FIRST SERVE

» Top-ranked Penn State remains home this week, welcoming another set of Big Ten conference teams to Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions square off against No. 4 Nebraska Friday, Oct. 2 at 7 p.m., before taking on Iowa Saturday, Oct. 3 at 7 p.m. in Rec Hall.

» Friday's matchup will broadcast live on the Big Ten Network with Mike Wolf and Audrey Flaugh on the call.

» The Nittany Lion matchup on Saturday marks PSU's annual Dig Pink event, benefiting the Side-Out Foundation. Fans attending the match will receive pink shakers and are also encouraged to wear pink to the match. Pink Penn State volleyball shirts will also be available for purchase. Additionally, the Nittany Lions will host a silent auction featuring Penn State women's volleyball game-worn pink warmup t-shirts. Proceeds from the auction will go directly to PSU's "Dig Pink" profile.

» Penn State opened the first week of Big Ten conference play with a pair of wins last week, sweeping past No. 16 Wisconsin before outlasting No. 21 Minnesota in five sets.

» The Nittany Lion victory against the Gophers moved PSU to 4-0 this year against teams ranked within the Top 25 of the AVCA Coaches' Poll. The match against the Huskers marks Penn State's third consecutive outing against a Top 25 team.

» Sophomore Haleigh Washington was tabbed the Co-Big Ten Player of the Week for the second consecutive week. She had back-to-back double digit kill performances as well as a pair of multi-block performance against both the Badgers and the Golden Gophers.

» Four Nittany Lions powered the PSU offense with double figure kills against both Minnesota and Wisconsin. Additionally, Megan Courtney logged two consecutive double-doubles last week with 10 kills and 14 digs against the Badgers and 22 kills, 13 digs against the Gophers.

» The win against Minnesota extends the Nittany Lion stretch of consecutive wins to 33 straight matches, dating back to the first win in the streak against Purdue on the road Oct. 17, 2014. The stretch is the longest active DI women's volleyball streak in the nation.

» Penn State has earned 12 of its 13 victories this year by way of a 3-0 sweep, while also limiting its opponents to a .114 hitting percentage. The mark ranks third nationally and leads the Big Ten.

» Averaging 3.20 blocks per set on the year, Penn State has commanded a 131.0 - 57.0 advantage in the blocking margin against its opponents in 2015. The average ranks third nationally and leads the Big Ten. Individually, sophomore Haleigh Washington's 1.51 blocks per set ranks eighth nationally and also leads the Big Ten.

» Penn State's .319 hitting clip ranks second in the NCAA national standings and leads the Big Ten. Helped out by Haleigh Washington's team-high .527 hitting clip, her efficiency leads both the nation and the Big Ten.

» In the win against St. John's, Haleigh Washington led a group of five multi-block performers with a career-high 11 total blocks. Her tally is the second highest single-match total in a 3-set match in Penn State program history.

» Senior Kendall Pierce has been selected as a candidate for the 2015 Senior CLASS Award. Pierce is one of 30 women's volleyball student-athletes to be named a candidate, along with one other from the Big Ten conference. The Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

» PSU was voted No. 1 overall for the sixth consecutive week in the latest AVCA Top 25 Coaches' Poll. Penn State received 63 of a possible 64 first place votes.

» Including Penn State, more than half of the Big Ten teams in the conference are featured in this week's AVCA Top 25 poll, including a season-high eight in the top 25 for the third week in a row.

BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK ... AGAIN.

After helping Penn State to a pair of wins in its first week of Big Ten conference play, sophomore Haleigh Washington earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors, splitting the award with Northwestern's Maddie Slater. The award marks Washington's second consecutive Big Ten Player of the Week honor, as well as her third overall this season. In total, Washington's now garnered six career Big Ten Weekly awards.

Washington helped the No. 1 Nittany Lions to wins against two Top 25 opponents with back-to-back double digit kill performances, posting a team-high .488 hitting percentage during the week. She opened the week with 11 kills on 14 perfect swings for a .786 hitting efficiency in a straight set victory against No. 16 Wisconsin. Washington then tallied 13 kills in a five-set victory against No. 21 Minnesota. She also led the PSU blocking unit, averaging 1.25 blocks per set in the undefeated week. In both matches, she tallied five total blocks, including two solo stuffs in each outing.

