QUICK HITS

SETTING THE SCENE | After a week off, the Nittany Lions return to action at 6 p.m. Saturday vs. Iowa in the Bryce Jordan Center and on ESPNU. It is the lone meeting for the Nittany Lions (15-13, 3-2 B1G) with the Hawkeyes (18-10, 9-6 B1G) this season, as the teams last faced each other Feb. 15, 2014, also in University Park.

CVC DAY | The Iowa game marks Penn State's Coaches vs. Cancer Day, bringing together cancer survivors and cancer fighting groups from across campus and the community. [MORE: Page 2]

MR. NEWBILL | D.J. Newbill has led the Big Ten in scoring since the season tipped off, averaging 20.5 ppg to lead all NCAA players from power 5 conferences. He is fourth in Penn State career scoring, after three seasons, and is poised to become third player all-time to produce back-to-back 600-plus point campaigns. He is just the second PSU player with three-consecutive 500-plus point seasons. [MORE: 17-18]

SCORING DEFENSE | In 11 of 15 Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent below their season scoring average, including nine of the last

10. Penn State limited Wisconsin to 18.4 points below its season average and held the Badgeres to their second-lowest scoring output of season.

IOWA | The Hawkeyes are coming off a Wednesday night win over Illinois, 68-60. They are 18-10 on the season and 9-6 in the Big Ten, tied for fourth in league standings. [MORE: Page 2]

SO CLOSE | Ten of Penn State's Big Ten games have been decided by single digits, tied for the second-most among Big Ten schools, most recently with an eight-point loss to No. 5 Wisconsin Feb. 18. The nine single-digit losses in conference play have been separated by an average of 6.0 points.

THE MATCHUP

SCOUTING IOWA

- The Hawkeyes are coming off a Wednesday night win over Illinois, 68-60. They are 18-10 on the season and 9-6 in the Big Ten, tied for fourth in league standings.
- Against the Illini, Aaron White had 29 points. He scored 14-consecutive points for the Hawkeyes in the second half and was 5-of-6 from the field (2-of-2 from 3-range) and 8-of-9 from the line in the second period.
- Iowa has won each of its last three games and five of the last seven. The Hawkeyes are 5-3 in road games on year with four of those wins coming in league play (4-3).
- Iowa has the fifth-ranked scoring offense in the league and Top 4 spots in overall and 3-point shooting percentages.
- White is leading the team in scoring and rebounding with 15.2 ppg and 7.2 rpg, respectively. He recently moved into No. 4 all-time in Iowa career scoring.
- Jarrold Uthoff is second with 12.0 ppg, an average which goes up to 13.2 ppg in Big Ten play. Along with Peter Jok, Uthoff is shooting 40 percent from behind the arc and has a team-high 26 triples.

SERIES HISTORY

- Iowa holds a 26-13 advantage in the series vs. Penn State and has won six of the last eight meetings, with the two Nittany Lion wins coming at the Bryce Jordan Center.
- The Hawkeyes took the lone meeting last season, an 82-70 decision Feb. 15 in the BJC.
- The Nittany Lions a 10-8 advantage in games played at home, including wins in five of the last seven games at the BJC. Six of the last eight home games have been decided by five or fewer points.

LAST TIME VS. THE HAWKEYES

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (Feb. 15, 2014) - Melsahn Basabe scored 16 points and No. 16 Iowa pulled away from Penn State 82-70 in the Bryce Jordan Center. Roy Devyn Marble added 15, Aaron White 14 and Mike Gesell 13 as the Hawkeyes (19-6, 8-4) won their fourth Big Ten road game of the season. Iowa's three-game road winning streak in the Big Ten is its longest since 1998.

Penn State (13-13, 4-9) was led by D.J. Newbill, who scored 22 points, but Tim Frazier was held to 11. The game was tied four times in the second half before Iowa stretched it out with a 14-4 run.

14-15 NITTANY LIONS VS. THE HAWKEYES

D.J. Newbill is the leading scorer in the series with Iowa, producing 22.7 ppg through three meetings. He's posted at least

20 points in every outing, including the second-highest all-time scoring output of 26 points in February 2013. Newbill also is the leading rebounder in the series with 6.7 per game.

