TODAY'S GAME

• Penn State will begin its quest for its sixth national title and third NCAA crown when it hosts Canisius in NCAA first-round action Friday, May 10.

LIONS-GRIFFINS MEET FOR FIRST TIME

• The Nittany Lions and Golden Griffins will meet for the first time Friday.

BACK-TO-BACK NCAA BIDS

• Penn State earned back-to-back NCAA tournament bids for the first time since a three-span from 1995-97.

NCAA TOURNAMENT QUICK HITS

- The Nittany Lions will make their 19th NCAA tournament appearance in 2013.
- The NCAA began sponsoring the women's lacrosse championships in 1983. Penn State made 11 straight NCAA tournaments from 1983-93.
- Penn State has won five national championships, including two NCAA titles (1987, 1989). The Nittany Lions also won three straight USWLA titles from 1978-80.

HOSTING IN THE TOURNEY

• Penn State is 5-2 at home in the NCAA tournament. The Nittany Lions last hosted an NCAA tournament game in 2005 (L, 7-6 (3OT) vs. North Carolina).

PENN STATE IN THE NATION

- The Nittany Lions rank eighth in the NCAA in caused turnovers per game (9.67), 12th in points (340), 13th in scoring offense (13.33) and 18th in draw controls per game (13.56).
- Senior defender **Katie Guy** ranks 12th in the nation in caused turnovers per game (1.94).
- Sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick** ranks 15th in the NCAA in points (76), 19th in points per game (4.22), 22nd in assists (33) and 23rd in assists per game (1.83).

SCOUTING CANISIUS

- The Golden Griffins won their third straight MAAC championship with a 10-9 win against Marist.
- Canisius ranks second in the NCAA in ground balls per game (21.17), ninth in caused turnovers per game (9.61), 10th in scoring defense (8.17) and 16th in scoring offense (12.94).
- The Golden Griffins have allowed at least 12 goals in all four of their losses, while allowing no more than nine goals in any of their wins.

• Sophomore goalkeeper Kayla Scully ranks third in the NCAA in save percentage (.521) and fifth in goals-against average (7.38).

• Senior midfielder Morgan Leonard ranks 12th in the country with 3.11 goals per game, while sophomore attacker Tori Quinn ranks 17th in points (74) and 23rd in points per game (4.11).

COMMON OPPONENTS

- Both Penn State and Canisius have played Cornell, Ohio State and Duquesne in 2013.
- The Nittany Lions defeated Duquesne and Ohio State, while Canisius topped Duquesne.

SEARCH FOR A BAKER'S DOZEN

• The Nittany Lions are looking for their first 13-win season since 1999 when they finished with a 15-5 mark.

HONORS ROLLING IN

- Several Nittany Lions were honored with both IWLCA All-West/Midwest Region and All-ALC honors.
- Senior **Katie Guy**, sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** and sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick**, who earned IWLCA first-team honors in 2012, earned IWLCA All-West/Midwest and All-ALC First Team honors.
- Freshman midfielder **Jenna Moschetti**, who earned ALC Rookie of the Week honors a league-high four times, earned IWLCA and ALC second-team recognition.
- Junior attacker **Mackenzie Cyr** was named an All-ALC second-team honoree.

MOST POINTS SINCE 1989

• Sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick's** 76 points are the most by a Nittany Lion since Tami Worley collected 94 points during Penn State's 1989 national championship season.

McCORMICK'S BREAKOUT SEASON

- Sophomore attacker **Maggie McCormick** has improved upon an outstanding freshman campaign with a breakout sophomore season.
- The Eldersburg, Md., native, who has led or has tied for the team lead in points in 13 games this season, is a nominee for the Tewaaraton Award and leads Penn State in goals (43), assists (33) and points (76).
- In 2013, McCormick has set career highs in goals (40), assists (32) points (72), caused turnovers (3), goals in a game (6 vs. James Madison) and assists in a game (5



vs. Duquesne).