WEEK 6: AVCA TOP 25 COACHES' POLL UPDATE

Penn State remained atop the AVCA Top 25 Coaches' Poll for the sixth consecutive week. Penn State earned 63 of a possible 64 first place votes. Including PSU, this week's poll features more than half of the Big Ten conference teams with a season-high eight teams in the top 25.

WASHINGTON EARNS BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Following a 3-0 weekend on the road at the USF Invitational, sophomore Haleigh Washington earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors. The award is Washington's second Big Ten Player of the Week award this season, as well as her fifth-career Big Ten Weekly honor. Washington led the team with a .735 hitting percentage in an undefeated weekend on the road that featured wins against Auburn, St. John's and South Florida. Finishing second on the team with 27 kills, she highlighted the weekend with a pair of double figure kill performances. She also led the blocking unit with 1.56 blocks per week.

PENN STATE EARNS USF INVITATIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT NODS

Sophomore Haleigh Washington earned USF Invitational All-Tournament team honors. Red-shirt senior Aiyana Whitney and redshirt freshman Bryanna Weiskircher joined her on the All-Tournament team. In addition to back-to-back double figure kill performances, Washington also logged her first double digit dig performance of the season with a career-high 11 total blocks. Her 11 blocks in the win against St. John's is the second highest single match total in a 3-set match in Penn State program history.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE GOLDEN DOME INVITE ALL-TOURNEY TEAM

Senior Megan Courtney highlighted a Nittany Lion trio that earned Golden Dome Invitational All-Tournament team honors. Courtney was tabbed the tournament's Most Outstanding Player, while redshirt freshman Bryanna Weiskircher and sophomore Ali Frantti each earned All-Tournament team honors. Courtney closed out the weekend with her third double-double of the season at Notre Dame. She finished tied for second on the team with 14 kills, adding 15 digs against the Fighting Irish. Frantti had back-to-back double figure kill performances in the same day, leading the offense with 11 kills against Mississippi State before tying for first on the squad with 14 kills against Notre Dame. Weiskircher paced the team to a .355 team hitting percentage during the week, including a .361 hitting clip against Eastern Kentucky. Against Mississippi State, she logged a career-high five total blocks.

KENDALL'S GOT CLASS

Senior Kendall Pierce has been selected as a candidate for the 2015 Senior CLASS Award. Pierce is one of 30 women's volleyball student-athletes to be named a candidate, along with one other from the Big Ten conference. The Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. A health policy and administration major, she was honored as a 2014-15 Big Ten Distinguished scholar. Pierce also earned back-to-back Academic All-Big Ten selections from 2013-14. WASHINGTON NAMED CO-BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After helping top-ranked Penn State women's volleyball to a pair of wins against nationally ranked opponents, sophomore Haleigh Washington earned Big Ten Co-Player of the Week honors. Washington shares the honor with Ohio State's Taylor Sandbothe. Washington led the team with 3.33 kills per set on .515 hitting in a 2-0 week that featured straight set wins against No. 21 Colorado and No. 2 Stanford.

BIG TEN/PAC-12 CHALLENGE ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

With a pair of multi-block performances and a team-high hitting clip against No. 2 Stanford, sophomore Haleigh Washington earned Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge All-Tournament team honors. Washington led the team eight kills against No. 21 Colorado before logging 12 kills on .526 efficiency against the Cardinal. Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney and senior Megan Courtney joined her on the All-Tournament team. Whitney finished tied for first on the team with 13 kills on .440 hitting against Stanford. Courtney had a team-high 12 digs against No. 21 Colorado before registering a double-double against Stanford with 11 kills and 13 digs.

STREAKING!

Penn State holds the top three winning streaks in Big Ten history. Penn State's most recent record-setting streak of 65 consecutive matches began on Nov. 11, 2006 and ended on Sept. 24, 2010 at Illinois. It is the longest streak in league history. Penn State's other two conference winning streaks were 49 matches and 41. Presently, The Lions are on a 33-match winning streak, which dates back to Oct. 17, 2014 when PSU started the streak with a 3-2 win at Purdue. The stretch is the longest active DI women's volleyball winning streak in the nation.

