SETTING THE SCENE

» No. 14 Penn State is set to wrap up its two-game homestand hosting No. 17/14 Johns Hopkins Sunday, April 17 in another Big Ten matchup under the lights. Opening faceoff is set for 7 p.m., live on the Big Ten Network with Pete Medhurst and Mark Dixon on the call.

» The Nittany Lions moved to 7-4 on the year and 1-1 in the Big Ten standings last week after coming up short in a close 11-10 OT loss to then-No. 5 Maryland. Junior Mike Sutton led a group of six Nittany Lion goal-scorers with his second hat trick of the season

» Sunday marks Penn State's Faceoff Against Cancer game, highlighted by the Nittany Lions' annual Friends of Jaclyn event. PSU will welcome Friends of Jaclyn adopted teammate Gavin Royer, along with JHU's adopted teammate Connor Durgin in a ceremonial pregame coin toss.

» The Blue Jays have won all seven outings in a series that dates back to 1916. Last year, the two teams met in the regular season for the first time since 1946, with Johns Hopkins claiming an 11-10 double overtime win in Baltimore. PSU and JHU met once more in the inaugural Big Ten Tournament semifinals, with Hopkins claiming a 14-9 win to advance to the finals.

» The matchup against the Blue Jays marks the fifth time this season the Nittany Lions will face a ranked opponent. Penn State is currently 3-1 on the year against ranked teams, having knocked off No. 18/15 Cornell (8-7), No. 8/7 Harvard (13-12OT) and No. 1/1/ Denver (15-10), before falling short against No. 5/5 Maryland (11-10OT).

» Penn State is currently leading the nation with the fewest turnovers per game, averaging 9.73 per outing. Committing less than 10 turnovers in all but five games this season, Penn State's 107 miscues on the year are the third fewest among NCAA DI teams. Freshman Grant Ament's 23:10 assist-to-turnover ratio is tops among 14 NCAA DI players with at least 23 assists on the year.

FLORENCE IN THE CLUTCH

Redshirt junior Matt Florence has proved to be a clutch offensive option for the Nittany Lions at all the right times this season. Florence netted his second game-winner of the season in Penn State's win at Ohio State, scoring with 1:41 remaining in the fourth quarter to break open a tied score and secure a 6-5 win. Earlier this season, he scored with 3:49 in the fourth quarter to secure an 8-7 win at Cornell.

SHARING IS CARING

Having notched at least five assists in all but three games this season, Penn State is averaging 7.50 assists per game, which ranks 13th nationally and third in the Big Ten conference.

Penn State's starting attack unit with Nick Aponte, TJ Sanders and Grant Ament features a trio with double figure assists and goals. With one assist in all but two games this season, Aponte has totaled 17 helpers. Leading the team with 23 assists, Ament's averaging 2.09 per game, which ranks 15th nationally and third in the conference. Ament's 23:10 assist-to-turnover ratio is tops among a group of 14 NCAA DI players with at least 23 assists on the year.

THE THIRD QUARTER

Penn State is outscoring its opponents 34-27 in the third quarter. The Nittany Lions have also held both No. 18 Cornell and No. 8 Harvard without a goal in the third frame, on the way to wins against both teams. Most recently, Penn State out-scored No. 1 Denver 4-1 in the third frame, to build a five-goal lead. Against the Crimson, the Nittany scored back-to-back goals in the third quarter within exactly two minutes of each other, holding Harvard without a goal in the frame. On the offensive side, PSU used a nine-goal showing the third quarter at Furman to secure a comfortable second half lead that led to a 16-7 win.

A FEW NOTES ON THE MARYLAND GAME

Despite the outcome, Penn State scored 10 goals against the Terrapins in last weekend's close OT loss to become just the second team this season to score 10 goals on the Terps. Maryland entered the matchup with a 39-5 record across the last three seasons when allowing less than 10 goals in

a game prior to the Nittany Lions' offensive surge. Maryland had also limited its opponents to just 18 goals in the first quarter on the year, before Penn State put away five in the opening frame.

