WASHINGTON AVAILABILITY

Coach Washington will hold weekly press conferences during the season (schedule at right). All additional interview requests should be directed to Greg Campbell in the Strategic Communications office.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All student-athlete interviews must be arranged through Greg Campbell at least 72 hours in advance. Players will generally be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Coquese Washington's weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off. Player phone numbers will not be released. Following games, requested Penn State student-athletes will be brought to the postgame media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

CREDENTIALS

Single game and season press credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Requests for credentials should be directed to Greg Campbell at least one week in advance of each game. Press credentials can be picked up at Media Will Call, which is located at the Media/Team entrance, on the south side of the Bryce Jordan Center, across from the Penn State Lacrosse Complex.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

A photo pass must be issued to gain access courtside in the Bryce Jordan Center. Please contact Greg Campbell one week in advance for photo passes. Courtside photographers must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas and the stands, and must remain seated at all times.

RADIO NETWORKS

The Penn State Sports Network originates from the first row of Booth C23 in the press area. Visiting radio stations are located on the first row of Booth C22 in the press area. Visiting radio is provided Ethernet, POTS and ISDN connections.

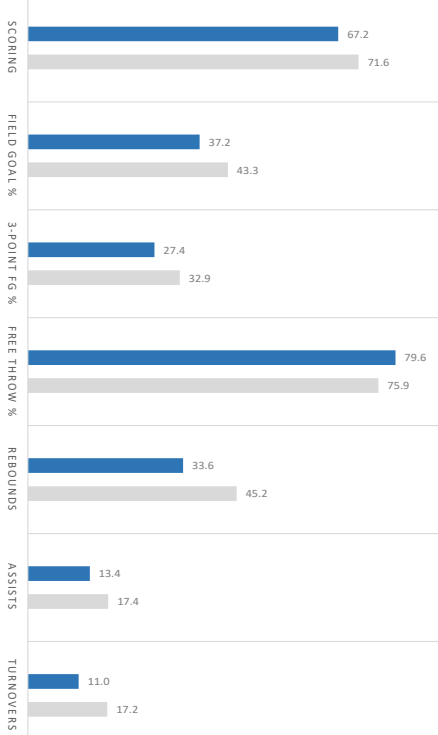

LAST FIVE



- » Penn State is 2-3 over its last five games, with wins over Michigan State (Feb. 4) and Northwestern (Feb. 14) at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- » Looking at the three main statistical categories, Penn State is minus-4.4 in scoring margin, a minus-11.6 in rebounding margin, while owning a plus-6.2 edge in turnover margin.
- » The Lady Lions have 53 steals (10.6 spg) over the last five games, including four games with 10-plus swipes.
- » The 53 steals have helped Penn State force 86 turnovers (17.2 tpg) during that stretch, including back-to-back 20-turnover games vs. Michigan State and at Iowa.
- » Junior **Teniya Page** is scoring 18.6 points per game, reaching double-figures in each contest, including three 20-point contests. She reached the 20-point plateau at Iowa (23), at Minnesota (22) and vs. Northwestern (22).
- » Redshirt-sophomore **Amari Carter** has scored in double-figures in six-straight games and is averaging 14.6 points per game over the last five contests.
- » Carter also has a team-best 15 steals (3.0 spg) and 19 assists (3.9 apg) during that stretch.
- » Carter, Page and **Siyeh Frazier** are all in double-figures in the steals column over the last five games, with 15, 12 and 14 swipes, respectively.
- » Frazier is adding 10.4 points per game during that stretch, as well.
- » Freshman **Alisia Smith** earned her first career start against Northwestern on Feb. 14 and has started each of the last two games, averaging 6.8 points and 4.8 rebounds.

SCOUTING THE OPPOSITION

- » Ohio State enters the regular season final ranked No. 15 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll and No. 14 in the AP Top-25 with a record of 23-6 and a 12-3 mark in Big Ten play.
- » The Buckeyes can clinch the outright Big Ten regular season title on Sunday with a win, as they own a one-game edge in the loss column over Maryland and Nebraska.
- » Ohio State has held its last seven Big Ten opponents to under 70 points, including limiting Penn Stat to 64 points on Jan. 31.
- » Kelsey Mitchell is the Big Ten's all-time leading scorer, either male or female, with 3,264 career points and is currently fourth in NCAA history. She is just 19 points behind Britteny Griner for third all-time in NCAA history.
- » Mitchell also owns the NCAA record for career 3-pointers made (475) and has made at least one 3-pointer in a NCAA-record 86-straight games.
- » Linnæ Harper has done a little bit of everything this season for the Buckeyes, averaging 15.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 2.4 steals per game.
- » She is one of only four players in the country to average more than 15 points, 8.5 rebounds, two assists and two steals per game this season.

- » For the 17th time in 2017-18, **Jaida Travascio-Green** hit double-digits with a team-best 14 points.
- » Travascio-Green led the team in scoring for the fourth time this season and sixth of her career.
- » With four made 3-pointers in the game, Travascio-Green has hit at least three 3-pointers on 10 occasions this season.
- » The four makes from 3-point range pushed her season total to 58 made 3-pointers. She was tied for No. 16 in a single season passing **Tyra Grant** (55; 2008-09), **Suzie McConnell** (56; 1987-88) and **Tina Nicholson** (57; 1995-96), and equalling the mark of **Jess Strom** (58; 2004-05).
- » **Teniya Page** started her 78th career game to move into the No. 25 on the career charts.

- » Carter ended the night with 12 points to mark her 19th game of the season and 28th of her career in double-figures.
- » Freshman **Kamaria McDaniel** moved into a tie for No. 10 on the freshman 3-pointers made list with one make at Ohio State. Her 21 3-pointers made equaled the mark of **Alex Bentley** (2009-10).
- » McDaniel tied her career high with six rebounds in the game, equaling her total vs. Wake Forest earlier this season.

- » Penn State was the first team in the NCAA to don pink uniforms, debuting the threads on Feb. 4, 2007 against Wisconsin at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- » The Lady Lion program has been honored as the Play 4 Kay Division I initiative winner twice in program history, winning the award in 2013 and 2014.

More Than Just a Game

- » The Lady Lions own a 7-4 record in Pink Zone at Penn State games, including a five-game winning streak from 2010-2014.
- » Pink Zone at Penn State has raised more than \$1.85 million in funds over the 11 years, including a record \$310,000 in 2014.
- » The event began in 2007 with \$20,490 raised and 31 cancer survivors in attendance and has grown into an event that annually raises over \$200,000 (six-straight years) and welcomes over 500 cancer survivors annually.
- » In 2017, Penn State raised \$266,000 and 504 cancer survivors joined the Lady Lions in the BJC.
- » Pink Zone's six beneficiaries include; Mount Nittany Medical Center, Penn State Cancer Institute, Kay Yow Cancer Fund, PA Breast Cancer Coalition, JC Blair Memorial Hospital and Geisinger-Lewistown Hospital.

2017 Pink Zone at Penn State

- » The 11th Annual Play4Kay Game benefitting Pink Zone at Penn State was one for the ages, as Penn State defeated Michigan, 76-75, on Sunday, February 26 in the Bryce Jordan Center.
- » After the highest scoring affair in the events history in 2016, the same two teams played the first one possession game of the event.
- » The 2017 event raised \$255,000, moving the streak of \$200,000 raised to six-straight events.
- » In 2017, 504 cancer survivors attended the game vs. the Wolverines, with 4,090 years of survivorship gathering on the court during the halftime celebration.

Page: The One and Only

- » The rich history and tradition of Lady Lion basketball is illustrated by the immense success that the student-athletes have on and off the court. With all of the great names that have donned the blue and white, it isn't often a player can accomplish something no one else has, but **Teniya Page** did just that in 2016-17.
- » On her way to her 1,000th point, Page was able to tally 200 made field goals, 60 made 3-pointers, 100 made free throws and add 100 assists. No other Lady Lion has amassed those numbers, as Page totaled 209 field goals - 64 of the 3-point variety - 136 free throws and 109 assists.