NITTANY LIONS ON TV

As one of the nation's top volleyball programs, Penn State has earned regional and national exposure. This year, the Nittany Lions will be on television at least six times between the Big Ten Network and ESPNU. All other matches will be streamed live on GoPSUsports.com or on BTN Plus.

This weekend's matches will feature current Penn State's Jack Milewski on play-by-play, joined by PSU junior defensive specialist Laura Broerman.

THREE EARN PENN STATE CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS

Following back-to-back double-digit kill performances in the same day, senior Megan Courtney earned Penn State Classic Most Outstanding Player honors. Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney and sophomore Ali Frantti each earned spots on the All-Tournament team.

Courtney led the team with 11 kills on .647 hitting against Stony Brook before returning later in the evening to lead the team with a double-double (16 kills, 13 digs) against Villanova. Whitney finished the week ranked second on the team with 3.44 kills per set, having posted 11 kills on .400 hitting vs. Buffalo and 14 kills on 429 hitting against Villanova. Frantti was third on the team with 2.44 kills per set last week and third with 2.33 digs per set. She had 10 kills against Stony Brook and a career-high 12 digs against Villanova.

PENN STATE TOPS AVCA PRESEASON POLL RANKINGS

Penn State women's volleyball earned the No. 1 overall ranking in the 2015 AVCA Preseason Coaches' Poll for the second consecutive season. Penn State is among six Big Ten schools to be ranked within the AVCA Top 25 and one of four conference programs to be voted within the top 10. Penn State received 54 of a possible 64 votes in the preseason poll.

Tied at No. 5, Nebraska and Wisconsin join the Nittany Lions in the top five, while Illinois rounds out the top 10 at No. 8. Ohio State is slated No. 14 and Michigan State is slotted No. 19. Purdue, Minnesota and Michigan also represent the league in the poll, as all three are receiving votes. Since 2007, Penn State has been ranked within the top three of every AVCA preseason poll, having also been voted No. 1 a total of six times (2008-11, 2014-15).

WHITNEY JOINS BIG TEN FOREIGN TOUR

Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney joined the inaugural Big Ten Women's Volleyball Foreign Tour this summer. For the first time in conference history, Big Ten volleyball student-athletes from all 14 schools traveled overseas to both compete, and participate in community services initiatives. Whitney and the Big Ten Volleyball Foreign Tour Team traveled to Slovenia, Croatia and Italy this summer, opening the trip in Maribor, Slovenia. Northwestern's Keylor Chan served as the team's head coach.

PENN STATE IN SEASON-OPENERS

PSU improved to 32-7-1 all-time in season-openers after sweeping Buffalo in the first match of the season. The win against the Bulls marks PSU's fourth consecutive season-opening victory.

NITTANY LION ALUM AT THE 2015 ESPY AWARDS

Penn State alum Micha Hancock was nominated for an ESPN ESPY for the second consecutive season. Nominated for Best Female Collegiate Athlete, her nomination marked the fourth time a PSU women's volleyball student-athlete was up for an ESPY. Megan Hodge earned a nomination in 2010, following the '09 season, while Blair Brown was selected in 2011 following the '10 season. Hancock is the first in program history to receive back-to-back nominations.

BEST ON THE BLOCK

Penn State's commanded the advantage in the blocking margin against its opponents this year. To date, Penn State has out-blocked its opponents 131.0 - 57.0, averaging 3.20 blocks per set, which ranks third nationally and leads the conference. Individually, sophomore Haleigh Washington's 1.51 blocks per set ranks eighth nationally and also leads the Big Ten. Sophomore Heidi Thelen's 1.22 blocks per set ranks second on the team and sixth in the league.

TOUGH DEFENSE

Penn State has limited its opponents to .114 hitting this season, which ranks first in the Big Ten standings and third nationally. PSU has held nine of its 13 opponents to .097 or lower hitting efficiency. The Nittany Lions have limited three squads to hitting clips between .210-.267. Only one team (Stanford/.267) has posted a .250 or better hitting percentage against the Nittany Lions. At the Golden Dome Invitational, Penn State held back-to-back teams to negative team hitting clips. Eastern Kentucky hit -.012, while Mississippi State hit -.010.

