No. 2 Maryland (5-2) opens its 2023 Big Ten schedule with a Top-10 showdown with No. 9 Penn State (5-2) on Saturday, March 25, at 5 p.m. at SECU Stadium.

WHERE WE'VE BEEN ...

- Maryland is 5-2 on the season with home wins over then-No. 19 Richmond (15-4, Feb. 4) and then-No. 16 Syracuse (15-12, Feb. 18) and road wins over then-No. 4 Princeton (11-5, Feb. 25), Albany (16-9, Mar. 11), and then-No. 1 Virginia (14-13 OT, Mar. 18). The Terps losses have come at Loyola (12-7, Feb. 11) and at home to No. 2 Notre Dame (13-12 3OT, Mar. 4).
- The ninth-ranked Nittany Lions (5-2) are coming into College Park off of a neutral-site loss to Marquette, 12-11, on Mar. 18. Penn State has ranked road victories over then-No. 7 Yale (13-11, Feb. 25) and then-No. 3 Cornell (10-6, Mar. 11).

ABOUT THE COACHES

- John Tillman is in his 16th season as a head coach and 13th with the Terps, with a 185-61 career record for a .752 winning percentage. Coming off of an undefeated 2022 campaign, Tillman is 165-42 (.797) as Maryland's head coach and
- Penn State head coach Jeff Tambroni is in his 23rd season as a head coach and 13th in State College. He is 210-114 (.648) all-time and 101-74 (.577) with the Nittany Lions.
- With Maryland, Tillman is 9-1 all-time vs. Tambroni at Penn State, but the two met four times when they coached Harvard and Cornell, respectively. With the Big Red, Tambroni was 4-0 against Tillman's Crimson from 2008-10.
- Penn State assistant coach John Haus is a 2013 graduate of Maryland. He played four seasons in College Park, including his final three under Coach Tillman. Haus was a first-team All-ACC and USILA first-team All-America selection in 2013.

WIERMAN ON THE VERGE OF 500 FACEOFF WINS; RISING UP GROUNDBALL CHART

- With his fifth of 18 faceoff wins vs. Loyola on Feb. 11, Luke Wierman became just the ninth Terp in 98 seasons of Maryland men's lacrosse to win 400 or more faceoffs. He needs just two faceoff wins to become only the fifth Terp to reach 500 faceoff wins.
- Wierman's 15 faceoff wins at Virginia moved him into a tie for fifth place on the Terps' career list with Charlie Raffa with

Wierman is also climbing up the career groundballs list and is one of only 12 Terps in history to scoop up 200 or more groundballs. He became only the fifth Terp in history to reach 250 career groundballs with eight vs. Notre Dame.

FRESH FACE BETWEEN THE PIPES

- ▶ True freshman goalies are rare in the history of Maryland men's lacrosse. When Brian Ruppel made his first collegiate start in goal at #4 Princeton on Feb. 25, 2023, he became just the third Terrapin to start in goal as a true freshman since 1993. Coincidentally, the previous two true freshman net-minders were also named Brian ...
- ▶ Brian "Doc" Dougherty earned his first career start as a true freshman at Towson on May 4, 1993. Dougherty made 23 saves in an 11-8 win over the No. 14 Tigers and earned the starting goalie spot for the final two games of the 1993 season, which included another 20-save effort in Maryland's NCAA tournament game at Army on May 15.
- ▶ Injuries to returning All-American Harry Alford and junior Jason Carter forced freshman Brian Phipps to start the first 13 games of the 2007 season. Phipps registered double-digit saves in seven of those 13 games, including a 16-save effort in an 8-7 win over No. 11 Towson on March 10, 2007, en route to being named the 2007 ACC Freshman of the Year.

