lions on top, 21-18, with six minutes left in the period. The Bears answered with a 5-2 strike to keep the frame knotted, 23-23, but PSU regrouped with an 8-2 run to go up by as many as six, 31-25, heading into the intermission.

Garner came out firing to start the second half with his first 3-pointer for a nine-point Penn State lead. Bolstering the lead to as many as 16 in the second half, the Nittany Lions did not let the advantage dip below 10 as PSU powered to a 61-48 win.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State has now won its last 10 season openers. Having not lost a season-opening contest since 2004, the win also marks the fourth consecutive for head coach Patrick Chambers.
- · Penn State moves to 89-30 all-time in season openers and 79-10 in yearly home openers.
- The Nittany Lions improve their advantage to 5-0 in all-time series against Morgan State.
- Penn State moves to 13-1 all-time against current squads in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.
- Shep Garner made his first collegiate start for the Nittany Lions against Morgan State. Garner is the first true freshman to start in a season opener since Trey Lewis in 2011, who made his rookie debut for the Nittany Lions Nov. 12, 2011 vs. Hartford. Both Garner (14) and Lewis (17) recorded double figure scoring in their debut outings for PSU.
- D.J. Newbill hit the court for his 66th consecutive start in the Blue and White, as he's started every single contest since arriving on campus as a sophomore transfer.
- With 17 points, Newbill recorded his 10th consecutive double-digit scoring outing, having posted double figures in every game since notching 22 against Iowa Feb. 15, 2014.
- With 1,125 career points, Newbill needs just 14 more points to move to No. 20 on the Penn State all-time career scoring list.
- Geno Thorpe set a career-high mark with 11 points against Morgan State breaking his previous high (9) that he set last season against Ohio State (2/27/14).

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Four Nittany Lions scored in double figures as Penn State men's basketball (2-0) powered to a 73-54 victory against Fordham (1-1) Sunday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. Senior D.J. Newbill scored 18 points, freshman Shep Garner added 12 on four 3-pointers, junior Brandon Taylor and senior John Johnson each scored 11 as the Nittany Lions sank 25 of 53 field-goal attempts and seven of 18 3-pointers. The Lions held the Rams to 17of-55 shooting, including just 8-of-26 3-pointers.

Nemania Zarkovic scored 14 points for Fordham and Chris Sengfelder added 10.

The Nittany Lions won the rebounding battle (40-37) and held the Rams' Eric Paschall to just seven points. Paschall, who scored 31 against New York Institute of Technology Friday night, fouled out with 12:56 remaining. Senior Ross Travis had nine rebounds and eight points.

Tied up at 10-10 in the first half after some early back-and-forth action, senior John Johnson sparked a 6-0 run with a three-point play that lifted the Nittany Lions ahead by as many as six, 16-10. The Rams cut off the streak with a free throw, but Penn State surged ahead with eight more unanswered points capped off with a dunk by Newbill to stretch the advantage to double-digits, 24-11.

POSTGAME NOTES

- PSU limited Fordham to 29.3 percent shooting from the field marking the first time that the Nittany Lions have held a team to less than 30 percent from the field since Dec. 23, 2012 against New Hampshire (22.6%).
- · Four Nittany Lions recorded double-figure scoring in the win including, D.J. Newbill (18), Shep Garner (12), John Johnson (11) and Brandon Taylor (11).
- Penn State's four-guard rotation of Newbill, Garner, Thorpe and Johnson combined for 62 percent of the Nittany Lions' offense scoring 45 of 73 total points.
- The Penn State victory extended the Nittany Lion winning streak to six straight when playing on Nov. 16, as PSU moved to 7-1 all-time on the day.
- Penn State improved to 3-2 in the all-time series against the Rams in the first meeting between the two teams since 1973. The Nittany Lions also move to 1-1 at home in the series against Fordham.
- The Nittany Lions move to 113-77 all-time against Atlantic 10 teams. Penn State has two games remaining against A-10 opponents including Duquesne (Dec. 10) and George Washington (Dec. 14).

CHARLESTON, S.C. (AP) - Led by a career-high 35 points from senior D.J. Newbill, Penn State men's basketball (2-1) fell short in a 106-97, double overtime loss to Charlotte (2-0) on the road in the Charleston Classic Thursday evening at TD Arena. The Nittany Lions rallied back from behind by as many as 17 points in the second half to send the game into two overtimes.

Four Nittany Lions posted double digit scoring, led by Newbill's career-high mark. Newbill is the first Nittany Lion to notch 35 points since Pete Lisicky put up the tally against Penn in 1996. Junior Brandon Taylor finished second on the squad with 19 points, including 11 in the first half.

Sophomore Geno Thorpe finished third on the team with a career-high 14 points, while freshman Shep Garner rounded out the group with 12 points. Senior Ross Travis and Taylor led the team with nine rebounds apiece.

This one looked like a runaway with Charlotte up 63-46 with 11:46 left in regulation. But Penn State used a 37-20 run to the buzzer and tied the game on senior John Johnson's 3-pointer with 1.6 seconds left.

Penn State had a chance to win in the first overtime, but Newbill's drive to the basket with the game tied at 90-all was blocked by Cameron Blakley. Ogbueze got the 49ers going in the second extra session. Thorne added two foul shots and a jam and Charlotte was up 97-93.

- · Penn State erased a 17-point deficit in the second half to force the game into overtime (83-83) with a clutch three-pointer from John Johnson with two seconds remaining.
- A second overtime was forced (90-90), marking the first double-overtime game for Penn State since March 7, 2009 vs. Iowa (Iowa, 75-67).
- · With a career-high 35 points, senior D.J. Newbill notched his first career 30-point game. The 35 points stand as the most by a Penn State player since Joe Crispin tallied 35 vs. Iowa Jan. 6, 2001.
- · Newbill used 33 field-goal attempts in the process, the second-most in program history behind only Gene Harris' 37 vs. Holy Cross in 1962
- · Newbill has 1,178 career points, which vaults him into 19th place on the Penn State all-time list. He needs just six more points to match Ron Brown (1972-74) for 18th all-time.
- · Sophomore Geno Thorpe finished third on the team with a career-high 14 points, marking the second time this season he's reach double figure scoring.
- · Senior John Johnson scored his only three points of the game with a clutch 3-pointer with two seconds remaining in regulation to send the contest into overtime.

Charleston, S.C. (AP) - D.J. Newbill had 26 points including the driving layup as the buzzer sounded to lift Penn State to a 72-71 victory over Cornell at the Charleston Classic on Friday night.

The Big Red (2-3) were up 71-70 with four seconds left but threw the inbounds pass into the backcourt to beat the five-second clock. Geno Thorpe picked it up and passed to Newbill on the left side. Newbill dribbled the baseline and went up for the winning shot before time ran out.

It was the first lead for Penn State (3-1) since going up 4-2 less than three minutes into the game.

John Johnson had 17 points, including a high arcing 3-pointer with 4.5 seconds left that drew the Nittany Lions to 71-70.

Galal Cancer and Robert Hatter had 17 points each for Cornell, which faces Drexel for seventh place game Sunday.

It was a dramatic change of fortune for the Nittany Lions in Charleston. They rallied from 17 points down against Charlotte on Thursday night only to fall 106-97 in double overtime.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State trailed by as many as 13 before erasing an 11-point second-half deficit to earn the win with a buzzer-beating layup from D.J. Newbill.
- The 13-point deficit is the largest comeback for a win since the Nittany Lions overcame a 13-point disadvantage to defeat Indiana on the road, 66-65, Feb. 12, 2014.
- Penn State led for all of :07 in the entire contest. The game-winning bucket was its first advantage since the 17:38 mark in the first half.
- The game featured seven ties and three lead changes. Cornell led for 32:39 of the game
- Penn State moves to 6-5 all-time against the Big Red, while head coach Patrick Chambers moves to 3-0 against Cornell in his career at both Penn State and Boston University.
- With 26 points, D.J. Newbill recorded his second-consecutive 20-plus point outing this season and 22nd of his career.
- Newbill tallied 15 first-half points going 3-3 from 3-point range and 4-8 from the field. He finished the evening 4-5 from the 3-point line.
- John Johnson set a season-high mark with 17 points, shooting 6-9 from the field and 4-4 from the free-throw line.
- Thirteen of Johnson's 17 points came in the second half, including a 3-pointer with :04 on the clock to make it a one-point game, 71-70

Charleston, S.C. (AP) - If Penn State wanted to close the Charleston Classic with a victory, coach Pat Chambers knew D.J. Newbill would have to make the biggest plays.

Newbill came through with 16 of his 22 points in the second half in the Nittany Lions' 63-61 win over Southern Cal in Sunday's fifth place game. He finished the three games with 83 points to set the tournament scoring mark, surpassing the 78 scored by St. Joseph's Carl Jones in 2011.

