2013 PENN STATE WOMEN'S LACROSSE

TODAY'S GAME

- Penn State travels to the state of Maryland for the second time in three weeks as they visit top-ranked Maryland for a noon matchup.
- The Nittany Lions have played the Terrapins 49 times, more than any other opponent in a series that dates back to 1973.

LAST TIME VS. MARYLAND

- The Nittany Lions dropped their home opener to Maryland, 16-6, at Penn State Lacrosse Field Feb. 19.
- Goalkeeper **Dana Cahill** made a career-high 16 saves, while **Mackenzie Cyr** (2g, 1a) and **Maggie McCormick** (1g, 2a) led Penn State with three points each.

ALL-TIME VS. THE TERRAPINS

- Penn State is 14-34-1 all-time against Maryland and have not defeated the Terrapins since the 2005 season.
- The teams' closest game since Penn State's last victory came in 2008 when Maryland pulled out a 12-11 triple overtime victory.

COMMON OPPONENTS

- Both Penn State (W, 15-14) and Maryland

(W, 18-10) picked up road victories against then-No. 6/8 Virginia last week.

PENN STATE IN THE NCAA

- Through March 3, senior **Katie Guy** is tied for 17th in the NCAA in ground balls (14) and 20th in caused turnovers (9).
- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** is tied for ninth in assists (12).
- Penn State ranks 14th in the country in scoring offense with 15.00 goals per game.

TERRAPINS IN THE NATION

- Maryland boasts the second-ranked offense in the nation (17.60 goals per game) and, as a team, ranks eighth in draw controls.
- Senior attack Alex Aust ranks third in the country in points (32), fourth in goals (19) and sixth in assists (13).
- Senior goalkeeper Kasey Howard ranks 10th in the country in saves (39).

DOHERTY FACES ALMA MATER

- Penn State head coach **Missy Doherty** was a four-year standout defender for the Terrapins from 1994-97.
- Doherty helped lead the Terrapins to three straight NCAA championships (1995-97).

- Maryland amassed a 68-2 record, including an NCAA record 50-game winning streak, during her career.

WHAT'S AT STAKE

- Penn State will look to beat its first top-ranked opponent since a pair of victories in 2005.
- The Nittany Lions defeated then-No. 1 Virginia, 10-7, March 11, 2005 before taking down top-ranked Princeton, 14-13, in overtime March 19, 2005.

DOHERTY VS. MARYLAND

- Head coach **Missy Doherty** will look for her first victory against her alma mater as a head coach. Doherty is currently 0-5 (0-2 at Penn State) against the Terrapins.

PENN STATE VS. TOP-10 TEAMS

- Penn State is 1-1 against top-10 teams in 2013. The Nittany Lions fell to No. 6/10 Loyola (13-11) and defeated No. 6/8 Virginia (15-14).

MCCORMICK STRIKES AGAIN

- Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** set a career-high six goals and matched her career-high eight points in Penn State's 13-

STEADY CYR

- Junior attack **Mackenzie Cyr** extended her point-scoring streak to 12 games with five points (3g, 2a) against James Madison.
- Cyr, who has notched at least three goals in four games this season, has recorded three straight hat tricks.

LECHNER EARNS PAIR OF HONORS

- After an eight-point weekend (5g, 3a) against Duquesne and then-No. 6/8 Virginia, sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** was named the WomensLax.com Player of the Week and ALC Offensive Player of the Week.
- Lechner matched her career high with four points in both games. She also tied a personal best with three goals against Duquesne.

HIGHEST RANKING SINCE 2007

- The Nittany Lions improved to No. 7 in the March 5 IWLCA poll as they earned their highest ranking since being tabbed sixth during the 2007 season.

LIONS KNOCK OUTLAST VIRGINIA

- After trailing by an 8-5 halftime margin, the Nittany Lions netted 10 second-half markers as it edged No. 6/8 Virginia, 15-14, at Klöckner Stadium March 3
- Sophomore midfielder **Kelly Lechner** recorded a career-high four points (2g, 2a) for the second straight game, while junior **Mackenzie Cyr**, who added an assist, notched her third three-goal game of the season.