Tough Down the Stretch

- » They are the moments a player dreams about: time running out, team is down one and you have the ball in your hand. For junior **Teniya Page**, she has already had a number of these moments in her career.
- » With Penn State trailing by one point and under five seconds on the fourth-quarter clock, Page was fouled shooting a 3-pointer against No. 25/21 Rutgers. Following a technical foul on the Rutgers bench after the foul call, Page knocked down 4-of-5 freebies to push Penn State into the lead, 70-67, and eventually the victory.
- » On Dec. 6, 2017, Page scored 14 of her game-high 27 points vs. Fordham in the fourth quarter to lead Penn State back from a 10-point deficit with 7:43 to play in the game. She was 5-of-6 from the floor and 4-of-5 from the free throw line to help lead the comeback, hitting the go-ahead basket with 1:32 to play to give Penn State its first lead of the game, 58-57.
- » Page had a trio of games with last minute moments in 2016-17, including go-ahead buckets at Boston College and vs. Marshall in the waning moments.
- » On Dec. 18, 2016 vs. American, Page twice helped Penn State fight off a late charge from the Eagles, going 5-of-6 from the foul line in the final 33 seconds to seal the win and push her scoring total to 30 points for the game.
- » Against Marshall on Dec. 3, 2016, the Lady Lions found themselves trailing by one, 77-76 with 0:46 left to play. Page brought the ball up the court, hesitated and then cut through the lane for her 10th basket of the game to give the Lady Lions the lead for good.
- » In the 2016 ACC/Big Ten Challenge at Boston College, Penn State found itself trailing 56-54 with 40 ticks left after a Mariella Fasoula basket. Page drove the baseline, hit runner and was fouled -- connecting on the free throw -- to give Penn State the lead for good.

Teniya Page became just the fourth Lady Lion to post consecutive seasons with at least 450 points and 100 assists, doing so during her freshman and sophomore seasons.



Taking the Lead

- » At Minnesota on Sunday, Feb. 11, **Teniya Page** led the team in scoring and assists, ticking off 22 points and four helpers.
- » It marked the 20th time in her career she led the team in both categories for the same game and the sixth of the 2017-18 season.
- » In her career, Page has led the team in scoring on 46 occasions and paced the team in assists in 44 contests.

Giveth and Scoreth

- » One thing that junior **Teniya Page** has done well in her career is score, while also keeping her teammates involved.
- » Of her 85 career games, Page has scored at least 10 points and handed out at least four assists in the same game on 38 occasions, including nine this season. **MORE ON PAGE 38**
- » She is one of four Penn State student-athletes to account for at least 450 points and 100 assists in consecutive seasons, joining **Alex Bentley**, **Carol Walderman** and **Tanisha Wright**.
- » Page registered 473 points and 131 helpers as a freshman and has added 618 points and 109 helpers in 2016-17.
- » Bentley did so in three-straight campaigns from 2010-11 to 2012-13. She scored 505 points with 174 assists as a sophomore, had 156 helpers and 465 tallies as a junior and posted 451 points and 112 assists as a senior.
- » In 1980-81, Walderman accounted for 522 points and 110 assists. Her 1981-82 season included 127 assists and 528 tallies.
- » Wright outdid all of them with at least 500 points in each of her three seasons. From 2002-03 to 2004-05, Wright scored 560, 502 and 578 points. She had 139, 140 and 108 assists in those respective campaigns.

Page Putting In Work

- » While wearing the blue and white, junior **Teniya Page** has produced 35 career games playing at least 38 minutes, and of those games, 14 of them have featured at least 40 minutes.
- » Page's 14 games of at least 40 minutes in her career include three so far this season.
- » Page has not fouled out of a game in her career, reaching four fouls in only 11 games. She had eight games with four fouls as a freshman and reached the mark only twice in 2016-17. She has one game this season with four infractions against.

Career Candids

- » Redshirt-sophomore **Amari Carter** has set a career-best in scoring on three occasions this season, including a personal-best 26 tallies in a victory over Indiana on Jan. 3.
- » The Washington, D.C. native entered the season with a personal-best 22 points at No. 3/3 Maryland on Jan. 11, 2017.
- » She topped that mark with 23 tallies at Providence on Nov. 18 and followed that with 24 points two games later vs. Louisiana Tech on Nov. 24.
- » Carter's career-best 26 points came vs. Indiana on Jan. 3, when she hit 10-of-22 shots - including 4-of-6 from 3-point range - to go along with six assists in Penn State's first BIG win of the season.

Leading the Charge

- » Redshirt-sophomore **Amari Carter** has led Penn State in scoring on eight occasions this season, including three-straight games from Nov. 18-24.
- » She has also led the team in assists on 15 occasions, including seven-straight games from Nov. 12-Nov. 30.
- » After handing out five assists to sophomore **Siyeh Frazier's** six in the season opener, Carter reeled off seven-straight games atop the team's assist chart, before junior **Teniya Page** edged her 5-4 vs. Manhattan.

Stealing the Show

- » A steady dose of defense has helped redshirt-sophomore **Amari Carter** move her name into the conversation as one of the top defenders in the Big Ten, as she leads the conference in steals and steals per game.
- » Carter has racked up 75 thefts so far in 2017-18 for an average of 2.67 steals per game.
- » This season, Carter has 14 games with 3-plus steals, including eight games with four steals and three more games with five swipes.

Percentage Gains

- » Amari Carter continues to have a solid season running the Penn State offense, accounting for 45 percent or more of the team's total offense ((points scored + points assisted on)/team points) on five occasions this season.
 - » In a victory at Providence, Carter scored 23 points and handed out three assists (seven points) to have a hand in 50 percent of Penn State's offense (30 of 60 points).
 - » Versus Louisiana Tech, Carter poured in 24 points and added a team-high-tying four assists. Combined with her 24 tallies, she assisted on nine points, giving her a hand in 33 of Penn State's 59 points (56%).
 - » The next night vs. Kansas State, Carter tallied 15 points and had five assists - all on 3-pointers - to have a hand in 30 of the 65 points in the game (45%).

- » Redshirt-sophomore **Amari Carter** has handled the Penn State offense with a steady hand during her first two seasons on campus, with just 96 turnovers in 61 appearances, or 1.57 turnovers per game.
 - » For her career, she has led the team in assists on 35 occasions - including 22 games with 5-plus assists - and committed two-or-fewer turnovers in 49-of-61 games played.
 - » Carter has 18 games with 5-plus assists and two-or-fewer turnovers in her career, including six this season.

Jaida's Sophomore Transformation

- » Sophomore **Jaida Travascio-Green** worked on her overall scoring game this summer and that has paid off in the early goings of 2017-18, as she is averaging in double-figures for the season.
- » Last season Green made 78 percent (46-of-59) of her field goals from 3-point range, but in 2017-18 that number is down to 63 percent (67-of-106). **MORE ON PAGE 48**
- » In 2016-17, Travascio-Green made 59 total field goals, with 46 of those coming from distance, giving her just 13 made two-point baskets. She posted her 14th made two-pointer in game eight of the 2017-18 season.
- » The change to her style of play has also led to more opportunities at the free throw stripe, as she eclipsed her attempted and made free throws totals from a season ago just eight games into 2017-18.
- » As a freshman, Travascio-Green was 10-of-20 from the charity stripe, and is currently 45-of-54 from the free throw stripe as a sophomore.

Climbing the Triples Charts

- » In just 56 career games played, sophomore **Jaida Travascio-Green** has already ascended into the upper echelon of 3-point shooters in Penn State history, ranking among the career and single season leaders.
- » At Purdue on Jan. 28 2018, Travascio-Green hit her 100th career 3-pointer to make her the 16th Lady Lion all-time to reach the century mark from distance.
- » Her 113 makes currently sits tied for No. 15 on the all-time list with **Lynn Dougherty** (113; 1989-92). She is now 13 shy of a spot in the top-10 at Penn State. **MORE ON PAGE 6 SIDE BAR**
- » This season, Travascio-Green has already set a season-best with 67 makes from beyond the arc, moving her to No. 10 on the single season list.
- » Travascio-Green hit 46 triples as a rookie in 2016-17 to rank No. 4 on the freshman charts, a total that is now No. 29 on the single season list.
- » In her career, Travascio-Green has 19 games with 3-plus makes from distance, including 12 this season. Of those 19 games, six of them have featured 5-plus connections from 3-point range.