Penn State opened 4-1 for the third time in Chambers' four seasons.

After the Trojans (2-3) built a 49-43 lead with just under 10 minutes left, Newbill scored 10 of Penn State's next 13 points in their go-ahead run. His second 3-pointer put the Nittany Lions ahead to stay at 56-54.

Southern Cal was still within 62-60 on Jordan McLaughlin's foul shot with 1.3 seconds left. But Shep Garner made a foul shot with 0.7 seconds left to provide the final point.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The two wins at the 2014 Charleston Classic mark the first time Penn State has won at least two games at a neutral site tournament since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic at Madison Square Garden. The Nittany Lions knocked off Princeton, 65-52, Dec. 26 and Hofstra, 74-71, Dec. 27 before going on to the NCAA Sweet 16 that season.
- The Nittany Lions limited the Trojans to 27.3 percent from the field marking the second time this season Penn State has held a team to less than 30 percent from the field.
- PSU matched a season-high mark with seven team 3-pointers, marking the second-consecutive game the Nittany Lions have reached the mark.
- The Nittany Lions did not attempt a free-throw until the 7:57 mark of the second half. USC had a 22-0 advantage in free-throw attempts to that point and finished with a 27-10 margin.
- With 83 points across all three games of the Charleston Classic, D.J. Newbill now holds the scoring record for the most points in tournament history. The previous record was held by Saint Joseph's Carl Jones (2011) with 78 points.
- Newbill averaged 27.7 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.3 steals over the last three games, while shooting 50 percent from 3-point range, 47 percent from the field and 85 percent from the free-throw line.
- Shep Garner registered 12 points in the first half, shooting 4-5 from both the field and 3-point range. He concluded the night ranked second on the team in scoring with 13 points.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) -- Patrick Chambers made it clear to his Penn State players that their first 20 minutes of play against Akron Tuesday night were not acceptable.

His players made it clear in the second half that they heard him. D.J. Newbill scored 29 points, Penn State outscored Akron by 19 points in the second half and the Nittany Lions defeated the Zips 78-72.

Brandon Taylor was 4 of 11 from 3-point range and added 14 for the Lions, who trailed 45-32 at the half. Geno Thorpe scored 10 points. Penn State (5-1) opened the second half by holding Akron (3-2) scoreless for 6:19 and built a 47-45 lead off a 15-0 run.

Deji Ibitayo scored 17 points and Noah Robotham 16 for the Zips, but Akron's second-half shooting woes opened the door for the Nittany Lions.

The Zips, who shot 58.6 percent from the field in the first half, went 6 of 29 in the second (21.2 percent). Penn State was 14 of 22 and shot 45.6 percent overall.

The Lions also got four blocked shots from Jordan Dickerson and three more from Taylor as Penn State increased its pressure on Akron around the rim.

- Penn State trailed 45-32 at the half, but came out of the break scoring 16 unanswered points and took a 48-45 lead with 13:55 left in regulation.
- The game featured three ties and three lead changes with Penn State taking the lead for good with 8:56 to play (56-54).
- After allowing Akron to shoot 17-of-29 (58.6 percent) in the first half, the Nittany Lions held the Zips to 7-of-33 (21.2 percent) shooting in the second half.
- The Nittany Lions have battled back from deficits of 14 (Akron), 6 (Southern California) and 13 (Cornell) in its three-game winning streak.
- Penn State had a 46-27 advantage in the second half. The Lions are outscoring opponents 236-191 (+45) in the second frame through six games this season, opposed to being outscored 198-194 (-4) in the first period.

Lewisburg, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill had 28 points and Penn State pulled away late for an 88-80 victory over Bucknell on Friday. The Nittany Lions (6-1) never trailed but never led by more than 12.

Bucknell (2-5) tied the game once, at 66-all, with 6:19 to play. Penn State answered with a 12-4 run and held steady from there with Newbill scoring six of the Nittany Lions' last 10 points to secure the win.

Ross Travis added 14 points, and Brandon Taylor and Geno Thorpe had 12 apiece. Penn State was 8 of 15 from 3-point range and 30 of 54 from the field.

The Bison used a 16-6 run to pull even late in the second half, but Chris Hass and John Azzinaro turned the ball over on consecutive possessions to halt the momentum.

Haas cut the deficit to 83-78 on a 3-poiner with 1:07 left and the Bison would get no closer. Penn State led 39-33 at halftime, and Newbill scored 21 of his 28 in the second half. Taylor's 3-pointer with 6:18 left in the first half gave Penn State its largest lead at 31-19. The Bison answered with nine straight points.

POSTGAME NOTES

- With the 88-80 win on the road at Bucknell, Penn State improves to 6-1on the year, marking the second consecutive year PSU has opened the year with a 6-1 mark under head coach Patrick Chambers.
- The Nittany Lions are 3-1 away from the Bryce Jordan Center and 1-0 after their first true road game. The team has won their first true away game in each of the last two seasons.
- · The win also extends the current Nittany Lion winning streak to four straight, marking the third consecutive season PSU has put together a four-game winning streak.
- The Nittany Lions went 30-54 from the field for a season-high 56 percent mark in the win. Penn State also made 20 of 26 attempts from the free throw line for a season-high 77 percent from the charity stripe.
- In the first half alone, Penn State shot 86 percent from the 3-point line, nailing six three's, while also shooting 54 percent from the field in the opening half.
- Penn State made eight 3-pointers for a season-high mark during requlation games. Eight treys also marks the fourth-consecutive game the Nittany Lions have netted at least seven 3's. Penn State finished the night 8-15 (53%) from 3-point range marking the first time PSU has shot 50 percent from three since 2/27/13 against Michigan (10-20, 50%).
- · Ross Travis set a season-high in scoring with 14 points, finishing the evening 6-7 from the field. He reached the mark early in the first half with 12 points, shooting 5-5 from the field and 2-2 from three-point range heading into the intermission.
- D.J. Newbill had a game-high 28 points for his fifth-consecutive 20-plus scoring outing and 25th of his career.
- With 1,283 career points, Newbill moves up to No. 16 on the Penn State all-time scoring list, passing Dan Earl (1993-99). He needs just five more points to match Calvin Booth (1995-1999) for No. 15th all-time.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Patrick Chambers was eager to point out that Penn State's defense played a huge role in the Nittany Lions' 61-58 ACC-Big Ten Challenge victory over Virginia Tech Wednesday night. D.J. Newbill scored 18 points and Shep Garner added 13 for Penn State (7-1), but the Lions crafted a 47-38 edge in rebounding. They were led by 10 from Ross Travis, eight from Jordan Dickerson and seven each from Brandon Taylor and Donovon Jack.

Penn State limited the Hokies (4-3) to 38.5 percent shooting from the field and 28.6 from 3-point range during the back-andforth game in which a 16-2 second-half run turned momentum in Penn State's favor. It was the fourth one-possession game Penn State has played this season.

Joey van Zegeren scored 18 points for the Hokies and Justin Bibbs added 16. But Tech hit only 4 of 14 free throws and 4 of 14 3-pointers. The Hokies (4-3) led by as many as eight points early in the second half but Penn State's Newbill scored 13 second-half points after a 1-of-5 first-half shooting performance.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Penn State victory extends the Nittany Lions winning streak to five in a row, putting PSU out to its best start (7-1) under head coach Patrick Chambers and for the program since the 2008-09 campaign.
- · Eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points in the win, led by D.J. Newbill and Shep Garner, who each recorded double figure scorina.
- · Powered by a 16-2 run in the second half, Penn State came from behind by as many eight, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have come back from down by more than six to win (14 vs. Akron, 6 vs. USC and 13 vs. Cornell).
- Penn State trailed by as many as seven in the first half (17-10, 10:38), before closing out the opening frame with nine unanswered points to enter the intermission with a three-point lead, 30-27.
- Penn State out-rebounded Virginia Tech 47-38, posting a season-high mark on the boards and the most since Dec. 7, 2013 vs. Marshall.
- · Penn State wore its throwback uniform for the second time this season, improving to 2-0. The pink and black jerseys honor the original schools colors of the University, which were established in 1887.
- · Penn State moves to 6-8 in its 14th Challenge appearance, winning its first since 2011.
- With 1,301 career points, Newbill moves into the No. 15 spot on the Penn State all-time scoring list. He needs nine more points to match John Amaechi (1,310; 1993-95) for No. 14 and for the record among players to spend just three years of action at Penn State.

