PENN STATE VS. UTAH

Penn State holds a 2-0 mark in the all-time series against the Utes, having earned both wins during the 1983 season. The Nittany Lions recorded a close 3-2 victory in the first meeting between the two teams on the road Sept. 21, 1983, before claiming a 2-0 victory the next day at the BYU Invitational.

SCOUTING THE UTES

Utah improved to 21-12 on the year after rallying for a 3-1 victory against Yale in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. After losing set one, 29-27, the Utes posted 25-15, 26-24, and 25-16 wins in the next three sets to secure the win. The triumph marked the first NCAA Tournament win for the Utes since 2008.

A trio featuring Erin Brandon-Redd, Shelby Dalton and Morgan Odale are at the helm of the Utah offense, pacing the team with at least 2.30 kills per set each. Dalton's leading the group with 2.67 kills per frame, while Brandon-Redd's .323 hitting clip ranks third on the team. Odale's 24 aces ranks first on the squad, while her 2.29 digs per set ranks second on the team behind Chelsey Schofield, who's averaging 3.22 digs per set. Brandon-Redd is also atop the Utah blocking unit as well, averaging 1.40 per set. Bailey Bateman is close behind, averaging 1.26 blocks per frame.

PENN STATE PUSHES PAST LIU BROOKLYN

The Nittany Lions pushed past LIU Brooklyn in straight-sets (25-21, 25-21, 25-14) Friday evening in Rec Hall to advance to the second round of the 2013 NCAA Tournament. With the victory, the Nittany Lions improved to 28-5 in the first round of the event and 6-0 all-time against the Blackbirds. Penn State has won its last 24 consecutive first round matchups, having posted sweeps against each team.

Senior Ariel Scott led the offense with nine kills on .348 hitting, while also contributing three blocks. Senior Katie Slay posted eight kills on a squad-best .412 hitting clip, registering two digs and six blocks. Junior Nia Grant tallied six kills and one dig, while leading the Nittany Lions blocking unit with seven total blocks, including one solo stop. Two others recorded multi-block performances, including junior Micha Hancock, who had five and senior Deja McClendon, who had three blocks, seven kills and a match-high 10 digs. Hancock also totaled a team-high four aces.

SIX NITTANY LIONS EARN SEVEN BIG TEN POSTSEASON HONORS

Six Nittany Lions earned seven Big Ten postseason awards, as announced by the conference this morning. Junior Micha Hancock highlighted the group with her second consecutive Big Ten Setter of the Year award, while seniors Katie Slay, Ariel Scott and Deja McClendon joined her on the All-Big Ten team. Head coach Russ Rose earned Big Ten Coach of the Year honors.

Hancock is the only recipient of the Big Ten Setter of the Year award as she earned her second consecutive honor. Scott and Slay both posted their third consecutive All-Big Ten team honors, while McClendon notched her fourth consecutive. Senior Maggie Harding rounded out the group as Penn State's sportsmanship award honoree. Rose's honor marks his 12th career award and sixth in the last seven years.

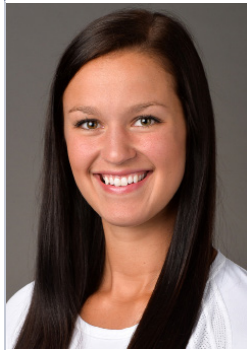

NITTANY LIONS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Nittany Lions enter Saturday's match against Utah after securing a 3-0 win against LIU Brooklyn to stretch the all-time record in the first round to 28-5. With a 78-26 all-time record in the NCAA Tournament, Penn State has totaled 10 trips to the National Semifinals ('93, '94, '97, '98, '99, '07, '08, '09, '10, '12), seven appearances in the NCAA title match ('93, '97, '98, '99, '07, '08, '09, '10) and five National Championships ('99, '07, '08, '09, '10).

SUCCESS IN THE SECOND ROUND

PSU has earned the opportunity to host the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament 27 times since 1981, having welcomed a trio of tournament teams to the court in Rec Hall for the opening rounds of the event in the last 23 consecutive years. The Nittany Lions are 18-5 all-time in round two of the tourney, having posted wins in the last 10 consecutive matches in its second NCAA Tournament outing.

HANCOCK EARNS FIFTH BIG TEN SETTER OF THE WEEK NOD

After guiding the No. 2 Penn State women's volleyball team to a pair of conference victories in the final two regular-season matches of the year, junior Micha Hancock has earned her fifth Big Ten Setter of the Week honor this season. Hancock helped Penn State extend its winning streak to 19 consecutive matches, directing the Nittany Lion offense to wins at Ohio State and No. 10 Nebraska. She highlighted the weekend with a double-double at OSU (28a/14d).