THREE NOTABLE GAMES

Feb. 16, 2012 (PSU, 69-64): Having reduced a 16-point Penn State lead to three with 24 seconds to play, Iowa intentionally put redshirt freshman Jon Graham on the foul line. He hit both to effectively ice a 69-64 victory for the Nittany Lions.

Jan. 26, 2011 (PSU, 65-51): One of the two home games in the last eight not separated by five or fewer points was decided by Talor Battle's 23-point outing that gave Penn State its third-consecutive Big Ten home win.

March 27, 1995 (PSU, 67-64): Pete Lisicky nailed a 3-pointer with 2.1 seconds left to send the Nittany Lions to the semifinals of the NIT.

COACHES VS. CANCER DAY

- The Iowa game marks Penn State's Coaches vs. Cancer Day with \$4 from every ticket sold benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer, as well as proceeds from t-shirts and "Who I Fight For: ____" cards sold at the door.
- The annual CvC Day brings together cancer survivors and cancer fighting groups from across campus and the community. They will join together for halftime recognition and a group photo Saturday.
- Penn State's chapter of Coaches vs. Cancer has raised over \$2 million since its inception in 1995 and consistently ranks among the Top 10 in CvC organizations across the country. Started by then head coach Bruce Parkhill, the organization raises funds for the American Cancer Society, as well as the Bestwick Foundation and Bob Perks Fund, local organizations that provide direct support for community members and families fighting cancer.

WELCOME, ISAAC!

Following Penn State's win over Dartmouth Dec. 22, head coach Patrick Chambers added a top recruit who signed a letter of intent to join the Nittany Lions for life.

Isaac Bennett, a native of Hollidaysburg, Pa., was presented with a No. 1 jersey and a Certificate of Relentlessness in the postgame ceremony.

Bennett has a non-cancerous, but aggressive brain tumor and signed with Penn State through the Friends of Jaclyn program, which places children battling brain tumors with college and high school sports teams.

SCORING DEFENSE | In 11 of 15 Big Ten games, Penn State has held its opponent below their season scoring average, including nine of the last 10. Maryland was the first team to produce more than its average (+5.4) since the Purdue game Jan. 17. The Nittany Lions limited Nebraska to 43 points Feb. 7, 20.7 points below their season average of 63.7 points per game on the year. Most recently, PSU limited fifth-ranked Wisconsin to 18.4 points below their scoring average (73.4), holding the Badgers to 55 points.

Penn State limited Nebraska to 13 first-half points, marking the fewest points by an opponent in the opening frame since 12/12/07 when Princeton scored 11. The Nittany Lions held Nebraska without a made field goal for a stretch of 11:16 of game action in the first half. The Huskers' 43 points in the game are the fewest by a PSU opponent this season and the second-lowest scoring output for any team in the Big Ten during league action.

FIELD-GOAL DEFENSE | Penn State's opponents are scoring on 40.7 percent of their total shots and 32.4 percent of 3-point attempts, defensive marks which both stand as fifth and third, respectively, all-time since 1965 (among full-season figures). [Page 137 of Media Guide]

BLOCK PARTY | With two blocks from Jordan Dickerson against Wisconsin, Penn State now has three players in the Penn State Top 11 in the category. Donovan Jack owns the No. 8 spot (77), while Dickerson own the No. 10 position with 72. Brandon Taylor is close behind at No. 11 with 69 career blocks. Dickerson is averaging 1.5 blocks in his Penn State career, putting up 72 through 50 career games. [MORE: Page 25]

VS. RANKED TEAMS | Penn State has faced a team ranked in the Top 25 at the time of meeting five times this season, falling to Wisconsin (twice), Maryland (twice) and Ohio State -- with two of five occurring on the road. Five of the Nittany Lions' 2014-15 opponents are currently ranked, or receiving votes, in the AP and/or USA Today polls and nine have been ranked at some point this season.

15 WINS | It took Penn State 24 games to reach 15 wins on the season, the fewest games since 2008-09 since the Nittany Lions got to 15 wins in the span of 20 games. It took 30 games a year ago. Penn State has produced more than 15 wins in a season just three times since the turn of the century (.