HUNTINGTON, W. Va. (AP) - D.J. Newbill, John Johnson and Brandon Taylor each scored 17 points, leading Penn State to a 73-69 win over Marshall on Saturday night. Penn State (8-1) is off to its best start since going 9-1 in the 2000-01 season. Newbill added seven rebounds with four assists and Ross Travis grabbed nine boards.

The Nittany Lions opened the second half with a quick 6-0 run, pushing their lead to 13 after Newbill's three-point play and a split pair of free throws from Jordan Dickerson. Marshall stormed back to pull within one after Jay Johnson's free throws with 1:12 left. Donovan Jack followed with a putback and hit two free throws after Johnson's missed 3-pointer to withstand the rally.

Johnson led Marshall with 19 points. Tamron Manning scored 12 while Ryan Taylor and Aleksa Nikolic had 10 points apiece.

- The Nittany Lions improved to 8-1 on the season with the win over Marshall, securing the program's best start since the 2000-01 Sweet 16 season.
- · Penn State has now won six-consecutive games, its longest streak since the 2007-08 campaign. The six-game streak is the longest active winning stretch among all 14 Big Ten teams.
- Penn State has won two true road games in 2014-15 and is 4-1 in games played away from the Bryce Jordan Center.
- The Lions have played in four games decided by five points or fewer so far this season, winning all of them.
- The Lions are 6-0 when leading at the half and with 5:00 remaining on the clock this season.
- D.J. Newbill, Brandon Taylor and John Johnson all tallied 17 points in the win. It is the fourth time this season three players have scored in double-figures.
- Payton Banks hit his first FG of his Penn State career, a 3-pointer at the 6:37 mark of the first half to give the Lions a 19-17 lead. The team would not trail again.

- The Penn State bench produced a season-high 32 points, led by Johnson's 17. All 10 players to see action for PSU tallied at least one point.
- With 17 points, D.J. UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Penn State has gotten off to its best start in more than a decade because it's been able to finish.

The Nittany Lions took the lead late in the first half and never trailed in the second en route to a 64-62 victory over Duquesne Wednesday night. Their seventh straight victory is the longest streak since 2007-08 and is the longest active streak among Big Ten teams.

Geno Thorpe scored a career-high 19 points, freshman Shep Garner added 13 and Penn State upped its record to 9-1, its best start since the Lions' 2000-01 Sweet 16 season.

The Dukes (3-3), who were led by 18 points from Jordan Stevens and 11 from TySean Powell, took a potential game-winning shot at the final buzzer, but Micah Mason's 3-pointer fell short.


D.J. Newbill and Donovon Jack each added 11 for Penn State. and Jack made good on four free throws in the final two minutes.

Penn State, after a 5-of-10 first-half performance at the free throw line, sank 15 of 18 in the final 20 minutes. Penn State led by 10 early in the second half but Powell and Stevens teamed up for an 8-2 Duguesne run to close to 46-42, and Duguesne got to within 52-51 when Darius Lewis made good on a three-point play. POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State matches its best start, 9-1, since the 2000-01 team also started 9-1. That team finished 21-12 and made an appearance in the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen
- · Penn State has now won seven straight games, its most since winning seven in a row in 2007-08 and the longest active streak among Big Ten teams.
- The Lions have had five games decided by five or fewer points and four by just one possession. They have won all of them this season and have been victorious in each of their last seven games decided by three or fewer points, dating back to last season.
- The Nittany Lions held Duquesne to just 4-of-19 from beyond the arc (21.1 percent). The Dukes came into the game shooting 45.8 percent collectively from 3-point range.
- The 35 bench points for Penn State are the most since posting 44 vs. Central Connecticut State on Nov. 22, 2010.
- The Nittany Lions, who led by just one (29-28) at the midpoint, started the second half on an 11-2 run to take a 40-30 lead at the 15:59 mark in the second half.
- Penn State improved to 27-19 all-time against Duquesne.
- Geno Thorpe scored 19 points, a career high. His previous best was 14 against Charlotte on Nov. 20, 2014.
- Shep Garner had 13 points in the game and has now scored in double figures seven times in 10 games this season.
- · Garner posted four assists, tying his personal best, which he also did at Marshall (Dec. 6, 2014).

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - A solid defensive effort enabled Penn State to inch closer to its coach's season-long goal of playing a complete, 40-minute game on Sunday. DJ. Newbill scored 20 points, Brandon Taylor added 17, and Penn State defeated GW 64-51 for its eighth straight win. The Nittany Lions (10-1), who also got 10 points from Shep Garner, shot 38.7 percent (18 of 53) from the field and were 9 of 9 from the free throw line. But six blocks from Jordan Dickerson - out of 11 total blocks - and 10 rebounds from Ross Travis helped shut down a Colonials team that averaged nearly 74 points per game.

George Washington (6-3), which was led by 15 points each from Kevin Larsen and Patricio Garino, consistently shot from under the basket but made good on only 18 of 53 shots for 34 percent. The Colonials failed to score on eight 3-point shots and were just 15 of 23 from the free throw line.

Penn State's start is its best since the 1995-96 team jumped to a 13-0 record and ultimately advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The Nittany Lions outrebounded GW 40-35. Its 16 offensive rebounds, many of which came late in the second half, enabled Penn State to kick the ball out to the backcourt and kill time while holding leads that ranged from 10 to 15 points down the stretch.

POSTGAME NOTES

- · Penn State extends its winning streak to eight in a row with the win against George Washington to move to 10-1 on the year, marking the best start for the Nittany Lions since the 1995-96 season. The streak also is the longest for the Nittany Lions since the 1995-96 season (13).
- · Having posted wins in its last eight non-conference games, Penn State's 10 non-conference wins are also the most for PSU since the 2008-09 season (11).
- PSU's eight-game winning stretch is the longest among all 14 Big Ten teams.
- The Nittany Lions registered a season-high mark with 11 blocks in the win, marking the most for PSU since posting 13 against Duguesne in 2013.
- · Penn State grabbed a season-high 16 offensive rebounds, posting a 40-35 advantage against GW on the glass.

ALLENTOWN, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 20 points, Brandon Taylor had 14 and 11 rebounds and Penn State won its ninthstraight game 73-68 over Drexel on Saturday at the PPL Center.

The Nittany Lions (11-1) made 7 of 8 free throws in the final minute to hold off the Dragons (2-8), who lost their fourth straight. Tavon Allen had 15 points for Drexel with Sammy Mojica adding 14 off the bench, Damion Lee getting 13 and Mohamed Bah 10.

Penn State led 58-38 on a Newbill jumper with 7:23 left before Drexel made a final run. Allen hit the first of two straight 3-pointers at 6:58 and Freddie Wilson followed with a third to fuel a 15-0 run that cut it to 58-53 with 4:13 left.

Newbill hit two free throws, Donovon Jack had a tip-in and the Dragons never got closer until a 3 by Rashann London with 1 second left.

The Dragons got within 40-35 early in the second half before a Newbill layup and four free throws pushed Penn State ahead 46-35. That was the start of a 14-1 run that gave Penn State a 55-36 lead with nine minutes left.

Penn State finished 20 of 27 from the foul line to 12 of 19 for the Dragons, who shot 40 percent from the field while the Nittany Lions were at 49 percent. The rebounding battle was even but Drexel had an 11-5 advantage in offensive boards.

- The Nittany Lions improve to 11-1 on the season, continuing their best start since the 1995-96 season (13-0) and extending their winning streak to nine games.
- The 11 non-conference wins tie the program record set in the 2008-09 season (11-2).
- The nine-game win streak is the longest since the 13-0 start to the 1995-96 season and is the longest active streak among all Big Ten teams.
- · Penn State is the first Big Ten team to 11 wins and stands atop the standings with a 91.7 win percentage.
- As a team, Penn State shot 48.9 percent from the field, its second-highest showing this season (55.6 vs. Bucknell).
- Drexel attempted 47 field goals, a season low by a Penn State opponent.
- The Dragons' Damion Lee entered the game averaging 20.7 points per game, but was held to 13 points (4 in first half) on 33 percent shooting (3-15)
- Penn State has had six games decided by five or fewer points this season. It has won all of them after going 4-8 in similar games a year ago.
- The Nittany Lions improve to 5-0 all-time vs. Drexel with a win in the first meeting between the teams since 1992. It was the first neutral-site meeting in the series.
- · Brandon Taylor finished with 14 points and 11 rebounds for his first career double-double and the first for a PSU player this season. The 11 rebounds are a career high.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 17 points, Geno Thorpe added 12 and Penn State defeated Dartmouth 69-49 Monday for its 10th straight win and a school-record 12th non-conference victory.

John Johnson and Brandon Taylor each added 10 points for Penn State (12-1), which held Dartmouth to 19 of 54 from the field and 2 of 20 from 3-point range. The Nittany Lions shot 47 percent from the field and had a 38-30 edge in rebounding. Alex Mitola had 13 points and Gabas Maldunas had nine to lead Dartmouth (5-6).