POLE GOALS

- Last season the Terps enjoyed a boost of offense from long poles with 10 pole goals.
- The 2023 season started much the same, with the first goal coming via a pole goal from LSM **John Geppert**, who was the leading pole goal scorer in 2022 with 10. LSM Jack McDonald also found the net vs. the Spiders.
- The 2023 total is already at three pole goals, with Geppert adding another in the Terps' 15-12 win over No. 16 Syracuse.

HAT TRICK TERPS

- Maryland has had a hat trick in 64 straight games dating back to February 2, 2019. During that span, Logan Wisanuskas and Jared Bernhardt lead the way with 37 and 29 hat tricks, respectively.

- With a second straight undefeated regular season, the Terps won their sixth Big Ten regular season title in seven seasons.
- This was the Terps' second-straight regular-season title. They also won the 2021 Big Ten Tournament with a 12-10 victory over Hopkins.
- In total, this was Maryland's 36th conference championship. The team has seven in the Big Ten and 29 in the ACC.
- Maryland has not lost to a Big Ten opponent since a 2019 Big Ten Tournament loss to Johns Hopkins on May 2, 2019. That's 29 consecutive regular season and postseason games combined.

GET TO 10 AND WIN

- Since John Tillman took over the program in 2011, Maryland has won 143 of the 160 games in which it has scored 10 or more goals for a .894 winning percentage.
- The Terps scored at least ten goals in 17 of 18 games in 2022, with the lone single-digit scoring game coming in the NCAA Championship game, a 9-7 victory over Cornell on May 30.
- Maryland is 5-1 in 2023 when scoring 10+ with wins over Richmond, Syracuse, Princeton, Albany, and Virginia. The 13-12 3OT loss to Notre Dame on March 4 was the Terps' first loss when scoring 10+ since the 2021 NCAA title game (May 31).
- The last time Maryland failed to reach 10 goals or more at home dates back to May 9, 2015. Maryland hosted Yale in the first round of the NCAA tournament and advanced with an 8-7 victory. The Terps trailed 7-4 early in the fourth quarter, but four straight goals by Bryan Cole, Joe LoCascio, Matt Rambo, and Henry West brought home the victory.
- Maryland is also 108-14 (.885) since 2015 when scoring at least 10 goals.

HOLDING OPPONENTS TO SINGLE-DIGITS

- Maryland is 118-11 since Tillman took over the program in 2011, when it allows nine goals or less for a .915 winning percentage.
- Maryland is 3-0 in 2023 when holding opponents to less than 10 goals after a 15-4 win over No. 19 Richmond (Feb. 4), holding No. 6 Princeton to five goals in an 11-5 Terrapin win (Feb. 25), and a 16-9 win at Albany (Mar. 11).
- The last time the Terps allowed less than 10 goals and lost a game was March 4, 2017 a 5-4 loss at Notre Dame.
- The last time Maryland suffered a home loss when giving up less than 10 goals was back in the first year of the Big Ten Tournament when Ohio State topped the Terps, 9-6, in the conference semifinals at SECU Stadium.

SEASON OPENERS

- Maryland has won 30 consecutive season-opening games dating back to the 1994 season. The Terps are 94-3-1 all-time in season-opening games dating back to the program's first varsity season in 1924.
- Maryland opened its 2023 season with a dominating 15-4 win over No. 19 Richmond on Feb. 4 at SECU Stadium. Owen Murphy led the offense with four goals, while the Terps' defense was stellar in keeping Richmond scoreless for 43:31, spanning the first through fourth quarters. Logan McNaney made 12 saves in net and allowed just three goals.

CONSECUTIVE 10-WIN SEASONS

- Maryland's 17-9 win over Rutgers on April 10, 2022, extended the Terps' streak of double-digit win seasons to 18, the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse.
- Only two programs own a current streak of at least 10-straight 10-win seasons after Notre Dame's streak was snapped in 2017 at 11. *2020, canceled in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic, is not counted on this list.