SHARE THE LOVE | In Penn State's win over Minnesota Jan. 28, nine players saw action and all tallied at least three points. Four players produced or tied career highs in scoring, while the defense posted a season high in steals and helped limit the Gophers to 19.5 points below their season average. [MORE: Page 36]

40 MINUTES | Patrick Chambers said after the Rutgers game Jan. 24 was the first time the Nittany Lions had played 40 full minutes of Penn State basketball. It resulted in 51 percent shooting, a season-high 18 assists, 10 3-pointers and the six-largest win over a Big Ten team in program history. [MORE: Page 36]

ONE-POSSESSION GAMES | Seven games this season have been separated by one possession with Penn State winning the first four before falling in each of the last three. A year ago, the Lions had eight games decided by three points or fewer in the regular season. They lost each of the first five and won the last three, giving them a seven-game win streak in regular-season, one-possession games.

FIVE-POINT GAMES | Through 28 games, Penn State has had 11 decided by five points or fewer, winning each of the first six plus the decision vs. Minnesota (63-58) to stand at 7-4. The four losses have been separated by four (Rutgers), three (Indiana and Maryland) and two (Illinois) points. Last season, the Lions were 4-8 in regular-season games decided by the same margin.

SINGLE-DIGIT SEPARATION | Ten of Penn State's 15 Big Ten games have been decided by single digits, tied for the second-most of any league team behind Illinois (11), through Wednesday games this week.

BENCH MOB | The PSU bench - which has dubbed itself the Bench Mob - is averaging 18.7 ppg this season, up from 14.7 ppg last season, and has outscored the opponent's bench in 14 games. Reserve players have combined to score more than 30 points in four games this season: Duquesne (35), Michigan (33), Marshall (32) and Dartmouth (31). [MORE: Page 28]

WIN STREAK | Wisconsin snapped Penn State's 10-game winning streak, which was the longest for a PSU team since the 1995-96 squad opened the year going 13-0. The longest single-season win streak in program history was 15 games (1952).

NON-CONFERENCE WINS | The 12 non-conference wins were the most for the Nittany Lions in program history, breaking the previous high of 11 set during the 2008-09 season. In the Big Ten era, Penn State was undefeated in conference play in 1995-96 (9-0) and had one-loss seasons in 2000-01 (9-1) and 1994-95 (8-1).

COMEBACKS | The Lions battled back from second-half deficits of 14 (Akron), 13 (Cornell), 8 (Virginia Tech), 7 (George Washington) and 6 (Southern California) in wins this season. [MORE: Page 29]

CHARLESTON CLASSIC | The two wins at the Charleston Classic stand as the first multi-win performance at a neutral-site, regular-season tournament for Penn State since the 2000 ECAC Holiday Classic.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHTS

D.J. NEWBILL |

- Has likely topped out in the No. 4 spot in career scoring at Penn State (1,682) in just three seasons, needing 304 points to hit the No. 3 spot.
- Reached 500 points on the season vs. Nebraska (574) -- only one other player - PSU all-time leading scorer Talor Battle -- has reached 500 points three seasons in a row.
- Owns two of the Top 10 single-season scoring outputs, with last season's 604 points sitting in seventh and this year currently sitting in 10th.
- Needs 26 points to reach 600 on the season. There have been six players, Newbill included, to score at least 600 points in a season a total of eight times in PSU history. He will be just the third to do so twice.
- Needs 25 points to reach 2,000 career points (including freshman season at Souther Miss). There are only eight active NCAA Division I players with 2,000 or more points; Newbill has the 10th-most points of any active DI player.

Newbill is averaging 20.5 ppg, tops in Division I among Power 5 conferences and ninth overall in Division I. It also is the fifth-highest season scoring average all-time at Penn State, among full-season figures, and is the greatest clip since 1963. He is averaging 18.1 ppg over his three seasons with Penn State, a career scoring average which is second all-time, behind only Jesse Arnelle (1952-55; 21.0 ppg; 2,138 points). [MORE: Page 25]

Off the court, Newbill was named one of 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award, presented annually to the one four-year student-athlete with exceptional accomplishments in all four areas of classroom, community, character and competition. alone and was shooting 53 percent from behind the arc. He had nine points, all of 3-pointers, in his return vs. the Terps and added multiple 3-pointers in three of the last four games. SEASON NOTES

PENN STATE AND THE BIG TEN TAKE NYC

The Big Ten Conference announced a four-year men's basketball and men's hockey doubleheader series in Madison Square Garden, set to begin in 2016 with Penn State vs. Michigan Jan. 30. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

Additionally, the 2018 Big Ten Tournament will take place in MSG, scheduled for Feb. 28-March 4 with all 14 conference programs competing for the Big Ten's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament. The 2018 event will be held one week earlier than previous tournaments, ending seven days before NCAA Tournament Selection Sunday.

