SETTING THE SCENE

• Seventh-seeded Penn State (7-8-4, 0-6-0) will begin pursuit of the program's fourth conference crown on Wednesday, Nov. 9 at 3:45 p.m. when it battles No. 2 seed Ohio State (10-6-2, 4-2-0) in an opening round match-up of the 2011 Big Ten Tournament.

• The University of Michigan will serve as hosts of the annual conference event, with all games to be played at U-M Soccer Stadium in Ann Arbor.

TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE

• The Nittany Lions' match with the Buckeyes will be preceded by a contest featuring No. 4 seed Indiana (11-3-4, 3-1-2) and No. 5 Michigan State (7-7-4, 2-2-2) (1 p.m.) and will be followed by a meeting between No. 3 seed Wisconsin (9-7-2, 4-2-0) No. 6 seed Michigan (5-13-1, 1-5-0) (6:30 p.m.).

• Should Penn State get past Ohio State in the first round, it would advance to meet the Wisconsin-Michigan winner in a semifinal contest scheduled for 3:30 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 11.

The advancing team from the Indiana-Michigan State match will face Big Ten regular season champion and No. 1 seed Northwestern (10-4-4, 4-0-2) at 1 p.m. in the other semifinal.
The title game is set for 12 p.m. on Sunday,

Nov. 13.

LAST TIME OUT

• Penn State's snake bit 2011 regular season took a final cruel turn on Saturday afternoon at Jeffrey Field, as the Nittany Lions fell to Wisconsin, 1-0, in double overtime on Senior Day.

• With just 21 seconds remaining in the game, the official awarded the Badgers a penalty kick after Wisconsin's Ryan Buda kicked the ball into the hand of a Nittany Lion player near the top of the box.

• UW's Tomislav Zadro took the penalty kick, beating PSU freshman goalkeeper Andrew

Wolverton to his right.

• Penn State had several prime scoring chances during both regulation and in overtime, putting eight shots on goal, but could not capitalize.

• Mackenzie Arment, Hasani Sinclair, and Minh Vu each had near misses.

PENN STATE SCOUTING REPORT

• Goals have been at a premium for Penn State this season, as it has scored a total of 15 in 19 games.

• Juniors Hasani Sinclair and Julian Cardona top the Nittany Lions with three goals, while Minh Vu (2 goals, 3 assists) is tied with the duo for the team-lead in points with seven.

• Sophomore forward Jordan Tyler and Mackenzie Arment have also scored multiple goals, with each netting two.

• The hallmark of the 2011 Nittany Lions has been solid team defense.

• A senior-laden back line, featuring Mark Fetrow, Justin Lee, and Matt Smallwood, who have combined to start 200 career games, has played strong defense in front of freshman goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton.

• A starter of all 19 games in his rookie campaign, Wolverton tied the Penn State record for shutouts in a season in 2011, recording 10, while compiling a 0.59 goals against average.

• Juniors Brian Forgue and John Gallagher have also been key defensive factors, splitting starts at right back.

OHIO STATE SCOUTING REPORT

• Ohio State enters Wednesday's contest coming off a 1-0 setback to Indiana in Bloomington in its regular season finale on November 5.

• The Buckeyes had been riding a three-game winning streak prior to the loss to the Hoosiers, which was bookended by Big Ten wins over Penn State (1-0, OT) and Wisconsin (2-0).

• Averaging 1.50 goals per game, the Ohio State offense is headlined by Chris Hegngi.

• The junior forward leads the Buckeyes and is tied for first in the Big Ten with nine goals, three of which were game winners.

• Sebastian Rivas (4 goals, 1 assist), Parnell Hegngi (3 goals, 3 assists), Austin McAnena (2 goals, 2 assists), and Omar Vallejo, the team leader in assists with four, have also been productive contributors.