A CLEAN SWEEP

Penn State has earned 12 of its 13 victories this season by way of a 3-0 sweep. Penn State has also limited Eastern Kentucky, Mississippi State and St. John's to less than 45 total points in a single match, holding the Colonels to a season-low 41 total points. The Red Storm had 43 and Bulldogs had just 42.

AN ARRAY OF OFFENSIVE OPTIONS

Redshirt freshman setter Bryanna Weiskircher has directed the Nittany Lions to a .319 hitting percentage, which ranks second nationally and first in the Big Ten. Weiskircher has also paced a trio of her top attackers to .297 or better hitting, led by sophomore Haleigh Washington's .527 hitting clip, which leads both the nation and the conference. Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney's .324 hitting percentage is second on the team while senior Megan Courtney's .297 clip is third.

DEFENDING THE HOUSE

Including a 7-0 mark in 2015, Penn State owns a 571-31 (.949) all-time record at home in Rec Hall. With the Big Ten wins last week, Penn State is 260-17 all-time in conference matches on the court at Rec Hall. Only Ohio State has defeated the Nittany Lions on their home court more than three times, having topped PSU five times. Illinois, Minnesota and Michigan State are the only three teams to beat Penn State at home more than once.

GREAT WEEKEND AT THE GOLDEN DOME INVITATIONAL

Freshman libero Keeton Holcomb had a career-high weekend at the Golden Dome Invitational. Holcomb averaged 5.33 digs per set during the weekend that featured three consecutive 3-0 wins. She highlighted the weekend with back-to-back 20-dig performances in the same day against both Mississippi State and Notre Dame. On the year, Holcomb's leading the team with 3.74 digs per set, which ranks 11th in the Big Ten standings.

RECORD BOOK WATCH: MILESTONE FOR MEGAN

Penn State senior Megan Courtney is nearing the 1,000 career kills/1,000 career digs plateau. With 976 career kills and 961 kills, she needs just 24 more kills and 39 more digs to reach the mark. Courtney would join an elite group, as just the eighth Nittany Lion in program to reach the milestone and the first since Deja McClendon in 2013.

NITTANY LIONS NAMED BIG TEN PRESEASON FAVORITE

Penn State earned the No. 1 ranking in the 2015 Big Ten Preseason Coaches' Poll, marking the 10th time in the last 11 years the Nittany Lions have been picked to win the league. The Big Ten Preseason poll is selected by votes from all 14 conference head coaches.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN NITTANY LIONS

Penn State is well represented on the Big Ten Preseason All-Big Ten team, with more selections than any other conference program this year. 2015 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Haleigh Washington highlights Penn State's four preseason All-Big Ten honorees as a unanimous selection. Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney, senior Megan Courtney and sophomore Ali Frantti round out the group of honorees.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Penn State hits the road next week for the first portion of a two-week roadtrip. The Nittany Lions travel to Illinois to take on the Illini Friday, Oct. 9 at 8 p.m. ET, live on the Big Ten Network. Penn State rounds out the weekend on the road at Northwestern, squaring off against the Wildcats Saturday, Oct. 10 at 8 p.m. ET.

With a match-high 16 kills on .714 hitting, Aiyana Whitney helped then-No. 6 Penn State to a straight set victory against Iowa. Haleigh Washington added double figure kills with 12, posting a .667 hitting percentage.

Ali Frantti finished fourth on the team with nine kills, two digs and two blocks.

NITTANY LIONS MONTH - BY- MONTH

Penn State is 43-5 (.896) all-time during the month of August, after notching a trio of victories against Buffalo, Stony Brook and Villanova in the first week of 2015.

Penn State is 379-57-4 (.866) all-time during the month of September. The Lions are 204-18 (.919) during September dating back to the 1995 season and 62-9 (.873) within the last six years.

PSU is 394-69 (.861) all-time during the month of October. Penn State has posted a 93-13 (.877) mark in October across the last 10 seasons, and a record of 58-5 (.921) in the last five years, without losing a match during the month from 2007 to 2010.

Penn State is 294-57 (.838) all-time during the month of November, including a 97-8 (.924) mark across the last 10 seasons. The Nittany Lions posted a six-year streak from 1995-2000 where they did not lose a match in the month, and in the last five seasons, Penn State has a 53-3 (.946) mark in November.