PENN STATE REMAIN NO. 2 IN AVCA TOP 25 POLL

After posting a pair of Big Ten wins on the road to claim the Big Ten title outright, Penn State earned its seventh consecutive No. 2 ranking in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches' Poll. The Nittany Lions also picked up 15 first place votes in the poll. Prior to the No. 2 position, PSU moved between spots No. 1 and No. 4, but has remained within the top five in every poll this season.

HANCOCK SERVES HER WAY TO THE TOP OF THE RECORD BOOK

Averaging 0.66 aces per set, junior Micha Hancock ranks second in the latest NCAA national standings (0.64 as 12/3). Her mark ranks first in the Big Ten. She has moved from first to second periodically throughout the season after leading the nation in the category for first five consecutive weeks of the season.

With four aces against Eastern Kentucky, Hancock notched her 200th career service ace. Building on the mark, she posted two aces against Northwestern last weekend, Hancock moved into sole possession of first place on the Penn State all-time list. Passing Ellen Hensler, who set the record in 1986, Hancock now has 243 aces in her career.

1,120 WINS AND COUNTING

After earning victory number 1,100 against Yale earlier this season, head coach Russ Rose moved into sole possession of second place on the NCAA DI wins list with victory number 1,107 at Northwestern. With the triumph, Rose passed former UCLA head coach Andy Banachowski, who previously owned the record.

With 1,120 wins, Rose is presently eight wins shy of tying current Hawaii head coach Dave Shoji for first on the all-time list with 1,128 career victories. Earlier this season, Shoji surpassed Banachowski, taking the top spot as the newest leader in the category.

THE BEST BLOCKING IN THE NATION

Overall, Penn State's 3.12 blocks per set ranks first among all DI programs in the country, while also ranking first in the Big Ten. Katie Slay is at the helm of the Nittany Lion blocking unit, averaging 1.64 per frame, which ranks third in the nation and first in the conference.

THAT'S SOME HEAVY HITTING

Micha Hancock has paced the Nittany Lions to a .311 overall hitting percentage in 2013, which ranks fourth in the nation and leads the Big Ten. Penn State is also averaging 14.08 kills per set, which is good for 28th in the country (as of 12/3) and second in the conference.

Individually, senior Katie Slay's .403 hitting efficiency ranks 24th in the nation and first in the Big Ten. Junior Nia Grant is close behind, as her .394 (.401 as of release on 12/3) hitting percentage ranks 26th nationally and third in the Big Ten.

SLAY COLLECTS BACK-TO-BACK BIG TEN DEFENSIVE PLAYER HONORS

Following an important 2-0 weekend on the road, senior Katie Slay earned her second consecutive Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honor. Two weeks ago, Slay helped No. 2 Penn State to a pair of straight-set victories at No. 14 Wisconsin and No. 11 Minnesota, which extended the Nittany Lion winning streak to 15 consecutive matches.

Slay led the PSU blocking effort in both matches, posting at least eight blocks against each opponent, averaging 2.67 blocks per frame on the week. Against the Badgers, she put down four kills to go along with eight blocks. The next evening, she posted another eight blocks, including one solo stuff and added seven kills.

PSU EARNS NO. 2 RANKING IN PRESEASON COACHES' POLL

The defending Big Ten Champion Nittany Lions enter the season with the No. 2 ranking, according to the 2013 AVCA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Lions are among Big Ten teams to break into the top 10, with Minnesota and Michigan coming in at No. 6 and No. 7 and Nebraska at No. 10.

Defending NCAA Champion Texas nabbed the top spot, earning 55 of 60 possible first-place votes. The Nittany Lions received three first place votes, while third-ranked Stanford earned two. Rounding out the top five is USC and Washington, who are ranked fourth and fifth, respectively.

HANCOCK EARNS FOURTH BIG TEN SETTER OF THE WEEK HONOR

Following a 2-0 weekend that featured a record-breaking performance and at least a share of the Big Ten title, junior Micha Hancock earned her fourth Big Ten Setter of the Week honor. Hancock guided the Nittany Lions to wins against Northwestern and No. 20 Illinois. The selection marks the 14th weekly conference accolade of her career and fourth setter of the week award in 2013, extending her career setter of the week tally to 10.