THROWBACK UNIS

Penn State wore new throwback uniforms at Bucknell Nov. 28 and vs. Virginia Tech Dec. 3, going 2-0. The unis are black and pink, honoring the school's original school colors established in 1887. The color pairing lasted just 2.5 years. Problems arose when the pink faded to white after several weeks of exposure to the sun. The students then opted for blue, rather than black, and white. The official announcement of the new choice was made on March 18, 1890.

PLAYER LEADERSHIP

The team elected four captains prior to the start of the season -- D.J. Newbill, who is in his third season as a captain, along with two-time captain Ross Travis, Brandon Taylor and Kevin Montminy. Those four, along with Alan Wisniewski, make up Patrick Chambers' Leadership Council, which the staff relies on for decision making, providing guidance and helping everyone be the best possible teammate.

CHAMBERS BEGINS YEAR FOUR

The 2014-15 season marks the fourth in University Park for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native has seen his win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season as he racked up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State, a road win at Indiana and his first PSU postseason appearance last season.

ROOKIES LOOK TO MAKE IMPACT

Three new faces join the veteran core of Nittany Lions. Devin Foster, a junior college transfer, along with freshmen Shep Garner and Isaiah Washington as Penn State rookies. Garner (Chester, Pa.) and Washington (Williamsport, Pa.) bring the number of Pennsylvania natives on the roster to eight, including four from the Philadelphia area.

MONTMINY EARNS SCHOLARSHIP

Kevin Montminy was awarded a scholarship for the 2014-15 season, Patrick Chambers announced in early August. A three-year walk-on, Montminy has seen action in 40 career games over the last three seasons with 24 total points and 10 rebounds. With a 4.0 grade-point average in each of the last five semesters, Montminy is a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, Academic All-Big Ten honoree and the team's Academic Award recipient.

CHARLESTON CLASSIC

The Nittany Lions are slated to take part in the 2014 Charleston Classic, Nov. 20-23 in Charleston, S.C. They will open play in the tourney by taking on Charlotte at 5 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 20 on ESPNU and then will face either South Carolina or Cornell on the second day of the three-day event. The remaining teams in the field include Akron, Drexel, Miami (Fla.), and Southern California.

OFFSEASON TRAINING

The Nittany Lions made headlines with their extensive offseason-training regimen. Strength coach Brandon Spayd designed a three-part workout challenge for team members called the Yoke Zone Challenge. Players pushed cars, crawled through sandpits and completed a number of demanding stations in an obstacle course setting. Kevin Montminy and Jordan Dickerson were the top pair among players completed the entire course each week.

Patrick Chambers and his staff also brought in The Program, a leadership development and team building program created and executed by former military personnel. Players completed two days of extensive mental and physical tasks designed to build better leaders and more cohesive teams.

CHAMBERS ADDS ANOTHER FORMER PLAYER TO STAFF

D.J. Irving, a four-year member of the men's basketball team at Boston University, joined the Penn State staff as a graduate manager for the 2014-15 season. He replaced Andrew Jones, who is an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Thunder's D-League team. Irving is the fourth player coached by Chambers to join his staff. Assistant coach Dwayne Anderson and Ross Condon, director of operations, both played at Villanova with Chambers as an assistant and associate head coach. Irving came into the fold at Boston University and fellow PSU graduate manager Nicholas Colella played two seasons for Chambers as a Lion.

PENN STATE OPENS THE 119TH SEASON

Penn State is competing in its 119th season on the hardwood and its 23rd as a member of the Big Ten conference. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, which returns to the schedule for the third year in a row. The Lions have made 13 postseason appearances in the last 26 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

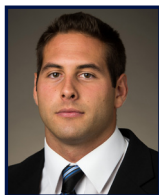

Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

SCORING

D.J. Newbill has 1,682 points in his third and final season wearing the Blue and White and ranks No. 4 all-time in career scoring. He also holds the record for scoring among three-year players, passing John Amaechi's 1,310 points with 17 at Marshall Dec. 6.