GOALS ON GOALS ON GOALS

Penn State is outscoring its opponents 130-112 on the year, with a scoring offense that's ranked 14th nationally, averaging 11.82 goals per game. Penn State's .349 shot percentage is also slotted sixth nationally and first in the conference.

Penn State has scored at least 10 goals in six of 11 games this season, at 5-1 in outings with 10 or more goals. The Nittany Lions are also 4-0 on the year when limiting their opponent to less than 10 goals per game.

Penn State scored 37 goals in just the first two games of the season, marking the most amount of goals in the first two games of the season in program history. The 37 goals were the most since Penn State scored 36 in the first two games of the 1987 season and the first 30-plus scoring through two games since the Nittany Lions had 33 goals in 2013.

SCHREINER EARNS THIRD B1G WEEKLY AWARD

After a career-high performance in Penn State's Big Ten opener at Ohio State, sophomore Will Schreiner has earned Big Ten Specialist of the Week honors. Schreiner led the team with a career-high 15 saves in the Nittany Lions' 6-5 win. He made six saves in the fourth quarter alone, marking a season-high tally in a single frame. He allowed just five goals in the victory, which is also a season-low mark for Penn State this year.

CREATOR'S TROPHY ENTERS YEAR FIVE

Penn State, Michigan and Ohio State compete for The Creator's Trophy, an annual award presented when a team is 2-0 against one of the other programs. The trophy was created to honor the rivalries among the first three Big Ten lacrosse schools at the time Michigan added the sport in 2012. PSU won the 2012 and 2014 titles, while OSU earned the trophy in 2013 and 2015. After defeating Ohio State, the Nittany Lions could potentially win the trophy with a win against Michigan in the regular season finale, April 30.

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE BLUE JAYS

SCOUTING JOHNS HOPKINS

The Blue Jays enter the weekend at 6-4 on the year, having rebounded from a 16-9 loss at Rutgers with a 13-12 win at home against Ohio State last weekend. Johns Hopkins is averaging 20.00 points per game on the year, which ranks ninth nationally. Shack Stanwick leads the team with 44 points (16g, 28a), while Ryan Brown ranks first in the team standings with 28 goals on the year. Stanwick's 2.80 assists per game ranks second nationally, while Brown's 2.80 goals per game is slated ninth.

SERIES HISTORY vs. JOHNS HOPKINS

The Blue Jays have won all seven outings in a series that dates back to 1916. Last year, the two teams met in the regular season for the first time since 1946, with Johns Hopkins claiming an 11-10 double overtime win in Baltimore. PSU and JHU met once more in the inaugural Big Ten Tournament, with Hopkins claiming a 14-9 win to advance to the finals.

FRESH CONTRIBUTIONS

Through 11 games, the Nittany Lion newcomers have continued to make their mark, contributing 35 goals and 30 assists for nearly 30 percent of the team's total point scoring this year.

At least one freshman has scored in all 11 games this season for the Nittany Lions. Nick Spillane recently registered his second goal of the season in Penn State's Big Ten opener at Ohio State.

In the road-win at Cornell, Grant Ament logged his third multi-assist outing, leading the team with two helpers. Ament has scored at least one goal seven of the last eight games, netting two in the win against No. 1 Denver and against No. 5 Maryland. Against Hobart, Ament recorded his first collegiate hat trick, while also tallying a pair of assists for a team-high five points. Chris Sabia also led the team with three caused turnovers.

All 16 Nittany Lion rookies saw action in Penn State's 2016 season-opening victory against Robert Morris. Making the most of their debuts, a total of six newcomers combined for seven goals and six assists. Defensively, Sabia made his first collegiate start at defense, tallying three ground balls. Trevor Scollins also saw action in goal, notching two saves in 10:50 seconds between the pipes.

PENN STATE IN THE NCAA RPI

Penn State slipped to No. 18 in the latest NCAA DI men's lacrosse RPI update. The Nittany Lions are the behind Big Ten opponents, No. 1 Maryland and No. 10 Johns Hopkins.