Hancock highlighted the weekend pacing the PSU offense to a .344 hitting clip against the Wildcats, distributing 63 assists, nine digs, three blocks and four kills. With two service aces, she moved into sole possession of first place on the PSU all-time list with 237 career aces.

SLAY JOINS 500 CLUB

With 10 blocks against No. 11 Minnesota, senior Katie Slay became the eighth member in Penn State program history to record more than 500 career total blocks. Her 591 total career blocks ranks sixth on the all-time list.

McCLENDON BUILDING ON MILESTONE MARK

Recording 10 digs against Iowa, senior Deja McClendon registered her 1,004th career dig to eclipse the 1,000 career kills/1,000 career digs mark. With 1,565 kills and 1,113 digs, McClendon is the first Nittany Lions to reach the mark since Megan Hodge in 2009 (2,142k/1,150d) and the fifth in program history.

McClendon recently hit the 1,500 kills mark after tallying 11 kills at Minnesota. The mark ranks seventh on the Penn State all-time list, as she is now one of seven student-athletes in program history to amass 1,500 or more kills in her collegiate career.

PSU POSTS 37TH 20+ WINS SEASON

Following a straight-set victory at No. 14 Michigan State, the Nittany Lions posted their 20th victory of the 2013 season, marking the 37th time in program history that PSU has reached 20 wins in a season. Penn State has reached the mark every year since the inaugural women's volleyball season in 1976.

VOTE FOR A. SCOTT!

Ariel Scott has been selected as one of 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award. Scott was selected from a pool of 29 other candidate for the annual award that is presented to one athlete who exemplifies excellence both on and off the court. Fans are encouraged to vote on the Senior CLASS Award website until December 9, as fan votes will be combined with media and DI head coaches' votes to determine the winner at the NCAA Championship.

A CLEAN SWEEP

Penn State registered its 21st straight-set victory of the season against LIU Brooklyn in the first round of the tourney. Among the 31 matches the Nittany Lions have played this season 21 of the 29 victories or 72 percent have been by a score of 3-0. Of the 21 sweeps, 10 of them have come against non-conference foes, while 11 have been against Big Ten teams.

GOTTA PLAY THE BEST TO BE THE BEST

Among the 16 matches Penn State has played against ranked teams this year, the Nittany Lions have compiled a 14-2 record in matches against ranked opponents this season, which includes matches against three different non-conference teams and 13 outings with teams from the Big Ten conference.

SLAY EARNS CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

Two weeks ago, senior Katie Slay was selected as a Capital One CoSIDA Academic All-District honoree, along with five other District II candidates. She will now be considered for national honors as an Academic All-American, which is presented to one outstanding student-athlete in December.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS

In the match against Indiana, the Nittany Lions posted a .507 hitting percentage against the Hoosiers, which is the highest PSU has hit against a league opponent so far this season. Penn State registered a .458 attacking percentage against Iowa, before hitting .451 at Michigan State, rounding out the top three highest hitting clips Penn State has put together this season against Big Ten teams.

Overall, the Nittany Lions have held their opponents to a .133 hitting percentage, which ranks first in the conference. Other than Nebraska (11/30), no Big Ten team has been able to hit better than .246, which is the attacking percentage the Huskers posted in a 3-1 loss against Penn State. Texas is the only squad to out-hit Penn State in a match this season, having recorded a .262 hitting clip in a five-set victory.

NOTABLES FROM NORTHWESTERN

At Northwestern, PSU also did not allow the Wildcats to secure a single block in the three-set match, which marks the first time the Lions have held a league opponent to 0.0 total blocks since Nov. 4, 2011, when then-No. 15 Minnesota did not record a block in a 3-0 PSU win.

IN THE NEGATIVES!

Penn State has limited two different opponents to negative attacking on three separate occasions this season. In the first meeting between Penn State and Ohio State, the Lions limited OSU to a -.030 hitting clip. In the next outing, the Buckeyes hit -.078 against PSU.

Earlier in the season, Penn State held Iowa to -.047 hitting efficiency after the first match against the Buckeyes, which marked the first time Penn State the Lions have held two Big Ten teams to a negative attacking percentage since 2005. During the 2005 season, Illinois and Minnesota hit -.020 and -.043, respectively on Nov. 12th and Nov. 18th.

PENN STATE CLAIMS OUTRIGHT BIG TEN TITLE

Penn State powered past Ohio State in straight sets on the way to an outright Big Ten Championship, Wednesday, Nov. 27th. The victory put the Nittany Lions in sole possession of its 16th conference title in history and 11th in the last 10 years.