During his tenure, the Catamounts won the America East twice, made their first two NCAA Tournaments in program history, and went 44-24. Bernhardt was a member of the Terrapins' staff in 2014 as the Director of Operations.
- Tim O'Branski joined the Terps in September 2022 as the team's volunteer assistant coach. Before becoming a Terp, O'Branski spent two years as offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator at Mercer University.

TERPS' 98TH SEASON OF LACROSSE

- ▶ The Terps boast an all-time record of 877-279-4 (.758), dating back to the first varsity team in 1924 (a team was not fielded in 1944 and 1945 due to World War II). Maryland has finished with a .500 or better record in all 97 seasons. The program reached the 800-win milestone with a 12-6 victory on April 12, 2017, at Albany.
- Maryland finished the decade of the 2010s 134-42 for a .761 winning percentage, making it the winningest decade in Terrapin lacrosse history. Nine of those seasons came under the direction of head coach John Tillman, who has posted a 122-38 record and a .763 winning percentage at the helm for Maryland.
- During the decade of the 2000s, Maryland went 111-49 for a .694 win percentage. In the decade of the 1990s, Maryland posted a 95-47 record. The .669 winning percentage matched Maryland's win percentage of the 1980s when the Terps went 83-41 and also compiled a .669 win percentage.

NO. 1 TERPS OPEN BIG PLAY WITH 18-7 WIN AT PENN STATE

STATE COLLEGE, PA - No. 1 Maryland continued its winning ways in 2022 with a dominating 18-7 victory at Penn State to open Big Ten play for the Terps at a chilly Panzer Stadium on Sunday night. The Terps moved to 8-0 on the season and 1-0 in Big Ten action.

Maryland reeled off 13 goals in a row bridging the second and third quarters to open an 18-3 lead while the defense kept the Nittany Lions off the scoreboard for more than 23 minutes from midway through the second guarter until the early fourth guarter.

Keegan Khan scored four first-half goals, his second week in a row with four goals. He added an assist for a five-point game.

Eric Malever (three goals, two assists) scored at least two goals for the fourth game in a row for a career-high five points. Kyle Long scored three goals, equaling his career-high for the third time. Jack Koras had his first first-career multi-goal game with a pair.

Logan Wisnauskas posted five points on a goal and a season-best four assists and a goal.

Ten different Terps scored goals in the victory.

At the X, Luke Wierman once again dominated, winning 16-of-21, giving the Terps the huge advantage in possession, leading to 44 shots. He also had 10 groundballs, with all 10 coming in the first half alone.

Between the pipes, starting goalie Logan McNaney made nine saves, allowing just three goals and holding Penn State scoreless for the final 22:25 of his playing time. Drew Morris made five saves in relief.

Penn State fell to 2-7 and 0-1 in the Big Ten. Will Peden and Nils Barry each scored two goals for the Nittany Lions.

BREAKING DOWN THE ACTION

- ▶ The Terps jumped out to a 4-0 lead to open the game with tallies by Will Koras, Keegan Khan and a pair by Kyle Long Long with four minutes left in the first quarter. McNaney made four saves in the first quarter as the Terps led 4-1 after 15 minutes.
- ▶ After Penn State crept back within two at 5-3 on a Will Peden goal with 7:35 left in the first half, the Terps ripped off six goals in a row with Khan scoring three goals in the spurt and Luke Wierman, Bubba Fairman and Long adding the others in the run. Khan and Wierman scored six seconds apart to open the burst. Maryland led 11-3 at halftime.
- ▶ The Terps continued the onslaught scoring seven goals in a quarter for the second period in a row. Maryland blanked Penn State, 7-0, in the third quarter with Malever scored a natural hat trick with the final three goals of the quarter in a span of 4:29. Wisnauskas, Koras, Jonathan Donville and Anthony DeMaio also scored. It was the fourth different quarter Maryland shut out its opponent this season.
- ▶ Penn State scored all four goals of the fourth quarter to make the score 18-7.