Jaida Goes for 31

- » With 49 seconds left in the first quarter, **Jaida Travascio-Green** connected on her first field goal of the game vs. Drexel, giving her four points in the contest and would end the first quarter with six tallies.
- » Over the final three quarter, Travascio-Green poured in 25 points - including 12 in the fourth quarter along - and become the 17th Lady Lion to post a 30-point game.
- » Her 31 tallies mark the 69th 30-point game in program history, as she joins teammate **Teniya Page** as the only current Lady Lions to reach the 30-point mark.

Career Night for Jaida

- » Along with her career-best 31 points vs. Drexel, **Jaida Travascio-Green** was able to accomplish three more career high efforts in the process.
- » Her 10 made field goals marked a personal-best, while her seven made 3-pointers were also a career mark. The seven made triples are the most by a Lady Lion since **Lindsey Spann** hit seven shots from distance at Minnesota on Jan. 3, 2016.
- » The sophomore also added a personal-best five blocked shots in the game, the most for a Lady Lion since **Candice Agee** swatted five shots vs. Rider on Dec. 14, 2014.

Going Green Against the Terps

- » Sophomore **Jaida Travascio-Green** had one of her most efficient shooting games in a near upset of No. 15/14 Maryland on New Year's Eve, hitting 8-of-13 shots (62 percent) from the field and 5-of-8 (62 percent) from 3-point range.
- » Travascio-Green posed her Big Ten career best with 21 points and added three rebounds.

FROSH FINDINGS

Freshman Firsts

- » All three rookies saw time off the bench in the season opener vs. Siena, with all three reaching the scoring column in their collegiate debuts.
- » **Alisia Smith** logged 17 minutes on the court in the season opener, hitting 3-of-5 shots from the field and 3-of-4 from the free throw line.
- » **Sam Breen** added seven points and grabbed four rebounds in her debut, adding one assist and one steal.
- » With five points, three assist and two steals, **Kamaria McDaniel** logged 22 minutes on the floor to lead all rookies.

McDouble-Figures

- » There have been some good rookies come to wear the blue and white under head coach **Coquese Washington**, and **Kamaria McDaniel** looks to add to that trend.
- » McDaniel has posted five double-figure scoring games this season, including 20 points at Marshall. (*See note below*)
- » She also tallied 17 vs. Central Connecticut State (11/20), 12 vs. Wake Forest in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge and 14 against Manhattan (12/3).
- » McDaniel posted her first double-figure scoring game in Big Ten play on Feb. 22 at Nebraska with 10 points.

McDaniel Sparks Lions at Marshall

- » With Penn State trailing by two points and struggling to find a consistent footing on offense, **Kamaria McDaniel** hit a 3-pointer to push the Lady Lions into the lead.
- » McDaniel hit another 3-pointer in the second quarter and ended the half with eight points, however it was her 12 points in the second half that sparked the Lady Lions to victory.
- » The rookie poured in a career-high 20 points in the win at Marshall, hitting 7-of-11 shots from the floor and 5-of-8 tries from 3-point range, all career best efforts.
- » She added two assists, one steal and four rebounds in the contest in a career-high 26 minutes off the bench.

Kamaria's Triples

- » Freshman **Kamaria McDaniel** moved into the top-10 in program history on the freshman 3-pointers made list on Jan. 31, 2018 at Ohio State with her 21st made triple.
- » McDaniel trails **Jess Brungo** (27; 2000-01) for the No. 9 spot on the list, with spots 6-11 listed below.

Breen Building

- » Freshman **Sam Breen** has continued to build on a foundation during in her rookie season.
- » The rookie scored seven points with four rebounds and one assist in the season opener vs. Siena.
- » After going scoreless over the next three game, Breen steadied her production scoring 11 points with 14 rebounds during that stretch.
- » She scored three points - including a crucial basket in the fourth quarter - and added a career-best six rebounds at Providence.
- » She followed that with four points and six boards - all in the first half - against Central Connecticut State. She added two steals and an assist vs. the Blue Devils.
- » Breen saw action in each of the non-conference contests, but saw just six minutes over her first nine Big Ten games, before playing five minutes at Purdue.
- » Against the Boilermakers, Breen posted three rebounds and two steals.

Smith Doubles Up

- » At American, rookie **Alisia Smith** posted her first career double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds to close the non-conference season on a high note.
- » Smith compiled her points on an efficient afternoon, hitting 2-of-4 shots from the field and 6-of-8 attempts from the free throw line.
- » Six of her rebounds came on the offensive glass and she added one blocked shot.

Smith's Rookie Success

- » The learning curve for each freshman is different and for **Alisia Smith**, everything clicked on Nov. 20 vs. Central Connecticut State, as she set career highs in a bevy of categories.
- » The Lansing, Michigan native reached double-figures in the scoring column for the first time in her career with a 14-point showing, shooting 6-of-7 from the field.
- » She also posted career-bests in blocked shots (3) and assists (2).
- » In Big Ten play, Smith has steadied her production, averaging 4.1 rebounds and 5.1 points per game, playing 13 minutes per game. **MORE ON PAGE 30**
- » Smith started her first career game vs. Northwestern on Feb. 14 and followed that up with a start at Nebraska.

Double-Double Double

- » At American, freshman **Alisia Smith** and junior **Teniya Page** each collected a double-double with points and rebounds, marking the first time since Jan. 25, 2015 against Northwestern that multiple Lady Lions double-doubles in a game.
- » Page led the team with 19 points and a game-high 13 rebounds, while Smith notched 10 points and 10 boards.
- » It was the first double-double for each student-athlete, including the first double-digit rebound game for the duo.
- » The last Penn State duo to post double-doubles in the same game was **Kalayah Mitchell** (10 p, 15 r) and **Alex Harris** (11 p, 10 r) each accomplished the feat against Northwestern on Jan. 25, 2015.

Siyeh's Sophomore Debut

- » After closing the 2016-17 season on a high note, **Siyeh Frazier** started her sophomore campaign the same way, scoring in double-figures in the first four games to open the 2017-18 slate.
- » Frazier kicked off her sophomore season with a 14-point, 8-steal, 6-assist and 3-rebound night vs. Siena.
- » The eight steals were the most by a Lady Lion since **Alex Bentley** posted eight swipes vs. NJIT on Dec. 23, 2012.
- » Versus Drexel, Frazier scored in double figures, again, marking the first time in her career she netted back-to-back 10-point efforts. She ended with 10 points, two assists and one steal.
- » At Marshall, Frazier logged 11 points on 5-of-7 shooting, to go along with five assists and four more steals.
- » Frazier added 10 points, two rebounds, one blocked shot and one steal in a victory at Providence.

Boards for Boykin

- » After sitting out the second half of her freshman season due to NCAA Transfer Rules and missing the final 16 games of last season due to injury, redshirt-sophomore **De'Janae Boykin** is enjoying her time back on the court.
- » Boykin has pulled down at least five rebounds in 23 of 25 games she has appeared in this season, including a seven double-digit rebound contests.
- » Along with her 19 boards vs. Drexel (*see note below*), Boykin posted three-straight games with 10-plus boards from Nov. 24-30.
- » She notched 11 rebounds vs. Louisiana Tech in the opener of the South Point Thanksgiving Shootout and pulled down a game-high 14 rebounds vs. Kansas State to cap her stay at the event.
- » Boykin tallied 11 boards against Wake Forest in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge and equaled that mark at Rutgers.
- » The Springdale, Md., native also added 10 rebounds vs. Rutgers (1/18) and followed that up with 10 caroms against Illinois (1/23).

Boykin Doubles Up

- » **De'Janae Boykin** returned to the floor on Nov. 10, 2017 vs. Siena after missing the final 16 games of the 2016-17 season due to injury and posted a solid showing with eight points and nine rebounds.
- » Following her efforts against the Saints, Boykin poured in a career-high 14 points and hauled in a career-best 19 rebounds for her first career double-double.
- » Boykin has led the Lady Lions in rebounding eight times in 2017-18.
- » The redshirt-sophomore's 19 rebounds rank tied for No. 11 in program history - tied with three others - and are the most by a Penn Stater since **Nikki Greene** hauled in 20 rebounds vs. Cal State Northridge on Nov. 24, 2012.
- » The 19-rebound effort ranks tied for No. 23 nationally this season and is the third-highest single game total in the Big Ten.