• The Ohio State defense, which allows an average of 1.11 goals per game, is anchored by senior David Tiemstra, the 2010 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, and First Team All-Big Ten goalkeeper Matt Lampson.

 In 18 starts, Lampson has amassed a 1.09 goals against average and recorded five shutouts.

PENN STATE-OHIO STATE SERIES

AME NOTES

• Wednesday's Penn State-Ohio State match will be the 29th all-time meeting between the teams, with the Nittany Lions leading the series 15-11-2.

• In Penn State's 1-0 regular season overtime loss to Ohio State on October 23 in Columbus, the Nittany Lions had a 19-11 shot advantage, including a 6-4 edge in shots on goal, but couldn't find the back of the net.

• Austin McAnena netted the game winner for the Buckeyes, scoring 5:57 into the first overtime period.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

• Overall, Penn State owns a Big Ten Tournament mark of 26-14-4; one of just two conference teams to own a winning record in the postseason competition.

• The Nittany Lions are undefeated versus Wisconsin (4-0), have lost just once to Michigan (3-1) and Michigan State (6-1-1), are 4-2 versus Ohio State, and own a 6-2 mark against Northwestern.

• Their only losing record is against Indiana (3-8-3).

• Penn State last met Ohio State in the Big Ten Tournament in the 2009 title game, falling 1-0 on a goal in the final minute of regulation.

• Penn State is 16-3-1 all-time in first round Big Ten Tournament games. Its only three opening round losses came in 1995 (Indiana), 2004 (Northwestern), and 2008 (Northwestern).

• In 2010, the No. 4-seeded Nittany Lions defeated Northwestern, 3-1, in the first round and then went on to knock off Indiana, 2-1, in the semifinals before falling to Michigan, 4-1, in the Big Ten championship game.

• The Big Ten Network will exclusively broadcast the Big Ten Men's Soccer Tournament, providing television coverage of the semifinals and the finals.

• Dean Linke, Richard Broad, and Chris Doran will provide play-by-play and analysis for all three games.

• Fans can also follow all of the Penn State soccer action at the 2011 Big Ten Tournament on the Internet with live stats and instant scoring updates from GameTracker.

WOLVERTON ANCHORS DEFENSE

• Through the first 19 games of his collegiate career, freshman goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton has registered 10 shutouts.

• Tied the Penn State record for shutouts in a season last week on Oct. 26 versus Bucknell , earning his 10th.

• The program mark is also held by Angelo Nickas (1980), Whit Gibson (1998), and Conrad Taylor (2005).

• Ranks first in the Big Ten in goals against average (0.59), shutouts (10), and save percentage (.826).

• Ranks No. 11 in the NCAA in goals against

average.

• Started all 19 games and logged every minute in goal this season.

• Ranked No. 5 overall on Top Drawer Soccer's national list of top 100 freshmen (No. 2 goalkeeper).

CARDONA EARNS CALL UP

• Julian Cardona was recently called into duty by the Puerto Rico National Team to play in two World Cup qualifying games.

• Cardona left Happy Valley following the Nittany Lions' 2-0 win over Penn on October 4 to head to Puerto Rico and returned on October 11.

• Cardona started and earned 50-plus minutes of playing time in Puerto Rico's Group D World Cup qualifier with Caribbean rival Saint Kitts and Nevis on October 7 in Bayamon, P.R., which ended in a 1-1 draw.

• On October 11, Cardona and the Blue Hurricane met the Canadian National Team at BMO Field in Toronto.

• Canada had dominated Group D, scoring 14 goals while allowing just one but Puerto Rico played the home team to a 0-0 tie.

• However, based on its overall Group D record, Puerto Rico was eliminated from World Cup contention.

• Cardona has started 14 of 15 games in which he has appeared in his first season as a Nittany Lion and currently is tied for first on the team in goals with three and points with seven.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

• Penn State posted a 7-2-4 record this season versus non-conference opponents, including a 5-0-1 mark at home.