QUICK SETS

From Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten in 1991, Penn State has played in 813 total matches, winning 751. Across the last seven years, Penn State has earned 188 of its 238 victories in three sets (79%), including 37-of-38 (98%) in 2008 and 32-of-38 in 2009 (84%).

In the last 15 years, the Lions have only lost 61 matches. And of those 22 teams that defeated the Lions - BYU, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Long Beach State, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Oregon State, Purdue, USC, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin - only nine of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota, Michigan State and Florida) have been able to beat Penn State three times. The Lions have compiled a 295-61 mark in the last 15 years versus these teams.

RUSS ROSE AT A GLANCE ...

It's been nearly four decades since Russ Rose arrived on campus. Entering his 37th season, the AVCA Hall of Fame head coaches' record-setting seven NCCA national titles and 16 Big Ten championships speak directly to the confidence and character he's passed along throughout his career.

As each year passes, his list of accomplishments continue to swell, but a quick snapshot of his legendary tenure might read something like this: The leader of a women's volleyball powerhouse who's kept his program among the nation's elite for nearly 40 years, guiding his teams to a record-setting seven NCAA national titles, including an unprecedented four consecutive championships from 2007-10. Along with 16 Big Ten titles, his program is one of only two women's volleyball schools to compete in all 34 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball National Championship events. He's produced four AVCA National Players of the Year, 13 Big Ten conference Players of the Year and at least one AVCA All-American in 35 of 36 seasons. His student-athletes excel in the classroom as well, with an outstanding 156 Academic All-Big Ten selections and five Academic All-Americans.

WHO'S BACK

The Nittany Lions return plenty of potential when it comes to finding new ways to win. This year's senior group features experienced hitters in Megan Courtney and Aiyana Whitney as well as defensive specialists Kendall Pierce and Lara Caraway. From last year's top-ranked freshman recruiting class, All-American and DI National Freshman of the Year Ali Frantti and Big Ten Freshman of the Year Haleigh Washington highlight the large class that has already gained the taste of a national title.

Returning second team AVCA All-Americans Aiyana Whitney and Frantti are among an experienced group of top attackers. Courtney started all 39 matches for the Nittany Lions during the 2014 season, finishing third on the team with 2.44 kills per set and second on the squad with 2.34 digs per set. She highlighted the year with a clutch career-high performance in the NCAA national semifinals before going on to earn 2014 NCAA Championship MVP honors.

The Nittany Lions also return options at the middle position as well. Sophomore Haleigh Washington has emerged as one of the top returners in group. Washington burst on to the scene in September after an injury sidelined her for the opening portion of the season. In 25 appearances on the court, she finished first on the team with a .463 hitting percentage, while also tallying 96 blocks. With the ability to play multiple positions in the front row, redshirt senior All-American Aiyana Whitney could also be an option at the middle position this year, along with sophomore Heidi Thelen.

EXPERIENCED SENIOR CORE

Comprised of four, this year's senior class features Lara Caraway, Megan Courtney, Kendall Pierce and Aiyana Whitney. Playing all together at the same time, the four have a combined record of 103-8 in three years, as well as a 56-4 mark in Big Ten matches. Along with back-to-back Big Ten titles in 2012 and 2013, the veteran class also boasts back-to-back NCAA national titles from 2013-14. Having made it to the final four in the last three consecutive seasons, the four have an NCAA tournament record of 16-1.

SPOTS TO FILL

This year, the Nittany Lions enter the season with some sizable question marks, tasked with replacing a core group of senior leadership. First there's three-time All-American and 2014 AVCA DI National Player of the Year Micha Hancock, who set the Nittany Lions to both championship crowns in 2013-14, while also impressing from the end line with her clutch serve. Then there's three-year starting libero Dominique Gonzalez, and defensive specialist Lacey Fuller who commanded the backrow. Lastly, there's two-time All-American Nia Grant, who frequently led the nation in hitting efficiency in 2014.

Perhaps one of Penn State's top priorities this season will be at the setting position, replacing Hancock, who ended her career atop both the NCAA and Big Ten career aces lists. Departures from Dominique Gonzalez and Lacey Fuller present another top priority for the Nittany Lions heading into the 2015 season. Gonzalez closed out her collegiate career ranked fourth all-time in the Penn State record book with 1,474 digs.