KEENAN PICKS UP BIG TEN AWARD

Following a career-high outing against top-ranked Denver, sophomore Ryan Keenan earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors. The award is the first of Keenan's career, as he shares it with Maryland's Connor Kelly.

Keenan was one of two Nittany Lions to register a hat trick in Penn State's 15-10 win against the top-ranked Pioneers. He also dished out two assists for a career-high five points in the victory.

NITTANY LIONS UPSET NO. 1 DENVER

Penn State put an end to a 20-game Denver winning streak, upsetting the top-ranked Pioneers, 15-10, to capture the 2016 Patriot Cup at SMU's Ford Stadium. The Nittany Lion victory marks the first win over a No. 1 ranked opponent in Penn State program history.

Junior Dan Craig and sophomore Ryan Keenan powered a group of five Nittany Lions with multi-goal outings, scoring a pair of hat tricks. Penn State out-shot the Pioneers 33-26, putting 23 shots on goal to Denver's 16. Penn State also won the ground ball battle, 31-27 as Billy Lombardi finished 13-for-28 from the faceoff "x."

After trailing in the first quarter, Penn State used a six-goal surge to enter halftime leading, 8-6. The Nittany Lions out-scored the Pioneers 4-1 in the third quarter to build the lead to as many as five, 15-7. Denver looked to get back on track with three goals in the final four minutes, but Penn State held off the pressure to secure the win.

SANDERS NEARING ANOTHER MILESTONE

With a team-high four goals in Penn State's win against Robert Morris, senior TJ Sanders notched his 100th career goal to join an elite group as just the seventh Nittany Lion all-time to amass 100 career goals. As the first Nittany Lion to hit the mark since Jack Forster in 2013, he needs 10 more goals to tie for first all-time. Sanders has scored at least two goals in all but four games this season.

AND AT ATTACK ...

Penn State's starting attack unit consisting of veterans TJ Sanders and Nick Aponte and freshman Grant Ament has combined for 51 goals and assists, for just under 50 percent of the team's total point-scoring this year.

With each member of the trio having posted at least 30 points or more on the year, Sanders has proven to be the top goal scorer, with Ament and Aponte registering at least 14 goals and 15 assists apiece, serving as a duo that can successfully distribute and finish.

In the last five games, the trio has logged 21 goals and 24 assists for 45 of the team's 87 points during the stretch, that included wins over two Top 10 teams. Ament notched at least two goals in three of five games during the stretch, while Sanders had a hat trick against then-No. 8 Harvard before registering two goals vs. then-No. 1 Denver.

DUO EARNS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONOR

After helping Penn State to a pair of wins at Furman and against No. 8 Harvard, sophomore Will Schreiner and freshman Grant Ament earned Big Ten Weekly awards. Schreiner earns his second career Big Ten Co-Specialist of the Week nod, while Ament also picks up his second career Big Ten Freshman of the Week laurel.

Schreiner averaged 9.5 saves per game for the Nittany Lions in a 2-0 week. After recording nine saves in the win against the Paladins, he led the team with a career-high 10 saves in a thrilling overtime win over the Crimson.

Ament finished second on the team with eight points during the undefeated week, as one of two Nittany Lions to total five assists across both outings. He dished out two assists at Furman, adding one goal. Against Harvard, he logged three assists and scored two goals, marking his fifth straight game with at least one goal.

APONTE LEADS PSU PAST NO. 8 HARVARD IN OT

Behind junior Nick Aponte's game winning goal, Penn State knocked off No. 8/7 Harvard 13-12, for a thrilling overtime victory last week. A total of eight Nittany Lions found the scoring column, led by hat tricks from Aponte and senior TJ Sanders.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Penn State Lacrosse's expansive alumni base is bound to produce a few connections among current Nittany Lions, and this year's team is no exception. Matt Florence's father Tom was a goalie at Penn State from 1982-85. J.J. Pearl, who ranks fifth in career saves (557 from 1989-92), is also sophomore Hunter Pearl's father.

