NO. 12 USC MEN'S VOLLEYBALL BEGINS JEFF NYGAARD ERA AT 2016 SEASON-OPENING PENN STATE TOURNAMENT

THE FACTS

The Jeff Nygaard era of USC men's volleyball begins when his No. 12-ranked Trojans (0-0 overall, 0-0 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation) open the 2016 season against a pair of Top 10 non-conference opponents at the Penn State Tournament, first meeting host No. 10 Penn State (0-0) on Thursday (Jan. 7) at 7:30 p.m. ET and then playing No. 6 Ohio State (0-1) on Friday (Jan. 8) at 5 p.m. ET.

FOLLOW THE TROJANS

All of USC's home matches are video- and audio-streamed live for free on USCTrojans.com, except for the 6 matches televised live on Pac-12 Network (those matches only are audio-streamed). Many of USC's road matches are audiocast live on USCTrojans.com. USC's online announcers are onetime Northeastern player/Winthrop assistant coach Paul Duchesne and ex-Trojan player Paul Yoder (one of 6 Yoders to have played volleyball at USC). Fans can also follow USC home matches through Live Stats at USCTrojans.com and all matches via Twitter (@USCmen'svolley).

RANKINGS

USC is ranked 12th in the current AVCA Division I-II Top 15 poll. Penn State is ranked 10th and Ohio State is sixth.

OPPONENTS

USC holds an 18-7 series mark against Penn State, but Troy was swept by the Nittany Lions in a home match last season. The Trojans are 18-1 all-time against Ohio State and have won the past 3 meetings, most recently a 3-1 victory over the Buckeyes in 2010 in a tourney in Hawaii. Before facing USC, Ohio State hosts Princeton on Jan. 5 and then meets UCLA in the Penn State Tournament on Jan. 7.

LAST YEAR

USC returns 11 lettermen, including four starters and the libero, from a 2015 team that went 19-9 overall (15-7 in the MPSF for a fourth place finish). Last year, USC posted seven victories over Top 10 teams, advanced to the MPSF Tourney semifinals (losing a five-set heartbreaker to host UC Irvine) and finished with a No. 7 national ranking. Troy went 8-3 in five-setters in 2015, a USC record for five-set matches and wins. After the 2015 season, it was announced that Bill Ferguson would not return after 9 years as USC's head coach. During his tenure, he had guided Troy to three trips to the NCAA Championships, two Mountain Pacific Sports Federation regular season crowns and an MPSF tourney title. Ferguson was succeeded by Jeff Nygaard, his assistant the past 5 seasons. Under Nygaard's new leadership, the 2016 Trojans are looking to make it back to the NCAA tourney after a three-year absence (2012 was USC's third NCAA trip in a four-year span). USC's biggest challenge in 2016 will be replacing two-time All-American and Lloy Ball Awardwinning setter Micah Christenson, a four-year starter who is now the U.S. Men's National Team setter, and three-year starting middle blocker Robert Feathers, who hit .382 in his career with 324 blocks. Also graduated from 2015 are opposite hitter Cristian Rivera (39 career starts, with a third of those last season) and middle blocker Chris Lischke, who started 20 times in his tenure. Larry Tuileta, a 2015 MPSF All-Freshman team selection when he hit .272 with 173 kills and 118 digs, also did not return.

NYGAARD

Jeff Nygaard, a 3-time Olympian in indoor and beach volleyball and a 2-time collegiate MVP while playing on a pair of NCAA championship teams, was named the head coach of the USC men's volleyball team on June 4, 2015, after serving the previous 5 seasons as a Trojan assistant. Nygaard, 43, coached USC's middle blockers in his 5 seasons (2011-15) as Bill Ferguson's lead assistant. During that span, Troy played in a pair of NCAA Final Fours, won 2 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation regular season titles and posted an 88-48 (64.7%) overall mark. In the summer of 2015, Nygaard was the head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team that competed in the Pan American Cup in Reno.

QUOTING NYGAARD

"I am excited about USC's future," said Nygaard. "We will take the groundwork that was put down here in the past and take it to a championship level, which is where USC's heritage is and where it belongs. Excellence is the norm at USC. Our focus moving forward is to become sustainably great. We will cultivate a team culture where each player expects more from himself and more from his teammates. Our emphasis in training has been to improve our physicality, our competitiveness and our volleyball IQ. Our players have embraced this challenge. Setting the expectations and establishing the culture has been at the top of the to-do list. This past fall was dedicated to instituting a mindset of success and doing things the right way in all facets of the student-athlete experience. Coupled with that was the dedication to player development, which will go on throughout the season. We want to peak at the end. We have a long way to go to get where we want, but there's no doubt in my mind that this team can have the success expected of a USC men's volleyball team. I am looking forward to our journey through the season."

ASSISTANT COACHES

Joining USC as new assistant coaches in 2016 are former U.S. Men's National Team assistant and Japan head coach Gary Sato and 2015 AVCA Division III Coach of the Year Todd Hollenbeck from UC Santa Cruz, along with volunteer assistant Galen Dodd.