New Addition

- » Head coach **Coquese Washington** announced the addition of **Kayleigh Semion** as a walk-on.
- » Semion, a junior, has served as a team manager for the last season and a half and competed as a member of the club basketball team for the past two years.
- » Her family is no stranger to the Blue and White, as her sister, Meredith, was a part of the Touch of Blue majorettes during her time on campus.
- » As a prep, she scored 1,323 points, grabbed 492 rebounds, and added 364 assists and 348 steals in 116 games played. Semion started every game during her prep career and connected on 238 career 3-pointers.
- » Semion earned first-team All-Lackawanna Conference, *Scranton Times-Tribune* All-Region, second-team All-State selection, Lackawanna Conference Player of the Year and *Scranton Times-Tribune* Northeast Pennsylvania Player of the Year as a senior.

Inking Three

- » Penn State added three student-athletes for the 2018-19 campaign on Wednesday, Nov. 8, as head coach Coquese Washington and her staff saw National Letters of Intent arrive from three different states.
- » **Lauren Ebo** (Washington, D.C.), **Karisma Ortiz** (San Jose, Calif.) and **Bexley Wallace** (Pickerington, Ohio) all inked their NLI's on the first day of the early signing period.
- » Ortiz is the highest ranked signee, sitting at No. 54 nationally according to *ESPN/HoopGurlz*, as the guard from San Jose, California averaged 9.3 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists.
- » After spending her first two prep seasons at Paul VI Catholic School, Ebo averaged 10.3 points and 7.7 rebounds at Riverdale Baptist School as a junior.
- » Wallace has been a force for Pickerington Central High School and spent one summer with the USA Basketball 16U squad, winning a bronze medal at the 2015 FIBA Americas Championships.

30-Point Pair

- » Junior **Teniya Page** and sophomore **Jaida Travascio-Green** have done something only two other Penn State tandems have ever accomplished: produce 30-point games in the same season.
- » Travascio-Green netted 31 points vs. Drexel on Nov. 12, while Page poured in 34 points against Rutgers on Jan. 18.
- » Page was also a part of the second occurrence, when her 31 points vs. Michigan on Jan. 17, 2016 was joined by **Lindsey Spann**'s 30 points at Minnesota on Jan. 3, 2016.
- » The first set of teammates to post 30-point games in the same season were **Maren Walseth** (35; vs. Michigan, 1/27/2000) and **Lisa Shepard** (31; vs. St. Joseph's, 11/27/1999) during the 1999-2000 season.

Sans Seniors

- » Penn State enters the 2017-18 season with no seniors on its roster, making it one of 11 NCAA Division I programs without a senior on its 2016-17 roster.
- » Of the 349 Division I women's basketball programs, only Penn State, Alabama A&M, Arizona State, Delaware State, FIU, Fresno State, Houston Baptist, Omaha, Portland State, Utah State and VCU are without "senior leadership" on the roster.

COACHES CORNER

Washington Eyes No. 200

- » In her 11th season at the helm of the Lady Lion program, head coach **Coquese Washington** has amassed 196 career victories, leaving her just four shy of reaching the 200-win mark for her career.
- » Over a decade on the Penn State sideline, Washington has enjoyed three Big Ten regular season championships, six postseason appearances - including four NCAA Tournament berths - and five 20-win campaigns.
- » She looks to become the 16th head coach to reach 200 wins at a single Big Ten institution, with five of those coaches still active (*Lisa Bluder, Iowa; Brenda Frese, Maryland; Suzy Merchant, Michigan State; C. Vivian Stringer, Iowa & Rutgers; Sharon Versyp, Purdue*).

WNBA Connections

- » Penn State's WNBA connections run deep, starting with 15 student-athlete's drafted and continuing on to the three staff members that played in the organization.
- » Head coach **Coquese Washington**, along with assistant coach **Itoor Coleman** and **Tamika (Williams) Jeter**, all had their time on the floor in the WNBA.
- » Penn State is the lone school in the NCAA with three coaches on staff with WNBA experience. Eight other Division I programs boast two coaches with WNBA experience. (*Research provided by Florida Atlantic Athletic Communications*)
- » On the player-side of the coin, Lady Lion alum **Alex Bentley** capped her fifth WNBA season with 8.4 points, 2.9 assists, 1.5 rebounds and 0.8 steals per game in 2017 for the Connecticut Sun.
- » Bentley was a 2015 WNBA All-Star for Connecticut and helped the Atlanta Dream to the WNBA Finals during her rookie season in 2013.
- » Historically, Penn State has seen two alumni hoist the WNBA Championship trophy, with **Tanisha Wright** winning a title in Seattle and **Kelly Mazzante** winning a pair of titles in Phoenix.
- » Bentley, **Helen Darling** (San Antonio) and **Maggie Lucas** (Indiana) each helped their respective organizations to the WNBA Finals.

EFFICIENT OFFENSE

- » Penn State picked up right where it left off during the 2016-17 season: limiting turnovers. After setting a school standard in fewest turnovers per game last season, Penn State is right back in the top-5 this year.
- » Of the top-10 seasons in fewest turnovers per game, five of them have come under head coach **Coquese Washington**.
- » The top-10 seasons for offensive efficiency are below;

Turning 'Em Over

- » Penn State is forcing 16.36 turnovers per game this season, including seven games with 20-plus missteps forced.
- » In the non-conference, Penn State pressured five opponents into 20-plus turnovers; Siena (26; 11/10/17), Marshall (22; 11/15/17), Central Connecticut State (20; 11/20/17), Wake Forest (20; 11/30/17) and Manhattan (21; 12/3/17).
- » In Big Ten play, Penn State posted back-to-back games with 20 turnovers, pushing Michigan State (2/4/18) and Iowa (2/8/18) to the mark.
- » The 26 missteps by Siena in the season opener are the most turnovers forced by a Penn State since forcing 26 vs. Oregon State on Nov. 11, 2013.
- » Penn State has 15 games this season with nine-or-more steals - including 11 double-digit steal games - and is averaging 8.5 steals per game this season.

Miniscule Missteps

- » For just the fourth time since 1990-91, the Penn State women's basketball team committed fewer than 10 turnovers in consecutive games during the 2017-18 campaign.
 - » The Lady Lions turned the ball over nine times vs. Illinois at the Bryce Jordan Center on Jan. 23, 2018 and followed that with just seven missteps at Purdue on Jan. 28, 2018.

- » For the 32nd time in program history, Penn State has topped the 10-win mark on its home court, posting a record of 11-2 with one game remaining at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- » This is the seventh time that head coach **Coquese Washington** has guided the Lady Lions to double-digit wins at home in her 11 seasons.
- » Of the 32 10-win seasons at home, 15 have come at the Bryce Jordan Center and 15 were accomplished at Rec Hall, while one streak was split between the BJC (8 wins) and Rec Hall (4 wins) in 1995-96 and one was split between Rec Hall (6 wins) and White Building (5 wins) in 1978-79.
- » The 1978-79 season, with Penn State going 6-2 at Rec Hall and 5-0 at White Building, was the first 10-win home slate in Penn State history.

Freebies For All

- » When you look at the NCAA rankings, you will find only **Teniya Page** among the top 150 individuals in the free throw categories. However, as a team the Lady Lions are among the best in the NCAA in both free throws made and attempted.
- » Penn State's 566 free throws attempted lead the Big Ten and its 417 makes are No. 2 in the conference. Those totals sit No. 29 and No. 16 in the NCAA, respectively.
- » Page currently sits No. 46 nationally and No. 6 in the Big Ten with 118 makes from the stripe, while her 83.1 clip at the line is No. 65 in the NCAA and No. 3 in the conference.