2016 PENN STATE MEN'S LACROSSE

Sophomore Josh Wellman highlighted the game with a career-high outing from the faceoff "x," winning 18-of-29 attempts, while also collecting 10 ground balls. Penn State shot out to a 6-3 lead in the first quarter before allowing a 5-2 Harvard run. The Nittany Lions held the Crimson without a goal in the third quarter as Mike Sutton and Dan Craig scored back-to-back goals, but Harvard battled back with four straight to tie the score, 12-12, forcing overtime.

Penn State held off early pressure from the Crimson in the opening part of the overtime period, but Ament found Aponte for the game winner with 2:59 remaining to secure the win.

POLL POSITIONING

Since entering both the USILA Coaches Poll and the Inside Lacrosse Media Polls, the Nittany Lions made significant movement in the poll. This week, Penn State stayed at No. 14, splitting the spot with Johns Hopkins via Inside Lacrosse.

The Nittany Lions opened the season receiving votes in both polls, working their way as high as No. 15/12 by the second week of the season. In total, Penn State has been ranked within the Top 20 in six of nine poll releases this season, earning its highest ranking of the season in the USILA Coaches Poll at No. 14 last week.

A FAST START

Following Penn State's 8-7 win on the road at No. 18 Cornell, the Nittany Lions improved to 3-0 on the year, marking the best start for the program since 2002. The 3-0 start to the 2016 season marked a first for head coach Jeff Tambroni, who has directed the Nittany Lions to back-to-back wins in the first two weeks of the season twice in the last four years.

SCHREINER EARNS BIG TEN LAUREL

Penn State's Will Schreiner earned Big Ten Specialist of the Week honors after helping direct the Nittany Lions to their third straight victory on the road at No. 18/15 Cornell. He becomes the first Nittany Lion in program history to earn Big Ten Specialist of the Week honors. Schreiner logged seven saves in Penn State's thrilling 8-7 victory against the Big Red, marking the team's first win over a nationally ranked opponent this season. He registered three saves in the fourth quarter alone, including one huge save in the final minute of the game to keep the Nittany Lions on top for the win. He also led the team with three ground balls.

DUO NAMED TO TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

Penn State's Nick Aponte and TJ Sanders have been named to the 2016 Tewaaraton Award watch list. The Nittany Lion duo is among the top players across all three divisions of NCAA Lacrosse to be recognized as early contenders for the prestigious award, presented by Under Armour. The Tewaaraton Award, annually honors the top male and female college lacrosse player in the United States. On April 28, the field will be narrowed to 25 men's and 25 women's nominees.

PENN STATE HOLDS OFF CORNELL, 8-7

No. 20 Penn State held off No. 18 Cornell for a thrilling 8-7 victory on the road at Schoellkopf Field. The Big Red jumped out to a fast start, scoring two quick goals, including one just five seconds in to take over an early lead.

Mike Sutton and Matt Florence responded for the Nittany Lions to tie the score, 2-2 with 1:30 remaining in the first. Penn State and Cornell kept it close in the second quarter until the Big Red broke open the tied score with a goal to pull ahead 3-2 as time expired in the first half.

The Nittany Lions came out of the intermission firing, using a 5-0 scoring streak to take control. James Chakey opened the stretch, followed by back-to-back goals from TJ Sanders. Kevin Fox and Ryan Keenan followed with a pair of goals to widen the advantage to four, 7-3 with 2:41 left in the third quarter. The Big Red came storming back with four consecutive goals, scoring the last two 38 seconds apart to knot the score, 7-7 with 5:13 left in the game. Florence came through in the clutch with his second goal of the afternoon to send the Nittany Lions ahead for good, 8-7.

PENN STATE RALLIES PAST HOBART

Helped out by an offensive surge in the fourth quarter, Penn State rallied past Hobart to earn its second straight win. Penn State's offense fired on

Grant Ament, TJ Sanders and Ryan Keenan led the team with three goals apiece. Both Keenan and Ament's multi-goal scoring outings marked career high efforts for the pair. Ament also added two assists to lead the team with five points.

