**Nittany Lions Play a Trio at Liberty:** The Penn State baseball team heads to Liberty University this weekend for a three-game set with the Flames. The Nittany Lions will be taking on Liberty for the first time in program history. Due to weather conditions, the Lions will play a nine-inning game on Saturday, followed by a double header on Sunday.

**Last Time Out :** The Lions are coming off of a three-game series against Eastern Tennessee State University, going 1-2 against the Bucs last weekend. Opening the season in style, Penn State took the first game 6-4, posting 11 hits without a single error. Despite a weekend of hard-fought games, the squad dropped the next two to ETSU, falling 8-3 and 9-7. The Lions pushed for a late-game comeback in the third game, however, notching four runs between the eighth and ninth innings and recording 14 hits overall.

Sophomore **J.C. Coban** had a standout series, going six for 14 with a home run, five RBIs and a double. Coban's double gave the Lions the lead in the 6-4 victory over the Bucs, moving the score to 5-3 after being down a run going into the top of the eighth. With the bases loaded, the designated hitter sent the ball hurtling towards the center field wall, earning three RBIs and giving Penn State the momentum to win the contest. The sophomore went on to record his first home run of the season in the final game of the series, earning two RBIs and moving the score to 9-7.

Making his collegiate debut, freshman **James Coates** stepped up for Penn State, notching two hits and an RBI in his first game as a Nittany Lion. The rookie ended the weekend with five hits, two RBIs and two runs, and currently boasts a .500 batting average. Coates fit right in with veterans **Steve Snyder** and **Luis Montesinos**, who each notched three hits and an RBI.

Additionally posting solid performances against ETSU, redshirt senior **Cody Lewis** earned the win for Penn State on Friday, recording one strikeout while walking one without a single hit or earned run. Lewis was relieved by sophomore **Casey Kulina**, who pitched 1.1 innings with three strikeouts, one hit and one earned run to earn the save. Sophomore **Ryan Harper**, freshman **Nick Hedge** and junior **Ian Parvin** each saw action

coming out of the bullpen for Penn State, as did freshman **Jack Anderson** who recorded one strikeout in 1.1 innings and held the Bucs without a hit or earned run in the 9-7 loss.

**Scouting the Flames:** Coming away from a three-game series against No. 7 South Carolina, Liberty sits at a 1-2 record after a 3-2 win and falling 8-7 and 4-3. The close contests were highlighted by a win for **Trey Lambert**, who posted four strikeouts with five hits and an earned run in 4.1 innings, and a save for **Ashton Perritt** in the 3-2 victory over the Gamecocks. Perritt struck out one and allowed zero hits or earned runs in 1.1 innings for the save, and went on to see an inning of action in the 8-7 loss to South Carolina. **Brooks Ray** made the start in the second game, with one strikeout and one hit, while **Carson Herndon** recorded three strikeouts with three hits and an earned run in the 4-3 loss.

**Ryan Cordell** leads the squad with a .462 batting average, with six hits in 13 at-bats, two doubles, a triple and five RBIs. Following Cordell, **Trey Wimmer** holds a .333 percentage after three hits in nine at-bats. **Dalton Britt** and **Bryan Aanderud** each hold a .273 average and three hits. Britt has recorded a triple and an RBI, while Aanderud has notched three RBIs.

Herndon, who holds a 1.80 ERA, is expected to make the start on Saturday, while Lambert, who holds a 2.08 ERA, will start on Sunday in the first game of the double-header. The starter for the final game has yet to be announced.

**All-Time vs. Liberty:** This will be the first ever matchup between Penn State and Liberty.

**AS A RS-JUNIOR IN 2012:** Appeared in 20 games with a 3.74 ERA in 21.2 innings of action...Leads team with a 1.46 ERA against Big Ten opponents...Leads team in games finished with 15...Opened season against UAB (Mar. 9), striking out one with two earned runs in one inning...Struck out three in 1.2 innings against Binghamton (April 4), with just two hits and zero runs...Pitched 2.1 innings in the Michigan series, allowing just two hits and two earned runs while striking out three...Notched first save of the season against Kent State (April 25), striking out a season-best five batters while allowing just one hit and zero runs in two innings...Struck out four batters in two innings to earn first victory of the season against Ohio State (April 28)...Came away from the Minnesota series with his second save of the season, as well as two strikeouts, just one hit and zero earned runs...Produced three consecutive saves in the Illinois series, striking out three and allowing two hits with zero earned runs...Continued to dominated Big Ten opponents, recording his sixth save of the season against Michigan State on May 17...The fourth consecutive save was highlighted by two strikeouts and zero hits or earned runs...Earned the fifth consecutive and seventh overall save of the season the following day against the Spartans (May 18), allowing only one hit and walking one in a single inning...Played his final game of the season on May 23 against Ohio State, striking out one with three earned runs...11.1-inning streak with no earned runs allowed.