BENESH

USC will be led by 6-9 junior middle blocker Andy Benesh, a two-year starter who spent this past summer competing with both the U.S. Men's Junior National Team, which won a silver medal at the U21 Pan American Cup and also played in the FIVB U21 World Championships, and the U.S. Men's National Team that competed in the Pan American Cup. He was named to the 2016 Off The Block Pre-season All-American second team. He was named to the 2016 Off The Block National Middle Attacker of the Year

Award watch list. A back injury could be slow him early in the 2016 season. Benesh won 2015 honorable mention All-American and All-MPSF notice while leading USC's regulars in hitting percentage (.394) and blocks (93) and also getting 160 kills and 45 digs. He is a .419 hitter in his career with 350 kills and 184 blocks.

OTHER MIDDLE BLOCKERS

Looking to fill Robert Feathers' spot as the other middle blocker will be 6-8 senior Tommy Leonard, who has appeared in just 22 matches in his career (with 12 starts, including nine times in 2014), 6-6 redshirt freshman Connor Inlow, who redshirted last spring as an outside hitter, and 6-7 firstyear freshman Tyler Resnick out of Newbury Park (Calif.) High, who like USC's other four new frosh was on the 2015 Volleyball Magazine Fab 50 list.

OUTSIDE HITTERS

A number of players will battle to start on the outside. Alex Slaught, a 6-4 senior, has 50 career starts at outside hitter with 483 kills, 220 digs, 63 blocks and 39 aces. He was named to the 2016 Off The Block Karch Kiraly Award (nation's top outside attacker) watch list. Last year, he earned All-MPSF honorable mention while getting a teambest 284 kills along with 121 digs, 26 blocks and 25 aces (second on USC) and starting 23 times. He played in the 2015 World University Games for the U.S. The other outside hitting job was shared last year between Larry Tuileta and 6-3 junior Christopher Orenic, who had 194 kills (second on the team), 101 digs and 20 aces in 2015. Looking to re-emerge into the

outside hitting mix is 6-4 junior Lucas Yoder, who never got untracked in 2015 (he appeared in only 3 matches) after being the 2014 National and MPSF Freshman of the Year when he had a team-best 394 kills while hitting .303, along with 111 digs, 33 blocks and 13 aces. He is one of six Yoders to play at USC, including his late father, Dave. Then there is a trio of first-year freshman outside hitters: 6-2 Woody Cook of Oak Park (Calif.) High, the 2015 All-CIF Division II Player of the Year (his father, Scott, played for the 1986 Trojans), 6-4 Blake Markland of Mira Costa High in Manhattan Beach (Calif.), who earned 2015 prep All-American second team and All-CIF Division I honors, and 6-7 Ryan Moss of Corona del Mar (Calif.) High, a 2015 prep All-American first teamer and All-CIF Division I pick. Cook and Moss might also be used at opposite hitter.

OPPOSITE HITTERS

Josh Kirchner, a 6-6 senior, has 26 career starts (half last spring at opposite hitter and the others in 2013 at middle blocker). He either will look to start at opposite in 2016 after splitting time there a year ago with the graduated Cristian Rivera or he might be used again in the middle. He notched 151 kills (hitting .252), 51 digs and 34 blocks in 2015. But Kirchner will be pushed at opposite not only by Woody Cook and Ryan Moss (if they are tried there), but by 6-6 soph **Jon Rivera** of Puerto Rico (no relation to Cristian), who had 2 starts at opposite hitter in 2015 as a true freshman (he played in only 4 matches overall).

SETTERS

The task of replacing the talented Micah Christenson at setter will fall to either 6-5 junior Michael Mullahey, a member of 2015 U.S. team at the World University Games who has appeared in 13 matches (with 5 starts) in his USC career as Christenson's backup, 6-6 sophomore Gert Lisha, a transfer from Lewis who appeared in 26 matches last spring as a backup for the Flyers' NCAA runnersup squad and who played for his native Albania in the 2013 FIVB World Grand Prix, or 6-3 sophomore Jack Yoder, Lucas' cousin (he has seen brief action in only one match at USC). Mullahey could be sidelined at the start of the 2016 season with a knee injury.

LIBEROS

Brooks Varni, a 6-2 senior, returns as the starting libero (he had 210 digs in 2015). <u>He</u> was named to the 2016 Off The Block Erik Shoji Award (nation's top libero) watch list. He and Slaught are the team's captains. He will be challenged by 5-9 junior Vinnie Rios (his only playing time came in 6 matches last spring) and 5-10 first-year freshman Matt Douglas of Loyola High in Los Angeles (Calif.), a prep All-American and All-CIF Division I honoree last year.