Matt Florence and Dan Craig posted multi-goal outings, registering two goals each. Brian Prestreau, Kevin Fox and Billy Lombardi and Mike Sutton all logged one goal apiece to round out the balanced group of goal scorers.

AMENT EARNS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

Penn State's Grant Ament earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors after helping guide the Nittany Lions to a 20-7 victory against Robert Morris. Ament is the first Nittany Lion in program history to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors and the fourth conference weekly award-winner all-time.

Ament recorded two goals and led the team with five assists for a seven-point outing in his collegiate debut in the Blue and White against the Colonials. He put away his first collegiate goal in the first quarter, just one minute after registering his first collegiate assist. After tallying four consecutive assists in the second quarter, he closed out the afternoon with Penn State's 17th goal of the game for a multi-goal outing against Robert Morris.

PENN STATE IN SEASON OPENERS

The Nittany Lions improved to 21-17 all-time after downing Robert Morris 20-7 in this year's 2016 season-opener. With the victory, Penn State has won each of its last four season opening games. Penn State is also 5-1 in yearly openers under head coach Jeff Tambroni.

HOME SWEET HOME

The 2016 Penn State men's lacrosse schedule features double the home dates this season as the Nittany Lions are set to welcome eight opponents to University Park this year.

PSU hosts back-to-back games at home in the first two weeks of the season for the first time since 2014, hosting Robert Morris and Hobart. Other non-conference dates include Villanova (2/27), Harvard (3/12) and UMASS (3/19). The Big Ten slate is also set to take place mostly at home with Penn State hosting Maryland (4/10), Johns Hopkins (4/17) and Michigan (4/30).

PSU PICKED FOURTH IN BIG COACHES POLL

Penn State has been voted fourth in the 2016 Big Ten Preseason Coaches' Poll with Nittany Lions redshirt juniors Matt Florence, Drake Kreinz and senior TJ Sanders named Penn State's Players to Watch. Johns Hopkins claimed the top spot in the 2016 poll with a unanimous selection from the league's head coaches. Maryland and Ohio State rounded out the top three at spots two and three, respectively. Michigan and Rutgers were selected fifth and sixth.

BIG TEN PRESEASON PLAYERS TO WATCH

Redshirt seniors Matt Florence and Drake Kreinz and senior TJ Sanders earned Penn State Big Ten Preseason Player to Watch honors. The preseason nod is the second straight for Kreinz and Sanders, who both earned 2015 Player to Watch honors prior to the first year of Big Ten lacrosse.

Florence earns his first career Big Ten preseason honor, having capped off the season with Big Ten All-Tournament team honors. A 2015 Academic All-Big Ten selection, Kreinz served once again as Penn State's top faceoff specialist in 2015, playing in 13 of 14 games. A USILA All-America honorable mention, Sanders returns as one of the Nittany Lions' top offensive contributors in 2016, having earned both All-Big Ten honorable mention distinction and Academic All-Big Ten awards last year.

TRIO TO LEAD AS 2016 CAPTAINS

A trio of midfielders will lead the team during its 2016 campaign. Seniors Tommy O'Neill and James Burke and redshirt junior Drake Kreinz have been voted as captains. The process for choosing captains has remained unchanged for years and Jeff Tambroni is confident in the system he has in place.

"There are a number of different factors going into the captains process," Tambroni said. "One is a consensus vote from last year's team, we want to get exiting seniors, graduating seniors opinions on who they believe will lead this team most effectively."

After the team vote, Tambroni and fellow assistant coaches evaluate upperclassmen during the fall semester before making a final decision. Penn State men's lacrosse has experimented with the number of captains the team has every year. In 2014 three seniors led the team but in 2015 the task fell solely on senior Kyle Zittel.

TAMBRONI SIGNS 11 TO NLI

Jeff Tambroni has announced the signing of 11 newcomers to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period. From U.S. Lacrosse All-Americans and MVPs to state champions and honor roll athletes, this year's class features a talented group poised to join the team in 2016.