- Since Maryland joined the Big Ten in 2015, the Terps lead the series 8-1.
- Last season saw the top-ranked Terps jump out to a 4-0 lead in the first quarter, but a 13-0 run, spanning the second and third quarters, proved to be the difference in the 18-7 win for Maryland. Keegan Khan led 10 Maryland goal-scorers with four goals.

BERNHARDT SETS TERPS' GOAL RECORD IN ROMP OVER PENN STATE. 17-10

COLLEGE PARK, Md. -- Senior Jared Bernhardt broke the all-time Maryland career goals record as he scored a game-high five goals in the #3 Terps' 17-10 victory over #19 Penn State on a sun-splashed Saturday at Capital One Field at Maryland Stadium.

BERNHARDT'S DAY OF HISTORY

- ▶ Bernhardt's goal from the left side of the goal with 1:39 left in the second quarter gave him his 156th of his career, passing Matt Rambo (2014-17), who scored 155 in his time as a Terp.
- ▶ Bernhardt now tops the goal-scoring list with 159 and counting.
- ▶ He finished the day with a career-high tying eight points, adding three assists to move second in career points with 234, passing Joe Walters (2003-06), who had 227 and Bob Boneillo (1977-80), who had 231. Rambo holds the record with 257.
- ▶ Bernhardt's eight points tied his career-high, set back in 2019 against Michigan, when he also had five goals and three asissts.
- ► The eight-point day ties for 13th-most in school history.
- ▶ With his three assists, Bernhardt now has 75 to stand 19th all-time.

▶ The Terps remained perfect on the season at 7-0 as they are off to their best start since 2014, when they also started 7-0.

OFFENSE CONTINUES TO ROLL

- ▶ With 17 goals, the Terps are averaging 16.6 goals per game, fifth in the nation and first in the Big Ten.
- In addition to Bernhardt scoring five, three other Terps had multi-goal goals.
- Logan Wisnauskas netted four goals, Daniel Maltz had three and Bubba Fairman tallied two.
- ▶ The Terps' other goals came from Griffin Brown, Jack Koras and Kyle Long.

Blending a mix of the program's historic motto, "Be The Best," with his own principles of high character in all aspects of life, John Tillman has created a formula that has resulted in one of the most successful eras in Maryland lacrosse's illustrious history.

Tillman's formula came to ultimate fruition in 2017 when Maryland captured its first NCAA National Championship since 1975. He then led the Terps back to the top in 2022 with an undefeated 18-0 season capped by the 2022 National Championship.

Since taking over the helm as Maryland head coach 12 years ago, Tillman has led the Terps to nine NCAA Final Fours, seven national title games and a 163-41 (.799) overall record. He enters his 13th season at Maryland in 2023.

Tillman's numbers since arriving in College Park in 2011 are impressive, leading the country in All-American selections (79), NCAA Tournament wins (28) and Final Fours (9) during that 12-year span.

In just 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, Tillman has already supplanted himself among the greatest coaches in history. His 28-9 (.757) career NCAA Tournament record ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history. Additionally, the program's accomplishments have translated to the classroom, as Tillman has had 20 USILA Scholar All-Americans in 12 seasons. The 2015 spring semester and 2016 fall semester combined for the program's highest GPA in more than 10 years.

GAME 1: NO. 1 MARYLAND OPENS SEASON WITH 15-4 WIN OVER NO. 19 RICHMOND

COLLEGE PARK - No. 1 Maryland began its 2023 season with a 15-4 victory over No. 19 Richmond on a sunny 28-degree day at SECU Stadium. Ten different Terps scored goals and 13 Terps had points.

Owen Murphy recorded four goals, tying his career-high in goals. Daniel Maltz posted five points on two goals and a career-high tying three assists.

Freshman Braden Erksa had three points on two goals and an assist in his college debut.

The Terps' defense was stellar in keeping Richmond scoreless for 43:31 spanning the first through fourth quarter. That was the longest scoreless streak for Maryland's defense since keeping Drexel scoreless for 56:17 on Feb. 28, 2015.