PENN STATE DOMINATES DUQUESNE

- Ten Nittany Lions scored in a 16-9 victory against Duquesne Feb. 27.
- Sophomore attack **Maggie McCormick** paced the team with six points (1g, 5a), while junior **Mackenzie Cyr** and sophomore **Kelly Lechner**, who matched her career high, scored three goals each.
- Junior **Evan Foulsham** recorded a career-high five draw controls.

McCORMICK SETS CAREER HIGH

- Sophomore attack **Maggie McCormick** notched a career-high five assists against Duquesne Feb. 27.

LIONS FALL TO LOYOLA

- The Nittany Lions fell to No. 6/10 Loyola, 13-11, at Ridley Athletic Complex Feb. 23.
- Penn State took a 7-6 halftime lead but the Greyhounds opened the second stanza with four straight tallies.
- **Maggie McCormick** (2g, 1a), **Jenna Mosketti** (2g, 1a) and **Mackenzie Cyr** (3a) led Penn State with three points each.

DUO TABBED ALL-AMERICANS

• Sophomore midfielder **Tatum Coffey** and junior midfielder **Lizzy Carney** were tabbed *Inside Lacrosse* Preseason All-Americans.
• Last season, Coffey was the nation's only freshman to be named to an All-America team (third).

OFFENSIVE PUNCH

• With the graduation of only three starting seniors, the Nittany Lions returned 79.9% of their scoring from a season ago.
• Sophomore **Maggie McCormick** led the Nittany Lions with 59 points and 30 assists, while senior **Molly Fernandez** paced the squad with 35 goals.

BACK FOR MORE

• Although still a young team, Penn State returns its category leaders in each major category with the exception of ground balls.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY

• Senior midfielder **Katie Guy** and sophomore midfielder **Tatum Coffey** are the only two returning Nittany Lions to record double-digit ground balls, draw controls and caused turnovers in 2012.

FAMILIAR FACES

• Penn State returns 17 letterwinners, as well as eight starters, in 2013.
• The Nittany Lions lost starters **Dana Cahill**, who was the ALC goalkeeper of the year, and midfielders **Aly Adams** and **Theresa Zichelli** to graduation.

SISTER ACT

• Penn State boasts three sets of sisters - the Cyrs, Lechners and Foulshams - on the 2013 roster.

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS

• Seniors **Molly Fernandez** and **Katie Guy** and junior **Lizzy Carney** will serve as the Nittany Lion captains during the 2013 season.

NEWCOMERS

• Penn State welcomes eight newcomers

to the squad, including seven freshmen.
• Three Nittany Lions freshmen - **Madison Cyr**, **Heather Harman** and **Ally Heavens** earned US Lacrosse All-America honors during high school.

DOHERTY ENTERS THIRD SEASON

• Head coach **Missy Doherty** enters her third season at Penn State with a 101-61 career record and a 22-15 mark in Happy Valley through 2012.
• Last season, she led the Lions to their first NCAA tournament appearance since 2005.

MATTHEWS JOINS STAFF

• Former Northwestern standout **Brooke Matthews** joined the Penn State staff June 21, 2012.
• As a player, she helped the Wildcats win three national titles (2008, 2009, 2011).
• In 2012, she served as an assistant coach at Mount St. Mary's.

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

• Penn State will play eight opponents that are ranked in the IWLCA preseason coaches' poll.
• After their opener against Bucknell, the Nittany Lions will embark on a season-high three game road trip.
• Penn State will have a season-long three-game homestand April 10-17.

AMERICAN LACROSSE CONFERENCE

• Four conference foes - No. 1 Northwestern, No. 3 Florida, No. 13 Ohio State and No. 19 Johns Hopkins are ranked in the preseason top 20.
• Penn State will host conference foes Vanderbilt (March 17), Florida (March 30) and Ohio State (April 14), and will travel to Northwestern (April 5) and Johns Hopkins (April 21).