3-point Prowess

- » After finished No. 3 on the single season 3-pointers made charts last season, Penn State has picked up right where it left off, averaging 6.2 made 3-pointers per game in 2017-18.
 - » Currently, the 2017-18 squad sits No. 8 on the single season list at Penn State with 169 makes from distance.

- » The Lady Lions moved into the top-10 after a seven-make evening at Iowa (2/8/18), pushing their season total to 160 at that point in the season.
- » Against Kansas State, Penn State made 13 shots from 3-point range, its most since hitting 14 shots from distance vs. North Carolina on Nov. 30, 2011.
- » Penn State has reached double-figures in makes from distance on two other occasions this season, hitting 12 3-pointers at Marshall and at Wisconsin.
- » On an individual level, sophomore **Jaida Travascio-Green** has hit at least three shots from deep in 12-of-26 games this season, including seven triples vs. Drexel and six at Wisconsin. She also has five makes from deep vs. Kansas State.
- » Freshman **Kamaria McDaniel** hit five 3-pointers at Marshall, while redshirt-sophomore **Amari Carter** hit five at Wisconsin.

Road Warriors

- » Penn State wrapped up a four-game road trip on Thursday, Dec. 28 at Michigan to open up Big Ten play.
- » It was the longest stretch of true road games since the 2006-07 season, when the Lady Lions spent four-straight games on the road in December.
- » This season, Penn State finished the road trip at 1-3, winning at Pittsburgh (59-48; 12/17), while dropping games at St. Bonaventure (65-52; 12/9), at American (75-66, OT; 12/20) and at Michigan (89-69; 12/28).
- » The 2006-07 swing saw Penn State post a 1-3 mark, winning at Georgetown (52-44; 12/17), but falling at Mississippi (65-48; 12/10), at Illinois (74-65, OT; 12/28) and at No. 13 Purdue (70-44; 12/31).
- » There are only five longer stretches of consecutive road games in Penn State history;

- » After playing four-straight road games to end 2017, the Lady Lions will play five of the final eight games of the regular season on the road.
- » The season-ending streak began at Purdue (L, 77-83) and continues on Jan. 31 at No. 17/18 Ohio State (L, 64-94).
- » After a stop at home to face Michigan State (W, 74-59) on Super Bowl Sunday, Penn State traveled to the west-rim of the conference, starting at Iowa (L, 76-80) on Feb. 8. and finished at Minnesota (L, 68-101) on Feb. 11.
- » A pair of home games bookend a trip to Nebraska (L, 51-59) on Feb. 22. The home games come vs. Northwestern (W, 67-59) on Valentine's Day and against Ohio State (Noon) in the 12th annual Play4Kay Game benefitting Pink Zone.

Block Party

- » Penn State currently ranks No. 56 nationally and No. 8 in the Big Ten with 119 blocked shots (4.3 bpg). **MORE ON PAGE 23**
- » In 2016-17, Penn State blocked just 98 shots (3.1 bpg), however the Lady Lions surpassed that total in the 26th game of the 2017-18 season.
- » Junior **Jaylen Williams** sits No. 116 nationally and No. 8 in the conference with 38 blocked shots on the year.
- » The 2017-18 squad wasted no time getting into the record books, as the 13 rejections vs. Drexel rank No. 2 all-time in Bryce Jordan Center history and sit No. 4 all-time in single game history.
- » The 14 blocked shots vs. Purdue on Jan. 12, 2014 remains the BJC standard and one of three 14-block efforts in program history, also rejected 14 shots vs. Boston (1/22/82) and Delaware (2/15/80).

Double-Digit Deficits

- » Penn State has overcome two double-digit second-half deficits this season, with a 13-point rally against Northwestern on Feb. 14, 2018 and a 10-point margin against Fordham on Dec. 6, 2017.
- » The Lady Lions trailed Fordham 54-44 with 7:48 to play in the fourth quarter at the Bryce Jordan Center, before outscoring the Rams, 21*-8 down the stretch to collect the win, 65-60.
- » Against Northwestern, Penn State trailed by 13 points with 1:02 to play in the third quarter and entered the fourth quarter trailing by eight points, 45-37. Over the final 11 minutes of the game, the Lady Lions outscored the Wildcats 35-14.

Overtime Overtures

- » On Dec. 20 at American, Penn State played the 41st overtime game in program history, falling 75-66 to the Eagles.
- » The Lady Lions are now 21-20 all-time in overtime contests, including an 11-11 mark in true road overtime games.
- » It was the first overtime game for Penn State since a Jan. 30, 2016 double overtime game vs. Purdue at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- » The overtime road contest was the first since Dec. 2, 2010 when Penn State fell 113-104 at Boston College.

Super Bowl Sunday

- » Penn State played for the 27th time in program history on Super Bowl Sunday. The Lady Lions improved to 18-9 record all-time when playing on the final day of the NFL season.
- » The first game on Super Bowl Sunday came on Jan. 30, 1983, a 75-60 setback vs. No. 8 Tennessee at Rec Hall. That night, the Washington Redskins defeated the Miami Dolphins, 27-17, at the Rose Bowl.
- » Penn State is 9-4 at home and 9-5 on the road on Super Bowl Sunday.
- » By Super Bowl winner, the Lady Lions are 11-4 when the NFC is victorious and 7-5 when the AFC wins the World Championship.

Tough Sledding

- » Three of Penn State's first four opponents to open Big Ten play had a ranking next to their name, marking the first time in program history the Lady Lions opened conference play against three ranked teams in the first four opponents.
- » The stretch is one of the toughest in program history, with Penn State playing three ranked opponents in any four-game stretch of conference play only twice before.
- » The 2010-11 squad faced No. 23/24 Ohio State (W, 80-71), at Michigan (W, 81-63), at No. 20/22 Iowa (W, 82-75) and hosted No. 13/11 Michigan State (L, 49-60).
- » In 2004-05, the Lady Lions navigated a stretch that included No. 23 Purdue (W, 77-54), No. 8 Michigan State (W, 73-56), at Northwestern (L, 48-59) and No. 10 Minnesota (W, 81-68).
- » Outside of conference play, Penn State has six other such occurrences, doing so in 1977-78 (three-straight top 25 opponents), 1978-79 (five-straight), 1982-83, 1983-84 (three-straight), 1985-86 and 1991-92.

Back-to-Back Ranked Foes

- » Penn State played its first two conference games vs. ranked opponents this season, marking the first time since 2004-05 that the Blue and White opened conference play vs. back-to-back ranked foes.
- » It is also just the second time in Penn State's BIG tenure they opened against back-to-back Top 25 teams, also doing so in 2003-04.
- » This season, Penn State fell at No. 19/21 Michigan (69-89) and vs. No. 15/14 Maryland (65-69).
- » In 2004-05, Penn State hosted No. 7 Ohio State (W, 69-62) and traveled to No. 18 Iowa (W, 77-71). That season, the Blue and White played at Marquette between the two BIG games.
- » The 2003-04 season saw the Lady Lions play at No. 7 Purdue (W, 47-42) and against No. 22 Michigan State (W, 64-62) at home. Those were back-to-back games.

In The Rankings

- » Penn State is playing its 26th season in the Big Ten Conference and the Lady Lions are playing one of the toughest schedule they have ever played against conference foes.
- » As of the February 20, 2018 national rankings, Penn State will play six ranked BIG opponents during the 2017-18 regular season.
- » All-time against ranked Big Ten opponents, Penn State is 49-55.
- » Currently this season, Penn State is 1-4 in conference games vs. ranked opponents.
- » The most ranked Big Ten opponents the Lady Lions have faced in a single season are six, with that happening on five occasions. The Blue and White have also met five ranked foes in conference play in six seasons.

BIG Winning Streaks

- » Penn State extended its winning streak to 13 games vs. Northwestern with a 67-59 victory on Wednesday, Feb. 14, 2018.
- » The Blue and White own just three winning streaks of 10-plus games against a single opponent in the 26 seasons in the Big Ten Conference, including the current streak vs. the Wildcats.
- » The other two streaks include a pair of 12-game spurts: vs. Minnesota from Feb. 19, 1995-Jan. 6, 2003 and again vs. Northwestern from Jan. 30, 1998-Feb. 1, 2004.
- » Penn State also owns nine-game winning streaks against Indiana and Wisconsin during their time as conference opponents.
- » The longest winning streak overall in against one opponent in Penn State women's basketball history is a 14-game streak vs. Massachusetts, which is active. The last meeting with the Minutemen came on Feb. 16, 1991.