In goal, Logan McNaney made 12 saves for Maryland before giving way to Teddy Dolan for the final 10 minutes.

Close defensemen Brett Makar (four) and Ajax Zappitello (three) combined for seven caused turnovers as the Terps had 12 as a team. Makar had five groundballs.

Face-off man Luke Wierman won 10-of-17 face-offs, grabbing nine groundballs.

In allowing just four goals, the Terps had their fewest goals allowed in a game since beating Navy, 10-4, in the 2018 season opener on

The Terps have now won 30 consecutive season openers dating back to the 1994 season.

BREAKING DOWN THE ACTION

- ▶ Geppert opened the scoring for the season with a pole goal coming 1:25 into the action. The Terps took a 3-0 lead in the game's first four minutes as Murphy and Erska scored. Murphy added his second of the game with 56 seconds left for a 4-1 Terps edge after one.

BALTIMORE, MD -- No. 1 Maryland could not rally from early deficits against Loyola and ultimately came up short by a score of 12-7. Daniel Kelly scored four goals to lead the way for the Terps. Jack Brennan and Kyle Long each added a goal and an assist apiece. Luke Wierman won 18-of-22 at the face-off and scooped up seven ground balls. His fifth face-off win gave him 400 for his career. He is just the ninth Terp in 98 seasons to reach that milestone.

GAME 3: NO. 4 MARYLAND BEATS NO. 16 SYRACUSE. 15-12

COLLEGE PARK - No. 4 Maryland had five different multi-goal scorers as the Terps beat No. 16 Syracuse, 15-12, at SECU Stadium on Saturday afternoon. Daniel Kelly (four goals and two assists for six points) and Jack Koras (three goals and an assist for four points) each posted career highs in points in the victory, which came in Syracuse's first game at Maryland since 1997.

The Terps (2-1) extended their home win streak to 20 games in a row, and they have won 37 of their last 39 games dating to 2020. The Orange dropped its first game of 2023 and now stand at 3-1 on the season.

Dante Trader Jr., who starred for Maryland football this past fall, scored his first two collegiate goals for the Terps, including an amazing individual effort in the fourth quarter where he maintained the ball after being knocked down, drawing a penalty; he then ran down from midfield and scored. Trader also had three groundballs.

Kyle Long (two goals, two assists), Owen Murphy (two goals, assist), and Daniel Maltz (goal, assist) also had multi-point games for the Terps. In addition, John Geppert scored his 10th career pole goal.

Face-off man Luke Wierman continued his dominant play this season, winning 24-of-31 face-offs and scooping up 12 groundballs. The 24 wins equaled his career high.

On defense, Brett Makar limited Syracuse's Joey Spallina - who entered the game with 11 goals and 13 points - holding him to one goal and one assist. Makar had five groundballs and a caused turnover. Ajax Zappitello had three caused turnovers and four groundballs.

Graduate student Teddy Dolan made his first start in goal for the Terps in place of Logan McNaney and made nine saves.

The Terps took 50 shots, their most since taking 50 against Virginia last season at Audi Field.

This was Syracuse's first game at Maryland since the 1997 NCAA Tournament and first regular-season game in College Park since 1983.