Newbill passed the 500-point season mark vs. Nebraska (574), becoming just the second person in PSU history to do so in three-consecutive seasons, joining Talor Battle.

With 26 more points, Newbill will become just the third PSU player to reach 600 points twice in his career, joining Talor Battle and Joe Crispin.

REBOUNDS

Ross Travis, who has led the Nittany Lions in rebounding each of the last two seasons and is among the top returning rebounders in the Big Ten, has 774 on his career and owns the No. 3 spot.

BLOCKS

Donovon Jack entered Penn State's Top 10 with one block vs. Fordham (11/16). He is now ranked No. 8 and has 77 with all but three coming after his freshman season. His 54 blocks as a sophomore are the eighth-most in a single season and the most since the 1998-99 season. Only Calvin Booth, who owns positions 1-4, and John Amaechi (spots 5-7) rank above Jack.

Jordan Dickerson owns the No. 10 spot after producing multiple blocks in 15 games this season, including seven of the last eight games. He has 43 blocks this season and is averaging 1.5 per game, which ranks eighth in the Big Ten. Last season, Dickerson produced 29 blocks in the 22 games he was eligible to compete last season, an average of 1.3 per game. That average would have placed him among the Top 10 in the Big Ten last season had he reached the minimum number of games to be ranked.

Brandon Taylor moved to No. 11 at Penn State with 69 career blocks. He is second on the team this season with 20 (0.8 per game).

EVANSTON, Ill. (AP) - The Nittany Lions fell to Northwestern 60-39 on Saturday afternoon, in a game where they struggled from the field. Geno Thorpe scored 13 points for Penn State, which scored a season-low point total and shot a season-low 27 percent.

Penn State outrebounded Northwestern 37-36. PSU's D.J. Newbill, the Big Ten's leading scorer at 21.1 points per game, finished with three points on 1-for-6 shooting and nine rebounds. He scored his first points on a 3 with 1:25 remaining to cut the lead to 56-39.

Vic Law scored 17 points, Tre Demps added 16 for Northwestern. Alex Olah added 10 points for the Wildcats (13-14, 4-10 Big Ten), who have won three straight after snapping a 10-game losing streak.

Penn State came out hot, using an early 12-3 run powered by a trio of 3-pointers from Shep Garner and Geno Thorpe. The Wildcats answered with a 12-0 streak to go up by three, 15-12, but Garner cut off the stretch with his second triple of the frame to tie the score, 15-15. With PSU unable to spark some momentum, Northwestern used a 13-5 run to close out the first half, entering the intermission with an eight-point lead, 28-20.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Geno Thorpe led the team in scoring for the third time in this season with 13 points, shooting 3-for-5 from behind the arc.
- The Nittany Lions shot 39 percent from behind the arc in the first half with five treys from Thorpe and Shep Garner. Garner led the way with three first-half triples shooting 3-for-5 from 3-point range.
- Penn State won the advantage on the boards, collecting 37 rebounds to the Wildcats' 36. D.J. Newbill led the way with nine rebounds, while Ross Travis and Thorpe added six each. The Nittany Lions are 12-4 when outrebounding an opponent.
- Shep Garner finished second on the team in scoring with nine points after registering three triples in the first half alone. He has at least one 3-pointer in all but four games this season, with multiple treys in 13 games.
- In Big Ten games, Garner is averaging 10.0 ppg in eight road contests compared to 5.9 ppg in the seven homes games.
- Geno Thorpe knocked down a career-high three triples on the way to his 12th double figure scoring outing of the season with a team-high 13 points.
- Thorpe's reached double figures in four of the last six games with multiple treys in two of the last three appearances on the court.
- With three blocks, Jordan Dickerson logged his 15th multi-block performance of the season. Having recorded multiple blocks in seven of the last eight games, he leads the team with 43 on the year.
- With 72 career blocks, he ranks 10th on the Penn State all-time list. He needs just one more to match Geary Claxton (2005-08) for ninth.
- With 774 career rebounds, Ross Travis is ranked No. 3 all-time among career rebounds at Penn State. He would need 138 more rebounds to match Mike Lang for No. 2.