Senior Deja McClendon led the offense with a match-high 11 kills, adding nine digs. Junior Micha Hancock notched a double-double, dishing out 28 assists and logging a team-best 14 digs. Junior Nia Grant put down six kills on a squad-best .556 hitting percentage. PSU also matched a season-low in points surrendered in a single set, giving up just eight points in a 25-8 win in the third stanza.

HANCOCK EARNS THIRD BIG SETTER OF THE WEEK HONOR

Following wins at No. 17 Michigan and No. 14 Michigan State, junior Micha Hancock earned Big Ten Setter of the Week honors for her performances in the pair of PSU conference victories. The selection is Hancock's 13th weekly conference accolade of her career and third setter of the week honor in 2013.

Against the Wolverines, Hancock dished out 48 assists, pacing three Nittany Lion attackers to double-digit kills. Hancock also notched five kills, one ace, nine digs and five total blocks in the victory. Against the 14th-ranked Spartans she guided Penn State to a .451 hitting percentage, distributing 35 assists, adding nine digs and one block in the straight-set win.

WHO SAYS 40'S BAD?

In 30 total matches played this season, Penn State has held seven different opponents to less than 40 total points on nine occasions. In non-conference play, the Lions played four consecutive matches surrendering no more than 40 points, including Florida Gulf Coast (40), Albany (18), Eastern Kentucky (37) and Yale (39). In conference play, PSU has limited three different teams to less than 40 total points per game on four occasions, including Indiana (37/38), Ohio State (36/34) and Iowa (27). The 27 total points given up against the Hawkeyes marks the fewest number of points Penn State has surrendered to a Big Ten opponent since 25-point set scoring began in 2008.

NITTANY LION DUO HIGHLIGHTS BIG WEEKLY AWARDS

Following a 2-0 weekend at home, senior Katie Slay and junior Micha Hancock earned a pair of conference weekly awards as Slay was tabbed the Big Ten Player of the Week and Hancock was named Setter of the Week. The selection is Hancock's second straight, while Slay's is her first of the season.

Slay earned her seventh career weekly award after leading the team with 18 blocks, averaging 2.25 per set. Slay also tallied 22 kills, registering a squad-best .366 hitting percentage. Hancock dished out 100 assists, averaging a Big Ten best, 12.50 per frame, while also tallying 12 digs, one block and five kills.

HANCOCK EARNS FIRST BIG SETTER OF THE WEEK HONOR IN 2013

After helping the Nittany Lions to a 2-0 weekend on the road, Micha Hancock earned Big Ten Setter of the Week honors. The weekly selection is Hancock's first of the season and 11th of her career.

Hancock concluded the weekend ranked second in the league in aces, totaling six for a 0.75 average per set. She also finished fourth in assists, dishing out 83, averaging 10.38 per set. At IU Hancock directed the Penn State offense to a .507 hitting percentage, while also adding four aces, seven digs, four blocks and three kills. At No. 24 Purdue, she registered her first double-double of the season, tallying 45 assists and 13 digs.

PSU SPENDS TWO WEEKS AT NO. 1 IN TOP 25 RANKINGS

After posting two back-to-back undefeated weekends in the non-conference portion of the schedule, PSU spent two weeks at No. 1 in the AVCA weekly Top 25 Coaches' Poll, while also picking up top rankings in the RichKern.com and Volleyball Magazine polls. Last year, Penn State spent six weeks atop the standings, including five consecutive weeks from Sept. 24 to Oct. 22, before earning the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, Nov. 9. The No. 1 ranking marks the 79th time in program history that Penn State has reached the top of the polls, having earned its first-ever No. 1 ranking Sept. 2, 1997.

Slay earned her third all-tournament honor after combining for 27 kills on the weekend, posting a team-high .649 hitting clip. Slay highlighted the weekend with 11 kills against Eastern Kentucky. She also led the team in blocking with 13 total blocks, averaging 1.44 per set.

McClendon finished the weekend with 24 kills, 16 digs and seven blocks, while also hitting .300 or better. She posted double-digit kills against Eastern Kentucky (10) and ranked second on the team with nine kills against Yale. Gonzalez led the squad with 44 digs on the week, including a season-high 20 against EKU.