WHO'S NEW

Penn State's 2015 freshman class features a little bit of everything, including setter Wilma Rivera (Carolina, Puerto Rico), defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb (Belville, Texas), middle blocker Tori Gorrell (Ontario, Canada) and right side Jelena Novaković (Belgrade, Serbia).

Tori Gorrell » Gorrell attended Abbey Park High School in Oakville, Ontario, helping Abbey Park to the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Association AAA volleyball championship. In addition to helping the team to an undefeated season, she also led the squad to Halton Tier I and Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference AA titles.

Keeton Holcomb » A four-year letterwinner and team MVP at Belville, she earned AAA First Team All-State honors in 2013-14, as well as Texas Sports Writers Association All-State honors in 2013. Holcomb is a MaxPreps Second Team All-American, having also been named to the 2014 Under Armour All-American watch list. Played club with Houston Juniors.

Jelena Novaković » Novaković helped Red Star to a National Cup title in 2014 and a silver medal at the 2014 Championship, while also earning MVP honors at the U17 Belgrade Tournament. She earned gold at the European Championship with the U19 Serbian Junior National Team in 2014, as well as another gold medal at the Balkan Championship in Subotica, Serbia.

Wilma Rivera » Rivera was a four-year team captain and senior MVP at Saint Francis School. She helped her high school squad to the 2014 Puerto Rico Lopa El Nuevo Dia Championships, while also earning LACC All-State Best Setter and MVP honors in the same year. Rivera also competed on the Puerto Rican Junior National Team.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. - A trio of career-high performances guided No. 1 Penn State to a straight set victory against Mississippi State in the second match of the Golden Dome Invitational.

Penn State opened the match on a 5-1 run to take control of an early lead. Mississippi State quickly erased the advantage with four unanswered points, tying the score, 5-5. The Nittany Lions and the Bulldogs continued to trade points, keeping the score tied up, 7-7. Mississippi State pulled ahead with an ace and a kill, 9-7, but PSU came storming back with five unanswered points to take over a three-point advantage, 12-9.

The Bulldogs called a timeout looking to cut off the streak, but Penn State followed with a 3-1 strike to widen the advantage to five, 15-10. Mississippi State answered back with three consecutive kills to trim the deficit to two, 15-13.

Penn State responded with a 5-2 stretch to build the lead back to five, 20-15, prompting the Bulldogs to call a timeout. Mississippi State came out of the huddle with a kill, 20-16, but a pair of kills from redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney and senior Megan Courtney sparked a 5-0 run that secured a 25-16 win in the opening set for the Nittany Lions.

The Nittany Lions and the Bulldogs traded points early in the second set to keep the score close. With the score knotted, 4-4, sophomore Haleigh Washington, sophomore Ali Frantti, Courtney and redshirt freshman Bryanna Weiskircher put away four consecutive kills to vault PSU on top by four, 8-4. A Nittany Lion attack error broke up the streak, but PSU regrouped with a 5-2 run to make it 13-7, causing the Bulldogs to call a timeout.

Penn State continued to roll out of the break, using a 6-2 strike to extend the Nittany Lion lead to double figures, 19-9, prompting the Bulldogs to take another timeout. PSU did not let its advantage dip below nine points for the remainder of the frame, as Frantti capped off a 25-14 win in the second set with back-to-back kills.

Penn State and Mississippi State kept it close early in the third set. Trailing by one, 10-9, Courtney followed three consecutive Bulldog errors with a kill to pull Penn State ahead, 12-10, causing Mississippi State to call a timeout. Penn State came out of the break firing, using an 8-2 streak to stretch the lead to nine, 20-11, causing Mississippi State to use its final timeout of the match.

Junior Carley Muller sparked a 5-1 run out of the break with an ace to propel the Nittany Lions to a 25-12 win in the third set to complete the sweep. Weiskircher, Washington and Frantti also chipped in kills down the stretch.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. - Top-ranked Penn State captured the Golden Dome Invitational crown with a straight set win against Notre Dame Saturday night at Purcell Pavilion.

Penn State and Notre Dame traded points early in the match to keep it close. Tied at 11-11, Washington sparked a 3-0 spurt that lifted the Nittany Lions ahead by as many as three, 14-11, prompting Notre Dame to call a timeout. Courtney came out of the break with a kill to make it 15-11, before a service error cut off the streak.