Dartmouth opened the second half with more energy, outscoring the Lions 15-11 over the initial 7 1/2 minutes. But the Big Green struggled to stay consistent and remained cold from long range as well as at the foul line. Penn State led by 25 with 10:30 remaining but Maldunas was good on four free throws and Malik Gill lobbed a pass over the basket that Wesley Dickinson slammed through to close Dartmouth's deficit to 60-42. Newbill followed with a driving layup, got the ball from Ross Travis on a team and fed Travis for an easy slam and a 64-42 advantage.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The win against Dartmouth marked the 12th non-conference victory of the season, a program-best mark for Penn State.
- The Nittany Lions extended their winning streak to 10 in a row with a victory against the Big Green. The winning streak is the longest since the 1995-96 season when PSU opened the season 13-0. The 12-1 start also is the best mark since the 1995-96 campaign.
- The 10-game win streak is the longest among all 14 Big Ten teams. Penn State is the first conference team to reach 12 wins this season.
- Penn State limited Dartmouth to a season-low 16 first-half points marking the fewest amount of points allowed in the first half since Northwestern scored 15 on March 16, 2014. The 69-49 final score also marks the first time the Nittany Lions have recorded a 20-point margin of victory since defeating the Wildcats 59-32 in 2014.
- The Nittany Lion bench contributed 31 points in the win, led by double figure scoring from John Johnson (10) and Geno Thorpe (12). Having recorded more than 20 points in nine games this season, the Nittany Lion bench is averaging 22.0 ppg this season. Non-starters produced 15.1 ppg a year ago.
- Along with Johnson and Thorpe, D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor posted double figures with 17 and 10, respectively, marking the fifth time this season the Nittany Lions have had four record double digit scoring.
- Penn State improves to 7-0 in the Bryce Jordan Center, marking the most consecutive victories at home for the Nittany Lions since 2007-08, when PSU recorded eight in a row from Nov. 12 – Dec. 31, 2007. They have won each of their last 12 non-conference games in the BJC.
- A season-high tying 13 players saw action for the Nittany Lions with 10 of them tallying points. Thirteen players also took the court opening weekend vs. Fordham.

MADISON, Wis. (AP) - Frank Kaminsky had 18 points and 14 rebounds, Nigel Hayes scored 21 points and No. 4 Wisconsin shot a blistering 63 percent from the field to beat Penn State 89-72 on Wednesday. The Badgers (13-1) won their sixth straight with Kaminsky leading a balanced attack. The preseason All-American had secured his sixth double-double of the season by midway through the second half with Wisconsin comfortably ahead by double digits.

D.J. Newbill scored 29 points for Penn State (12-2), which had its 10-game winning streak snapped. The Big Ten's leading scorer was 5-of-11 shooting in the second half after going 6 of 7 in the first. Wisconsin's athletic front court asserted control after halftime, with Kaminsky and Hayes getting to the basket at will. Forward Sam Dekker scored 17 after shooting 7 of 10 from the field.

The Nittany Lions withered on both ends of the court to start the second half, when Wisconsin went on an 8-2 run to take a 51-38 lead with 17:03 left on Traevon Jackson's 3-pointer. It was in sharp contrast to the opening 20 minutes, when Penn State stayed step-for-step for much of the time with Wisconsin.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions scored more points against Wisconsin than any other team this season. As one of two teams to score 70 points against the Badgers, only Duke has been able to put up at least 70 points.
- The Penn State bench tallied 28 points, led by 11 points from Geno Thorpe. The PSU bench is averaging 22.0 ppg this season, up from 15.1 ppg in non-conference games last season.
- Penn State shot 53.7 percent from the field (29-54) against the Badgers, marking a season-best for the Nittany Lions. PSU opened the game shooting 64 percent in the first half alone.
- Three Nittany Lions recorded double figures, led by D.J. Newbill, who put up a team-high 29 points.
- Penn State's 10-game winning streak came to an end as the Nittany Lions move to 12-2 on the year with the loss.
- Penn State moves to 2-1 in true road games this season and 7-16 in Big Ten openers.
- The Badgers also move to 32-10 in the all-time series against the Nittany Lions.
- D.J. Newbill led the team in scoring with 29, including 15 first-half points, going 6-7 from the field in the opening frame ... His 29 points is his eighth 20-point scoring outing of the season.
- With 1,415 career points, he ranks 10th all-time on the Penn State alltime list. He needs 44 points to points to match Tom Hovassee (1986-89) for ninth all-time at 1,459.
- Ross Travis finished with five rebounds to take over the No. 10 spot alltime with 704 career rebounds.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. (AP) - Despite trailing by as many as 14 in the first half and 11 at halftime, Penn State men's basketball rallied within one in the final minute of play, but could not complete the comeback in a 50-46 setback on the road at Rutgers.

D.J. Newbill scored 14 for the Nittany Lions (12-3, 0-2), who have dropped two straight. It was the second-lowest scoring output this season for Newbill, who entered the game with Big Ten-leading 21.9 average.

Myles Mack had 10 points and seven rebounds for the Scarlet Knights (9-6, 1-1 Big Ten), who gained their first Big Ten victory since joining the conference this season. Rutgers led the entire game and had its biggest advantage at 30-16 near the end of the first half. Penn State got within one twice, at 45-44 and 47-46. Mack hit two foul shots to put Rutgers up 49-46 with 27.0 to play.

Newbill missed a 3-pointer and Jack was fouled on the rebound. He made 1 of 2 free throws with 9.8 seconds remaining to clinch it. The Nittany Lions return home to the Bryce Jordan Center Tuesday, Jan. 6 to host Michigan in its Big Ten home opener.

- D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor led the offense with double digit scoring. Newbill led all scorers with a game-high 14 points.
- Through 15 games, Penn State has had seven decided by five points or fewer, having won all but tonight's matchup against the Scarlet Knights.
- PSU limited the Scarlet Knights to 16 percent from the field in the second half (4-25), while also holding Rutgers to 17 percent from behind the arc (1-6).
- Despite trailing by as many as 14 in the first half and 11 at the intermission, Penn State rallied within one, 47-46, in the final minute of play, but could not complete the comeback in a 50-46 setback to the Scarlet Knights.
- In the 67th meeting between the two teams, Penn State moved to 37-30 all-time in the series against Rutgers.
- The Scarlet Knights also maintain a 21-13 edge at home in the RAC.
- D.J. Newbill overcame a slow offensive first half to finish with a gamehigh 14 points. He's recorded double-figure scoring in all 15 games this season.
- With 1,429 career points, Newbill remains 10th all-time on the PSU career scoring list, just 30 points away from matching Tom Hovassee (1986-89) for 9th.
- Newbill also finished tied for second on the squad with five rebounds.
- Geno Thorpe entered the starting lineup for the first time this season and fourth of his career
- Brandon Taylor finished second on the team with 10 points, marking his ninth double figure scoring outing of the season.
- Taylor also led the team in rebounding with seven boards.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 20 points and John Johnson added 16, but the Penn State men's basketball team fell to Michigan 73-64, Tuesday night at the Bryce Jordan Center.

The Wolverines' Caris LeVert scored 18 points, while Zak Irvin added 17 and Michigan converted on free throws down the stretch to hold off the Nittany Lions. Michigan also had a 31-26 rebounding edge on Penn State as Irvin pulled down nine.

It was the Big Ten home opener for Penn State, which fell to 0-3 in conference play and 12-4 overall. Michigan (9-6, 2-1 Big Ten), relied on 3-point shooting from Irvin, LeVert and Aubrey Dawkins who each had two as the Wolverines were 9 of 13 from 3-point range and 24 of 45 overall.

Each team was stale offensively to open the second half, but Penn State rallied with a 12-2 run that featured slams from Donovon Jack and Jordan Dickerson, and a Newbill 3-pointer and a nifty drive through the lane to tie the game at 53 at the 7:36 mark.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions had an eight-game Bryce Jordan Center winning streak snapped, dating back to the CBI last season. They opened the year 7-0 on their home floor.
- Penn State earned its first lead of the game following a 14-4 run during a seven-minute stretch in the first half to go up 21-17 after trailing 13-7.
- The Lions went on another lengthy run, this time 12-2 during a four minute stretch midway through the second half, tying the contest at 53 after being down 51-41.
- With D.J. Newbill's 20 points and John Johnson's 16, the Lions have now had at least a pair of players in double-digits in each game this season.
- In the teams' 43rd all-time meeting Penn State now moves to 12-31 vs. Michigan and 1-6 under head coach Patrick Chambers.
- The Nittany Lions are now 7-12 at home vs. the Wolverines.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP) - Penn State was led by Ross Travis and Shep Garner, who each had 14, but a late charge from Indiana was enough to hold off the Nittany Lions 76-73 on Tuesday.