YODERS: FIRST FAMILY OF USC VB Cousins Lucas Yoder and Jack Yoder are among 6 Yoders to play volleyball at USC and one of 8 Yoders to play collegiately: their uncle, Bob, was a 1977 All-American first teamer who led the Trojans to the NCAA title that season and then as USC's head coach for 8 seasons (1982-89) guided Troy to the 1988 NCAA championship; Lucas' late father, Dave, was a 1987 All-American second teamer who led USC to 3 NCAA Final appearances; their cousin, Erin, was a defensive specialist on the USC women's team (2009-12, including on a pair of NCAA Final Four teams); their cousin, Cory, was a 2011 All-American at UC Irvine and was a member of the Anteaters' 2009 NCAA champions; Jack's brother, Paul, was a libero at USC (2011-14) and now is the online radio analyst for USC men's volleyball broadcasts; and Lucas' sister, Molly, was a libero at UC Irvine (2011-14).

RELATIVELY SPEAKING

Woody Cook's father, Scott Cook, played volleyball at USC in 1986, helping the Trojans to a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championship after posting a 27-2 overall record and a 20-0 mark while winning the conference, while his uncle is Chris Lewis, a 3-time (1976-78) All-American tennis player at USC who won the 1977 NCAA doubles crown (with Bruce Manson) and was a member of Troy's 1976 NCAA championship squad ... Matt Douglas' late grandfather, Jon Douglas, was a 2-sport star at Stanford, lettering at quarterback in 1956 to 1957 (he was the starter in 1957) and was the school's first All-American tennis player in 1957 and 1958 (he was the NCAA singles and doubles runner-up in 1958), then was ranked in the U.S. Top 10 from 1960 to 1962 and played on the 1958, 1961 and 1962 U.S. Davis Cup teams (he is a member of the Stanford Athletic Hall of Fame and the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Hall of Fame)...Josh Kirchner's sister, Stephanie, was a middle hitter at Wisconsin-Platteville (2010-13)...Gert Lisha's parents, Besnik and Valbona, played professional volleyball in Albania (his father, Besnik, was on the Albanian national team), while his late grandfather was Albanian author Mentor Quku...Blake Markland's grandfather, Francis, was a faculty member at the USC School of Medicine for 40 years...Michael Mullahey's grandfather, Edward Mullahey, was swimmer at Iowa (1952-54).

VOLLEYBALL SCHOOL

In its history, the USC men's volleyball program claims 4 NCAA titles (1977-80-88-90) among its 14 NCAA Final Four appearances, as well as 2 USVBA titles (1949-50). It has produced 18 Olympians, 34 All-American first teamers and seven College Players of the Year. Besides the crowns that USC's men have won, the Women of Troy have captured 6 national

volleyball titles. USC's women won the AIAW trophy in 1976, 1977 and 1980, and the NCAA crown in 1981. Current coach Mick Haley's 2002 and 2003 Women of Troy squads captured NCAA titles (the 2010 and 2011 teams made it to the NCAA Final Four).

ACADEMICS

The USC men's volleyball team posted a Fall 2015 semester cumulative grade point average of 3.02, the fifth consecutive semester the team has topped a 3.0 GPA (tied with the swim team as USC's best men's streak). Eight Trojans have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above: **Connor Inlow** (3.45, communication), **Andy Benesh** (3.40, communication), **Jack Yoder** (3.27, economics), **Brooks Varni** (3.25, communication), **Tommy Leonard** (3.20, business administration), **Vinnie Rios** (3.12, global medicine and human biology) and **Michael Mullahey** (3.11, business administration).

2016 SIGNEES

Three high school volleyball standouts— Sean Morrissey of Huntington Beach (Calif.) High, Lucas Lossone of Redondo Union High in Redondo Beach (Calif.) and Jackson Wedbush of Mira Costa High in Manhattan Beach (Calif.)—signed letters of intent with USC in the fall of 2015 and will join the Trojan program in the fall of 2016.

Morrissey, a 6-5 outside hitter, earned 2015 Orange County Register All-Orange County honorable mention and All-Sunset League first team notice as a junior as Huntington Beach won the CIF Division I and Southern California Division I titles. His Southern California Volleyball Club team won the 2015 U17 Open Junior Olympics and he was named MVP of the All-Tournament team.

Lossone, a 6-7 opposite hitter, made 2015 South Bay Daily Breeze All-South Bay honorable mention as a junior and the South Bay Daily Breeze All-South Bay second team as a 2014 sophomore at Redondo Union. He spent his 2013 freshman year playing at South Torrance (Calif.) High. His Southern California Volleyball Club team won the 2015 U17 Open Junior Olympics and he made the All-Tournament team. He also played on the beach, helping Redondo Union win the 2015 Interscholastic Beach Vollevball League High School Beach volleyball boys championship and placing ninth at the 2014 FIVB U17 Beach World Championship in Mexico (with Aidan Brown). His mother. Cica Baccelli of Brazil, was an outside hitter at USC in 1991 and 1992, earning All-American second team and All-Pac-10 first team honors in 1992.

Wedbush, a 6-2 opposite hitter, was a made 2015 South Bay Daily Breeze All-South Bay first teamer as a junior at Mira Costa. His Southern California Volleyball Club team won the 2015 U17 Open Junior Olympics. Also a beach player, he won the 2012 AAU U14 Beach Championship (with Henry Smith).