SLAY EARNS HGIHS CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT MVP HONORS

Senior Katie Slay earned her second all-tournament honor of the season after being selected as the MVP in the Hilton Garden Inn Homewood Suites Classic. Slay recorded two season-high marks in the 3-0 weekend, registering a team-high eight blocks against Central Arkansas and a squad-best .818 hitting percentage at FGCU. She also combined for 23 kills on the week, with only one error while leading the team with a .667 hitting percentage. Slay also averaged 1.78 blocks per set in all three matches and extended her streak to seven straight games with at least one block.

COURTNEY AND HANCOCK NAB SPOTS ON ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Micha Hancock and Megan Courtney both earned spots on the Hilton Garden Inn Homewood Suites Class all-tournament team. The honor was Hancock's second of the season.

Hancock dished out more than 30 assists in all three PSU victories this weekend, while pacing tournament MVP, Katie Slay to a season-high .818 hitting clip against FGCU. She notched three aces against both Central Arkansas and FGCU for an 0.67 average per frame.

Courtney tied for first on the team in kills against Marquette and FCGU while leading the squad with double-digit kills (10) against Central Arkansas last weekend. She combined for 28 total kills in all three matches, adding 17 digs.

HANCOCK TABBED PENN STATE INVITATIONAL MVP

Micha Hancock earned Penn State Invitational MVP honors for a pair of outstanding performances in the Penn State Classic. Hancock tied for third on the squad in kills with five against Syracuse, on .556 hitting. She also dished out 30 assists, while pacing the team to a .313 hitting clip. Against Louisville, Hancock registered eight service aces, which is just two shy of her career-high mark of 10 that she set against Binghamton in the NCAA Tournament last season. She also tallied two kills and seven digs against the Cardinals to round out the weekend.

PRIETO CERAME AND SLAY EARN PSU INVITE ALL-TOURNAMENT

Redshirt freshman Paulina Prieto Cerame and senior Katie Slay also earned Penn State Invitational All-Tournament team honors in the Penn State Invitational. In her first season in the blue and white, Prieto Cerame recorded a team-high nine kills against Syracuse and hit double-digits with 10 against No. 19 Louisville. Slay led the squad with a team-best five blocks against Syracuse, including two solo blocks. She also tied for third on the team with five kills. Against the Cardinals, she posted three blocks, including one solo block, adding three kills.

Governed by the CEV, is the organization is the highest level of competition for professional clubs. This year, Dabrowa captured the Polish Cup, qualifying the team for its fifth appearance in the CEV Women's Volleyball Cup since 2009. Dabrowa's lineup consists of athletes from four different countries including Belgium, Czech Republic, Italy and Poland.

SISTER, SISTER!

In Penn State's final matchup of the Penn State Invitational, three-time AVCA All-American Deja McClendon lined up against her sister, Maya McClendon, who is currently an outside hitter for the No. 19-ranked Louisville Cardinals. Deja led with a team-high 17 digs, while Maya led the Cards offense with eight kills.

NITTANY LIONS IMPROVE TO 29-6 IN SEASON-OPENERS

With a victory against Syracuse, Penn State improved to 29-6 all-time in season-openers. The win marks the second-straight season opening triumph for the Lions after knocking off Morehead State 3-0 in the first match of the 2012 season. The Penn State Invitational also marked the first time the Nittany Lions opened the season at home in six years. The last time PSU opened at Rec Hall was in 2007, when Penn State defeated Texas, 3-1, on Aug. 24 and 25 to kick of the start of an eventual national championship campaign.

TRAVELING THE WORLD

During the summer, the Penn State women's volleyball team traveled to Europe for a week-long tour. The team traveled to Prague, Vienna and Slovenia touring the cities and playing some of the top professional teams from each country.

PENN STATE PICKED FIRST IN BIG PRESEASON POLL

PSU was picked as the Big Ten preseason favorite in the 2013 Preseason Coaches' Poll, marking the Lions' eighth first-place nod within the last nine years. Following Penn State in the No. 2 slot is Minnesota, followed by Michigan, Nebraska and Michigan State. Illinois rounds out the group, slated at sixth.

FIVE EARN BIG TEN PRESEASON HONORS

Penn State dominated the Preseason All-Big Ten honors this year with five Nittany Lions earning honors. Ariel Scott led the group with a unanimous selection, marking her second straight appearance on the list. Deja McClendon earned her third consecutive nod, while Katie Slay also notched her second straight. Micha Hancock and Megan Courtney also earned spots on the list.

NITTANY LIONS BY MONTH

Penn State is 37-5 (.881) all-time during the month of August, including the pair of victories this weekend against Syracuse and No. 19 Louisville. Its first two losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 when Nebraska swept the Lions, and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State, 3-2, in the opening round. Most recently, the Nittany Lions suffered a season opening loss to Oregon in 2011 before rebounding with a hard fought 3-2 win against nationally-ranked USC.