The Hoosiers (13-4, 3-1 Big Ten) have won two straight but had to survive a replay review on Brandon Taylor's 3-pointer that would have forced overtime. Officials determined the shot came after the buzzer.

It was not quite enough to snap a four-game losing streak, but Penn State (12-5, 0-4) certainly had a chance. The Nittany Lions cut a 12-point deficit to 76-73 on Travis' basket with 53.1 seconds to go. After a defensive stop, they took possession on a jump ball with 14.6 seconds left. But D.J. Newbill's contested 3 from the left wing was off and after Taylor grabbed the rebound, raced to the arc and made the shot, the refs waved it off.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions starting lineup of D.J. Newbill, Donovon Jack, Brandon Taylor, Shep Garner and Ross Travis took the court for the eighth time this season (6-2). All five starters finished in double-figure scoring.
- Geno Thorpe posted 10 points, making him the sixth Nittany Lion with double figure scoring, marking the first time PSU has had six in double figures since 12/19/2009 vs. Gardner Webb.
- Penn State scored 18 of its 39 first-half points in the paint, finishing the game with a season-high 46 points in the paint. The mark is the highest since 3/2/14 vs. Wisconsin when the Nittany Lions tallied 50.
- The Nittany Lions have had five one-possession games this season with this standing as the first loss. They won each of their last three games decided by three points or fewer last season for a seven-game streak.
- Eight games this season have been decided by five or fewer points with Penn State winning the first six in non-conference play and dropping the last two to Big Ten teams.
- PSU picked up eight steals against the Hoosiers, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have recorded at least eight steals.
- D.J. Newbill finished second on the team with 12 points, scoring 10 in the first half alone for his 17th consecutive double-figure scoring outing of the season.
- With 1,461 career points, Newbill moved into ninth on the Penn State career scoring list. He needs 81 more points to match Geary Claxton (2005-08) for eighth all-time.
- Ross Travis finished tied for first on the team with a season-high tying 14 points. It is the first time he has led or shared the lead in the team in scoring since Dec. 7, 2013 when he tallied 20 points vs. Marshall.
- Travis led the team with eight rebounds, including six on the defensive glass. He has led the team in rebounding in 10 of 17 games this season.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Despite 37 points from D.J. Newbill, Purdue slipped past Penn State for an 84-77 overtime victory Saturday afternoon at the Bryce Jordan Center.

Newbill's effort stands as the eighth-most points in a Penn State game all-time and is the most since 1965. Purdue's Kendall Stephens scored 22 points, including a game-tying 3-pointer that sent the game to overtime.

The Boilermakers (11-7, 3-2 Big Ten) trailed throughout the second half, save for one tie, but Stephens' shot from the left corner knotted the score before Purdue outscored Penn State (12-6, 0-5) 17-10 in overtime.

In overtime, Hammons drained a 6-footer and Octeus and Hammons each converted a pair of free throws to give the Boilermakers a 73-67 lead. In the interim, Penn State's Donovon Jack and Jordan Dickerson fouled out and Newbill missed a pair of short, open looks.

- D.J. Newbill led all scorers with a career-high 37 points, setting the record for single-game points by a Penn State player in the Big Ten, passing Joe Crispin's 35 against Iowa Jan. 6, 2001. The 37 points stand as the eighthmost scored all-time and the most since 1965 when Bob Weiss tallied 38 vs. Duke.
- With 1,498 total points, Newbill needs 44 points to match Geary Claxton (2005-08) for eighth all-time on the Penn State career scoring list.
- Penn State shot 60 percent from the field in the first half and 50 percent from three-point range, marking the fourth half this season PSU has shot 60 percent or better in a half.
- Devin Foster scored his first career field goal, finishing with career-high three points.
- Ross Travis finished one shy of a career-high mark with a team-high 12 rebounds, grabbing eight in the first half alone.
- With 731 career rebounds, Travis moves into eighth place on the Penn State all-time list, passing Calvin Booth (1995-99). He needs just three more to move into seventh, matching Carver Clinton (1964-66).
- With a team-high two blocks, Jordan Dickerson has blocked multiple shots in five of the last eight games, including a career-high six in the win over George Washington Dec. 14th.

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Despite a game-high 27 points from D.J. Newbill, Michigan State slipped past Penn State in a 66-60 decision on the road in East Lansing Wednesday evening.

Newbill, the nation's No. 4 scorer, had 18 of his 27 points in the second half and nearly gave the Nittany Lions (12-7, 0-6) their first win since Dec. 22.

Branden Dawson had 12 points, 10 rebounds and three blocked shots to help Michigan State outlast Penn State. Gavin Schilling added 11 points and 10 rebounds for the Spartans (13-6, 4-2 Big Ten). Denzel Valentine scored 11 points and Travis Trice and Matt Costello 10 each.

The Nittany Lions battled back from an eight-point first half deficit to tie the game at 37-37 in the opening part of the second half. Despite keeping it tight, a technical foul on frustrated Penn State coach Patrick Chambers helped Michigan State pull away when the game was tied for the final time at 51. A short jumper from Valentine with 4:04 left gave the Spartans the lead for good at 53-51.

POSTGAME NOTES

- D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor paced the offense with double figure scoring, led by a game-high 27 points from Newbill.
- Eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points, with a total of 10 seeing time on the court.
- The Nittany Lions trailed by as many as eight, but tied up the game seven times in the second half alone. They were never able to take the lead.
- The last five games have been decided by an average of fewer than six points (5.8), with two being separated by three and four points (Rutgers, Indiana).

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 23 points and Brandon Taylor 16 to lead Penn State to a 79-51 win over Rutgers on Saturday for its first Big Ten Conference victory of the season.

The Nittany Lions (13-7, 1-6 Big Ten), losers of six straight games, never trailed after taking a 16-15 lead with just over 10 minutes to play in the opening half. The 28-point spread was Penn State's largest margin of victory since December 2011 against Mount St. Mary's (29).

Shep Garner added 13 points for Penn State, including three 3-pointers. Penn State shot 10 of 20 from 3-point range and its first 12 points of the game were on 3-pointers.

Rutgers (10-11, 2-6) was led by 19 points from Kadeem Jack, the only Scarlet Knight in double figures. Rutgers shot just 10 of 27 in the second half after going 11 of 21 in the first half. The Knights were 3 of 13 from 3-point range.

Penn State forced 16 Rutgers turnovers while committing just nine of its own, and also owned a 32-28 edge in rebounding. **POSTGAME NOTES**

- Penn State's 28-point margin of victory is tied for the sixth-largest win against a Big Ten team in program history and is the largest at home since defeating Northwestern by 38, 83-45, on Jan. 22, 1998.
- The win is the first 20-point Big Ten victory since the Nittany Lions defeated Northwestern 59-32 (27) March 6, 2014 on the road in Evanston. The win also marks the most recent 20-point margin of victory at home against a conference team since PSU topped Purdue 65-45 (20) January 5, 2012.
- PSU totaled 41 first-half points, marking a season high total for the Nittany Lions in Big Ten play this year. The first half tally also marks the first time Penn State has reached the number in Big Ten action since January 11, 2014 and the first half vs. Indiana (41-37).
- The Nittany Lions tallied a Big Ten season-high 10 3-pointers, marking the first time PSU has notched double-digit treys since February 27, 2013 against Michigan. In the opening half alone, Penn State shot 75 percent from 3-point range, sinking 6-of-8 attempts.
- Penn State hit 50 percent of its 3-point attempts on the game for the first time in Big Ten play this season. The Lions season-best performance was 53.3 percent (8-15) at Bucknell.
- Penn State shot above 50 percent from the field for the third time this season and the first time in the Bryce Jordan Center. The Lions finished 50.9 percent from the field (29-57) for the highest shooting percentage at home vs. league teams since also hitting 50.9 percent of shots vs. Northwestern Feb. 25, 2012.
- Nine players tallied points for the Nittany Lions, including three in double figures. Penn State is 6-1 on the season with three players top 10 points.
- The Nittany Lions converted a season-high 21 points off of 16 Scarlet Knight turnovers.
- Penn State totaled a season-high 18 assists, while also matching a season-low mark with just nine turnovers.
- Penn State wore its alternate gray uniforms for the third time this season, improving to 3-0 in them.

Game 21: Penn State 63, Minnesota 58

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - D.J. Newbill scored 12 points, Jordan Dickerson blocked a shot with 4 seconds left and Penn State held off a late Minnesota rally to defeat the Gophers 63-58 Wednesday night.

