"We were just a couple of possessions away I think from finishing the game. Siyeh [Frazier] had a good look at the end to send it into overtime. We just have to keep working and figure out how we can get those one or two possessions to close these games out. But hats off to Michigan, they have a really good player, Hallie Thome, and she played really well for them today and Naz Hillmon as well."

Q: Coach what was the crowd atmosphere like with the Play for Kay game today and what was that type of support like for you guys?