**AS A RS-SOPHOMORE IN 2011:** Had arguably the finest start to a career in Penn State history after going 5-0 with a 1.71 ERA during his first six outings with the Nittany Lions ... Opened the year with a victory in each of his first three appearances ... Earned his first win after firing 1.1 innings of shutout relief against West Virginia in his debut on February 19 ... Struck out five and allowed just two hits during a spectacular 4.1-inning effort against Eastern Kentucky on February 26 ... Continued his run with a win over NC State after striking out one in 1.2 innings of relief against the ACC power on March 4 ... Earned his first start of the season against Old Dominion on March 8, tossing three shutout innings with five strikeouts ... Pieced together his finest performance of the year in his next start against Norfolk State on March 13 ... Fired six innings and struck out 11, which matched the highest single-game effort in the Big Ten during the 2011 campaign ... Had his no-hit bid against the Spartans broken up with a lazy single to left in the fifth, which marked the only hit he surrendered ... Earned Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for that performance ... Capped off his season with one last victory after striking out six in 4.2 innings of relief against No. 26 Wichita State on March 20 ... Underwent Tommy John surgery following that contest ... Ranked fifth in the NCAA with five wins and 15th in the nation with a 12.0 strikeouts-per-nine rate at the time of the injury.

**AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2010 (MIDLAND COLLEGE):** Appeared in 19 games with 13 starts on the mound ... Earned All-Conference honors after tallying an 8-6 record with two saves to go along with a 3.25 ERA ... Fired six complete games and posted a pair of shutouts during 91.1 innings of work ... Held opponents to a .224 batting average and recorded 76 strikeouts against only 26 walks.

**AS A FRESHMAN IN 2009 (MIDLAND COLLEGE):** Appeared in 11 games with four starts ... Posted a 3-0 record while striking out 22 in 22.2 innings of work ... Earned the victory in just his second career appearance against Temple on February 13 ... Added wins against College of Southwest and New Mexico.

**AS A JUNIOR IN 2012:** Appeared in 15 games, starting each with nine Big Ten appearances... Led the team in innings pitched with 100.2... Fourth best ERA on the team with a 3.84... Tied at eighth in the Big Ten with allowing just one triple all season... Made season debut against Cincinnati on Feb. 19 where he threw six innings with five strikeouts and three earned runs... Recorded first win at Purdue (April 1) with three strikeouts and three earned runs in 6.2 innings... Pitched first complete game on April 8 against Canisius, striking out eight with just seven hits and three earned runs for the win... Second consecutive and third overall win came against Michigan (April 15) with four strikeouts, one walk and three earned runs... Had the game of his career against Iowa where he threw a no hitter, only allowing one walk and striking out three... Hill's no-hitter was the first Penn State no hitter since 1995, earning him Big Ten Pitcher of the Week (April 23)... NCBWA National Co-Pitcher of the Week... Final win of the season came against Minnesota on May 5... Struck out seven while only walking one and allowing zero earned runs... Struck out three in the final game of the season against Nebraska (May 24)... Had ten starts this season of pitching at least six innings while giving up no more than three earned runs.

**AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2011:** Pieced together a breakout sophomore campaign, earning second-team All-Big Ten honors while receiving the Charles Medlar Award as Penn State's top pitcher ... Anchored the starting rotation throughout the year, starting 15 games while leading all conference pitchers with a 2.57 ERA ... Fired 101.2 innings, which led the squad and ranked second in the Big Ten ... Tossed at least six innings in 12 starts, including a league-high four complete games ... Opened the year with a season-high eight strikeouts while scattering five hits over 7.2 innings of work against West Virginia during the BIG EAST / Big Ten Challenge on February 19 ... Limited NC State to six hits in 6.2 innings of work while posting five strikeouts on March 5 ... Tossed his first complete game of the season and earned the victory after striking out five while allowing just one unearned run during the second game of a doubleheader against Norfolk State on March 19 ... Continued his hot streak with 7.1 innings of work against No. 26 Wichita State, which earned him his second straight victory ... Picked up another win after surrendering just five hits and two runs while striking out seven during a complete game effort against Le Moyne on March 26 ... Tossed his first shutout of the season after blanking Northwestern during a 12-0 victory in Evanston ... Limited the Wildcats to seven hits while striking out two without allowing a walk ... Fired at least six innings in each of his next three starts, highlighted by an eight-inning effort against Michigan State on April 29 ... Named the Big Ten Co-Pitcher of the Week for his performance against Minnesota on May 13 ... Scattered just four hits and struck out six without surrendering a walk while firing his second shutout of the season against the Golden Gophers ... Wrapped up the regular season with seven shutout innings against Michigan on May 19 to earn his sixth victory of the year ... Surrendered just 12 walks during the season and ranked 17th in the nation with a 1.06 walks-per-nine-innings rate ... Finished the year with a 2.08 ERA in conference action, which was the lowest in the league.

**AS A FRESHMAN IN 2010:** Appeared in 21 games with eight starts while throwing 68 innings (second on the squad) ... 43 strikeouts were third-best ... Finished the season with sensational start vs. Michigan (5/21), tying a career-high seven innings, allowing only three runs. The Lions went on to a thrilling 6-5 walk-off win in the ninth ... Was the tough-luck loser at Minnesota (5/15), bouncing back from a tough first inning to go 5.2, allowing only four runs with five strikeouts in the Metrodome ... Earned first-career save as part of win over No. 24 Pitt (4/13), throwing 1.1 scoreless innings with two strikeouts ... Picked up second win of the season, coming into a jam against Columbia (3/20) while tossing 1.2 sparkling innings ... Second strong start in as many outings, tossing six innings while only allowing two runs with three strikeouts at Texas State (3/14) ... Impressed in first career outings, tossing 5.2 innings of one-run ball in the Big Ten/BIG EAST Challenge ... Pitched three innings against Notre Dame (2/28), allowing one run while striking out six. Got out of a bases loaded one-out jam in the ninth by striking out consecutive hitters to force extra innings ...