BREAKING DOWN THE ACTION

- Maryland opened the game with the first three goals of the afternoon coming from Kelly, Jack Koras, and Maltz as the Terps took the first 13 shots of the game in building a 3-0 lead in the first 2:56 of the game. The Orange got on the scoreboard as Michael Leo scored with 4:30 left in the first to make it 3-1 after the first.
- Syracuse scored the first two goals of the second quarter to even the game at 3-3 on a goal by Luke Rhoa. Maryland regained the lead at 4-3 on a man-up goal by Owen Murphy set up by Kelly with 7:47 left in the second. Long, Jack Koras, and Murphy scored to make it a four-goal run to give the Terps a 7-3 advantage on four goals in a span of 2:36. Syracuse scored the next two goals, coming from Griffin Cook and Jake Murphy, cutting Maryland's lead to 7-5. They responded with two goals in the final 55 seconds of the first half as Kelly and Geppert scored 10 seconds apart to give the Terps a 9-5 lead at halftime.
- The Orange opened the second half with a pair of goals to make it 9-7 just over three minutes into the game, but Maryland, once again, answered as Kelly notched the hat trick, followed by Trader scoring his first collegiate goal off a face-off win and another Kelly goal to make it 12-7 with 9:33 left in the third quarter. Syracuse tallied the final two goals of the third quarter to make it 12-9 in favor of Maryland after 45 minutes.
- ▶ After Spallina scored on a behind-the-back goal to make it 12-10, the Terps responded with three goals as Long notched his second of the game, then Koras posted his first-career hat trick for a 14-10 lead - both on man-up. Trader then scored after an amazing individual effort where he was knocked down for an ensuing penalty, maintained the ball, and scored for a 15-10 lead.

GAME 4: ALL-AROUND EFFORT GIVES NO. 6 TERPS 11-5 WIN AT NO. 4 PRINCETON

PRINCETON, NJ - No. 6 Maryland had outstanding efforts on both ends of the field as the Terps won at No. 4 Princeton, 11-5, in frigid temperatures at Class of 1952 Stadium. Freshman goalie Brian Ruppel made his collegiate debut in goal and made 14 saves to anchor a Terrapin defense that allowed just five goals. The 14 saves were the most by a Maryland freshman in his first-career start since Hall of Famer Brian Dougherty made 23 in his first start as freshman on May 4, 1993 vs. Towson State.

On offense, Daniel Maltz scored four goals and added an assist for five points. Jack Koras had three goals and a helper for four points. It was Koras' second game in a row with a hat trick and four points, to equal his career best.

Daniel Kelly also scored two goals, his third game in a row with multiple goals. Maryland's other goals came from Owen Murphy and Ryan Siracusa. The Terps were 3-of-6 on man-up with Kelly, Koras and Maltz scoring with the extra man

The Terps (3-1 overall) led throughout, taking a 2-0 lead in the first quarter and holding that lead throughout thanks to stellar defense. The third quarter proved to be the decisive one as the Terps outscored Princeton 7-2 over that 15-minute span with Koras and Maltz each scoring two in the period.

In front of Ruppel, the two-time C. Markland Kelly Award winner at Catonsville High School, the Terrapin defense was stout. Brett Makar had six groundballs and caused four turnovers. Ajax Zappitello had three caused turnovers while Jack McDonald had two caused turnovers and two groundballs.

Face-off man Luke Wierman won 13-of-20 and had a game-best nine groundballs. He moved to fifth in career groundballs at Maryland and now has 242. His 450 career face-off wins stand sixth all-time.

In a rematch of the 2022 NCAA Semifinals, Princeton suffered its first loss of the season and is now 2-1. Coulter Mackesy led the Tigers with three goals.

- ▶ The Terps struck first as a result of a beautiful defensive play from Makar that led to a Kelly goal in transition. Murphy put the Terps ahead 2-0 with 50 seconds left at the end of the first quarter.
- ▶ Maltz scored off a feed from Murphy to make it 3-1 Terps with eight minutes left in the second quarter. The Terps led 3-1 at halftime of a defensive game. Ruppel had eight saves in the first half in allowing just one Tiger goal.
- Maryland opened up the offense in the third quarter scoring seven goals to build a 10-3 lead after three. Maltz had three goals in the quarter and Jack Koras scored twice in the period.
- Princeton scored two goals in the fourth quarter and Koras finished the scoring with 2:15 left in the game for the 11-5 final.