B1G Highlights

- » Penn State is in its 26th season as a member of the Big Ten.
- » The Lady Lions own an all-time mark of 268-161 in conference play.
- » All-time, Penn State is 160-55 at home in Big Ten conference games, while owning a 108-106 mark in road games.
- » Penn State's eight regular season championships since 1992-93 are tied for the most won by any Big Ten team with Ohio State (7). Purdue (6) is next closest.
- » The Lady Lions also own a pair of Big Ten Tournament titles, winning in 1995 & 1996.
- » Their 25 NCAA Tournament appearances tied for No. 2 in the Big Ten. Purdue has 26 appearances, while Penn State, Iowa and Rutgers each have 24 NCAA Tournament appearances.

B1G Bragging Rights

- » Penn State owns an overall mark of 350-219 against the current members of the Big Ten, including an overall winning record against 10 of the 13 teams in the conference.
- » Since joining the conference in 1992-93, the Lady Lions are 295-182 vs. its conference brethren. That mark includes a 268-161 mark in conference play, a 26-21 mark in the Big Ten Tournament and one win vs. Indiana in the 1998 WNIT Semifinals.
- » Since 1992-93, Penn State owns an overall winning mark vs. 10 of the 13 Big Ten teams.

- » After opening its 26th season as a member of the Big Ten with a loss at Michigan, Penn State owns a 14-12 record in Big Ten openers.
- » Penn State met Michigan in Ann Arbor for the first time in a Big Ten opener this season.
- » The Lady Lions opened Big Ten play on the road for first time since the 2014-15 season, after opening the last two years at home (*W, 79-72 vs. Northwestern; L, 70-89 vs. Indiana*).
- » In road openers, Penn State is 13-13 all-time, losing five-straight B1G road openers. The last B1G road opening win for the Lady Lions was on Jan. 5, 2014 at Iowa, defeating the No. 23 Hawkeyes, 87-71.
- » The Lady Lions are 16-9 all-time in the first Big Ten home game of the season.

Upon arriving on the University Park campus as the fifth head coach in Penn State women's history - and first female African-American head coach in Penn State history - Coquese Washington quickly returned the program to national prominence with her up-tempo, aggressive style of play. Entering her 11th season on the sideline in Happy Valley, her passion for creating a winning culture, predicated on innovative coaching techniques, tireless recruiting, cultivating meaningful relationships with student-athletes and an unmatched enthusiasm for teaching the game she loves, Washington is in the conversation as one of the nation's top head coaches.

Washington has seen success at every level of basketball and in every role she has filled on the sidelines. She became the first player at Flint Central High School to earn a starting position all four seasons and helped her squad to the program's first Saginaw Valley League and district championships, while earning all-state honors on two occasions.

She went on to earn four varsity letters at the University of Notre Dame, leading the team in steals four times and assists on three occasions, before moving on to professional basketball where she was a member of the 2000 WNBA Champion Houston Comets squad.

On the sidelines, she has appeared in the postseason 14 times, with 12 of those being NCAA Tournament appearances. She helped the Lady Lions to four straight berths in the NCAA Tournament - including a pair of Sweet Sixteen appearances - and was an assistant coach on Notre Dame's 2001 NCAA National Championship team. Her three straight Big Ten Championships make her one of just four coaches in Big Ten history with three-or-more consecutive Big Ten regular season championships (Jim Foster, Ohio State; C. Vivian Stringer, Iowa & Tara VanDerwever, Ohio State), taking home outright crowns in 2012 and 2013, while sharing the 2014 title.

Growing the Game

The professionals that are most successful often share one trait; they are thinkers, and Washington is no different. As a student-athlete at Notre Dame, Washington earned her degree in just three years. After her collegiate career was complete, Washington went on to earn her Juris Doctorate from her alma mater, while simultaneously playing in the professional ranks for the American Basketball League's (ABL) Portland Power. Her passion for learning is matched only by her love of family and basketball.

Washington served on the WBCA Board of Directors during each of her first 10 seasons as Penn State's head coach, holding the role of President from 2015-17 with the organization that is tasked with solving issues, preserving the history and growing the game of women's basketball. She was also the Vice President/President-Elect from 2013-15.

Her service to the game also includes time with USA Basketball, the Kay Yow Cancer Fund and the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee. She won a gold medal with Team USA in Kazan, Russia at the 2013 World University Games and served on the USA Basketball Women's Junior National Committee from 2009-12. Her work with the Kay Yow Cancer Fund Board of Directors ran from 2012-15 and she served five years on the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee.

Of her many accomplishments, Washington was the founding President of the WNBA Players Association in 1999 and was a primary force in negotiating the association's first two collective bargaining agreements.

Recruiting Premier Talent

The recruiting trail has always been a place of success for Washington, with the Lady Lions signing four top-25 recruiting classes - including three top-15 classes - since her arrival in Happy Valley. Her top-25 recruiting classes have included a pair of 14th-ranked classes (2009, 2013), one that sat at No. 15 (2015) and one that came in 22nd nationally (2010).

Prior to Washington's arrival, Penn State had only signed one McDonald's All-American in program history, but the seasoned recruiter has brought six to campus in her 10 years as head coach. Candice Agee (2012), Brianna Banks (2011), De'Janae Boykin (2015), Maggie Lucas (2010), Sierra Moore (2012) and Dara Taylor (2009) have all donned the McDonald's All-American uniform before matriculating to the University Park campus.

Led by the All-American duo of Indiana native Alex Bentley and Lone Star State product Nikki Greene, Washington's 2009 class also included all-state performers Gizelle Studevent (California) and Marissa Wolfe (Pennsylvania), along with transfer Mia Nickson (Virginia), who was a top-100 recruit coming out of high school in 2008. In 2010, Washington landed a pair of Pennsylvania's top players in shooting guard Maggie Lucas and forward Talia East, while the three-person class was boosted by New York wing and WBCA High School All-American Arielle Edwards.

In 2013, Washington and her staff inked a seven-person class that included four ESPN HoopGurlz Top-100 players, including the Georgia duo of Kaliyah Mitchell and Peyton Whitted, and Maryland guard Lindsey Spann. The 2013 class was also bolstered by the addition of Duke transfer Sierra Moore, who was a top-50 national recruit in the class of 2012.

A pair of five-star guards in Chicago native Teniya Page and Maryland product Amari Carter led the way for the class of 2015. Adding to a strong recruiting haul was the highly recruited post pair of Kentucky's Ashanti Thomas and Boston-area product Jaylen Williams.

Washington came to Happy Valley after eight seasons as an associate head coach and assistant coach under Muffet McGraw at Notre Dame, her alma mater. One of the top recruiters in the country, Washington was instrumental in helping the Irish secure eight consecutive top-25 recruiting classes, a feat only accomplished by two other programs in the country (Connecticut and Tennessee).

WNBA: Pioneer and Pupils

A pioneer in advancing the WNBA both on and off the court, Washington continues to supply the league with top notch talent, sending six Penn Staters to play in the world's most competitive professional league.

Alex Bentley and Maggie Lucas are two of Washington's pupils that have seen success on the grand stage, with Bentley playing in the WNBA Finals as a rookie and earning WNBA All-Star status in 2015. Lucas also competed in the WNBA Finals, helping the Indiana Fever to the WNBA Championship series against the Minnesota Lynx during the 2015 season.

In 2014, Lucas was selected with the 21st overall pick (second round) by the Phoenix Mercury, then was traded to the Indiana Fever during training camp. In her third year as a professional, Lucas saw her court time increase each season, before suffering a season-ending injury in the fourth game of the 2016 campaign, an injury that

ultimately sidelined her in 2017, as well. Also in 2014, Ariel Edwards inked a free agent contract with the Tulsa Shock.