Gerard Arceri (Saint James, N.Y.), Nick Cardile (West Grove, Pa.), TJ Connellan (Cazenovia,

N.Y.), Colby Kneese (Dallas, Texas), Nick McEvoy (Bethesda, Md.), Mac O'Keefe (Syosset, N.Y.), Kane Randolph (Annapolis, Md.), Jack Rusboldt (Richmond, Va.), Mitch Schaefer (Canandaigua, N.Y.), Conor Smith (West Islip, N.Y.) and Barrett Sutley (Stevenson, Md.) are all set to arrive in Happy Valley. Three of the signees are ranked within Inside Lacrosse's list of top 25 recruits with Arceri ranked No. 11, O'Keefe tabbed No. 23 and McEvoy slotted No. 25.

SNAPSHOT: LOOKING BACK AT 2015

2015 was a historic season for Penn State men's lacrosse as the team kicked off its first official year of participation in the Big Ten conference. The Nittany Lions opened the season with a non-conference upset win over No. 16/11 Penn and earned a pair of Big Ten wins over Rutgers and Michigan to qualify for the first ever Big Ten Tournament.

WHO'S BACK?

Penn State returns nearly all of its offensive production from last year, including Nittany Lion top scorer and USILA All-America honorable mention, TJ Sanders, who led the team with 29 goals and 13 assists in 2015 for a team-high 42 points. Mike Sutton also joins Sanders as one of two 20-plus goal scorers from last year. Sutton closed out the year second on the team with 24 goals, including eight multi-goal outings. Both Sanders and Sutton both earned 2015 All-Big Ten honorable mention distinction.

Another top returner at attack is Nick Aponte, who transitioned from midfield to attack late in 2015 season. Prior to the move, Penn State averaged 8.9 goals per game, but since transitioning in the first meeting against Johns Hopkins (4/17), the team improved to 10.33 goals per game, with Aponte highlighting the remainder of the season with three goals and one assist for four points in a close 10-9 victory against Michigan.

In the midfield, Penn State returns Big Ten All-Tournament Team honoree Matt Florence, who finished third on the team with 16 goals in 2015. Also moving positions last year and returning is Dan Craig, who transitioned from attack to the midfield mid-year. He scored 11 goals and finished second on the team with nine assists. Craig also enters the 2016 season with at least one goal in the last four consecutive games. Other returners at midfield include Brian Prestreau and Chris Young. Prestreau saw action in 13 of 14 games, notching five goals including one in each of the last two games of the season.

At defensive midfield, the Nittany Lions have a veteran crew of seniors: James Burke, Tommy O'Neill and James Chakey, with Burke at the longstick. Burke registered a team-high 12 caused turnovers to go along with 34 ground balls. Defensively speaking, Penn State has Peter Triolo returning at close defense, who played in 13 games, starting the final 10.

Penn State is also solid at the faceoff "X" with returner Drake Kreinz who finished 129-237 on the year with a .544 winning clip.

WHO'S GONE?

Penn State is tasked with replacing standout goalie Connor Darcey, who passed away suddenly last summer. Darcey played all 14 games, recorded 176 saves with a .553 save percentage on the year. The Nittany Lions also saw departures from defenseman JP Burnside and Pat Manley at attack. Manley played in 13 of 14 games, tallying 12 goals and six assists for 18 points.

WHO'S NEW?

Ranked No.12 nationally by Inside Lacrosse, Penn State welcomes 16 newcomers in its freshmen class this year. The class includes five All-Americans, eight all-conference honorees, three all-league picks and a Canadian national champion. Defenseman Tommy Wright was slotted No. 12 in Inside Lacrosse's Power 100 Freshman Rankings while attackman Grant Ament came in at No. 31. Midfielder Drew Petkevich was slated No. 67, while Kevin Hill (midfield) and Robby Black (midfield) rounded out the group at No. 81 and No. 93, respectively.