- The attacker also notched her 100th career point vs. Drexel March 22.

CYR CLIMBS THE CHARTS

- With a career-high 27 assists in 2013, junior attacker **Mackenzie Cyr** has collected 73 career helpers to move into seventh place on Penn State's all-time list.
- The Westminster, Md., native also leads the Lions with four game-winning goals in 2013, including two in the game's final minute.

LECHNER LEADING

- In 2013, sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** has collected career highs in goals (41), assists (7), points (48), draw controls (48), caused turnovers (17), points in a game (5), goals in a game, draw controls in a game and caused turnovers in a game.
- The Silver Spring, Md., native leads the team in draw controls (48) and ranks second in goals, third in points and caused turnovers and fourth in assists.
- The midfielder has recorded at least three goals in six straight games (eight games overall).

SPREADING THE WEALTH

- Penn State has enjoyed a balanced attack all season with nine student-athletes recording at least 10 points.
- Led by 70-point scorer **Maggie McCormick**, Penn State also boasts one 50-point player, one 40-point performer and three 30-point contributors.
- Five Nittany Lions - **Kelly Lechner**, **Tatum Coffey**, **Jenna Moschetti**, **Madison Cyr**, **Ally Heavens** and **Katie Guy** - have recorded at least 10 ground balls, draw controls and caused turnovers.

UNDERCLASSMEN THRIVING

- Penn State has started as many as eight underclassmen during the 2013 season.
- Freshmen and sophomores have combined for 185 goals, good for 77 percent of the Nittany Lions' scoring.
- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** leads Penn State in goals (43), assists (33) and points (76), while sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** paces the squad with 48 draw controls.
- Freshman **Emi Smith** has been the goalkeeper of record for each game (12-56).

DEFENSIVE ANCHOR

- Defender **Katie Guy** has flourished during her senior season as she has set career highs in ground balls (43), draw controls

(34) and caused turnovers (35).

ALC TOURNAMENT RECAP

- The Nittany Lions fell to Northwestern, 9-8, in overtime in the ALC semifinals at Johns Hopkins' Homewood Field May 3.
- Penn State improved to 6-1 in its opening ALC tournament game with a 16-14 victory against Vanderbilt in the quarterfinals.
- Senior defender **Katie Guy** and sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** earned All-Tournament honors.

LAST TIME OUT

- Penn State dropped a 9-8 overtime contest to Northwestern in the ALC semifinals May 3.
- The Nittany Lions erased a 8-5 second-half deficit to force the extra frame before the Wildcats netted the winning tally.
- The overtime meeting was the first between the schools.
- Final Stats (PSU-NU): Shots (20-20), Saves (7-4), Ground Balls (14-10), Draw Controls (9-12), Turnovers (15-13), Caused Turnovers (9-10).

MOSKETTI GETS FOURTH ALC HONOR

• Freshman midfielder Jenna Mosketti was named ALC Rookie of the Week for the fourth time April 23. The Fallston, Md., native recorded four points (3g, 1a), five draw controls, one ground ball and one caused turnover in victories against Lafayette and Johns Hopkins.

NOT DONE SINCE '91

• The Nittany Lions finished the regular season with an undefeated home record for the first time since 1991.
• Penn State accomplished an undefeated regular season at home for the 13th time in program history.

ANOTHER 10-WIN SEASON

• Penn State secured its fourth straight 10-win season with a 19-10 victory against Lafayette.
• The Nittany Lions have won at least 10 games in each of head coach Missy Doherty's three seasons.

PENN STATE RISING

• The Nittany Lions were twice ranked sixth in both the IWLCA and deBeer Media polls.
• Penn State was ranked at No. 6 for the first time since the 2007 season.

MOSKETTI EARNS THIRD ALC HONOR

• Freshman midfielder Jenna Mosketti earned her third ALC Rookie of the Week honor after helping lead Penn State to victories against Lehigh and Ohio State.
• The Fallston, Md., native tied for the team lead with four caused turnovers, while also collecting three goals, four draw controls and four ground balls.