The Irish followed with a service error, but regrouped with a kill to trim the margin to three, 16-13. Pulling ahead, Frantti sparked a 4-2 stretch that widened the Nittany Lion advantage to five, 20-15, causing Notre Dame to call its final timeout of the frame. Notre Dame came out of the break with a kill, 20-16, but Courtney answered with three consecutive kills to send PSU ahead, 23-16. An Irish error on the next play set the Nittany Lions up for set point, 24-16. A Penn State service error held off the attempt before Whitney, Washington and Courtney teamed up for a triple block to secure a 25-17 win in the first set.

The Nittany Lions jumped out to an 8-3 lead in the second set, causing the Irish to call an early timeout. Notre Dame came out of the break with a kill, 8-4, but served long to keep PSU ahead by five, 9-4. Penn State continued to roll with back-to-back blocks from Washington and Weiskircher, widening the advantage to seven, 11-4.

Notre Dame came battling back with a 5-2 streak to arrive within three, 13-9. A kill from Frantti and an ace from Washington brought Penn State back up by six, 15-9, prompting the Irish to call their final timeout of the set. Notre Dame came out of the timeout with a 3-0 burst to shave the PSU lead back to three, 15-12. A block from Thelen and a kill from Courtney made it 17-12, but a

Notre Dame kill moved the Irish within four, 17-13. From there, Penn State managed to maintain at least a five-point lead, 22-16, until a pair of Irish kills put Notre Dame back within four, 22-18, prompting PSU to call a timeout. A kill from Frantti and a Notre Dame attack error out of the break set Penn State up for set point, 24-18. UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 1 Penn State women's outlasted No. 21 Minnesota in five sets in front of a crowd featuring 5,039 Nittany Lion fans

Penn State jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the match, winning the first and second sets, to command the advantage heading out of the intermission.

Tied up at 9-9 in the third set, a kill from Minnesota and a pair of Penn State errors sent the Golden Gophers ahead, 12-9. Penn State looked to get back on track with a kill from Ali Frantti, but another Minnesota kill and a block made it 14-10, prompting Penn State to call a timeout. The Gophers came out of the break with a kill, but a kill from Megan Courtney and a Minnesota attack error cut the deficit to three, 15-12.

The Golden Gophers followed with a 4-2 stretch to widen the margin to five, 19-14, causing PSU to call a timeout. Courtney came out of the break with a kill, 20-15, but the Nittany Lions could not sustain the momentum as the Golden Gophers used a 5-4 strike to take the third set, 25-19. Penn State opened the fourth frame with a 7-5 run capped off by back-to-back solo stuffs from Courtney and Haleigh Washington.

Minnesota answered back with a 4-2 strike to tie the score, 9-9. A Gopher kill and a PSU attack error moved Minnesota ahead by two, 11-9, but Frantti followed with a kill to put Penn State within one, 11-10. Penn State continued to battle, but Minnesota matched the Nittany Lion point-for-point to remain ahead by one, 17-16.

Rallying, a block from Washington and Frantti tied the score, 17-17, causing Minnesota to call a timeout. The Golden Gophers came out of the break with four unanswered points to pull ahead, 21-17. A Minnesota service error and a kill from sophomore Simone Lee made it 22-18, but Penn State could not continue the momentum as Minnesota took set four, 25-20 to send the match into a deciding fifth set.

Penn State opened the fifth frame on 5-3 streak, capped off by back-to-back kills from Washington. The Golden Gophers cut off the run with a block to arrive within one, 5-4. The two teams continued to trade points until a kill from Frantti lifted the Nittany Lions ahead by two, 8-6 at the crossover.

Minnesota quickly answered with a kill to keep within one, 8-7, but PSU responded with a 3-2 spurt finished off by kills from Courtney and Washington to move ahead by as many as three, 12-9, forcing Minnesota to call a timeout. The Gophers regrouped with a kill, but served into the net to keep Penn State on top, 13-10. Minnesota made one final attempt to spark a run with a kill, 13-11, but a kill from Washington made it match point, 14-11. A PSU service error held off the momentum before Frantti put down a kill to secure a 15-12 win in the fifth set.