UP NEXT

Penn State hits the road next week for its final roadtrip of the regular season. The Nittany Lions are set to travel to Rutgers for a rare Friday night matchup April 22 in Piscataway. Opening faceoff is set for 8 p.m. with live coverage on the Big Ten Network.

After guiding the Nittany Lions through the inaugural season of Big Ten Lacrosse, Jeff Tambroni returns for his sixth season as Penn State's head coach in 2016.

Tambroni guided the Nittany Lions through a historic season in 2015 that brought Penn State's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament following the first ever season of Big Ten lacrosse. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked No. 14 in the USILA DI Preseason Coaches' Poll and knocked off No. 16/11 Penn during the 2015 season. Tambroni also led Penn State to its first two Big Ten conference victories as well as a berth to the conference tournament. He also mentored rising senior TJ Sanders to USILA All-America honorable mention honors.

In 2014, Tambroni led Penn State to its fourth consecutive above-.500 season. His student-athletes earned the eighth USILA All-American and third Scholar All-America honors of Tambroni's Penn State career. He also coached goalkeeper Austin Kaut to his school record third All-America honor and conference-best All-CAA First Team award.

Penn State's 2013 campaign saw Tambroni lead Penn State to one of the greatest seasons in program history while celebrating its 100th season. The Nittany Lions set new records for wins (12) and earned the program's first outright regular season conference title by sweeping the CAA with a 6-0 record. PSU rattled off 10 straight wins from March through May to earn the school's third NCAA bid and first chance to host an NCAA game.

Tambroni was named CAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2011), while Kaut (under Tambroni's tutelage) was named Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalie. Also, Kaut was CAA Player and Defensive Player of the Year. TJ Sanders was named Rookie of the Year and the Nittany Lions placed six on the All-CAA First Team.

During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a second-place CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees. Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman goalkeeper Austin Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 national championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.

During his tenure, his players earned 37 first-team All-Ivy honors, including five Ivy League awards, and three conference Rookie of the Year selections. In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III national championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA championships (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.

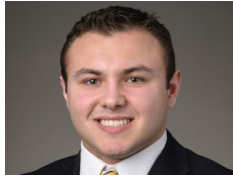

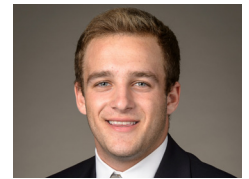

"We're thrilled," head coach Jeff Tambroni said. "I thought our guys came out of the locker room and from the start of the game at the first whistle they played a very inspired game of lacrosse and gained a ton of momentum in the second and third quarter."

Penn State jumped out to an early lead in the first quarter as Matt Florence found the back of the net off an assist from Nick Aponte less than two minutes into the game to spark a 5-0 scoring streak. Aponte, Grant Ament, James Chakey and Brain Prestreau all added goals during the stretch.

Looking to spark some momentum, Robert Morris' Eric Rankel popped in a goal to cut the Nittany Lion advantage to four with less than two minutes remaining. Florence answered with his second goal of the quarter to send Penn State ahead 6-1 at the end of the frame.

The Colonials opened the second quarter with a goal from JonPatrick Kealey to trim the gap back to four, 6-2. Penn State came storming back with 11 consecutive goals spanning the remainder of the second quarter and into the third to surge ahead by as many as 15, 17-2.

TJ Sanders kicked off the scoring streak with back-to-back goals, scoring his first on an extra-man opportunity after the Colonials were whistled for cross-checking. The Crimson looked to hold off the run with a goal following Aponte's first of the game, but two more from Sanders and one from Hill, Florence and Ament rounded out the strike for the Nittany Lions.

Penn State continued its momentum into the second quarter as Wellman won the faceoff and charged straight for the net, scoring his first collegiate goal to lift the Nittany Lions up by four, 7-3 with 14:51 remaining in the first half. Ament added another to widen the PSU scoring streak to seven straight, as Penn State pulled ahead by as many as five, 8-3, with 9:57 left in the second quarter.