In 2013, for the third time in program history, the Lady Lion program saw a pair of student-athletes selected in the WNBA Draft. Bentley went 13th overall to the Atlanta Dream and Nikki Greene was selected 26th overall by the Phoenix Mercury. Bentley has found a home with the Connecticut Sun after competing one season for the Atlanta Dream, and playing in the WNBA Finals that year. A WNBA All-Rookie selection in 2013, she was among the MVP candidates in 2015 before missing the final nine games of the season with an injury.

Greene played two years in the league, suiting up for the Los Angeles Sparks in 2014 before teaming up with Bentley in Connecticut during the 2015 season.

Tyra Grant capped off her Penn State career by being selected by the Phoenix Mercury in the second round of the 2010 WNBA Draft, and Washington was also instrumental in helping Kam Gissendanner sign a free agent contract with the WNBA's Los Angeles Sparks following in the 2008 campaign. Edwards and Zhaque Gray have also signed free agent contracts with WNBA teams, inking deals with the Tulsa Shock and Chicago Sky, respectively, in 2014.

During her time at Notre Dame, Washington saw seven players earn roster spots on WNBA teams.

Dancing Shoes

In 18 years as a collegiate coach, Washington has laced up her dancing shoes and headed to the postseason on 14 occasions, including 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament. While coaching the Blue and White, Washington has guided the program to four NCAA Tournament berths and a pair of appearances in the WNIT.

From 2011-14, the Lady Lions advanced to the NCAA Tournament each season, reaching at least the second round on all four occasions. The 2012 and 2014 squads moved on to the Sweet Sixteen with a pair of postseason wins, before falling to top-five ranked opponents.

The 2016-17 campaign marked a return to the postseason for Penn State, piling up a 21-11 overall record on its way to the third round of the WNIT. Penn State topped Ohio and Fordham, before bowing out to Virginia Tech.

In their fourth straight NCAA Tournament appearance, the 2014 squad hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament inside the Bryce Jordan Center for the 14th time in school history. Wins over Wichita State in the opening round and a 22-point rout of Florida in the second round sent the program to its 13th Sweet Sixteen. A date with No. 5/6 Stanford awaited in Palo Alto, as the No. 3 seed Lady Lions fell to the No. 2 seed Cardinal at Maples Pavilion to close out a 24-8 campaign, which included a Big Ten regular season title.

In 2013, Penn State again advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a win over Cal Poly in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The 26-6 campaign ended with a loss to LSU on their home court. The Lady Lions advanced to the 2012 Sweet Sixteen with wins over UTEP and LSU in Baton Rouge before falling to No. 3/3 Connecticut en route to a 26-7 overall record.

The Lady Lions worked their way back to the "Big Dance" for the first time since 2004-05 and advanced to the second round for the first time in seven years with a win over Dayton in the first round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament in front of a raucous Bryce Jordan Center crowd. Washington's first appearances in the tournament as a head coach started with a 75-66 win over Dayton.

Washington's first taste of postseason play as a head coach came against Hofstra in the 2010 WNIT. The Lady Lions hosted the contest on the University Park campus, but the Pride got the best of a young Lady Lions squad in the opening round.

During Washington's eight years on the bench, Notre Dame reached the NCAA Tournament each season, including four Sweet Sixteen runs and the 2001 National Championship.

Trophies & All-Americans

Washington's competitive side shines brightest on the biggest stages and that is a trait that her teams have taken on during her tenure on the University Park campus, as well. Washington's teams have advanced out of the first round of the NCAA Tournament in all four of trips, while earning berths in the Sweet Sixteen twice.

From 2012-14, the Lady Lions claimed three straight Big Ten regular season titles, making them one of just four teams in conference history to win three-or-more regular season crowns in a row. Washington's squads took the title outright in 2012 and 2013, while sharing the crown in 2014.

Washington is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2012, 2013 & 2014), a two-time WBCA Region Six Coach of the Year (2012 & 2013) and two-time finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year (2012 & 2013). She was also selected as the 2011 and 2014 Black Coaches Association Female Coach of the Year.

On the national awards front, Washington's players have earned a host of national honors from All-America laurels to honors for community service and selflessness. Teniya Page joined the list of Washington pupils to earn national honors after her standout sophomore campaign. The Chicago, Illinois native became just the second Penn State to earn WBCA All-America laurels as a sophomore (Kelly Mazzante).

Maggie Lucas finished her Penn State career as one of the most decorated student-athletes to pass through the Lady Lion program. Lucas was a two-time finalist for the Wade Trophy and Wooden Award, while earning nine All-American honors, including first team honors from the United State Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) in 2013 and 2014. She was a three-time AP All-American, garnering second team (2013), third team (2014) and honorable mention (2012) accolades during her career.

Alex Bentley was a two-time All-American, earning AP honorable mention laurels in 2013, and WBCA naming her honorable mention All-America in 2012 and 2013. One of the toughest defenders in the nation and a scoring threat from anywhere on the court, Bentley was the 2013 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winner as the nation's top player under 5-foot-8.

Bentley and Lucas were both named to Freshman All-America teams during their rookie seasons of 2010 and 2011, respectively, while Tyra Grant was Washington's first All-American, garnering honorable mention honors in 2010 from the *Associated Press*.

On-court accolades are not the only ones celebrated by the Lady Lion program, with Gizelle Studevent and Maggie Lucas each earning national attention for their off-court undertakings. Studevent was a member of the 2013 Allstate WBCA Good Works Team, honoring student-athletes that have made outstanding contributions in the areas of volunteerism and civic involvement. Studevent was the lifeblood and founder of the anti-bullying program Penn State Athletes Take Action (PSATA). Earning a selection to the 2014 Senior CLASS Award All-American Team, Lucas was one of 10 women's basketball student-athletes to be celebrated for the award that is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School.

During her tenure at Notre Dame, Washington coached five All-Americans in her role as the guards coach, and was directly responsible for developing three All-Americans and two Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award winners: Niele Ivey and Megan Duffy. Washington also worked with Alicia Ratay, who is the NCAA's career 3-point field goal percentage leader.

Big Things Happening

In 10 seasons on the sideline, Washington has seen 16 players earn All-Big Ten laurels on 28 occasions, along with three each earning Big Ten All-Freshman Team and Big Ten All-Defensive Team honors. Among the All-Big Ten honorees, five of Washington's pupils account for 10 first team selections and Penn State has seen multiple players earn all-conference in nine of her 10 seasons on the sideline.

Earning Big Ten Player of the Year on two occasions (2013 & 2014), Maggie Lucas was also the 2011 Big Ten Freshman and Sixth Player of the Year. Lucas joins Alex Bentley as three-time All-Big Ten first team selections under Washington. Teniya Page became just the fourth Lady Lion to earn consensus All-Big Ten first team as a sophomore in 2016-17, while Tyra Grant (2009 & 2010) and Ariel Edwards (2014) round out the group of first teamers.

Dara Taylor became the first Lady Lion under Washington to win the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, claiming the award in 2014, while also getting the nod to the All-Defensive Team in 2013. Bentley was also a two-time Big Ten All-Defensive Team choice (2012 & 2013), while Nikki Greene earned her selection to the squad for her shot blocking prowess in 2011.

In 2016, Penn State placed three players on the All-Big Ten team, highlighted by Page's selection to the All-Big Ten second team as a true freshman. Her second team selection made her just the third Penn State rookie to earn either first or second team honors at season's end, joining Lucas (2nd team; 2011) and Kelly Mazzante (1st team; 2001). Adding to the haul of all-conference honors were Brianna Banks and Lindsey Spann, each earning honorable mention selections.

During Washington's first Big Ten Championship run in 2012, her squad put five players on the All-Big Ten squad. Bentley and Lucas each earned first team honors that season, and Greene, Zhaque Gray and Mia Nickson all noted honorable mention accolades. Both the 2011 and 2014 teams placed four players on the All-Big Ten squads, with the 2016 team joining the 2008 and 2013 teams that each had three representatives.

Washington is a stout believer in getting her best players on the floor regardless of position or class, with three student-athletes earning a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman squad. Bentley (2010) and Page (2016) were both unanimous all-rookie picks, and Lucas secured a spot on the 2011 list.