Penn State (14-7, 2-6 Big Ten) led by 10 points at the half but the Gophers (13-9, 2-7) shot their way back into a 46-45 lead before Devin Foster gave the Lions a lead they would hold for their second straight conference victory.

Geno Thorpe and Payton Banks each scored nine for the Lions, who shot 42 percent from the field and were 16 of 21 from the free throw line.

Minnesota's Andre Hollins scored 17 points but no other teammates were in double figures and the Gophers were outrebounded by Penn State 36-28.

Hollins' 3-pointer gave Minnesota its only lead of the half.

Elliott Eliason became active under the basket for Minnesota and his second layup made it 57-54, but Penn State's Dickerson put Penn State up 60-54 with a short bank shot and one of two foul shots one possession later.

- All nine Nittany Lions to play in the game scored at least three points, led by D.J. Newbill, who recorded a team-high 12 points.
- Penn State limited the Golden Gophers to just 58 total points. Minnesota entered the matchup averaging 77.5 ppg.
- The Nittany Lions entered the game averaging just over 10 assists per game, but produced 14 vs. the Gophers. Penn State has had an average of 16.0 assists per game over the last two contests.
- Penn State finished with a season-high 10 steals for the first time since nabbing 11 in the win at Indiana 2/12/14. Both Newbill and Geno Thorpe led the way with three apiece.
- PSU won the advantage on the glass, outrebounding the Gophers 36-28. Minnesota entered the night with an average of 35 rebounds per game. The Lions are 11-1 when outrebounding their opponent this season.
- Four players produced or tied career highs in points on the night: Payton Banks (9), Devin Foster (8), Jordan Dickerson (6) and Julian Moore (4).
- The Nittany Lions outscored the Golden Gophers 27-18 from the bench. The PSU bench is averaging 20.7 ppg this season, up from 14.7 last year, having outscored the opponent's bench in three Big Ten games this season and 11 overall.
- Penn State is 9-2 in the Bryce Jordan Center this season.
- The Nittany Lions improve to 14-7 on the year and 2-6 in Big Ten play, having won its last two conference games.
- The Nittany Lions put an end to a five-game losing streak against Minnesota, moving Penn State to 11-32 in the all-time series. Posted his first double-double of the season and fourth of his career with 12 points and a Big Ten-career high 11 rebounds. It was the senior guard's first double-double since tallying 17 points and 10 rebounds vs. Purdue last season (1/18/14).
- With 1,560 career points, Newbill remains in seventh in the Penn State record book. He needs 10 more points to match DeRon Hayes (1990-93) for sixth all-time.

CHAMPAIGN, ILL. (AP) - D.J. Newbill led Penn State with 20 points, but the Nittany Lions fell to Illinois 60-58 in a game that came down to the very last play.

Illinois forward Malcolm Hill scored 27 points Saturday including two on a layup with four seconds left in the game to put Illinois up by two. Newbill raced down the court and drove to the basket but couldn't convert on the layup as time expired.

Shep Garner added 14 for Penn State. Julian Moore posted a career-high 10 points for the Nittany Lions, having entered the game averaging just 1.1 points a game.

The biggest lead of the afternoon was eight, in the first five minutes for Illinois. Kendrick Nunn added 10 points for Illinois. Leron Black had a game-high seven rebounds.

Penn State outrebounded Illinois 32-26, while making 42% of their shots and holding Illinois to 38% shooting. Illinois -- if you take away its 8-of-15 3-point shooting -- shot just 31.6 percent from the field.

The Nittany Lions will play their second straight on the road, traveling to Maryland on Wednesday.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Three Nittany Lions recorded double figure scoring, featuring a teamhigh 20 points from D.J. Newbill and a career-high 10 points for Julian Moore.
- Six games this season have been separated by one possession with PSU winning the first four before falling short in the last two (Indiana and Illinois). In Big Ten play, six of the team's seven Big Ten losses have been decided by an average of 4.8 points.
- Through 22 games, Penn State has had a total of 10 games decided by five points or fewer, having won the most recent close call earlier this week against Minnesota (63-58).
- Penn State limited Illinois to 60 total points, which is 13.5 points below the Illini's 73.5 ppg average entering the game.
- Penn State outrebounded the Illini 32-26, including a 21-15 margin on the defensive glass. Penn State is 11-2 when outrebounding its opponent this season.
- The Nittany Lions scored 26 points in the paint to Illinois' 14. On the year, Penn State entered the game averaging 27.9 points in the paint.
- Penn State shot 11 percent from behind the arc in the first half before improving to 43 percent in the second half.
- With 1,580 points, D.J. Newbill broke into the Top 5 on the Penn State all-time career scoring list, passing Jamelle Cornely (2006-09). He needs 25 more points to match Pete Lisicky (1995-98) for fourth (1,605).
- Led the team with 20 points, marking his 13th 20-plus scoring outing the season. Newbill has recorded at least 20 points in six of nine Big Ten matchups this season, including four of the last five games.
- Julian Moores scored equal to nearly half his season point total entering the game (21) with a career-high 10 points against the Illini, marking his first double figure scoring outing of his career.
- Shep Garner, finished second on the team with 14 points. In Big Ten games, Garner's averaging 11.2 ppg in five road contests, compared to to 6.8 ppg in the four home games.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. (AP) - Despite double figure scoring performances from D.J. Newbill and Geno Thorpe, Penn State men's basketball came up short in a close 64-58 loss on the road at No. 17 Maryland Wednesday evening.

The Nittany Lions (14-9, 2-8) and the Terrapins (19-4, 7-3 Big Ten) were tied with 4:59 left before Maryland pulled away with a late rally to capture the win.

With Maryland leading 57-52, PSU battled to within one before Wells made two foul shots with 39.3 seconds remaining. Then, after a Penn State miss, Wells grabbed the rebound and added another free throw to clinch it.

Maryland improved to 4-0 this season following a defeat. The Terrapins were coming off an 80-56 loss at Ohio State.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Nine different Nittany Lions scored at least two points, led by D.J. Newbill and Geno Thorpe, who both tallied double figure scoring. Newbill led the way with 18 points, while Thorpe followed with 10.
- Despite 13 lead changes and seven ties, PSU held the lead for 12:01, before the 17th-ranked Terps edged the Nittany Lions, 64-58.
- Penn State limited Maryland's leading scorer Melo Trimble to just four points, holding him scoreless from both the field (0-5) and from threepoint range (0-2). Trimble entered the game averaging 15.7 ppg, which ranked eighth in the Big Ten standings.
- While the Nittany Lions entered the intermission shooting 15 percent (2-13) from behind the arc, PSU improved to 44 percent (4-9) in the second half, led by a pair of treys from both Newbill and Brandon Taylor.
- Including Maryland, Penn State has held its opponent under their season scoring averaging in seven of 10 Big Ten games, including each of the last five. The Terps totaled 64 points, having entering tonight's matchup averaging 68.4 ppg.
- D.J. Newbill led the team in points (18), rebounds (7) and assists (5). He
 has led the team in all three categories twice this season and for the second time in three games. He also did so vs. Minnesota (12, 11 and 5).
- With 1,598 points, Newbill is in sole possession of fifth place on the PSU career scoring list. He needs just seven more points to match Pete Lisicky (1995-98) for fourth all-time.
- With 490 points on the year, Newbill is 10 points shy of becoming the second player in program history to reach 500 points in three consecutive seasons.
- Geno Thorpe finished second on the team with 10 points in his fifth consecutive start for the Nittany Lions.
- His 10 points also marks his ninth double figure scoring performance of the season.
- Sinking both of his free throw attempts against the Terps, Thorpe has shot 100 percent from the charity strip in 13 games this season, making 33 of his last 37 shots. His 87 percent (73-84) mark from the free throw line ranks first on the team and third in the conference standings.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Geno Thorpe scored 14 points, Brandon Taylor and D.J. Newbill had 11 as Penn State was able to take advantage of Nebraska's cold shooting to beat the Huskers 56-43 on Saturday. The teams combined for just 35 first-half points before picking up the pace in the second half. Nebraska shot 15 of 51 from the field and just 2 of 20 from 3-point range. Nebraska (13-10, 5-6 Big Ten) trailed by as many as 11 points late in the game but closed to within 44-41 before Penn State (15-9, 3-8) pulled away with just over 3 minutes to play.

Shep Garner's 3-pointer, Thorpe's steal and layup and the same combination from D.J. Newbill gave the Lions a 55-43 lead with 34 seconds to play. Nebraska, led by 13 points from Terran Petteway and 12 from Shavon Shields, has yet to win a road game in conference play. Newbill added 11 points for Penn State and moved to fourth place on Penn State's career scoring chart with 1,609 points. He is just the second player in program history to score 500 points in three consecutive seasons.The Lions were 19 of 44 from the floor and 9 of 21 from long range. They outrebounded Nebraska 39-26 as Newbill and Jordan Dickerson each had six.