HIGHEST RANKED WIN SINCE 2007

• The Nittany Lions defeated its highest ranked opponent since 2007 when it knocked off No. 2 Florida, 16-11, at Penn State Lacrosse Field March 30.
• Penn State trailed, 9-6, at halftime but outscored the Gators by a 10-2 margin in the second.
• Tatum Coffey recorded a game-high five points (4g, 1a), while six players recorded multi-point games.

TRIO EARNS WEEKLY HONORS

• Sophomore midfielder Tatum Coffey earned WomensLax.com Co-Player of the Week honors after five points (4g, 1a), two draw controls, one ground ball and a caused turnover against the Gators.
• Freshman Jenna Mosketti earned her second ALC Rookie of the Week award.

Mosketti scored twice, including the game-winner, and corralled a game-high four draw controls.

• Senior defender Colleen Shea was named ALC Defensive Player of the Week for the first time after helping hold Florida to two second-half goals. She also recorded a game-high two caused turnovers.

GUY, MOSKETTI HONORED BY ALC

• Senior Katie Guy and freshman Jenna Mosketti were named ALC Defensive Player of the Week and Rookie of the Week, respectively, March 19.
• A Whitby, Ont., native, Guy collected six ground balls, four draw controls and five caused turnovers against Cornell and Vanderbilt.
• Mosketti collected seven points (5g, 2a), seven ground balls, five draw controls and four caused turnovers.
• Both Guy and Mosketti were honored for the first time in their careers.

LECHNER EARNS PAIR OF HONORS

• After an eight-point weekend (5g, 3a) against Duquesne and then-No. 6/8 Virginia, sophomore midfielder Kelly Lechner was named the WomensLax.com Player of the Week and ALC Offensive Player of the Week.
• Lechner matched her career high with four points in both games. She also tied a personal best with three goals against Duquesne.

COFFEY NAMED TO WATCH LIST

• Sophomore midfielder Tatum Coffey was named to the Tewaaraton Award Watch List Feb. 22.
• The Tewaaraton Award annually honors the top men's and women's U.S. college lacrosse player.

LIONS OPEN 2013 WITH WIN

• The Nittany Lions defeated Bucknell by a 16-goal margin for the second straight season with an 18-2 victory Feb. 20.
• Ten different Nittany Lions recorded at least one point, while goalkeeper Emi Smith garnered the victory in her collegiate debut.

STELLAR DEBUTS

• Several Nittany Lions starred in their collegiate debuts. Midfielder Jenna Mosketti tallied three goals, attack Madison Cyr recorded two points (1g, 1a) and midfielder Ally Heavens added a free-position goal.



DUO TABBED ALL-AMERICANS

- Sophomore midfielder **Tatum Coffey** and junior midfielder **Lizzy Carney** were tabbed *Inside Lacrosse* Preseason All-Americans.
- Last season, Coffey was the nation's only freshman to be named to an All-America team (third).

SISTER ACT

- Penn State boasts three sets of sisters - the Cyrs, Lechners and Foulshams - on the 2013 roster.

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS

- Seniors **Molly Fernandez** and **Katie Guy** and junior **Lizzy Carney** will serve as the Nittany Lion captains during the 2013 season.

DOHERTY ENTERS THIRD SEASON

- Head coach **Missy Doherty** entered her third season at Penn State with a 101-61 career record and a 22-15 mark in Happy Valley through 2012.
- Last season, she led the Lions to their first NCAA tournament appearance since 2005.

MATTHEWS JOINS STAFF

- Former Northwestern standout **Brooke Matthews** joined the Penn State staff June 21, 2012.
- As a player, she helped the Wildcats win three national titles (2008, 2009, 2011).
- In 2012, she served as an assistant coach at Mount St. Mary's.