• The Nittany Lions surrended just a total of five goals in 13 games versus non-conference foes, with three coming in one game, an early season loss to Stetson.

WARMING REACHES MILESTONE

• With Penn State's 1-0 win over Florida International on September, head coach Bob Warming secured his 400th career win.

• Became just the 31st coach in NCAA men's soccer history to reach the 400-win milestone.

• Ranks sixth among active Division I head coaches and 15th all-time in career wins. CAREER OVERVIEW:

- 34-year coaching veteran
- Six-time finalist for NCAA Division I National Coach of the Year
- Led two teams to the College Cup (Saint Louis, 1997; Creighton, 2002)
- Led his teams to 29 winning seasons.

• Only Division I coach to have at least one player drafted into the MLS every year since the league's inception.

• Inducted into the Creighton University Athletics Hall of Fame in May 2011.

• Minh Vu was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on August 29 for scoring his first Division I goal in his first game as a Nittany Lion in a 1-0 win over Siena.

• Andrew Wolverton was honored as Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on September 12 following a 3-0 shutout of Saint Peter's.

• Jordan Tyler was named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com National Team of the Week on September 12 for scoring two goals in 3-0 win over Saint Peter's.

• Andrew Wolverton was selected to the TopDrawerSoccer.com National Team of the Week on September 19 for recording shutouts versus Saint Francis (Pa.) and Hartford.

• Andrew Wolverton was named SoccerSavings.com/Philly Soccer News College Player of the Week on October 30 for tying the Penn State record for shutouts in a season with his 10th in a 0-0 draw with Bucknell.

• Andrew Wolverton was ranked No. 5 overall on Top Drawer Soccer's national list of top 100 freshmen (No. 2 goalkeeper).

ROSTER MAKEOVER

Penn State lost 71% of its goals, 57% of its assists, and 66% of its points from last year's squad, including the NCAA scoring champion in Corey Hertzog (20 goals, 6 assists) and the nation's leader in assists in Matheus Braga (17).
In all, 12 letterwinners and six starters are gone from the 2010 team that went 14-8-1, played for a Big Ten title, and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Championship.

• Replacing those losses on the 2011 roster are 12 newcomers, including five transfers and seven freshmen.

• Jacob Barron (UC Davis), Julian Cardona (Butler), and Hasani Sinclair (South Florida) transferred from Division I programs while Mihn Vu (Pima Community College) and Marvin Ledgister (North Iowa Area Community College) came to Penn State from junior colleges.

• Through 19 games, 2011 transfers have combined for 66 starts and accounted for 26 of Penn State's 47 points.

• Andrew Wolverton (19) and Owen Griffith (9) are the only freshmen to earn starts in 2011.

2011 CAPTAINS

• Senior defender Matt Smallwood was named the team captain prior to the start of the 2011 season.

• Smallwood exclusively served in that role until the week leading up to Penn State's match-up with Michigan State when head coach Bob Warming appointed fellow seniors Mackenzie Arment, Mark Fetrow, and Justin Lee as cocaptains.

• The four co-captains have combined to start 257 games at Penn State.

• A two-time All-American goalkeeper at at Central Connecticut State, Oshoniyi won two Division II national championships.

• Drafted into the MLS by Columbus, he played 12 years as a professional, capturing a title with Kansas City in 2000.

• On June 27, Warming added Chad Duernberger, former head coach at Division II University of Charleston, to his bench.

• One of the youngest head coaches in the nation when he was hired by his alma mater in 2008, the 24-year-old Duernberger engineered an impressive and rapid turnaround after inheriting a Charleston program that went 0-17-0 the year prior.

• 2009 team went 19-4-0, advancing to the NCAA quarterfinals and earning a final No. 7 ranking.

• Named 2009 NSCAA Division II Coach of the Year.

• Was a four-year starter for Charleston (2002-06), earning First Team All-WVIAC honors three times and all-region recognition in 2002.