Penn State is 358-56-4 (.856) all-time during the month of September. The Lions are 183-17 (.915) during September dating back to the 1995 season and 41-8 (.837) within the last five years.

PSU is 386-67 (.852) all-time during the month of October. Penn State has posted an 86-11 (.887) mark in October across the last 10 seasons, and a record of 50 -3 (.943) in the last five years and did not lose a match during the month from 2007 to 2010.

Penn State is 285-57 (.833) all-time during the month of November, including a 87-8 (.916) mark across the last 10 seasons. The Nittany Lions posted a six-year streak from 1995-2000 where they did not lose a match in the month, and in the last five seasons, Penn State has a 45-3 (.938) mark in November.

QUICK SETS

From Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten in 1991, Penn State has played in 757 total matches, winning 671. Additionally, 530 of those 671 wins, or 79%, have been three-game sweeps. Across the last seven years, Penn State has won 204 of its 252 victories in three games (81%), including 37-of-38 (98%) in 2008 and 32-of-38 in 2009 (84%).

In the last 15 years, the Lions have lost only 58 matches. And of those 22 teams that defeated the Lions – BYU, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Long Beach State, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Oregon State, Purdue, USC, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin – only nine of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota, Michigan State and Florida) have been able to beat Penn State a third time. The Lions have compiled a 277-56 mark in the last 15 years versus these teams.

The No. 2 Penn State women's volleyball team officially opened 2013 with a 3-0 (25-16, 25-15, 25-17) victory against Syracuse in the Penn State Invitational. With the win, the Lions improve to 29-6 in season-openers under the guidance of head coach Russ Rose.

Following an early Penn State 4-1 lead, the Orange fought within two, 12-10, following a kill from junior Nicolette Serratore and an attacking error on senior Deja McClendon. The Lions regained momentum though, and increased its advantage to as many as nine points, 23-14, before a kill from junior Nia Grant sent McClendon to the service line for match point. Grant followed with a kill to secure the opening set, 25-16.

Tied at 6-all in set two, the Lions went on a 7-3 run and didn't relinquish control for the remainder of the set, finishing the frame with a kill from Prieto Cerame and an ace from Hancock to go up 2-0.

Syracuse made one final attempt to hold off PSU, 24-17, in set three following a kill by Monika Salkute, but an Orange service error ended the attack, giving the Lions a 25-17 win in set three and the victory.

PSU 3, WISCONSIN 0 Madison, Wisc. (UW Field House) Nov. 15, 2013

Sophomore Megan Courtney led the No. 2 Penn State women's volleyball team (23-2, 14-1) to a straight-set victory (25-23, 27-25, 25-16) at No. 14 Wisconsin (19-8, 8-7), logging her fourth double-double of the season with a team-high 15 kills, adding 11 digs.

Maintaining a narrow advantage throughout first set, the Nittany Lions used a 4-0 streak, for its largest lead of the frame, 19-12. The Badgers answered with a 9-2 streak to jump within one, 22-21. Two Wisconsin errors put PSU at set-point, 24-21. Two PSU errors stalled the win, but Courtney responded with a kill to seal a 25-23 victory.

Trailing by one, 15-14, in set two, Penn State attempted to settle into a scoring rhythm, but Wisconsin came up with a 24-23 advantage. Rallying, Slay and Grant put down a pair of back-to-back kills to lift PSU to set-point, 25-24. A PSU error halted the attempt, but a Wisconsin error after a kill from Scott secured a 27-25 win.

Knotted, 10-all, PSU used a 3-1 strike for a two-point lead, 13-11. Wisconsin managed to cut the advantage to one, 14-13, but the Lions tallied the next five points to extend the advantage to six, 19-13, before claiming a 25-16 victory in the third set to complete the sweep.

The No. 2 Penn State women's volleyball team dismantled No. 11 Minnesota in straight sets to extend its winning streak to 15 consecutive matches Saturday evening at the Sports Pavilion.

Double-digit kill performances by four Nittany Lions propelled No. 2 Penn State to a 3-1 victory against Northwestern. The win extends the current PSU winning streak to 16 consecutive matches.

Knotted at 5-5 after the break, Penn State cracked open the tied frame with a 5-0 streak and never looked back. The Nittany Lions grew the lead as high as 11, 23-12, before claiming a 25-14 win in the set and a 3-0 victory in the match.