- Three Nittany Lions recorded double figure scoring in the win, led by Geno Thorpe, who tallied a game and Big Ten career-high 14 points. A total of eight different Nittany Lions contributed at least two points, with four putting up at least one 3-pointer.
- Penn State limited the Huskers to just 13 first-half points, marking the fewest points by an opponent in the opening frame since 12/12/07 when Princeton scored 11. The Nittany Lions held Nebraska without a made field goal for a stretch of 11:16 of game action in the first half.
- The Huskers' 43 points in the game are the fewest by a PSU opponent this season and the second-lowest scoring output for any team in the Big Ten during league action. The last time Penn State held an opponent under 45 points was March 6, 2014, at Northwestern (32).
- PSU held Nebraska to 29 percent shooting from the field (15-51) and a Big Ten season- low, 10 percent (2-20) from the 3-point line.
- In eight of 11 Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent to less than their season scoring average, including each of the last six by an average of 13.0. The Nittany Lions limited the Huskers to 43 points, 20.7 points below their season average of 63.7 points per game on the year.
- With 11 points, D.J. Newbill increased his PSU career total to 1,609 points to move into fourth place on the Penn State career scoring list ahead of Pete Lisicky (1,605; 1995-98). He would need 377 more points to move into the Top 3 and match Joe Crispin (1,986; 1998-01).
- Newbill has 501 points on the season, becoming just the second Nittany Lion player all-time to score at least 500 points in three-consecutive seasons, joining Talor Battle (2009-11).

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) - D.J. Newbill had 16 points and Brandon Taylor 11 as Penn State men's basketball (15-10, 3-9) fell short in a 75-55 decision on the road at No. 23/21 Ohio State Wednesday evening.

Sam Thompson scored a career-high 22 points, while Russell, the nation's top freshman scorer, added 17 points, six rebounds and seven assists for Ohio State (19-6, 8-4 Big Ten), which has won five of six.

Ohio State never trailed after streaking to a 9-0 lead early in the game. The Nittany Lions scored nine of 11 points during one span to draw as close as 24-16 before Ohio State pulled away for good.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Ten different Nittany Lions contributed at least one point, led by D.J. Newbill and Brandon Taylor, who each recorded double digits.
- In nine of 12 Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent to below their season scoring average, including each of the last seven contests. The Nittany Lions limited Ohio State to 75 points as the Buckeyes entered the game averaging 79.0 on the year.
- After shooting 25 percent from three-point range in the first half, PSU shot 44 percent in the second half, behind a trio of treys from Taylor.
- Having tallied six or more 3-pointers in the last three outings as a team, Penn State's averaging 6.5 per game, which ranks 10th in the Big Ten standings.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Despite double figure scoring from three Nittany Lions, No. 19 Maryland used strong shooting in the second half to scramble past Penn State 76-73 Saturday night. The Terrapins (21-5, 9-4 Big Ten), the nation's No. 2 team in free throws made with 447, sank 21 of 26 and were 9 of 19 from 3-point range. Penn State (15-11, 3-10) was led by 25 points from D.J. Newbill, who reached double figures for the 100th time in his career. Geno Thorpe added 17 points and Brandon Taylor had 11 for the Nittany Lions.

The Terps led 72-70 with a minute remaining when they committed their 11th turnover. Newbill then slipped and lost control of the ball, and Trimble hit a pair of free throws. Newbill recovered with a long 3-pointer to bring the Lions to 74-73 with 13.6 seconds left. Trimble was fouled on the inbounds pass and put the Terps up by three. Newbill took a 25-foot shot that bounced high off the rim and then off the top of the backboard to end the game.

POSTGAME NOTES

- · All nine Nittany Lions to see action on the court made it on to the scoreboard with at least one point. D.J. Newbill, Geno Thorpe and Brandon Taylor led the group with double figure scoring.
- The Nittany Lions held Maryland without a bucket for 4:05 during a 13-0 second-half Penn State surge, while also holding the Terps without a field goal for 7:22.
- Through 26 games this season, Penn State has had 11 decided by five points or fewer, moving to 7-4 in five-point games since knocking off Minnesota (63-58). There have been seven one-possession decisions.
- The game featured eight ties and five lead changes with the Nittany Lions holding the lead for 20:28 of the contest (15:46 for UMD, 3:45 tied)
- The Nittany Lions move to 17-15 all-time when playing on Valentine's Day with the last four games being decided by a total of 12 points: 2013

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Penn State men's basketball battled from behind by as many as 16 in the second half to arrive within five, 48-43, with 4:08 remaining, but Wisconsin pulled away for a 55-47 win Wednesday evening. Newbill led all scorers with 29 points. The Badgers, despite shooting 39 percent, were aided by Nigel Hayes' 13 rebounds and nine points.

Wisconsin never trailed and pulled out to a 39-26 lead at the outset of the second half when Dekker sandwiched a pair of buckets around two from Hayes. That forced a Penn State timeout, then neither team scored for more than three minutes before Newbill's layup for Penn State and another Dekker 3-pointer that put the Badgers up by 14. The teams combined for just 21 points in the first 11 minutes of the half, and the Badgers patiently built a 46-30 lead. But Newbill brought the Nittany Lions back within striking distance when he put in seven straight points and Geno Thorpe added two more to make it 48-43.

- In 10 of 14 Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent below their season scoring average, including eight of the last nine contests. The Badgers entered the game averaging 73.4 ppg before the Nittany Lions held Wisconsin to 55 points.
- In Wisconsin's eight-game winning streak following its lone conference loss, the Badgers have defeated opponents by an average of 15.1 points. The only two games UW wins decided by a closer margin all season were wins over Georgetown (3) and Michigan (4).
- Penn State's defense limited Wisconsin to its lowest scoring output of the B1G season and the second-lowest on the year (49 points vs. Marquette).
- Ten of PSU's 14 B1G games have been decided by single digits. Through 27 games, a total of 17 have been decided by eight points or fewer.
- · D.J. Newbill powered the PSU offense with a game-high 29 points, shooting 13-for-21 from the field and 3-for-3 from the free throw line. Of the team's 10 first-half field goals, Newbill scored seven of them and tallied assists on the other three.
- Totaling 29 points, Newbill recorded his 15th 20-plus point outing of the season and 35th of his career. He is averaging a team-high 21.1 ppg, having entered the night ranked tops in the Big Ten and sixth nationally.
- Jordan Dickerson broke into the Top 10 on Penn State's career blocks chart. The Nittany Lions have three active players among the Top 11: Donovon Jack (No. 8, 77), Dickerson (No. 10, 69) and Brandon Taylor (No. 11, 68). Taylor had been No. 10 before Dickerson's two-block performance vs. Wisconsin.
- · The Nittany Lions committed a season-low six turnovers. In the last two games, Penn State has totaled no more than seven turnovers against back-to-back teams ranked within the AP Top 25.
- Senior Ross Travis led the team with eight rebounds, having grabbed at least six boards in two the last three outings.
- With 768 rebounds, Travis surpassed Gene Harris (1960-62) and moved into third place on the PSU all-time list. He would need 144 more rebounds to match Mike Lang (1980-83) for third.

EVANSTON, III. (AP) - The Nittany Lions fell to Northwestern 60-39 on Saturday afternoon, in a game where they struggled from the field. Geno Thorpe scored 13 points for Penn State, which scored a season-low point total and shot a season-low 27 percent.

Penn State outrebounded Northwestern 37-36. PSU's D.J. Newbill, the Big Ten's leading scorer at 21.1 points per game, finished with three points on 1-for-6 shooting and nine rebounds. He scored his first points on a 3 with 1:25 remaining to cut the lead to 56-39.

Vic Law scored 17 points, Tre Demps added 16 for Northwestern. Alex Olah added 10 points for the Wildcats (13-14, 4-10 Big Ten), who have won three straight after snapping a 10-game losing streak.