The success of her student-athletes isn't confined to the hardwood, as the Lady Lion program has 47 Academic All-Big Ten honorees over her 10 seasons. The 2015

squad set a school record with seven honorees on the list, while her 2009 and 2013 teams each saw six honorees for academic success. The 2016 team had a school-record three student-athletes named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, awarded to Big Ten student-athletes with a minimum GPA of 3.7 or higher for the previous academic year. Sarah McMurtry, Kalyah Mitchell and Spann all earned the honor, giving Penn State the most representatives of any Big Ten women's basketball program in 2016-17.

Play to Your Strengths

Washington's style of play lends itself to being up-tempo and high scoring, which has enabled the program to rise to new heights and return to the national spotlight. As a member of the Big Ten Conference, her teams are playing one of the toughest conference slates in the country, but that doesn't stop Washington from scheduling key non-conference games against the nation's best teams – home and on the road.

In each of Washington's first six years, Penn State improved its Big Ten win total and the Lady Lions posted three consecutive 25-win seasons, joining the 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 squads as the only teams in program history to accomplish the feat.

During Washington's first 10 seasons, Penn State has toppled ranked opponents in eight of those seasons; winning multiple games against ranked foes during each of those campaigns. Her first season in Happy Valley included wins over No. 20 Pittsburgh and No. 10 Duke. The 2011-12 squad traveled to No. 16/13 Texas A&M for a top-20 showdown with the Aggies and walked away with 63-58 victory to snap a 58-game non-conference home court winning streak for TAMU.

The 2016 squad also had its share of success against ranked opponents, pushing No. 4 Tennessee to the brink in an early season road test, before opening the Big Ten schedule with a 79-72 victory over then-No. 14 Northwestern at the Bryce Jordan Center. Avenging an earlier loss to Michigan State, Penn State traveled to East Lansing and handed the then-No. 15 Spartans a 65-61 defeat in front of a national television audience on the Big Ten Network.

Inside the Bryce Jordan Center, the home crowd was delighted by a pair of top-25 victories on the way to a school-record-tying 16-2 overall home record. On Nov. 20, it started with a 70-56 victory over then-No. 13 Tennessee and continued with a thrilling triumph over No. 24 Michigan, 76-75, to cap the 11th annual Play4Kay game benefiting Pink Zone in front of 8,213 fans.

The Penn State record books have also been invaded by Washington's teams and student-athletes.

Teniya Page was a catalyst on the court in 2015-16, as she was the only freshman in the NCAA to average at least 15 points and four assists per game. She became just the third rookie in Penn State history to reach the 400-point and 100-assist mark – and first since Suzie McConnell (1984-85).

Continuing her ascent into the national conversation in 2016-17, Page became the first Lady Lion to amass 200 made field goals, 60 made 3-pointers, 100 made free throws and 100 assists in a single season. She also became just the fourth Penn Stater to reach the 1,000-point mark prior to the end of her sophomore campaign, joining the group of Kelly Mazzante, Maggie Lucas and Susan Robinson – the top three scorers in Lady Lion history.

Lucas finished her career second in school history and fourth in Big Ten history in scoring (2,510) and broke the Penn State and Big Ten records for career 3-pointers made (365) and career free throw percentage (.907). Lucas left Penn State ranked among the top-five on 25 different single season or career charts.

Nikki Greene became the first player in school history to accumulate 1,000 points, 900 rebounds and 200 blocks, while Alex Bentley is one of only two players (Suzie McConnell) in program history with 1,500 points, 500 assists and 250 steals. Brianne O'Rourke closed out her career as an All-Big Ten performer and left Penn State as one of just six players in school history with 1,000 points and 500 assists.

On the team side of things, the 2013-14 graduating class of Lucas, Ariel Edwards, Dara Taylor and Talia East produced 101 wins, which are the second-most wins by a senior class in Lady Lion history.

The 2010-11 team was a dominating force from the perimeter as the Lady Lions tied the school record with 228 3-pointers and led the NCAA from deep with a .415 3-point field goal percentage. Beyond the arc was a place the 2016-17 team thrived, as well, sitting No. 3 in school history with 193 makes from long range. Washington's squad had three student-athletes top the 40-make mark from 3-point range, as Page (64), Lindsey Spann (41) and Jaida Travascio-Green (46) became the second trio in school history to all top the 40-make mark in a single season.

With just 13.0 turnovers per game during the 2016-17 season, Washington's squad set the school standard for taking care of the basketball. That average gives Washington-led teams five of the top 10 lowest turnovers per game marks in program history. To add to that, the 2016-17 squad equaled the school record for fewest turnovers in a game on three occasions, committing just six missteps vs. Wisconsin, Purdue and Fordham.

Double Domer

Washington was a four-year starting point guard for Notre Dame under McGraw and was the team captain on Notre Dame's first-ever NCAA Tournament team. She was a two-time All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference (MCC) selection and led the Irish to three MCC Tournament titles. Washington led the team in steals in each of her four seasons and was tops on the squad in assists three times. Washington is first on UND's all-time steals per game list (2.7), third in career steals (307), and sixth in assists (554).

The epitome of a student-athlete, Washington graduated from Notre Dame in 1992, a full year ahead of schedule, with a bachelor's degree in history. She went on to attain "Double Domer" status in 1997 after earning her Juris Doctorate from the Notre Dame Law School.

The Consummate Professional

Washington juggled finishing her law degree with the start of her professional basketball career, returning to the hardwood as a professional in 1997-98 with the ABL's Portland Power before spending a two-year stint with the WNBA's New York Liberty (1998-99).

Moving to Houston in 2000, Washington played an instrumental role in leading the Comets to the WNBA title. Her solid season in 2001 with the Comets for Hall of Fame coach Van Chancellor, saw her finish ninth in the WNBA in assists and fourth in steals as Houston earned its fifth consecutive playoff berth. Washington's started the 2002 campaign in Houston before being traded to the Indiana Fever at the midway point of the season. Washington guided the Fever to their first-ever playoff berth, helping her become the first player in WNBA history to lead three different teams to the postseason. She retired from the WNBA in 2003 as a member of the Fever.

Utilizing her law degree, Washington was a central figure in helping create the WNBA Players Association (WNBPA), serving as the founding president of the WNBPA from 1999 until 2001. She also served as the Executive Vice President of the WNBPA from 2001 until her retirement in 2003. Washington led negotiations for the association's first collective bargaining agreement as the association's president, and as the executive vice president was a mainstay in the negotiations for the league's second collective bargaining agreement, which brought about the first free agency system in women's professional sports.

A native of Flint, Michigan, Washington was inducted into the Greater Flint Area Sports Hall of Fame in December 2009.

Serving the Community

Be it on the hardwood, on the golf course, or out on a speaking engagement, Washington is among the most active Penn State coaches in the community. Her annual efforts include Coquese's Drive for the Centre County Women's Resource Center, championing the fight against breast cancer for the Penn State Play4Kay game and supporting her team during their many hours of giving back to the Centre region.

One of the first relationships that Washington established in State College was with the Executive Director of the Centre County Women's Resource Center, Ann Ard. The relationship grew quickly, with the focus shifting to helping the local non-profit find a way to raise funds and provide resources in the fight against domestic violence. In its 10 years, Coquese's Drive has raised more than \$188,000 to benefit the CCWRC.

While the event has spread nationally, Penn State women's basketball was and continues to be a trend-setter in spreading awareness for breast cancer research as the first team in the country to wear pink uniforms. Washington has embraced Pink Zone at Penn State and helped it grow into an annual "can't miss" event for survivors and supporters alike. During her tenure, Washington has seen the program's Play4Kay game grow in both attendance numbers and funds raised. The 698 survivors at the 2014 game are the most in program history, while the \$310,000 raised that year are a benchmark for years to come.

Along with her community involvement, Washington has appointed Miriam Powell as the Director of Community Outreach for the Lady Lion program. 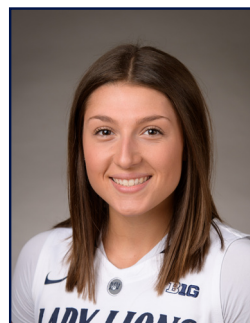