GAME 5: NO. 2 NOTRE DAME WINS TRIPLE-OT THRILLER OVER NO. 4 TERPS, 13-12

COLLEGE PARK - In a Top-5 showdown that lived up to the billing, Pat Kavanaugh scored in triple overtime to lift No. 2 Notre Dame past No. 4 Maryland, 13-12, before 6,001 fans at a sunny SECU Stadium on Saturday. The game was tied nine different times before Kavanaugh's winning goal. Maryland is now 3-2, while the Irish are 4-0.

On offense, Owen Murphy (three goals), Eric Spanos (three goals), Jack Brennan (two goals), and Daniel Maltz (two goals) each had multiple goals for the Terps. Daniel Kelly and Zach Whittier (first-career goal) also scored. Maltz added two assists for four points, while Murphy also had four points with a helper

Kyle Long added three assists for the second week in a row, and freshman Braden Erksa had a career-high three assists.

On defense, freshman goalie Brian Ruppel, making his second-career start, made 12 saves, including three crucial saves in overtime. At the face-off X, Luke Wierman won 20-of-31 for the Terps as he also scooped up eight groundballs.

Notre Dame's Chris Kavanaugh had three goals. Quinn McCahon, Brian Tevlin, and Jack Simmons each scored two.

This was Maryland's first triple-overtime game since beating Johns Hopkins, 8-7, on April 28, 2018.

BREAKING DOWN THE ACTION

- ▶ Murphy had a hat trick in the first quarter as the Terps led 4-3 after the first 15 minutes. After Murphy opened the scoring, Notre Dame reeled off three goals in a row before the Terps regained the lead on two tallies by Murphy and one by Brennan.
- Notre Dame regained the lead at 5-4 with two goals in the first 1:20 of the second guarter as Tevlin's goal gave the Irish the lead again. The Terps were held off the scoreboard for the entire quarter – their first scoreless quarter this season – as Notre Dame led 5-4 at intermission. Maryland outshot the Irish 30-15 over the first 30 minutes.
- ▶ Just 50 seconds into the second half, Brennan evened the game with his second goal of the game off a feed from Erksa to tie the game at 5-5. Spanos gave the Terps a 6-5 lead 4:47 into the second half. The Irish tied the game on a tally by Eric Dobson just 22 seconds later at 7-6. Notre Dame extended to an 8-6 lead on consecutive goals by Jack Simmons with 6:23 left in the third. Spanos scored his second in the quarter to bring the Teros back within one at 8-7 with 5:35 left. Whittier tied the game at 8-8 with 4:42 left in the quarter with his first-career goal. The Terps continued a three-goal run with a Daniel Kelly score off a sweet feed from Long with three minutes left in the quarter as Maryland went ahead 9-8. The Terps held that one-goal lead into the fourth.
- ▶ The Irish tied the game 2:04 into the fourth quarter on a Chris Kavanaugh goal and took the lead back at 10-9 on Quinn McCahon's second of the day off a feed from Pat Kavanaugh with 11:49 left in the fourth. Spanos tied the game at 10-10 with 10 minutes left in the game - the eighth time the game was tied. Maltz gave the Terps the lead back at 11-10 with 8:48 remaining. Maltz scored again with 3:50 left for a 12-10 Terps' lead. The Irish got one back with 3:14 left, making it 12-11. Chris Kavanaugh tied the game for the ninth time at 12-12 with 1:56 left in the fourth. Neither team could score after that, and the game went to overtime.
- ▶ Ruppel made two huge saves in the first overtime as neither team could find the back of the net. In the second overtime, Ruppel again came up big with a save to keep the game scoreless and headed to a third extra session. Pat Kavanaugh scored the winner with 2:06 left in the third overtime.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA - In a battle fitting of the last two teams to win the National Championship. Daniel Kelly scored for No. 3 Maryland in overtime to give the Terps a dramatic 14-13 win over No. 1 Virginia, handing the Cavaliers their first loss of the season. Maryland moved to 5-2 overall, while Virginia is now 6-1.

In overtime, Brian Ruppel made three incredible saves to gain possession back for the Terps, setting the stage for Kelly's heroics.