Penn State came out hot, using an early 12-3 run powered by a trio of 3-pointers from Shep Garner and Geno Thorpe. The Wildcats answered with a 12-0 streak to go up by three, 15-12, but Garner cut off the stretch with his second triple of the frame to tie the score, 15-15. With PSU unable to spark some momentum, Northwestern used a 13-5 run to close out the first half, entering the intermission with an eight-point lead, 28-20.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Geno Thorpe led the team in scoring for the third time in this season with 13 points, shooting 3-for-5 from behind the arc.
- The Nittany Lions shot 39 percent from behind the arc in the first half with five treys from Thorpe and Shep Garner. Garner led the way with three first-half triples shooting 3-for-5 from 3-point range.
- Penn State won the advantage on the boards, collecting 37 rebounds to the Wildcats' 36. D.J. Newbill led the way with nine rebounds, while Ross Travis and Thorpe added six each. The Nittany Lions are 12-4 when outrebounding an opponent.
- Shep Garner finished second on the team in scoring with nine points after registering three triples in the first half alone. He has at least one 3-pointer in all but four games this season, with multiple treys in 13 games.
- In Big Ten games, Garner is averaging 10.0 ppg in eight road contests compared to 5.9 ppg in the seven homes games.
- Geno Thorpe knocked down a career-high three triples on the way to his 12th double figure scoring outing of the season with a team-high 13 points.
- Thorpe's reached double figures in four of the last six games with multiple treys in two of the last three appearances on the court.
- With three blocks, Jordan Dickerson logged his 15th multi-block performance of the season. Having recorded multiple blocks in seven of the last eight games, he leads the team with 43 on the year.
- With 72 career blocks, he ranks 10th on the Penn State all-time list. He needs just one more to match Geary Claxton (2005-08) for ninth.
- With 774 career rebounds, Ross Travis is ranked No. 3 all-time among career rebounds at Penn State. He would need 138 more rebounds to match Mike Lang for No. 2.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Despite double figure scoring from four NIttany Lions, Penn State men's basketball came up short in an 81-77 OT loss to Iowa Saturday evening at the Bryce Jordan Center. D.J. Newbill scored 19 points for Penn State (15-14, 3-13), which has lost 10 Big Ten games by nine points or fewer. Shep Garner added 17 points, Geno Thorpe 14 and Ross Travis 10 for the Nittany Lions.

lowa's Aaron White scored 21 points, including six free throws in overtime, and the Hawkeyes were able to scrape past Penn State. Mike Gesell (14), Gabriel Olaseni (12), Josh Oglesby (12) and Jarrod Uthoff (11) also scored in double figures for the Hawkeyes (19-10, 10-6 Big Ten), who were 25 of 27 from the free-throw line.

White's steal of a D.J. Newbill in-bounds pass with 30 seconds left in overtime swung momentum the Hawkeyes' way, as did his freethrow shooting. Penn State committed 15 turnovers.

Uthoff started lowa off in overtime with a 3-pointer and Gesell followed with another for a quick 74-68 lead. Thorpe scored Penn State's only two points in the first 2:10 of overtime. Iowa went cold and Newbill's four straight points tied the score at 74 with 47 seconds to play.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State's third overtime game of the season featured eight lead changes and seven tied scores.
- Four Nittany Lions finished with double figures, led by D.J. Newbill's team-high 19 points. PSU is now 4-2 on the year when four or more post 10-plus in a game.
- All 10 who saw time on the floor grabbed at least one rebound as the Nittany Lions outrebounded the Hawkeyes 44-41. Penn State moves to 12-5 when outrebounding an opponent.
- Through 29 games this season, a total of 12 have been decided by five points or fewer. Having won seven, Penn State is now 7-5 on the year in regular-season possession games.
- Penn State has had 11 Big Ten games decided by single-digits, tied with Illinois for the most in the league.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) - Having led by as many as nine points in the first half, Penn State men's basketball fell short in a 77-67 decision to No. 23 Ohio State on Senior Night at the Bryce Jordan Center.

Seniors D.J. Newbill (17 points) and Ross Travis (14) led Penn State (15-15, 3-14) during their final home game for the Nittany Lions. Newbill eclipsed the 2,000-point mark for his career; he has 2,011 points and is one of nine active DI players to achieve the mark. Freshman Shep Garner chipped in 13 points.

D'Angelo Russell scored 28 points and coach Thad Matta tied the school record for wins in No. 23 Ohio State's victory over Penn State. Matta is 297-91 in 11 seasons at Ohio State, tied with Fred Taylor. Matta's next win would give him the Buckeyes mark as well as his 400th career victory overall. Jae'Sean Tate and Shannon Scott each added 13 points for the Buckeyes (22-8, 11-6 Big Ten). Russell was 5 of 8 from 3-point range.

The Buckeyes didn't pull away until the final 10 minutes. Penn State led 38-29 early in the second half but Ohio State's 39-16 scoring run over the next 12 minutes provided the Buckeyes with a safe margin.

- The Nittany Lions led by as many as nine in the first half and held the lead for 13:56 before Ohio State's late comeback put the Buckeyes on top for a 77-67 final decision.
- In 12 of 16 Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent below their season scoring average, including 10 of the last 12. Ohio State entered tonight's game averaging 79 points per game.
- The Nittany Lions honored graduating seniors Alan Wisniewski, Ross Travis, Kevin Montminy and D.J. Newbill in a special pregame ceremony, with all four earning a spot in the starting lineup. It was the first career start for Montminy and Wisniewski.
- Led by a senior tandem featuring Newbill and Travis, three Nittany Lions reached double figure scoring. Newbill put up a team-high 17 points while Travis matched a season-high mark with 14 and Shep Garner finished with 13.
- Penn State concludes the home portion of its regular season schedule with a 10-6 record for its best mark in the Bryce Jordan Center since 2010-11 (13-5).
- Ohio State moves to 34-15 in the all-time series against Penn State and 13-7 when playing in the Bryce Jordan Center.
- Including his freshman season points at Southern Mississippi, D.J. Newbill surpassed the 2,000 point-mark against the Buckeyes with a teamhigh 17 points. With 2,011 career points, he's one of 10 active Division I players to achieve the mark.
- With 610 points on the year, Newbill is now the third player in program history to produce at least 600 points in two seasons, after having tallied 604 in 2013-14. He joins Joe Crispin and Talor Battle.
- Newbill's 610 points rank seventh in Penn State single-season totals. He now owns the Nos. 7 and 8 spots all-time. He needs 25 points to move into sixth place with Talor Battle (635; 2009).

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) - D.J. Newbill pulled up and calmly swished a 3-pointer at the buzzer, giving him 31 points to lift Penn State to a 79-76 victory over Minnesota on Sunday.

The Big Ten's leading scorer went 11 for 22 from the field, including 5 for 11 from 3-point range, to snap a six-game losing streak by the Nittany Lions (16-15, 4-14) with his dramatic finish. The senior guard also knocked down a one-handed floater from the lane with 22 seconds left to give Penn State a one-point lead.

Joey King, who scored 19 points on a career-high five 3-pointers for the Golden Gophers (17-14, 6-12), pump-faked Jordan Dickerson in the air to draw a foul and two free throws with 14 seconds remaining. He split the pair, setting Newbill and the Nittany Lions up for the final shot.

Mo Walker had a career-high 26 points plus 11 rebounds, but the Gophers took their eighth loss in conference play by six points or fewer, half of those by three or less.

Geno Thorpe scored 14 points for Penn State and Brandon Taylor added 12 points. The Nittany Lions became the sixth opponent in Minnesota's last eight games to make 10 or more 3-pointers and shoot 40 percent or better from behind the arc.

- Including D.J. Newbill's game-winning buzzer beater, PSU tallied 10 3-pointers, marking the fourth time this season the Nittany Lions have scored 10 treys.
- Led by Newbill's game-high 31 points, a total of three Nittany Lions recorded double digit scoring. Geno Thorpe finished second on the team with 14, while Brandon Taylor notched 12. Penn State is 8-4 this year with three scoring 10-plus in a game.
- Penn State finished with an 18-6 advantage in second-chance points, helped out by 12 offensive rebounds. Overall, PSU led Minnesota 36-34 in rebounding. The Nittany Lions are 13-5 on the year when outrebounding an opponent.
- The Nittany Lions posted 43 first half points, marking a season high tally in Big Ten play this season. The total is the second time PSU has scored 40 or more in a half against a Big Ten opponent, having put up 41 against Rutgers (1/24/15).
- Penn State shot 50 percent from both the field (17-34) and 3-point range (6-12) in the opening half, led by a pair of triples from Shep Garner and Brandon Taylor. The Nittany Lions finished at 47 percent from the field (31-66).
- Closing out the regular season slate with a 16-15 mark, Penn State's 16 wins this year are the most regular season wins since 2011 (16). PSU also secured its first regular season finish above .500 since 2011 and its third since 2000.
- Penn State has posted 16 or more wins in a season five times since 2000-01, including each of the last two years under head coach Patrick Chambers.
- Through 31 games, Penn State has had 13 decided by five points or fewer, winning each of the first six plus both decisions against Minnesota to stand at 8-5. Eight games have also been separated by one possession with Penn State winning its fifth overall and first against a Big Ten team.
